WORLD RECORD YEARLING FILLY AT TATTS

Agent Charlie Gordon-Watson and his client Craig Bennett outgunned agent Simon Christian, acting on behalf of Patrick Fahey, to land a world record yearling filly for 2.5-million guineas at yesterday's final session of Book 1 of Tattersalls' 2007 October Sale. Sold as lot 612, the daughter of Sadler's Wells is a full-sister to recent G1 Fillies' Mile winner Listen (Ire). The previous record for a yearling filly was

the \$4,400,000 paid for unraced Moon's Whisper, a daughter of Storm Cat out of East of the Moon bought by Shadwell Estate Co Ltd at Keeneland September in 2000. Yesterday's record setter was bred by Brittas House Stud and consigned from Mark Dwyer's Oaks Farm Stables. Bennett will send his purchase to trainer Luca Cumani. She will eventually join his fledgling breeding operation under the Merry Fox Stud banner, although Bennett's mares will be boarded at various farms. "She was absolutely gorgeous and you don't get pedigrees like that very often," said Bennett. "Even if she's not lucky on the racecourse, she's a breeding prospect to die for. I want to build a broodmare band of enormous quality, one whose impact will still be felt in 20 years--like Luca's Fittocks Stud. I also bought four fillies last year, including a 1.2 million guineas daughter of Sadler's Wells. The mares will be kept in the best places, probably in Ireland." Based in Cheshire, Bennett was finance director of the cellphone company Caudwell Group before selling his share in the business, worth around £73 million, last year. He added, "My grandfather was a bookmaker and I've always loved racing and I wanted to wait to do this when I could do it properly." Gordon-Watson was also responsible for the day's top priced colt, a son of Dalakhani (Ire) purchased for 1-million guineas. Offered by Meon Valley Stud, lot 586 is out of Bella Lambada (GB) (Lammtarra), producer of listed-placed Fontana Amorosa (GB). The dam is also a half-sister to group winners Stagecraft and Mullins Bay (GB). Gordon-Watson, who outbid John Ferguson for the colt, remarked, "I can't say anything about who he is for or where he is going." **Tattersalls cont. p4**

SHAKESPEARE RETIRED

GISW **Shakespeare** (Theatrical {Ire}--Lady Shirl, by That's a Nice) has been retired due to a tendon injury in his left foreleg. The winner of the GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic and GI Belmont BC H. in 2005, the six-year-old missed the entire 2006 season after suffering a tear in the tendon, but returned after a 21-month absence to win an optional claimer at Saratoga Aug. 2. He followed up with a victory in the Sept. 16 GI Woodbine Mile S., and was being pointed for the Oct. 27 GI Breeders' Cup Mile. "He's sound, he was training," trainer Kieran McLaughlin told *DRF*. "It went wrong the last day or two and it doesn't look good. After consulting with the vet, we decided we were not going to push on. He's a star; it's unfortunate. I think he'll be an outstanding stallion." Campaigned by breeder Dell Ridge Farm and William Schettine, Shakespeare was two-for-two at Gulfstream as a three-year-old, but was sidelined from March of 2004 until July of 2005. The bay came back to win three more starts, besting English Channel by a head in the Turf Classic, but disappeared again after finishing 12th in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf. He retires with a record of 8-7-0-0 and earnings of \$1,293,780. He will stand stud at Frank Justice's Dell Ridge Farm in Kentucky.

LONG LIVE THE QUEEN

Inaugurated in honor of Queen Elizabeth II's visit to Kentucky in 1984, the first Challenge Cup was contested on dirt. Sintra (Drone) won by a nose, and the British monarch was on hand to present the trophy to owner Cherry Valley Farm. Keeneland installed its turf course the following autumn, and the QEII Cup has been run over the sod ever since. The race received Grade III status in 1986, when Henryk de Kwiatkowski won with his second straight Danzig filly as Lotka followed on the heels of Contredance. Moving quickly up the graded ladder, it was

established as a Grade I event in 1991, with Wimborne Farm's La Gueriere (Lord At War {Arg}) earning her first win at that level.

