THE TIME IS NOW FOR MOLENGAO

Lava Man (Slew City Slew) will have to be on top of his game today to become the first three-time winner of the GI Hollywood Gold Cup since Native Diver pulled if off between 1965-67. He's gotten the better of TNT Stud's **Molengao (Brz)** (Royal Academy) in their first three meetings, including a 3/4-length victory in the Mar. 3 GI Santa Anita H., but that rival appears to be ready to turn the tables following a razor-sharp victory over this course in the GII Mervyn LeRoy H. last time May 5. "It's tough because the race when he got beat by Lava Man, for my eyes, he overcame a very difficult situation because he ran against a very slow pace and he was the only one that was covering ground," trainer Paulo Lobo said. "I like the way that he overcame it and ran huge that day. But of course, the last race was an amazing race. I brought him [here] fresh from the Mervyn LeRoy. Since that race, he has been doing very well." Lava Man followed his victory in the Big 'Cap with a disappointing 16th-place finish in the G1 Dubai Duty Free Mar. 31, and failed to hold a clear lead in the stretch when he resurfaced with a second-place finish in the grassy GI Charles Whittingham Memorial H. most recently June 9. Today's Gold Cup marks Lava Man's first start over a synthetic surface. **cont. p3**

SUBURBAN IS 'FAIR' GAME

Fairbanks (Giant's Causeway) is clearly a better horse when able to dictate the early pace, and he will have every chance to prove that theory correct in today's GI Suburban H. at Belmont Park. The Team Valor colorbearer recorded a gaudy 115 Beyer when taking the GIII Tokyo City H. in wire-to-wire fashion at Santa Anita last time Mar. 31, but hasn't been heard from since. "He's coming off a huge race, but it wasn't Grade I competition," trainer Todd Pletcher said. "This is a horse that, if he gets loose going a mile and a quarter, he could be dangerous." **cont. p3**

GO WEST

French runners are rare in the G1 Pretty Polly S., which was run as a Group 2 until its upgrade in 2004, but Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum's **West Wind (GB)** (Machiavellian) looks sure to play a key role in today's renewal of The Curragh contest. As the first major encounter between sophomores and older distaffers, the race lives up to its status, with two winners and two runners-up from this year's Classics set to clash. Henri-Alex Pantall makes the journey from Beaupreau with pride and joy West Wind, who provided him with a first success at the highest level in Chantilly's G1 Prix de Diane June 10. "She is very well for the moment and in good form," Pantall told *PA Sport*. "I hope she is still improving." **cont. p4**

ROYAL APPOINTMENT

Andre Fabre enjoys his overseas forays, and he ships a live contender to The Curragh for tomorrow's G1 Irish Derby in **Royal and Regal (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells). Having annexed this prize with Winged Love (Ire) in 1995 and Hurricane Run (Ire) two years ago, the Chantilly maestro understands what it takes to make an impact here. On the face of it, Peter Savill and Susan Magnier's colorbearer has to improve on his second in Longchamp's May 8 G2 Prix Hocquart and his narrow win in the Listed Prix de l'Avre at that track 20 days later, but Savill is hopeful he will live up to expectations. "Andre Fabre has a very high opinion of this horse," Savill told the *Racing Post*. "He told me last year that he thought he would be a very nice horse and thought he was a Derby horse. It was really a case of trying to find the right Derby. The French Derby, being at a mile and a quarter, would be a bit short. He's convinced that he is a mile-and-a-half horse, and I remember him saying last year that he thought The Curragh would be the place for him. He's a big, long-striding horse, a galloper." **cont. p2**

As expected, Aidan O'Brien reduced his five entries to four yesterday when scratching Yellowstone (Ire) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), who will now head to Longchamp for the July 14 G1 Juddmonte Grand Prix de Paris. The chief Ballydoyle hope **Eagle Mountain** does not have Authorized (Ire) to contend with here, but the G1 Epsom Derby runner-up meets another representative of the Peter Chapple-Hyam stable in Abbey Horse Racing and Breeding Ltd's **Striving Storm**. That colt is reappearing for the first time since finishing runner-up in the Apr. 28 G3 Sandown Classic Trial, and his trainer is hopeful he can translate his sterling homework to the main event. "We are taking our chance and his work has been really good," his conditioner commented. "He will love the soft ground--in fact it couldn't be soft enough for him. I think he will run a huge race and he looks over-priced to me. If he could finish in the first three it would be superb." Sir Michael Stoute is seeking a fourth renewal and his first since Shahrastani scored in 1986. He puts forward Saeed Suhail's **Al Shemali**, who was third in the G2 Dante S. at York May 17 before finishing strongly when second in last Thursday's Listed Hampton Court S. at Royal Ascot. "Soft ground is a big benefit to him and he won his race as a two-year-old on soft last year," Racing Manager Bruce Raymond told *PA Sport*. "He has good form and I think his Dante run is good enough to give him a shout in this sort of company. He flashed home at Ascot, but I think they were really stopping in front. He couldn't go early as they went so fast, and he was a little outpaced. For a quality horse he is slightly slow to pick up, but we will see if he is at the very top on Saturday."

