INVASOR GETS BACK TO WORK

Turning in his first recorded workout since annexing the Mar. 31 G1 Dubai World Cup, Shadwell Farm's **Invasor (Arg)** (Candy Stripes) breezed an easy half-mile yesterday over Belmont Park's main track in :50.84.

America's reigning Horse of the Year is scheduled to return to racing in Belmont's GI Suburban H. June 30. "We're very happy to get him back on the work tab," said trainer Kieran McLaughlin. "He doesn't require a lot of work, but we do need to get him going again. Everything's going great and he's good to go. He'll have several more works, but not every week because he doesn't need it." McLaughlin said that colt rebounded from his trip to Dubai with few problems. "He travels really well, but he did lose a little weight coming back from Dubai," the conditioner said. "He was just a little dehydrated. [But] he quickly came back around and put the weight back on." McLaughlin was asked about another Shadwell star in his stable, last year's GI Belmont S. hero **Jazil** (Seeking the Gold). McLaughlin said the June 16 GI Stephen Foster H. at Churchill was the short-term target for Jazil, who recently disappointed when last of 12 in Keeneland's Apr. 27 GIII Elkhorn S. in his grass debut. "He's definitely going back to the dirt," he said. "We'll look at the Foster because I want to keep him and Invasor apart. I wouldn't mind running in an allowance race before that."

CHANGE OF PLAN FOR REBEL

Geoff Huffer has changed direction with Phil Cunningham's G1 2000 Guineas hero **Cockney Rebel (Ire)** (Val Royal {Fr}) and will target the colt at the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas. Despite initially ruling out the May 26 Curragh Classic, the conditioner is keen to take in the contest en route to Royal Ascot's G1 St James's Palace S. June 19. "Cockney Rebel has been in great form since the weekend," he told the *Racing Post*. "He's a big, immature horse and I thought he would need more time, but he has come out of it so well. I sat down after the furore and had a think about it and Ireland looks an attractive option. The timetable is quite good, with three weeks between Newmarket and The Curragh and then there is another three weeks before the St James's Palace."

BEO HEADS TO LONGCHAMP

Michael Ryan's **Finsceal Beo (Ire)** (Mr. Greeley) will embark on an ambitious Classic treble by taking in Sunday's G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches before her Irish 1000 Guineas bid. Having pleased connections with her wellbeing since accounting for Arch Swing by 2 1/2 lengths in Newmarket's G1 1000 Guineas, she will attempt the unprecedented feat of winning the English, French and Irish Guineas. "Finsceal Beo has come out of the 1000 Guineas very well and the plan is to run at Longchamp on Sunday," trainer Jim Bolger said, before adding that the G3 Leopardstown 2000 Guineas Trial and G3 Tetrarch S. scorer **Creachadoir (Ire)** (King's Best) will run in the same card's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas).

Successful in his only juvenile start at Saint-Cloud last November, Lawman returned to finish second in a Longchamp conditions event Mar. 29 and was a last-out fourth in a strong renewal of the Apr. 15 G3 Prix de Fontainebleau back at the Bois de Boulogne track. Leading at a generous pace from the bell here, he was coaxed along from the 500-meter pole to go safely clear approaching the final furlong and was not to be caught in the latter stages to post a deserved career high. "He has class and there is no doubt it is much better for him to use his tactical speed rather than wait behind and get caught for toe," explained trainer Jean-Marie Beguigne. "His half-sister Lattice was very good when she won the G1 Prix de Diane. At this stage he is good and we will find out in the G1 Prix du Jockey Club [at Chantilly June 3] if he is very good also," he added.

He incurs a four-pound penalty for that success. Standing in the line of fire is **Metaphoric**, representing the Michael Bell-Royal Ascot Racing Club axis, and Juddmonte Farms' **Arabian Gulf**. The former steps up from a score in a Newmarket handicap Apr. 19, while the latter took out a Craven-meeting maiden one day earlier.

Velazquez Has 'Roxy' Ride in Preakness...

Team Valor's **King of the Roxy** (Littleexpectations), trained by Todd Pletcher, will be piloted by John Velazquez in the GI Preakness S. May 19 at Pimlico. The chestnut colt, winner of the GII Futurity S. at Belmont last year and of the GII Hutcheson S. in March, ran second in the GI Santa Anita Derby Apr. 7, but skipped the GI Kentucky Derby in favor of a shot at the second jewel of the Triple Crown. "We decided to wait until after the Kentucky Derby before choosing a rider, because we wanted to see what the fallout would be," Pletcher said. "As of [Tuesday], I am not planning to run back any of my Kentucky Derby starters. Johnny obviously is my go-to guy, and he wants to ride King of the Roxy. He has always done well on him." The Ohio-bred colt is slated to ship to Pimlico next Wednesday.

Mint Slewlep Joins Preakness Field...

Trainer Robert Bailes, who saddled Scrapy T to a runner-up finish to Afleet Alex in the 2005 GI Preakness S., said yesterday that he will run **Mint Slewlep** (Slew City Slew) in this year's edition. The colt, fifth in the GIII Gotham S., is coming off a fourth to Divine Park in the Apr. 28 GIII Withers S. "We had this in the back of our mind depending on how many horses came out of the [Kentucky] Derby," Bailes said. "He came out of the Withers real good and we decided to give it a shot. We always liked this colt; he is very professional. He has a lot of ability, but we still have to find out if he is at this level. We trainers can always find excuses if we look hard enough, but he has had hard luck and that is why we don't know how good he really is." Bailes will ship his charge into the Pimlico stakes barn Sunday and work the bay Monday morning.

