

DARLEY ACQUIRES INTEREST IN HUMOR

Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum's Darley Stud has acquired "a number of shares in **Distorted Humor** (Forty Niner--Danzig's Beauty, by Danzig)," with the intent of breeding off those shares for the future, according to a release from WinStar Farm. "Darley's involvement will further enhance Distorted Humor's legacy as a great sire," commented Doug Cauthen,

president of WinStar and the syndicate manager for the stallion. The news comes a little over a week after the announcement that WinStar and Padua Stables' GI Haskell Invitational S. winner Any Given Saturday (Distorted Humor) would take up stallion duties at Darley upon completion

of his racing career. Sheikh Mohammed's operation has also been a supporter of Distorted Humor at auction, most recently going to \$800,000 for a son of What a Bird (Storm Bird) at Fasig-Tipton Saratoga. Distorted Humor currently sits atop the 2007 list of leading sires along with A.P. Indy, with 17 individual stakes winners. In 2007 alone, he has been represented by GISW Hystericalady and GSWs Cowtown Cat and Fourty Niners Son. Added Dan Pride, chief operating officer for Darley, "Distorted Humor has made a great impression on Sheikh Mohammed and we are thrilled that Darley is part of the syndicate." To date, Distorted Humor is the sire of 59 stakes winners and the earners of over \$33 million from six crops to race.

SHADWELL SETS FEES FOR INVASOR, JAZIL

Officials at Shadwell Farm have announced the 2008 stud fees for reigning Horse of the Year **Invasor (Arg)** (Candy Stripes-Quendom {Arg}, by Interpretate {Arg}) and the recently retired **Jazil** (Seeking the Gold--Better Than Honour, by Deputy Minister). Invasor, the Uruguyan Triple Crown winner, was defeated only once in his career, and rattled off six consecutive victories in Grade I company, capped by his success in the G1 Dubai World Cup. Retired after suffering an injury on the eve of the GI Suburban H. in late June, Invasor will stand for a fee of \$35,000. Jazil, hero of the GI Belmont S. in 2006, will cover his first mares at a fee of \$12,500. The four-year-old is a half-brother to this year's Belmont S. winner Rags to Riches. He also hails from the female family of the outstanding European filly Peeping Fawn. Shadwell will host a daily stallion show at Nashwan Stud beginning at 8:30 a.m. from Sept. 8 through Sept. 25.

HEILIGBRODTS SELL MAJORITY OF POSSE

SHARES William and Corinne Heiligbrodt have sold the majority of their shares in the successful first-crop stallion **Posse** (Silver Deputy--Raska, by Rahy) to Posse Partners LLC, a group headed by Barry Weisbord, also

the publisher of the *Thoroughbred Daily News*. "This is a business decision for us," the Heiligbrodts commented in a release. "Posse has been a wonderful success story, but our family continues to put racing first. We still own a percentage of Posse, which gives us ample breedings to support our program. We have a number of Posse yearlings and weanlings and rest assured, you will see our colors on Posse's offspring in the future." Posse is off to a fast start at stud, having produced six stakes

winners from his first crop, including GII Saratoga Special S. hero Kodiak Kowboy and GIII Sapling S. victor Lantana Mob. Posse, who stands at Dr. Tom Simon's Vinery, was previously owned by Heiligbrodt Racing Stable and Vinery. Vinery remains the largest shareholder.

STACKED IN HIS FAVOR

Tommy Stack needs no introduction to the racing world, having made himself a household name by steering Red Rum (GB) to his third and final success in Aintree's Grand National in 1977. Building on his glories in the saddle, the farmer's son from North Kerry has conquered several major prizes since taking out his trainer's licence in 1988, and he will try to add to that resume with **Alexander Tango (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) in Saturday's GI Garden City BC S. at Belmont Park.

Stack's big-race success started with the inaugural running of the Cartier Million at the Phoenix Park racecourse with Corwyn Bay (Ire) in his first season. His career was buoyed by the exploits of the talented Single Combat, Pirouette (Ire), Kostroma (Ire) and Runyon (Ire), but the stable's finest was Las Meninas (Ire), who beat Balanchine in the 1994 G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket.

