CREACHADOIR PLUNDERS TETRARCH

Creachadoir (Ire) (King's Best), who burst into prominence with a maiden-breaking win in the G3 Leopardstown 2000 Guineas Trial, drew away in the final furlong to secure a three-length victory in yesterday's G3 Tetrarch S. at The Curragh. After entering the Leopardstown Trial a maiden, the colt emerged from his 3 1/2-length success as an exciting prospect. Trying 10 furlongs in the G3 Ballysax S. back at that track 15 days later, Creachadoir ran with credit to finish just over two lengths fourth to Mores Wells (GB) under a penalty, but was back markedly in trip for the Tetrarch, a trial for the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas. Stalking the early pace against the rail, the bay was switched out to challenge and swept to the front at the eighth pole before drawing away for a comfortable score. "The Irish Guineas [at The Curragh May 26] is definitely on the agenda," winning trainer Jim Bolger confirmed. **Click for the racingpost.co.uk chart.**

CHILUKKI DIES

Chilukki (Cherokee Run--Song of Syria, by Damascus), champion juvenile filly of 1999, died yesterday at Hagyard Equine Medical Institute near Lexington, according to *The Blood-Horse*. The 10-year-old suffered complications in foaling and her Ghostzapper colt was also lost. During her championship season, Chilukki won the GI Del Mar Debutante and GI Oak Leaf S. for trainer Bob Baffert and Stonerside Stable. She beat the boys while winning the GIII Kentucky Breeders' Cup S. and was second behind Cash Run in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. Chilukki also won the GII Churchill Downs Distaff H. and GII El Encino S., while earning over \$1.2 million in her career. The first champion campaigned by Robert and Janice McNair's Stonerside Stable, Chilukki produced two winning Storm Cat foals. Her unraced two-year-old **Sequoyah** (A.P. Indy) is expected to join Baffert's barn later this week and she has a yearling filly by Elusive Quality. "She was like a family member," Baffert told *Blood-Horse*. "She was special from the beginning. Her first start was brilliant. We were fortunate to end up with a filly that was so thrilling to watch run." Chilukki was buried at Stonerside.

NEW SHOOTERS EYE PREAKNESS

While five horses from the Kentucky Derby remain possible contenders for the May 19 GI Preakness S., a host of newcomers lie in wait for the second leg of the Triple Crown. Yesterday trainer Mark Shuman confirmed that Federico Tesio S. winner **Xchanger** (Exchange Rate) was likely for the race. "I was very impressed with the performance of Street Sense in the Kentucky Derby, but it didn't look easy for anybody in that race," Shuman said. "I'm glad we were where we were. If you have to meet horses like that in big races, you want to get a chance when they're coming off big efforts." Michael Matz may enter GI Florida Derby third-place finisher **Chelokee** (Cherokee Run) in the Preakness. "He went really well," Matz said after watching his colt work five furlongs at Fair Hill Training Center yesterday, adding a decision would be made later in the week on his Preakness status.

Having plied her trade in handicaps from six furlongs to a mile last summer, Eastern Appeal earned a shot at stakes company and held her own when fourth in the Listed Garnet S. at Naas in October and third in the Listed Knockaire S. at Leopardstown the next month. Fifth in a six-furlong handicap staged on heavy ground here on the opening day of the Irish flat season, she took advantage of the livelier surface prevalent this time to make the jump to group class. Always handily placed by Rory Cleary in third, she was switched around Modeeroch in the final drive and reeled in that rival in the shade of the post. "She was worth taking a chance with and that race was always the plan," trainer Mick Halford said. "She handles this ground and seven is her ideal trip, but she could join Deauville Vision in the G3 Ridgewood Pearl S. [at this track May 26]."

Septimus took the G2 Beresford S. here before finishing third in the G1 Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster in October of his juvenile year and looked a major Classic player when registering an eight-length success in York's G2 Dante S. last May. Only 12th in the G1 Epsom Derby the following month, he returned feeling the effects and was appearing for the first time shouldered with a penalty here. Allowed to use his stride by Seamus Heffernan early, the imposing bay tracked Championship Point until wresting the advantage from that rival at the quarter pole. Pressed by Fracas late on, he never looked in danger of being upstaged and was firmly on top at the line. "He came home sore from the Derby and the ground was just safe enough for him to run today," Heffernan said. Andre Fabre has won this trial for the June 3 G1 Prix du Jockey-Club four times since 1988, most recently with Hurricane Run (Ire) in 2005, and he has a powerful hand in **Shujoon** and **Royal and Regal**. The former was third in the Listed Prix Roland de Chambure here last July before taking a conditions event at Saint-Cloud in September. Continuing the winning thread back at this track in the Mar. 29 Listed Prix Francois Mathet, he has an experience edge over his highly regarded stable companion, who comes here off a conditions score at Saint-Cloud in late October. Aidan O'Brien sends across last year's Listed Eyrefield S. winner **Anton Chekhov**, who returned to finish fifth in the G3 Ballysax S. at Leopardstown Apr. 22. Jean-Claude Rouget was successful 12 months ago with Numide (Fr) and relies on the Listed Prix Maurice Caillault winner **Serabad**, who has supplemented following his Saint-Cloud success Mar. 17.