"I thought she was the best filly in the Ashland, she ran into some traffic issues at Fair Grounds, and obviously ran into a monster in the Kentucky Oaks." **Lady Joanne** has won her last three starts, including the GIII Dogwood Breeders' Cup S. June 2. **Boca Grande**, last term's GII Demoiselle S. heroine, was last seen finishing a disappointing fourth in the GI Acorn S. June 9.

Aidan O'Brien, looking for a first renewal, is in the pole position with G1 Epsom Oaks runner-up **Peeping Fawn**. Her half-length defeat by Light Shift in that June 1 contest followed a third behind Finsceal Beo (Ire) in the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas five days earlier, and she will be up for a battle on the soft going. Lady O'Reilly's **Dimenticata** split Finsceal Beo and Peeping Fawn in the Curragh Classic, and had previously proved she stays further than a mile when runner-up in the Listed Victor McCalmont Memorial S. over an extended nine furlongs of Gowran Park's circuit May 6. "The form of the Irish Guineas stood up and she ran just short of a mile and a quarter in the McCalmont, so the trip shouldn't be a any problem," commented her trainer Kevin Prendergast, who sent out Rebelline (Ire) in these colors to land his fourth renewal six years ago. Pam Sly sends over last year's G1 Irish 1000 Guineas heroine **Speciosa**, who played second fiddle to subsequent G1 Prince of Wales's S. winner Manduro (Ger) in the G3 Earl of Sefton S. on her four-year-old bow at Newmarket Apr. 19. She may have had excuses when trailing in Newbury's G1 Lockinge S. last time May 19, and her trainer is hoping she can bounce back. "She came heavily into season that day and it didn't work out at all," Sly explained. "We have to give Peeping Fawn and West Wind 12 pounds, but she's better off with a bit of ease in the ground, and she was staying on at the end of the Earl of Sefton over nine furlongs." John Oxx won this in 1993 with His Highness the Aga Khan's Takarouna and he saddles another homebred in **Timarwa**. She won a course-and-distance maiden with ease on her latest start May 27 and warrants respect.

While there doesn't appear to be anybody of the caliber of Roses in May, who won the Cornhusker in 2004, this year's renewal is a competitive affair headed by **Silent Pleasure**. The four-year-old colt extended his winning skein to four with a tally in the GIII Texas Mile Apr. 28, when he beat Bob and John. If his winning prep in the June 2 Jim Rasmussen Memorial over this surface is anything to go by, **Patriot Act** looks to have been pointed toward this race and could be primed for a top effort. At 20-1 in the morning line, **Deputy Glitters** is a live longshot.

Joseph LaCombe's homebred beat Bluegrass Cat in last year's GIII Tampa Bay Derby and won the GII Ohio Derby in his penultimate start for Tom Albertrani. Now with trainer Greg Fox, the colt was well-beaten in his two 2007 starts, but footing might have been an issue in both. Known to be a horse who needs a dry track, he ran seventh in a Churchill allowance May 4 in the slop, then was tried on the grass last time and faded to ninth in a minor Mountaineer stakes May 28. He has fired two bullets since.

Rooting against **The Tin Man** is like rooting against a rainbow, and the venerable veteran, still going strong at nine, enters this with just one loss in his last seven starts. That run includes a win in this race last July, followed by a victory in the GI Arlington Million. Trainer Richard Mandella opted to skip the Breeders' Cup after The Tin Man exited his wire-to-wire win in Santa Anita's GI Clement L. Hirsch H. a bit listless, and Mandella's patience was rewarded when The Tin Man returned this season to annex the GI Shoemaker Mile May 28. The Arlington Million could be the immediate goal for The Tin Man once again this year. **Right Special** is a late-running sort who is likely to get plenty of pace to run at. The South American import was a MGSW in Brazil before coming to the States for the 2007 season. He rallied into slow fractions to win a Hollywood allowance Apr. 26, then was a solid fifth, beaten 1 3/4 lengths, in the Shoemaker. **Becrux** was just ahead of Right Special in the Shoemaker, and last year's GI Atto Mile hero is capable of a big effort.

