THE SUMMER OF GEORGIE

Carrying the underdog banner in a manner that would make George Constanza proud, the California-bred **Georgie Boy** (Tribal Rule) rallied from the back of a crowded 12-horse field to capture yesterday's GI Del Mar Futurity on the closing day of Del Mar's 2007 meet.

Georgie Boy's win came at the expense of the previously undefeated **Salute the Sarge** (Forest Wildcat), who prevailed by a length when the two first met in the GII Best Pal S. Aug. 12. Looking to turn the tables in the Futurity, Georgie Boy was allowed to drift to the back of the back under Garrett Gomez, but

commenced a resolute rally down the center of the track and outfinished Salute the Sarge and a slew of rivals to prevail by a half-length. **Cont. p2**

RAGS TO RICHES TO TARGET GAZELLE

Trainer Todd Pletcher confirmed yesterday that **Rags to Riches** (A.P. Indy) will bypass this weekend's GI

Ruffian S. at Belmont Park and instead target the following Saturday's GI Gazelle S. at the same venue. Pletcher's announcement was not unexpected following the GI Belmont S. heroine's missed work at Saratoga last week, the result of an elevated temperature.

"This provides us the opportunity to make up the work without compromising on the other end," Pletcher told *Daily Racing Form*. "The six weeks to the Breeders' Cup is actually ideal." Rags to Riches, who breezed five panels in 1:02 3/5 at Saratoga on Sunday, hasn't raced since defeating Curlin in the June 9 Belmont.

ECHOES OF HIS SIRE

York is often referred to as a front-runner's track and Godolphin's **Echo of Light** (GB) (Dubai Millennium {GB}) provided a masterclass yesterday in his sire's image when smashing the track

record by over two seconds in the G3 Strensall S. Penalised for his narrow success in Deauville's G3 Prix Gontaut-Biron Aug. 15, the imposing bay made light of that burden with an authoritative display to best

Master of His Domain...

In reality, George Schwary's Georgie Boy wasn't much of an underdog in yesterday's Futurity, considering his 5-1 odds made him the third betting choice in a wide-open affair. In his first two career starts, Georgie Boy ran third and then second in Hollywood maidens in June and early July before fittingly earning his diploma in the Graduation S. for statebreds over Del Mar's Poly July 25. He was wearing blinkers for the third consecutive start when he tired as the pacesetter in the Best Pal, where he nonetheless ran a game second to Salute the Sarge, and lost the hood here with the addition of East Coast jock Garrett Gomez, who flew in to take the mount. "Kathy [trainer Kathy Walsh] was high on this horse, and that means a lot to me," said Gomez. "Kathy is like family to me; like a second mother. When I was first getting started out here, she was a big part of that. And my wife worked for her for a bunch of years. She calls her 'Mom.' Kathy called me about him, several times. When I realized that she was that high on him, I had to take it seriously. We had the good trip and he did what he had to do. He's a two-year-old and he's still a little green, but aren't they all. Today he did just fine." Walsh added about her charge, "He does everything like an old horse, except he's slow to change leads. Today he never even changed and he won anyway." Trainer Eric Guillot thought a troubled trip may have made the difference for Salute the Sarge, who was in tight on the turn before muscling his way through in mid-stretch. "We got bottled up near the quarter pole," Guillot said. "He's kind of a grinder--he's not the kind to get checked and then get right back into his stride. He ran a good race. Georgie Boy deserved to win." The post-time favorite Drill Down, a \$350,000 BESMAR juvenile who was coming off a sharp maiden win over the track July 28, ran with credit in his stakes bow to complete the trifecta. One of the very few runners remaining from the sole crop of Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum's star performer, Echo of Light has taken a while to mature and fulfil the early promise that prompted his owner to nominate him as the best of the crop which included Dubawi (Ire). He also gave them headaches in the early days and his notorious running out at the top of Windsor's straight two years ago led him to be labeled as a "thinker," but he clearly possesses a large share of ability with conditions in his favor. That was demonstrated by his easy success in this race on St Leger day last year before his subsequent win, despite veering violently left, in Longchamp's G2 Prix Daniel Wildenstein later that month. He was merely a sitting target out on the lead in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile and was duly inhaled in the Churchill Downs heat in October, before another wayward run when fourth in the July 14 G2 Summer Mile S. on his return at Ascot. Back on track at Deauville with the help of cheekpieces, he clung in to a diminishing short-head margin as Atlantic Air (Fr) closed in. With the sheepskin applied again here, he was in a league of his own, still traveling smoothly with Dettori motionless approaching the eighth peg and putting in a decisive surge with one slap of the whip inside the final 150 yards. "I was surprised he broke the track record, as the wind was against us," Dettori said. "I was a bit disappointed at Deauville last time, but the team said he had a little abscess, so that explains why he was a bit flat. At the highest level, it's a little bit difficult for him, but in this company he's a very good horse. [Trainer] Saeed [bin Suroor] used to tease me and say I was afraid of him, but I like him now as I know what to expect." Godolphin's trainer is pinpointing a return to Longchamp for the G2 Prix Daniel Wildenstein Oct. 6. [Click for the Racing Post race chart.](#)

