life in today's G1 Queen Anne S. Although Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's colt missed this meeting last year, he had dazzled sufficiently in winning the G1 2000 Guineas and G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. to ensure a lofty status at stud. Subsequently proven subfertile, the enigma was eased back into the Ballydoyle routine and resumes his old career today. "I think he's been back about three months, but he was back a

month before he went into the main string," commented Aidan O'Brien, looking for a second consecutive renewal following the exploits of Ad Valorem. "I think he was a little bit unsure about himself and his surroundings at two and three and can be wary, but he seems to have grown out of that mentally and we're hoping that's behind him now. ### COCKNEY TREBLE?

Established in 1834, the G1 St James's Palace S. is now firmly entrenched in the program as the traditional decider between the various Guineas heroes of Europe, and Phil Cunningham's **Cockney Rebel (Ire)** (Val Royal {Fr}) is the one to beat today. His sustained burst to capture Newmarket's G1 2000 Guineas May 5 was not in evidence at The Curragh three weeks later, but he had what it took to get the job done and complete the English-Irish 2000 Guineas double. He showed he can battle in the latter, though, and will need to here if he is to follow where Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) led in 2002 in pulling off the trio of triumphs. "We've had no hitches, he's in fine form and I'm well pleased with him," trainer Geoff Huffer told *PA Sport*. "I think he is still improving, too. He'll be a better horse than he was in Ireland. I keep looking for a chink in his armour, but I haven't found one yet." **St James's Palace cont. p2**

**A Brief History...**

Royal Ascot began courtesy of Queen Anne in 1711, with the first building established 82 years later and the racecourse officially recognised in 1813. In 1807, when the Ascot Gold Cup was run for the first time, the Royal meeting started to take shape. It was followed in 1825 by the inaugural Royal Procession and 20 years later by the Royal Enclosure. The St James's Palace S., Queen Anne S., Prince of Wales's S. and Coronation S. were all 19th-century creations, while the Golden Jubilee S. was introduced as the Cork and Orrery S. in 1868 and became known by its new title in celebration of the Queen's Golden Jubilee year in 2002. This year's meeting is set to take place on ground easier than in recent times after the rains arrived on the weekend. Clerk of the Course Chris Stickels declared, "I'm delighted with the course, it's in great condition."

**O'Brien Shoots for the Stars (Again)...**

Aidan O'Brien's record in the St. James's Palace S. reads three winners, a second and two thirds from the last seven renewals, and he continues a recent trend in opting for safety in numbers here. Heading the O'Brien triumvirate is Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's **Astronomer Royal** (Danzig), who overcame Jim Bolger's **Creachadoir (Ire)** (King's Best) to take the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains at Longchamp May 13. Kingmambo in 1993, Sendawar (Ire) in 1999 and Shamardal two years ago managed to complete the Poulains-Palace double, but the list of the vanquished in that period includes such as Ashkalani (Ire), Daylami (Ire) and Landseer (GB). Magnier, Tabor, Smith and Matthew Green's **Excellent Art (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) may be labeled unlucky not to be bringing the French 2000 Guineas crown into this contest after being repeatedly stopped before running on into fourth. Along with **Duke of Marmalade (Ire)** (Danehill), fourth in both the Newmarket and Curragh Guineas, they make up a formidable challenge from Ballydoyle. Of the former two, O'Brien said, "There wasn't much between them in France, and it will be interesting to see who gets the luck on the day. Astronomer Royal had to come wide off the bend and lost ground there, while Excellent Art was getting a clear run up the inner until late." Susan Roy and Cheveley Park Stud's **Dutch Art (GB)** (Medicean {GB}) is a prime contender and demonstrated when third in the Newmarket Guineas that he stays a stiff mile. That was in doubt because of the natural speed he showed at two when winning the G2 Norfolk S. here in June, G1 Prix Morny at Deauville in August and G1 Middle Park S. at Newmarket in October. "Dutch Art is in very good form," trainer Peter Chapple-Hyam said. "The St James's Palace has always been the plan for him since the Guineas and I'm more than happy with him. Cockney Rebel beat us fair and square at Newmarket, but we are going to try and reverse the form. All ground seems to come the same to him, so that won't be an issue. He is one of the few horses who can go on just about any ground."

