

**INDIAN RIDGE COLT TOPS FINAL SESSION**

The Goffs Million Sale concluded yesterday with a son of Indian Ridge (Ire) topping proceedings when selling to Charlie Gordon-Watson for €600,000. That agent set the pace early with the purchase of Airlie Stud's hip 414, the fourth foal of the 2001 G3 Doncaster Cup heroine Alleluia (GB) (Caerleon). She is also the dam of this year's G2 Goodwood Cup and G2 Henry II S. winner Allegretto (Ire), and like that talented stayer, the chestnut yearling from the family responsible for Tuesday's €2.4-million top-per will enter training at Freemason Lodge. "He will be going into training with Sir Michael Stoute, and the owner Saeed Suhail has already had a very good horse by Indian Ridge in Imperial Stride)," Gordon-Watson explained after outlasting Denis Sheehy. "Unfortunately, Indian Ridge is dead, and this horse comes from the same family as last night's sales topper, so it all adds up." In the thick of the action again later, Gordon-Watson snapped up the second-highest priced yearling of the session at €550,000. Consigned by Paul Shanahan's Ashtown House Stud--the sale's leading vendor--hip 514 is a Galileo (Ire) colt out of the Norwegian listed scorer Corrine (Ire) (Spectrum {Ire}), whose second dam is a sister to Bellypha (Ire). "He's a good-moving sort by the sire of the moment--of that there can be no doubt," Gordon-Watson said. "He'll be staying in Ireland to be trained." **Cont. p2**

**CASTLETON LYONS FOUNDER RYAN DIES**

After a lengthy battle with pancreatic cancer, Castleton Lyons founder and Chairman Dr. Tony A. Ryan died yesterday at Lyons Demesne, Celbridge in County Kildare. He was 71. "We are proud of Tony's many achievements of his spirit of entrepreneurship which created enterprise and opportunity for many people in this country and abroad and, most especially, we are proud to have been his loving and loved family," the Ryan family said in a statement. Ryan, who founded Guinness Peat Aviation in 1975, was a co-founder of Ryanair, and was involved in the French art and wine trade before venturing into Thoroughbred racing. After securing Group 1 winner Catchascatchcan (GB) for \$4.7 million at Keeneland November in 2000, Ryan purchased 1,070 acres Castleton Stud in Lexington in October 2001 and renamed it Castleton Lyons, after his estate in Ireland. Following extensive renovations in 2004, Castleton Lyons reopened as a stallion operation. It currently stands Action This Day, Bernstein, Malibu Moon, Sir Shackleton, Toccet and Wiseman's Ferry. "That amazing energy is what many of us at Castleton Lyons will remember, and we regret that he was not able to see Castleton Lyons-sired two-year-olds run next year, especially by his beloved Bernstein, a hope of his that sadly was not to be," the farm statement continued. "He will be cheering from above, and wishing success for all in his beloved Kentucky home." A private funeral service and burial will be held at Lyons Demesne. Details of a memorial service, which will be held in the upcoming weeks, will be released once a date has been set.

**Revisiting the Past...**

Jim Bolger's love affair with this sale saw him give €435,000 for a son of Galileo (Ire) Monday, and he will take home a clutch of potential stars to fill the void left by Teofilo (Ire). Among them will be the son of Giant's Causeway Bolger paid €340,000 for yesterday. From Sonia Rogers' Airlie consignment, hip 530 has firm roots in Coolcullen tradition, as Bolger bred and trained the talented dam Daneleta (Ire) (Danehill) and her 2004 G3 Noblesse S.-winning sister Danelissima (Ire), and also handled the granddam Zavaleta (Ire). Further back, the dynasty of La Meilleure (Ire)--due to be represented in Sunday's Arc by the G1 Irish Derby hero Soldier of Fortune (Ire)--is all his making. Like Bolger, Dermot Weld has spent the week restocking his yard, and snapped up a couple of notables yesterday, beginning with a son of Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) from the consignment of Mark Dwyer's Oaks Farm Stables. Hip 509 is out of Claxton's Slew, a stakes winner for Weld and subsequent dam of Allen Paulson's champion and 1998 GI BC Distaff winner Escena and of GSW winner Humbel. Weld, who saddled the latter, was not to be denied for his half-brother and saw off his challengers with a bid of €255,000. "He's a grand colt," Weld said. "It's a family I know well, as I trained his dam and his half-brother, both of whom were very smart horses." Weld also paid €230,000 for Carriganog Stud's hip 606, a Sadler's Wells daughter of an unraced sister to Rock of Gibraltar (Ire).



