STREET SENSE WORKS AT THE SPA

Street Sense (Street Cry {Ire}) posted his first workout yesterday since annexing the GII Jim Dandy S. July 29. The GI Kentucky Derby hero tuned up for the GI Travers S. Aug. 25 with a four-furlong bullet over the Saratoga slop in :49.03. Regular rider Calvin Borel was in the irons. "He breezed great," Borel said. "He went nice and easy, just galloping around the dogs. He's really done well since getting to Saratoga. He likes it here. The Jim Dandy was the perfect race for him. He got a lot out of it. I know [trainer] Carl [Nafzger] wants to bring him back four or five days from now and do a little something more serious than today." Stablemate **Lady Joanne** (Orientate) also turned in a four-furlong breeze Wednesday, stopping the clock in :49.53. The July 30 Banshee Breeze S. heroine remains on target for the GI Alabama S. Aug. 18.

Tasha's Miracle (Harlan's Holiday) pressed the early leaders after breaking from the eight hole through fractions of :22.65 and :46.48, gained command on the turn for home and drew clear in the stretch to post a convincing 3 1/4-length victory over **Set Play** (Van Nistelrooy) in yesterday's GIII Sorrento S. at Del Mar. The bay entered the Sorrento with two Hollywood starts under her belt. She finished second, beaten a neck in her June 2 unveiling, then posted a smart 2 1/2-length maiden tally July 1. **One Hot Wish** (Bring the Heat), who set a world record for 4 1/2 furlongs in her Keeneland debut Apr. 12, tired badly to finish seventh as the even-money favorite.

AUTHORIZED FACING INTERNATIONAL TASK
 Epsom Derby hero **Authorized (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}), a last-out second in the July 7 G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown, remains on course for the G1 Juddmonte International at York, but conditioner Peter Chapple-Hyam hopes ground conditions will be in the sophomore's favor for the Aug. 21 contest. "I'm very happy with him, he's in good form and did a bit of work Tuesday," the trainer told *At The Races*. "We are now looking at how to get him back to his best after Sandown. It's going to be tough again, York will be testing I think. We will just send him and see what happens. He goes on fast ground, but we would be worried about too much jarring." Authorized is set to renew his rivalry with Sandown conqueror **Notnowcato (GB)** (Inchinar {GB}) and will also face international competition from the Mike de Kock-trained **Asiatic Boy (Arg)** (Not for Sale {Arg}). The latter, fourth in his British debut in the Aug. 1 G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood, will be partnered by Jamie Spencer, who replaces homeward-bound South African Weichong Marwing. "Asiatic Boy definitely goes for the Juddmonte, and I think he's come on for his run in the Sussex," de Kock told *PA Sport*.

of old age at Arthur Hancock's Stone Farm in Paris, Kentucky Tuesday. The 28-year-old stallion, who was pensioned at the farm, will be buried close to the main residence. "He was the realization of my life's dream," said Hancock. "We are all saddened by his passing, but I take solace in knowing that he had a great life."

Foaled and raised at Stone Farm, the grey, bred by Hancock in partnership with Leone J. Peters, won the 1981 GII Del Mar Futurity for trainer Eddie Gregson, but was winless in seven subsequent starts before registering the biggest victory of his career in the GI Kentucky Derby in 1982.

Gato del Sol skipped the GI Preakness S. and was runner-up to Conquistador Cielo in the GI Belmont S. At four, he won the Cabrillo H. at Del Mar and, at five, finished third to the Iron Man John Henry in the GI Arlington Million. Transferred to trainer Charlie Whittingham late in his career, the horse concluded his racing campaign with seven victories from 39 starts and earnings of \$1,340,107. The grey entered stud at Stone Farm, and remained there from 1986 through 1992 until he was sold for stud duty to Gestut Goerlsdorf in Germany. Hancock's wife, Staci, proved instrumental in bringing the Classic winner back to the United States in 1999 following the discovery of champion Exceller's untimely demise in a Swedish slaughterhouse. "Most people will remember Gato as a Kentucky Derby winner, but I will remember him as my good friend," said Staci Hancock. "I feel blessed to have had him in my life. Gato was very special to me and everyone on the farm. We will surely miss him." From 12 crops to race, the stallion sired two stakes winners from 87 winners, with progeny earnings over \$2.5 million.

Penna Thinking BC with Chatain:

Chatain (Forest Wildcat), a game winner of the GIII Hal's Hope H. at Gulfstream in January, followed a disappointing eighth-place finish in Keeneland's GIII Ben Ali S. Apr. 26 with a smart \$75,000 optional claiming score going six furlongs at the Spa Aug. 6. Trainer Angel Penna, Jr. told *Daily Racing Form* that his charge will be pointed toward the inaugural Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile at Monmouth Park Oct. 26. "If you're not thinking about the Breeders' Cup this time of year, you're lying," Penna told *DRF*. "Hopefully, I can get him on a tight schedule now. It seems like something silly always comes up and he runs every three months. It's frustrating, because he's a very sound horse. It's just always something stupid. Like before the Met Mile, he ran down. He popped a quarter crack in Florida. Two days before he was going to run in the Withers last year, he had a temperature of 105 degrees. All these little things set you back." Penna added that **Remarkable News (Ven)** (Chayim), who was withdrawn from last weekend's GII Fourstardave H. due to a mild case of colic, should be ready to run in about a month. "He's fine now," Penna continued. "It just happened at the wrong time. We had to treat him for colic, and once you medicate on top of a race, you can't run. He was perfect the next day. You can't let it linger for two or three days."

Ag Approps Passes; Congress Adjourns

After a bitter fight, the House voted August 2 to pass its version of the Agriculture Appropriations bill, H.R. 3161. The bill passed by a vote of 237 to 18, with 13 Members voting Present. All but 11 of the 237 "yeas" were Democrats. In protest, 163 GOP Members abstained from voting.

As originally drafted, Sec. 738 of H.R. 3161 would have halted the international movement of horses. NTRA, Breeders' Cup, Keeneland, Churchill Downs, American Horse Council and others opposed Sec. 738.

An amendment by Reps. John Spratt (D-SC), Nick Rahall (D-WV), Ed Whitfield (R-KY) and Ben Chandler (D-KY) stripped Sec. 738 in the final bill and substituted language focused on eliminating funding for USDA officials involved in inspecting slaughter-bound horses.

The bill now heads to Conference. The White House has announced that the President would veto the Ag Approps bill as authorizing an "excessive level of spending."

THIS DATE IN HISTORY...

August 10, 1982...Mary Russ became the first female jockey to surpass the \$1 million mark in earnings when she finished third in the fourth race at Saratoga.

August 12, 1943...Representatives of **Suffolk Downs** donated \$625,000 to the National War Fund, the single largest contribution by any sports venue in support of the war effort. Six weeks later, an additional \$10,885 was donated; the two contributions were funded by of an 18-day War Charity meet.

August 13, 1919...Upset scored a win against **Man o'War** in the Sanford Memorial S. at Saratoga. The defeat was Big Red's only loss in 21 career starts.

August 14, 1938...Trainer **Mary Hirsch** became the first woman to saddle the winner of the Travers S. at Saratoga, sending out Thanksgiving for owner Anne Corning.

August 14, 1939...The record payoff for a \$2 Daily Double, \$10,772.40, lit up the tote board at Washington Park. Joy Bet and Merry Caroline produced the record.
