Blood-Horse

FOUR FIFTY BRINGS FOUR FIFTY

Samantha Siegel was frustrated to have finished runner-up in the battle for Monday's session-topping colt by Lion Heart. But she atoned for that defeat yesterday, fittingly going to \$450,000 for hip 450, a muscular colt by Malibu Moon which topped the two-day Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July Yearling Sale. Consigned by breeder Clarkland Farm, the bay is a son Royal Veagess (Rock Royalty), a multiple stakes winner of \$281,033 which Clarkland purchased for \$72,000 at the 2004 Keeneland November sale. This colt is a half-brother to GII Cotillion H. winner Skipping Around, who went on to produce GI Santa Maria H. winner Sugar Shake to the cover of Awesome Again. Siegel said the colt fit the bill. "This is a big, strong, beautiful-looking horse," she commented. "He's very racy looking and I wish he wouldn't have brought his hip number, but he looks like a nice racing prospect." Siegel knew it would be tough sledding. "I thought he'd be hard to buy," she admitted. "Good horses are expensive. You have to take a shot every once in a while, and I get a little more leeway than I used to and I decided to do it. You can never tell when it's going to happen."

Not the First Time...

The Siegels, who campaigned Malibu Moon's champion Declan's Moon, have had success purchasing horses from Clarkland. Arson Squad, a \$100,000 graduate from this auction house in 2004, has gone on to win a pair of graded stakes and \$564,450 to date. Going back to 1992, the family paid \$35,000 for Noassembly required as a Keeneland September yearling; she became a stakes and graded-stakes placed winner of nearly \$100,000. Siegel may have been disappointing Monday afternoon, but was determined to come out on top yesterday. "You don't know what you're going to find somewhere else along the line,"

she said. "But I can't say that if I'd gotten the horse [Monday] I wouldn't have gone as strong [yesterday]. You can't predict the future." Clarkland's Fred Mitchell was nearly speechless after the sale. "I really didn't know what we had," he said. "We had a lot of good people looking at the colt. You do not know what to expect. You think you have a really nice individual, but we don't know until the hammer falls. When you are a small farm and a small breeding operation, and when you raise a nice individual and he sells like that, words can't express what it means to the farm and the family." Clarkland has 200 acres in the horse operation and 165 for raising crops and "also where I play with my bird dogs," Mitchell said.

Malibu Moons Making a Big Splash...

The offspring of Castleton Lyons' Malibu Moon were a hot commodity. Sobhy Sonbol, advisor to Ahmed Zayat, got in the fray by going to \$350,000 for a lovely chestnut filly out of Try Your Best (Kris S.). The property of Samuel and Carolyn Rogers and consigned by The Acorn agency, the Jan. 31 foal is a half-sister to three-year-old Try to Fly (Trippi), a \$275,000 graduate of The Acorn consignment at this venue in 2005 and winner earlier this year of the San Pedro S. at Santa Anita. Sonbol was impressed with the filly. "I thought she was the best horse in the sale," he commented. "The sire is nice, the physical is unbelievable. I had one word written in my comments--wow. Just a beautiful, beautiful filly. She's big and strong and everything just falls into place." The Rogerses' daughter, Lynn Rainbow, operates The Acorn with her husband Bill. "We're absolutely thrilled," she said. "She's a homebred filly for multi-generations, and she grew out beautifully just like a lot of the Malibu Moons do. Everything that she does is natural. She's such a beautiful mover, and we couldn't be more thrilled with the owner and the price."

