THE SPITTING IMAGE OF HIS DAD?

Ready's Image (More Than Ready) will try to emulate the feat of his sire when he goes postward in today's GII Sanford S. at Saratoga. More Than Ready won the Sanford for Todd Pletcher in 1999 and the champion trainer will saddle the son for owner James Scaturochio in the 93rd renewal of the six-furlong race today. Ready's Image, a debut winner at Keeneland in April, was third behind Rated Fiasty in the May 3 GIII Kentucky Breeders' Cup S. With the addition of blinkers, the dark bay colt



Ready's Image *A Coglianese* romped home by 7 3/4 lengths in the July 1 Tremont S. at Belmont Park. Ready's Image breaks from the outside in the field of nine and has been made the 9-5 morning-line favorite. Pletcher will also saddle Michael Tabor's **The Roundhouse** (Fusaichi Pegasus) in the Sanford. The Roundhouse, out of GI Spinaway S. winner Circle of Life (Belong to Me), closed impressively to win his only start to date, a five-furlong maiden at Monmouth June 15. Trainer Stanley Hough will try to break up the Pletcher win parade with **Twenty Eight Hours** (Sky Mesa), who was third behind Ready's Image in the Tremont. "Todd has a lot of nice two-year-olds," Hough admitted. "He's in control, although, the thing about racing is you never know where the good horses come from." Twenty Eight Hours won at first asking at Keeneland Apr. 26 and made his second start in the Tremont. "He's a nice horse, but we have to find out where he fits; we want to see if he can run with the best," Hough said. "He broke his maiden rather early and he had that space in between races. I thought he needed that race in the Tremont. Ready's Image seems to be a nice horse. He ran away with authority that day." Hough will also have to deal with another juvenile powerhouse in Steve Asmussen, who sends out **Sok Sok** (Trippi), who overcame a bad start to win a Churchill maiden in his only start to date June 16. "He has a lot of speed, but was knocked off early in that race," Asmussen said. "I was concerned, but I was glad with the outcome. After talking to [jockey] Shaun [Bridgmohan] and watching the replay of the race, I was more impressed with his run." *Full Field p2*

SUBTLE IN SCINTILLATING SCHUYLERVILLE

The International Equine Acquisitions Holdings Stable purchased a 75-percent interest in **Subtle Aly** (French Envoy) last week from owner Alan Pesch and the two-year-old filly quickly repaid the group's confidence with a dramatic victory in yesterday's GIII Schuylerville S. at Saratoga. After stumbling at the break, the once-raced filly pulled her way into striking distance along the rail down the backstretch. She continued along the rail while **Subtle Aly** (center) *B Benson* racing a close-up fourth behind fractions of :22.04, :45.44 and :57.76 and neatly split horses turning for home to grab the lead at midstretch. She looked to have put away **I Promise** (Hook and Ladder), but the pacesetter battled back gamely on the inside as **Blitzing** (Montbrook) closed strongly to make it three noses on the wire. "That was a thrilling race," exclaimed winning trainer Richard Dutrow, Jr. "It was good for Opening Day." *Cont. p3*

It can't be said that Charles Fipke hasn't given Perfect Soul (Ire) every chance to succeed at stud. Over the past few years, Fipke, the Canadian diamond-hunter, has assembled a brood of both blue-blooded mares and accomplished runners for the son Sadler's Wells, whom Fipke retired to Darby Dan Farm in 2005 and whose oldest offspring are yearlings. Now, a year before Perfect Soul's youngsters hit the track, Fipke is enjoying what is perhaps an unexpected bonus to his plan: the offspring of the in-foal mares he purchased for Perfect Soul's first year at stud are now two, and some of them are showing promise. Of course, given the pedigrees of some of those horses, that shouldn't be a surprise. Case in point is the Fipke homebred **Tale of Ekati** (Tale of the Cat), who is 5-1 in the morning line for today's GII Sanford S. at Saratoga. Tale of Ekati is the third foal (first to race) out of the Sunday Silence mare Silence Beauty (Jpn), herself a daughter of MGISW Maplejinsky and a sister to champion Sky Beauty. Silence Beauty was purchased for \$1 million as a yearling, failed to win in three European starts, and was resold in foal to Tale of the Cat to Fipke for \$525,000 at the 2004 Keeneland November sale.

