RAGS TO RICHES OUT OF CCAO

Rags to Riches (A.P. Indy) will be forced to skip Saturday's GI Coaching Club American Oaks after developing

a fever. The three-year-old, who became the third filly in history to take the GI Belmont S., was scheduled to work yesterday, but trainer Todd Pletcher opted to gallop her instead. She will now likely be readied for the Aug. 18 GI Alabama S. at Saratoga. "Her temperature was 101, which is not high, but a little beyond the normal range," Pletcher said. "We are going to take the conservative approach. She hasn't quite seemed herself the last couple of days.

We won't breeze her without her being 100 percent. Our plan now is to point for the Alabama and the Breeders' Cup." He added, "I am disappointed that we didn't get to run her [in the CCAO] because a lot of people were looking forward to seeing her at Belmont Park."

"LIGHT" GUIDED TOWARDS GOODWOOD

Henry Cecil yesterday revealed that the Niarchos Family's **Light Shift** (Kingmambo) could run in the Aug. 4 G1 Nassau S. at Goodwood. The G1 Epsom Oaks winner was reported to be none the worse after her defeat by Peeping Fawn in Sunday's G1 Irish Oaks, and Cecil remarked that a rematch could be on the cards in the 10-furlong Nassau. "What we do now depends on the ground and how she is, but I'd be happy to take on Peeping Fawn again on decent ground," he told the *Racing Post*. "On the sort of ground we had at The Curragh, we wouldn't be able to beat her, but on decent ground I think it would be close. She's not a machine, so I can't say for definite where she will run next, but if she's okay to run...she will go for the Nassau. If she's not ready in time for Goodwood, she will wait for the G1 Yorkshire Oaks [Aug. 22]. She's fine over a mile and a quarter, and the course at Goodwood would suit her."

KING OF THE JUNGLE AT FASIG-TIPTON JULY

Lion Heart (Tale of the Cat) was the talk of the town in Lexington yesterday. Represented by his first crop at the New Sire Showcase at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July Yearlings sale, the Coolmore stallion accounted for the top three lots, and four of the top 10. Highlighting day one was hip 219, a handsome colt from the Taylor Made Sales Agency consignment that brought \$350,000. Seated just four rows apart in the Fasig-Tipton sales pavilion, Danny "Bear" Dion, the owner and operator of Bear Stables, outlasted a game Samantha Siegel to take home the session top-per. Bidding was steady through the \$300,000 mark as each party carefully considered their next move. Siegel, seated alongside Ric Waldman, somewhat reluctantly answered Dion's bid of \$340,000 with one of her own at \$345,000, but declined to up the ante after Dion responded to the auctioneer's plea for \$350,000. The Quebec native admitted that he was beyond his comfort zone. "It was a little more expensive than I thought it would be," Dion said. "We thought we'd stop at \$200,000, we ended up at \$350,000. That's a horse sale." Dion, the president and CEO of Bear Slashing Ltd., an oil exploration and mulching business, added that he has 37 two-year-olds with trainer Reade Baker, but he will try to bring that number down to about 20.

This is also the family of top sires Gone West and Known Fact.

Finley, Lakin to Do More Dreaming...

