RAIL OFF TRACK

Juddmonte Farms' **Rail Link (GB)** (Dansili {GB}--Docklands, by Theatrical {Ire}), last year's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner, will not make it to the track this year after connections revealed the four-year-old has suffered a tendon injury.

Having already undergone minor surgery in Newmarket during the winter, the Andre Fabre trainee was expected to return for a late-summer campaign, but those plans have now been shelved. "The colt has suffered a tendon strain and will not race this

year," Racing Manager Lord Grimthorpe told *PA Sport*. Unraced at two, the bay kicked off his career inauspiciously after clipping heels and unseating his rider in a Saint Cloud maiden last April, before finishing second in a Chantilly allowance the following month. Warmed up for his third start, Rail Link finally got the job done at Saint Cloud May 29 and made it two straight with a victory in the following month's G3 Pris Du Lys at Longchamp. Victorious over subsequent GI Breeders' Cup Turf hero Red Rocks (Ire) in the July 14 G1 Grand Prix de Paris, he added wins in the G2 Prix Niel in September followed by a neck score over Pride (Ire) in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe Oct. 1. He concluded the sea and was named Hwt Three-year-old Colt at 11-14f in France last year. According to Lord Grimthorpe, a decision on the four-year-old's future will be announced shortly.

(Street Cry {Ire}) will be giving the head runner-up of that race, **Strike a Deal** (Smart Strike), when they meet again Saturday. But the storms that brought heavy rains to the Northeast yesterday raised the possibility of another potentially important component to the Virginia Derby--

the condition of the turf. With thunderstorms in the forecast through Friday, there's a chance that the jewel of the Colonial Downs meet will be run on grass with at least some give to it, which suits the trainer of Strike a Deal just fine. "He's been on all kinds of turf, and if it's soft, I'd say it's better for him, because you know he can handle it, while some of the others haven't been on it and maybe can't handle it," said Alan Goldberg, who conditions Strike a Deal for Richard Santulli's Jayeff 'B' Stable. Goldberg added with a chuckle, "But, at this point I'm more worried about just getting him there-- have you looked outside?" Strike a Deal has twice raced over turf rated yielding, finishing second in the Pilgrim S. at Belmont last October before winning the Laurel Futurity a month later. Rival Summer Doldrums, meanwhile, has been on firm turf for his only two grass efforts--a nose loss to Strike a Deal in the May 23 Straight Deal S. at Belmont and in the Turf Cup. Of the others in the race, several have wins on turf rated good, but only **Duveen** (Horse Chestnut {SAf}) has won on yielding ground, having annexed the May 4 GIII American Turf S. on a yielding Churchill lawn.

Senate Races Spark Speculation

Recent campaign filings have stoked rumors that several senior Senators may retire.

Five-term Senator John Warner (R-VA), 80, says he will decide in September whether to seek a sixth term. Through June 30, Warner's campaign raised just \$71,500 but has \$735,000 on hand should he decide to run again. Warner ran uncontested in his last race.

Other Senators up for re-election in 2008 include Chuck Hagel (R-NE), with \$485,000 raised through June; Larry Craig (R-ID) with \$200,000 raised; Thad Cochran (R-MS), with \$312,000 raised but nearly \$1.1 million on hand; and Tim Johnson (D-SD), who has raised \$660,000 and reports \$1.8 million on hand. Still recovering from a brain hemorrhage he suffered last December, Johnson has not yet cast a vote in the Senate this year, fueling speculation he will retire.

Democrats hold a 51-49 margin in the Senate. Of the **21 GOP and 12 Democratic Senators** up for re-election in 2008, only Wayne Allard (R-CO), has announced he will not seek another term.

CONSOLIDATING GAINS

The bottom line for sales companies begins with gross, so the obvious conclusion from this week's season-opening Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July Yearling Sale--that Fasig's average looks better when they keep the number catalogued below 500--isn't as compelling as we might think. It appears to be true, though. In the last four years, twice fewer than 500 were catalogued. In 2004, 495 were catalogued, 452 offered and 338 sold, for a 'clearance rate' (sold/offered) of 75 percent, and an average of \$114,260. Last year, there were 477 catalogued, 407 offered and 307 sold; the clearance rate was again 75 percent and the average was \$115,954. On the other hand, in 2005, Fasig catalogued a whopping 679 for the July sale; 601 were offered, but only 368 sold, a clearance rate of 61 percent. The average was \$100,832. This year, 581 were catalogued; 521 were offered, of which 354 sold. The clearance rate was 68 percent, better than 2005, but not as good as 2004 and 2006. This year's average was \$102,941.