The resulting foal was named Tale of Ekati after the diamond mine--Canada's first--that Fipke discovered in the Northwest Territory. "That [Silence Beauty] was in foal to Tale of the Cat was really no consideration," said Jack Werk, Fipke's bloodstock advisor. "We bought her strictly because of her pedigree." Tale of Ekati made people take notice once on the ground however. "Wayne Sweezy at Darby Dan thought he was one of the best foals that Fipke had that year, and J.B. McKathan, who broke him, also thought he was probably the best of that group," said Werk. Tale of Ekati lived up to the hype in his debut, romping by 8 1/4 lengths in a 5 1/2-furlong Belmont maiden July 8, and takes the big jump into stakes company in the Sanford. Interestingly, another of Fipke's two-year-olds that has enjoyed early success is also by Tale of the Cat. The homebred filly Tale of the Forest, out of Fipke's \$90,000 2004 purchase Forest Flora (Woodman), broke her maiden over Woodbine's Polytrack a day after Tale of Ekati's win.

Subtle Aly Wins Schuylerville (cont. from p1)

Subtle Aly had made only one other start before yesterday's GIII Schuylerville S. at Saratoga, but it was a memorable one. The chestnut filly set the track record for 4 1/2 furlongs at Churchill Downs while winning her June 23 debut by a front-running five lengths in :50 2/5 for trainer Steve Asmussen. Richard Dutrow Jr. took over training duties after IEAH purchased Subtle Aly last week and he didn't have much time to get to know the filly. "We got her about six days ago, after Steve breezed her five furlongs," Dutrow said. "The first time I had seen her was today in the paddock. As soon as I saw Asmussen, I said, 'Thanks a lot. You've done a great job.' Asmussen said she would win the race and don't worry about anything." Dutrow did have some anxious moments at the break, however. "It looked like she didn't break too good, and [jockey] Edgar [Prado] said she didn't feel too comfortable behind. We got very lucky today, considering the way she broke. She did show up as a racehorse." Trainer Gary Contessa was happy with the game effort of I Promise, who battled back after looking a beaten horse at midstretch. "That's about as tough as they can get," Contessa said. "One jump before the wire, she had her. One jump after the wire, she had her. That's horseracing. When they are this young and this game, you just have to love them." [Click for the brisnet.com chart.](#)

WHITNEY WIN AND YOU'RE IN

Saratoga's exceptional Saturday card, headlined by the \$750,000 GI Whitney H., will feature the inauguration of the Breeders' Cup "Win and You're In" Challenge. The winner of each of the 25 challenge races will automatically qualify for the corresponding divisional race in the Breeders' Cup World Championships, which will be held Oct. 26-27 at Monmouth Park in Oceanport, New Jersey. Previously, Breeders' Cup selection was based on points accrued in graded-stakes races throughout the year and via selection by an international committee. Horses not originally nominated to the Breeders' Cup program that win a Challenge race will still need to pay the requisite supplementary fees before taking their place in the starting gate at Monmouth. "The Breeders' Cup Challenge give sports fans an easily understood 'Win and You're In' playoff concept that has been successful in other sports," said Breeders' Cup President and Chief Executive Officer Greg Avioli. "Since announcing the series last fall, we have received widespread industry support from our participating race-tracks and our horsemen for the Breeders' Cup Challenge. Working in concert with our network partner ESPN, we are excited about expanding the Breeders' Cup brand to our sport's most prestigious races leading to the Championships." In addition to the Whitney, the other "Win and You're In" races at Saratoga this Saturday are the GI Go for Wand H. for the Distaff division, the GI Diana H. for female turf runners and the GII Alfred G. Vanderbilt H. for sprinters. This year, with the exception of the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf--which is limited to 12 starters--starting fields for each Breeders' Cup race will be determined in the following manner after pre-entries are received Monday, Oct. 15:

All horses in the *TDN* are bred in North America, unless otherwise indicated

- (1) Breeders' Cup Challenge winners, who will earn a starting position in a corresponding Breeders' Cup divisional race
- (2) The next horses will be ranked on the total number of Breeders' Cup Points collected during the year until seven horses have been ranked based on Breeders' Cup Challenge races and Breeders' Cup Points.
- (3) The remaining seven horses will be ranked by the Racing Director/Secretaries Panel.

