Looking to capture his third straight stakes victory and his second in graded company, Vinery Stables and Fox Hill Farm's **Kodiak Kowboy** (Posse) muscled his way through a seam of daylight in upper stretch and rallied to a convincing win in yesterday's GI Saratoga Special S. "I saw the hole turning for home, and he was willing," winning jockey Shaun Bridgmohan said. "He did everything I wanted and was very gutsy today. He got a lot out of this race." Trainer

While he captured the GI Hollywood Gold Cup by a nose on Hollywood's Cushion Track, Lava Man is untested on Del Mar's new surface, which Dennis O'Neill, assistant and brother to Lava Man's trainer Doug O'Neill, calls 'a different animal.' the June 17 Victoria S. by daylight, but hit the road again in an easy victory in the Gill Bashford Manor S. under the Twin Spires July 7. Looking to pull off the Victoria/Saratoga Special double just like the Asmussen-trained Chace City did last year, Kodiak

Kowboy broke from the rail and was content to allow Little Nick (Tiger Ridge) to show the way through quick :22.07 and :44.97 splits. In tight on the turn, Kodiak Cowboy responded with a strong move when the opportunity presented itself and left the others fighting for the minor spots. "He was professional in doing it," added Bridgmohan. "He broke smartly, and he rated himself a little bit. When I pointed him, he was just willing and just shot right through there. Then, he went about his business." Asmussen was also pleased with the effort. "Today, he overcame a little bit," said the trainer. "What I love was that, down in between horses, he was looking for somewhere to go, and when it opened up, he punched through nicely. I think the final time [1:15.95] was excellent for a two-year-old." Asmussen added that the seven-furlong GII Futurity S. at Belmont Sept. 15 was likely to be the next target. This race was marred by a clutch of withdrawals due to the rain, but it produced a progressive winner in the shape of Pride of Nation. Long held in high esteem within the Cumani camp, the bay began his season in York's Listed Hambleton S. May 17, where he finished third behind the subsequent G3 Diomed S. winner Blythe Knight (Ire). Dropped to seven furlongs for Royal Ascot's Buckingham Palace S. June 22, he could do no better than sixth before finishing fourth behind Ordnance Row in a heritage handicap at Sandown July 7. The five-year-old got his confidence back with a conditions success at York three weeks ago and he reversed placings with Ordnance Row after surviving a stewards inquiry here. Restrained early racing close to the pace, he drew even with that rival passing the furlong marker before hanging down under pressure and bumping that foe en route to a clear-cut success, which was judged not to have been effected by the interference. "He's a smart horse and if the ground was unraceable he'd be at his best," jockey Jamie Spencer commented. "He pounds the ground and would be better in a really fast-run race. He takes a furlong to get going, but then really stretches and Mr. Cumani's horses do improve, so you never know where he could end up."

Synopsis enjoyed a low-key juvenile campaign, which yielded a second in her sole start at Longchamp last October, and began this semester with a victory back there Apr. 5 before running sixth on stakes debut in the Listed Prix de Thiberville, again at the Bois de Boulogne track, last time July 14. Ridden with a degree of patience here, she outstayed a host of more experienced opponents to bag a maiden stakes score in style and is now set for an ambitious program ahead. Settled at the back of the peloton before easing into sixth at the entrance to the straight, the chestnut homebred closed under urging to challenge at the distance and stayed on strongly in the latter stages to assert for a comfortable win. "This is a filly I've always liked, but it didn't go to plan at Longchamp last time and she was left with too much ground to make up in the straight," explained winning trainer Andre Fabre. "She will now go for the G1 Prix Vermeille at Longchamp [Sept. 16]."

[But] you know, Father Time does draw a finishing line, and my horse is a four-year-old and getting better all the time. You always hope you can knock off the champ, and it's going to [happen] some day, and I hope it's [this] weekend for me."

Lady Attack had been an ineffectual runner in her first three starts, which came on either dirt or Polytrack. But since being moved to the lawn, Will Farish's three-year-old has developed into a very promising filly. She'll get a chance to show just what she's made of when she goes in search of her first stakes

win here. A three-length winner in her grass debut at Churchill in early June, Lady Attack romped by 5 1/2 lengths in a one-mile allowance in her next June 23. Shipped north for the Saratoga meet, she gave herself plenty to do when she broke near the back of the pack in the 11-horse strong GIII Lake George S. July 27, but closed with a rush in the lane to be beaten just a

neck by Rutherienne. That foe has gone west in search of Grade I glory in tomorrow's GI Del Mar Oaks, leaving Lady Attack as a logical choice here. She's hardly a sure thing, though. **Christmas Kid** is a GISW on the Poly and won the Tropical Park Oaks on the grass earlier this year. She was more recently third in the Virginia Oaks to Dreaming of Anna, while the runner-up in that race, **New Edition**, is a game filly with good tactical speed.

A pair of logical contenders for this year's inaugural Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint line up here in the form of Grade I winners River's Prayer and Pussycat Doll. The former is coming off the biggest win in her career. The four-year-old Cal-bred, winner of the GIII Las Cinegas H. sprinting down Santa Anita's hillside turf course in April, underlined her versatility when she shipped in to annex the GI Princess Rooney H. over the main track at Calder Race Course July 7. The victory extended River Prayer's winning skein to four, but the gray has never competed over a synthetic surface, which raises questions as she goes for her fifth straight. While Pussycat Doll has started on a synthetic track, the result wasn't what trainer Bob Baffert was looking for. The sparsely raced five-year-old, winner of the 2005 GI La Brea S. and last year's GI Humana Distaff H., most recently was a well-beaten sixth in the GII A Gleam H. on the Cushion Track at Hollywood July 6. Many have said the Poly at Del Mar is a different surface completely, and, if her recent works at Del Mar are anything to go by, Pussycat Doll is handling the going just fine.