Godolphin have stamped their considerable presence on this race more than any other at the meeting, winning six of the last 11 renewals. It is up to **Ramonti** to carry the royal blue this time, and the lightly raced five-year-old has a progressive profile. Trained by the Botti brothers in Italy until acquired by Sheikh Mohammed at the end of last year, he captured the G2 Premio Emilio Turati and G1 Premio Vittorio di Capua at the San Siro

and G2 Premio Ribot at the Capannelle last year. Third in the G1 Hong Kong Mile at Sha Tin in December, he justified his private purchase on his debut for his new connections when a head second to Terry Neill's **Red Evie** in the G1 Juddmonte Lockinge S. at Newbury May 19. Red Evie's rise to prominence began when winning the Listed Sandringham S. at this meeting in June and continued through with wins in Goodwood's G3 Oak Tree S. in August and the G1 Matron S. at Leopardstown in September, which was her seventh straight.

Trainer Michael Bell thinks she is up to taking on the colts again. "She's in very good form and it's a fascinating race, but we're up for it," he commented. "We could have taken the easy option and gone for the Windsor Forest, but we're on a mission." When Godolphin were missing out in this in recent times, Sir Michael Stoute was winning; he has been responsible for a trio of scorers since 2000. He relies on Betty Moran's **Jeremy**, another to taste success here 12 months ago in the G3 Jersey S. His success on his four-year-old bow in the Apr. 28 G2 Sandown Mile ended a subsequent losing streak, but he failed to land a blow when fifth in the Lockinge last time and needs to step up.

Last year's winner **Takeover Target** holds claims to being one of Australia's finest sprinters, but the fact that he is not categorically clear of his compatriots underlines the strength of the Antipodean brigade. A four-time Group 1 winner in his native country, most recently taking the May 26 G1 Doomben 10,000, he bested **Benbaun** in this event a year ago and powered away with the G1 Sprinters S. at Nakayama in October. Owner/trainer Joe Janiak is hoping lightning can strike twice. "He'll be nice and fresh for this and he's an old-stager at traveling now," he said. "We didn't expect to win last year, so it was a buzz, and he's more forward this year. He's a bit older and has probably lost a bit of early speed, but he's still very competitive." Takeover Target will have to get the better of **Bentley Biscuit**, who had him back in fifth when winning the G1 All-Aged S. at Randwick Apr. 14 before confirming the form with a short-neck score over the veteran in the G1 BTC Cup at Doomben last time May 12. "He went to the July course on Friday morning for his final gallop," trainer Gai Waterhouse told *racenet.com.au*. "He did the work very easily, with Nash [Rawiller] saying he feels spot on. Nash was particularly impressed with his strength on the line and he appeared to handle the undulations, which bodes well for Ascot."

The top two have barely a pound on **Miss Andretti**, who captured Moonee Valley's G1 Manikato S. in September before returning to that venue to add the Feb. 3 G1 Lightning S. and Feb. 17 G1 Australia S. to her resume. She annexed Caulfield's G1 Newmarket H. on her latest start Mar. 10 and is on a roll. "She's traveled well and has kept putting on weight and eating," trainer Lee Freedman explained. "She can produce very big times and, if she produces her best, she's going to run really well." Of the Europeans, **Dandy Man** commands the utmost respect. He was just a length down on Takeover Target when fourth here last year, despite racing on the far side away from the bias. Lightly campaigned since, he split **Tax Free** and last year's G1 Prix de l'Abbaye hero **Desert Lord** when second in the Listed Naas Sprint S. June 4, and connections are hoping these quicker conditions can held him come out on top.