Two years later, the Danzig filly Tribulation emulated her half-sister Plenty of Grace--the 1990 victress--in winning the QEII Cup. Her trophy was the fourth of five for the Galbreath/Phillips family. The Darby Dan colors were carried to victory by both Plenty of Grace and 1988 winner Love You by Heart; James Phillips won with Graceful Darby in 1987 and owned Tribulation in partnership with Arthur Seelbinder; and Memories of Silver (Silver Hawk) came home first in 1996 for Joan and John Phillips.

On The Bit...

Coquerelle (Ire) (Zamindar) and **Dreaming of Anna** (Rahy) are already winners at the highest level; will they add to their laurels, or will one of their rivals join the ranks of Grade I winners? **Bit of Whimsy** (Distorted Humor) dead-heated with Rutherienne when making her stakes bow in just her third career start, hitting the line on even terms in the June 2 GIII Sands Point S. at Belmont Park. She lost her best chance when she stumbled at the start of the July 21 Virginia Oaks, finishing fourth, then raced wide on both turns in the Sept. 8 GI Garden City BC S. and just missed, finishing second by 3/4 of a length. The chestnut filly is the third generation bred by owner Joyce Bonner Young. The second dam, Highland Mills, has produced six stakes horses from her 12 foals, including Grade I winners Miss Josh and Royal Mountain Inn. The dam, Kristi B, was named for Young's daughter, but was injured before she broke her maiden. "She shattered her right front cannon bone and Dr. [Stephen] Selway said there was no way he could operate, and he put her in a cast," Young said. "She stayed in the cast from the end of July to mid-January in [trainer Barclay Tagg's] barn, where he and Robin [assistant trainer Robin Smullen] took care of her. When Bit of Whimsy won the Sands Point, I told Barclay that Kristi B had paid him back."

Classic Contender...

She couldn't get out of her own way on the main track, but **Classic Neel** (El Corredor) has become a contender since switching to the turf. Owner Sheila Mead well remembers the filly's first foray onto the lawn. "She was 60-1, I'll never forget it," Mead said. "She had trained so well, but she didn't run at all in her races on the dirt. We didn't invite anyone, because we thought she would be last again. But my husband [Fred] and I were watching the race, and here she comes. I was about to have a fit--it was so exciting. She ran really big and she has been doing fantastic ever since." After her maiden score, the \$250,000 FTFEB juvenile took a Gulfstream allowance in March and was second by a neck in the Appalachian S. at Keeneland in April. A close-up third in the Sands Point, she was fourth in the July 27 GIII Lake George S. before capturing the Sept. 3 Weekend Madness S. at Saratoga last time out. Can she carry her form into Grade I company? "With a little bit of racing luck, we're hopeful," Mead said.

Book 1 Concludes with a Bang...

With an increased catalogue, the 64.9 million guineas turnover was up 18 percent on last year's October Part 1 figure of 55 million guineas, although the average of 127,063gns and median of 80,000gns remained static. "We would have to be satisfied with the way Book 1 of our October Yearling Sale has gone, and it was wonderful to end the week on a high with the new world record price of 2.5-million guineas for a yearling filly and record turnover for the sale," said Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony. "The introduction of the £2,200,000 Tattersalls Timeform Millions has, without doubt, brought the trainers out in greater numbers, and they have made a major contribution from start to finish, but the real feature of the week has been the particularly robust top end of the market." Concerning the base of buyers present at Tattersalls this week, Mahoney added, "All of the usual faces at that level have been as active as ever, but they have found competition from many different quarters and it was hugely encouraging to see three relatively new faces fighting it out on the record-breaking filly. It is a while since we have seen that level of demand from new participants and it demonstrates a real appetite for the sort of quality that has always been the hallmark of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale." Reflecting on Book 1, Mahoney said, "The market has, however, been selective at times and the sheer number of yearlings catalogued can seem a little daunting, but the significant increase in turnover this week is a real positive. We have two more good catalogues to come starting next Tuesday and we will be able to assess the state of play fully at the end of Book 3, but we can derive plenty of encouragement from the last four days." **Cont. p5**