Bloodstock agent Buzz Chace chose to stand during the bulk of the bidding on hip 193. But, as the heated battle was approaching its end, he apparently went missing, much to the surprise of the auctioneers. The panic was only momentary, as Chace had strolled down the aisle to take a seat. A few minutes later, he lobbed his final bid of \$300,000 and walked out a winner on a flashy bay colt by Lion Heart--V V S Flawless (Deputy Minister). The Valentine's Day foal, a Maryland-bred, was consigned to the sale by Ronald and Carolyn Green's Green Willow Farms. Chace was acting on behalf of L & F Stables, a new pinhooking venture whose principals are Lewis Lakin and Terry Finley. The partnership between the two horsemen began auspiciously enough--Finley was about to let GISW Dream Rush go to a higher bidder at the 2006 OBSFEB sale, but Lakin encouraged him to launch another salvo. "During the bidding, Lewis approached Buzz just as the hammer was about to fall," Finley explained. "We were going to be the underbidder. It was our good fortune that he decided to come and sit down." Asked whether he was apprehensive about entering the pinhooking business during a time when the practice has proved increasingly challenging, Finley was philosophical. "A couple of years ago, it seemed like everyone jumped in and wanted to pinhook," he said. "But you can never go wrong when you buy good-quality horses. The objective is to sell these horses at the two-year-old sales, but we're both of the opinion that you can't go wrong with good prospects. We both run, so if there's a hiccup somewhere along the line we have something of a safety net." He added that there are currently about six other partners involved, and that their goal is to "buy 20 to 25 pinhooking prospects" in the "\$100,000 to \$300,000 range." The horses are likely to be consigned to the juvenile sales by David Scanlon, David McKathan and Nick de Meric. He added, "I think the business is good and I think it's an interesting time to enter the pinhooking game. I think it hasn't been quite as tough to buy. I think the vast majority of people would tell you a year ago it was a little stronger, a little higher."

Full of Hope...

Agent Dennis Yokum, bidding on behalf of owner Ernie Moody's Mercedes Stables, was extended to \$200,000 for a colt from the second crop by Full Mandate (A.P. Indy). Consigned to the sale by Bill and Alison Murphy's Ballinswood agency, hip 99 was produced by Our Pleasure Jet (West by West) and was bred in Florida by SGV Thoroughbreds and Bulldog Racing. "He's a good horse," Bill Murphy offered. "He showed himself very well from the day he came over here and every time he came out, he acted like it was his first time. We showed him over 100 times [Sunday]. He's just a big, beautiful horse. If he had Street Cry (Ire) or Johannesburg after his name, he'd be bringing a million [dollars]--he's that kind of an individual. Mercedes Stable bought him and you'd like to see those people do well, too." Murphy said his pupil was of sound mind and body. "He had a lot of leg and a lot of size underneath him, but he had the body to go with it," he explained. "He's got a very good mind. We had a lot of good players on him. When you get a good horse, you get good people looking at him."

City Slicker...

A few years back, Tiger Ridge, a Storm Cat half-brother to A.P. Indy who was winless in five career starts and stood at Hartley/DeRenzo Thoroughbreds, boasted several well-sold yearlings during the New Sire Showcase. Though represented by far fewer in number, City Place is off to a promising start as a sire, despite the fact he never visited the racetrack. The six-year-old stallion, also a son of Storm Cat, is out of the outstanding racemare Glitter Woman (Glitterman), making him a half-brother to the recent GI Suburban H. winner Political Force. City Place was the sire of two youngsters during yesterday's session. While one was a scratch, his lone remaining offspring, hip 227, did him proud, selling to Stephanie Preston for \$80,000, some 20 times his 2005 stud fee of \$4,000. City Place stood the 2007 breeding season at Hartley/DeRenzo in Ocala for \$4,000.

Kimmel Likes Candy...

Trainer and veterinarian John Kimmel is on a crusade of sorts. Having grown increasingly wary of the toll the two-year-olds in training sales take on its participants,

Kimmel is buying pinhooking prospects on behalf of Drew Rayman's Zephyr Stable. The conditioner went to \$235,000 for a filly from the first crop of the track record setting Candy Ride (Arg) from the consignment of Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency. The bay is the first

