Adrian Nicoll of the BBA Ireland agency bid just shy of 600,000gns for the colt but the eventual buyer, Sheikh Mohammed's bloodstock advisor John Ferguson, had to finally fight off Blandford Bloodstock's Tom Goff to land the

prized lot. "It's a pedigree that everyone knows very well. He's a brother to one of the best fillies of recent years in Divine Proportions, while Whipper won the G1 Jacques Le Marois and it's also the family of Shirley Heights (GB)," said Ferguson. "I'd seen him at the stud and he had a great attitude through the week. He was an exceptional athlete and ticked all the boxes." Of the overall sale, Ferguson added: "We can be satisfied with the market rather than ecstatic, and there is always a need for new people to come in and buy racehorses." Timing Is Everything...

Myth to Reality was bought by the Middlebrooks for \$125,000 at Keeneland in January 2003 before her progeny Divine Proportions (Kingmambo) and Whipper (Miesque) enjoyed Group 1 victories in Europe. Now 21, she is in foal to Lemon Drop Kid, having been barren to Kingmambo last year. "I'm so thrilled for Gary and Lesley, who have put so much into racing and are the sort of people who really deserved a proper touch like that," said Lady Carolyn Warren. "I've had the colt since July and when he arrived, I rang the Middlebrooks to say that this horse was the real deal. He was beautifully reared in America, but our stud groom at Highclere, Paul Smith, has done a great job with him." Ferguson's seven purchases also included a 425,000gns Oasis Dream (GB) colt consigned by Watership Down Stud.

Lucky Seven for Coolmore...

Demi O'Byrne also purchased seven lots for Coolmore and these were led by a 520,000gns Montjeu (Ire) colt from the family of Sleepytime (Ire) bred by Charles H. Wacker III and sold through Voute Sales. Trainer Marcus Tregoning, who had been underbidder to O'Byrne on Tuesday's 500,000gns session-topping Montjeu colt, again came off second best. John Magnier earlier outbid representatives of Katsumi Yoshida's Northern Farm for a 475,000gns Pivotal (GB) granddaughter of Group 1 winner Rebecca Sharp (GB) (Machiavellian) from the consignment of Anthony Oppenheimer's Hascombe and Valiant Studs. The 24-year-old Simon Callaghan, who will be one of Newmarket's youngest trainers when taking over the licence from his father Neville in February, gained an expensive addition to his first team of two-year-olds when getting a 380,000gns Pivotal (GB) filly offered by Barouche Stud. Richard Brown of Blandford Bloodstock, who signed for the yearling, said, "For me she was physically the nicest filly in the sale. She's for an existing client and Pivotal has done very well with fillies."

The latter is also the dam of this year's G2 Prix du Gros-Chene heroine Beauty is Truth (Ire), the latest to carry Richard Strauss's famed silks to success in a major sprint.

THE CHALLENGE AHEAD

Tough as it may be for breeders when their yearlings don't make the cut, the good news from the first two days of Tattersalls' October 1 yearling sale is that--as at Goffs last week--prices are holding up. There are plenty of buyers for yearlings at 200,000 gns plus (roughly \$420,000), though there is also a ceiling around 500,000 gns.--call it the \$1-million mark, plus or minus --for all but the super-elite horse. One filly at Goffs topped the \$3-million mark; a Gone West 3/4-brother to Divine Proportions sold yesterday for over \$2-million. But the really good news for breeders was that, half-way through the sale, the gross was on course to be up close to 10 percent over last year (12 percent more were catalogued), and the average will be down in single digits--less than 10 percent.

