EASY BREEZE FOR CURLIN

Nine days after running third in the first leg of the Triple Crown, trainer Steve Asmussen's **Curlin** (Smart Strike) breezed an easy four furlongs in advance of an assault on the second leg, Saturday's GI Preakness S. at Pimlico. The chestnut, who lost his unbeaten record after completing the tri-fecta under Street Sense and Hard Spun in the GI Kentucky Derby, worked in :51 flat at Churchill Downs. It ranked 51st among the 54 works at the distance over a track rated fast.

Asmussen said the move was just what he was aiming for. "He looked nice, smooth and relaxed," said the conditioner. "He's still Curlin--a great big horse that covers a lot of ground. He galloped out real loose and seemed to come back very easy." Curlin was caught through fractions of :13.20, :26.20 and :38.80 and galloped out five furlongs in 1:05. Asmussen added that he was pleased with how Curlin trained after suffering his first-ever loss. "I was curious to see, with him never being beat before, how he would go back to the track," Asmussen said. "But he was very patient, and that was the one thing I was really wanting to see--that he didn't tighten up or get nervous, or be somebody that he hasn't always been." While he's looking forward to seeing his colt get back to winning ways, Asmussen said he didn't feel that Curlin has to avenge his Derby loss to Street Sense and Hard Spun. "We're trying to win the Preakness--we're not taking a shot at anybody," he said. "I expected him to win, but give credit to horses that beat him. He beat 17 of the best three-year-olds at one time in his fourth race, and now we've got to figure out how to beat the other two." Curlin is expected to ship to Pimlico Wednesday.

CIRCULAR QUAY MAY RUN IN PREAKNESS

Trainer Todd Pletcher yesterday indicated that Michael Tabor's **Circular Quay** (Thunder Gulch), sixth in the GI Kentucky Derby, may in fact tackle Saturday's GI Preakness S. It was earlier thought that Pletcher would be represented by only **King of the Roxy** (Littleexpectations). Pletcher's announcement followed Circular Quay's four-furlong work over Belmont's main track in :48.44, which came in company with stablemate A.P. Arrow. "I worked him with the Preakness in the back of my mind," said Pletcher. "I'll talk to Mr. Tabor and we'll make a decision

[Tuesday] morning." Circular Quay finished sixth at odds of 11-1 in the Derby, his first start in eight weeks following his win in the GI Louisiana Derby at Fair Grounds Mar. 10. Some suspicions were aroused last weekend when Garrett Gomez, not John Velazquez, worked King of the Roxy at Belmont. Velazquez had previously been named to ride King of the Roxy in the Preakness.

HONOR AND GLORY

Quest for Honor (GB) (Highest Honor {Fr}) made the most of this short field to take yesterday's G2 Prix Greffulhe Mitsubishi Motors at Saint-Cloud. Off the mark at Clairefontaine in October, the grey returned to finish third in the Mar. 17 Listed Prix Maurice Caillault here before failing to land a blow when only fourth behind the subsequent G3 Chester Vase winner in the G2 Prix Noailles at Longchamp on his latest start Apr. 8. Reserved in fourth early as the field traveled in single file, he tracked **Sunshine Kid** (Lemon Drop Kid) through and was alive to that rival's move at the quarter pole. It took until 100 metres out for him to get to the front and he had enough in reserve for the final drive to hold the staying-on **Sagara** (Sadler's Wells), who ran greenly throughout. C P West Strong in Pre-Preakness Drill...