An accomplished group of seven have gathered for this, including **Octave**, who aims to become just the fifth filly of all time, behind Shuvee, Mom's Command, Open Mind and Sky Beauty, to annex the GI Mother Goose S., GI Coaching Club American Oaks, and the mile-and-quarter Alabama.

Looking to upset Octave's chances is the Coaching Club runner-up **Lear's Princess**. The Kiaran McLaughlin-trained miss won the Tweedside S. on the Belmont lawn July 1, then ran Octave to a half-length in the July 21 CCA Oaks despite switching to her wrong lead in deep stretch. Asked earlier in the week if any mistakes were made in Lear Princess's training leading up to the CCA Oaks, McLaughlin laughed, "Well there certainly wasn't any mistakes made by *me*. I'll blame her for her jumping off her lead at the 16th pole. I did everything right. No, I'm just kidding. She's a nice filly and this is her second start on dirt. She should improve and [jockey Eibar] Coa knows her now well. And two turns should help. So we're all ready to go, and hopefully won't jump off her lead at the 16th poll."

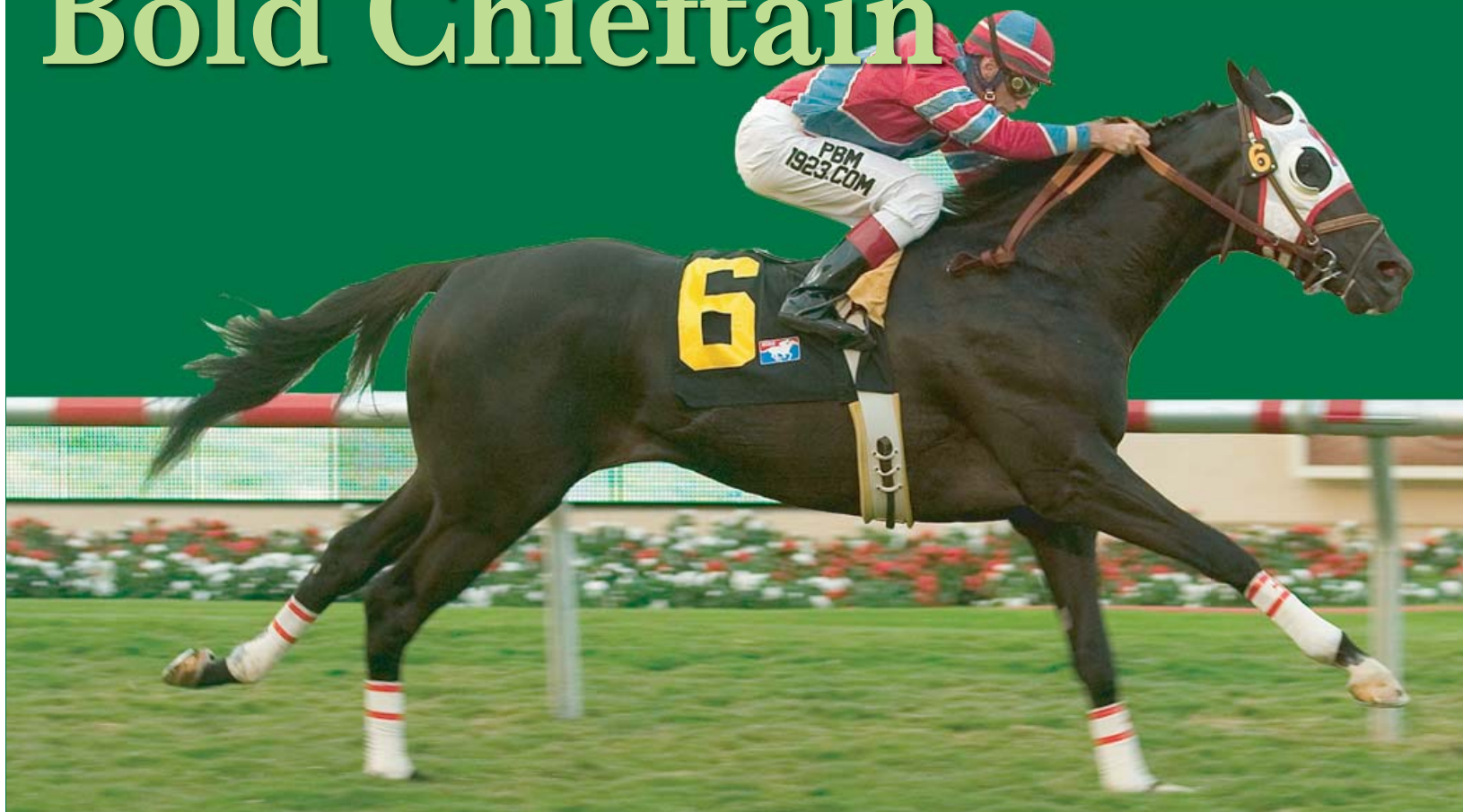
