### REBEL WITH A CAUSE

Phil Cunningham's G1 2000 Guineas winner **Cockney Rebel (Ire)** (Val Royal {Fr}) heads the list of 20 probables for the Irish equivalent at The Curragh Saturday. Runner-up **Vital Equine (Ire)** (Danetime {Ire}) is set to reoppose his Newmarket conqueror in the Classic, it was confirmed after yesterday's five-day declaration stage. Cockney Rebel has delighted connections in recent workouts, and his weekend exercise at Newmarket left trainer Geoff Huffer with little doubt he can follow up in the €400,000 Boylesports-sponsored event. "I really think this horse could be a legend," the trainer told *Racing Post*. "That was the best piece of work I've ever seen from a horse; it was absolutely astounding. He moved so well and, unbelievable as it seems, he has come on for his run in the Guineas. I can't wait for him to run." Vital Equine's trainer Eoghan O'Neill was also in confident mood ahead of the eagerly anticipated rematch. "It was quick ground at Newmarket and, if it comes down to a scrap, you'd want Vital Equine on your side," he told the trade daily. "Take nothing away from Cockney Rebel, who was the best horse on the day, but we are happy to take him on again." Aidan O'Brien still has a team of seven engaged, including **Duke of Marmalade (Ire)** (Danehill) and **Eagle Mountain (GB)** (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), who finished fourth and fifth, respectively, in the May 5 Rowley Mile Classic. The home defence is strengthened further by Jim Bolger's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains runner-up **Creachadoir (Ire)** (King's Best), who will seek compensation for his half-length defeat at Longchamp May 13. The County Kildare course is currently riding good and is expected to remain so over the next five days, which will negate the need for watering the track. "There have been some showers in recent days that have helped taked the sting out of the ground, and it is perfectly good racing ground," Clerk of the Course Joe Collins told *Racing Post*.

**SPENCER SUSPENSION CONFIRMED**

Jamie Spencer will miss the entire Epsom Derby meeting after his appeal to overturn a portion of the 10-day ban he incurred at Longchamp May 13 failed yesterday. Spencer was originally banned for two separate offences when partnering **Excellent Art (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) to finish fourth in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas), but was only appealing the latter of those in a bid to make the Epsom Classics. The jockey was represented at France Galop's Boulogne headquarters by solicitor Rory Mac Neice, who told *PA Sport*, "We appealed against the four-day element of the 10-day ban, but the suspension was upheld." Having to serve an unrelated two-day ban imposed by Ascot's stewards, Spencer will be on the sidelines from May 23 through June 3.

Ted Durcan will replace Kerrin McEvoy for the choice ride on G1 Epsom Derby second favorite **Salford Mill (Ire)** (Peintre Celebre), as McEvoy is likely to be claimed by Godolphin for the June 2 Blue Riband. McEvoy was aboard Salford Mill when successful in the May 5 Listed Newmarket S. last time, but Durcan will renew acquaintance, having ridden the sophomore to finish second on his seasonal return in the Apr. 18 Listed Feilden S., also at Newmarket. "I spoke to Kerrin's agent, and he thinks Godolphin will have a Derby runner," trainer David Elsworth told *PA Sport*. "Ted had ridden the colt before, knows him, and we needed to get it sorted out. Salford Mill didn't work as well as he usually does [in his latest morning trial], but is in great form and is still on course for Epsom."

Rather like darling Clementine in the famous old song, Mr. Prospector is lost and gone forever. But whereas Clementine's untimely demise left everyone dreadful sorry, Mr. Prospector lived life to the full, being active right up to his death at the age of 29 in June 1999, and we can only celebrate his vast contribution to American breeding.

As the very likeable Curlin thrust his nose ahead of Street Sense to wreck Triple Crown hopes for another year, he became no less than the 24th male line descendant of Mr. Prospector to win an American Triple Crown race. Altogether, these 24 have landed nine victories in the Kentucky Derby, 11 in the Preakness and 12 in the Belmont, and Curlin is its seventh winner of the Pimlico Classic in the eight years since Mr. Prospector's death.

