BULL RUSH

Susan Magnier, Derrick Smith and Michael Tabor's hand in the upper echelon of the middle-distance division was strengthened further yesterday when **Papal Bull (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire})

bounced back to win the G2 Princess of Wales's S. at Newmarket. Below-par since his success in the G2 King Edward VII S. at Royal Ascot last June, the four-year-old put the disappointment of his unplaced effort in Sandown's May 31 G3 Brigadier Gerard S. firmly behind him to reward those who kept the faith at 11-1. Threading his

way through rivals to lead at the furlong marker, the dark bay established a 2 1/2-length advantage at the line despite his errant tendencies. "He wasn't traveling that well, but started enjoying himself picking off horses," jockey Ryan Moore commented. WATSON, I PRESUME

Leaving it late, The Comic Strip Heroes's **Winker Watson (GB)** (Piccolo {GB}) got to the front in the nick of time to deny **River Proud** (Proud Citizen) and defy a penalty in yesterday's G2 July S. at Newmarket. Workmanlike when taking the June 21 G2 Norfolk S. at Royal Ascot, the 11-4 pick was forced to pull out all the stops this time, storming from the rear to gain a short-head verdict. "I wouldn't say I gave him a very good ride," jockey Jimmy Fortune said. WORST KEPT SECRET

Despite his lack of experience at the top level, Bridget Swire's exciting new kid on the block **Sakhee's Secret (GB)** (Sakhee) was all the talk surrounding today's G1 Darley July Cup at Newmarket. He made an instant

impression when destroying a seemingly competitive lineup in the Voute Sales H. at the Craven meeting here Apr. 18, then opened his stakes tally with ease in the Listed Carnarvon S. at Newbury a month later. It was his dramatic acceleration in accounting for **Prime Defender (GB)** (Bertolini) by four lengths in Salisbury's Listed Cathedral S. on his latest start June 17 that really set the tongues wagging. Jockey Steve Drowne is hoping he can translate that prowess to this stage. "He's got a great chance, but you've got to remember he's an inexperienced three-year-old who has never had a tough race like this," Drowne commented. "He's certainly a Group 1 horse in my mind, but doesn't have the battle experience." Trainer Hughie Morrison, who saddled Pastoral Pursuits (GB) to win this in 2005, is even more guarded. "I think it's rather strange that he's favorite taking on proven Group 1 performers," Morrison said. "He's obviously gone forward since his maiden success, but what our horse has done so far hasn't warranted the attention he's got. He hasn't beaten anything of great note, but I'll be very surprised if he doesn't improve with age." **cont. p2**

A Prime Asset...

Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's colors were carried to success by Lake Coniston (Ire) in the 1995 G1 July Cup and **Asset (Ire)** (Marju {Ire}) looks to double that tally for the syndicate here. Unplaced behind George Washington (Ire) in the G1 2000 Guineas last May, he was put on the shelf after a subsequent second in Royal Ascot's G3 Jersey S. the following month, but returned with a bang when winning the Listed Abernant S. on the Rowley Mile here Apr. 19. The heavy rain that plagued the Royal meeting undermined his cause when third behind Budget Stable's **Soldier's Tale** (Stravinsky) in the June 23 G1 Golden Jubilee S. and trainer Richard Hannon Jr. is expecting better things back on a faster surface. "He's a horse that will be better on firmer ground, but he proved at Ascot that he actually can operate on softer ground as well," Hannon said. "I don't think he quite stayed the mile in the Guineas last year, but he's improved since and he's a much better horse now than he was last year and he's going to be a good sprinter. He's in great form at the moment--he looks absolutely super."

Jeremy Noseda is keeping a keen eye on the clouds above Suffolk as he ponders whether to pitch G1 Golden Jubilee S. winner **Soldier's Tale** back into this league. "Soldier's Tale, who is in great order and ready to run, will only take his place in the eventuality of the ground being on the soft side," Noseda explained. "We'll have to see what the weather does. If it does rain then he'll be there and I'm sure he'll acquit himself well." Noseda will be alone in his raindance. Connections of Ronnie Arculli's **Red Clubs (Ire)** (Red Ransom) are hoping for faster ground than the four-year-old encountered when a length behind Soldier's Tale in fourth in the Golden Jubilee. Last year's G2 Diadem S. scorer has been knocking on the door at this level and trainer Barry Hills' son and assistant Charlie is hoping that drier conditions can help him obtain the elusive Group 1. "He looked the winner a half-furlong down at Ascot, but didn't quite get home, as I think the downpour we had before the race took the finish out of him," he explained. "He seems to have come out of the race extremely well and has been fairly consistent over the years."