**Henrythenavigator** created a stir when winning the same Gowran Park maiden as past Ballydoyle dignitaries Landseer (GB), Spartacus (Ire) and Antonius Pius by seven lengths on debut May 6. He is the stable's first string and, along with **South Dakota** and **Greek Mythology**, forms a strong raid on the trophy his stable has wrested four times since 1997. "Henrythenavigator is out of a very fast mare [Sequoyah {Ire}] for a Sadler's Wells, and he seems to have a lot of those qualities," trainer Aidan O'Brien said. "He is a very fast breaker with natural early speed. Although this is a big ask after only one run, we are very happy with him and always thought he was a classy horse at home." His stable companions are no back numbers, with South Dakota failing by a short head to give six pounds to **Pencil Hill** in a conditions event at Naas May 16 and Greek Mythology winning a solid Leopardstown maiden May 30. **Declaration of War** went two-for-two in Epsom's Listed Woodcote S. on Derby day June 2. "I am pleased with him," trainer Peter Chapple-Hyam said. "He is a tough and genuine horse who has got better and better. He looks to have a decent draw and won't mind any further rain." Paul Cole, who celebrated success in this heat with Dilum in 1991, Sri Pekan in 1994 and Red Sea (GB) in 1998, saddles **Luck Money**, who looked to have a bright future when taking a Newmarket maiden on debut May 26. Mick Channon sends out **Yem Kinn**, who got off the mark in his debut over five furlongs here May 12.

Christophe Soumillon has been freed to ride **Dylan Thomas** after it was announced that Princess Zahra Aga Khan's Mandesha was ruled out of the contest by trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre. Last year's G1 Prix d'Astarte, G1 Prix Vermeille and G1 Prix de l'Opera winner will instead contest Sunday's G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud before shipping into Britain later in the summer. "We have decided to go for the Grand Prix," her conditioner told the *Racing Post*. "She will then run in either the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. [at Ascot July 28] or the G1 Nassau S. If all goes well with Bentley Biscuit in today's King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot, this very good Australian sprinter will turn out again in Saturday's Golden Jubilee S., in the process attempting to complete a quick Group 1 double for his sire Peintre Celebre. But Bentley Biscuit, already a triple Group 1 winner this year in Australia, is a very different type from Peintre Celebre's other Group 1-winning son Sudan, hero of Sunday's Gran Premio di Milano over a mile and a half for his new owner Gary Tanaka.

While some of Italy's traditional Group 1 contests have lost a measure of prestige, the Gran Premio di Milano is an exception, as those top international performers Lando, Falbrav and Electrocutonist all rank among its winners in the previous 12 years. Sudan's Italian victory was his first at Group 1 level, but he had finished within two-and-a-half lengths of the subsequent Arc winner Rail Link on three occasions last summer, so he could become a potent force in America's top turf races later in the year.

Sudan is another fine advertisement for the Wildenstein family's breeding operation, which has produced so many top performers over the years. His family came into the Dayton organisation with the purchase of his second dam Special Happening, a Relaunch mare bred by Hilary J. Boone at Wimbledon Farm.

When I reviewed the Wildenstein operation for the *Thoroughbred Owner & Breeder* magazine last year, I commented, "The emphasis has always been on performance, and Daniel Wildenstein was happy to buy well-qualified racemares, even if their pedigrees were less than fashionable, a good example being Blue Tip. An inexpensive yearling, Blue Tip was by Tip Moss, a moderate stallion, and none of her first three dams ever raced. However, Blue Tip brought herself to Daniel Wildenstein's attention by winning the Prix La Camargo and G3 Prix Penelope. She justified her purchase by being placed in such good races as the Prix de l'Opera [twice] and E.P. Taylor S.

"Although she didn't prove as effective as a broodmare, Wildenstein's judgement has been vindicated by the fact that Blue Tip's daughter Bordighera is now the dam of Grandera and George Washington [and of the Pivotal colt which sold for 1,200,000gns in October].

"Bordighera was culled from the Dayton team, and the Wildensteins have always been prepared to sell fillies if the price was right [and if the family is well represented]."

Special Happening was acquired from Eugene V. Klein soon after she had won the Alcibiades S. in 1989. and she quickly rewarded Wildenstein with third in the Hollywood Starlet and victory in the Pasadena S., with her efforts earning her a weight of 116 pounds on the Experimental Free Handicap.