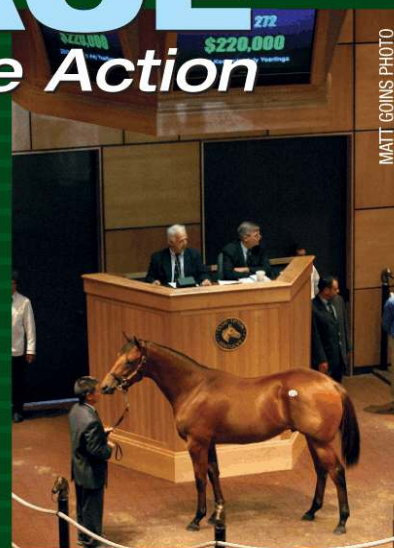

Moon week," commented Castleton Lyons' General Manager Stuart Fitzgibbon. "It started with Moon Catcher's win in the GII Delaware Oaks over a classy field, and it's culminated in an amazing sale. We could not be more pleased with the support he has received, and the horses have been sold by good people and bought by good people. We are very much looking

forward to the future with him." Fitzgibbon was also pleased with the performance of first-crop yearlings by Toccet, by Awesome Again. "They have also been received very well, as nine were sold for an average in excess of \$80,000. He is another stallion we have high hopes for."

Another Profitable Sale for Nursery Place...

John Mayer's Nursery Place agency consigned a \$760,000 colt by Pulpit to last year's sale, and the team celebrated another strong performance yesterday, when his filly by Pulpit--Probable Storm (Tabasco Cat) was sold for \$385,000 to pinhooker Murray Smith. It was the top price for a filly on the day. Mayer's client, the late Robert Hagopian, purchased Probable Storm, a half-sister to GISW Summer Colony, for \$100,000 carrying a foal by Aptitude at the 2004 Keeneland November sale. "The whole plan was to buy four or five mares with great families and try to improve who they were in foal to," said Mayer, explaining their philosophy. "We just thought, 'Let's take these mares from these good families and try to do better with the studs.' It worked and it was good and I'm just sorry that he wasn't here to see it." Hagopian passed away two months ago. Mayer was anything but dismayed with the results. "It's kind of a dodgy sort of deal, so how can you be disappointed?" he said. "She sold without reserve, like we said. She's a nice filly, a great person got her and she's going to get every shot in the world. At the end of the day, what are you going to say?" For her part, Smith sees a rosy future for her purchase. "She just exuded class," Smith stated. "She's elegant, a lovely mover, perfect vet--every time I went to see her, she was gorgeous. The two-year-old market is a very thin market, and there's not that many fillies like her. I've never owned a filly like her with this kind of pedigree. We're not going to expect her to go :10.1 or :21 flat. She'll work within herself and look pretty down the lane. She has residual value as a broodmare." Mayer also believes his pupil will suit the juvenile market. "She's so easy on herself and she's got a real shot," he said. "She just needs to turn out, kind of be a horse for a little bit and then come back."

A Top Prize...

Sarah Middleton, an assistant manager for Mort and Bonnie Topfer's Castletop Stable, went to \$350,000 for a strong-looking son of Indian Charlie from the consignment of Paramount Sales, agent. The bay, a \$70,000 Keeneland January purchase by Atlantic Bloodstock, is the first produce from Lady Doms Tiara (Conquistador Cielo), a daughter of GSW Lady Dom Alaric and a half-sister to MSW Buxton Spice and SW Zitkala. "We're very excited to have this lovely horse in our group," Middleton offered. "He's a grand-looking horse, wonderful family, what's not to like?" With the purchase, the Castletop racing stable, spread out among trainers Rick Violette Jr., Stan Hough and Angel Penna Jr., now numbers 17 horses. Paramount Sales' Pat Costello agreed that the colt was well sold. "He was smooth and clean as a whistle here," he said. "He passed every single test; they said he had a great throat and there were no issues whatsoever. He was relaxed and walked as good the first day as the last. He's just a really super horse. That was a great price for him and we're delighted." Costello also chimed in on the overall market. "The market has been up and down," he opined. "When you bring up the good horses like him, they make all the money and the average horses are tough to get done. That seems to be the way it is."

