### ANY GIVEN SATURDAY TO DARLEY

WinStar Farm's and Padua Stables' **Any Given Saturday** (Distorted Humor--Weekend in Indy, by A.P. Indy), a dominating winner of the GII Dwyer S. July 4 and the GI Haskell Invitational Aug. 5, will join Sheikh Mohammed's Darley banner following this year's GI Breeders' Cup Classic, it was announced yesterday. The purchase price wasn't disclosed. Bred in Kentucky by Racehorse Management, the dark bay was purchased for \$1.1 million as a yearling at Keeneland September. "Any Given Saturday is one of the stars of an outstanding generation," John Ferguson, Sheikh Mohammed's bloodstock advisor, said. "He's also a most attractive son of one of the world's hottest stallions. He's got a big future, both on the track and later at stud." Any Given Saturday came within a nose of defeating subsequent GI Kentucky Derby hero Street Sense in the GIII Tampa Bay Derby in March. "It was an extremely difficult decision, but business dictated that it was the right thing to do," WinStar President and CEO Doug Cauthen offered. "I think this is further evidence that we run WinStar as a business. This was a chance to not only make a good business decision, but also to put the horse in a good spot to succeed." **Cont. p2**

### STREET SENSE ON TARGET FOR TRAVERS

**Street Sense** (Street Cry {Ire}) worked a sharp five furlongs in :59.68 beneath Calvin Borel at Saratoga yesterday and remains on target for the GI Travers S. Aug. 25. It was the second workout for the GI Kentucky Derby hero since annexing the GII Jim Dandy S. July 29. "It was a good, solid work," trainer Carl Nafzger said. "I have no gripe about it. He went out there and did what Calvin and I wanted him to do. He galloped out well at the end and walked fine back to the barn. He finished the final quarter in :23 4/5 seconds. I thought that was strong." According to Nafzger, the James Tafel homebred will have one more workout before the Mid-Summer Derby.

### LOOKING LIKE A MILLION AT THE SPA

**More Happy** (Vindication), a \$1-million FTFEB acquisition, followed a neck-debut victory over Del Mar's Polytrack July 21 with a front-running tally in yesterday's GII Adirondack S. at Saratoga. Beneath jockey Rafael Bejarano, the dark bay rattled off fractions of :21.88 and :44.93, led by 4 1/2 lengths through six furlongs in 1:10.12 and was saved by the wire. "She's a nice filly and we thought a lot of her," trainer Bob Baffert said. "I knew she was extremely fast. I told Rafael [Bejarano] that when she leaves, don't fight her and don't hold her back. She was getting tired in the end. She was tearing it up early." As for what's in the cards for More Happy, Baffert commented, "I would love to start her at two turns. I really don't know what we're going to do. We'll have to play it by ear." **Cont. p2**

\$1,000,000 2YO purchase **MORE HAPPY**, by Champion Vindication, remains unbeaten with a wire-to-wire win in the Adirondack S. (G2) at Saratoga. At the Saratoga meet alone, Vindication has a Stakes winner and two TDN Rising Stars, Sargent Seattle, entered in today's Saratoga Special (G2) and Maimonides who is pointing towards the Hopeful S. (G1).

“Any Given Saturday’s going to have every opportunity with Darley, and we are going to breed to him throughout the rest of his career,” Cauthen continued. “So we’re rooting for him there, just as if he was at our farm. We were given the opportunity to race him throughout the rest of the year for our benefit and our account, and that was a big thing to us. But every once in a while an opportunity like this comes along, and we felt we had to take it. It’s difficult to not stand him here at WinStar, but it’s an opportunity to secure our business future. You’re looking trying to firm up the next five or 10 years.” Any Given Saturday is a half brother to Bohemian Lady (Carson City), GSW, \$423,231.

Bejarano was pleased with More Happy’s performance. “When nobody put pressure on, and we were on the lead, we were gone,” Bejarano said. “She got a little tired. When I got to the turn, that horse was coming and I heard noise behind me. So, that’s why I started whipping, but I don’t think she liked the whip. She ran good. She won comfortably. I didn’t have to push her too hard to win.”

**Phantom Income** (Montbrook) entered the starting gate as one of the favorites, but was declared a non-starter after rearing at the start. The gray romped to a 10 1/4-length victory at Belmont July 6 in her only outing. Rick Violette trains the Klaravich Stables’ colorbearer.

Bouncing back from a sixth in last August's G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood, Echo of Light garnered the G3 Strensall S. at York in September and recorded a personal best when landing the G2 Prix Daniel Wildenstein at Longchamp later that month. He faded out of contention when contesting the GI Breeders' Cup Mile at Churchill Downs in his 2006 finale and came back this term to finish fourth in the G2 Summer Mile S. at Ascot July 14. Benefitting from an enterprising Frankie Dettori ride in this contest, the five-year-old, who sported a set of sheepskin cheekpieces, clung to a fast-diminishing advantage to claim a fourth pattern-race score. Echo of Light broke alertly from an outside box and Dettori eased him to the front after the early strides. Allowed to drift off the rail at the top of the straight, the bay came under the full might of Dettori's whip inside the closing panel to just hold the late lunges of Atlantic Air and Kocab.

"It was his first time with cheekpieces and they really helped him concentrate," explained trainer Saeed bin Suroor. "Frankie did a great job and he just lasted to the line, but I think he is more of a miler than a 10-furlong horse. We have no specific plans at this stage, but we might consider going for the [G2] Prix Daniel Wildenstein [at Longchamp Oct. 6] again."