Trainer Nick Zito has saddled 17 GI Preakness S. starters in his Hall of Fame career, including 1996 winner Louis Quatorze, and said he feels confident about the way his 18th potential starter was coming into this year's event. Robert LaPenta's **C P West** (Came Home) showed his readiness for Saturday's Classic with a sharp four-furlong move in :47 1/5 at Belmont Park yesterday, the second-fastest of the 105 works at the distance. "Everything went well," said Zito. "He finished up in :59 and change [for five furlongs]. It was pretty much what we wanted." Though Zito said he had plenty of respect for the Kentucky Derby winner Street Sense, he added that his charge, who is coming off a runner-up effort in the Apr. 28 Gill Withers S., deserved a shot in the Preakness. "Street Sense impressed me in the [Breeders' Cup] Juvenile and the Derby, but they still have to run around the track," said Zito. "[C P West] ran in the Breeders' Cup [sixth] and he was second [to King of the Roxy] in the GII Futurity S. at Belmont. He acted like a promising two-year-old, and we're hoping he continues to improve as a three-year-old." Edgar Prado will ride C P West Saturday.

'Mint' Fresh and Fit in Pimlico Move...

He'll be a longshot in the Preakness, but **Mint Slewlep** (Slew City Slew) indicated that he'll be ready to fire his best shot Saturday with a quick :59 4/5 work at Pimlico yesterday. Exercise rider Christy Knorr was aboard. According to trainer Robbie Bailes, Mint Slewlep accomplished the 6:30 a.m. work with ease. "I thought he was walking," said Bailes. "In fact, [Christy] said she thought he was going in 1:04. That's what's so deceiving about him. He's does things so easy." Mint Slewlep and Bailes, who is based at Bowie Training Center, currently have the Preakness S. barn to themselves, which suits Bailes just fine. "When they start feeding in, he'll already be used to everything. That's one advantage of getting here real early," he said. "I really wanted to get a work over the track. You got the tents; you got the seats; everything's new to him."

Pimlico to Honor Team Barbaro...

The Maryland Jockey Club yesterday said it will honor 2006 Kentucky Derby hero **Barbaro** (Dynaformer), who was injured in last year's Preakness S., as well as his owners Roy and Gretchen Jackson, jockey Edgar Prado and surgeon Dr. Dean Richardson at Pimlico during Preakness week. "Preakness 131 introduced us to the courage and class of the champion Thoroughbred Barbaro," said Maryland Jockey Club CEO Joseph A. De Francis. "People across the country were moved by his enduring legacy. Barbaro touched our hearts and reminded us of what an incredible athlete and tremendous inspiration he was, and still is, to legions of fans world-wide." The Maryland Jockey Club had previously announced that the former Sir Barton S., on the Preakness undercard, had been renamed The Barbaro S. This Thursday, Pimlico will honor Prado and Dr. Richardson with the prestigious Special Award of Merit during the annual Alibi Breakfast. Before the Barbaro S., the Wings of Blue, the U.S. Air Force elite parachute jump team, will perform. One jumper will carry a flag designed with the colors of the Jacksons' Lael Stables, which will be presented to the couple in a winner's circle ceremony.

"He did well on the dirt in Dubai, but the horse is different gear on the grass and The Curragh should suit him."

SPECIOSA HEADS LOCKINGE 10 Pam Sly's **Speciosa (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) yesterday headed the 10 declared entries for Saturday's G1 Juddmonte Lockinge S. at Newbury. Last year's G1 1000 Guineas winner, who was runner-up to Manduro (Ger) in the Apr. 19 G3 Earl of Sefton S. at Newmarket on her four-year-old bow, was reported on course for the mile contest by her trainer. "I thought that she ran a very good race at Newmarket--that Manduro is a proper Group 1 horse," she told *PA Sport*. "The ground should be fine for her, it was too quick for her at Newmarket." Cheveley Park Stud's six-year-old **Peeress (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}), who will bid for back-to-back renewals and Betty Moran's G2 Sandown Mile winner **Jeremy** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) form a two-strong assault by the Sir Michael Stoute stable, while Godolphin look likely to re-introduce the G1 Premio Vittorio di Capua winner and G1 Hong Kong Mile third **Ramonti (Fr)** (Martino Alonso {Ire}).

Having reached the sort of age where my son occasionally greets me affectionately as "Old Man," I have more than a little sympathy for those elderly stallions which tend to be overshadowed by the latest hot new stud. However, many an old dog still has plenty of life in him, and the same applies to some old stallions, as Danzig continued to prove up to and beyond his death at the grand age of 29 last year.