Come on Over...

Since it was moved from the dirt to the grass in 1994, the GI Garden City Breeders' Cup S., which will be contested this Saturday at Belmont Park, has become a logical spot for fillies and mares shipping over from Europe. Only one has won the event in her state-side debut, though, while a pair, **True Flare** (Capote)--who won the race in her third start in the U.S. when the event was still called the Rare Perfume H. in 1996--and **Luas Line (Ire)** (Danehill), took the nine-furlong event after having been previously campaigned across the pond. The sole three-year-old filly to win the Garden City without previous experience in the U.S. was Dario Hinojosa's **Pharatta (Ire)** (Fairy King), who was let go at 7-1 odds in the 1998 renewal off her fourth-place effort in the G2 Prix d'Astarte at Deauville in early August. The bay belied those odds, coming from between foes and running down the heavily favored Tenski to win it by 1 3/4 lengths. **Cont. p4**

Phar Out...

Four fillies could replicate Pharatta's feat should they indeed line up for the Garden City. European performers **Alexander Tango (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), **Costume (GB)** (Danehill), **Missvinsky** (Stravinsky), and **Touch My Soul (Fr)** (Tiger Hill {Ire}) are all nominated and would be making their U.S. debut, with the former pair figuring to make the biggest impact. Alexander Tango has been keeping esteemed company while racing for training Tommy Stack in Ireland. The chestnut came through as the favorite in the G3 Derrinstown Stud 1000 Guineas Trial S. at Leopardstown in May, then ran a respectable fourth, beaten 2 1/4 lengths by the brilliant Finsceal Beo (Ire), in the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas S. two weeks later. More recently, she won the Kilroy Estate S. July 15 and took on the boys in the G2 UAE Royal Whip S. at The Curragh Aug. 12, where she completed the exacta under Eagle Mountain (Ire). The nicely bred Costume, meanwhile, seems to be hitting her best stride for trainer John Gosden. Out of Dance Dress, a group winner by Nureyev, the bay ran fourth while still a maiden to Darjina (Fr) in the G1 French 1000 Guineas in mid-May. She broke her maiden at Ripon in June and, in her latest, was a good second in the G3 Oak Tree S. at Goodwood Aug. 3.

