TATTERSALLS OCTOBER GETS UNDERWAY

Officials at Tattersalls are hopeful of lively trade at Part 1 of the October Yearling Sale, which begins at 11:30 a.m. in Newmarket, England today. There are 733 lots catalogued over the four days of Europe's

premier yearling sale, compared to 652 in 2006, and representatives of all the major buyers were inspecting yearlings at the company's Park Paddocks venue yesterday. Like Goffs, Tattersalls has a "Milion" series of sales races to entice buyers, with a total of

£2.2 million in prize money on offer to purchasers. Another incentive to buy is the strong offering. "Everybody has commented on what a good catalogue it is," said the company's Marketing Director Jimmy George. "A feature is that there is something for everyone at all levels this week--that is the message we are really trying to get across. The numbers reflect that; it is not intended to be a super-super select sale. We have been very busy over the past couple of days at the sales paddocks with potential buyers from throughout Europe, Australia, Hong Kong, Japan and Australia." Added agent Charlie Gordon-Watson, "There are three or four who could make considerable money, but across the board they are a very consistent group of horses." Peter Molony of Co Limerick-based Rathmore Stud has enjoyed a good sales' season so far, and he believes it can keep going at Newmarket. "We've been very busy and would be satisfied with the numbers of viewers," said Molony. "We had a great sale at Goffs last week and at Doncaster before that, but I think it will be the old story here that the middle-to-top will be strong, but if they don't make the list you will struggle. JOHN HENRY EUTHANIZED

John Henry (Ole Bob Bowers--Once Double, by Double Jay) was humanely euthanized at the Kentucky Horse Park in Lexington Monday. He was 32. John

Henry will be buried near his paddock at the Hall of Champions alongside Thoroughbred champions Man o' War, War Admiral, Forego, Bold Forbes, Allez France, Peteski and Jay Trump. "After continued successful efforts to maintain the quality of John Henry's life, he did not respond to our medical intervention," said the Kentucky Horse Park's Equine Director, Kathy Hopkins. "Due to

the loss of kidney function and muscle mass, his veterinarian, Dr. Mike Beyer, found it impossible to keep him properly hydrated and comfortable. Over the years, our goal has always been to maintain the highest quality of care and life for him, and it became evident over the weekend that this was no longer possible." Through eight seasons on the track, John Henry won 39 of 83 career starts, including 30 stakes--16 of which were at the Grade 1 level--and amassed \$6,591,860 in earnings. During that time, he collected seven Eclipse Awards, including two Horse of the Year titles in 1981 and 1984. He equaled a world track record for 1 1/2 miles in 2:23 at Santa Anita and is the only horse to be crowned Horse of the Year in non-consecutive years, and the oldest horse ever to win that title--at age nine. John Henry was voted 'Racehorse of the Decade' for the 1980s, and was inducted into Racing's Hall of Fame in 1990. "John meant the world to my family and me," said Chris McCarron, who rode John Henry in his final 14 career races. "Everywhere he raced, his presence doubled the size of a normal race track crowd. He did so much for racing, even after he retired, that he will be impossible to replace. He will be sorely missed, but will remain forever in our hearts." A public memorial service will be held and will be announced by the park upon completion of the arrangements, which will be posted at www.kyhorsepark.com.

Glatissant, who was successful in the 1993 G3 Prestige S., is a half to the 2001 G1 Yorkshire Oaks third Rockerlong (GB), from the Oppenheimer family of Superstar Leo (Ire) and this year's G1 St Leger runner-up Mahler (GB).

Lady Lloyd-Webber's nursery consign this February-foaled colt, who is a half-brother to the sire Majorien (GB) and the 2000 G2 Prix de Malleret winner America (Ire), herself dam of this year's G2 Prix Noailles third Spycrawler.

By the sire of this year's G3 Princess Margaret S. winner Visit (GB) and a clutch of smart and speedy juveniles, this April-foaled colt is a half-brother to last year's G1 Criterium International scorer Mount Nelson (GB). The Ballydoyle runner has not yet reached the track this term, but is still highly regarded by his connections. This colt also hails from the Cliveden family of Reference Point (GB).