This male line's astonishing Classic dominance was achieved by three sons of Mr. Prospector, 10 grandsons, 10 great-grandsons and one great-great-grandson, and we can be confident that plenty more Triple Crown success awaits Mr Prospector's great-grandsons.

The late lunge by Curlin (whose pedigree I reviewed on Mar. 20) may have scuppered Street Cry's chances of siring a Triple Crown winner in his first crop, but it was still a very good weekend for this grandson of Mr. Prospector--and for some of Mr. Prospector's other stallion grandsons.

Street Cry added two more group/graded winners to his tally, which now stands at a highly impressive six, from a crop of 81. One aspect of Street Cry's success which interests me is that his latest graded victories both came over six furlongs, with Street Magician taking the GIII Hirsch Jacobs S. at Pimlico and Per Incanto taking the G3 Premio Tudini at Rome's Capanelle track. With his daughters Street Sounds and Majestic Roi taking, respectively, the GII Beaumont S. and G3 Dubai Duty Free S. over seven furlongs earlier this year, Street Cry's progeny are clearly capable of showing a lot more speed than might have been expected.

Street Cry himself showed plenty of speed early in his career, when he won over 6½ furlongs and failed by only a head to land the GII Del Mar Futurity, but he quickly graduated to distances of a mile or more. His finest performances came over 1 1/8 and 1 1/4 miles. His dam, Helen Street, won the Irish Oaks over 1 1/2 miles, showing the sort of stamina we came to expect of her Derby-winning sire Troy. The stamina in the bottom half of Street Cry's pedigree seemed to have dominated the precocious speed shown by his sire Machiavellian, and Street Sense's Kentucky Derby victory over a mile and a quarter was in line with my expectations of Street Cry's progeny.

I am now having to revise my expectations. Both of Street Cry's parents were very accomplished juveniles--as was Machiavellian's champion sister Coup de Genie--and this speed can clearly emerge in Street Cry's progeny, especially if he receives a little help from his mares. Per Incanto is out of a very speedy daughter of the sprinter Indian Ridge, while Street Magician is out of a daughter of Meadowlake.

Street Cry's biggest pay day came in the Dubai World Cup, a race which also fell to another of Machiavellian's sons, Almutawakel. Coincidentally, Almutawakel was in the news at the weekend, as well, as his son Awelmarduk became a Group 1 winner in the Derby Italiano.

Unfortunately, Almutawakel was forced into retirement at the age of 11 towards the end of last year because of an arthritic stifle. With fewer than 140 foals in his first three Irish crops, Almutawakel was also responsible for Silver Cup, another Italian Classic winner who went on to gain a trio of Grade II victories in California. He did even better in New Zealand, where he sired Wahid, winner of the New Zealand Derby, and Vital King, successful in this year's Hong Kong Derby. Considering that he wasn't expensive, Almutawakel ranks alongside Street Cry, Medicean, Titus Livius and Vettori as an advertisement for Machiavellian's prowess as a sire of sires. Machiavellian, of course, was inbred 3x4 to Native Dancer and 4x4 to Almahmoud, the pair responsible for Northern Dancer's dam Natalma. This must be relevant, as Danehill, an exceptional stallion who is also shining as a sire of sires, was inbred 3x3 to Natalma.

The other grandson of Mr. Prospector to excel over the weekend was Gone West's son Zamindar, who was discussed here a week ago. I am considering changing roles to that of tipster, as last week I wrote:

"The chances are that there are more stakes winners to come from Zamindar's 2004 crop, which also includes the Italian stakes winner Sweet Wind Music. His highly regarded daughter Coquerelle is among the entries for next Sunday's G1 Prix Saint-Alary, the main trial for the Prix de Diane, having won her last three races in fine style. One of her wins was gained at the expense of Cinnamon Bay, who is also expected to step up to stakes company."

Cinnamon Bay duly gained her first stakes success in impressive style four days later, and then the well-related Coquerelle took the Saint-Alary to become Zamindar's second Group 1 winner in the space of eight days, following Darjina's triumph in the French 1000 Guineas.