**That Man Again...**

Demi O'Byrne dominated proceedings over the first two days. His relentless shopping spree continued yesterday, highlighted by a pair of colts by Montjeu (Ire). The first was hip 518, a half-brother to Intikhab (Ire) whose page includes Polish Precedent and Zilzal. Offered by Timmy Hyde's Camas Park Stud, the May-foaled colt out of Crafty Example (Crafty Prospector) commanded a final bid of €450,000. "He is just a very nice horse by a top sire, and he is a half brother to a very good racehorse who was the champion of his year," O'Byrne commented. Eight lots later, it was O'Byrne's name on the docket again, paying €370,000 for another son of the Coolmore sensation. From the draft of Eddie Irwin's Marlhill House Stud, the March-foaled bay out of Dance Desire (Ire) is from the family of 2005 Grade I scorers Prince Arch and GI Garden City Breeders' Cup H. heroine Luas Line (Ire). Earlier, O'Byrne snapped up a colt by first-season sire Hawk Wing from the draft of Willie Browne's Meadowlands Stud. Hip 435, who is a half-brother to the dual listed winner Crosspeace (Ire), was knocked down to this sale's top buyer for €350,000.

**Knight Sightings...**

Sir Mark Prescott, who has been making some eye-catching purchases this week, went to €300,000 for a son of Montjeu (Ire) from the Moyglare Stud draft. Hip 544 is a son of the listed winner Desert Ease (Ire) (Green Desert) from the extended family of Trusted Partner. Japanese interests had been relatively quiet until yesterday, when Big Red Farm purchased a Montjeu colt from the draft of Eimear Mulhern's Abbeville and Meadow Court Studs.

Hip 499--out of Cheal Rose (Ire)--who is a half brother to the 2005 G1 National S. runner-up Golden Arrow (Ire), whose pedigree includes the 2005 GSW winner Chattahoochee War. The colt was secured with a bid of €300,000. Montjeu was also responsible for the top-priced filly in a session dominated by colts. Kerri Radcliffe Bloodstock paid €260,000 for hip 475, who is out of Bonheur (Ire) (Royal Academy). The filly is a half-sister to this year's Goffs Million third Carribean Sunset (Ire). David Nagle's Barronstown Stud consigned the filly, who hails from the family of the German champion Quebrada (Ire) and the 2001 G1 Preis der Diana winner Silvester Lady (GB). Shadwell capped a relatively quiet three days by their standards when purchasing hip 424, a daughter of freshman Monsieur Bond (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) from Denis Brosnan's Croom House Stud. Out Amazed (GB)--a sister to the multiple stakes-winning sprinter Bishop's Court (GB)--who has already produced the dual listed scorer Dazed and Amazed (GB). She was knocked down to Stephen Collins for €240,000. "She's a sharp, well-made good-looking sort," Collins said. "She comes from a good, tough and fast family, and looks the type to make up into a sharp two-year-old."

**'SHIFT' PRIMED FOR OPERA TILT** The Niarchos family's **Light Shift** (Kingmambo) pleased connections yesterday with a final spin ahead of Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Opera de Longchamp. Trainer Henry Cecil was on hand to oversee the G1 Epsom Oaks winner's workout as she prepares for the 10-furlong contest. "Light Shift is extremely well and I am delighted with her," he commented. "She is expected to run up to her best in the Prix de l'Opera on Arc day." Among the 12 remaining fillies at yesterday's forfeit stage were Michael Ryan's G1 English and Irish 1000 Guineas heroine **Finsceal Beo (Ire)** (Mr. Greeley), and Steven Lamprell's **Satwa Queen (Fr)** (Muhtathir {GB}). The latter, runner-up 12 months ago, warmed up for a repeat bid when taking Deauville's G2 Prix Jean Romanet last time Aug. 19. Also in the entries are the German fillies **Mystic Lips (Ger)** (Generous {Ire}) and **Dominante (Ger)** (Monsun {Ger}). They were first and second, respectively, in the June 3 G1 Preis der Diana at Dusseldorf, and Dominante represents Andreas Wohler. He told *PA Sport*, "She's gotten stronger over the season, and that's always a good sign when they do that and improve."