Despite losing his champion sire status, Sadler's Wells is still in a league of his own, and this year's G1 Fillies' Mile winner Listen (Ire) is the latest reminder of his importance. The graded stakes-placed dam is a half to the remarkable Russian Rhythm, winner of the G1 1000 Guineas, G1 Coronation S. and G1 Nassau S. in 2003 before beating the colts in the following year's G1 Lockinge S., and to the 2004 G2 Royal Lodge S. winner Perfectperformance. Further back, this excellent pedigree boasts the sires Cape Cross (Ire), Iffraaj (GB), Diktat (GB), Dumaani, Fath and Bin Ajwaad (Ire), and the 1991 G1 1000 Guineas heroine Shadayid.

Hip 116, c, Cape Cross (Ire)--Laramie, by Gulch

One of the picks of the first session, this March-foaled colt is the latest progeny of Laramie, who keeps churning out top-class runners. After Latice (Ire), who was the heroine of the 2004 G1 Prix de Diane, came last year's G3 Prix du Palais-Royal winner and G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest runner-up Satri (Ire), but Lawman (Fr) put the icing on the cake this term when capturing the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club and G1 Prix Jean Prat.

Monsun's fortunes continue to spiral upwards, and this is the sole colt by Gestut Schlenderhan's resident in the catalogue. He is a full-brother to this year's G3 Grand Prix Aufgalopp runner-up Lauro (Ger), out of a half to the outstanding champion Lando (Ger) and 1994 G1 Deutsches Derby winner Laroche (Ger).

This is the famed cross responsible for High Chaparral (Ire), Islington (Ire), Milan (GB) and this year's G2 Beresford S. winner Curtain Call (Fr), among countless others.

DREAMING OF ANNA READIES FOR CUP

Frank Calabrese's **Dreaming of Anna** (Rahy) has completed her final major work ahead of a start in Saturday's G1 Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup S. at Keeneland. Last year's champion two-year-old filly covered five furlongs in 1:02 over Keeneland's Polytrack Sunday. In her previous work, the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies heroine turned in a 1:00.60 move at Keeneland Sept. 29. "She is doing just super this morning," said trainer Wayne Catalano Monday. "She is just that far from being unbeaten on the grass." Catalano was referring to the filly's record of five wins from six starts on the turf. The chestnut was beaten a half length in the Gaily Gaily S. at Gulfstream in February. "She has held her form for two years," Catalano added. "A lot of two-year-olds are not that good at three. They don't make the step up, but she did."

What They're Saying At The Sales...

Bloodstock Agent Charlie Gordon-Watson:

"It will be very interesting to see how the market goes. Goffs was strong, but there is always a lot of Irish money that helps the market there, and the most significant fact will be what effect the increased spending by Europeans at Keeneland will have here. Another concern is the prize money in Britain. Even the very rich sporting owners are becoming more aware of how bad it is. The saving grace is that horses racing here have a very high residual value for resale because we have the best racing in the world."

PRIX DE L'ARC DE TRIOMPHE

YOUMZAIN BACK NEXT YEAR Connections of Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe runner-up **Youmzain (Ire)** (Sinndar {Ire}) have pledged to keep the four-year-old in training in 2008. Jaber Abdullah's colt was beaten just a head at Longchamp, and the owner's Racing Manager Bruce Raymond is looking forward to next season. "The winner picked up so quick and that is where he won the race," Raymond told *PA Sport*. "He just lacks a touch of quickening class. He does quicken, but it is not instant. When he gets decent ground and a good strong pace he is a very good horse. [Trainer] Mick [Channon] deserves a lot of credit, because he has been on the go since Dubai in March, but I would think that will be it for the season. The Breeders' Cup hasn't been mentioned. With the likes of Dylan Thomas and Authorized gone for next year, the new horses will now be thinking about beating Youmzain, as he is obviously getting stronger."