foal from Pelicus Affair (Pentelicus), a half-sister to MGSW Pine Dance and to SW Village Dancer, the dam of MSW and MGSP The Happy Hopper. Kimmel said she jumped through all the hoops. "She was a filly that we thought was physically appealing, and she obviously passed the technical information and scope and X-rays," he remarked. The day's co-top selling filly, she will go to go into the resale group, which will be a bit different than in the past. Kimmel explained that Zephyr Stable will put their horses through a less strenuous regimen before resale. "The horses will not be breezing fast and basically will be going without sticks and will probably not even be timed," he stated. "We're trying to sell a horse that doesn't have to go to the farm for 60 days of rehab [after being purchased]. The horses will be sound and will be able to go right from the two-year-old sale into the barn, and they're going to have a good mind and be ready to go forward. They're not going to have to go into the shop for repair. That's the concept we're trying to promote. I want to make a difference." Rayman is the CEO and chief creative officer for a company called i33 Communications, an online design, development and marketing firm. He maintains a racing stable called Rayzin' the Bar Stable and was recently represented by Caress S. winner Brushed Bayou. Earlier in the session, Kimmel went to \$150,000 for a filly from the first crop of Kentucky Derby hero Smarty Jones. Consigned by Perrone Sales Ltd., hip 84 is out of Must Be a Lady, a full sister to MSW Warleigh and GSW Must Be War. This is also the extended female family of the outstanding turf mare Citronnade.


Another Topper for Taylor Made?...

For everything they've accomplished as a perennial leading consignor, Taylor Made Sales Agency had never sold a \$1-million horse at Fasig-Tipton Kentucky. That all changed last year with the \$1.2 million colt by Forestry, and the agency is hopeful of topping the sale a second consecutive year, even if the seven-figure mark is not eclipsed. Hip 518 is the lone male representative in the catalogue by Taylor Made's outstanding sire Unbridled's Song. A gray colt, like his father, the Feb. 16 foal is a son of SP Blushing Ogygian (Ogygian), making him a full brother to Habiboo, a multiple graded stakes placed winner of \$190,190. "I think that pedigree is just going to keep getting better," Duncan Taylor commented. "This is a really nice horse. Unbridled's Song has done really well when Blushing Groom has been on the bottom side of the pedigree and Habiboo has already shown she can run. There's also a Street Cry (Ire) out of the mare called Street Boss that worked in :59 2/5 the other day. This is a well-balanced colt and I think it's a real opportunity for somebody." Added Mark Taylor, "He's one of those Unbridled's Songs that looks great standing there, but when he moves, he just glides across the ground." Swifty Farms went to \$425,000 for Blushing Ogygian carrying this foal in utero at the 2005 Keeneland November sale. Taylor Made also has high hopes for hip 502. By top sire Distorted Humor, the bay is out of Arianna's Passion (Unbridled's Song), a stakes winner of \$204,110. "This filly has a full sister that brought \$475,000 at the two-year-old sales that's in training with Jeff Mullins," Mark Taylor said. "He's really high on her. The second dam, Impassion, has a beautiful Unbridled's Song filly that's going to sell in September. If you had to draw up what you want when you breed to Distorted Humor, this is what you'd want. She's got a big, sloping shoulder, a huge hip and a great walk. She's got the whole package."

Making Their Point...

By any standards, the 2007 season has been nothing short of spectacular for West Point Thoroughbreds, the New Jersey-based racing syndicate headed by Terry

Finley. The year began on a high note when the relatively unknown Awesome Gem took January's GII San Fernando Breeders' Cup S. at Santa Anita. Flashy Bull became the organization's first Grade I winner with his mild upset in the Stephen Foster H. at Churchill

Downs, and Dream Rush followed suit a few weeks later, storming home to take the GI Prioress S. at Belmont Park. That effort followed High Finance's success in the GII Tom Fool BC H. on Independence Day. It's no wonder Finley is in good spirits these days.

"We're obviously very happy with the success," he said yesterday at Fasig-Tipton. "We're not really doing anything differently than we did before. It's a very competitive environment and I don't want to say it was our turn, but certainly things seem like they're aligning."

Finley stated that Flashy Bull would go next in the GI Whitney H. and Dream Rush in the GI Test S., while High Finance is being pointed to the GI Forego H. Awesome Gem will make his next start in the GI Pacific Classic Aug. 19. Finley is also looking

down the road to World Thoroughbred Championships day, to be held at Monmouth Park, a stone's throw from Finley's home base. "We hope we'll have at least some representation at the Breeders' Cup," he commented. "We'll just enjoy the ride. You talk to some of the older guys in the business who have been through the ups and downs and one thing they tell you is to just enjoy it. Those Grade I's don't come around a whole lot and when they do they generate the memories of your life--that's a phrase that I've latched onto." One of West Point's first 'big' horses was Seattle Fitz (Arg), who now stands at Buck Pond Farm and is represented this week at the sales. "I was pleasantly surprised to see four of them in the New Sire Showcase," Finley said. "Actually, three of them made the short list. They all look like they have good bone and are intelligent horses. We like to think he's got a shot."