money for hip 375 at Fasig-Tipton. Blue-water Sales' Mike Levy signed on behalf of Schwartz for the dark bay filly by prominent sire Royal Academy. Bred and consigned to the sale by E. H. Beau Lane III, the Apr. 11 foal was produced by Love Tunnel (Mining), making her a half-sister to Fearless

Vision (Vision and Verse), runner-up since the catalogue in the GII Peter Pan S. "She has a very unique pedigree that's deep," Levy explained. "The stallion's a fabulous stallion who doesn't get a lot of respect. The three-year-old can run, and she was conformationally very good." Beau Lane monitored the proceedings from barn 11, where he is recovering from a broken leg sustained while foaling a mare May 1. "I went up to the mare to her head to try to get her to relax and when I did, she struck me with her front foot. Those things happen," he said matter-of-factly. Lane's left leg is now equipped with a plate and screws and a joint needed to be rebuilt. Yesterday's results certainly ease any discomfort. "We're very pleased," he continued. "She's a very high-quality filly. She brought a good price, and I'm sure she'll go ahead and do great for the people who bought her."

On the selection of Royal Academy, he added, "This mare tail-females to Lady Be Good from her sire and her dam. We got a very good individual with a ton of athletic ability. I think we got the best Royal Academy has to offer. This filly will be a good one." Lane is grateful for those who helped prepare the filly for the sale. "I have to thank my son-in-law and my daughter and some wonderful help for getting it done, because I wasn't much help to them this year. They did a great job," he said.

Tall Tales...

Bidding on behalf of an undisclosed client, bloodstock agent Nick de Meric went to \$230,000 for hip 337, a filly by Tale of the Cat. Consigned by Highclere Sales,

agent, the flashy bay is the first foal produced by the Texas-bred mare Hay Lauren (Hay Halo), a multiple stakes winner of \$197,190. Bred in Kentucky by Ro Parra's Millennium Farms, she was purchased by R. L. Glosson for \$50,000

as a short yearling at this winter's Keeneland January Sale. De Meric was clearly pleased with his purchase. "This was our pick of the fillies over here," he commented. "We really rated her highly. She jumped through all the hoops, vet-wise, and we did a cardio scan and she was wonderful on that, too. We felt she was a beautifully balanced, athletic type of filly with a wonderful look, and she epitomized all the best qualities that Tale of the Cat throws." De Meric, who went to \$250,000 for a son of Lion Heart--Baba Gonzo during Monday's opening session, said that yesterday's purchase could be resold, but is slightly more likely to join his client's racing stable. "He is having success at the moment and he's enthusiastic about the game and we want to help him retain that enthusiasm," de Meric said. He added, "We'll see where we end up after September before we firm up a decision." The veteran horseman has been impressed with the sale. "Whatever the summary sheet says, at the end of the day, it's no easier to buy the horses you want than it's ever been," de Meric offered. "I would say it's overall a healthy marketplace and one in which we should all be able to ply our trade. We're trying to buy horses that would appeal to the high-end buyers, and to do that you've got to step up every once in a while."

The Garden State Represented at FTK...

The Thoroughbred community at large, and especially in New Jersey, mourned the death of Charles Hesse last November, and yesterday, a pair of horses bred by Hesse and his wife Marianne were sold through Taylor

Made Sales Agency. Both individuals were purchased by Lawley--Wakelin Bloodstock, agent. The first of those to go through the ring was hip 466, a New Jersey-bred filly by Successful Appeal--Special American (Quiet American) which sold for \$135,000. Hesse purchased the filly's second dam Special Vice (Vice Re-

gent) for \$50,000 at the 1995 Fasig-Tipton November sale. She hails from the extended family of one of the Hesses' best horses, Park Avenue Ball. Special Vice also appears under the third dam of hip 467, a More Than Ready filly out of Special Brush (Broad Brush). The dark bay, a half-sister to the stakes-placed Jet Set Broad, was hammered down for \$110,000. Few knew Charlie Hesse as well as bloodstock agent Buzz Chace and he reflected on his friend yesterday at Fasig-Tipton. "Nobody loved the game as much as Charlie and he was an icon in Jersey racing," Chace commented. "He was really respected by all. Every time we go up to the boxes [at Monmouth Park], we miss him. He's not there this year doing his handicapping with his paper. But his wife is carrying on and she's doing a great job. She loves the horse business. She's having fun at it." And she's there to stay, according to Chace. "She's doing what Charlie would have done by carrying on."