**PUSSYCAT DOLL TO FASIG NOVEMBER** **Pussycat Doll** (Real Quiet), a three-time Grade I winner of \$750,832, will go under the hammer at Fasig-Tipton's Kentucky November Mixed Sale Nov. 4. She will be consigned by Hill 'n' Dale Sales. Racing in the colors of Mike Pegram, the \$100,000 KESEP graduate annexed the 2005 G1 La Brea S., the 2006 G1 Humana Distaff H. and this term's G1 Santa Monica H. **NICHOLLS TRIO SET FOR ABBAYE** David Nicholls is set to saddle three contenders for Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp, he said yesterday. Successful with Continent (GB) in 2002, the Northern-based conditioner will run Lady O'Reilly's duo of **Moss Vale (Ire)** (Shinko Forest {Ire}) and **Peace Offering (Ire)** (Victory Note) as well as **Strike up the Band (GB)** (Cyrano de Bergerac {Ire}) in the five-furlong contest. Last year's winner **Desert Lord (GB)** (Green Desert) headed a remaining entry of 23 yesterday. "We've got Moss Vale, Strike up the Band and Peace Offering going for the Abbaye, providing they all get in," Nicholls confirmed. "The going over there is soft at the moment, so they'll all appreciate that."

**GETAWAY SUPPLEMENTED FOR ARC** Baron Georg von Ullmann's **Getaway (Ger)** (Monsun {Ger}) will be supplemented for Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, for which 14 remained at the last forfeit stage yesterday. Runner-up in the G3 Prix Gladiateur at Longchamp last time Sept. 16, the four-year-old homebred will be the sole representative of the Andre Fabre stable after the injury to Manduro (Ger) two weeks ago. "It's his first crack at a Group 1, but Mr. Fabre has always insisted that one day he would bring him back to a mile and a half and a Group 1," the owner/breeder's Racing Manager Paul Harley told *PA Sport*. "He always said he had the class and ability to take his chance in such a race. You have to respect everything Mr. Fabre does." With only the G1 Deutsches Derby third **Anton Chekhov (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) defecting yesterday, a maximum field of 15 is set to line up, including the pick of seven remaining entries from Ballydoyle.

After the heartbreak of watching Sulamani (Ire) go so close five years ago, the man from the chic Parisian suburb of Neuilly, close to the Bois de Boulogne, is hoping that his turn has come.

In the homebred Zambezi Sun, Bary has the material. Considered unlucky when fourth in the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club in June, the colt was the impressive five-length winner of the G1 Grand Prix de Paris the next month before finishing third in the Arc's traditional warm-up, the G2 Prix Niel last month.

"He is a late-maturing horse, who could not run at two and has not stopped improving with each race since his debut in April," Bary explained. "In the French Derby, he had a bad draw and the trip was too short, but he was really flying in the straight, and he confirmed that he was very smart next time in the Grand Prix de Paris. He had a troubled preparation for the Prix Niel, having a foot abscess at the end of August, and I could not work him as much as I wished for that reintroduction." *Cont. p7*

“He was short of work and blew quite hard afterwards, so I consider his third-place finish, in a race run in record time, to be excellent,” said Bary. “He seems to have come on a lot for the run and now I could not be more pleased with his build-up to The Arc.”

For Bary, racing’s call came early, and the local riding school provided his focus as his father Louis Charles Bary undertook his role as the vice mayor of Neuilly (he was appointed the mayor seven years ago). After a one-year stint in the Army in the famous Fontainebleau riding squad, Bary assisted the renowned Sir Mark Prescott in Newmarket, a larger-than-life disciplinarian with a wicked sense of humor.

“He is a man with a true gift to train horses,” Bary said. “A lovely personality who was very strict at work, but also very human.”

Back in his native land in the mid-seventies, he was hired as assistant to the great Francois Boutin and stayed for four years.

“He is the man who taught me almost everything and he had a great personality,” Bary says. “He was a brilliant trainer and the most lovely person to be around. He not only taught me about horses, but also about life and he was a very generous and great human being. When I have a doubt about a horse or if I don’t know what to do, I always try to think of what Francois would have done.

“Through him, I was also lucky enough to meet the Niarchos family, Lady Chryss O’Reilly and, when [Boutin] passed away, Prince Khalid Abdullah trusted me to train the horses that Francois had under his care,” Bary added. “So Francois is always present in my mind.”