Zamindar and his brilliant brother Zafonic had The Minstrel as their broodmare sire, so it was inevitable that breeders would try sending them mares with pedigrees containing The Minstrel's three-parts-brother Nijinsky II.

Zafonic had more than 20 foals out of mares by Nijinsky's top-class son Caerleon, which created 4x4 to Northern Dancer and 5x4 to Flaming Page. His best result was the Group 2 winner Zipping, fourth in the 2002 2000 Guineas, but Zamindar has done even better with Caerleon mares, which are responsible for

the unbeaten Coquerelle and the useful French three-year-old Lost Ark.

In comparing Zafonic and Zamindar, it is interesting that Zamindar now has three Group 1 winners among the 263 foals in his first six crops (he has another 51 coming on line in his 2005 crop). Zafonic, on the other hand, sired four Group 1 winners among the 633 named foals in his nine crops, the last of which is four years old in 2007.

This statistic suggests strongly that Zamindar has the potential to be a better sire than his older brother, even though Zafonic had comfortably the better form (Timeform rated Zafonic fully 14 pounds superior to Zamindar). This also supports the view that Zamindar (always held in very high regard by Andre Fabre) never revealed the full extent of his talent on the racecourse, largely because of a reluctance to settle as a juvenile.

## CAPITAL PLAY MAKES ITS BID

With the current franchise to operate the three major New York tracks--Belmont, Aqueduct, and Saratoga--set to expire on Dec. 31, 2007, it likely won't be long before New York State lawmakers vote on who is awarded the next franchise. There are four operations in contention: the New York Racing Association, which has held the franchise since 1955, as well as Excelsior Racing, Empire Racing and Capital Play. The four bidders made their proposals in public hearings Apr. 10-11.

The New York City-based Capital Play was a late arrival on the scene, but quickly established itself as a major player with a strong proposal backed by deep pockets. The company recently joined in partnership with Plainfield Asset Management LLC to create "a fully funded bid team."

In contrast to the other three candidates, which boast mostly domestic rosters and familiar names, Capital Play sports an international cast that has broad experience in Australian racing. Representatives of Capital Play emphasize the organization is by no means an "Australian" company. Nor do they consider themselves to be a group of outsiders.

Last Friday, the *TDN's* Lucas Marquardt sat down with Karl J. O'Farrell, the president and CEO of Capital Play. The Irish-born O'Farrell, a graduate of Trinity College in Dublin, the Dublin Institute of Technology and the prestigious Wharton School of Business in Philadelphia, laid out Capital Play's plans for the New York tracks. He offered his perspective on synthetic racing surfaces and current conditions on the backstretch, and explained why he thinks the Belmont S. should be one of the world's richest races.

This will be the first of four interviews with the respective principals of the four major bidding groups.

### **What's your opinion of the state of racing in New York, and the U.S. in general?**

Well, there isn't one track that's really increasing attendance. There's the idea that VLTs will save everything, but really you've got to fix racing itself. And it's our viewpoint that it can be fixed. Australia, 20 years ago, was in a very similar position to where New York is today. There was declining attendance, and the average patron was male and aging. In 20 years, there would have been no one at the tracks. Women had stopped attending; the glamour of it all, apart from the big days, was all gone.

It is our viewpoint that you have to put investment back into the tracks, and there has to be a marketing plan.

Racing is now the biggest sport in Australia. The recent Melbourne Cup festival attendance was 57-percent female; the average age was just under 35, and it generated A\$680 million in economic activity for the city of Melbourne and the state of Victoria.

There has to be a focus on getting young people back and also bringing in the corporate market. By doing that, attendance increases as the companies use it to market their products.

### **How do you get young people to the track?**

The way to get young people to the track is by getting women there, and you're only going to get women to go if it's an interesting place to be. You need good restaurants with quality food and good wines. And you've got to have the glamour. Now, it isn't going to be every day, but there are enough of those big days to create glamour and carry the sport through.

Even on the off days, people should be able to go to the track to have lunch and have an enjoyable time, to bring business clients there.

