## A WORTHY SUBSTITUTE

Today's GI Coaching Club American Oaks took a major hit with the withdrawal of **Rags to Riches** (A.P. Indy), but that hasn't fazed trainer Todd Pletcher, who still sends the 3-5 morning-line favorite in **Octave** (Unbridled's Song). The gray, who finished second behind champion Dreaming of Anna in last term's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, was runner-up in five straight stakes attempts before annexing Belmont's GI Mother Goose S. last time June 30. "Coming back in 21 days is a little quicker than we normally would, but the way she's training it shouldn't be a problem," Pletcher said. Accord-

ing to Pletcher, GI Belmont S. heroine Rags to Riches has galloped well the past few days and may record a published workout Sunday. **Folk** (Quiet American), an impressive maiden at the Big A last November, enjoyed her time in the desert this winter, posting victories in the Listed UAE 1000 Guineas Feb. 15 and the UAE Oaks Mar. 8. The Godolphin colorbearer looks to bounce back following a 10th-place against the boys in the GII UAE Derby Mar. 31. "As for her training, I'm real happy with her," Godolphin assistant trainer Rick Mettee offered. "She's done well since getting back from Dubai. It's been pretty straightforward; she's had a few breezes and she's galloped out well. The one caveat is going a mile and a quarter off the bench. She was able to get nine furlongs in Dubai, so we're hopeful she can go another furlong."

## WOODMAN EUTHANIZED

Champion and leading sire **Woodman** (Mr. Prospector --Playmate, by Buckpasser) was euthanized due to the infirmities of old age Thursday at Ashford Stud in Versailles, Kentucky. The 24-year-old stallion had more than 40 mares scanned in foal this past spring while standing for \$20,000. "Woodman has been a terrific servant to his shareholders and to Ashford Stud," said Dermot Ryan, Ashford's manager. "He will be sadly missed." Bred in Kentucky by Warner L. Jones Jr. and Ed A. Cox Jr., the chestnut sold for \$3 million as a yearling at Keeneland July and was sent to Ireland. Carrying the colors of Robert Sangster and trained by Vincent O'Brien, the half to SW Single Thread captured three of his first four starts, including the G3 Anglesey S. and G3 Futurity S., and was the highweighted two-year-old colt in Ireland in 1985. He had just one outing at three, a third in the listed Mill Ridge S., and entered stud in Kentucky in 1987. Woodman made an immediate impact. His first two-year-olds hit the track in 1990, when he was represented by French champion and multiple Group 1 winner Hector Protector, English champion and multiple group winner Mujtahid and U.S. multiple graded-stakes winner Hansel. *cont. p5*

**ONE MILLION REASONS TO TRY TURF**

Michael and Doreen Tabor's **Circular Quay** (Thunder Gulch) makes his turf debut in today's GII Virginia Derby at Colonial Downs. The handsome chestnut opened his account last season with three straight

tallies, including the prestigious GI Hopeful S. at Saratoga. He completed the exacta over Keeneland's Polytrack in the GI Lane's End Breeders' Futurity last October before closing up his two-year-old campaign with a distant second behind subsequent GI Kentucky Derby champ Street Sense. Circular Quay encountered a nightmare trip when fifth in the GIII Risen Star S. Feb. 10, but bounced back nicely to add the GII Louisiana

Derby Mar. 10 to his trophy case. Sent off at 11-1 in the Run for the Roses, he rallied from 18th to finish sixth, beaten 9 1/4 lengths. The son of GI Spinaway S. winner Circle of Life was last seen finishing fifth in the GI Preakness S. May 19. Circle of Life (Belong to Me), also campaigned by Tabor, finished fifth in her only attempt on the lawn against Belmont allowance foes. "[Circular Quay] has the pedigree to suggest that turf would be a viable option," trainer Todd Pletcher told *Daily Racing Form*. "This isn't necessarily a permanent thing, but we thought it was a good option at this stage. We thought it would be worth taking a shot." Circular Quay has posted six workouts over the Belmont lawn since the second jewel of the Triple Crown, including a four-furlong move in :48 4/5 July 15. "He has trained very well over the grass," Pletcher continued. "We're optimistic."

**Round Three...**

**Summer Doldrums** (Street Cry {Ire}) and **Strike a Deal** (Smart Strike) have put on quite a show in their first two encounters, and lock horns again here. Strike a Deal beat the former by a nose in Belmont's Straight Deal S. May 23, then had the tables turned on him by a head in the GIII Colonial Turf Cup S. last time June 16. It has been a successful transition to grass for Summer Doldrums, who makes his third start on the lawn here.