CADEAUX FEELING EFFECTS OF GUINEAS

Connections of **Major Cadeaux (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) revealed yesterday that the G3 Greenham S. winner returned "sore" after his run in Saturday's G1 2000 Guineas. Woodcock, Pickford and Mort's colt spread a plate on the morning of the race and ran with credit to finish sixth in the Newmarket Classic. "He's very sore this morning, but it's only the sole of his foot--it's nothing else--and it will take him a week to get over it," trainer Richard Hannon's son and assistant Richard Jr said. "He didn't have the perfect preparation at all and I look forward to taking on the horses that beat him again, as it must have affected him. Dad is very keen to take him back to six furlongs and we put him in the G1 July Cup [at Newmarket July 13] yesterday and he's in the G1 St James's Palace S. [at Royal Ascot June 19], so we'll feel our way from there."

ARCS ON TARGET FOR YORK RETURN

Trainer Tim Pitt yesterday confirmed his sprinting star **Les Arcs** (Arch) would make his seven-year-old bow in next Wednesday's G2 Duke of York S. at York. Successful in the G1 Golden Jubilee S. and G1 July Cup last term, the gelding has those Royal Ascot and Newmarket contests on his agenda again in 2007. "He's in great form and did a nice piece of work this morning," Pitt commented. "We'll probably start him off in the Duke of York at the Dante meeting next week, although he has a Group 1 penalty, so we'll see how we go. His three main obvious targets are the [June 23] Golden Jubilee, the [July 13] July Cup then the G1 Haydock Sprint Cup [at Haydock Sept. 8]. He is a bit bigger and stronger this year, which may sound silly for a horse going from six to seven years of age, but he's done very well and has been working well."

DOMINGUEZ WINS HIS 3,000TH Ramon Dominguez, the country's leading rider by wins in 2001 and 2003, notched his 3,000th career victory at Delaware Park yesterday. The current and four-time defending leading

jockey at Delaware, Dominguez, a 30-year-old native of Caracas, Venezuela, scored the milestone win aboard Astor Park in the fifth race, a six-furlong maiden for three-year-old fillies.

Dominguez rode his first race in his native country in 1995. He came to the U.S. later that year and began riding in 1996 at Hialeah. His first career winner was aboard Solo Moondance in March of 1996. He won his 2,000th career race in late June of 2004 and captured his first Breeders' Cup race later that year in the GI Turf aboard Better Talk Now. Dominguez was presented the 2004 Isaac Murphy Award by the Na-

tional Turf Writers Association as the jockey with the nation's highest winning percentage (28.3).

UTOPIA TO GO NEXT IN MET MILE Godolphin's veteran **Utopia (Jpn)** (Forty Niner), winner of the May 2 GIII Westchester H. in his stateside debut, will make his next start in the May 28 GI Metropolitan H. at Belmont Park. "It's going to be a tough spot, but he's a seven-year-old and we'd really like to try and win a Grade I with him in this country," explained Rick Mettee, who oversees Godolphin's New York string for trainer Saeed bin Suroor. "I wish I had a little more time with him, but he's done well since the Westchester and there's only one Met Mile." Utopia won the eight-furlong Westchester in an impressive 1:33 1/5, earning a 106 BRIS speed figure in the process ([video](#)).

Ha also purchased the second-highest priced weanling, a Zabeel colt out Myself (GB) for NZ\$400,000.

The duchess was pleased with the results. "Some of the mares whose pedigrees were really exciting to me made fantastic prices and have gone to wonderful homes which, I suppose, was the part I minded about the most," she said after the sale. "I am thrilled Twentyfirstcentury is going to the Schick family, Mr. Ha buying the Honor Lap and Zabeel colt is fantastic, the owners of Ticklish bought her mother which is wonderful--so many good things to come out of the day." She added, "The thing that was most amazing about this sale was the tremendous support the industry gave me--all the studs that helped our purple army--and I would like to thank New Zealand Bloodstock for the last 10 years of selling our horses, culminating today." In all, the 31 broodmares grossed NZ\$3,197,000 for an average of NZ\$103,145. The 22 weanlings sold for an aggregate of NZ\$1,401,000 and an average of NZ\$63,682.

NTRA REPORT FROM Capitol Hill

Jockey Insurance Bill Re-Introduced

Reps. Ed Whitfield (R-KY) and Bart Stupak (D-MI), minority and majority leaders, respectively, of the House Energy and Commerce Committee's Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations, have re-introduced the "Jockey Insurance Fairness Act," (H.R. 2175).

The legislation would amend the Interstate Horseracing Act and stipulates that a portion of horsemen's simulcast proceeds be diverted to pay for jockey health insurance. The bill also bans the use of steroids in racehorses. NTRA has issued this statement regarding H.R. 2175:

"This legislation has potential application to other major industries such as construction and agriculture, which similarly rely on independent contract labor and would have far reaching social, economic and legal impacts. We continue to believe that a business solution can be found to address this matter and call upon the Jockeys' Guild and its members to work with the industry to develop a plan that is fair and equitable."