“PASSAGE” RE-ROUTED TO CHAMPION

Khalid Abdullah's **Passage of Time (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) will miss the Breeders' Cup and stay in Newmarket for Saturday's G1 Emirates Airline Champion S. Connections had penciled in the Oct. 27 G1 F/M Turf for last year's G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud heroine, but will now target the 10-furlong Champion instead. "We thought that she had had quite a disjointed year and it might be too much to ask of her to go to America," her owner/breeder's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe told *PA Sport*. "She is going to be kept in training next year, and even though the Breeders' Cup is very close to our hearts, we think we have a very good chance of winning the Champion. The Breeders' Cup will no doubt be a target for next year and if there was a hiccup, there is still a chance that she could go this year."

NO RAMONTI AT BREEDERS' CUP

Ramonti (Fr) (Martino Alonso {Ire}) will bypass the Breeders' Cup and be prepared for a tilt at the Dec. 9 G1 Hong Kong Cup, Godolphin confirmed yesterday. WILD GAMS TO PREP AT FAIR HILL

Gill Thoroughbred Club of America S. winner **Wild Gams** (Forest Wildcat) will prepare for the Oct. 26 Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint at Fair Hill Training Center. The four-year-old was shipped to the Maryland facility yesterday. "We want to keep her on synthetic tracks because she's done so well on them," explained trainer Ben Perkins Jr., who is based at Monmouth Park. "She'll be shipped to Monmouth a couple of days before the race."

JESSAMINE 1-2 HEADED TO BC UNDERCARD

Wind in My Wings (Sligo Bay {Ire}) and **Lickety Lemon** (Lemon Drop Kid), the one-two finishers in Thursday's Jessamine S. at Keeneland, could meet again in the \$250,000 Epitome Breeders' Cup S. The one-mile turf test for juvenile fillies will be run at Monmouth Oct. 26. "There is not really anything for Wind in My Wings the rest of the year at Woodbine," said Ruth Schmidt, assistant to trainer Reade Baker. "But there is a race at Monmouth that she could go to and we are already taking Bear Now there for the Dis-taff." Stoneside, twice a listed winner in France, was a nose behind **Asperity** when runner-up in the June 10 G3 Prix Paul de Moussac. The bay ended his European campaign with a second in the July 8 G1 Prix Jean Prat. Sent off the 13-10 chalk in his U.S. bow, the Sept. 2 GII Del Mar Derby, he lacked a late kick and finished sixth, but he prepped for this with a bullet five furlongs in :59 2/5 around the "dogs" Oct. 7 and should improve in his second stateside start. **Asperity** followed up with a sixth in the Jean Prat and a fifth in the July 28 G2 Prix Eugene Adam going 10 panels and looks to rebound in his American debut. **Augment** switched to the turf after finishing sixth in the July 14 GII Swaps BC S. and rallied to take an optional claimer at Del Mar by a nose Aug. 9. The gelding changed tactics for the Del Mar Derby, cutting out fractions of :48 and 1:12 and digging in down the lane to be second by 3/4 of a length behind **Medici Code** (GB). "He's very honest," jockey **Richie Migliore** said. "He shows up every time, and the good thing about him is, if they go real slow, he'll make the running; if they go fast, he'll settle in. He won't be a victim of pace or the way the race is run. He kind of makes his own trip. A horse like that is fun for a jockey to ride." **Ten a Penny** was four-for-five while racing against handicap horses in Britain. Taking on stakes foes for the first time in his inaugural appearance in the U.S., he closed to win a division of the **Oceanside S.** at Del Mar July 18. Fourth in the Aug. 11 GII La Jolla H., he was second by a head to **Unusual Suspect** in the Sept. 29 Bay Meadows Derby.