Meeting Expectations...

In advance of the sale, officials at Fasig-Tipton were hopeful that, in light of an increased catalogue, results would remain largely the same. In the end, the sale was statistically similar to 2006. Gross receipts eclipsed \$36 million while a strong second session helped boost the average to \$102,941. That represented an 11-percent decrease from last year, but that is an explicable deviation, according to Fasig-Tipton officials, who point out that the two horses that sold last year in excess of \$750,000 had a near six-percent impact on the results. There was an overall sense of relief. "I thought the market was a lot more similar than it appears," said Fasig-Tipton President Walt Robertson. "We had a bigger percentage of new sires this year than last. For the last few years, the established sires have sold better than the new sires. That coupled with the two high prices from last year--you take those two out of the mix and it cuts the amount we are down by about half." Executive Vice President and CEO Boyd Browning Jr. largely agreed. "[Monday] night, I would have probably said the market might be off a touch. I think the reality is after seeing the sale today, you had a combination of new sire showcase and we increased numbers. That always has a tendency to have a decrease in the average price. I think the market is remarkably similar in '07 as it was in '06. The world hasn't changed a whole lot since the spring sales. The economy is good, the Dow is good."

Resellers Step Up...

Following a somewhat quiet opening session, pinhookers were more active and aggressive yesterday, highlighted by Murray Smith's purchase of the Pulpit filly. Boyd Browning took pains to offer a contrarian view to a common perception. "The sale has been characterized by the media as a pinhooker-driven sale, and we really have worked hard the past five years to attract more end users," he said. "There's no doubt that there are more end users in 2007 than there were in 2002. Anyone that doesn't want pinhookers involved in their sale is crazy. We want deep, broad, aggressive participation by the pinhookers, because they help every marketplace. We also want to have end users outbidding them on a number of horses."

NO KING GEORGE FOR MANDURO Baron Georg von Ullmann's **Manduro (Ger)** (Monsun {Ger}) has been ruled out of the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. After the five-year-old defeated Dylan Thomas (Ire) in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. over 10 furlongs at Royal Ascot June 20, his connections pondered the July 28 Ascot showpiece as a potential option for the Andre Fabre inmate. However, the owner's Racing Manager Paul Harley yesterday announced that the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp Oct. 7 would be "the one and only time" he races over 12 furlongs. "We are still toying with the idea of running him in the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois [at Deauville Aug. 12], but we haven't decided yet," Harley told *PA Sport*. "He's very versatile with regard to the ground, so it won't be that which makes up our mind. We've just always had that in the back of our mind as the next race for him and, at the present time, nothing has changed. The Arc at the end of the season is also still on the agenda, but obviously that won't be decided until we see how he performs between now and then. If he attempts 12 furlongs, the Arc will be the one and only time he attempts it."

