### RACING NSW CALLS FOR GOVERNMENT AID

With hundreds of jobs in the Thoroughbred industry jeopardized by the equine influenza outbreak, Racing New South Wales called on the government Thursday to aid the thousands of workers affected by the shut-down of the sport in the state, and a fund of A\$4 million has been earmarked for assisting those workers. A four-year-old gelding stabled at Randwick was confirmed positive for EI, and seven more horses in

trainer Anthony Cummings's barn have contracted the disease as well. The track is under a mandatory 50-day quarantine and, as the quarantine is effective from the last diagnosed case of EI, the period could well be extended. Racing in NSW could be shut down for three months, and the A\$35-million Spring Carnival has been canceled. Federal Minister For Fisheries Ian McDonald said, "It is shocking news--the worst possible we could have received. The racing industry is now completely shutdown and will be for quite a few months. Everyone is absolutely devastated."

Added Racing NSW Chief Executive Peter V'Landys, "It is the darkest day in New South Wales racing history. We have 50,000 participants who are already suffering. One horse transport company has already laid off 50 people. This will have a devastating effect and will cost hundreds of millions of dollars." Officials in Victoria are still hopeful the A\$80-million Victorian Spring Carnival, highlighted by the G1 Melbourne Cup, will go ahead as planned, and that will be the case if the virus is contained within NSW. Due to the outbreak, William Inglis and Son have indefinitely postponed the Spring Thoroughbred Sale that was to be held Sept. 28.

Added Racing NSW Chief Executive Peter V'Landys, "It is the darkest day in New South Wales racing history. We have 50,000 participants who are already suffering. One horse transport company has already laid off 50 people. This will have a devastating effect and will cost hundreds of millions of dollars." ### SIR PERCY TO LANWADES

Four-year-old **Sir Percy (GB)** (Mark of Esteem {Ire}--Percy's Lass {GB}, by Blakeney {GB}) will join the stallion roster at Kirsten Rausing's Lanwades Stud in 2008. "Percy was an outstandingly tough and healthy individual, with a tremendous constitution and an eye-catchingly athletic walk." One notable absentee from the Forego field is Tracy Farmer's fleet **Commentator** (Distorted Humor). Tenth as the odds-on favorite in last year's renewal, the six-year-old was third to **High Finance** after disputing a furious pace in the GI Tom Fool H. on Independence Day and was most recently sixth in the GI A.G. Vanderbilt H. July 28. Trainer Nick Zito said he will train Commentator up to the Breeders' Cup, and he could contest the Sprint or the new Dirt Mile. "He's doing good," the conditioner explained. "We've made up our minds and we're going to shoot [for the Breeders' Cup]. We have to make this race count. He's capable of running a big performance off the layoff." **Chatain** was entered for the Forego, but is an uncertain starter. Trainer Angel Penna Jr. told *Daily Racing Form* that the four-year-old has a bruised left front foot discovered following a half-mile breeze this past Tuesday. "He breezed beautiful, all cylinders were on," Penna told the *Form*. "I came to walk him, he was a little gimpy. We worked on him all afternoon and he was 90 percent better, but it's not 100 percent." Penna said Chatain would gallop this morning with a special shoe designed to minimize pressure on his heel.

**Starting Over...**

An impressive 10 1/4-length maiden winner in her July 6 debut at Belmont Park, GI Spinaway S. candidate **Phantom Income** (Montbrook) looked like one to watch in the Aug. 15 GI Adirondack S. at Saratoga, but she lost all chance at the start. In one of a series of gate incidents during the meet, the filly was still in the hands of the assistant starter when they rang the bell and was on her hind legs in the first jump. She was declared a non-starter, and all wagers were refunded.

Explaining what happened, trainer Rick Violette Jr. said, "She was getting a little tight and a little fractious and, unfortunately they sprang the gate when she was basically unprepared. [Jockey Eibar Coa] had a big hold of her and the assistant starter had a big hold of her and she went straight up in the air. The photos of the start are amazing--she has her neck bowed and her ears pricked, and it looks like she was superimposed over the other horses as they opened the doors."

The experience has a lasting negative effect on the Klaravich Stable's colorbearer. A good gate student before the Adirondack, Phantom Income had to go back to class after the race.

"It has been a big problem," Violette said. "It's disappointing. She is a temperamental filly--she literally has a temper and she doesn't like being told what to do, but she wasn't any trouble at the gate before this, she really wasn't."

"We have had her back to the gate every day," he added. "We have been standing her and backing her out, and doing a lot of work without the rider. They have been tailing her [holding onto her tail over the back doors as she stands in the gate], but I'm hoping we can get beyond that. She really resents it, but they are afraid she'll rear up."

The gate grades have been mixed, but Violette is hopeful that Phantom Income will have her gate work down in time for Sunday's Spinaway.