Thoro-Graph Race of the Week

1 Incendiary Flame Thrower Garcia 20-1
Incendiary has moved forward steadily, but is still too slow to compete here, and she is highly questionable at the distance.

2 Natalie'spinkkaty Graeme Hall Fawkes 12-1
Natalie'spinkkaty didn't show much run in two sprints, and then exploded when stretched out around two turns. She would need another forward move to contend with these, which is unlikely, but until a juvenile has established a level (either bounced or paired up) it's tough to know what the limits are.

3 Calico Bay Three Wonders Kaplan 10-1
Calico Bay hasn't run a bad one yet--every race is as good as or better than the one before it. A juvenile that pairs up tops is often ready for a forward move, and we expect this filly to run well. She has drawn well, and has the right running style in a race loaded with speed.

4 Silk Ridge Eltish Potter 6-5
Silk Ridge has developed quite a bit since the summer, and her win two starts back produced one of the best figures by a juvenile filly this year. That effort figured to take something out of her, and she did back up a couple of points last time. She's now coming off what we call an 0-2, a top followed by a two-point regression, and since Silk Ridge has already had quite a bit of racing, and the top was both a big jump and a huge effort, we think she's ready to go back further.

5 Bond Princess Trippi Ritvo 8-1
Bond Princess stayed at the same level for the first three starts, and then inched forward slightly when stretched out last time. This is a decent pattern for a new top, but we don't expect a big jump, so a check is possible, but a win unlikely.

6 Shorty Puffs **B L's Appeal** **Pilotti** **6-1**
 Shorty Puffs has already had eight starts and done a lot of developing. The last two route efforts are decent, but leave her short of competitive, and more development short term is unlikely.

7 Awesome Dreamer **West Acre** **O'Connell** **4-1**
 Awesome Dreamer didn't show much in her first four starts, although she had trouble in the last two. Last time, she exploded with a big figure, and a repeat of that effort would give her a very big shot. But it was a new top of almost eight points, and a bounce is likely.

8 Mymymyboogieshoes **Pure Precision** **Fawkes** **20-1**
 Mymymyboogieshoes has never run fast enough to make a dent in this.

9 Asi Asi **Yes It's True** **Collazo** **8-1**
 Asi Asi has moved forward significantly with every start, and her last was good enough to make her a contender with these. This is a tough pattern to read--as we said, until a horse levels off, there is no way to know what his top is. We give this filly a much better chance of pairing or going forward than Natalie'spinky because she improved in increments, but on the other hand, with each forward move, the smaller the percentage of the juvenile filly population that can run that fast without bouncing.

Bottom Line: Silk Ridge will be very short, and may not fire, so she's worth taking a shot against. Calico Bay is solid, and Asi Asi is usable.

THIS WEEK IN HISTORY...

October 12, 1920...In the final race of his career, three-year-old **Man o'War** defeated 1919 Triple Crown winner Sir Barton in a match race at Kenilworth Park. Sent off at odds of 1-20, Man o'War won by seven lengths for his 14th consecutive victory.

October 12, 1966...**Damascus**, owned by Edith Bancroft, broke his maiden at Aqueduct Racetrack, winning by eight lengths.

October 13, 1927...**Arlington Park** opened. The track, built by H. D. Brown, had a steeplechase course and a polo field and was adjacent to tennis courts, a golf course and a one-mile training track.

October 13, 1956...At age four, 1955 Horse of the Year **Nashua** won his last race, the Jockey Club Gold Cup at Belmont Park.

October 13, 1984...At age nine, odds-on favorite **John Henry** won his last race, the Ballantine's Scotch Classic at the Meadowlands. He earned a \$500,000 bonus for winning both the Scotch Classic and the Turf Classic at Belmont Park September 22. He retired with then-record earnings of \$6,597,947.

October 14, 1952...Jockey **Bill Hartack** rode his first career winner at Waterford Park.

October 14, 1953...After a 21-year hiatus from the saddle, jockey **Earl Sande** won the first race since staging a comeback October 5, booting home Miss Weesie at Jamaica. The victory was the final race in Sande's career.