MAIMONIDES SIDELINED WITH SORE SHINS
Zayat Stable's highly regarded **Maimonides** (Vindication) will spend at least the next month on the sidelines after emerging from Monday's GI Hopeful S. at Saratoga with sore shins, reports *The Blood-Horse*. "I noticed after the race that his shins were pretty sore and he'd bucked one of them, so he'll miss about 30 days and of course miss the [GI] Breeders' Cup [Juvenile]," Baffert told the publication. "We're gonna have to back off of him, which is disappointing, but in a way I feel better about it because I'd been wondering why he didn't run his race in the Hopeful." A \$4.6 million yearling purchase by Ahmed Zayat's operation, the half to Roman Ruler and El Corredor earned **☆ "TDN Rising Star" ☆** status after an eye-catching debut win at Saratoga Aug. 8., but faded badly in the stretch in the Hopeful after setting rapid fractions, finishing third behind winner Majestic Warrior. "He should have kept going, and I really didn't think he could get beat in that race, but it turns out he had a legitimate excuse," Baffert added. "He'll be fine, though. He's young and these things happen; he'll bounce right back and he'll have a great winter campaign heading into the Kentucky Derby, so it might be a blessing in disguise."

MANLEY RESIGNS FROM JOCKEYS' GUILD

Dwight Manley, who took over from the beleaguered Dr. Wayne Gertmenian as the national manager of the Jockey's Guild 13 months ago, announced yesterday that he has resigned from the post. Terry Meyocks, former president of the New York Racing Association, has been identified as Manley's probable successor. "My decision to resign was not an easy one, but a necessary one," Manley said in a press release. "I'm a single father of two children, and I cannot commit the time that the Jockeys' Guild deserves from its national manager and fulfill my obligations to my family." Jockey John Velazquez, chairman of the Guild, commented, "Mr. Manley became national manager at a time of crisis for our organization. He saved the Guild. Under his leadership, we have now stabilized our finances. We appreciate all of his efforts and his achievements as our leader in dealing with the industry and achieving a sound financial basis for the Permanently Disabled Jockeys Fund."

WELL-RELATED COLT TO BE SCRATCHED

An El Prado (Ire) half-brother to Monday's GI Hopeful S. winner **Majestic Warrior** (A.P. Indy), scheduled to sell as hip 57 during Monday's opening session of the Keeneland September Yearling Sale in Lexington, has been scratched, according to Jim Scott, farm manager at the Steinbrenner family's Kinsman Farm in Ocala. "The family simply decided to keep the colt after watching the way that Majestic Warrior performed at Saratoga," Scott explained. "He just became too valuable a prospect for us to part with. He's an awfully nice colt and he'll go into training for us." Scott said that the son of MGISW and

millionaire Dream Supreme (Seeking the Gold) would be returned to the farm to be broken and will go into training with Bill Mott at the appropriate time. The bay colt is also a full-brother to SW Crystal Current and A.P. Dream, a maiden winner at Gulfstream Park this past March, which was bought back by Kinsman for just short of \$2.4 million at last year's Keeneland April Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training.

DARLEY PURCHASES DIABOLICAL Recent GI Alfred G. Vanderbilt H. winner **Diabolical** (Artax--Bonnie Byerly, by Dayjur) has been purchased by Darley Stable and will be taken out of consideration for the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, according to *Daily Racing Form*. The four-year-old colt will instead ship to Dubai for a winter/spring campaign that's likely to culminate with a start in the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen during the 2008 Dubai World Cup in March. Diabolical was purchased as a juvenile in training by trainer Steve Klesaris for \$300,000 on behalf of Jeff Puglisi. Racing for Puglisi Stables and Klesaris, the chestnut was considered one of the top sprinters in the country this year after consecutive wins in the May 19 GIII Maryland Breeders' Cup Sprint H. and the July 28 Vanderbilt. "Certainly he'll be greatly missed by our whole organization," Klesaris told *DRF*. "He's been a lot of fun since day one. Lot of thrills, memories. He's going to a very good outfit. I certainly wish them the very best of luck." Diabolical's second dam is Grade I winner Plenty of Grace (Roberto), herself a three-parts sister to champion turf mare Soaring Softly.

