**MANDURO JOINS DARLEY ROSTER**

Baron Georg von Ullmann's MG1SW **Manduro (Ger)** (Monsun {Ger}--Mandellicht {Ire}, by Be My Guest), unbeaten in four starts this year, will head to Darley to stand stud at the conclusion of his racing career. The five-year-old was the champion juvenile in Germany in 2004 and the highweight older horse at 9 1/2-11 furlongs in France in 2006, but has eclipsed those honors with his performances this season. The dark bay opened the campaign with a four-length victory in the G3 Earl of Sefton S. and came back to take the G1 Prix d'Ispahan by five. He outfinished Dylan Thomas (Ire) by 1 1/4 lengths when taking the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot and made it four in a row in his latest, the Aug. 12 G1 Prix Jacques le Marois. "We are delighted to add Manduro to our roster, which already includes Monsun's Breeders' Cup Turf winner Shirocco (Ger)," said John Ferguson, Sheikh Mohammed's bloodstock advisor. "Manduro has proven this season that he is one of the best turf horses in the world." Added Baron von Ullmann said, "We are happy to continue our association with Darley after the excellent opportunities given to Tiger Hill (Ire) and Shirocco, and expect Manduro to be a great success at stud." Manduro will continue to race for The Baron and trainer Andre Fabre until his retirement. To date, he has compiled a record of 17-9-3-4 for earnings of \$1,897,041.

**DANCE SMARTLY DIES**

Multiple champion **Dance Smartly** (Danzig--Class 'n Smart, by Smarten) died over the weekend after suffering an irreparable injury in her paddock. The injury was related to an arthritic stifle. The Sam-Son Farm homebred was Canada's champion two-year-old and three-year-old filly. She was also Canada's Horse of the Year and the Eclipse champion three-year-old filly after a stellar eight-for-eight campaign in 1991. During that season, Dance Smartly won Canada's Triple Crown, as well as the G1 Breeders' Cup Distaff and the GII Molson Export Million. *Cont. p2*

**INTERNATIONAL INTENT**

Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's **Dylan Thomas (Ire)** (Danehill) returns to York's Knavemire with a score to settle. The four-year-old finished a tame fourth behind Anthony and David de Rothschild's **Notnowcato (GB)** (Inchinar {GB}) as the favorite in last year's G1 Juddmonte International S., but looks to turn the tables today. His disappointing performance at York last season was the latest in a long line of three-year-old failures in the race, broken only by Ballydoyle's Giant's Causeway since 1993. Now a year stronger and with quicker ground conditions to help, Dylan Thomas is in the pole position to provide Aidan O'Brien with his second renewal. The winner of the G1 Irish Derby and G1 Irish Champion S. last year, he opened 2007 with a victory in the Apr. 29 G1 Prix Ganay. The imposing bay lost by a head to Notnowcato in the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup at The Curragh May 27 and by 1 1/4 lengths to Manduro (Ger) in Royal Ascot's June 20 G1 Prince of Wales's S., but brought his total of wins at the highest level to four in Ascot's July 28 G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. "Coming back from a mile and a half [in the King George] to a mile and a quarter shouldn't be a problem for Dylan Thomas once there is a good even pace in the race," O'Brien said. "He's been fine since he won the King George, is in good form, and we are happy with him."

**Notnowcato** was four lengths adrift in third in the Prince of Wales's, but reappeared to get the better of **Authorized** in a tactical battle for Sandown's G1 Eclipse S. July 7. That was his third top-flight victory, having bested Maraahel (Ire) by a short-head in this prize 12 months ago. Jockey Ryan Moore, who was applauded for his enterprise in taking a lone course against the stands' rail at Sandown, is hopeful he can become the first back-to-back winner since Halling in 1996, and provide Sir Michael Stoute's with a sixth edition. "It's a very good race with Dylan Thomas, Authorized, Asiatic Boy and probably a couple of others in there, but it's a horse race and anything can happen," Moore said. "He is in good form and I'm sure he'll run a nice race and won't be far away." Saleh Al Homaizi and Imad Al Sagar's **Authorized** was an emphatic winner of the June 2 G1 Epsom Derby, having beaten up lesser opposition previously when taking the G2 Dante S. over this track and trip May 17. His defeat at Sandown took some gloss off his reputation, and he is the first Epsom Derby winner to tackle this race since Benny the Dip was third 10 years ago. He would be the first to complete the double since Troy (GB) in 1979. "It is what racing is all about," trainer Peter Chapple-Hyam said yesterday. "Yes, it is a seriously tough race, but it's great to be involved. Authorized is in very good form and we've got to go. I've been very happy with his preparations and he worked really well with Frankie [Dettori] on board last Thursday. We jumped him out of the gates yesterday and we had a job to pull him up." Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al Maktoum's G2 UAE Derby winner **Asiatic Boy** transferred from dirt to turf in his European debut when fourth in Goodwood's G1 Sussex S. Aug. 1, and conditioner Mike de Kock is expecting improvement. "He was tending to over-race early there, which is typical of a horse that's been on the dirt, but he was battling courageously at the end, even though he was needing it," de Kock explained. "He will be better off for that experience fitness-wise--Jamie Spencer does get horses to settle and he is learning to relax a bit more now."