Brilliant subsequently missed some training and an expected start in Canada because of an elevated white blood cell count, but trainer Neil Howard said he is cautiously optimistic about Brilliant's chances today. "I'm slightly apprehensive, but I think everything's okay," said Howard. "In a perfect world, an extra work or two spaced a little more normal would have been a little better. But, all in all, he's doing good." Brilliant is three-for-four on the sod at Churchill and returns to a distance at which he's perfect in two starts. **Remarkable News** has been sneaky good in his career, winning eight of his 14 starts. He scored a pair of graded wins last term and more recently captured the GII Dixie S. at Pimlico May 19 in a smart 1:46 1/5 for the nine furlongs. Ramon Dominguez rides for Angel Penna Jr., who wins at an impressive 27-percent rate in graded stakes. Local **Obi Wan Kenobi**, an improving sort, could find his way into the exotics.

"He worked over 7 1/2 furlongs and everything went to plan," Chapple-Hyam commented. "I couldn't have been happier with his gallop and Frankie [Dettori] was delighted, too. That was his major piece of work before Sandown--I had to get one serious piece into him. He will now just have one more little blow as well as his routine exercise ahead of the Eclipse."

GREY SWALLOW HEADED TO STUD? Six-year-old **Grey Swallow (Ire)** (Daylami {Ire}--Style of Life, by The Minstrel) is likely to be retired, but will skip the upcoming Southern Hemisphere breeding season and will stand in the Northern Hemisphere in 2008. He is scheduled to return to Australia for stud duties to the newly developed Woodside Park at Woodend in Victoria. Trainer Dale Sutton said

"We are standing Econsul (NZ) at Woodend as our foundation stallion and we don't want to stand two in our first season. We will try to place him in the Northern Hemisphere for next year." The champion two-year-old in Ireland in 2003, Grey Swallow was the highweight three-year-old at 11-14 furlongs in his native country. He was also highweight older horse in that division in 2006, but made both starts in the U.S. that year, winning the GII Jim Murray Memorial H. at Hollywood Park and finishing third behind Cacique (Ire) in the GI Manhattan H. at Belmont. Purchased by Wadham Park principal Peter Rowsthorn for a reported A\$6-million from Irish trainer Dermot Weld

after that effort, he made his lone Australian start in the Cox Plate, but the plan unraveled when he became fractious in the barriers before the race. Although he was passed fit to run, the steward's report noted after the 2040-meter race that Grey Swallow had sustained lacerations to his hind leg. He finished last. "He got his [right hind] leg over the gates in the Cox Plate and did bone damage," Sutton said. Grey Swallow retires with six wins from his 15 career starts and earnings of A\$2,194,282. Northern Hemisphere stud plans have not been finalized.

ALL-WEATHER TRACK FOR OBS The Ocala Breeders' Sales Company announced yesterday that it is installing the all-weather surface Safetrack on its one-mile racetrack. The new surface is expected to be ready by mid-November. "Our paramount concern is for the welfare of the horses offered for sale," said OBS President Tom Chiota. "We have long been committed to providing a safe facility, and an all-weather surface will be a significant investment toward achieving that goal. In addition to safety, the ability of Safetrack to handle rain will ultimately lead to a more consistent racetrack throughout the duration of the under-tack shows."

CALIFORNIA RACING BACKS OFF AS TRIBES EXPAND GAMING by Jack Shinar, courtesy www.bloodhorse.com

As expansion of gaming for four Southern California casino tribes lurched toward approval in the Legislature June 28, it did so with little interference from the state's racing industry. Rather, the Thoroughbred Owners of California and most of the state's other racing organizations opted to not oppose 25-year operating compacts for four tribes that allows for up to 17,000 additional slot machines--potentially a 30-percent increase in the number of slots in the state. Both houses of the Legislature had to approve the gambling expansion, a key hurdle in passing a state budget. While a fifth compact awaits in legislative limbo, the nonpartisan Legislative Analyst's Office said additional gambling revenue could be close to \$200 million next year. Drew Couto, president of the TOC, said the group's decision to abstain from the fight--which pitted labor groups against tribes--was the result of ongoing negotiations with the casinos for future business that could benefit racing. He also said it was "a fallacy to believe" that racing could acquire the rights to slot machines either legislatively or at the ballot box within the current political climate. That's a remarkable change for a racing industry that has fought tribal gaming expansion at nearly every turn. **Click [here](#) for more.**