BEO FINE AFTER GUINEAS

Trainer Jim Bolger yesterday reported Michael Ryan's G1 1000 Guineas heroine **Finsceal Beo (Ire)** (Mr. Greeley) to be feeling no ill effects from Sunday's Classic. Confirming the Irish equivalent at The Curragh May 27 as her next outing, the Coolcullen conditioner commented, "She had a walk and a pick of grass when she got back and then ate up last night. The Irish 1000 Guineas is definitely on our schedule now."

CAMILLO HAS LONGCHAMP OPTION

Sir Robert Ogden's **Sander Camillo** (Dixie Union) could line up in Sunday's G1 Gainsborough Poule d'Essai des Pouliches (French 1000 Guineas) at Longchamp, connections revealed yesterday. Forced to miss Sunday's G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket due to being in season, last year's G2 Cherry Hinton S. winner featured among the 20 fillies left in the French Classic yesterday. "It is a possibility that she could run in the French Guineas," the owner's Racing Manager Barry Simpson told the *Racing Post*. "If she doesn't run in that, she has the option of the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas [at The Curragh May 27] before the [June 22] G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot."

DUKE CURRAGH-BOUND

Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's **Duke of Marmalade (Ire)** (Danehill) looks likely to run in the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas May 26. Returning from a lengthy layoff when fourth in Saturday's G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket, he finished a place in front of **Eagle Mountain (GB)** (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), who could be targeted at the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (French Derby) June 3.

PEDIGREE INSIGHTS

ROYAL ACADEMY'S ARE BORN TO RUN

Like Bruce Springsteen, he was born in the USA and quickly found fame there, thanks partly to his striking appearance. But unlike Springsteen, there was nothing blue collar about the ancestry of Royal Academy, who was sired by the great Nijinsky II from the ultra-quick Crimson Saint. This made him a half-brother to Storm Cat's spectacular dam Terlingua, so no wonder Vincent O'Brien was prepared to bid a sale-topping \$3.5 million for him at Keeneland's 1988 July Sale.

Although Royal Academy promptly departed to Ireland, he returned to America to win the 1990 Breeders' Cup Mile and was ultimately repatriated from Ireland to continue his stallion career at Ashford Stud in 1998. He is now in his 10th season at Ashford, but there is a strong suspicion that Royal Academy's virtues are far from fully appreciated in his homeland. Why else would this stallion--a sire of no fewer than 140 stakes winners worldwide--be currently available for as little as \$15,000? He covered 90 mares in 2004, 98 in 2005 and 107 last year, which aren't the type of figures normally associated with a proven Ashford stallion.

This lukewarm recent response to Royal Academy probably stems from the fact that his progeny have seemed more at home on turf than dirt, with most of his American graded winners, such as Val Royal, Academic Angel, Quero Quero, Mananan McLir, Legislator, Naughty Rafaela, Dernier Croise, Oprah Winney and Royal Gem, scoring on grass. The ex-French Danzon, a fine third against the males in Saturday's GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic, looks a certainty to be added to this list before long. There have been exceptions to this rule, though, such as Baghdaria, Court Folly and this year's dual Grade II winner Molengao, and the prospect of more and more synthetic tracks should also be in Royal Academy's favor.

The weekend's classics at Newmarket provided a wonderful demonstration of why Royal Academy should be held in higher regard. The 2,000 Guineas was won in style by Cockney Rebel, a colt from the first Irish crop by Royal Academy's son Val Royal, and a day later the 1,000 Guineas confirmed the champion status of Finsceal Beo, a Mr. Greeley filly out of Royal Academy's daughter Musical Treat. Musical Treat is the second Royal Academy mare to produce a British classic winner, the first being Crystal Crossing, dam of the St leger winner Rule of Law. *Cont. p5*

Despite this success, it is probably also fair to say that breeders in Europe had mixed feelings about Royal Academy during his years at Coolmore in the 1990s (he was leased to Japan in 1996). His real merit didn't become clear until after he had been transferred to the States, but his tally of Group 1 winners from those Irish crops included Sleepytime (1,000 Guineas), Zalaiyka (French 1,000 Guineas), Oscar Schindler (two editions of the Irish St Leger), Val Royal (Breeders' Cup Mile), Ali-Royal (Sussex S.) and Carmine Lake (Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp).