For instance, we look at Aqueduct as a place that can be hip and young and vibrant--that's the promotion. And Belmont; we see Belmont essentially as New York's corporate dining room. You want companies to be able to host functions there, to be associated with a glamorous sport.

**Some people say that there are too many sports options in New York--baseball, football, etc.--for racing to be seriously competitive. How do you respond to that?**

Again, look at Australia: runner-up in the World Championship Rugby; just won the Cricket World Cup; competes evenly with the U.S. in swimming--it's a huge sport in Australia. There's Aussie Rules (Football), there's Rugby League. The Sydney Olympics was one of the most successful Olympics in recent history. I mean, there are a lot of options. To the people who say there are too many sport options, I say you've given up on racing, and you shouldn't do that, because this sport is very resilient. If you feed it properly, it will come back to its rightful place.

**What are some things you can do to help 'feed' the tracks?**

Well, by our numbers, excluding Saratoga, about 1.2 million people attend the New York tracks each year. Which means out of an 8-million population in New York City, you've got an attendance rate of about 15 percent. On top of that, you've got 50 million people who come to New York each year to visit. And if .01 percent of those people attended a race track in New York, I'd be surprised. Again, I'm excluding Saratoga.

I did a little survey myself last week in New York. I picked 10 hotels and went to their concierges. I started at the Waldorf and finished up at the Comfort Inn in midtown. Not one of them had anything about horse racing to give to their guests--not one of them. It's such an easy thing to do, to put out fliers or pamphlets, and it doesn't cost much. Have a day at the track where all the concierges come, and promote the track. I don't know what the numbers would be, but I bet that if you did that over a two- or three-year period, you'd get 700,000 people.

**Capital Play has stated that it will focus on rebuilding the images of Belmont and Aqueduct. Starting with Belmont, what do you envision?**

We think that Belmont Park should be the number-one track in the world. It should have the number-one race in the world, which is the third leg of the Triple Crown, the Belmont S., and we want it to have the

biggest prize money in the world. And that's our intention. As soon as the Preakness is over, there should be a festival that starts that leads up to the race. And it shouldn't be dependent on whether there's a potential Triple Crown winner. Of course that adds to the excitement, but it actually shouldn't depend on that.

**What kind of purse do you envision for the Belmont Stakes?**

What's Dubai [World Cup] now--\$6 million? It's got to be that and more. We think that New York should have the best track in the world, and we think New Yorkers should be proud of their track. Right now, New Yorkers aren't proud of the state of their racing. Our whole focus is that we want to turn racing into something really special again.

**What do you do with a place like Aqueduct, which, to be frank, can be a dreary place in January?**

That's because it's been allowed to become dreary. What we'd like to do is install the VLTs, then put in a five-star hotel. We'd like Aqueduct to be the waiting room for JFK [airport], which is right across the street. We'd like to create a casino entertainment environment there, very upper market. I don't mean 'upper market' meaning 'for the rich,' but as a hip and urban venue. It's located in a working-class environment, but we also want to attract New Yorkers who will go because it's an interesting and exciting thing to do.

As far as people visiting New York, we think people will spend either their first or last day--particularly their last day--at that hotel before they leave New York, having fun. **Cont. p9**

And we'd bring the capacity down to hold 30,000 people. Aqueduct holds around 70,000 or 80,000 people, which does not reflect the attendance potential today. On Wood Memorial Day, the biggest day at Aqueduct, they had 8,000 people there. We believe we can get attendance for that day back up to 30,000. Is it ever going to be 100,000? Maybe that's not realistic, but we can get it back to a good crowd.

We Also want to design Aqueduct so that, if you go on a winter's day on a Wednesday, you have the ability to close down parts of the stands. So if there's 5,000 or 6,000 people there, it feels pretty busy and people don't feel like they're in this deserted place.