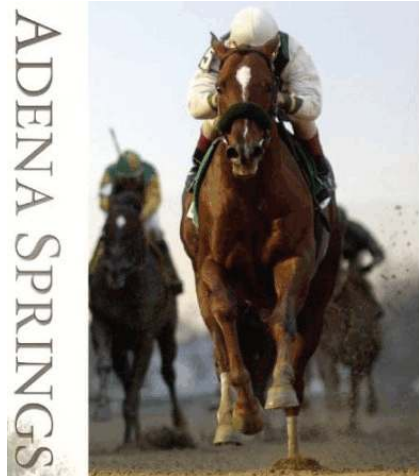

‘SECRET, ‘ART COULD REMATCH AT HAYDOCK Bridget Swire's **Sakhee's Secret (GB)** (Sakhee) and Susan Roy and Cheveley Park Stud's **Dutch Art (GB)** (Medicean {GB}) are poised to meet again in the Sept. 8 G1 Haydock Sprint Cup after the connections of both colts confirmed they are targeting the sprint. Split by a half-length in last Friday's G1 July Cup at Newmarket, the sophomores headed 54 entries for the £300,000 six-furlong contest. Trainer Hughie Morrison announced that Sakhee's Secret would be rested following his winning exploits in the July meeting's feature. "He's in great form," Morrison said yesterday. "He came back full of beans and is sound and well--he's been turned out the last couple of days. We'll give him a bit of a holiday for two or three weeks and then make a plan, but I think the natural race is the Haydock race." Dutch Art's trainer Peter Chapple-Hyam will send his charge to Deauville before the awaited rematch. "He'll go to France first for the [Aug. 5] G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest and then the plan is Haydock," Chapple-Hyam remarked. "I was delighted with his effort at Newmarket--the winner is obviously a very good horse. He's come out of the race a bit stiff, but that's normal for him; otherwise, he's perfectly fine. I will be happy to take on Sakhee's Secret again." Also in the mix for Haydock are Ronnie Arculli's July Cup third **Red Clubs (Ire)** (Red Ransom), last year's winner **Reverence (GB)** (Mark of Esteem {Ire}) and Budget Stables' G1 Golden Jubilee S. hero **Soldier's Tale** (Stravinsky). Aidan O'Brien has entered five including Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's **George Washington (Ire)** (Danehill), who could drop back to sprinting after finishing third in the July 7 G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown. Haydock's Managing Director Dickon White was delighted with the entry yesterday. "Reverence confirmed himself a sprinter of the highest order last year and it would be wonderful to watch him defend his title against up-and-coming speedsters like Sakhee's Secret and Dutch Art at Haydock Park on Sept. 8," he said.

MANDESHA AIMING FOR NASSAU Princess Zahra Aga Khan's **Mandesha (Fr)** (Desert Style {Ire}) has been confirmed on course for a clash of the generations in the Aug. 4 G1 Nassau S. at Goodwood. Last year's G1 Prix d'Astarte, G1 Prix Vermeille and G1 Prix de l'Opera heroine featured amongst yesterday's strong entry of 26 distaffers for the 10-furlong contest. "This is very much her objective, unless something goes wrong," the owner/breeder's Racing Manager Georges Rimaud told *PA Sport*. "Everything is going well; she looks very well and she is behaving better than she has for her last two races. She tends to take some time to come to herself really, and I think she just thrives later in the season. As she strengthens she gains confidence, so she should be okay. This will be a real test for her and we will be able to see more clearly after it what we shall do next.

But that is another good reason to travel over rather than keep her in France. She is okay on most ground, but we obviously wouldn't want very soft ground, she is better on good ground. She has won Group 1s over a mile, 10 and 12 furlongs, but I think she is at her best over 10 furlongs and more." As expected, the list for the £200,000 contest includes the Niarchos Family's G1 Epsom Oaks winner **Light Shift** (Kingmambo) and Michael Tabor and Susan Magnier's G1 Pretty Polly S. and G1 Irish Oaks victress **Peeping Fawn** (Danehill), but there is also the prospect of Michael Ryan's G1 English and Irish 1000 Guineas heroine **Finsceal Beo (Ire)** (Mr. Greeley) and Pam Sly's **Speciosa (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) could make an appearance. Last year's G1 1000 Guineas winner was runner-up to Peeping Fawn in the Pretty Polly on her latest start June 30 and, despite holding the alternative option of Deauville's July 29 G1 Prix d'Astarte, looks to be Goodwood-bound. "We are meeting today to decide whether she goes for the Nassau Stakes or the Prix d'Astarte, but the Nassau is more of a prestigious race, and I think the mile and a quarter would suit her rather than the mile at Deauville," Sly commented. Other notables include Derrick Smith, Michael Tabor and Susan Magnier's G1 Falmouth S. winner **Simply Perfect (GB)** (Danehill) and Cheveley Park Stud's **Nannina (GB)** (Medicean {GB}).