So the obvious conclusion is that Fasig has a 'stronger' sale when they keep the number catalogued under 500; but sales companies tally up gross sales, not simply averages. We can't say for certain that the gross wouldn't have dipped significantly in 2005 and 2007 had they not jumped the numbers, but it certainly seems relevant that the Fasig July gross has landed within a \$3-million band (high \$38.6-million in 2004, low \$35.6-million in 2006) in the last four years.

Primarily because we were able to calculate that the North American juveniles and horses of racing age sales this year were down 10 percent, it seemed an obvious guess (or 'projection') that the Fasig average would be off by 10 percent; the average seemed, in this case, a better measurement to project, because of the 22 percent increase from 2006 in the number catalogued. The number sold rose by 15 percent, and the gross rose by 2 percent, a little under \$1-million. In the event, both the average (\$102,941 from \$115,954) and the median (\$80,000 from \$90,000) were off 11 percent from '06. That's almost exactly what we expected. Whether upcoming sales will follow that same trend is something we'll have to wait and see. It wouldn't be surprising. The Dow Jones may be flirting with 14,000, but the horse market has risen almost constantly since 1992, with only a blip in 2001-'03, caused by a combination of the 'dot-com crash' and Kentucky's MRLS disaster which probably cost \$300-million a year. Between 2004-'06 the overall major NA and European markets, from Fasig through the end of the year, grew by about 27 percent, from an estimated \$1-billion in '04 to an estimated \$1.275-bil. in '06. A 10 percent contraction in '07 would be neither surprising nor alarming--except for those whose profit margins are torpedoed by increasing stud fees.

The New Sires...

Fasig's revival the last few years can be attributed to two innovations: this sale's New Sire Showcase, and their ability to attract top race fillies/broodmare prospects to their Sunday sale in November. The sales company wanted to point out that the New Sires comprised more than half the catalogue this year, as opposed to less than half the catalogue this year, surmising that could account for some of the drop in average. It may be: the good stuff by proven sires does bring more than the good stuff by unproven sires, after all. But I thought, in this sale, it was more a case of how many yearlings, as we like to say now, had check marks ('ticks', if you're European) in all the boxes; to where is 'the bar' raised, you might say. I thought 'the bar' in this sale was \$150,000, and, as we saw, it ranged up to just about the \$500,000 level. By my unofficial count, 85 of the 354 yearlings sold (24 percent), sold for prices between \$150,000-\$500,000. That's just about a quarter of the horses sold, and suggests horses by sires people like, who 'reach the bar' as individuals, and vet clean, sell very well. No news flash there, but it may be very significant to remember that a quarter of the yearlings actually sold reached the bar.

Among them were quite a few, naturally, by first-crop sires. There was one yearling (\$150,000) by crop commercial leader Smarty Jones, and Darby Dan's promising Sadler's Wells horse, Perfect Soul, had a colt bring \$250,000. There were also 11 sires which had three or more yearlings sell and averaged \$85,000+, which I would have said is pretty good going; each of the eleven had at least one \$150,000+ yearling, and, unusually for this sale, none stand in Florida. Ten stand in Kentucky, and Domestic Dispute stands in Maryland.

Though he was edged out for leadership in average by Medaglia d'Oro (six averaged \$150,833), Lion Heart (15 averaged \$148,166) was runaway leader among first-crop sires of \$150,000+ yearlings: seven of his 15 sold brought or exceeded that figure. Tied for a distant second in \$150,000+ yearlings were Medaglia d'Oro and Tapit (10 averaged \$93,700), with three each. Strong Hope (five averaged \$135,000), Speightstown (five averaged \$110,000), and Cuvee (nine averaged \$104,111) had two each. The other five sires with three or more sold and \$85,000+ averages had one each, and were: Candy Ride (three averaged \$138,333); Domestic Dispute (six averaged \$111,666); Friends Lake (six averaged \$105,000); Congaree (four averaged \$101,000); and Toccet (nine averaged \$85,111). In addition, six other sires averaged just under \$70,000 or more: Seattle Fitz, Peace Rules, Saarland, Omega Code, Even The Score, and Chapel Royal.

