### SANTOS RETIRES FROM THE SADDLE

Jockey Jose Santos, whose easy-going attitude and fierce competitiveness made him one of the more popular jockeys of his time, announced his retirement Monday at Saratoga Race Course. The 46-year-old native of

Concepcion, Chile, had been trying to come back from injuries suffered in a three-horse spill at Aqueduct Feb. 1. "I had five fractures in my spine," said Santos, who also broke ribs in the spill. "Three of them were compression fractures of the [thoracic] vertebrae. The other two--the T-7 and T-8--

were more serious fractures. [Dr. Thomas M. Mauri; Director of Orthopaedic Spine Program at North Shore University Hospital, Great Neck, N.Y.] said that the way they were pressing against the spinal cord, there would be an 80-percent chance that I could wind up in a wheelchair if I continued to ride. This has been very hard for me, because I really wanted go out on my own terms," said Santos. "That didn't happen. I decided that I wanted to make this announcement today because I didn't want to take anything away from the Hall of Fame ceremonies." Santos will be inducted into the Hall of Fame in Saratoga Springs Monday, Aug. 6. **cont. p2**

### RAGS TO RICHES RETURNS TO TRAINING

**Rags to Riches** (A.P. Indy), winner of the GI Belmont S. in her latest start June 9, galloped over Belmont's main track Monday and was given the go-ahead by Dr. Paul Thorpe to resume training. "After reviewing the results of the physical exam she had at New Bolton, Dr. Thorpe felt there was no reason for her not to resume training," explained trainer Todd Pletcher. The chestnut is scheduled to join Pletcher's Saratoga string today following a morning gallop at Belmont. "I will watch her train over the next week before I make a final decision on whether or not she will race in the GI Alabama S. on Aug. 18." The filly is undefeated in five starts this term, including the GI Kentucky Oaks May 4 and the GI Santa Anita Oaks Mar. 11.

### A MOST DISTINGUISHED AMSTERDAM

Live Oak Plantation's **Most Distinguished** (Dixie Union) took advantage of crisp early fractions carved out by the front-running tandem **Out of Gwedda** (Out of Place), **Americanus** (Yonaguska) and **Sir Five Star** (Five Star Day), and closed stoutly in the lane to win Monday's GI Amsterdam S. at Saratoga. Settled off the early lead in sixth through an opening quarter of :22.02 and a half in :44.83, the 2-1 favorite made his move five wide turning for home and mowed down the game Americanus to collect his first stakes victory. "He ran unbelievable," said winning trainer Nick Zito. "He's consistent and never throws in a bad race. I can never thank the horse enough. The owners wanted to keep him sprinting, but you know me: I like to stretch horses out a little bit. It's obvious that he can do both." According to Zito, the \$500,000 FTSAUG yearling purchase will be pointed toward the GI King's Bishop S. Aug. 25. **cont. p2**

### TEAM VALOR PURCHASES ASTOR PARK

Team Valor International and Gary Barber have acquired **Astor Park** (Ecton Park) from Bryan and Holly Rice and will run the three-year-old filly in Saturday's GI Test S. at Saratoga. Undefeated in three starts, including Mon-mouth Park's Dearly Precious S. June 30, the chestnut will be saddled by Todd Beattie Saturday. "Dream Rush will be an odds-on favorite, but she could be vulnerable as she just ran a new top after pairing up and figures to react," said Barry Irwin, Team Valor International President. "Hopefully, some regression, plus the extra furlong from her last race, will be enough to make a difference for our new filly." Irwin indicated that the filly may be transferred to the barn of trainer Todd Pletcher following Saturday's race.

Although in the money in 10 of 11 starts prior to the Amsterdam, the bay needed eight tries to final get the job done, but he did it in style with a 7 3/4-length score going a mile at Gulfstream Feb. 24. Fourth in the GIII Tampa Bay Derby Mar. 17, the three-year-old scored by 4 1/2 lengths in the slop in a \$75,000 optional claimer at Belmont May 11 before finishing second in his latest in the seven-furlong GII Woody Stephens BC S. June 9. Still smarting from the recent string of second-place finishes, including a second to Lawyer Ron with C P West in Saturday's GI Whitney H., trainer Nick Zito was relieved to get the big prize yesterday. "It looked like Americanus was going to get away, and I said to myself 'Not another second.' But then, he came," Zito said. "It's great to get this win."