Scaling the Heights in Virginia...

The coming of spring generally ushers in a fresh string of sophomores looking to make their mark along the Triple Crown trail in hopes that they can bring it all together the first Saturday in May. Up until a few years ago, those showing an affinity for the grass have had limited opportunity to ply their trade while racing for lucrative purses. Colonial Downs, which has gradually increased the purses of their marquee events over the past several years, created a series to highlight the three-year-old stars of the turf with the inception of Grand Slam of Grass Series comprised of the GIII Colonial Turf Cup (Colonial Downs), GII Virginia Derby (Colonial Downs), GI Secretariat S. (Arlington Park) and GI Breeders' Cup Turf (Monmouth Park). "Our niche is the turf track and the premier three-year-olds are generally heading to the Triple Crown races on the dirt and we wanted to start a tradition on the grass that is somewhat similar to the Classic races on the dirt," explained Colonial Downs President Ian Stewart. "We've been very pleased with how the series has progressed. Interest has been growing every year. We think this will be our best year yet." Set for its 10th renewal this year, the Virginia Derby, which ballooned to \$1-million three years ago, has had very little difficulty getting the big names to participate. Recent winners of the race include 2004 turf champion Kitten's Joy, MGISW English Channel (2005) and Go Between, who set a stakes record in last year's renewal. "You'll find that a lot of the major trainers when they're looking for horses, they're looking at and aiming at this 3yo turf series," explained Colonial Downs Director of Publicity and Marketing Darrell Wood. Trainer Rick Violette Jr. substantiated that claim.

"I think it's great," he said. "It's only been the last few years that there has been substantial money for three-year-old turf horses. You'd run for \$75,000-\$100,000, except maybe the Secretariat. I'm not sure exactly how they do it, but it is great for an owner to have a three-year-old turf horse that isn't running for nickels and dimes."

**DISPUTE BETWEEN REDDAM AND RAMSEY
SET FOR TRIAL** *By Jack Shinar and Ryan Conley,

A dispute over the sale of an injured horse has two of the nation's top owners headed to court. Kenneth Ramsey, who with his wife Sarah, won the 2004 Eclipse Award as the nation's leading owner, stands accused of cheating prominent owner J. Paul Reddam in a Santa Ana, CA, lawsuit. The case is set for a civil jury trial starting July 23 in Orange County Superior Court. The case, which also names trainer Dale Romans as a defendant in an alleged conspiracy, focuses on the \$600,000 sale by Ramsey to Reddam of then three-year-old colt Big Picture on July 10, 2005. The lawsuit claims Big Picture was lame and in considerable pain when he arrived at trainer Doug O'Neill's Southern California barn the day after the sale, a condition resulting from alleged undisclosed chronic shin problems. Reddam's attorney, Daniel Baren, said he intends to prove that the defendants "doped up" Big Picture with painkillers and anti-swelling medication in order for the colt to pass a veterinarian's examination needed to complete the sale. Reddam is seeking general, punitive, and exemplary damages, an order rescinding the sale agreement, the return of the original purchase price, and a permanent injunction barring the defendants "from engaging in the types of unfair business practices alleged..." The defendants are accused of fraudulent inducement, concealment and misrepresentation, conspiracy to defraud, and unfair business practices. Reddam, the president of the CashCall finance lending company in Fountain Valley, Ca., and a major player in Thoroughbred racing this decade, said he believes Ramsey, once informed of his objections, had an obligation to void the deal because of Big Picture's physical problems. Instead, Reddam said in reference to the defendants, "Their attitude seems to be that if you didn't do your diligence, that's your problem."