Among true 'freshman' sires (first juveniles), both Full Mandate (\$200,000) and Aldebaran (\$180,000) had their lone offerings sell well, and Harlan's Holiday (five averaged \$132,000) certainly enjoys continued popularity. Another from this group who had a good sale is the lesser-known Claiborne A.P. Indy horse, Flatter, whose three yearlings averaged \$101,666.

Malibu Moon's first Kentucky crop are two-year-olds also, and he was undoubtedly one of the stars among the more proven sires, with eight from his second Kentucky crop averaging \$195,625, including the saletopper. With last weekend's G2 Delaware Oak winner (sired on a \$3,000 season), a couple of impressive two-year-old winners already from his first Kentucky crop, and sales results like these, it looks like this horse's commercial improvement isn't anywhere near its peak. Another who sold really well was Indian Charlie (seven averaged \$167,857), though the now-established Mr. Greeley actually topped them both among older sires with three or more catalogued, with four averaging \$207,500. More Than Ready (nine averaged \$138,777) again sold consistently well; and three yearlings from the first Kentucky crop by Taylor Made's Northern Afleet, sire of Afleet Alex, averaged \$160,000.

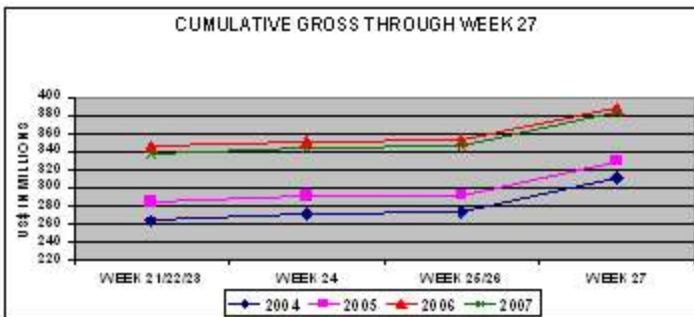

DOWNPOUR FORCES BELMONT TO CANCEL WEDNESDAY CARD

Belmont Park cancelled its live card and simulcasting menu Wednesday because of heavy thunderstorms that dumped five inches of rain on the track. Internet and Telebet wagering on other tracks was still available. The heavy downpour caused minor flooding in Belmont's clubhouse lobby and in the jockey's room. The dirt races scheduled for Wednesday will be re-drawn and used for the Sunset Friday card. The two turf races scheduled for Wednesday will not be brought back.

LAUREL CUTTING TAKEOUT In a program billed as "Ten Days at 10 Percent--Racing's Best Bet," takeout on Maryland's live races will be cut approximately in half during Laurel Park's 10-day summer meeting that runs Aug. 10-23. "We want to get people focused on the Maryland product during a very competitive period," said Maryland Jockey Club President Lou Raffetto. "We hear a lot of talk about what reduced takeout can do for business and this seemed like the perfect time to experiment with the concept." Takeout will be 10 percent on all bets on all live races conducted at Laurel, plus the legislated percentage to be allocated to the Maryland Million Fund, resulting in a blended rate of approximately 11.4 percent. The lower takeout on the trifecta, superfecta and Pick 6, is significantly below the standard takeout rate which would have been 25.75 percent. As a result, payoffs on these wagers will be 20 percent greater. "It will be like having a built-in rebate benefiting the \$2 bettor as well as the \$2000 bettor," added Raffetto. The Maryland Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association (MTHA) negotiating committee, chaired by Dale Capuano, and also consisting of John Alecci, Jerry Robb, Katy Voss and Richard Hoffberger, agreed to the plan. Raffetto commended the MTHA for its willingness to cooperate.

That one is a 3/4-sibling to SW & GISP Dr. Caton, and a half to graded winners Drilling for Oil and White Crown from the immediate family of Affirmed. Also debuting is Shadwell's **Sabooh (A.P. 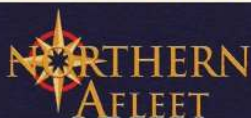