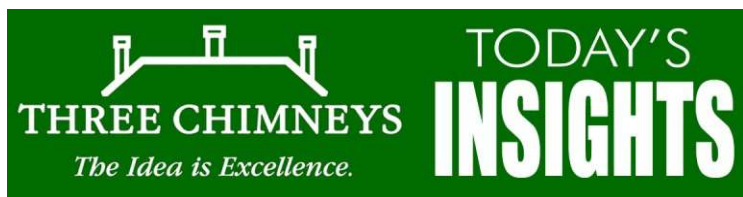

The New York Racing Association announced yesterday that it will be raising purses for the upcoming Saratoga meeting, as well as the final three weeks of the current Belmont Park meeting. Saratoga's daily purses will grow 13.6 percent, or \$92,694, while Belmont's purses will climb 12 percent, or \$61,826. Saratoga's daily purses averaged \$678,841 in 2006. Purses for the final three weeks of the 2006 Belmont Spring/Summer meet averaged \$514,637. "Higher purses attract bigger fields and better horses, and will ensure that Saratoga remains the greatest race meet in the country," said Steve Duncker, chairman of the NYRA. "Purse increases are good for horsemen, and they're also good for business. Since Saratoga generates our highest on-track handle, larger fields will increase that handle, and that's good business."

While the average and median dropped sharply at the final session, the 2007 Great Southern Sale saw nearly twice as many lots bring six figures as last year. PAPAL VISIT CAUSING CONCERNS

Trainers at the Australian Jockey Club's Randwick racetrack in Sydney's eastern suburbs have expressed serious concerns over the disruption and lengthy track closures planned when Pope Benedict celebrates World Youth Day at the course next July. Trainers, feed merchants, farriers and representatives of the Randwick Equine Centre met AJC officials and representatives from the State Government and Catholic Church on Thursday. Trainer John O'Shea said after the meeting that the various parties had been made fully cognizant of the impact the Papal Visit at Randwick, where about 600 horses work daily, would have on the industry, but no form of compensation was suggested. "The track will definitely be closed for 10 weeks. They are not telling us we have to leave, but we cannot possibly train horses there. I'm sure Racing New South Wales stewards will step in and say it is an unsafe environment to train horses in," said trainer Grahame Begg. Randwick Trainers' Association President Anthony Cummings said Randwick would be closed to racing for 10 weeks while a stage is built for Pope Benedict. More than 600,000 people are expected to attend the World Youth Day mass. "We have been told there is an opportunity for horses to stay here, but that is just not viable. The place will be a building site and raises insurance issues. We are entrusted with the care and well-being of very valuable horses, and it is not best practice to be training them on a building site," Cummings said.

CAMBRIDGE THROWS SUPPORT TO NEW ZEALAND

Sir Patrick Hogan's Cambridge Stud will sell exclusively at New Zealand Bloodstock's Karaka sale series next year. Cambridge was leading vendor on gross at NZB this year, with 41 horses returning NZ\$8.9 million, including the sale-topping Zabeel (NZ) colt from champion mare Sunline (NZ). Overall, the New Zealand stud sold 86 yearlings for A\$17.3 million, an average of A\$201,674, in 2007, compared with an Australasian average of \$A99,949. "New Zealand has held itself up internationally this year in an incredible fashion, with seven Derby winners in Australia, Macau and Hong Kong, plus an impressive display by Vengeance of Rain (NZ) in Dubai," Hogan said in a statement. "All of them are graduates of the Karaka sales ring, and two...are off Cambridge Stud's property. Following the outcome of the Karaka Sales Series earlier this year, I have huge confidence in the sale, and with our industry profiling itself so impressively, it is clear to me that Karaka is the place to sell next year." He added, "Our industry has a great opportunity to capitalise on the breaks it has received recently, and to do that we need to unite to restore our National Sale to its former glory as the premier source of top quality and good value Thoroughbreds. I believe this can be done, and have every intention of starting this year by helping to make Karaka 2008 a real show-stopper."