Anyone wanting to measure the impact that this great stallion has had on European racing need look no further than the Stan James 2000 Guineas 10 days ago. Of the 24 colts which went to post, two of them-- US Ranger and Haatef--were sons of Danzig, two others were by sons of Danzig and a further eight were by grandsons of Danzig, which adds up to half the field. Although victory eluded them, they filled eight of the first 12 places.

The Danzig male line also made its presence felt when France staged its version of the 2000 Guineas, the Poule d'Essai des Poulains, two days ago. This time Danzig was again responsible for two of the runners, Astronomer Royal and Dijeerr, and his sons and grandsons provided another three of the 14 contenders. This time they supplied first, third and fifth, with Astronomer Royal giving Danzig his first victory in a race which had previously fallen to three of his grandsons and one of his great-grandsons.

Of course, Danzig's current Classic crop also contains Hard Spun, who impressed me considerably with his gallant front-running effort in the Kentucky Derby. Altogether Danzig has had five sons contest the 2007 Classics, which adds up to a great achievement for a stallion who was 26 years old at the time of their conception and whose crop numbers only 30 named foals.

This surely proves that Danzig isn't one of those stallions whose results seem to decline once they approach veteran status. After all, he was 24 when his Group 1-winning sons Ad Valorem and Librettist were conceived and there were four stakes winners among the 24 named foals conceived when he was 25. This bodes well for his final crop of 27 live foals born in 2005--and for the buyers who were prepared to pay such enormous prices as \$9.2 million and \$5.2 million for two of them.

Perhaps the explanation is simply that Danzig's record was simply so exceptional that breeders were prepared to maintain the standard of mare they sent him, even in his twilight years. For example, the ClassicStar-bred Astronomer Royal is out of Sheepscot. This stakes-winning half-sister to the Florida Derby winner Vicar already has a Grade II winner to her credit in Navesink River. For the record, Hard Spun is out of a Grade II-placed mare from the family of champion Little Current; the Group 3-winning Dijeerr (a brother to the \$9.2-million yearling) is out of a sister to a multiple Grade II winner; US Ranger is out of a mare closely related to Dynaformer; and Haatef is out of a winning sister to the Grade II winner Kayrawan.

Or maybe Danzig has been helped by the fact that so many of his descendants are based in Europe. As any dominant stallion's influence spreads through the breed, an increasingly large proportion of the best young broodmares are effectively denied him and his best sons. This could explain why some of Mr. Prospector's most successful sons have struggled to maintain their success rate as they have become older.

Moving on to the Poule d'Essai des Pouliches, this Classic added another chapter to the interesting life story of Gone West's son Zamindar.

Zamindar first sired a winner of this Classic in 2002, when Zenda, a filly from his first crop, triumphed for Juddmonte.

Unfortunately, Zamindar's stallion career had been badly interrupted by a health issue which meant that Zamindar had to miss most of his third season in 2000. Only one foal was born in 2001, by which time Zamindar had been switched to Florida, where he spent the 2001 and 2002 seasons at a fee of only \$5,000.

His first crop wasted little time in highlighting Zamindar's potential in 2001. His first stakes winner Lipstick was unlucky not to collect the very valuable first prize in the Watership Down Stud Sales race. She was followed by such as Zenda, Jubilation (Listed Prix de Pontarme and later to become a Group 3 winner), Victorian Order (Listed Prix Pelleas), Minds Locked (a creditable fourth in the G1 Prix Jean Prat), Pertuisane (third in the G1 Garden City Breeders' Cup H.) and Zargus (Balmoral H. at Royal Ascot). **Caulfield cont. p6**

These achievements were good enough to earn Zamindar a return ticket to Banstead Manor Stud, and his return became all the more urgent when his exceptional brother, Zafonic, died in a paddock accident in the summer of 2002 in his first year as a shuttle stallion to Australia. Zafonic had been represented in 2002 by group winners in Britain, Italy, Germany, France and the USA, and, with a first-crop classic winner to his credit, Zamindar was widely viewed as a suitable replacement. He

received support from numerous top breeders in 2003, including, the Aga Khan, Cheveley Park Stud, Darley, Gainsborough Stud Management and Shadwell, as well as from several of France's top breeders.