**Santos Retires, cont. from p1**

***Making of a Champion...***

Santos rode his first race at Hipico Racecourse in Chile, following in the footsteps his father, Manuel, and three of his seven brothers. In 1984, he began riding in the South Florida tracks of Gulfstream, Hialeah and Calder. One year later, Santos moved to New York and became the country's leading rider by money, a title which he held for the next four years. He moved to California briefly at the end of 1990, but returned East in July of '91. In 1992, Santos was injured at Belmont, sustaining a fracture to his right arm, which required 14 screws and two pins. He also injured his collarbone and cracked his hip during the incident. With the best ahead of him, Santos enjoyed arguably his finest hour during the 2003 season with the popular gelding Funny Cide, who won the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. The rider also annexed the 1999 GI Belmont S. and GI Travers S. with Lemon Drop Kid and swept Saratoga's premiere juvenile races in 2000, scoring with City Zip in the GII Sanford S., GII Saratoga Special S. and GI Hopeful S. (in a dead-heat with Yonaguska). Santos also had 65 mounts in the Breeders' Cup, with seven wins, two seconds and nine thirds and over \$8 million in earnings. His Breeders' Cup victories include 2002 GI Classic winner, 43-1 longshot Volponi; back-to-back wins in 1989-'90 in the GI Mile with Steinlen (GB); the GI Turf with Chief Bearhart in 1997; the GI Juvenile with Fly So Free in 1990; the GI Juvenile Fillies in 1990 with Meadow Star and the 1986 GI Turf with Manila. But Santos will forever be linked with Funny Cide, who was recently retired and now is trainer Barclay Tagg's stable pony. "It's only right that we go out together," Santos said. "I just hope I find a job as good as his." Santos retires with 4,083 wins and \$187,255,105 in earnings. "I am extremely grateful for the career I've had, for the owners and trainers that had faith in me, to my fellow jockeys who helped bring out the best in me and to the fans for their support," said Santos, who earned an Eclipse Award in 1988. "Most of all, I am grateful to my family. They have always supported me, and it is tough because every time you ride a horse, you are in danger. They don't have to worry anymore, and that is a relief."

**Tariq** has been a revelation since his unplaced effort in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas) at Longchamp May 13. Following a comfortable success in the Listed King Charles II S. at Newmarket May 26, he brushed aside US Ranger in Royal Ascot's G3 Jersey S. last time June 20. Richard Hannon has had a volte face about **Asset's** preferred ground conditions, following his flop when favorite for Newmarket's G1 July Cup 18 days ago.

**Lennox S. cont.**

Only sixth behind Sakhee's Secret (GB) on good to firm there, he failed to replicate the form of his third in the June 23 G1 Golden Jubilee S. on Royal Ascot's easier surface. "We have always said he needed good to firm ground, but he flattened out at halfway in the July Cup and I think good ground is what he wants," his trainer told *PA Sport*. "We were either going to run in this or the Maurice de Gheest at Deauville, but we decided to make the entry. I think he'll get the seven furlongs and the track will suit." **Royal Oath** trounced the opposition in the June 20 Royal Hunt Cup H. at Royal Ascot and the improver holds claims on a second in the G2 Summer Mile S. on pattern-race debut back at Ascot last time July 14.

This traditional trial for the G1 St Leger has thrown up three recent winners of the oldest Classic in Nedawi (GB), Millenary (GB) and last year's hero Sixties Icon (GB). **Aqaleem** represents the G1 Epsom Derby form, having finished third behind Authorized (Ire) in the June 2 Blue Riband on his latest start. Trainer Marcus Tregoning is hoping he can book his ticket to the Sept. 15 Doncaster Classic. "He ran a smashing race in the Derby for an immature horse and we decided to go the easier route with him then," he said. "He came out of the race pretty good and, hopefully, he'll prove himself good enough to line up at Doncaster." Another sounding out his Leger prospects is Aidan O'Brien, who saddles the G1 Eclipse S. fourth **Yellowstone**. John Gosden sends out the G2 Dante S. runner-up **Raincoat**, who has to rebound from his unplaced run in the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (French Derby) at Chantilly June 3. "He has been fine since running in France and he definitely wants a mile and a half," his trainer commented. "Things were too sharp in the Prix du Jockey Club."