Shortly after Tarascon (Ire) landed the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas in 1998, Stack suffered from a severe attack of meningitis, which claimed his hearing, but thankfully not his life. The subsequent years represented a quiet time in the top league for the stable, but that all changed this term, when Myboycharlie (Ire) broke through with an emphatic success in The Curragh's Anglesey S. in July. Purchased by Susan Magnier shortly after, he paid an instant dividend with a smooth success in Deauville's G1 Prix Morny.

The family's Thomastown Castle base is bristling with energy at present and Stack's son and assistant James, better known as "Fozzy," has entered the public sphere during recent months. He is readying himself for the traditionally hectic fall to come.

"The following few months will be busy," Fozzy Stack remarked. "I'll be at all the major yearling sales in an effort to try and restock for next year. The year isn't over yet and we still have a couple of nice juveniles to run. It is an exciting time and it's great to have a filly good enough to bring over to America to run in a big race like this."

The younger Stack's dynamism has coincided with the upturn in fortunes for the yard based in Golden, County Tipperary. Noel O'Callaghan's Alexander Tango, winner of the G3 Derrinstown Stud 1000 Guineas Trial and Listed Kilboy Estate S., is close to the best in Europe.

"Things have been going very well this year," he said. "Our attitude has always been, if you have the horse and if there are suitable races for them in different parts of the world, then it makes sense to travel."

"It is straightforward enough these days and the filly took the journey over very well. She has settled in and this race has been the plan for sometime. She has been very consistent and rarely runs a bad race. She has been progressing well all year and ran a fine race [when fourth] in the Irish 1000 Guineas."

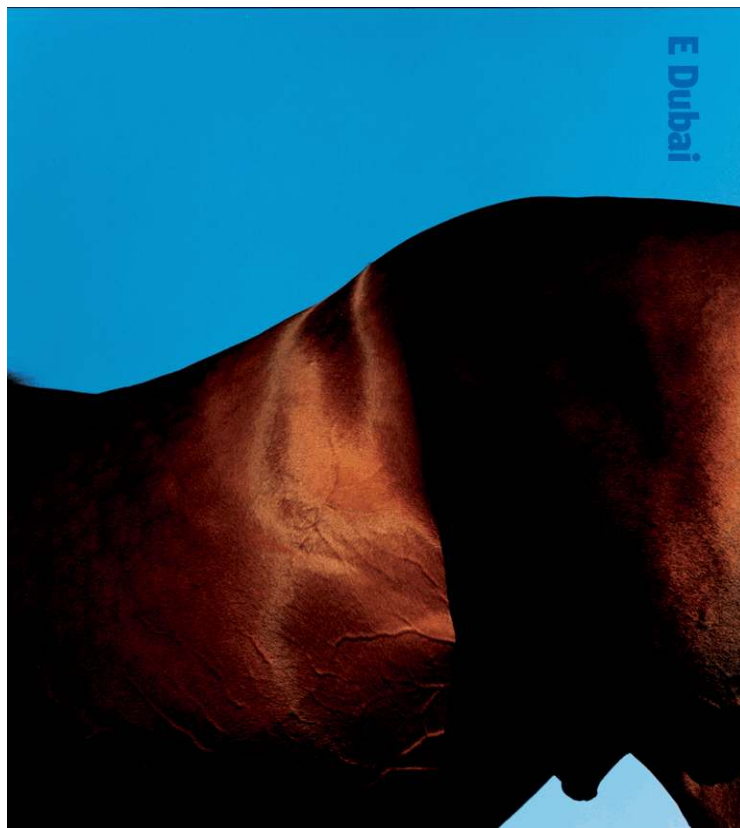

LAWMAN RETIRED TO BALLYLINCH Classic winner **Lawman (Fr)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}--Laramie, by Gulch) has been retired from racing and will enter stud next season at Ballylinch Stud in Ireland, according to Jour de Galop. Claudio Marzocco and Enrico Ciamp 's three-year-old, hero of this year's G1 Prix du Jockey-Club and G1 Prix Jean Prat, was a lackluster sixth to Manduro (Ger) in the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville Aug. 12 and was diagnosed with a liver ailment afterwards. Though Lawman had returned to training with Jean-Marie Beguigne, it was determined