After the apprenticeships came the hard reality of training under his own license, which was granted in 1981. Twenty-six years on, he has an astounding five Prix du Jockey-Clubs and three Breeders’ Cup races in the locker, and has become renowned for handling the recent great fillies Six Perfections (Fr) and Divine Proportions. As all trainers will admit, the loyal patrons are the source of all success, and there is a common ethos between them.

“I am lucky enough to train for some great clients like Jean-Louis Bouchard, the Niarchos family, Miss O’Reilly and Prince Khalid,” Bary said. “Working for them is a dream come true--their organizations are so well managed and they send you top-class yearlings every year. You never feel any pressure and they trust you 100 percent. Everything is done in respect of the horses and this is what I love. A racehorse is a most respectable animal and most of the time the horse will give you everything he has, with his heart and his courage. You have to respect that, and if you do, then you will harvest the results.” *Cont. p8*

Of the great moments, Bary adds, "Winning five French Derbies is certainly a feat and although not all of them were of the same caliber, I still have my name written five times in the record books. I loved Deep Roots (Ire), as he was my first ever Group 1 winner in only my second season as a trainer; and Highest Honor (Fr), as he had a lovely personality and he proved to be a top sire. To have trained such champions as Six Perfections, Divine Proportions and Sulamani was just great. Winning three Breeders' Cup races with Miss Alleged, Six Perfections and Domedriver were also great moments, as was winning the G1 Irish Derby with Dream Well (Fr). I dream of winning a Group 1 race in England, and I thought Six Perfections was the right filly to achieve it in the 1000 Guineas. It was a great disappointment that she got beat, but a trainer's career is about highs and lows and you can't win everything."

Despite his major-race haul, the Arc remains the glaring omission, and Bary makes no secret of his desire to capture the pinnacle event.

"I dream of winning the Arc, which in my opinion is the greatest race in the world," he said. "All European trainers dream to win it and I am no exception--even the Japanese think that it is the race to win. I am convinced that Sulamani was the best horse in the race when he finished second to Marienbard--it was a terrible disappointment, but you have to try again and I am still young enough to have other shots at the race. Winning the Arc has to be the peak of the career for any trainer."

Zambezi Sun is the latest top-flight product of Khalid Abdullah's incredible operation and Bary's enthusiasm for the subject rings out.

"The first time I met Prince Khalid, I was very impressed and shy and I could hardly talk to him," he explains. "He is a lovely person and his class has to impress anyone that meets him. Juddmonte Farms is one of the best breeding operations in the world and this is all his work. You have to be impressed with what he has achieved and to train for him is a pleasure."

"He trusts your training and your decisions and, although I only talk to him when I see him at the races, he knows everything that is going on through his manager Teddy Grimthorpe, who is also a great person to work with. When Prince Khalid asks you something about a horse, he always asks you the right question. Winning the Grand Prix de Paris for him with Zambezi Sun meant a lot to me, as it was the first Group 1 winner I had for him in 13 years, although Price Tag (GB) won the Poule d'Essai des Pouliches last year before losing the race in the stewards' room."

And for relaxation? Just simple quality time with family and friends around a good dinner and bottle of Bordeaux, of which he is a connoisseur. Come Sunday evening, the wine could be flowing chez Bary.

**Senate Moves Closer to Farm Bill Markup**

Senators Max Baucus and Tom Harkin, chairs of the Senate  
 Finance and Agriculture committees, respectively, are expected  
 to lead committee markups of portions of the Farm Bill today.  
 A key provision in Harkin’s section of the bill is expansion of the  
 Conservation Security Program, which provides aid to farmers  
 for using certain conservation and environmental management  
 techniques on land used to produce crops or livestock. The  
 program currently has 14 million acres enrolled. Harkin hopes to  
 expand the program to 80 million acres by 2012. Harkin also is  
 seeking more funds for specialty crops and rural development.  
 Baucus’ focus is on securing adequate funding for weather-  
 related farm disaster relief programs.

The Farm Bill is one of several prospective vehicles for the  
**Equine Equity Act**, a tax provision that would reduce the capital  
 gains holding period for horses from two years to one and  
 standardize depreciation for racehorses.

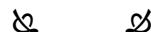