☆ NEWS TODAY ☆

"ROI" TO RACE AT FOUR Jaber Abdullah's G1 Sun Chariot S. winner **Majestic Roi** (Street Cry {Ire}) is likely to stay in training as a four-year-old, connections announced yesterday. After her career-best defeat of Nannina (GB) in Saturday's mile contest at Newmarket, the Mick Channon-trained sophomore is set to follow the major fillies' and mares' program in 2008. "She deserved it, as she has been competing with the best and just finishing behind them," the owner's Racing Manager Bruce Raymond told *PA Sport*. "I would like to think she will stay in training, as I don't think she has reached her full potential. It wasn't a fluke on Saturday and, as she won't be competing against the same fillies next year, another generation are going to have to prove they are as good as her."

LIGHT TO SHINE ON? The Niarchos Family's G1 Epsom Oaks heroine **Light Shift** (Kingmambo) is set to race on at four, connections revealed yesterday. Excusing her sixth placing in Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Opera at Longchamp, Racing Manager Alan Cooper pointed to the fact that the Henry Cecil-trained homebred had endured a long campaign and may have been past her best. "Light Shift was in very good form and appeared to be at the top of her game, but sometimes in a race you find out that it's one race too many," Cooper told *PA Sport*. "She'd had a very early start to the season to be right for Epsom and it's been a long year, so we'll put her away now. I think it's most likely that she will be in training next year, but we'll let her get home and settle in and see what Henry is recommending."

NOBIZ LIKE SHOBIZ TO BC MILE? **Nobiz Like Shobiz** (Albert the Great), winner of Saturday's GII Jamaica H. at Belmont, is now being considered for the GI Breeders' Cup Mile at Monmouth. A start in the Nov. 25 GI Hollywood Derby had been all but etched in stone, but trainer Barclay Tagg said Sunday that there is a slight chance that Elizabeth Valando's three-year-old might contest the Mile. "The problem with running in the Mile is that even if he wins, he won't get the accolades he deserves," said Tagg, explaining his dilemma. "English Channel or whoever wins the Turf will probably be turf champion and he's not going to be three-year-old champion, so what does he really have to gain by running in the Mile?"

VACARE UNLIKELY FOR BREEDERS' CUP Trainer Christophe Clement said yesterday that GII First Lady S. winner **Vacare** (Lear Fan) is likely to skip the Breeders' Cup, and instead head to California for her next start. "She came out of her race in good order," Clement said. "I now have to talk things over with the owners. It will either be the Breeders' Cup or the Matriarch at Hollywood Park [GI, Nov. 25]. The Matriarch is more likely. That gives us more time between races, it is run at a better distance for her and the ground may be better for her. We will make a decision this week." The GI BC F/M Turf is contested at 11 furlongs, while the Matriarch will be run at a flat mile this year. Vacare, six-for-eight lifetime, is two-for-two at a mile, but has never raced beyond 1 1/8 miles.

Stick around in the racing world for long enough and you'll see just about everything, ranging from the most heart-warming stories to moments of great sadness and disbelief. We saw an end of the spectrum last Sunday, when Kieren Fallon triumphed in the Arc just a day before he stands trial on charges of conspiracy to defraud. At the other extreme, the G1 Sun Chariot S. reminded me that virtually anything is possible, such as the kidnapping of star racehorses.

Examples I can think of include Shergar in Ireland, Carnauba in Italy and Fanfreluche in the USA. While the Shergar story ended tragically, there was a much happier outcome to the other incidents.

You probably won't remember the Fanfreluche case, unless you are old enough to audition for something like The Golden Girls. The bare facts were that this Northern Dancer mare--the champion three-year-old filly of 1970--was stolen from her paddock on June 25, 1977. It wasn't until December that the FBI discovered the mare in Tompkinsville, Kentucky, on a farm belonging to a Larry McPherson. According to McPherson, a neighbor had found the mare loose on the road and McPherson looked after the mare until someone claimed her. In the meantime, he had reportedly used the mare as a trail-riding mount! Fanfreluche's exertions apparently hadn't harmed her and she was still carrying her foal by Secretariat--a colt given the appropriate name of Sain Et Sauf (Safe and Sound).