Sophomores have beaten their elders seven times in this race since 1990 and Susan Roy and Cheveley Park Stud's **Dutch Art (GB)** (Medicean {GB}) has the classic

profile of past three-year-old winners Chief Singer (Ire), Green Desert, Ajdal, Royal Academy and Mozart (Ire) in dropping back in trip after trying their hand in the mile Classics. Last year's G1 Prix Morny and G1 Middle Park S. winner was third in the May 5 G1 2000 Guineas before finish-

ing fourth in the G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot June 19. "After he was placed in the Guineas, I said he was going to run in the July Cup so it was always in the equation," conditioner Peter Chapple-Hyam commented. "He is coming back in trip, but he has so much natural speed. We could have waited for the Moulin or the Maurice du Gheest, but he seems in such good form and has been working so nicely that we thought we would take our chance. He's a versatile horse who can sprint and does stay and he goes on any ground, so there are no worries there."

Trainer Barry Hills collected this prize in 2002 with Surbiton and his son and assistant Charlie issued an upbeat bulletin on the likely favorite. "He has the aim of the G2 Champagne S. [at Doncaster Sept. 15] and will hopefully end up in the G1 Dewhurst S. [at Newmarket Oct. 20]--he's a horse that's going to stay well." Peter Chapple-Hyam tasted success with Commander Collins (Ire) nine years ago and relies on **Declaration of War**. He overcame the speed test of Epsom's Listed Woodcote S. to open his stakes account on Derby day June 2 before failing to register a serious threat in the G2 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot June 19. "Seven furlongs is exactly what he wants now," Chapple-Hyam said. "The Coventry was a bit too sharp for him, plus the ground was probably a bit too firm for him. He has been thriving since Ascot and I'm very happy with him. His recent work has been very pleasing." Mick Channon relies on **Hatta Fort**, who steps up from five furlongs following a creditable third in the Listed Windsor Castle S. at the Royal meeting on his latest start June 19.

A Promising Upsetter...

Daytime Promise (Five Star Day) has gone winless in eight attempts this term, but that hasn't stopped trainer Gary Contessa from entering his charge in Delaware Park's richest race. The chestnut finished second, beaten a nose, in this track's Winter Melody S. May 14, then finished eighth in the grassy Foresta S. at Belmont June 9. "The Winter Melody absolutely made this decision easy," Contessa commented. "I find Delaware to be a very hard place to ship into. The fact that she ran so well over the track, that makes it all the more exciting. I love it--the distance and the fact she seems to like the track. I know this a tough race, but we like where we are at and I truly believe we can win it." The New York-based trainer thinks the distance will suit Daytime Promise well. "My filly will love a mile and a quarter," Contessa added. "Most of your distance horses will go up to a mile and an eighth, but a mile and a quarter really separates the women from the girls. A lot of horses cannot go a mile and a quarter. I think there is a lot to be said for that. Given that, I think Daytime Promise is a custom-made mile-and-a-quarter horse. I think she has been dying to go a mile and a quarter. She is always closing, she closes at a mile and eighth, and she looks like a mile and a quarter horse because she is built like a marathoner. This is a great opportunity for her." In eighth starts this season, the four-year-old has posted three runner-up efforts and four third-place finishes. The 2006 Busanda S. heroine completed the trifecta behind **Lila Paige** (Cryptoclearance) in a \$60,000 optional claimer over the Big A inner strip Mar. 22 and also finished a well-beaten third behind **Indian Vale** (A.P. Papal Bull was a leading contender for last year's G1 Epsom Derby after winning the G3 Chester Vase, but was the victim of the rough-and-tumble associated with the blue riband and trailed in mid-division. Rebounding to best Red Rocks (Ire) in the King Edward VII S. the next month, he was off the board on two more sophomore outings in York's G2 Great Voltigeur S. in August and G2 Prix Niel at Longchamp in September. Fourth in the May 6 G2 Jockey Club S. on the Rowley Mile here, he looked to be regressing when fifth in the Brigadier Gerard S. last time, but the Freemason Lodge team worked hard to restore the magic in the interim. Settled in mid-pack early, he needed encouragement to stay in touch at first, but as soon as the spark appeared, he delivered an irresistible run to reel in the long-time leader Shahin by the furlong marker. Despite veering sharply right when on his own, he was never in any danger thereafter. "He was one of the top three-year-olds last year, but his form did taper off in the autumn," commented Sir Michael Stoute. "It was a satisfactory start in the Jockey Club, but then he ran very badly at Sandown and he had us guessing a bit. His work had been good and movement very good of late and the team have done a really good job with him. Last year he didn't have any problems, but his Sandown run was baffling and we had to do things differently and try and work it out. He got a bit lonely in front today, but I was delighted to see him pick up and run by horses, which is the horse we know. Coolmore have so many of these middle-distance horses and we have Mountain High as well, so I'll have to talk to them about where he goes next."