The bad news for breeders is that the stud fees for many of the top sires in Europe have risen substantially since 2005, when this year's crop of yearlings was conceived. Galileo's fee quadrupled in the two years between 2005 (€37,500) and 2007 (€150,000); Danehill Dancer's nearly trebled (€40,000 to €115,000). Even neutral Dansili, who still stood for £12,500 in 2005, rose to £30,000 in 2007, and is likely to nearly double again for 2008. Excluding Sadler's Wells, who is suffering through a Storm Cat-like sales season with the exception of the Goffs' saletopping filly, breeders who are paying the stud fees are going to need to make sure the mares they breed to the top stallions in 2008 really merit going to those stallions. If we take the 'multiple times stud fee' figure that we ran during the September sale, just taking the averages for eight prominent European sires in Tuesday's and Wednesday's sessions, the numbers look pretty dramatic. Montjeu's Tuesday--Wednesday average (218,286gns) was 7.27 times his 2005 stud fee; had those same horses sold off his 2007 stud fee, the multiple would have been 2.62 times stud fee--a 64-percent drop. In other words, if Montjeu's yearling average were to be the same in 2009 as it was on the last two days, breeders would be a lot worse off than they are now. His average, and those of Galileo and Danehill Dancer as well, need to increase substantially to justify--commercially--breeders paying the asking price. One thing that will not happen: they're not suddenly going to be standing for five-figure stud fees. It could lead to a lot of foal-shares, which in the case of mares which don't merit paying for the season, will result in poor multiples of yearling average times published stud fee. **Bill Oppenheim may be contacted at bopp@erb.com. Another worrying angle is the polarization between Coolmore and Darley stallions, with the ever-more (commercially, at least) desirable 'neutral' stallions, like Juddmonte's Dansili and Oasis Dream, the principal beneficiaries. As in most wars, nobody really wins. Coolmore may be able to solve the problem of filling the books of six-figure sires by foal-sharing, but without the participation of Darley's buyers, it's hard to see how the averages for Coolmore's new Big Three can rise substantially. On the other hand, Darley's problem is that Coolmore has the top three active sires in Europe; their top sire at October 1 this year is Cape Cross, whose fee jumped from €20,000 in 2004 when Ouija Board was a three-year-old to €50,000 in 2005. The result was a vastly improved book of mares, and a consequent Tuesday-Wednesday average of over 150,000 gns. But this crop is his first chance to step up from being a useful sire who started out with a €10,000 stud fee to become a true world-class sire. It's unlikely that his stud fee will rise for next year, which means if it does work, if he does 'stand the raise', breeders who use him in 2008 can look forward to his yearlings having a good 'multiple times stud fee' all the way through 2010. **Cont. p6**

For the few owner/breeders who are really unconcerned with the commercial consequences, yearling profitability isn't such a big issue; but the vast majority of breeders are commercial sellers these days, and for them, decisions about 2008 matings aren't going to be easy. The likelihood must be that there will be a shift to more speculative, unproven stallions which stand for fees that make more commercial sense. The less you actually have in the stud fee (assuming that you actually pay a stud fee, usually a better long-term plan for the breeder than foal-sharing), the more chance you have of a 200,000-guinea yearling actually making you money. In light of this year's results at the yearling sales--here in Newmarket, at Goffs, and in Kentucky--it's hard to predict enough of an impending substantial rise in yearling averages to justify breeders using six-figure stud fee stallions for all but the really deserving mares. THE TIN MAN LIKELY TO STAY AT HOME

Ralph and Aury Todd's **The Tin Man** (Affirmed), beaten by a length at odds-on in last Saturday's GI Clement L. Hirsch Turf Championship S. at the Oak Tree meeting, is likely to pass on the GI Breeders' Cup Turf in favor of the GI Citation H., according to trainer Richard Mandella. "I can't see going," the Hall of Fame conditioner commented. "We'll probably think about the Citation for him. Three weeks is not enough time to prepare him [for the Breeders' Cup]. If he'd have won the Hirsch by as much as he lost, that would have made my decision harder." The Citation is contested at 8 1/2 furlongs on Nov. 23.

MIDNIGHT LUTE WORKS FAST

Midnight Lute (Real Quiet), who most recently returned from a five-month absence to take the GI Forego S. at Saratoga Sept. 1, sizzled six furlongs over the Santa Anita Cushion Track in 1:09.80 yesterday morning beneath exercise rider Janell Gruss. Private clocker Gary Young had the four-year-old colt in :57 3/5 for the five-eighths. In other news from the Bob Baffert barn, a decision has yet to be made on whether to supplement GI Lady's Secret S. winner **Tough Tiz's Sis** (Tiznow) to the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff. The cost would be \$180,000.