**WHITNEY RECORD CONFIRMED** The final time for Saturday's GI Whitney H., won by **Lawyer Ron** (Langfuhr), was confirmed as the new nine-furlong, main track record at Saratoga in a release issued by the New York Racing Association Monday. Lawyer Ron, who shattered the old mark of 1:47 set by Tri Jet in 1974 and equaled by Left Bank in 2002, stopped the timer in 1:46.64. The validity of the time, however, was questioned by the *Daily Racing Form's* Steve Crist, who suggested that a timer malfunction had inaccurately clocked the race. The four-year-old was awarded a 116 Beyer figure, the highest figure at a mile or longer and the second fastest over all this year. Both the teletimer operator and NYRA placing judge Stephen Foster hand-timed the race, as is normal procedure, and their results verified the teletimer result. Yesterday, the race was re-timed off the video recording of the Whitney before media representatives Jack Kelly of *Equibase*; Jerry Bossert, *New York Daily News* racing writer and President of the New York Turf Writers Association; and Mike Welch of the *Daily Racing Form*. The race was hand-timed by both Welch and Foster and their timings were consistent with the original teletimer result. The media representatives agreed that the official winning time of 1:46.64 for Saturday's Whitney was accurate.

**ARC WINNER RAIL LINK OFFICIALLY RETIRED**

Two weeks after it was announced that last year's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe hero **Rail Link (GB)** (Dansili {GB}--Docklands, by Theatrical {Ire}) had suffered a tendon injury, connections of the four-year-old colt confirmed that he has been retired, according to *The Blood-Horse*. The Juddmonte Farms homebred was scheduled to return to racing this summer after undergoing minor surgery following his Arc victory, but saw those plans dashed after straining a tendon. Rail Link, named Highweight Three-Year-Old Colt at 11-14 furlongs in France last year in a season that also saw him annex the G1 Grand Prix De Paris, G2 Prix Niel and G3 Prix du Lys, retires with a record of 7-5-1-0 and earnings of \$1,974,565. Stud plans were not announced.

During a weekend of seven Grade I events in the U.S. and Europe, we saw Awesome Again represented by his eighth Grade I winner from his first four crops and Giant's Causeway come up with his fifth Grade 1 winner from his sole Irish crop. The Grade I/Group 1 contests also produced excellent performances from Dylan Thomas, Lawyer Ron, Darjina and Soldier Hollow but, as all of these horses or stallions have been written about in this column, I am turning my attention to the comparatively unimportant Prix de Cabourg.

The stylish winner of this Group 3 event at Deauville was Sheikh Mohammed's very progressive Kingmambo colt Alexandros, who looks capable of adding to his sire's considerable achievements in Europe. He has already won three consecutive races, following a half-length debut defeat, and he wasn't fazed by dropping to six furlongs in the Cabourg after two wins at seven.

When Kingmambo's tough daughter Light Shift landed the Oaks at Epsom two months ago, she became no less than the seventh Classic winner in Britain or France for the Lane's End stallion, sire also of a Belmont S. winner in Lemon Drop Kid and a Japanese Derby winner in King Kamehameha.

Light Shift's predecessors were King's Best (2000 Guineas), Bluemamba (French 1000 Guineas), Russian Rhythm (1000 Guineas), Rule of Law (St Leger), Virginia Waters (1000 Guineas) and Divine Proportions (French 1000 Guineas and Oaks).

The fascinating aspect of Alexandros's pedigree is that it bears distinct similarities to those of Virginia Waters and Divine Proportions. Neither of these fillies was old enough to have demonstrated her talent by the time the mating which resulted in Alexandros took place, so I am guessing that the inspiration for the mating was provided by Whipper, a brother-in-blood to Divine Proportions sired by Kingmambo's brother Miesque's Son. *cont. p7*

Whipper had belied his \$4000 price tag as a weanling by winning the G1 Prix Morny in 2003, and by the time he retired to Ballylinch Stud he had increased his number of Group 1 victories at the Deauville festival to three. Another incentive for sending Sadler's Wells mares to Kingmambo had been provided by El Condor Pasa, the star Japanese colt who had been the highlight of Kingmambo's first crop. El Condor Pasa had an unusually intricate pedigree, featuring 4x3 inbreeding to Northern Dancer, 4x4 to Special, 5x5x4 to both Forli and Thong and 4x5 to Native Dancer.