**Pleasant Strike** bids for his third straight score. The Edward Evans homebred followed a victory in an off-the-turf optional claimer at Arlington May 26 with a 3 3/4-length score over **Lovango** and **Quasicobra** in the June 23 GIII Arlington Classic on the grass. Trainer Dermot Weld brings Moyglare Stud Farm's **Perfect Casting** over from Ireland. The chestnut colt broke his maiden at Leopardstown May 30 and wired the field in a conditions race at Navan June 15, winning by a nose. He stretches out off the pair of one-mile tests in his stakes bow. **Lattice** was a maiden winner in his career opener at Gulfstream in March with a second behind Inca King in a Keeneland allowance test Apr. 27, with Pleasant Strike back in third. The Claiborne/Dilschneider runner returned to take a Churchill allowance by a head May 18, and was an even fourth to Inca King in his first try in stakes company, the June 16 GII Jefferson Cup.

**Arson Squad** makes his first start since taking the Feb. 3 GII Strub S., but has won off shorter layoffs. The four-year-old gelding came back after a two-month break to capture the San Pedro S. in April of 2006. Third in a pair of graded events, he added a victory in the GII Swaps BC H. in July, then took an additional two months off after finishing fourth in the GII La Jolla H. on the grass at Del Mar. He returned to post an allowance score at Oak Tree Oct. 14. Eighth in the Dec. 26 GI Malibu S., he improved to be fourth in the Jan. 13 GII San Fernando BC S. prior to his Strub success. *cont. p4*

He has put in a series of rapid workouts for this test. **Buzzards Bay** was out just four times last year, winning the GIII All American H. at Golden Gate in February and the GII Oaklawn H. in April. He disappeared after finishing fourth in the June 17 GI Stephen Foster H. On the bench for nearly 11 months, the Florida-bred finished a solid third when he resurfaced in the May 5 GII Mervyn Leroy H. before winning the June 2 GII Californian S. by a bob over **Sun Boat**. Sun Boat was claimed for \$50,000 after running eighth on the turf at Santa Anita Apr. 12, but came to life on Cushion Track. The bay gelding rallied to beat \$40,000 claimers May 13 at Hollywood, and finished full of run to just miss posting a 25-1 upset in the Californian. **Heat Seeker**, third in Group 1 company in Ireland as a juvenile, made just one start at three, but was pinched back at the start of that optional claimer at Belmont in September and finished eighth. The chestnut colt has crossed the wire in second in all three outings this term, missing by a head on the Santa Anita turf in April and by 3/4 of a length on the Cushion May 24. He was a half-length back on the line in a June 30 allowance on the Hollywood lawn, but was awarded the win when Gem Proof was demoted to fourth.

Hansel went on to win both the GI Preakness S. and GI Belmont S. the following season, bankrolling over \$2.9 million, and earned an Eclipse Award as champion three-year-old, while Hector Protector captured the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains and G1 Prix Jacques le Marois during his sophomore campaign. Four years later, Timber Country landed the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile and GI Champagne S. on his way to an Eclipse Award, and added the GI Preakness S. in 1996 before retiring to stud in Japan. Hector Protector's full sister Bosra Sham made headlines as a yearling in 1994 when she topped the Tattersalls Houghton Sale at 530,000 when selling to Wafic Said's Addison Racing. Winner of the G1 Fillies Mile the following year, the chestnut captured the G1 1000 Guineas and G1 Champion S. in 1996 and was

highweighted in the 9 1/2-11 furlong category. She earned the nod in the same category at four in 1997 based on her victories in the G2 Prince of Wales's S. and G3 Brigadier Gerard S. Woodman later sired Hawk Wing, a Group 1 winner at two, three and four who also numbered runner-up finishes in the G1 2000 Guineas, G1 Derby S., G1 Irish Champion

S. and G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. The dark bay's defeat of his elders in the 2002 G1 Coral-Eclipse S. sealed his highweighted status at 9 1/2-11 furlongs in both England and Ireland, and he was ranked as the top miler in both countries at four in 2003 on the strength of a towering success in the G1 Lockinge S. His first foals are two-year-olds this year.

Woodman was also represented by Japanese champion sprinter Hishi Akebono, French highweighted juvenile Way of Light and Canadian champion Woodcarver as well as Group 1 winners Ciro, Chiselling, Gay Gallanta, Hula Angel, Mahogany Hall and Timber Trader (NZ). According to equineline.com, Woodman has been represented by 109 stakes winners (6 percent of foals) from 18 crops to race, including 44 graded-stakes winners. His progeny have amassed over \$99 million to date.