that he had missed too much time and would not make the major autumn races. A €75,000 DEAAUG yearling, the bay colt is a half-brother to Lattice (Ire) (Inchior {GB}), the 2004 G1 Prix de Diane heroine who has placed in several U.S. graded events; and Satri (Ire) (Mujadil), a Group 3 winner and Group 1-placed. Winner of his lone juvenile outing at Saint-Cloud, Lawman burst to prominence in this third start this year with a victory in the G3 Prix de Guiche May 9. He added a famous front-running score under Frankie Dettori in the Prix du Jockey-Club June 3 and added a three-length tally in the Jean Prat with Olivier Peslier in the irons July 8. Ballylinch's John O'Connor had his eyes on the colt for quite some time. "This past winter, Jean-Marie Beguigne et Paul Nataf came to see me at Ballylinch in Ireland," O'Connor recalled. "Jean-Marie spoke to be about a two-year-old that was exceptional. That two-year-old was obviously Lawman, and that was when I decided to buy him." When asked what he liked about the colt, O'Connor replied, "Everything! His pedigree, his conformation, his speed, the distances that he has succeeded at." O'Connor stressed that while there had been "plenty of interest in him already" from English and Irish breeders, the son of 2006 leading European freshman sire Invincible Spirit would be available to French breeders. JAPAN'S HAT TRICK TO WALMAC Hat Trick (Jpn) (Sunday Silence--Tricky Code, by Lost Code), the champion miler in Japan in 2005, will enter stud at Walmac Farm in 2008. Bred by Oiwake Farm, he was purchased for ¥68 million (\$539,862) as a foal at the 2001 JRHA Select Sale. Winner in four of his five starts as a three-year-old, he blossomed in 2005, winning the G1 Mile Championship S. at Kyoto in a time of 1:32.10 and followed that effort with a 1 1/4-length victory in

the G1 Hong Kong Mile. He retires to the breeding shed with eight wins from 21 starts and earnings of \$3,122,708. "He is jet black, just like his dad, and was an incredible racehorse," said Walmac's Managing Director John T.L. Jones III. "As a potential progenitor he is a complete outcross to a super majority of the mare popula-

tion, his pedigree being free of Mr. Prospector and Northern Dancer and free of Native Dancer for five-plus generations." The only Group 1 or champion son of Sunday Silence to stand in the U.S., Hat Trick is owned in partnership by Walmac, Stonerside Farm, John Stuart (Bluegrass Thoroughbred Services), Jamie Lamonica (The Stallion Company), Andrew Rosen (Star Crown Stables) and Omar Trevino. A stud fee will be announced at a later date.

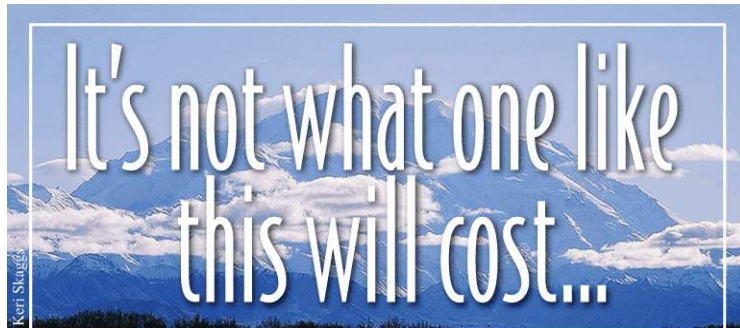
KAREN'S CAPER RETIRED Stonerside Stable's homebred **Karen's Cap** (War Chant--Miss Caerleona {Fr}, by Caerleon), a graded winner on both sides of the Atlantic, has been retired from racing to join her dam

and two half-sisters in the Stonerside broodmare band. Campaigned in England early in her career, the dark bay took the G3 Nell Gwyn S. in her sophomore debut before finishing a close fourth in the G1 1000 Guineas. Runner-up to Maids Causeway in the G1 Coronation S. at the Royal Meeting, she was repatriated in the fall of 2005 and missed by a nose to Sweet Talker in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup. She carried her

excellent form into 2006 when trained by Bobby Frankel, winning the GIII Noble Damsel Breeders' Cup H. prior to a nose defeat at the hands of Gorella (Fr) in the GII First Lady S. In one start this season, Karen's Cap was victorious in the GIII Eatontown S. at Monmouth Park. She retires with a record of 14-4-5-0 and earnings of \$622,136.