SOLDIER NEEDS RAIN

Budget Stables' **Soldier's Tale** (Stravinsky) may be forced to miss a clash with Sakhee's Secret (GB) in Saturday's G1 Haydock Sprint Cup if the ground is too firm for the six-year-old. Following the news that Susan Roy and Cheveley Park Stud's G1 July Cup runner-up **Dutch Art** (GB) (Medicean {GB}) may also sidestep the six-furlong contest if there is no rain, trainer Jeremy Noseda echoed those sentiments yesterday as he prepared the G1 Golden Jubilee S. hero. "Soldier's Tale is in very good order," he commented. "He worked this morning and is all set, ready to go, but I don't think it's going to happen as it is unlikely that the ground conditions will suit him. I will be having a chat with his owner today to decide whether we declare the horse or not in the vain hope that the rain may arrive for him at Haydock." Earlier, Cheveley Park Stud's Managing Director Chris Richardson told the *Racing Post* that Dutch Art "needs to get his toe in." He told the trade daily, "From our point of view the ground would have to be a major factor and if there is no rain he will not run. He needs to get his toe in. I know there is rain forecast, but it now looks as though that is going to bypass Haydock." Officials at the track are watering to ensure safe fast ground at the Merseyside venue, with a dry and warm forecast leading up to the feature.

AUSTRALIAN EQUINE INFLUENZA UPDATE

EI SPREADS TO HUNTER VALLEY The Equine influenza outbreak has reached the Hunter Valley, with the confirmation that a broodmare based in the epicenter of Australia's Thoroughbred breeding industry has tested positive for the respiratory virus and the 2007 NSW foal crop is now considered under threat. The virus, which can be deadly to foals, is already blamed in the deaths of two non-Thoroughbreds who contracted it in mid-August. Approximately 15,000 foals are born in the Hunter Valley every year. The affected broodmare is at Blandford, north of Scone and near to several major studs. In an effort to bolster to the breeding industry, the NSW State Government announced yesterday that disaster relief non-interest bearing loans of A\$12,000 per industry participant were being offered to victims of the Thoroughbred EI problem.

Albury Horses Negative for EI

There was some good news for the embattled racing industry in Australia. The results of tests taken by NSW Department of Primary Industries Officers on Tuesday morning from a group of horses stabled at Albury on the NSW-Victoria border, have been reported as negative to EI. Racing Victoria officials breathed an enormous sigh of relief when the results were made known. The tests were taken from 13 horses trained by Albury's biggest trainer Brett Cavanaugh, after he reported to Racing NSW Stewards and the DPI that a number of his horses had elevated temperatures. The Wodonga-trained horses withdrawn on Tuesday from Wednesday's Seymour meeting cannot be re-instated, as the results were not confirmed until after official scratching time. RVL will today review its position on the banning of movement of horses trained in Wodonga.

NEW TERRITORY FOR THE STALLION COMPANY By Christina Bossinakis

Bluegrass Thoroughbred Services John Stuart and Jamie LaMonica, co-owner of Empire Stud, competed against one other on stallion deals for years, but the duo recently joined forces to create a stallion brokerage firm called The Stallion Company. The endeavor was launched over this past spring. "There are a number of bloodstock agencies that do some work in the stallion business as a part time thing and it often becomes seasonal," said Stuart, explaining the need for the new venture. "We felt like there were a number of things that a part-time agency couldn't do as effectively as a company that deals with this full time." Both Stuart and LaMonica are involved in stallion deals; however, Stewart focuses primarily on the organization and administration of the venture, while LaMonica is involved more on the day-to-day operation of the company. While the presence of breeding titans Coolmore and Darley will always ensure single-ownership stallions, Stuart stresses the growing need of broodmare owners to buy equity in stallions. "We find that mare owners' biggest expense is the stud fee," said Stuart. "Their most important decision is who to breed their mare to. Our primary focus is to give a mare breeder a better take on who to breed their mare to, and to buy the season for them at a discounted price. We can help the breeder because we often help a farm to secure a stallion and we deal with a lot of seasons, which gives us access to seasons and shares that the individual farm might have difficulty accessing, even the larger breeder."

'Champions' Poised for Takeoff...