For any Sadler's Wells mare, a mating to Kingmambo produces 4x3 inbreeding to Northern Dancer, 4x4 to Special and 4x5 to Native Dancer, with the duplications to Northern Dancer and Special being particularly attractive in view of the extraordinary success enjoyed by the triumvirate of Nureyev, Sadler's Wells and Fairy King.

Indeed this cross has proved so compelling that there are now 73 foals of racing age by Kingmambo out of Sadler's Wells mares, with Alexandros being one of more than a dozen two-year-olds. These two-year-olds also include another highly promising European juvenile in Henrythenavigator, who kept his unbeaten record intact in the G2 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot.

Henrythenavigator is a full brother to Queen Cleopatra, a Group 3 winner good enough to finish third in both the Irish 1000 Guineas and French Oaks last year.

Breeders without the wherewithal to send their Sadler's Wells mares to Kingmambo have been happy to use his Classic-winning son King's Best as a substitute. This prolific cross has produced several stakes winners, including Best Alibi, third in the 2006 Irish Derby, and Creachadoir, a close second in this year's French and Irish 2000 Guineas.

But there is more in common in the pedigrees of Whipper, Divine Proportions, Virginia Waters and Alexandros than just Kingmambo and Sadler's Wells. Whipper and Divine Proportions are out of Myth to Reality, a mare by Sadler's Wells out Millieme, a sister to the Derby and Irish Derby winner Shirley Heights. Virginia Waters, for her part, has Sadler's Wells and Shirley Heights as the sire of her first two dams.

Alexandros is the first foal of Arlette, a mare by Sadler's Wells's Classic-winning son King of Kings, and the colt's second dam is High Hawk, this Shirley Heights mare being a sister to Virginia Waters' second dam. It is worth adding that Sequoyah, the dam of Henrythenavigator and Queen Cleopatre, is also bred on the Sadler's Wells--Never Bend cross, and that the Oaks-winning Light Shift is out of a mare by none other than Shirley Heights.

It was a bold move to send an unproven mare like Arlette to a stallion as expensive as Kingmambo, whose 2004 fee was \$225,000. Although she won three times at around a mile in France, her wins had come in the provinces and it was already apparent that her sire, King of Kings, was heading for disaster as a stallion in the Northern Hemisphere. **cont. p8**

However, any shortcomings on King of King's part were more than compensated for by Arlette's outstanding female line. Her dam High Hawk had established

herself as one of Shirley Heights's most accomplished daughters, both on the track and as a broodmare--and that is saying something. A Group 1 and Group 2 winner at around 1 3/4 miles, High Hawk had been a regular visitor to Sadler's Wells, with her visits rewarding Sheikh Mohammed with the excellent In

the Wings and his group-winning brothers Hunting Hawk, Hawker's News and Morozov. This family has produced several other group winners to Sadler's Wells and his sons Barathea and Beat Hollow, so Arlette has plenty of notable close relatives. Her family also produced the Derby winner High-Rise to a son of Shirley Heights and Sheikh Mohammed's Irish 2000 Guineas winner Dubawi is out of a grand-daughter of Shirley Heights from this distinguished family.

It is going to be fascinating to see whether Alexandros proves superior to another member of Kingmambo's 2005 crop--the Crown of Crimson colt which was recruited to Sheikh Mohammed's Godolphin team at a cost of \$11.7 million last September. That crop numbers nearly 80 juveniles, but it was the last sired by Kingmambo before health problems began to compromise his activities.

Kingmambo was able to cover only 37 mares in 2005, which means that he has only 22 yearlings in 2007. Rarity value, coupled with Kingmambo's recent results, is certain to make any sales yearlings by him very hot properties in the fall.

★ "TDN Rising Star" ★

Regular **TDN** readers will by now be quite familiar with the Rising Star demarcation. The feature was created in December of 2004 to denote exceptional young horses who looked destined for bigger and better things. Recently, we decided to look back and see how our Risen Stars from the past two seasons have fared.