**Dance Smartly Dies** (cont. from p1)

Dance Smartly was on the board in all 17 career starts and she retired with 12 wins and earnings of \$3,263,835. The dark bay mare produced Canadian champion three-year-old filly Dancethruthedawn (Mr. Prospector), as well as graded-stakes winner Dance With Ravens (A.P. Indy), Queen's Plate S. winner Scatter the Gold (Mr. Prospector) and the graded-stakes placed Dance to Destiny (Mr. Prospector). "Dance Smartly was a once-in-a-lifetime horse," commented Sam-Son President Tammy Samuel-Balaz. "She was magic and gave us incredible thrills as both a racehorse and a broodmare. While we were fortunate enough to have bred and owned her, she truly was Canada's horse." The 19-year-old mare was not in foal this year and her last foal is a two-year-old filly by Gone West. She was buried at Sam-Son Farm in Milton, Ontario.

**CURLIN RETURNS TO WORKTAB** G1 Preakness S.

winner **Curlin** (Smart Strike) turned in his first workout since running third in the Aug. 5 G1 Haskell Invitational at Monmouth Park. The chestnut went five furlongs in 1:03.64 over the Oklahoma Training Track at Saratoga. "He worked beautifully," said Scott Blasi, assistant to trainer Steve Asmussen. "I liked what I have seen in him. It was his first work since the Haskell and he's in great shape. I don't think his race was puzzling in the Haskell. He was coming off a two-month layoff. Any Given Saturday was set up perfectly for it--he was coming out of the [GII] Dwyer after four weeks. Against good horses, you can get beat under those circumstances." Curlin is being pointed towards the Sept. 30 G1 Jockey Club Gold Cup Invitational S. at Belmont Park, with the G1 Breeders' Cup Classic at Monmouth Park Oct. 27 his ultimate goal.

**STUDENT COUNCIL FINE AFTER CLASSIC WIN**

**Student Council** (Kingmambo) returned from his win in Sunday's GI Pacific Classic in fine shape. "I'm still smiling," trainer Vladimir Cerin confirmed yesterday. Cerin acquired Student Council last week after the five-year-old was purchased by Ro Parra the previous Saturday. "He looks terrific," he added. "He's ready to go to war real soon again." **Crossing the Line (NZ)** (Cape Cross {Ire}), winner of Sunday's GII Del Mar Breeders' Cup Mile, also exited his victory in good shape. Trainer John Sadler said his charge would now be pointed at the Oct. 7 GII Oak Tree Mile. **Greg's Gold** (Lake George) is doing well after his win in Sunday's GII Pat O'Brien H. and will now be pointed at the Oct. 7 GI Ancient Title S., according to trainer David Hofmans.

**"GULF" RULED OUT OF LEGER BID** Khalid Abdullah's **Arabian Gulf (GB)** (Sadler's Wells) will miss both today's G2 Great Voltigeur S. and the Sept. 15 G1 St Leger due to an infection, connections revealed yesterday. The G3 Chester Vase runner-up was scratched from the Great Voltigeur, which was his planned prep for the Doncaster Classic, and will be on the sidelines indefinitely. "It is serious and he won't run again this year," the owner-breeder's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe told the *Racing Post*. "We are doing further investigations, but the St Leger is definitely out and it will be a while before he gets back on the racecourse."

**FUTURE PLANS FOR MORNLY WINNER** Susan Magnier's G1 Prix Morny winner **Myboycharlie (Ire)** (Danetime {Ire}) will have one more run as a juvenile in either the Oct. 20 G1 Dewhurst S. or Oct. 5 G1 Middle Park S. The long-range goal for the Tommy Stack trainee is the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket next spring, a race that is likely to be his sophomore bow. "We'll probably look at the Middle Park or the Dewhurst, and I think seven furlongs shouldn't be a problem," the conditioner's son and assistant Fozzy said yesterday. "Hopefully, he'll get a mile next year; the 2000 Guineas is probably where we'll go first and see where we go after that."