One thing's for sure, whoever took Fanfreluche had excellent taste. At the time of her disappearance, Fanfreluche had had five foals, four of which became stakes winners. Three had run, with her Buckpasser colt L'Enjoleur winning two legs of the Canadian Triple Crown, her Le Fabuleux filly L'Extravagante finishing third in the Canadian Oaks and her Sir Ivor filly Grand Luxe winning the Fury S.

Her achievements continued to grow over the subsequent 30 years and her descendants continue to shine, to the extent that they have enjoyed Group 1 success on the first weekend in October in each of the last two years. The first to do so was Fanfreluche's grandson Holy Roman Emperor, who impressed in the Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere, and the second was her great-grand daughter Majestic Roi, who sprang a 16-1 surprise against some of Britain's best distaffers in the Sun Chariot. As if that weren't enough, Fanfreluche's great-grandson Flying Spur (a grandson of Grand Luxe) became champion sire in Australia during the 2006-'07 season, when his nearest challenger was Encosta de Lago, a great-great-grandson of none other than Fanfreluche.

It is worth pointing out that Holy Roman Emperor would not have existed had Fanfreluche not been recovered safely, as his dam L'On Vite wasn't born until 1986. L'On Vite's brother D'Accord, winner of the GII Breeders' Futurity, was also among the 13 foals produced by Fanfreluche after she was restored to her owners. Only five of these foals were fillies, but three of them produced stakes winners.

Majestic Roi's emergence as a Group 1 winner must provide all potential buyers at this week's October Yearling Sale Part 1 with hope that there will be plenty of bargains among 700-odd yearlings on offer. When Majestic Roi was offered two years ago--before her sire Street Cry had had a chance to prove himself one of the stars of the future--she was sold for only 25,000gns, even though the average price was nearly 120,000gns and the median was 70,000gns.

I can't claim to know what limited the filly's appeal. Although her dam, the French listed winner L'Extra Honor, had produced nothing better than a graded-placed winner, there was still plenty to admire about the filly's family. L'Extra Honor is a half-sister to Montelmar, a talented Alleged colt who won both starts as a three-year-old to earn a *Timeform* rating of 122. Montelmar later found a place in history as the sire of two Grand National winners, Monty's Pass and Hedgehunter.

Majestic Roi's dam is inbred 2x3 to Northern Dancer, her sire being Northern Dancer's son Hero's Honor and her dam being Fanfreluche's daughter L'Extravagante. It is easy to understand why someone would want to try to reinforce Northern Dancer's influence in this family, as he also sired Fanfreluche's brother Night Shift, a stallion with more than 30 group/graded winners to his credit.

Many of the family's best performers are inbred in the first four generations to Northern Dancer, including Holy Roman Emperor (3x3), Flying Spur (3x4), the Yellow Ribbon S. winner Aube Indienne (3x4), the champion European juvenile filly Bint Allayl (3x4) and her smart brother Kheleyf (now a Darley stallion), and the Grade II winner Conserve. The recurring theme in these good horses is Danzig, through his sons Danehill (sire of Holy Roman Emperor and Flying Spur), Green Desert (sire of Bint Allayl and Kheleyf) and Boundary (sire of Conserve).

Majestic Roi's victory--her second at group level on turf--helped Street Cry complete a magnificent treble, as he has now been represented by Grade I winners on three different surfaces. Her predecessors were Street Sense, winner of the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, Kentucky Derby and the Travers on traditional dirt, and the two-year-old Cry And Catch Me, recently successful in the Oak Leaf S. on Santa Anita's synthetic Cushion Track.