His Place in the Shade...

During last year's second session, John Mayer's Nursery Place agency sold a colt by Pulpit for a session-topping \$760,000, and the consignor is hoping history repeats when he sends hip 430 into the ring this afternoon. Also by the Claiborne stallion, the chestnut filly was produced by Probable Storm (Tabasco Cat), who recently became the dam of a stakes winner when Cajun Conquest (Came Home) took the July 14 Seeking the Gold S. at Louisiana Downs. "I've had several people come by and tell me that she reminded them of Rags to Riches," Mayer explained. "She acts like a colt sometimes. She can be a little tough and she's not a pushover." Mayer teamed with Robert Hagopian to acquire Probable Storm for \$100,000 at the 2004 Keeneland November sale and resold the Aptitude colt she was carrying for \$75,000 at Keeneland September last year. Unfortunately, Hagopian, at one time a part-owner of Spendthrift Farm, died about two months ago and Mayer confirmed that the Pulpit filly would be selling without reserve. "[Hagopian] loved his family and, hopefully, this will be a nice way to start taking care of them," Mayer said. Contemplating his good fortune, he added, "Obviously Pulpit has been very good to me--is that an understatement? They say [last year's] colt [now named Swath] is doing really well and, hopefully, she'll fall right in behind him."



Day One By the Numbers...

Given that the New Sire Showcase comprised only the first 212 horses during last year's sale, statistical comparisons between the opening sessions are difficult and somewhat hazy. The Showcase continues with the first 33 horses on offer today, and it will be more useful to compare this year's entire New Sire Showcase with last year's. With that in mind, the numbers were down versus last year. Gross receipts fell by 5.5 percent, while the average was off by 17.8 percent. There were 90 horses which failed to meet their reserves yesterday, a high 34 percent, while last year's RNA rate came in at 27 percent. "There's no doubt that the older sires helped day one last year," said Fasig-Tipton President Walt Robertson. "There wasn't a person here who hoped this year wouldn't be better than it was last year, but I don't feel bad about today's average. I can't say that I am surprised, because this is kind of the way it's been at the upper-level sales this spring. Is it a gauge of too many horses? Maybe. Is it a gauge of the overall market? Probably." Boyd Browning, executive vice president and COO of Fasig-Tipton, added his perspective. "It's probably safe to say there's been no dramatic growth in the buyer base," Browning said. "Given that, if you have more supply, you could have a decrease in overall numbers. I'd say there's a sense of relief--the market is still relatively strong. If we've lost a little bit from last year, we haven't lost a huge chunk and that bodes well for the rest of the year."

It was pretty much business as usual in Europe's four Group 1 contests last week, with champion sire Danehill striking twice through Simply Perfect in the Falmouth S. and Peeping Fawn in the Irish Oaks, while Danehill's son Dansili supplied the winner of the Juddmonte Grand Prix de Paris for the second successive year. The early stages of the Grand Prix were certainly controversial, but there was no escaping the promise of Zambezi Sun's display, which suggested that this very progressive colt has the potential to follow in Rail Link's Arc-winning footsteps. The only stallion to break the Danehill stranglehold was the interesting Sakhee, whose first crop provided the July Cup hero Sakhee's Secret.

Peeping Fawn and Simply Perfect are among a total of three Group 1 winners in Danehill's final Irish crop, which continues a rich vein of form dating back to Danehill's 1998 crop. In his last seven Irish crops, foaled between 1998 and 2004, Danehill sired a magnificent total of 27 Group 1 winners, including such stars as Banks Hill, Mozart, Westerner, Rock of Gibraltar, Intercontinental, North Light, Dylan Thomas and George Washington. It wasn't always like that, though.