In an effort to get breeders directly involved in the stallion acquisition game, Stuart and LaMonica developed a stallion fund called 'Champions,' which will be managed by The Stallion Company. "We've organized a pool of money which will be active in helping people buy stallion seasons," explained Stuart. "We haven't closed on it. However, we are within days of completing the somewhere between \$4-5 million offering, which will go to stallion shares and parts of stallions." According to Stuart, principal investors in the fund will hail from different areas in the horse business. "I don't know of another project that would be organized quite like this," said Stuart. "Farms have now raised pools of money to help buy stallions, but an independent stallion fund, I don't know of one. This is in an effort to help farms buy into stallions, which can be very expensive for the individual breeder. Hopefully, one hands cleans the other where the farms will support the stallions we buy an interest in."

International Appeal...**

An area which The Stallion Company will expand into in the future is the international stallion market: the buying, importing and syndicating stallion prospects from abroad. "The horse business is unquestionably an international business," added Stuart. "It's now a flat world. There is going to be a lot more flow of stallion prospects between countries. In the last six months, I've been to Argentina, Dubai and Australia, and have also been looking into the Japanese market as well. We are very much involved in the stallion business beyond here." Case in point is

a deal, brokered by Stuart last year. "We convinced an Argentine breeder to send his mare to England, to breed to a Darley stallion," he said. "The resulting foal, which was born in Argentina, was later purchased privately by a South African. That was the largest price for any yearling sold in Argentina last year." Stuart referenced the increasing presence of inbred bloodstock flooding the U.S. market today as a reason for looking elsewhere for tomorrow's stallion. "As our horses are becoming more inbred here, there is a need for the outcross in the U.S.," Stuart said. "That is going to be a primary focus for us over the next couple of years. So far, the response from international breeders has been very positive. We have had interest from as far as Australia to send a stallion prospect to stand here." While The Stallion Company's main focus remains on central Kentucky and a host of regional markets, including New York, Maryland and Florida, Stuart pointed out that wherever future stallions come from, the domestic bloodstock market will be driven by the demand for sound, two-turn horses that will serve as an outcross for domestic stock. "We see a big future in the stallion syndication market," said Stuart. "We are just trying to give people as much information as we can, so they can make a better informed decision on their investment."

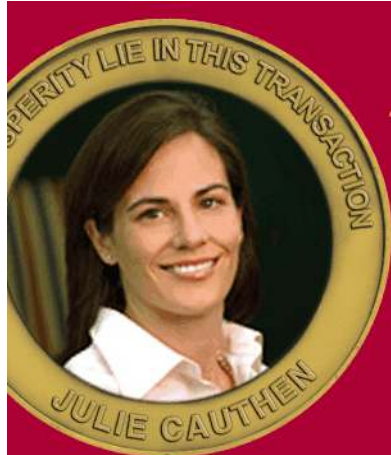

Farm Bill Moves to Senate

Senate Agriculture Committee Chairman Tom Harkin (D-IA) indicates he expects to begin the markup of the Farm Bill the week of September 17. The bill has already passed the House. The Farm Bill is a once-every-five-years piece of legislation covering a myriad of agriculture-related issues and as such is both complex and controversial. Loan rates for program crops, agricultural subsidies and revenue-per-acre targets for major crops are among the key issues.

The Senate bill would continue the current crop insurance program "with minor changes for the purpose of improving efficiency, closing loopholes in policy and budget savings."

Under one proposal, the Agriculture Department would offer no-fee secondary crop insurance to farmers who acquire buy-up crop insurance as a replacement for ad hoc disaster aid.