This versatility has been underlined by some of the other performers among Street Cry's impressive total of seven first-crop graded winners. Per Incanto gained his Group 3 success on turf in Italy; Summer Doldrums is a stakes winner on dirt and turf; Big Timer's Group 3 success came on turf in England; Street Sounds is a Grade II winner on Polytrack, as well as being a stakes winner on turf and dirt; and Street Magician's Grade III win came on dirt at Pimlico. Now that's what I call a stallion perfectly equipped to cope with the surface changes afoot not just in the USA, but also, to a lesser extent, in Europe.

But then Street Cry's background equipped him to be versatile. It was a shrewd call to aim a colt of his background directly to racing on dirt, as both his parents--Machiavellian and the Irish Oaks winner Helen Street--were Group 1 winners on turf. Whereas Helen Street's background was predominantly one of European turf horses, Machiavellian's featured such successful dirt performers as Mr. Prospector, Raise A Native, Native Dancer, Hail To Reason and Hoist The Flag. For once, here's a marriage which has fulfilled everyone's dreams.

SALES BONANZA

It's hard to predict just which races will produce sires, but one thing's for sure: the 2003 G2 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot was a huge pointer to the 2007 European Freshman Sire List. Choisir (Daneshill Dancer), a rising four-year-old on Australian time, won it as the first leg of his famous Ascot double that culminating four days later with a win in the G1 Golden Jubilee. The four-year-old Acclamation (Royal Applause) was second in the King's Stand, with the previous year's G1 Middle Park S. winner, the then three-year-old Oasis Dream, third on his seasonal debut. Oasis Dream went on to win the G1 July Cup at Newmarket, defeating Choisir, and the G1 Nunthorpe, with Acclamation third. Acclamation didn't win a Group 1, but did come back to win the G2 Diadem S. at Ascot.

These three are now the top three freshman sires in Europe, with nearly 70 winners and over 20 two-year-old stakes horses among them. The runaway winner on progeny earnings is Acclamation, himself a winner of Doncaster's sales race as a two-year-old. He has sired two Sales Race winners, both of which won last Friday at Newmarket: Excavation won a Tattersalls sale race, while Dark Angel, who captured the Doncaster sales race his sire won, followed up with wins in the G2 Mill Reef and the G1 Middle Park. Acclamation's runners have now won over £1 million, which puts him ahead even of North American leader Posse in total progeny earnings.

Of the three, it's the one that stands in England, Oasis Dream, who is most prominently represented at the Tattersalls October 1 Yearling Sale that kicks off today: there are 33 yearlings by Oasis Dream catalogued this week, with another 10 in Books 2 and 3 next week. Acclamation has two in Book 1 and 11 next week, while Choisir has none this week and eight next week; of course, the two Irish sires have already had 41 (Acclamation) and 36 (Choisir) sell in Europe so far this season.

Red Ransom's first English-sired crop ranks him ninth among European freshman sires this year; he has 11 from his second European crop in Book 1, another 13 next week. Shadwell's Nayef, now with six winners and some promising stakes form, has seven in Book 1, another 18 next week; and two Irish sires, Hawk Wing and Dalakhani, have six and 11 in Book 1, respectively. Hawk Wing has another 17 next week; Dalakhani had no winners by Aug. 1. CORRUPTION TRIAL UNDERWAY Proceedings in the trial involving Kieren Fallon began at the Old Bailey in London yesterday, with the prosecution telling the jury that Fallon and two other riders agreed to make horses lose in a series of 27 races. The prosecutors alleged that a syndicate run by Miles Rodgers sought to stop horses from "running on their merits" and that "riding practices would be used if necessary" to keep them from winning; Rogers could then profit by betting them to lose on the on-line betting exchange Betfair. Fallon and fellow jockeys Fergal Lynch and Darren Williams deny the charges; Rodgers, Philip Sherkle and Lynch's brother Shaun pleaded not guilty as well. All are charged with conspiracy to defraud between December 2002 and September 2004 by interfering with the running of horses to ensure they lost races, and of defrauding Betfair punters and others putting money on the races. Rodgers is also accused of concealing the proceeds of crime. Jonathan Caplan QC, prosecuting, told the court, "This case concerns a serious allegation of fraud. It is unusual, because it is also concerned with sport, and any allegation of fraud in that context obviously undermines the integrity of the sport in question. The prosecution case is that there was an unlawful agreement or conspiracy between these defendants and other persons that those races should be fixed. The defendants in this case did not fix races to ensure a particular horse won. On the contrary, they fixed the races to ensure that the horses in question lost. The object of the conspiracy was to wager large amounts of money on a particular horse to lose in each of those races whilst knowing that the jockey was prepared, if necessary, to cheat by stopping the horse."