Royal Academy has also made a major impact during his years spent shuttling to the southern hemisphere. His numerous group winners in Australia include this year's smart juvenile Deferential and the Group 1 winners Bel Esprit and Kenwood Melody. Australia has also seen evidence of Royal Academy's lasting impact, as Miss Andretti, an outstanding sprinter with four Group 1 victories to her name during the current season, was sired by Royal Academy's son Ihtiram at the miniscule fee of A\$2,500.

Royal Academy's two years in Brazil also proved highly productive--productive enough for him to top Brazil's two-year-old sires' list in 2003-04 and to finish third and then second on the general sires' lists in the next two seasons. Naughty Rafaela, Durban Thunder, Molengao, Neuilly, Misto Quente, Movie Star and the South African Group 1 winners Express Way and Eyeofthetiger are just some of the Brazilian foals which have gone on to impress elsewhere.

Presumably American studs failed to show enough interest in Royal Academy's best son Val Royal when his racing career was brought to a premature end by the recurrence of a tendon injury in Dubai in March 2002. Although this injury came just a matter of months after his spectacular victory in the Breeders' Cup Mile, Val Royal's destination proved to be Australia (to Eliza Park Stud) rather than the U.S., thanks to a deal arranged by the Kern Lillingston Association. He shuttled for three years to Australia, where his best winner is a two-year-old filly called Ehor, but his most recent trip to the southern hemisphere was to Argentina.

Cockney Rebel, named after a 'seventies rock band, is a member of Val Royal's first Irish crop, sired at Pat Fitzsimons' Oak Lodge Stud. Appropriately, the colt was bred by Oak Lodge Bloodstock, but, after demand from breeders fell in 2006, Val Royal has now moved on to the National Stud at Newmarket, where his fee for 2007 is £6,500.

Cockney Rebel is obviously Val Royal's finest achievement, but his first Irish crop also contains Valbenny, a filly who earned an Experimental Free Handicap mark of 113 after winning the GIII Miesque S. and another turf stakes towards the end of last year. Two group winners represent an eye-catching achievement in view of the general standard of the mares Val Royal covered at his fee of €8,500.

This was a modest fee for a horse of Val Royal's background. His female line served the late Jean-Luc Lagardere's stud extremely well, producing the Group 1 winners Vahorimix, Vadawina, Valixir and this year's very promising filly Vadapolina. Val Royal, for his part, won four of his six starts in Europe and also took the GII Del Mar Derby shortly after leaving Andre Fabre's yard.

It is a measure of how talented Val Royal was that he was able to return after an 18-month absence to win races of the calibre of the GII Oak Tree Breeders' Cup Mile and Breeders' Cup Mile. His time at Belmont on Breeders' Cup day was a record-breaking 1:32.05.

Val Royal's Breeders' Cup performance sent *The Blood-Horse* into raptures:

"Val Royal unleashed a strong late run to win going away, but the move was much more than that," it reported. "Explosive hardly does it justice, and Valdivia took Val Royal in hand before the wire, noting the horse was just playing around the last few yards. The five-year-old got his last quarter in little more than :22, extraordinarily quick even given the very firm turf."

Is it any wonder, then, that Cockney Rebel's Guineas performance was marked by a Street Sense-style burst of acceleration, which virtually took him from last to first in a 24-runner field, to win in a very fast time?

Cockney Rebel, who cost only 15,000gns as a foal before doubling his price as a yearling, is easily the best of the five winners out of Factice, an Irish two-year-old five-furlong winner. As you would expect of an inexpensive individual, his immediate pedigree is run-of-the-mill, but his fourth dam Rare Exchange was a half-sister to the influential broodmares Rare Treat and Battle of Roses and to the very smart Jaipur. Rare Treat produced the champion American filly What a Treat, who in turn became the dam of the highly successful Be My Guest, and another of Rare Treat's daughters bred the Derby-winning Golden Fleece.

REVIVED TASK FORCE HOLDS MEETING

Meeting for the first time since its announced resurrection almost three months ago, the revived Sales Integrity Task Force left its May 7 gathering at Keeneland with proclaimed vows of providing quick and satisfying results. Re-formed in February as part of an emergency agreement to table proposed Kentucky legislation seeking stringent reforms to the equine auction industry, the 36-member task force has pledged to find consensus on specific agendas outlined in the bill--agent licensing, ownership disclosure, and veterinary disclosure. The initial meeting was described as mostly organizational, with committees formed to address each of the three issues. Few details were made known to the media; an agreement was reached to not discuss particulars outside the confines of the meetings. "We debated the issue of media access at length, there was healthy dialogue on that point, and there was not initially unanimity," said Alex Waldrop, president of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association, who was designated as the spokesman of the task force. "But we came to the consensus that at least for now, the best way to encourage open dialogue in that room among the task force members was to give them the assurance that their comments would not be used against them publicly. The last thing that we want, as I explained to them, is to be debating these issues in the press. It only serves to alienate people and undermines the process of coming to a consensus."