**Tiz Wonderful Works, Travers Decision Today**

**Tiz Wonderful** (Tiznow), who suffered the first loss of his career when sixth behind Street Sense in the July 29 GII Jim Dandy S., worked six furlongs yesterday morning over the Oklahoma Training Track in 1:13.87. A decision on the colt's participation in Saturday's GI Travers S. is expected today. "He worked well," said Scott Blasi, assistant to trainer Steve Asmussen. "I was very happy with the way he worked. He came out of [the Jim Dandy] well and has trained forwardly since then. He was a little body sore after that race, but it is a non-issue now. We'll see how he comes out of the workout tomorrow. I think that's when the decision has to be made."

**Travers Tradition Continues**

The GI Travers S., which celebrates its 138th running Saturday, is the oldest stakes race for three-year-olds in the United States. It was named for Saratoga Race Course President William R. Travers, who, along with Leonard Jerome and John Hunter, built the track in 1863. Coincidentally, Travers and Hunter co-owned the winner of the inaugural running back in 1864, a colt called Kentucky.

GI Belmont S. heroine Rags to Riches is an unlikely starter, but if she does make it to the gate, she will once again be looking to buck history. While fillies did succeed in three of the first five editions of the Travers (Maiden in 1865, Ruthless in 1867 and The Banshee in 1868), there have only been four distaff winners since, and the most recent was Lady Rotha in 1915.

Three owners have boasted five Travers winners: Dwyer Brothers Stable, Rokeby Stables and George D. Widener Jr.

Bert Mulholland trained all five of the Widener winners, including Crewman, whose claim to fame is that he posted the slowest time since the race was permanently switched to a mile and a quarter in 1904. Ridden by Eric Guerin in 1963, Crewman completed the 10 panels in 2:20 2/5. **Cont. p4**

Mulholland and Widener also captured what was arguably the most exciting Travers in history in 1962. Widener's Jaipur and Mrs. Moody Jolley's Ridan hooked up right out of the gate and were stride for stride through fractions of :23 4/5, :47 2/5 and 1:11. Jaipur and jockey Bill Shoemaker had a head in front as they raced past the quarter pole in 1:35 2/5, but Ridan and Manny Ycaza just wouldn't quit. At the wire, it was Jaipur by the bob.

After the race, Shoemaker told *Daily Racing Form*, "I felt I had him right on the wire, but it sure was close."

Added Ycaza, "I really didn't know who won it. I was busy riding him out. It was a good, tough race for both horses. No excuses."

Trainer James G. Rowe Jr. also picked up five Travers trophies in his career, and a quartet of jockeys-- Eddie Arcaro, Braulio Baeza, Pat Day and Jim McLaughlin--rode four winners apiece.

**By The Numbers...**

- 7 - Number of fillies that have won the Travers.
- 8 - Number of Kentucky Derby winners who have doubled up in the Travers. The last to do it was Thunder Gulch in 1995. The others were Baden-Baden (1877), Hindoo (1881), Azra (1892), Omar Khayyam ('17), Twenty Grand ('31), Shut Out ('42) and Sea Hero ('93).
- 2:00 - Stakes record, set by General Assembly in '79.
- 2:01 3/5 - Bernardini's winning time last year.
- 1961 - The first year the canopy in the Saratoga infield was painted in the colors of the Travers winner
- 1987 - The first year the purse reached seven figures; Java Gold took home the winner's share of \$673,800. The purse was \$1 million or more from 1987-93, dropped to \$750,000 from 1994-98, and was raised back to \$1 million in 1999.
- 60,486 - Record attendance, on hand for Point Given's victory in 2001.
- \$707,100 - The biggest winner's purse in the race's history, pocketed by Rhythm in 1990.

Aidan O'Brien saddles a quartet as he bids to hone his team for the Sept. 15 G1 St Leger, for which this race has acted as the premier trial in recent years. Milan (GB) scored here en route to glory in that Doncaster Classic in 2001, while Powerscourt (GB) beat his stable companion and subsequent Leger hero Brian Boru (GB) for Ballydoyle three years ago. **Yellowstone** captured the G3 Gordon S. at Goodwood last time July 31, having finished a highly creditable fourth in the G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown July 7. Stablemate Mahler came back from an off-the-board effort in the June 2 G1 Epsom Derby to annex Royal Ascot's G3 Queen's Vase S. over two miles on his latest start June 22. Added to the mix is the one-time Derby favorite **Macarthur**, the brother to Motivator (GB) who has been off through injury since finishing third in the G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial at Leopardstown May 13. Bidding to spoil the Ballydoyle party is **Lucarno**, who was fourth at Epsom before splitting **Boscobel** and Yellowstone when runner-up in the G2 King Edward VII S. at Royal Ascot June 22 and finished fourth in the G2 Princess of Wales's S. at Newmarket July 12 last time out.