Kentucky Cup Classic to Offer Bonus:

Officials at Turfway Park announced yesterday that the winner of this year's \$200,000 GI Kentucky Cup Classic, to be held at the Florence, Kentucky track on Saturday, Sept. 29, will collect a \$150,000 bonus if the horse has already won a Grade/Group I race in 2006 or 2007. The 1 1/8-mile event on the Polytrack headlines Turfway's Kentucky Cup Day of Champions and is a prep for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Monmouth Oct. 27. "The Kentucky Cup races are ideally timed for preparation for the Breeders' Cup, as previous winners have demonstrated," said Turfway Park President and CEO Robert N. Elliston. For horses bred in Kentucky, the Classic carries a \$350,000 purse, part of which is funded by the Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund (KTDF). A Kentucky-bred meeting the bonus condition therefore would run for the winner's 62 percent of the base purse of \$200,000, plus 65 percent of the KTDF incentive, plus the \$150,000 bonus, a total of \$371,500. Grade/Group I winners bred outside the state are not eligible for the KTDF incentive and would run for 62 percent of \$200,000 plus the bonus, or \$274,000.

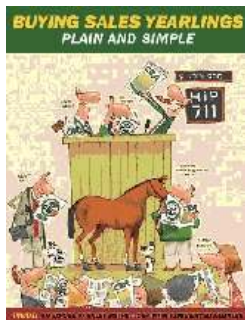

FIGURES DIVE AT FAIRYHOUSE Tattersalls Ireland's September Yearling Sale looks certain to be down on its 2006 equivalent after a disappointing second session yesterday saw the average plummet 32 percent to €12,227 and the median drop 29 percent to €10,000. With a clearance rate of only 65 percent yesterday, the auction has been the subject of the first glitch in the 2007 European yearlings sale season. The overall average is also down, falling 13 percent from 12 months ago. It was a filly by Darley's freshman sire Exceed and Excel (Aus) who topped the day's trading when selling to Dermot Farrington for €65,000. Consigned by Tom and Geraldine Mowlan's Riversfield Stud, hip 361 is out of the 2000 Listed Round Tower S. scorer Lady of Kildare (Ire) from the family of Formidable, Ajdal, Arazi and Noverre. Farrington revealed that the filly will enter training with the Curragh-based David Myerscough, who said, "She's a very racy filly out of a smart racemare and she looks an early type. She's the nicest filly by the stallion that we've seen so far and hopefully she might be back at The Curragh next August for the [€300,000] sales race." Four lots earlier, Mark Tompkins secured a colt from the first crop of the 2003 G1 Irish 2000 Guineas winner Indian Haven (GB) for €54,000. Out of a half-sister to Flash of Steel (Ire), who also won that Curragh Classic in 1986, his third dam is the top-class performer and producer Sparkalark. "He's a lovely colt," the Newmarket trainer said. "He's a good, hardy colour and looks a real athlete. We always buy one or two nice horses here and it's a sale that we've done well out of. This colt was the standout today." Later in the session, David Redvers paid €48,000 for hip 463, a Bahri colt from the draft of Brian Grassick's Newtown Stud from the family of Fadeyev and this year's G2 Mehl-Mulhens-Rennen third Champery.



Swinbank Seeks Acclamation...

Alan Swinbank is becoming an established name both at home and overseas, thanks to the exploits of his stable stars Collier Hill (GB) and Turbo Linn (GB), and he was keen to secure a son of the leading first-season sire Acclamation (GB). Consigned by Shinglis Stud, hip 342 from the family of Red Lord (GB) was knocked down to ex-trainer Jeremy Glover acting on behalf of the Northern-based conditioner for €40,000. "He's a very good-walking horse and looks quite athletic," Swinbank said. "This is a sale that's been good to us-- we've got more out of it than we have put in. I bought Valbenny (Ire) here a couple of years ago and I also got Theatrical Moment, who won four bumpers, out of here, but you've got to work hard to get them." Pat Neary paid €36,000 for Mount Eaton Stud's hip 367, a daughter of Shinko Forest (Ire) out of a half to Mac's Fighter (GB). "I've bought nine fillies here over the last two days," Neary explained. "She was the most expensive of them, but she's the best of them and in terms of looks I thought that she was the best filly here today. She's an excellent long-term prospect. The dam has already bred three winners from three runners and the page is already in black as her half-brother Fred's Lad (GB) was listed-placed two weeks ago.