The one thing that offends me the most is when I went and looked at the backstretch. I've been to some of the poorer parts of South Africa, and the conditions were similar with that. That, to me, is disgraceful. In a sport made up of many wealthy people, you don't treat people like that. You treat people with respect, and it's an indictment on the industry, and an indictment on all of us involved to let it continue to happen. We will fix that immediately. You have to give people quality living conditions and, one of my pet projects, is to give people scholarships. We would get together with the unions and work out a plan to help people build up their education levels, to learn English, that kind of thing. Or else you're keeping people in poverty, and you should never do that. You need to give people opportunities, and this is the land of opportunity.

**What about Saratoga?**

We really wouldn't do much with Saratoga. The only thing we'd do is to immediately recommend to put it into the National Historic Trust, to protect it forever. It's important to remember, our whole team is made up of racing people through and through. Saratoga is one of the most historic tracks in the world--the most historic track in the U.S.--and it's important to preserve that track. There are a few things the community wants up there: a safety rail, possibly an all-weather track. On a personal level, one of my biggest things is that a track of that significance should have a fence around it in keeping with the historic nature of it, and it now has a chain-link fence around it that is unacceptable.

**How do you feel about all-weather tracks in New York racing?**

We'd like to see all-weather tracks at all three courses, because that's the way things are moving, and it's safer for the horses. There are still some things that are being worked out, such as how it handles extreme cold and extreme heat, but there are people with greater minds than mine who will figure that out.

**Slots at Saratoga?**

No. We'd like to have them at Belmont, and think that would be an advantage to the state and to everyone. But we'll listen and liaise with the Saratoga community to make sure we come to decisions that are beneficial to everyone. Remember, we see ourselves as custodians of these tracks, especially Saratoga, which has such rich traditions and history.

**There has been a disagreement between NYRA and New York State over who owns the land Belmont, Aqueduct and Saratoga sit on. Are you worried about that?**

We think, when all is said and done, that the state owns the land. We've gotten opinions from three lawyers, and we feel confident about that. And if NYRA really cares about racing, it will give up the claim on the land. They can't say they care about racing and still hold the claim they own the land instead of the state, and over whoever runs the tracks. That's incompatible.

**Should you be awarded the franchise, do you see a complete overhaul of the current staff at the tracks?**

When it comes down to it, we'll have a significant number of roles for the current NYRA staff, including senior management and trustees, because they have the history. Our viewpoint is to come in and restructure New York racing. We believe that there are amazing people at NYRA who love this sport and care about it, but who may have lost their morale for whatever reason.

**How hard is it going to be for Capital Play to accomplish its goals?**

We think we can do this. It requires money and vision, and a plan you can implement. I've said to many people before, we're not reinventing the wheel here. We're not finding the cure for cancer. This is something that has worked elsewhere, and it will work in New York.

## PREAKNESS OVERNIGHT RATINGS DIP SLIGHTLY

Overnight ratings for NBC's telecast of the May 19 GI Preakness S. registered a slight decrease from a year ago, when Barbaro attracted much attention for the second jewel of racing's Triple Crown. NBC reported a 5.4 rating and a 13 share of the audience for this year's Preakness telecast, which aired from 5 p.m.-6:48 p.m. ET. That represented a five-percent dip from 2006's 5.7/14. One ratings point equals 770,000 viewers in overnight ratings, and the 13 share represents the percentage of televisions in use that were tuned to the race. This year's Kentucky Derby telecast drew an 8.3/18 in the overnights. The race segment of the Preakness show, from 6-6:30 p.m., attracted a 7.4 rating. NBC reported that the Preakness telecast was the highest rated sports show of the day, far outdistancing FOX's baseball coverage of the New York Yankees--New York Mets tilt. Since NBC took over the Preakness in 2001, the average overnight rating for the telecast has been a six, up by more than a third from the previous seven years, the network said. The top 10 markets for the Preakness telecast were: 1) Baltimore (21/41); 2) Louisville (16.5/34); 3) Buffalo (12.6/30); 4) West Palm Beach (11.9/25); 5) Columbus (10.8/22); 6) Orlando (10.8/20); 7) Fort Myers (10/19); 8) St. Louis (9.3/20); 9) Cleveland (9/19); and 10) Knoxville (9/18).
