THIS COUPE RUNNETH OVER

Returning to Europe after an unsuccessful Dubai venture in the spring, **Stage Gift (Ire)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) displayed admirable fight to land an eventful renewal of the G3 La Coupe at Longchamp. Victorious in last term's G3 Darley S. at Newmarket in October, he finished off the board in both the Feb. 8 G3 Maktoum Challenge (Round 2) at Nad Al Sheba and Mar. 1 G2 Jebel Hatta at the same track last time, but benefitted from an astute Kerrin McEvoy ride to double his stakes tally. Dictating matters on the front end from the bell, the Godolphin second choice was safely clear when the

field was depleted after halfway due to a spill and found extra when tackled in the straight to bag a second group-race success. The race was marred by a nasty-looking incident involving jockeys Frankie Dettori and Ronan Thomas, with the pair escaping serious injury despite parting company with their respective mounts. Dettori was catapulted to the turf when **Formal Decree (Ger)** (Diktat {GB}) slipped and fell on the bend at the exit of the backstraight. Thomas, aboard **Musical Way (Fr)** (Gold Away {Ire}), was also brought down in the process. The incident also claimed the chances of **Blushing King (Fr)** (Blushing Rambler), who eventually completed the contest a distance behind the remainder, and **Kilometre Neuf (Fr)** (Double Bed {Fr}) who was pulled up. A similar incident occurred during the first race on the card--a nine-furlong handicap--when Thierry Thulliez performed wonders to maintain his partnership with Selouma (Fr), who slipped on the same bend. Stewards cancelled the last three events on the middle course (moyenne piste) and transferred them to the main course (grand piste).

RACING MOURNS BARON GUY DE ROTHSCHILD

Baron Guy Edouard Alphonse Paul de Rothschild, one of France's premier breeders and owners, died Tuesday. He was 97. The French banker carried on the rich tradition of the de Rothschild family in business and in the sport his father Edouard had patronised with his Haras de Meautry operation in Normandy. Guy de Rothschild's most famous runner was Exbury (Fr), who went unbeaten through his 1963 season via the Prix Ganay, Coronation Cup, and Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud before punctuating the campaign with victory in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. Other notable successes came with Crystal Palace (Fr) in the 1977 Prix

du Jockey-Club (French Derby); the trio of fillies Cerisoles (Fr), Timandra (Fr) and Hermieres (Fr) in the Prix de Diane (French Oaks) between 1957 and 1961; Guersant (Fr), Cobalt (GB) and Soleil (Fr) in the Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas) from 1952 to 1966; and courtesy of Dictaway (Fr) and Timandra in the Poule d'Essai des Poulaches (French 1000 Guineas) in 1955 and 1960. De Rothschild also enjoyed success in the majority of his country's major races, including multiple renewals of the Prix Ganay, Grand Criterium, Grand Prix de Paris, Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud, Prix Jacques le Marois, Prix Royal-Oak and Prix Vermeille, the latest of which came with Indian Rose (Fr) in 1988. Following the election of President Mitterand in 1981, de Rothschild was forced to take a step back from racing and scale down his interests after the bank was nationalised. During the last 10 years, his sole horses in training were housed at the Pau base of Jean-Claude Rouget, who sent out Pinson (Ire) to record his last major success in the 2004 G2 Prix Guillaume d'Ornano at Deauville. He also chaired the association of racehorse breeders in France from 1975 to 1982 and is survived by his two sons, David Rene de Rothschild and Edouard de Rothschild, who is the current president of France Galop.

Mandesha Decision Delayed...