The Alleged Plot...

Jonathan Caplan outlined the organisation of the alleged scam, explaining, "[Miles Rodgers] was the organiser of this conspiracy and was the one who was most involved. On race days, Rodgers had direct contact by mobile telephone with Fergal Lynch and Darren Williams. Kieren Fallon was more cautious, and Rodgers had indirect contact with Fallon using an intermediary, Shaun Lynch, to a lesser extent Fergal Lynch, and latterly, Philip Sherkle." The jury learned that phone conversations, race footage, surveillance film and photographs would be produced in evidence. Of Coolmore's retained rider, he added, "Fallon's position appears to be that he would discuss the prospects of his own rides with Fergal and Shaun Lynch, but was completely unaware if they passed this information on to Rodgers. Fallon says that he also gave some tips to Sherkle, whom he thought was having 'his own couple of quid' on them. He was completely unaware if Sherkle passed these tips to Rodgers." However, Caplan added that it was "inconceivable" that Fallon, who rode in 17 of the races, gave this information without knowledge that it was passed on. A total of £2.12 million was laid by Rodgers' Betfair accounts on the 27 races. Caplan said there was no evidence that Fallon ever received any money or benefit from Rodgers or anyone else connected with the conspiracy, but that, by winning on horses that had been bet to lose, he had cost the conspiracy a net loss of £338,000 at the time of the arrests on Sept. 1, 2004. "He would have to earn that money back for the conspirators by stopping horses before he would receive any benefit himself," Caplan explained. "The inference to be drawn is that he was clearly involved for reward." Fallon is also alleged to have sent a text message to Sherkle following a winning ride on a horse that cost the conspirators £138,000 which read, "They are watching me." The case continues.

BOOKMAKERS ARRESTED IN SCANDAL

According to *Jour de Galop*, four British bookmakers were arrested at Longchamp racecourse Sunday afternoon after being caught accepting wagers. It is understood that the area of the grandstand reserved for British racegoers was being used by the four individuals to take bets until the Chief of the Gaming Police and a second member of his team intervened to make the arrests. Large amounts of cash and the passports of the unnamed quartet have been confiscated and they are currently detained. Bookmaking has been outlawed on French soil since 1891, and wagering on horseracing is state-licensed to the Pari Mutuel Urbain (PMU) who, alongside Pari Mutuel Hippodrome (PMH) have a monopoly on on-track and off-track betting.

RANDWICK STABLES CLEARED

All race horses stabled at Randwick, the first of Sydney's major tracks to be hit by EI six weeks ago, have been ordered to leave the complex. The 700 horses on the grounds will be moved out of Randwick and sent to spelling paddocks throughout New South Wales, giving RacingNSW the chance to clean and disinfect the facilities. "They will be moved out in stages, but all are going so we can undertake this massive clean-up," said RacingNSW Chief Executive Officer Peter V'Landys. The horse population will be allowed to filter back beginning Nov. 15. "We are hoping to have a race meeting at Randwick by the end of the year," V'Landys stated. The spread of the disease is not yet over, however. Rosehill fell to EI over the weekend, and two other major training centres in Australia, Newcastle in NSW and Toowoomba in Queensland, have now reported cases of equine influenza, despite the fact that both venues received vaccinations late last week. Glenlogan Park Stud in Queensland has also just been hit.