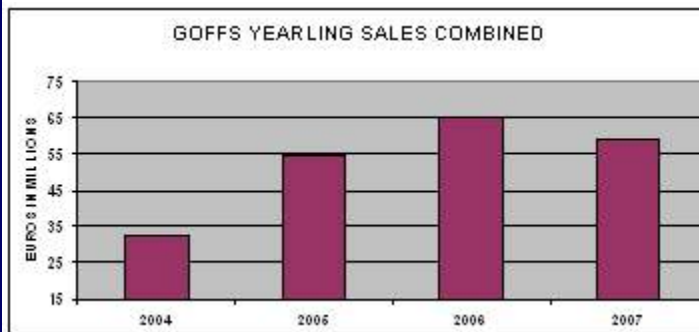

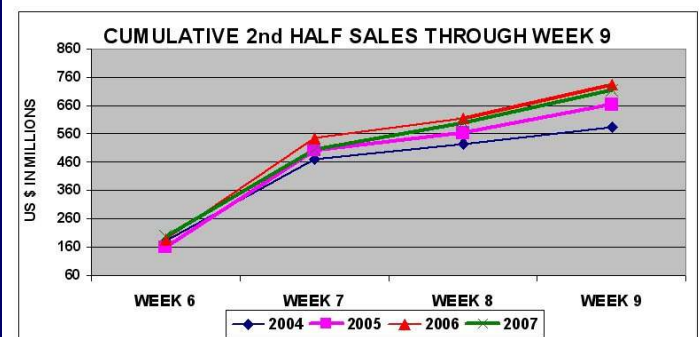

CHAPPLE-HYAM WAVES OFF AUTHORIZED

Trainer Peter Chapple-Hyam yesterday bid farewell to **Authorized (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}), as the colt left his St Gatien yard. While no final decision has been taken as to whether or not the G1 Epsom Derby and G1 Juddmonte International S. hero has been retired, his former conditioner was in an emotional mood yesterday. "Authorized is the king," he said. "He is the best horse I've ever trained and I'll never forget him. He goes with the best wishes of everyone connected to the yard and I'm sure he'll be a big success as a stallion. I look forward to one day hopefully training his progeny."

RED EVIE RETIRED Red Evie (Ire) (Intikhab--Malafemmena {Ire}, by Nordico) has run her last race for owner Terry Neill, finishing unplaced in Saturday's G1 Prix de la Foret. Trainer Michael Bell yesterday blamed the effects of a prolonged campaign for her 10th placing in Longchamp's seven-furlong contest. Last year's G1 Matron S. winner, who added Newbury's G1 Locking S. and G2 Hungerford S. to her tally this term, has a date at Tattersalls now. "We had all hoped that Red Evie would go out with a victory in what was to be her final race on Saturday," Bell said. "She was settled towards the rear of the field, but she was never travelling as well as she has in previous races, and maybe she has just had enough for the year. She will now head for the December Sales where, hopefully, she will catch the eye of one of the top studs and will go on to breed plenty of winners."

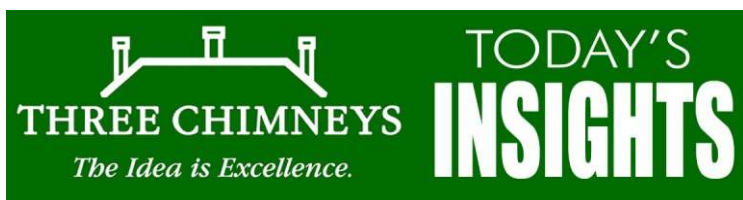
CHURCHIL, MAGNA LEAVE EMPIRE RACING

Officials at Churchill Downs Incorporated (CDI) have announced that they have withdrawn from Empire Racing Associates' bid to assume control of the New York racing franchise. "When our Company took a position in Empire Racing in August 2006, we were joining a very diverse, accomplished, resourceful and highly motivated group of business partners, including New York horsemen, whose common goal was creating a framework that would ensure the success of New York horse racing," said Robert L. Evans, president and chief executive officer of Churchill Downs Incorporated. "Since that time, the make-up of Empire Racing has changed significantly, and the bidding and selection process is now undefined. We continue to believe that Thoroughbred racing's success in the United States requires that New York racing be economically viable. Remaining part of Empire Racing is not serving that goal, so we've ended our participation in Empire Racing." A few hours later, officials at Magna Entertainment also withdrew their membership from Empire Racing, citing a current atmosphere which does not bode well for Empire's bid.