The Darley homebred has an unraced three-year-old filly named **Abaya** (Storm Cat) and a yearling colt by Elusive Quality. She produced a filly by Awesome Again this year. *Jilbab* was third in the GII Cotillion H. and fourth in the GI Alabama S. On the board in seven of nine outings, she retired to Gainsborough Farm with three wins and earnings of \$347,880.

NTRA REPORT FROM **Capitol Hill**

Appropriations Bill Carries Huge Impact on Racing

Section 738 of the Agricultural Appropriations bill for fiscal year 2008 (H.R. 3161), contains language would create a de facto ban on the international transportation of horses and possibly even the interstate transportation of horses. Sec. 738 would eliminate funding for quarantine facilities and other inspection services performed by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA).

By halting the import and export of horses, the bill would have devastating effect on the Breeders' Cup World Championships, the Olympic Games and the World Equestrian Games, among other international equestrian events.

Sec. 738 would also disrupt the world market for U.S. bloodstock sold at public auction as well as dual-hemisphere breeding programs for stallions.

NTRA and numerous other horse industry groups are lobbying for removal of Sec. 738 in its entirety from the legislation, which is expected to move to the House floor next week.

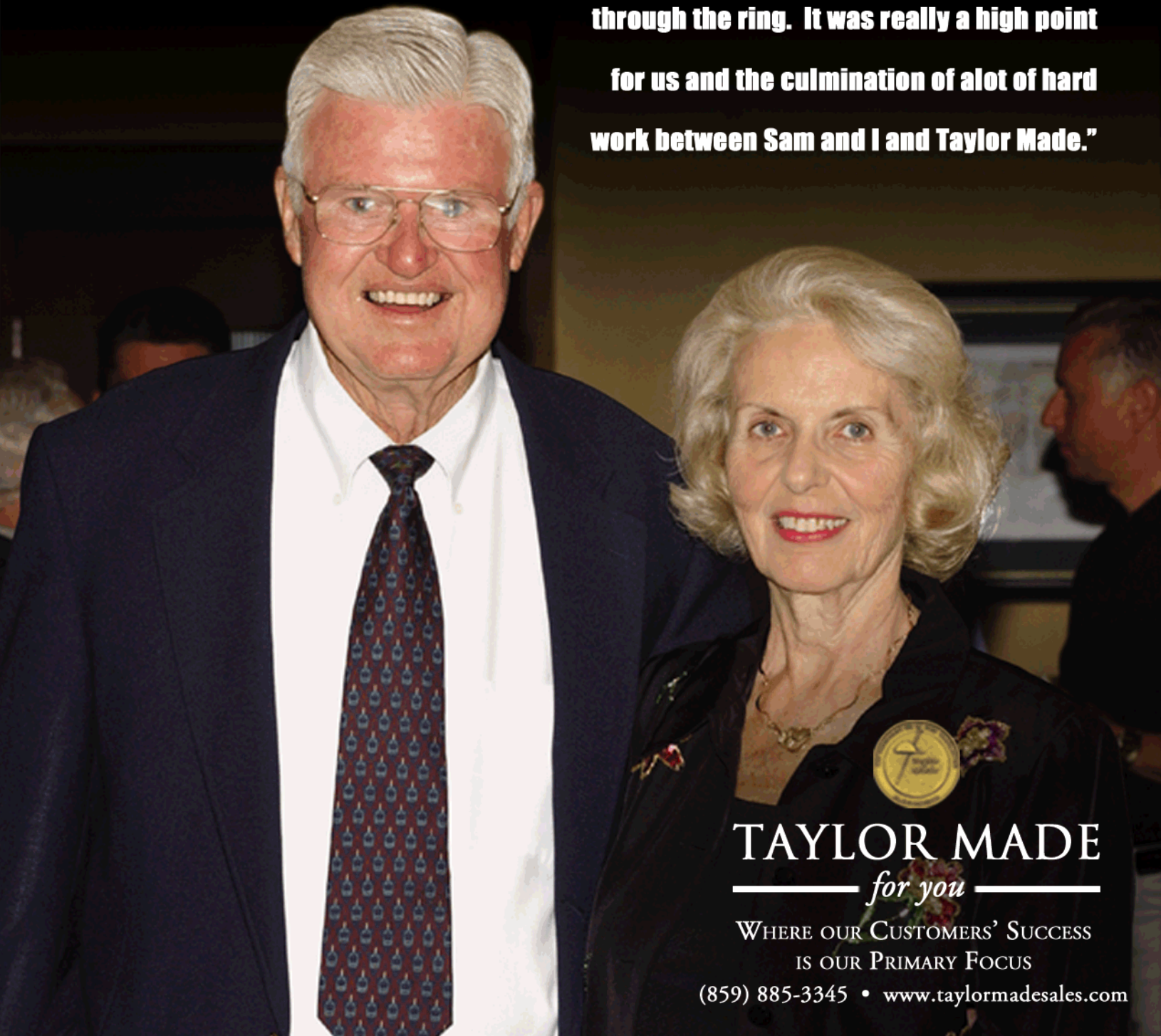

SETTLEMENT TERMS REACHED IN DISPUTE BETWEEN REDDAM AND RAMSEY

Settlement terms have been reached in the lawsuit between owners J. Paul Reddam and Kenneth Ramsey over an alleged injured horse, one day after a jury trial was scheduled to begin in a California superior court. Terms of the settlement are confidential, according to attorneys for the respective parties, and will become official upon the expected sign-off by Orange County Superior Court Commissioner Jane D. Myers, who is presiding over the case. Reddam will retain ownership of the horse at the center of the dispute, Big Picture, whom he acquired from Ramsey for \$600,000 in July 2005. "Ownership of the horse wasn't a component of the settlement terms," said Daniel Baren, an attorney representing Reddam, who originally asked the court to rescind the sale. Michael Meuser, an attorney representing both Ramsey