FORET PLAN FOR 'ART' Susan Roy and Cheveley Park Stud's **Dutch Art (GB)** (Medicean {GB}) will be aimed at the G1 Prix de la Foret after being scratched from tomorrow's G1 Haydock Sprint Cup. Cheveley Park Stud's Managing Director Chris Richardson confirmed yesterday that Longchamp's seven-furlong contest Oct. 6 would be the next port of call for last year's G1 Prix Morny and G1 Middle Park S. winner, who was runner-up in the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest on his latest start at Deauville Aug. 5. "We were hoping that the ground would be on the easy side at Haydock and although he ran a very brave and game race on quick ground at Deauville, he is just that much better if he can get his toe in," Richardson said. "The Foret looks the logical race for him and, hopefully, we can get all the pieces of the puzzle together and see him win a Group 1 this season."

CHARLIE SET FOR NATIONAL CLASH Susan Magnier's **Myboycharlie (Ire)** (Danetime {Ire}) was reported on course for next Sunday's G1 National S. at The Curragh. Trainer Tommy Stack's son and assistant Fozzy reported the G1 Prix Morny winner in fine fettle ahead of the seven-furlong contest, in which he is set to meet New Approach (Ire) and Rio de la Plata. "The plan for Myboycharlie is very much the National S. at The Curragh next weekend," Stack said. "We feel the better ground will hold no fears for him, and he is easily the best colt we've had. The horse is in great form, and we feel the extra furlong will be a help to him at the weekend."

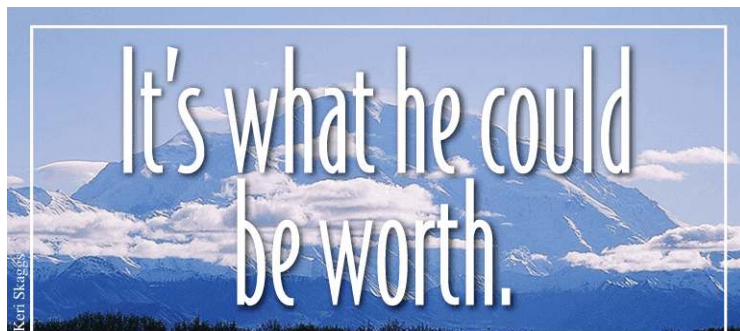

MONMOUTH BC PREPARATIONS ON TRACK
 Efforts began immediately following the close of the main Monmouth Park meeting to transform the track into a Breeders' Cup venue for the first time. The main project on the front side will be the installation of 25,000 temporary seats, plus tents, pari-mutuel facilities and concessions, on the grandstand and clubhouse aprons and in the picnic area which extends up the stretch. The Monmouth turf course is to be renovated for the four-day Breeders' Cup meeting. The course will be reseeded, top-dressed and aerated and then allowed to regenerate for a month. There also remains some work to be completed on the USDA quarantine barn, located in Barn 3 on the backside. Much of the work was completed by the beginning of the Monmouth meet in May, but some final improvements will be made, per USDA requirements.

"The barn has to be thoroughly cleaned and encapsulated," said Horace J. [Smitty] Smith, assistant vice president of operations for Monmouth Park. "New fences will be put up around the entire barn, and we'll build a separate horse path that leads from the rear of the barn to the racetrack."

AUSTRALIAN EQUINE INFLUENZA UPDATE

O'SHEA CALLING FOR VACCINATIONS Leading Randwick-based trainer John O'Shea came out swinging on Thursday as the EI virus continues to cause turmoil in both the harness and flat industries in New South Wales. "It is time we had mandatory vaccination now," O'Shea said. "There are four horses at Randwick who were vaccinated, and they are the only horses here that have not been affected by EI. And we have 700 horses at Randwick. The Department of Primary Industries has done a great job, but, saying that, they need to acknowledge that containment has not worked, and we now need vaccination. Everything has been crippled here, and we need to introduce this new measure. And, believe me, trainers here do not want to hear any more lies. We deal with the best liars in the business when we talk to jockeys, so the government can't pull the wool over our eyes any more." O'Shea added, "We know what we want and this has to be introduced to stop further mutating of this virus returning." Racing Victoria officials are still opposed to vaccination.