Old Friends to Help Create John Henry Memorial:

Michael Blowen, president and founder of the Old Friends thoroughbred retirement facility, has announced that he will team with Bill Oster and the Kentucky Horse Park to create a privately funded memorial for the late John Henry. "John Henry was special to the park,



he was special to racing, and his story is just a great one regardless of whether you are into racing or not," said Oster, a park volunteer for the last 10 years and one of John's primary caretakers. "He was the people's horse, he was a

blue-collar horse, he didn't have a lot of breeding, and he overcame every obstacle he ever had in his life." Famous for his testy disposition, John Henry was all business at the track, winning a record 30 stakes races and retiring with earnings of \$6.5 million, a record at the time. He was a seven-time Eclipse Award winner, including Horse of the Year in 1981 and 1984. Pending approval from the park commission, the memorial will consist of a landscaped sitting area outside of John Henry's former paddock with an understated monument, to be sculpted by local equine artist Shelley Hunter.

Horsemen Remember John Henry:

When reports came to light over the summer that John Henry was suffering from dehydration, many of his fans traveled from far and wide to stop by for a visit. One person who had a hand in the success of John Henry was his exercise rider Lewis Cenicola. "He was a very smart horse and a neat horse to gallop," he commented. "He would take his time walking to the track. When we would go to New York or Chicago, he would stop at the same places all the time to take in the view. He was just a smart horse and it's tough to see him go." Trainer Ron McAnally agreed. "It was inevitable," he stated. "I saw him in September and he was starting to fail then. [John Henry's main caregiver Cathy Roby] called me Monday on my cell phone and told me they didn't have any choice." McAnally continued, "It's like losing part of the family, of course. He meant an awful lot to us, and I think he lived a long and productive life." Jockey Eddie Delahoussaye knows just how tough a customer John Henry was. The retired reinsman had the call on The Bart in the inaugural Arlington Million in 1981 and thought he had the race won, but for John Henry's irresistible late surge. "It was so close," Delahoussaye recollected. "[Bill Shoemaker] and I didn't get together until the horses left the grass course and reached the main track and he said, 'What do you think?,' and I said, 'Bill, it's so close. It's hard to tell. There was a lot of controversy and it was great, because it was the first \$1-million race." John Henry will be honored with a video tribute Saturday afternoon at Santa Anita.

Handle and Purses Up, Race Days Down in Q3:

The National Thoroughbred Racing Association and the Equibase Company LLC have released the "Thoroughbred Racing Economic Indicators" for United States and Canadian wagering on Thoroughbred racing in America for the third quarter of 2007. Pari-mutuel handle increased by 0.90 percent versus the third quarter of 2006, while purses were ahead by a healthy 6.11 percent, due in large part to the opening of Presque Isle Downs in Pennsylvania in September. Those increases were achieved during a period in which the number of race days were down by 0.92 percent. "Thoroughbred racing's key economic indicators are trending in the right direction, and we are particularly pleased, given the high relative cost of ownership, to see purses increasing as they are," said Alex Waldrop, President and CEO of the NTRA. "As the pie gets larger, the ongoing challenge is to grow the business at a pace that produces real, sustained growth for the entire industry. An important step in this direction is to maximize handle--nd racing's share of the revenue generated by that handle--through the reduction of leakage."

FALLON'S DEFENCE BEGINS Kieren Fallon's Barrister John Kelsey-Fry QC yesterday told the jury at the race-fixing trial that there was "nothing wrong" with the former six-time British champion jockey discussing the races he is alleged to have conspired to lose. After two days of hearing the prosecution case against the six defendants at the Old Bailey, Kelsey-Fry had the opportunity to address Fallon's part in the affair. "He is a man driven by the desire to win," he said. "The very fact that a man described as the greatest jockey of his generation ends up unable to help winning when he is trying to lose is simply ridiculous." In response to the allegation that he used intermediaries to pass on information, Kelsey-Fry added, "Nothing wrong with that. If you're champion jockey six times, you will find, you readily accept, the whole world wanting to know your opinions about every horserace there is. You will hear evidence demonstrating that Mr. Fallon was content to do so to any number of such people."

BUMPER TROPHY ENTRY Doncaster yesterday welcomed a 63-strong entry for the Oct. 27 G1 Racing Post Trophy, with most of the season's top staying juveniles engaged.