**TIME CALLED ON PERCY** Anthony Pakenham's **Sir Percy (GB)** (Mark of Esteem {Ire}--Percy's Lass {GB}, by Blakeney {GB}) has run his last race, connections announced yesterday. Last year's G1 Epsom Derby hero has failed to reach the frame in four subsequent starts and trailed in last of six in the June 20 G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot. "I don't think he'll run again, as he's had enough and I wouldn't want to put him through it again," Victoria Pakenham said yesterday. "We are looking to get a suitable place for him to stand at stud and are not tempted by overseas interests, as we want him to stand in England." Trained by Marcus Tregoning, Sir Percy remained unbeaten at two and followed success in Goodwood's G2 Vintage S. with a defeat of Horatio Nelson (Ire) in the G1 Dewhurst S. at Newmarket in October. After a second to George Washington (Ire) in the G1 2000 Guineas back at that track the following May, he came out on top of a blanket finish to the Epsom Classic by a short head. Off the track until an unplaced effort in the G1 Champion S. back at Newmarket in October, he was an encouraging fourth on his four-year-old bow in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic at Nad Al Sheba Mar. 31 before finishing sixth in the June 1 G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom and in the Prince of Wales's. "Fingers crossed, we have found an interesting place for him to go but nothing is signed--it's somewhere where he will get good mares and we have bought a couple of fillies, so we will be sending those, she added. "He didn't have the typical profile for a Derby horse--he was unbeaten and a very precocious two-year-old and in any normal year he would have won the Guineas." Sir Percy retires with a record of 9-5-1-0 and earnings of £1,021,740.

They are last year's G1 Irish Derby and G1 Irish Champion S. winner **Dylan Thomas (Ire)** (Danehill), the G1 Coronation Cup victor **Scorpion (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}), 2007 Irish Derby hero **Soldier of Fortune (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and the G1 Eclipse S. fourth **Yellowstone (Ire)** (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}). "How the horses are early next week will be the main factor when it comes to deciding running plans," he told the *Post*. "The ground will be less of an issue, although Dylan Thomas does seem to be a much better horse on top of the ground. We will decide early next week on runners and it's possible we will run a few in the race."

**Topic 1: Kentucky Will No Longer Be the Stallion Capital of the World in 2030.**

Ocala, Florida, resident William Rainbow disagreed with the premise of the topic, stating that the world's highest concentration of important stallions is Central Kentucky, and he statistically supported his position. There is no evidence, Rainbow said, that the world will ever turn its attention away from the Bluegrass. Harrington also made a convincing argument, calling on evidence from his own country and citing the rise in status of Australian-based stallion Redoute's Choice (Aus). In support of his argument, he said that when a replacement was needed for George Washington (Ire), a call was made to the Hunter Valley and Encosta de Lago (Aus) was shipped north. Harrington also cited the rise in popularity and relative success enjoyed on the world stage by Japanese stallions.

**Topic 2: Shuttle Stallions are Detrimental to the Industry and Breed**

Buffolo took the lead on this subject, vehemently denying that the practice of shuttling stallions has any negative impact on the Thoroughbred business. Allowing horses to serve in dual hemispheres allows each country to expand, improve and diversify the breed. A South American native, Buffolo called upon the example of Spend a Buck, a largely mediocre sire despite his credentials in the Northern Hemisphere, but sire of a number of transplanted Brazilian horses who made an impact in the States, such as Pico Central (Brz), Hard Buck (Brz) and Einstein (Brz). Kilby took issue with the idea of shuttling horses, claiming that the risks outweigh the rewards. It serves to flood the Thoroughbred market and to dilute instead of diversify the breed. Kilby also pointed out that there are health risks to the horses associated with shuttling.

What once was a quality-driven activity, breeding Thoroughbred racehorses is now open to any Tom, Dick or Harry who owns a mare, Bryce submitted. There is a lot of "gluttony" and stallions have become "money-making machines" and there is little hope for reform. As stallion book sizes have continued to grow, it has become increasingly hard to reach the threshold of 10- percent stakes winners to foals and, citing work by Bill Oppenheim, Gina stated the new standard has become six percent. **cont. p8**

Elliott argued that productivity is the key to any business endeavor and that, despite open stallion books, the average number of mares to visit a stallion is just 58.6 in Kentucky and 16.9 in the U.S. overall. Fertility issues are of little concern, nor are any psychological effects on the stallion from large books. Stallion owners and managers are simply providing supply in answer to the corresponding demand, Elliott says.

**Topic 4: The Thoroughbred Industry Needs to Introduce Artificial Insemination**

Each a veterinarian, Pathak and Sun took on this delicate subject. In no uncertain terms, Pathak maintained that the practice of artificial insemination should remain banned. The Jockey Club insists that all foals produced in this country be the result of a natural cover and there are economic and practical reasons to leave it that way. There is little or no benefit to covering the mare artificially, as the risk of disease and injury are low. AI would also decrease the diversity of the breed. Sun attempted to extol the virtues of the practice, claiming that it would not destroy, but rather improve the Thoroughbred industry. Horses could inseminate over 1,000 mares a year and the risk of disease and infection would decrease significantly.