Princess Zahra Aga Khan's Mandesha (Fr) (Desert Style {Ire}) has yet to be committed to Wednesday's G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot, for which 11 stood their ground at yesterday's five-day stage. Last year's G1 Prix d'Astarte, G1 Prix Vermeille and G1 Prix de l'Opera winner satisfied connections in a key spin on the home gallops yesterday, but the four-year-old's program is still under discussion. "There is some discussion whether she will go there or not, which needs to take place and this will be taken later," the owner-breeder's Racing Manager Georges Rimaud told PA Sport. "She worked well today and the trainer needs to talk with the owner to decide which is the best route to go. This is a filly with a four-year-old career ahead of her. She has only had her seasonal debut recently and they need to figure out if this is the right way to go or not. The season is going to be long. We just need to be a bit careful and the decision needs to be well thought out." Mandesha captured Saint-Cloud's G2 Prix Corrida in her latest May 30. If she lines up Wednesday, she will meet an all-star cast including Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's G1 Irish Derby, G1 Irish Champion S. and G1 Prix Ganay winner Dylan Thomas (Ire) (Danehill) and the Ballydoyle runner's G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup conqueror Notnowcato (GB) (Inchiner {GB}), owned by Anthony and David de Rothschild and trained by Sir Michael Stoute. O'Brien has also left in George Washington (Ire) (Danehill), who is pencilled in for the previous day's G1 Queen Anne S., while Andre Fabre has committed Baron Georg von Ullmann's G1 Prix d'Ispahan scorer Manduro (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}) and Brian Meehan is set to run J. Paul Reddam's G1 Breeders' Cup Turf hero Red Rocks (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). Adding further spice to the 10-furlong contest is Anthony Pakenham's 2006 G1 Epsom Derby winner Sir Percy (GB) (Mark of Esteem {Ire}) and the Italian raider Pressing (Ire) (Soviet Star). Gary Tanaka's G1 Premio Presidente della Repubblica runner-up was yesterday supplemented by his new trainer Michael Jarvis.

A Stormy Night for McLaughlin:

Trainer Kiaran McLaughlin was getting ready to turn in for the night Tuesday, but Mother Nature had some plans of her own. "It was about 10 o'clock and I was going to bed, when suddenly I heard this 'Boom!'" he explained. "Lightning had hit the house, went right across the room and knocked everything out. Luckily my family was downstairs and no one was hurt, but the lightning knocked out the chimney. Our computers were on and we were fortunate to have the back up power surge protector. That saved them, but it burnt out the wireless router." He continued, "The chimney looked like it was hit by dynamite. All the brick came out. It caused some damage to my wife's car, but again, we're lucky no one was hurt." McLaughlin's wife, Letty, his 16-year-old daughter Erin and 13-year-old son Ryan, were downstairs at the time. "If you remember being a kid and setting off caps, that's what it smelled like only much more intense." On the horse racing front, McLaughlin said that Horse of the Year **Invasor (Arg)** (Candy Stripes) will work either this morning or tomorrow morning for his return engagement in the GI Suburban H. June 30.

American Oaks to Welcome First Aussie-Bred:

For the first time in its brief history, the GI American Oaks will feature a horse from Down Under. **Anamato (Aus)** (Redoute's Choice {Aus}), winner in her most recent appearance of the G1 Schweppes Australasian Oaks for trainer David Hayes, has accepted an invitation to the July 7 feature. The Oaks, the brainchild of Hollywood Park Racing Secretary Martin Panza, has become a truly international affair. Dimitrova (Ire) came from Ireland to take the 2003 running while Cesario (Jpn) took the 2005 renewal for the Land of the Rising Sun. Megahertz (GB) and Ticker Tape (GB), victorious in 2002 and 2004, respectively, were bred in England, but had raced on the California circuit prior to their successes. Although Anamato will be the first Australian-bred to compete in the 10-furlong turf event, three fillies bred in New Zealand competed in the 2004 Oaks.

"He is a nice horse, but still needs to learn how to settle and requires cover so that he doesn't do too much too soon," explained trainer Criquette Head-Maarek. MM CONCLUDES RECORD NATIONAL SALE

A record-breaking renewal of the Magic Millions National Sale came to a close on Australia's Gold Coast yesterday with a general yearling session. The marathon sale, which included weanlings, yearlings and broodmares over the span of 16 days, grossed in excess of A\$87 million, up some A\$16 million on last year's record total. "It's been a big few weeks here on the Gold Coast and our industry will look back on this sale as a landmark year for the selling of Thoroughbreds in this part of the world," said Magic Millions Managing Director David Chester. "Breeders can now be confident they can send any horse--no matter which sale or which budget--and know they are going to find a strong line-up of buyers to compete for their stock." Yesterday's action was topped by lot 3051, the four-year-old Kenfair (NZ) gelding Street Parade (Aus), who sold for A\$65,000. Street Parade was part of the Heinrich Racing Stables Reduction Sale that immediately followed the general session. Robert Smerdon bought the grey, who was the second-to-last horse through the ring. A son of Di Yvette (Aus), by Dignitas' Son (Aus), Street Parade is a winner of four races. **Cont. p10**