**GOLDEN YEARS**

Since Best Pal (\*Habitory) seized the inaugural \$1-million Pacific Classic in 1991, four other California-bred runners have captured Del Mar's marquee event:

Bertrando (Skywalker) in 1993, Free House (Smokester) in 1998, General Challenge (General Meeting) in 1999 and Lava Man (Slew City Slew) last year, surely one of the best performances by a non-Kentucky breeding program in a \$1-million Grade I race. By the time of his retirement in 1996, Best Pal had bankrolled \$5,668,245, and reigned as California's leading earner until a nice horse named Tiznow came along. Best Pal didn't get a chance to defend his Pacific Classic title in 1992, but logged a third-place finish in 1993 and was the runner-up in 1994, collecting a tidy \$900,000 for those three appearances. The Golden Eagle homebred didn't just shine at Del Mar, though. Among his 18 lifetime victories were six at the Grade I level: the 1990 GI Norfolk S. and GI Hollywood Futurity; the 1992 GI Santa Anita H., GI Charles H. Strub H. and GI Oaklawn H.; and the 1993 GI Hollywood Gold Cup. Tiznow announced himself as a force to be reckoned with as a three-year-old when he ran second in the 2000 Pacific Classic. The big Cal-bred won his next three outings, capped by the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, and was named Horse of the Year and champion three-year-old.

Bertrando, a winner of the GI Norfolk S. at two, hit the board in several big events at four before breaking through with a wire-to-wire, three-length score in the 1993 Pacific Classic. He followed that with an overwhelming tally in the GI Woodward S. at Belmont, then ran second to the improbable Arcangues in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, an effort good enough to secure the 505 Farms colorbearer an Eclipse Award as the nation's champion older horse. Bertrando retired with earnings of \$3,185,610 and became one of the best California-based sires of his time.

Like Best Pal and Bertrando before him, Free House also took the Norfolk at two, but it was a Grade II event by the time he had his picture taken in 1996.

The pale grey defeated Silver Charm in the GI Santa Anita Derby in 1997, only to finish behind that darker rival in each of the Triple Crown races: third in the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Belmont S., and second in the GI Preakness S. Racing in the colors of breeders Trudy McCaffery and John Toffan, Free House defeated defending titleist Gentlemen (Arg) in the 1998 Pacific Classic, and added a score the following winter in the GI Santa Anita H. before retiring with earnings of \$3,178,971.

Flying the flag for Golden Eagle, General Challenge won his lone outing at two, but came to hand quickly as a three-year-old in 1999, winning the GI Santa Anita Derby, GII Santa Catalina S. and GIII Affirmed H. The flashy chestnut secured another Pacific Classic for the Mabees later that summer, added a GI Santa Anita H. victory in 2000 and wound up compiling a record of 21-9-3-1 and \$2,877,178 in earnings.

The Sunshine Millions series wasn't around for those runners to pad their earnings, and while Lava Man has garnered \$825,000 over the course of two appearances, he's done pretty well in open company as well. Winner of the 2005 GI Hollywood Gold Cup, the dark bay ran third to Borrego in the Pacific Classic that summer, but went on a California tear thereafter. In 2006, the popular gelding captured another Hollywood Gold Cup, the GI Santa Anita H., and GI Charles Whittingham Memorial H. as well as the Pacific Classic.

He successfully defended his title in the Big 'Cap and, after losing out to After Market in the Whittingham,

became only the second horse to three-peat in the Hollywood Gold Cup June 30. The only other horse to do so? Native Diver, a Cal-bred foaled in 1959, counted three-straight Gold Cup victories (1965-67) among 37 career trips to the winner's circle; fittingly, he is buried at Hollywood Park. Lava Man will get a chance to add to his legacy in this year's Pacific Classic. "You'll see Sunday--his coat is all dappled out and he's just a happy, happy horse out there," said Dennis O'Neill, whose brother Doug

trains Lava Man. "And we're extremely confident going into Sunday that he's going to run his best race."

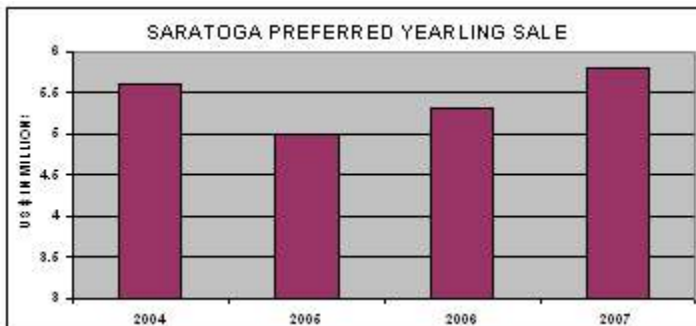

**New Immigration Rules to Take Effect**

New **immigration rules** that go into effect in September should simplify the process of employing foreign workers.

The Administration has charged the Department of Labor to review existing H-2A regulations with an eye to improving the flow and supply of agricultural labor. The Department also will issue regulations aimed at reducing the processing time for H-2B visas. Background checks will be expedited.

The new rules include stronger sanctions against employers who "knowingly" hire undocumented workers. Employers with more than 10 employees whose personal identity information submitted on Form I-9 does not match Social Security Administration records will receive a "no-match" letter.

Immigration and Customs Enforcement will contact an employer if its audits indicate that immigration status or employment authorization documents linked to a Form I-9 cannot be confirmed.

The new regulations outline measures for employers to avoid "knowingly" hiring undocumented workers as well as remedial steps and penalties should they be found to be in violation.