Last year's hero **Sergeant Cecil** has to rebound from two below-par efforts at Ascot. He was last to finish in the June 21 G1 Ascot Gold Cup, and a distant sixth in the July 28 G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. The eight-year-old loves this circuit, having also won the Ebor H. two years ago as well as last year's G2 Doncaster Cup run here in September due to that track's redevelopment and the G2 Yorkshire Cup May 18. "He's fine since Ascot and is in no worse form than when he won the race last year," trainer Rod Millman told *PA Sport*. "We always thought he had that turn of foot, but not against those type of horses in the King George." He faces a stiff task attempting to give five pounds to **Septimus**, who reemerges after finishing runner-up to Scorpion (Ire) in the June 1 G1 Coronation Cup. He had previously captured the G3 Mooresbridge S. at The Curragh May 7, his first run since being injured in the 2006 G1 Epsom Derby. **Percussionist** remains the sole horse to have got the better of Sergeant Cecil at this track over the past three seasons when winning the G2 Yorkshire Cup last May. Rested since his fourth in this year's renewal of that race, he has been prepared specifically for this race.

## Arqana Deauville August Sale

### RECORD-BREAKING SALE CLOSES ON A HIGH

Making it a banner year for Arqana, the Deauville Yearling Sale ended yesterday with a record gross of €37,448,000, far exceeding last year's figure of €29,772,000 and pipping the previous high of six years ago. The final day's trade was solid, and the total average was up 20 percent from 12 months ago, while the median rose by five percent. Despite a diminished international presence, yesterday's session saw a continuation of the trend of top yearlings selling for substantial sums. It was Guy Armengol who signed the docket for the topper, Haras du Petit Tellier's hip 425, a colt from the first crop of the Irish National Stud's resident Elusive City (Elusive Quality). From the family of Crystal Palace (Fr), he was one of the picks of the draft from Patrick Chedeville's stud and was knocked down to the bloodstock agent for €220,000. "I loved this colt--he was an extremely good walker and an outstanding looking individual," Armengol explained. "I bought him for a client who already has horses in France with various trainers, and it has not yet been decided who he will go to. I have seen about half of the horses in the sale and I have to say that it was a very good renewal with a lot of very nice individuals. It was not easy to buy in a strong and selective market--I didn't think I would have to go to that price for that horse, but there are a lot of determined buyers."

As an Englishman, I am supposed to be obsessed with society's class system, so let's apply it to the stallions responsible for last weekend's Grade I winners.

It's fair to say that Kingmambo, sire of the Pacific Classic winner Student Council, and Pulpit, who was so ably represented by Rutherienne in the Del Mar Oaks, could safely be categorized as blue-blooded aristocrats. Each was sired by a champion stallion from a Grade I-winning mare, so they were born with the proverbial silver spoon in their mouths. Orientate, whose daughter Lady Joanne took the Alabama S., is also out of a Grade I-winning mare but his sire, Mt Livermore, probably brings him down to upper middle class.

But what about Danetime, sire of the impressive Myboycharlie, who maintained his unbeaten record in the Prix Morny? If he were a person, Danetime would probably have been classified as working class, with the type of accent Dick Van Dyke attempted so ex-cruciatingly as the chimney sweep in Mary Poppins.

Myboycharlie's Brisnet catalogue-style pedigree summarises Danetime simply as a "black-type-placed winner of three races" but he was much more than that. Conceived in 1993 when Danehill was available for a mere Ir9,000 guineas, he was sold for IR13,000gns as a foal and for the unexceptional sum of IR36,000gns as a yearling. Bought by Demi O'Byrne on behalf of Michael Tabor, the youngster was sent to Neville Callaghan, the trainer who had done so well with Danehill Dancer, a year-old Danehill colt also belonging to Tabor.

Although Danetime showed promise in winning one of his three juvenile starts, his connections apparently regarded him as the type to give them a lot of fun in handicaps, rather than a potential group horse. Brought along steadily in the spring of his second season, Danetime became the subject of a huge gamble when he lined up against 29 others in the six-furlong Wokingham H. at the 1997 Royal Ascot meeting.