As the sale came to a successful conclusion, Chester said he'd already received dozens of complimentary messages from breeders and vendors from around the country. "Everyone knows our National Sale is the biggest and best breeding stock sale in the Southern Hemisphere--there's absolutely no doubt about that," he commented. "I know plenty of people were shocked at how well our National Weanling Sale went a couple of weeks ago--but it certainly didn't surprise me, we'd worked strongly to promote this sale in recent times. Traditionally in Australasia, weanling sales have been regarded as somewhat of a dumping ground--but it's not like that at the Gold Coast now." To illustrate the point, a Redoute's Choice (Aus) half-brother to MG1SW Dance Hero (Aus) became the first in Australian history to sell for seven figures when purchased by Coolmore Stud for A\$1.15 million. BREAKOUT '07 FOR AUSSIE YEARLING SALES

A total of 2,371 yearlings sold at Australia's major yearling sales in 2007 at an overall average of A\$135,627--up 25.7 percent from 2006, according to *The Australian Bloodhorse Review's* annual report. A whopping A\$321,572,350 changed hands--up 23.2 percent on the overall gross for 2006 of A\$260,959,750. The median was A\$70,000. The overall clearance rate was 82.4 percent with 3,111 catalogued. The sales included in the much-anticipated annual review are Inglis Easter, Melbourne Premier, Inglis Classic and Magic Millions Gold Coast January, and Perth and Adelaide Magic Millions. New Zealand's two majors--New Zealand Premier and New Zealand select--recorded similar increases with 798 sold (1052 catalogued, 965 offered) at an average of A\$98,327--an increase of almost 20 percent on 2006. The Australasian total was 3,169 sold at an average A\$136,939 (median of A\$72,222) for total turnover of A\$433,955.89. Strong demand for fillies throughout the season ensured a negligible difference between the average and median of fillies and colts. A total of 1,284 fillies averaged A\$124,571 (median A\$66,375) while colts averaged A\$123,205 (median A\$65,000). The New Zealand Bloodstock Select Sale recorded the strongest growth--a 43-percent increase in average to A\$49,715 for 435 sold.

The sparkling Inglis Easter results of Lonhro (Aus) ensured he was leading first-crop stallion by average (37 sold for A\$237,081 and a median of A\$200,000), ahead of Exceed and Excel (Aus). Darley's flagship stallion Elusive Quality--leading freshman at the sales last year--heads the second crop by average list with 40 sold at an average of A\$331,250 and at a median of A\$195,000, ahead of Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) (66 sold at an average of A\$186,356 and a median of A\$103,500) and Arrowfield resident Hussonet (Chi) (54 sold at an average of A\$136,449 and a median of A\$100,000). Leading third-crop sire by average was Galileo (Ire), with 44 sold at an average of A\$94,693 and a median of A\$67,500. Particularly notable was the outstanding leading New Zealand-based first-crop stallion Thorn Park (Aus); the son of Spinning World had 35 go under the hammer at an average of A\$104,986--more than 10 times his fee. It is no surprise, of course, that the ubiquitous Redoute's Choice (Aus) topped the overall table with 102 sold at an average of A\$577,000 and a median of A\$400,000, off a 2005 fee of A\$200,000.



FLANDERS FIELDS TO PERU *Flanders Fields* (A.P.

Indy--Flanders, by Seeking the Gold) has been purchased by Peruvian stud Haras San Pablo, who will stand the 3/4-brother to champion Surfside in the Southern Hemisphere. The deal was brokered by Byron Rogers, who is also the director of stallion operations for Taylor Made Farm. "Being by A.P. Indy and the fact that he's out of such a good race mare makes him very attractive for South America," Rogers commented. "He's going to have every chance to be an important sire." A homebred for Overbrook Farm and trained by Dallas Stewart, Flanders Fields won three times and was on the board in eight in his 13-start career, which featured a runner-up effort in the 2006 Woodchopper S. at the Fair Grounds.