"She was acting good yesterday, but she wasn't as good today," he said. "We'll keep working with her and see how she is. Horses can improve leaps and bounds in just a couple of days."

**"CHARLIE" HAS NATIONAL DATE** Susan Magnier's **Myboycharlie (Ire)** (Danetime {Ire}) faces a potential clash with New Approach (Ire) and Rio de la Plata in the Sept. 16 G1 National S., the *Racing Post* revealed. Following an easy success in the G1 Prix Morny at Deauville Aug. 19, the unbeaten colt will step up to seven furlongs for The Curragh contest before a tilt at the G1 Darley Dewhurst S. at Newmarket Oct. 20. "The plan now is to run him in the National S., as we intend taking the National/Dewhurst route with Myboycharlie," trainer Tommy Stack's son and assistant Fozzy told the *Post*. "He improved leaps and bounds since his first run at the Curragh and while all his three victories to date have come on testing ground, we're not worried in the slightest about better ground, so that shouldn't be a problem."

**A Pivotal Topper...**

Heading yesterday's market was hip 379, a son of Pivotal (GB) consigned by Flash Conroy's Glenvale Stud. Out of a half-sister to Namaqualand, he was knocked down to John Warren for 165,000 guineas. Warren's wife Lady Carolyn had been in the thick of the action three lots earlier when a Red Ransom colt from her Highclere Stud achieved 110,000 guineas. Cormac McCormack was the name on the docket for the three-parts brother to 2004 G2 July S. winner Captain Hurricane (GB), from the family of the multiple group winner Niche (GB). Shadwell have become active here in recent years, and that trend continued to the end yesterday when Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's operation paid 110,000 guineas for Bumble Mitchell's daughter of Medicean (GB). Consigned by the agent as hip 450, the half-sister to the listed scorer Warming Trends (GB) is a descendant of Kittiwake, whose dynasty includes the likes of the champion Miss Oceana, Kitwood and 1988 G1 Coronation S. heroine Magic of Life. Eimear Mulhern's Abbeville and Meadow Court Studs were responsible for another to break through the six-figure mark 10 lots later when Warren paid 105,000 guineas for a son of Alhaarth (Ire) from the family of Ogygian, Lookinforthebigone and Honour and Glory. Sunday's G2 Futurity S. win by New Approach (Ire) confirmed Galileo (Ire) as a continuing force; his sole offering, hip 392, proved popular. From the draft of Joe Foley's Ballyhane Stud, the daughter of the listed scorer Rosa delle Alpi from the family of Desert Wine, Menifee and Fasliyev was knocked down to BBA Ireland for 100,000 guineas.

**By the Numbers...**

The day's trading witnessed five lots breaking through the six-figure barrier, and the session average soared by 36 percent on last year's equivalent. In total, 22 lots made over 100,000 guineas, compared to 14 in 2006, while 92 yearlings broke the 50,000-guineas barrier, compared with 67 achieved 12 months ago. Added Beeby, "We came into the week expecting a good trade, as we knew our catalogue was good, but to record another 12-percent rise in average and median following 30 percent and 25 percent last year is truly remarkable. There has been a really excellent buzz in the sales paddocks from last Sunday and a huge crowd resulting in an excellent atmosphere. Frankly, we were missing no serious buyer of yearlings, and we are just so proud that the sale is taken so seriously by the industry these days."

**TDN INTERVIEW: STEVE BESHEAR**

The race to be the next governor of Kentucky is heating up, with native Kentuckian Steve Beshear, a Democrat from Dawson Springs, opposing Republican incumbent Ernie Fletcher.

The 62-year-old Beshear's resume is replete with experience in state government. He served in Kentucky's House of Representatives from 1974 through 1979 before being elected as Attorney General of the state, a role in which he served from 1980 to 1984. In 1983, Beshear was elected lieutenant governor on a ticket topped by Democrat Martha Layne Collins. Beshear failed to gain the Democratic nomination for governor four years later as part of a crowded, con-

tentious primary field, and returned to the private sector to practice law. Last December, Beshear announced his candidacy for governor for the 2007 election and in May earned the Democratic nomination. In an early-August poll by the Lexington-based *The Lane Report*, Beshear was leading Fletcher by some 18 points.

Last week, Beshear sat down for a phone interview with the *TDN's* Lucas Marquardt, and talked about his support of the horse industry in Kentucky and why he thinks expanded gambling can help the sport.

**Growing up in Kentucky, do you have a background with horses? Ever been to the Derby?**

My wife and I own some horses, but not race horses. My wife shows horses, and we both trail ride. We are among thousands of Kentuckians who own one or more horses. And I never got to go to the Derby until I was an adult, but I've now been a number of times.

**Why is racing so important to Kentucky?**

The horse industry in Kentucky has an approximately \$4-billion economic impact on our economy. It employs over 100,000 people directly and indirectly. In addition to the direct economic impact, it is one of the major tourist attractions in our state. So Thoroughbred farms, breeding operations and the race tracks all play an extremely important economic and tourism role in Kentucky.