PERFECT HAS DEAUVILLE AIM Derrick Smith, Michael Tabor and Susan Magnier's **Simply Perfect (GB)** (Danehill) is being targeted at Deauville's G1 Prix d'Astarte, trainer Jeremy Noseda announced yesterday. Following the grey's one-length success in the G1 Fal-mouth S. at Newmarket Wednesday, the trainer pin-pointed the July 29 mile contest, where she is likely to meet **Finsceal Beo (Ire)** (Mr. Greeley) and **Darjina (Fr)** (Zamindar). "At this stage I would hope that we can have a tilt at the Prix d'Astarte next," Noseda commented. "We will most probably look there instead of the G1 Nassau S. [at Goodwood Aug. 4]. We will maybe finish off the year with a crack at the G1 Sun Chariot S. [at Newmarket Oct. 6] and then possibly head over to North America for a Grade I on the turf. There are several options over there and the race that particularly appeals to me is the E. P. Taylor at Wood-bine."

FALLON PLEADS NOT GUILTY Kieren Fallon formally pleaded not guilty yesterday to a charge of conspiracy to defraud in connection with the alleged race-fixing investigation. Alongside fellow jockey Fergal Lynch at a pre-trial hearing, Coolmore's retained rider's plea was made before Justice Forbes in London, where the trial is due to begin on Sept. 24. Former syndicate director Miles Rodgers was also present to plead not guilty to a charge of concealing the proceeds of crime.

CURRAGH ABANDON SATURDAY CARD Officials at The Curragh have taken the measure of abandoning Saturday's meeting to safeguard the ground for the following day's action, which features the G1 Darley Irish Oaks. As the ground is currently described as soft-to-heavy and the forecast is for further rain ahead of the weekend, the G3 Keeneland International S. and Rockingham H. has been moved to Sunday's fixture. Cliff Noone, press officer for the Irish Turf Club, explained, "There has been heavy rain today and there is anything between 16 and 20 millimetres forecast for tomorrow. It's a common sense decision really."

Bred in France by Paul Chedeville, Aryenne scored major wins in the mile classic Poule d'Essai des Pouliches (Fr-I) in 1980 and the Criterium des Pouliches (Fr-I) in 1979. SEATTLE DANCER, RECORD-PRICED YEAR-LING, DEAD

Seattle Dancer, who set the racing world abuzz when he commanded a world-record \$13.1 as a yearling, died of a heart attack in June. The 23-year-old son of Nijinsky II stood at Gestut Auenquelle in Germany. Bred in Kentucky by Warner L. Jones Jr., William S. Farish, and William Kilroy, Seattle Dancer was a hot item going into the 1985 Keeneland July yearling sale. A half-brother, Horse of the Year Seattle Slew, had won the 1977 Triple Crown, and another half-brother, Lomond, had captured the 1983 English Two Thousand Guineas (Eng-I). And there was another half-brother, Argosy, who also was a stakes winner. Consigned by Jones as agent, Seattle Dancer sold for \$13.1 million to the English branch of the British Bloodstock Agency. The purchase was made for the Irish-based Coolmore Stud triumvirate of John Magnier, Robert Sangster, and trainer Vincent O'Brien; Stavros Niarchos of Greece; and Danny Schwartz of California. The price bettered the \$10.2 million paid at the 1983 Keeneland July sale for Snaafi Dancer, a son of Northern Dancer who was unraced. Ironically, Sangster was the underbidder. Campaigned in Niarchos' colors, Seattle Dancer failed to start at 2, but developed into group II winner at 3. He captured the Windfields Farm Gallinule (Ire-II) and Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial (Ire-II) and ran second in the Grand Prix de Paris (Fr-I). He retired with two wins from five starts and earnings of \$152,413. Seattle Dancer, who was produced from the Poker mare My Charmer, entered stud in 1988 at Coolmore satellite Ashford Stud near Versailles, Ky., and later stood at Coolmore Stud. He was moved to East Stud in Japan for the 1997 breeding season and began his German stint in 2003. Seattle Dancer's 37 stakes winners include Kentucky Oaks (gr. I) winner Pike Place Dancer, California grade I winner Caffe Latte, English group I winner Seattle Rhyme, and German champion and dual classic winner Que Belle. His record price was surpassed by the \$16 million paid for The Green Monkey at the 2006 Fasig-Tipton Florida February sale of 2-year-olds in training.