**Topic 5: January 1<sup>st</sup> and the Date of First Cover: We Need to Follow the Australian Example**

The contention was that there are some horsepeople in the U.S. who take advantage of the current system and foal out their mares shortly before the New Year, yet fail to report this to the Jockey Club. Birch advocated the position that the U.S. needs to adopt a program similar to that of Australia, New Zealand and South Africa, whereby Sept. 1 is fixed as the first possible cover date, alleviating the problem of early foaling.

The Jockey Club has begun sending teams out into the field in an attempt to police and curtail early foaling. Magical Romance and Endless Summer are two very public examples of early foaling gone bad. Brandon believes the current system in this country should remain, in large part because it is difficult to enforce any rules. Rice stated that it would be hard to insure that none of this country's 3,428 stallions cover a mare prior to Feb. 15. Stallion owners who would likely breed their private mares earlier than that date should have the right to have their mares covered whenever they like, he argued.

**Topic 6: The Bias Against Aged Stallions is Justified**

Roethemeier made the case that it is simply not true that as a stallion ages, he loses the capacity to pass on his genetic material and sire a quality runner. After the age of 20, he pointed out, Danzig sired the likes of Century City (Ire), Ad Valorem, Hard Spun and US Ranger, while Mr. Prospector was represented by such horses as Aldebaran, E Dubai, Fusaichi Pegasus, Hussonet and Dancethruthedawn in his twilight years. There exists an unfair bias towards older stallions, but as long as a stallion can produce a foal, he can produce a high-quality one, he offered. Reynier thought otherwise, saying that decreasing libido and the effects of age can and do have a negative impact. He points out that after their 20<sup>th</sup> birthdays, the SW/foal ratios for Raise a Native and Mr. Prospector declined from 12 and 17 percent to three and one percent, respectively. Foals on offer by older stallions are also less sought after, Reynier claimed.

The 12 participants were split into two teams and a winner was declared. More meaningful is the experience these young future horse people have gained in their first year of the program. Having completed a seven-month stay in Lexington, the group is now on holiday through Aug. 12 and will reconvene at Darley's Hunter Valley base in Australia thereafter. Graduation for the Darley Flying Start class of 2006 is set for July 5, 2008. ## SPITZER ASKS RACING FRANCHISE CONTENDERS TO RE-SUBMIT BIDS

New York Gov. Eliot Spitzer is asking the four entities vying for the state's Thoroughbred franchise to re-submit their bidding packages to reflect changes made in their structure and plans over the past year. He also opened the door for any of the existing bidders to join forces in a joint venture deal. Spitzer said he will then make his long-anticipated decision on his recommendation for the future of the franchise by Sept. 4. The announcement, which struck down days of rumors and media reports that he was going to be re-bidding the entire franchise process to more than just the present bidders, gives the four bidders until Aug. 7 to submit their changes. The administration said the request came because some of the bidding groups have seen dramatic changes in their structures that could affect their overall proposals. Excelsior Racing Associates has lost key partners and added new ones, such as real estate developer Steve Roth, while Capital Play was joined this week by Mohegan Sun, the Connecticut-based Indian casino company. And the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association recently left its partnership with Empire Racing Associates. There would be nothing to stop the bidders from adding new partners between now and Aug. 7 or even coming up with new ideas for the franchise. Bidders could also "strengthen" their existing bids with new plans, a state official said. The administration said July 20 that because of changes in the different bidding groups since April "each is being asked to update its proposal to reflect its current structure and financing or to confirm that there have been no material changes since the last submission." **AUSTRALIAN BREEDERS UNITED** After six years of protracted negotiations, the Australian Thoroughbred breeding industry finally will be represented by one united body. The results of the negotiations, which were completed yesterday in Melbourne, culminated in the commercial breeders' organization Aushorse officially joining the Thoroughbred Breeders' Australia. Aushorse Chairman and Arrowfield chief John Messara was elected president of TBA. "This development will result in breeders having one powerful body which will assist our industry to progress," said Messara, who also serves on the board of the Australian Pattern Race Committee. A watershed meeting between Aushorse and the TBA was held in February of 2002, with Messara outlining a proposal whereby a combined representative organisation could resolve ongoing funding issues for both parties. The stated advantages of the proposal also included enhanced professionalism, national and international credibility, appropriate input from all states and the combined power to lobby the government, sales companies and other relevant organisations. By 2003, the two fragmented bodies released a joint statement outlining a "heads of agreement" document relating to the union of the activities of the two groups, and the merger was finalized yesterday. Messara and Aushorse Director Ken Barry will sit on the 14-person TBA board. Woodlands Stud bloodstock manager Trevor Lobb was elected vice president of the TBA, and Western Australian Thoroughbred Breeders' Association President Sally Oakes was elected treasurer.