The start of Danehill's purple patch coincided with his return from a year in Japan, with his fee raised to IR25,000gns in 1997. The rise reflected his feat of having taken the title of champion sire of two-year-olds in 1995 and 1996.

Danehill's fee had gone in the other direction earlier in his Northern Hemisphere career, during a period of falling values. After starting out at IR20,000gns in 1991, his fee quickly fell to IR12,500gns and then to IR9,000gns in his third and fourth seasons. This makes it fair to compare Danehill's early years with those of Dansili, who stood his first season at £8,000, his second at £10,000 and his third and fourth at £12,500.

The facts are that Danehill sired four Group 1 winners in his first four crops, which totalled around 288 foals. Zambezi Sun follows Price Tag, Rail Link and Passage of Time as the fourth Group 1 winner from Dansili's first three crops, which--neatly enough--number 287 foals. Dansili has only around 60 two-year-olds this year, from that often difficult fourth year, but this crop has already made a bright start. His daughter Proviso was named a ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ when she eased home four lengths clear in a newcomers' race at Deauville last Wednesday, with her victory being followed a few hours later by a seven-length success for another Juddmonte debutante, Famous Name, in a six-furlong maiden.

Needless to say, success on this scale has prepared the ground for even richer harvests in the future for Dansili. Even with his fee raised from £12,500 to £30,000, Dansili was in tremendous demand from breeders this year.

He attracted more than 60 stakes winners, including 30 group winners, and his book also included the dams of the recent Prix du Jockey-Club winners Dalakhani, Blue Canari and Darsi. The dam of Danehill's Derby-winning son North Light was another visitor, as was the dam of that excellent mare Soviet Song.

Juddmonte continued to support Dansili strongly, as it has done from the start. However, only seven of the 30 group-winning visitors this year are owned by Juddmonte, which shows the extent to which outside breeders have now embraced Dansili.

This year's Juddmonte mares included Nebraska Tornado (G1 Prix de Diane and G1 Prix du Moulin), Quiff (G1 Yorkshire Oaks), Dance Routine (G2 Prix de Royallieu), Daring Miss (G2 Grand Prix de Deauville) and Phantom Wind (a Group 3-winning daughter of Ryafan). The dams of the Group 1 winners Reefscape and Powerscourt were other Juddmonte visitors, together with Verbose, already dam of Dansili's Group 3 winner Thousand Words, and Mooring, a stakes-winning half-sister to Rail Link's dam.

While Juddmonte has bred nine of Dansili's stakes winners, there was some sensitivity earlier this year about a comment made in a British magazine. "I've heard from some quarters," the writer reported, "that the success of Dansili is due to the fact that the broodmare barn at Juddmonte is carrying the horse."

Although Juddmonte has enthusiastically supported Dansili, it wouldn't have made sense to send lots of the most highly qualified mares to an unproven horse standing at £8,000, £10,000 or even £12,500. The facts of the matter are that none of Dansili's four Group 1 winners is out of a mare which earned black type. Rail Link's dam Docklands did her winning in the French Provinces, while Zambezi Sun's dam Imbabala gained her only success at Fontainebleau. Passage of Time's dam Clepsydra had a Timeform rating of only 78 and Tarocchi, the dam of Price Tag, was a useful winner who fell short of stakes class. Incidentally, the dams of all four Group 1 winners are all in foal to Dansili once again.

Of Juddmonte's other Dansili stakes winners, Early March and Quenched are out of unexceptional winners, while Daring Diva and Thousand Words are out of Listed-placed mares. Only Home Affairs has a stakes-winning dam, so what might Dansili achieve now that he has earned much greater opportunities?

Zambezi Sun's dam Imbabala is a daughter of the exceptional Zafonic and had the attraction of being a descendant of Peace, one of Juddmonte's most successful foundation mares. Interruption, another Zafonic mare from the Peace family, is the dam of Much Faster, one of the speediest juvenile fillies in France in 2003, when she won the G2 Prix Robert Papin and was second in the G1 Prix Morny.