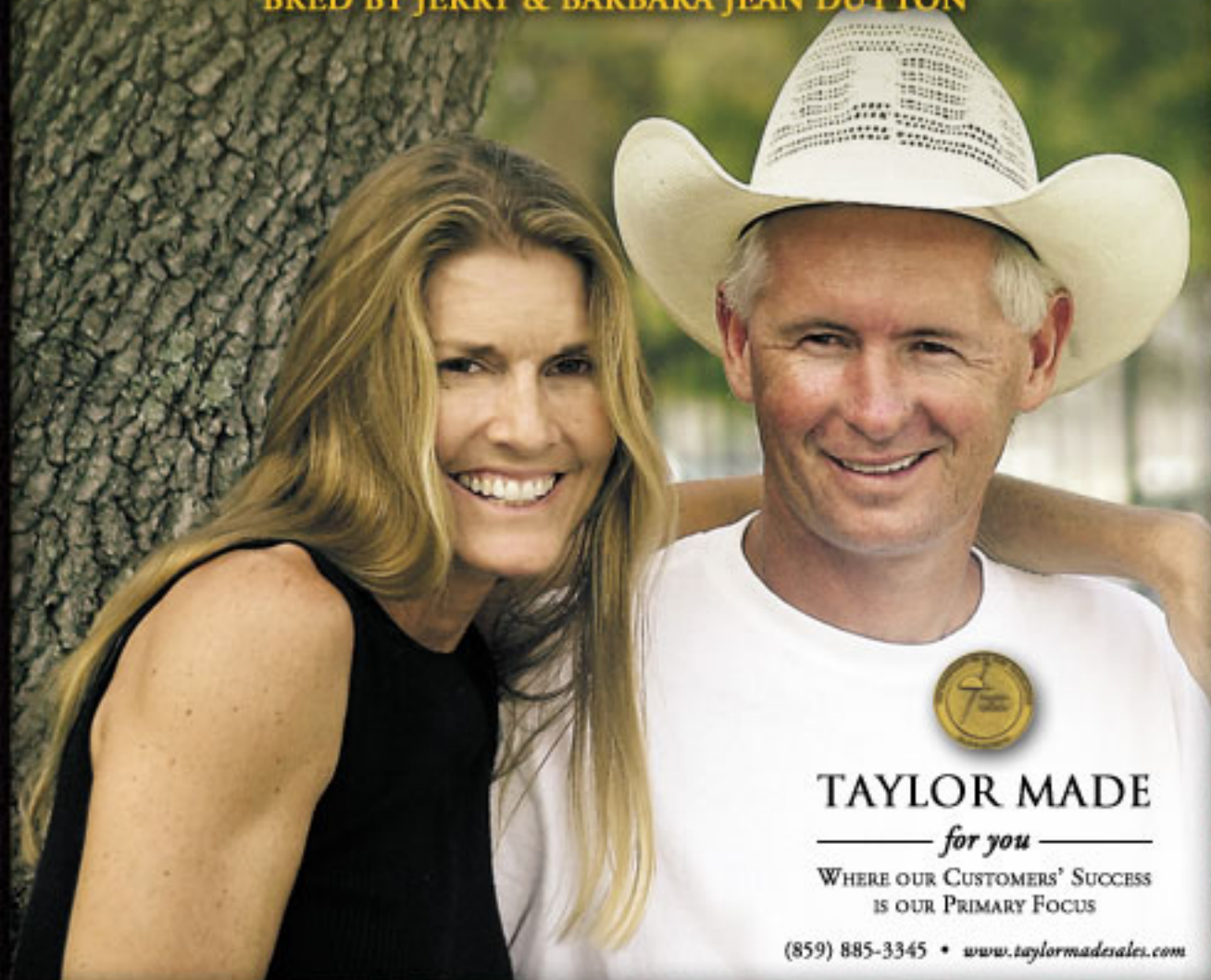

Wood, Santa Anita Superintendent, Steps Down:

Steve Wood, long-time track superintendent at Santa Anita Park, announced yesterday that he will leave his position at the Arcadia track effective Sunday, July 15, in order to devote more time to his other industry obligations. Wood, who has been at Santa Anita since 1989, holds a similar position at the soon-to-open Del Mar meet, as well as at Fairplex Park and the California Fair Circuit. He is also a consultant on racing surfaces in Saudi Arabia, Australia and Hong Kong. "Steve and I have discussed this in great detail," said Santa Anita President Ron Charles. "We both believed that his obligations to the care and maintenance of the new Polytrack surface at the upcoming Del Mar meet created a severe timing conflict with the installation of Cushion Track this summer at Santa Anita." Wood agreed that given this new set of circumstances, it would not be possible to be the full-time primary track superintendent at Santa Anita during the installation and still balance his other commitments. Preparation for the installation of Santa Anita's new Cushion Track surface began on July 5. Although no replacement has been named for Wood, the project is currently being supervised by Magna track consultant Ted Malloy and plant manager Steve Guise. Target date for completion is the first week in September. The Oak Tree Racing Association will open their 39th race meeting at Santa Anita on Sept. 26.