Among the Rising Star maiden winners who turned into bona fide super novas are Grade I winner Discreet Cat and champion juvenile filly Folklore from our 2005 collection, and champions Street Sense, Bernardini and Holy Roman Emperor (Ire) from 2006. Other Grade/Group 1 winners from the class are Araafa (Ire), Bluegrass Cat, Eswarah (GB), First Samurai, Nannina (GB), Nobiz Like Shobiz, Round Pond, Scat Daddy, Sweet Symphony and Wild Fit.

The speedy Discreet Cat earned his Rising Star status in his first trip to the post, taking a competitive maiden at the Spa by a resounding 3 1/2 lengths in August of 2005. After being purchased by Godolphin, the impressive bay went on to capture the GI Cigar Mile H., G2 UAE Derby and GII Jerome Breeders' Cup H.

Folklore and Street Sense both had us stargazing in their second starts; the filly champ with a four-length victory at Belmont in June of 2005 and Street Sense with a 1 1/4-length tally at Arlington last August. Both were from their sire's freshman crop (Tiznow and Street Cry {Ire}, respectively), and both went on to earn championship honors with Breeders' Cup wins in their respective divisions.

The imposing Bernardini gave his classmates a head start, but earned his star with a 7 3/4-length victory as a sophomore in his second start at Gulfstream last March. The Darley colorbearer went onto fame and fortune with wins in the GI Preakness S. and GI Jockey Club Gold Cup en route to championship honors.

By the numbers, a total of 171 winners were given Rising Star status in 2005 and 2006. Of those, 124, or 73 percent, became stakes horses. Eighty-two (48 percent) became stakes winners. A total of 100 were graded-stakes horses, with 60 (35 percent) graded-stakes winners and 23 (13 percent) winning Grade I events.

The class of 2007 Rising Stars is already off to a strong start. Leading the way is GI Preakness S. winner Curlin, who was selected as a Rising Star after his 12 3/4-length debut win at Gulfstream in February, and Epsom Oaks third-place finisher All My Loving (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). Other Rising Stars this term include subsequent graded-stakes winners Street Magician (Street

Cry {Ire}), Magnificience (Stormy Atlantic), Vadapolina (Fr) (Tremolino), Henrythenavigator (Kingmambo) and Mahler (GB) (Galileo {Ire}). Stakes winners include Spin Master (Distorted Humor) and Warsaw (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}). Also included are graded-stakes placed sophomores Ketchikan (Mr. Greeley) and Deadly Dealer (Concerto).

**Increases In Handle & Attendance for Week 1...**

Attendance increased 14 percent and on-track handle 20 percent, while total handle rose 13 percent over 2006 figures for the opening week of racing at Saratoga. Total attendance for the first six days of the 2007 meet--July 25-30--was 169,134, up from 148,279 in '06, while daily average of 28,189 compared to 24,713 in '06. On-track handle increased to \$21,080,631 from \$17,538,037, while daily average of \$3,513,439 was up from \$2,923,006 in '06. Total handle of \$100,293,710 topped last year's \$88,774,948 (daily average of \$16,715,618 over \$14,795,825 in '06). "Opening week exceeded all of our expectations," said NYRA President and CEO Charles Hayward. "We had a strong opening day, a very successful Sunset racing on Friday and the Breeders' Cup Challenge Saturday was a spectacular day of racing with a record-breaking all-source handle for a non-Travers day."

**Street Sense Fine; Tiz Wonderful Sore After Dandy...**

**Street Sense** (Street Cry {Ire}), winner of Sunday's GII Jim Dandy S. at Saratoga, exited the race in fine form, according to trainer Carl Nafzger. "He came out great," said Nafzger. "He cleaned up and jogged [yesterday] morning." Looking ahead, Nafzger said that he has not made any plans in preparing the colt for the GI Travers S. Aug. 25. "It depends how the horse feels," he said. "I'll know how he feels when he starts galloping...It's pretty hard to lay a plan with horses. There's one thing I can guarantee--this is like watching paint dry, if you get in a hurry and paint too quick, you will mess up." **Tiz Wonderful** (Tiznow), on the other hand, was a little worse for wear following the Jim Dandy. "He was body sore, but I don't think it's serious" explained Steve Asmussen. "I don't think the Travers is something that we are thinking about; we're just thinking about his state of mind." In other Spa news, **Papi Chullo** (Comeonmom), ninth in Saturday's GI Whitney, is "no worse for wear" and may make his next start in the GII Brooklyn H. at Belmont Sept. 22.