The Aga Khan sent three mares and he and his daughter Princess Zahra have been rewarded with Darjina, who thrust her nose ahead at Longchamp to deny Finsceal Beo a second Classic success. Incidentally, Darjina, Finsceal Beo and Zenda were all sired by sons of Gone West from Northern Dancer line mares which create 4x4 inbreeding to the legendary Windfields stallion.

The chances are that there are more stakes winners to come from Zamindar's 2004 crop, which also includes the Italian stakes winner Sweet Wind Music. His highly regarded daughter Coquerelle is among the entries for next Sunday's G1 Prix Saint-Alary, the main trial for the Prix de Diane, having won her last three races in fine style.

One of her wins was gained at the expense of Cinnamon Bay, who is also expected to step up to stakes company, and San Domenico, Fan Club, Lost Ark and Everlasting Fame are others with above-average ability.

A horse like Zamindar, with a fluctuating record, is bound to fall prey to the whims of commercial breeders, but Juddmonte has continued to support him and I note that the Aga Khan has a pair of juveniles by Zamindar. One is a colt out of half-sister to Zalaiyka, one of his previous winners of the French 1000 Guineas.

The female line which produced Darjina is proving one of the most successful in the Aga Khan's stud book. Her fifth dam Djebellina was acquired in the late 1970s as part of a large parcel of Marcel Boussac bloodstock, which also included her 1979 Labus filly Darazina.

The Pouliches winner is the third Classic winner to emerge from this family, her predecessors being Daryaba and Darsi. Daryaba, the 1999 Prix de Diane winner, is out of Darazina's very useful daughter Darata. Darsi, last year's Prix du Jockey-Club winner, is out of Darashandeh, a mare very closely related to Darjina's second dam, the group-placed Daralbayda (both mares were by Mill Reef line stallions out of the Group 3-winning Empery mare Daralinsha).