and fellow defendant, trainer Dale Romans, also confirmed the settlement, but said he couldn't comment further. "They are all gentlemen, and settled it amicably," Meuser said. A jury trial was slated to begin July 23. However, by mid-afternoon the next day, the parties were in settlement negotiations. The dispute focused on the \$600,000 sale of the 2002 colt Big Picture by Ramsey to Reddam July 10, 2005. Reddam claimed, in part, that Big Picture was lame with alleged undisclosed chronic shin problems when he arrived at trainer Doug O'Neill's Southern California barn July 11, 2005. The defendants claimed, in part, that Big Picture wasn't lame at the time of the sale, and that a shin condition common to race horses was fully disclosed to Reddam's representatives.

Shakespeare Nears Return:

Grade I winner **Shakespeare** (Theatrical {Ire}), unraced since suffering his first loss when last of 12 in the 2005 GI Breeders' Cup Turf, has breezed seven times since May 26 as he prepares to make his return for new trainer Kiaran McLaughlin. "He's getting close," McLaughlin confirmed. "He had a bit of a tendon issue. He looks good and he's training fine." The six-year-old opened his career with five straight victories for trainer Bill Mott. He captured the 2005 GII Belmont Breeders' Cup H. and GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic Invitational S. Shakespeare has been nominated to the Aug. 5 GII Fourstardave at Saratoga.

10-cent Supers to Debut at Breeders' Cup:

The introduction of 10-cent superfectas has proven popular at many tracks over the past few years, and this October, the Breeders' Cup gets into the action. The \$23-million Breeders' Cup World Championships, to be held over two days at Monmouth Park Oct. 26-27, will offer fans to bet superfectas with a base unit of 10 cents. Typically, the minimum base unit of a superfecta is \$1. "It will be an interesting experiment for us, going from \$1 to 10 cents," Ken Kirchner told *The Blood-Horse*. Kirchner is the president of Falkirk International, a consulting firm that assists Breeders' Cup with its simulcasting and wagering operations. He added, "There is some debate within the industry about the effect it has on the overall handle of superfectas, but I have not seen anything conclusively one way or another."