Across NSW, Minister for Primary Industries Ian Macdonald said in a press conference on Thursday in Sydney, "We now have 1,319 horses infected with Equine Influenza on 146 confirmed properties. And a total 3,376 horses are suspect on 405 properties." No horses in Victoria have contracted the virus as of yet. The bug has now spread to the harness racing industry and the first champion has been struck down. Black's A Fake, winner of two Interdominion Grand Finals and A\$2-million in purse money, has contracted the bug. He is trained by Bill Dixon, who has 48 horses under his care in Queensland.

The second highest price of the evening was a C\$160,000 bid for a colt from the first crop of Perfect Soul (Ire) out of the stakes winner Showering (Miswaki). Consigned by Glenn Sikura's Hill 'N' Dale Sales Agency, the colt was purchased by Canada Racing Partnership. The top filly in the sale was by Tiznow out of the Grade III stakes winner Flashy n Smart (Smarten). The bay yearling was purchased for C\$125,000 by Mike DePaulo, agent for partners Sniderman and Berg. A total of 159 yearlings were sold during the selected session, for an aggregate of C\$6,374,000. The average was C\$40,088 and the median rose to C\$32,000. "Our middle market was strong, and we were pleased to see the 18.5-percent increase in the median," said Julie Coulter, General Manager of the Canadian Thoroughbred Horse Society. "Considering the current economy and despite our attempts to grow our buyer base, the average was slightly down from last year." Banker's Jet Euthanized:

Banker's Jet, the 1987 winner of the A Phenomenon H. who was rescued by the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation after being found starving and near death a few years later, was euthanized July 23 at the age of 25. He resided at the Pleasant Valley, Connecticut, farm of Raymond Roy at the time of his death. After being retired in 1991, Banker's Jet, an eight-time stakes winner, ended up at a New York riding stable near Albany. When alerted to his dire condition, trainer Ron Gibson, then an employee of the TRF, was charged with rescuing Banker's Jet and was appalled by what he found. "He looked like he was coming out of Buchenwald," Gibson said. "I dropped over the fence to look at him and the mud pulled my boots off my feet. He had only a tub of water and it was funky. There was no sign of grain or hay and he was a cripple. I spotted a bale of hay about two paddocks over and I threw it in. He immediately started to eat. That's what kept him alive. He couldn't have weighed more than 600 or 650 pounds when I found him. I didn't know what to say. I told the people they should be ashamed of themselves, but they were a pretty rough looking bunch and I didn't want to get into a beef with them." First sent to the Walkill Correctional Facility in Walkill, New York, Banker's Jet was later transferred to Roy's farm and the two became fast friends. "Banker's Jet was my buddy for 14 years," Roy said. "He taught me much about horses and horse racing. Jet was always the suspicious one; humans were not to be trusted. It took several years and some bumps and bruises, but I finally became Jet's one trusted human friend. He, of course, was not able to comprehend how much that meant to me."

Magna to Sell Thistledown, Portland Meadows:

Officials at Magna Entertainment Corporation have announced their intent to sell off Thistledown Race Course near Cleveland, Ohio, and Portland Meadows in Oregon. "Although Magna remains strongly committed to the racing industry, the fact remains that Thistledown and Portland Meadows are confronted with very difficult operational and regulatory challenges," said MEC Chairman and interim CEO Frank Stronach. "Furthermore, MEC is very much committed to continuing to sell assets and to strengthening its balance sheet. This has led to MEC's decision to immediately pursue the sale of these unprofitable racetracks." Since acquiring Thistledown in 1999, MEC has unsuccessfully lobbied for alternative gaming. MEC began operating Portland Meadows in 2001 and did obtain a ruling from the Oregon Racing Commission to allow for the installation of "Instant Racing" machines at the track. However, in June of 2007, that ruling was struck down.