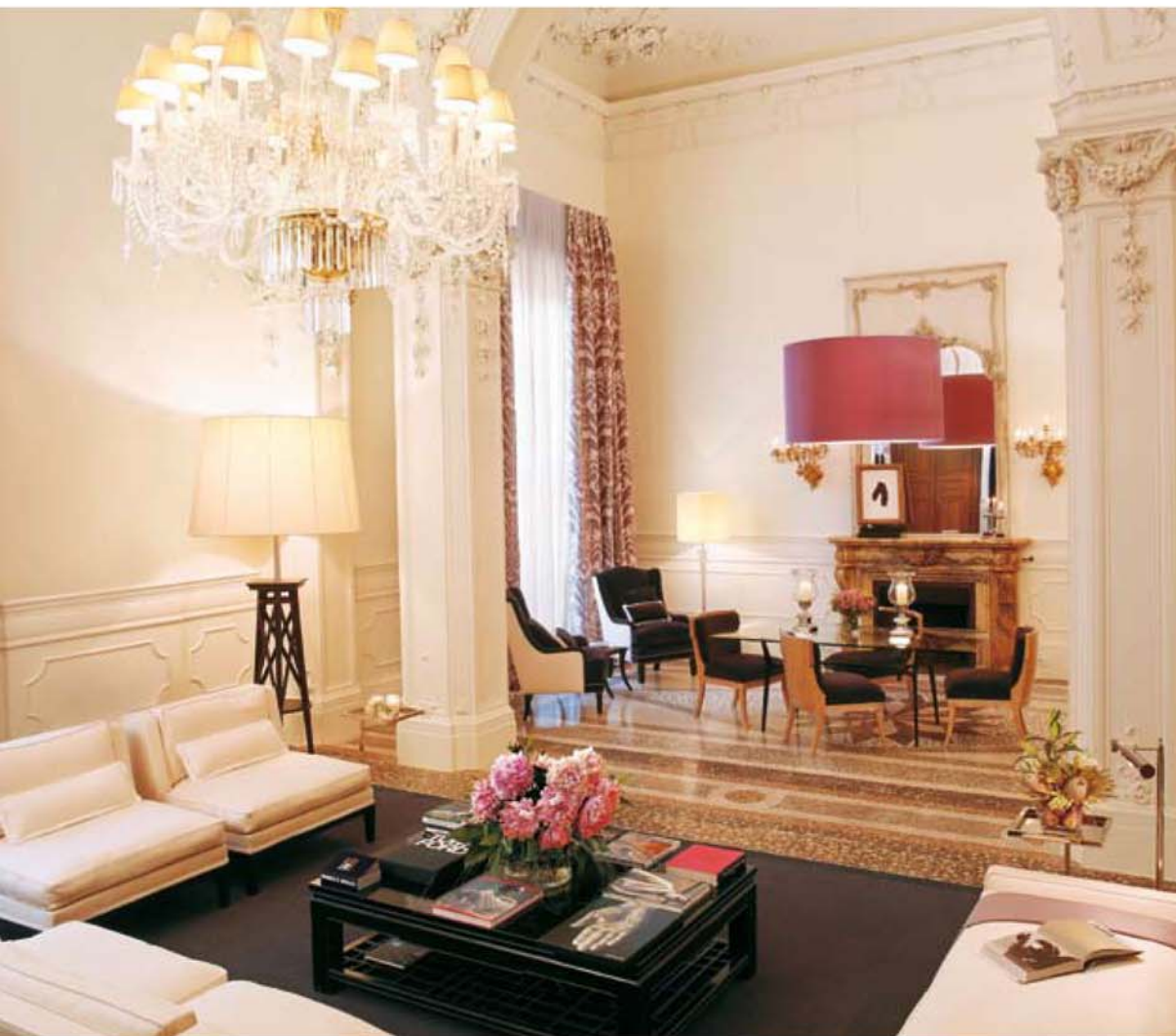
There is plenty of stamina in this female line and Darjina's dam, Darinska, was suited by a mile and a half, even though she is by Zilzal, a brilliant miler. No wonder the Prix de Diane is now under consideration for Zamindar's unbeaten daughter.

Jackson Reaches Settlement with Diaz-Valdes, Martin: By Ryan Conley, courtesy of [bloodhorse.com](#)

Two defendants named in Jess Jackson's California lawsuit involving alleged horse sale fraud have reached separate settlement agreements with the horse owner, attorneys on both sides of the legal action have confirmed. Agents Fernando Diaz-Valdes and Brad Martin, who were among the eight defendants named in the lawsuit originally filed in San Diego Superior Court in September 2005, join trainer Bruce Headley in having reached settlement agreements. Diaz-Valdes was accused in court documents of conspiring with others to defraud Jackson on certain private horse transactions. Diaz-Valdes has in pleadings denied any wrongdoing, and had filed defamation and libel cross-claims against Jackson. A joint statement delivered to *The Blood-Horse* by Diaz-Valdes' attorney, James R. Morgan, said all issues have been resolved between his client and Jackson: "Kevin P. McGee and Richard A. Getty, attorneys for Jess Jackson, and James R. Morgan, attorney for Fernando Diaz-Valdes, announced (May 9) they have amicably resolved all issues between them. No money shall change hands as a result of this agreement, and Jess Jackson shall drop all claims against Fernando Diaz-Valdes, including claims for fraud, conspiracy and punitive damages. "Conversely, Fernando Diaz-Valdes has agreed to drop all claims against Jess Jackson. Both Jess Jackson and Fernando Diaz-Valdes wish each other well in their future endeavors in the Thoroughbred horse industry. All claims and cross-claims shall be dismissed with prejudice."