**As governor, do you feel there are ways you can further strengthen the Thoroughbred industry?**

Well, the Thoroughbred industry is one of the signature industries of Kentucky, and I'm going to make sure it remains strong, and I'm going to take steps to make it stronger. I want to change our tax laws in Kentucky, so horses are treated the same as other agricultural animals. In that, the horse industry gets the same sales tax exemptions as other farmers in Kentucky.

Right now, if you go buy a bag of feed for a cow in the state, you don't pay the six percent sales tax in Kentucky. But if you buy the same bag of feed for a horse, you do. That's inequitable treatment of our horse industry, and we need to make sure that sales tax is removed from horse farming, just like it is for other farmers in the state. That, I think, will be a significant benefit to the horse industry, as well as people who own all kinds of horses in Kentucky.

Also, while we think Kentucky is the premier state for Thoroughbred business and Thoroughbred racing, other states have begun increasing their purses at the tracks, as well as creating owner and breeder incentives, which are beginning to affect the quality of racing in Kentucky and the quality of the horse industry here.

I am advocating the placing of limited casino gaming on the ballot in Kentucky, and allowing the people to vote on a constitutional amendment.

Right now, thousands of Kentuckians are going just across our borders every year and spending over \$1 billion dollars at gaming facilities in other states. I'm hopeful, by allowing limited gaming in Kentucky, we can capture that Kentucky money that's now going out of state. That would also create approximately \$500 million a year in additional tax revenue in Kentucky. My plan would be to use a part of that to enhance racing in the state, to create better purses, to create owner and breeder incentives, and in general to better support the horse industry in the state.

**When your say "limited casino gaming," does that mean casinos restricted to video lottery terminals?**

No, no. By limited, I mean in terms of locations. We would create only a limited number of licences, so there wouldn't be a proliferation of gaming every There would be a combination of race track locations and two or three free-standing locations along our borders, where we can take advantage of the surrounding states' populations. So we're recapturing the Kentucky dollar that's now leaving, and also attracting customers from across our borders. But these locations would have all of the types of gaming a casino would normally have, including table games like blackjack.

**Are you envisioning these types of casinos at tracks like Churchill Downs?**

My plan would call for several of the racetracks to have licences for these casinos, and obviously Churchill Downs would be one of the locations. You might well structure the legislation where the casino would be right at the race track, or within a certain proximity to the track.

**Does the same go for Keeneland, Ellis Park and Turfway Park?**

Certainly most of the major tracks around the state, and perhaps all of them, but we haven't worked out those details yet.

Do you feel there's been an adequate dialog between the horse industry and politicians in Kentucky over the past five, 10 years?

Several years ago, the horse industry formed an organization called the Kentucky Equine Education Project, or KEEP. And that group has been very engaged in educating the public *and* the legislature about the benefits of the horse industry in general, and has been engaged in advocating a number of positions favorable to the horse industry, including the sales tax exemption.

KEEP also advocates for allowing casino gaming at race tracks in Kentucky, and have been involved in the education process on that issue. Obviously, the issue of casino gaming at tracks is a controversial one in our state, but fortunately, we have a process where people will get to express their opinions, because this issue would be placed on the ballot and everybody in Kentucky would be allowed to vote on expanded gaming within the state.

Would a vote on expanded gaming be held at a special election, or during the next general election?

It would be in the form of a constitutional amendment that would be placed on the ballot in the next regular election after it was passed by the legislature, so the people would have the opportunity to vote on this.

How has the support been from horsemen? Have you been getting positive feedback from the industry?

We're receiving overwhelming support from the horse industry for our campaign, both because of my support for the industry and because of our plan to move this state forward in the areas of education and economic development. We plan on designating where this additional tax revenue from gaming will be spent. It will be designated to be spent in certain areas, such as education and health care. A portion of it will be dedicated to promote the horse industry. And a portion of the money would go to each of our counties, for their infrastructure and economic development. So we're getting support not only because the policies are good for the horse industry, but also because it's good for Kentucky as a whole.

**BIANCONE SUSPENDED** Trainer Patrick Biancone was handed a 15-day suspension by the Kentucky Horse Racing Authority after one of his horses tested positive for caffeine and a related drug following a victory, *Daily Racing Form* reports. He will serve the suspension from Sept. 5 to 19, Lisa Underwood, executive director for the KHRA, told the publication. The suspension is related to the positive test results returned on two-year-old filly L'Aziza (Zavata) following her victory in the fifth race at Churchill Downs May 3, the *Form* said. The testing also revealed the presence of theophylline, a drug used to treat respiratory diseases and asthma. Both caffeine and theophylline are Class B substances as defined by the Association of Racing Commissioners International. Class B substances have a high potential to impact performance but can also be used therapeutically, the *Form* reports.