Special Happening's achievements were no doubt the major incentive for Wildenstein stepping in to buy her soon after she had gone through the ring at Keeneland for \$600,000. Her bloodlines must also have been part of her appeal, though. With Relaunch as her sire and a Scout Leader mare as her dam, Special Happening had a pedigree free of such influences as Northern Dancer, Raise a Native and Hail To Reason, and Wildenstein will have seen it as a bonus that her fourth dam was Glad Rags, winner of the 1000 Guineas in 1966. For the record, Glad Rags produced those very good performers Terpsichorist, Mirthful Flirt and Gorytus, and her descendants also include Colonial Affair (Belmont S.), Prince of Birds (Irish 2000 Guineas) and Dreams Gallore (Mother Goose S.).

Rather like Blue Chip, the mare mentioned earlier, Special Happening didn't transfer her excellence on the racetrack to the breeding barn. Although other daughters of Relaunch produced performers of the calibre of Ghostzapper, City Zip, Ad Valorem, Starrer, Stellar Jayne, Pure As Gold and Passing Shot, Special Happening failed to produce a single stakes winner among her first 12 foals. It's not as if she wasn't given every chance, as she has produce by such outstanding stallions as Nureyev, Riverman and Kingmambo.

However, as so often happens in these instances, some of her broodmare daughters are making amends, most notably her fillies by Woodman. Serengeti Park, her first daughter of Woodman, produced a Group 3 winner in Australia by Lure, and her second, the dual French winner Sarabande, is the dam of Sudan.

I hesitated to mention Woodman as one of the outstanding stallions with progeny out of Sarabande. Few stallions can have suffered as much character assassination over the years as Woodman. One the one hand he has given us such outstanding performers as Hawk Wing, Hansel, Timber Country, Hector Protector and Bosra Sham. On the other he has often sired animals which proved not to have the ability or the determination to match their flashy good looks.

Fortunately, Woodman is building up a solid record as a sire of broodmares and his daughters have good winners all over the world this year, including the outstanding Australian filly Miss Finland.

Woodman mares have done some good work with sons of Nureyev. Fasliyev sired that very good juvenile filly Carry on Katie from one, while Theatrical sired this year's Prix de Diane runner-up Mrs Lindsay from another. Peintre Celebre has also thrived with Woodman mares, notably siring Sudan and the 2003 Prix du Jockey-Club runner-up Super Celebre.

He went on to sire 30 stakes winners from his 16 crops, including GISW and millionaire Halo America, 12-time stakes winner Docent, and graded winners Buck Trout, Crosspatch and Wicapi. His progeny have earned more than \$25 million to date.

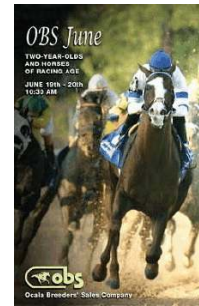

**Former NBA Player Files Lawsuit Against ClassicStar:**

Former professional basketball player Greg Minor is among the latest to join a long list of investors who claim former broodmare lease operator ClassicStar and its affiliates caused them to lose large sums of money. Minor, who played college ball at the University of Louisville and had a five-year pro career with the Boston Celtics, is among three related plaintiffs who June 12 filed a lawsuit in Florida federal court seeking damages well in excess of \$6 million from ClassicStar and other individuals and entities. The complaint claims Minor first heard a sales pitch from former ClassicStar marketing director S. David Plummer during the "feature presentation" of a 2003 meeting of the National Basketball Retired Players Association in Las Vegas. ClassicStar personnel later that year then allegedly treated the retired athlete and his wife, Stephanie, with all-expenses paid trips to Lexington, the 2003 Breeders' Cup races at Santa Anita Park, and a weeklong "business conference" in St. Croix of the U.S. Virgin Islands, where the Minors claim they eventually signed on for a mare lease program valued at more than \$9.1 million. As with other lawsuits claiming fraud by ClassicStar and its affiliates, the Minors' charge the lease program didn't deliver on pre-sale boasts of delivering significant federal tax savings. The Minors claimed more than \$9 million in deductions related to the program on their 2003 income tax return, write-offs that were first accepted by the Internal Revenue Service, but later rejected following a 2006 audit, the lawsuit alleges. **For the complete story, click [here](#).**