Peace is one of the most widely represented mares in the Juddmonte stud book, through the descendants of her daughters De Stael, Balabina and Intermission. De Stael, best known as the dam of the Eclipse Award-winning Wandesta, is the second dam of Dansili's talented daughter Cantabria. Cantabria's dam also produced the very speedy Deportivo.

Zambezi Sun's third dam, Intermission, earned a Timeform rating of 117 in winning three of her six starts, including the prestigious Cambridgeshire H. Although Intermission produced nothing better than a Grade III winner--the Sadler's Wells filly Interim--she is the dam of several successful broodmares.

One of them, Zambezi Sun's second dam Interval, was third in the 1000 Guineas and is the second dam of Continent, a winner of two of Europe's Group 1 sprints in 2002.

Imbabala has more than justified her retention, as Zambezi Sun is her second group winner from her first four foals. His predecessor Kalabar was a Group 2 winner over 1¼ miles. Interestingly, Kalabar was by Kahyasi, the sire of Dansili's astonishing dam Hasili.

Zambezi Sun isn't the only reminder that the versatile Peace family is still very much alive. Interim, the Sadler's Wells filly mentioned above, is the dam of Mizzen Mast's two-year-old son Midships, who made an impressive winning debut in a hot maiden in June. Also, Proviso--the Dansili filly who gained ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ status last week--is out of Binche, a great granddaughter of Peace, so the rest of this year could be an exciting time for the Dansili--Peace alliance.

Everything's Coming Up Violettes...

It has been a career year for trainer Rick Violette Jr.

Earlier this month, Violette sent out Dream Rush to win the GI Prioress S. and High Finance to take the GII Tom Fool BC H., and he knocked off his biggest purse ever when **Summer Doldrums** (Street Cry {Ire}) captured the \$750,000 GIII Colonial Turf Cup S. in June. With 4 1/2 months still left on the calendar, Violette's runners have accumulated more than \$2.5 million in earnings, surpassing his personal best.

Summer Doldrums can push the bankroll past the \$3 million mark with a big race in the Virginia Derby. Violette is optimistic that the colt will run back to his game head victory over **Strike a Deal** (Smart Strike) in the Colonial Turf Cup.

"He ran a great race last time, but we had to go to Plan C," the native New Englander said. "I thought he'd be on the pace or right behind it, but it didn't develop that way."

Rated off moderate fractions by jockey Jose Lezcano, Summer Doldrums saved ground early, worked his way to the outside in the stretch and outbattled Strike a Deal to the wire.

"He had a terrific trip and he got a good ride," Violette said. "[Jose] rode him quite confidently. He bided his time and at the head of the lane he found the seams he needed. Once he did, he was pretty resolute. [Strike a Deal] came to him and he had an eighth of a mile to get by him, but he couldn't."

Summer Doldrums, a \$150,000 KEESEP yearling, showed ability on the main track, taking the Whirlaway S. and finishing third in the GIII Gotham S. and fourth in the GI Wood Memorial S. But the decision was made to give him a chance on the grass.

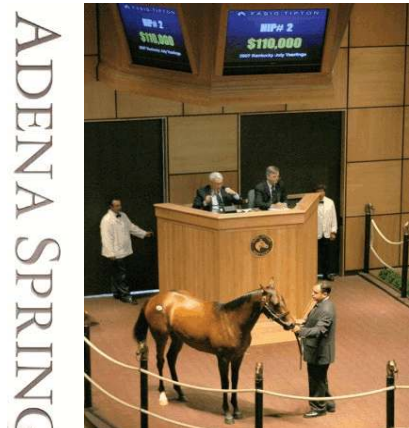
"As the competition got tougher, he was found wanting a little bit [on the dirt]," Violette explained. "That was the time to find out if he liked the turf, before the Colonial Turf Cup and the Virginia Derby. We didn't want to miss those races and leave all that money on the table. And Street Cry has license to sire horses that run on pretty much anything."

Owned by Klaravich Stables and William Lawrence, Summer Doldrums has four wins from 10 starts, with earnings of \$631,716.