DANETIME COLT TOPS FINALE The sons and daughters of Danetime (Ire) are in demand at present, and it was a colt by the late Tally-Ho-based sire who topped the final session of Tattersalls Ireland's September Yearling Sale yesterday. Forming part of the Gary Swift Sales consignment, hip 650 is from the family of the 1991 GI Breeders' Cup Mile winner Opening Verse and 2003 G1 St James's Palace S. hero Zafeen (Fr). He was knocked down to Willie Browne for €110,000. "He might have been a bit expensive for a breeze-up horse, but the sire has been good to me," said Browne, owner of Mocklershill Stables. "Unfortunately, they don't make them any more and he would probably have made just as much had he been in Doncaster last week. He's a very athletic-looking colt, and looks like he'll be able to gallop." Earlier, Aidan Kennedy paid €80,000 for JK Thoroughbreds' hip 571, a colt by freshman Elusive City (Elusive Quality) out of a half-sister to the listed winner The Bower (Ire) descending from the top-class producer Arachne. "He's been bought for a couple of people in Tipperary and we'll take him home and see what happens, but he will probably go into training in England," Kennedy said. "He's a very nice colt." Top-priced filly honors went to hip 580, a daughter of Daylami (Ire) from the Limerick-based Islanmore Stud. Agent Bobby O'Ryan paid €70,000 for the half-sister to the Cheltenham Festival bumper runner-up Sophocles (GB) and ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ Screen Star (Ire), an impressive 11-length winner on debut at Redcar last month. "She's been bought on behalf of James Leavy, who trains Sophocles," O'Ryan explained. "She's a nice filly, and her two-year-old half-sister looks like she could be a very good filly."

By the Numbers...

Trade on the final day witnessed another downturn on 2006, with the session average of €12,714 down by 16 percent and the €9,000 median dropping by 18 percent. Overall, the average of €18,984 fell by 15 percent and the median of €13,000 was down by 19 percent on last year. Tattersalls Ireland's recently appointed Managing Director George Mernagh was not downcast afterwards. "The difference in the trading between yesterday and today is noticeably improved, and we can only put this down to a better type of yearling, judging by comments from both vendors and purchasers," Mernagh commented. "It really does underline the fact that there is plenty of demand for athletes, but that with the number of yearlings, buyers are less willing to take a chance on horses falling short in conformation or pedigree. It wouldn't be beneficial to point any fingers at this stage for those reasons, but I do think there are a number of contributing factors. There were plenty of buyers here, from Italy in particular, as well as Spain and Greece, and also a large number of purchasers from England, who as a group bought nearly half the horses sold. It is the first time in many years that this sale has not shown an increase on the previous year, which, of course, is disappointing to us as we would have like to maintained this growth. However, it is worth bearing in mind that last year's sale was a bumper year, and our figures this year are still very favourable when compared to 2005. I will be reviewing the sale's format internally and within the industry. We will also have to see how it falls within the context of the rest of the yearling sales this autumn and what market trends develop." Full results are available on www.tattersalls.ie.

TIROL DIES IN INDIA Classic winner **Tirol (Ire)** (Thatching {Ire}--Alpine Niece {GB}, by Great Nephew {GB}) died from colic at Capricorn Stud Farm in India, according to *Racing Post*. The 20-year-old stallion had resided there since 1997. A 52,000gns yearling purchase, Tirol won two of four starts as a juvenile in 1989, including the G3 Horris Hill S. He kicked off his sophomore season with a score in the G3 Craven S. and doubled up in the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket and G1 Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh. Third to Saumarez (GB) in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris, the Richard Hannon trainee was off the board in his career finale, the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot in September. "Obviously he was one of the best horses that we've ever had here," Hannon told the *Post*. "We always held him in high regard, as he was a good, sound horse to have anything to do with, and had a very good turn of foot. When you win a Guineas, you obviously have a lovely day, and then he went to Ireland and won there. We could do with a few more like him." Tirol retired to Coolmore Stud in 1991 and sired a pair of highweighted juvenile fillies, Miss Tahiti (Ire) and Tarascon (Ire). The latter also captured the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas in 1998, but Tirol was already standing in India by then, and was represented by a number of good performers on the sub-continent. In all, Tirol sired 18 individual stakes winners and 47 stakes-placed runners from 12 crops of racing age.