With Gary Stevens in the saddle, Danetime had difficulty in maneuvering over to the stands side from the number 19 draw and consequently was much nearer last than first approaching the final furlong. However, he managed to make up at least eight lengths in the closing stages, only to fail by a head to catch Selhurstpark Flyer.

Danetime confirmed that he was developing into a very useful sprinter when he gave weight and a beating to the future Group 1 winner Elnadim in a handicap at Newmarket before taking his chance in the Stewards' Cup at Goodwood. Like the Wokingham, the Stewards' Cup is one of Britain's most fiercely competitive six-furlong handicaps, and it too attracted 30 runners. Tabor, a former bookmaker, set out to recoup his Wokingham losses and reportedly collected "a bit more than £200,000" after Danetime had won by a neck.

From then on, Danetime raced only at stakes level, but he never won again, despite being good enough to finish second behind Royal Applause in the G1 Haydock Park Sprint Cup and third behind his old rival Elnadim in the G1 July Cup. Although his efforts were good enough to earn a Timeform rating of 121 and an official rating of 117, Danetime's lack of a stakes victory must have seriously limited his appeal to the top stallion stations.


However, Tony O'Callaghan of Tally-Ho Stud has enjoyed plenty of success over the years, mainly by standing good-looking sprinters at commercial prices. He seized the chance to stand Danetime, who began his career in 1999 at a fee of only IR3,000gns--a fraction of the IR50,000gns now charged for Danehill, who had boosted his Northern Hemisphere reputation by becoming champion sire of two-year-olds on two occasions and by running Sadler's Wells very close on the general sires' list in 1997.

A third-place finish among the freshman sires of 2002 earned Danetime much stronger support than before, starting with 150 mares in 2003.

This allowed him to show exactly what he was capable of, and his 2006 two-year-olds proved an excellent collection, led by Vital Equine, winner of the G2 Champagne S., and Dhanyata, a close second in the G1 Cheveley Park S. Vital Equine went on to finish a fine second of 24 after trying to lead throughout in this year's 2000 Guineas and now Danetime has come up with an even better Classic prospect in Myboycharlie.

Sadly, Danetime is no longer around to reap the rewards of these solid achievements, as he died in 2005. His last crop of yearlings should prove popular at the sales over the next few months. It will also be interesting to see whether the Tally-Ho team can work the same magic with two more of Danehill's group-placed sons, Chevalier and Kodiak.

In comparison with Danetime, Pulpit has had things easy, but he too has had obstacles to overcome in establishing himself as A.P. Indy's most accomplished stallion son.

I hesitate to describe Claiborne's policy on mare numbers as an obstacle, as there are no doubt benefits to be gained from keeping a stallion's book well below the 150 mark, especially in the sales ring. However, breeding is very much a numbers game these days and it is all too easy for a stallion's achievements to be obscured by his having fewer runners than many of his rivals.

Pulpit currently has six crops aged three or upwards, but was never asked to cover more than 86 mares in any of those six years. This means that he has 329 named foals in these six crops, whereas Langfuhr, another stallion who retired in 1998, has nearly 500. Pulpit's relative Tale of the Cat retired a year later, but has 540 foals in his first five crops.

This concentration on quality rather than quantity has paid off, though. When Rutherienne sprinted clear at Del Mar, she became the sixth Grade I winner to emerge from those first six crops, and Pulpit now has 16 graded winners to his credit, which works out to an admirable 4.86 percent of his 329 named foals.

Interestingly, Rutherienne and the GII Peter Pan S. winner Sightseeing were conceived when Pulpit's fee rose to \$75,000 in 2003, but a comparatively disappointing 2003 sent his fee down to \$35,000 in 2004 (before rising again to \$60,000 and then \$80,000). It was around that time that Claiborne started to relax its numbers policy a little, and Pulpit covered at least 100 mares in 2004, 2005 and 2006. He therefore has some larger crops coming on line and these larger numbers may eventually help him rise higher up the general sires' list--and he is currently 10th behind his sire, by American earnings, in 2007.

With any American stallion, we have to consider whether he will benefit or suffer from the increasing number of synthetic tracks, which seem to favour the turf breed over the traditional dirt performers. It is in Pulpit's favour that he is capable of getting very good turf performers, such as Rutherienne, Stroll, Wend, Melhor Ainda, Lidgate and Ecclesiastic. He also has an all-weather stakes winner this year, while A.P. Indy has three, so there's every reason to think that Pulpit is well equipped to cope with the change of surface.