October 14, 1968...Jockey **Sandy Hawley** won his first race, riding Fly Alone to victory at Woodbine.

October 14, 1972...After finishing first in the Champagne S. at Belmont Park, **Secretariat** was disqualified and placed second for bearing in on **Stop the Music**, who was declared the winner.

TOP 25 SIRES BY 2YO ABC INDEX-midyear 2007 ratings

There are some familiar names among the leading sires by 2yo ABC Index – Danzig (4.76) and Storm Cat (4.20) – as well as some unfamiliar ones. Two sires who score over 5.00 in this category are the veteran German sire Big Shuffle (from the same Bold Reasoning/Boldnesian branch of Bold Ruler as Seattle Slew) and the obscure Star Kingdom-line Canadian sire, Foxtail. Walmac's Florida import Successful Appeal (4.58) is the fifth sire with an index over 4.00. Other top sires on this list, meaning they are very good at siring two-year-olds, include Danehill (3.08), Pivotal (3.01), and A.P. Indy (2.94), as well as other top names like Fusaichi Pegasus (2.73), Danehill Dancer (2.62), Smart Strike (2.52), More Than Ready (2.50). –Bill Oppenheim

NY Senator Calls for Cut in Racing's Slots Revenue:

A proposal by Sen. Bill Larkin now in front of the New York State Senate would cut the revenue that racing receives from slot machines at the Aqueduct casino. Under the terms of the 30-year franchise extension for the New York Racing Association backed by Gov. Eliot Spitzer, NYRA would get 7 percent of net revenue from slots, horsemen would get 6.5 percent and the casino operator would get 26 percent. While the details have not yet been finalized, Larkin's proposal would designate a larger share to the casino operator. On Wednesday, officials of Excelsior Racing Associates and Capital Play, two of the groups bidding for the casino franchise, told the New York Senate Committee they would withdraw their bids unless the operator's share of the revenue was increased.

Cal Law Will Expedite Hearing Process:

Gov. Arnold Schwarzenegger Wednesday signed into law legislation that is part of the California Horse Racing Board's strategy to provide effective and more rapid enforcement of racing regulations. Currently, anyone charged with using a prohibited substance can have the case heard by either a Board of Stewards or the Office of Administrative Hearings, but due to a backlog, those cases scheduled to be heard by the OAH can take a year or more to process. The new law gives the accused the choice of going before either a Board of Stewards or a hearing officer, and it requires hearings to start within 90 days of the ruling unless there is good cause for an extension. The Board will select hearing officers from a pool developed by the CHRB and the state's racing associations and horsemen's associations. "This will be a pool of unbiased individuals with knowledge of the law and knowledge of horse racing, who will really understand the intricacies of the business," said CHRB Executive Director Ingrid Fermin.

RIO RETURNS Godolphin are looking at running **Rio de la Plata** (Rahy) in Saturday's G1 Darley Dewhurst S. at Newmarket. Following his easy success in last Sunday's G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere at Longchamp, connections are keen on turning out their prized juvenile in a potential rematch with his G1 National S. conqueror New Approach (Ire) in the seven-furlong contest. "He has done nothing but improve physically and he takes his races very well," Racing Manager Simon Crisford said yesterday. "He's come back from France very well and is in good form, so the Dewhurst is under strong consideration. The ground has to be right for him and if it gets very soft next week, we would give that a miss, but the weather forecast is pretty good so there is a good chance he might turn up."

FALLON TAKES SABBATICAL Kieren Fallon vowed yesterday not to return to the saddle until the high-profile race-fixing trial is over. In a statement to the *Racing Post*, Coolmore's retained rider explained that the lengthy case at the Old Bailey meant that he could not give his full attention to his work. "I have decided not to ride again until this is over," Fallon told the trade daily. "There is too much going on--it is not fair on trainers and I would struggle to concentrate. It just wouldn't work. By the time I finish here each day and sit with my legal team for an hour or more afterwards, the day is over. Then I have to get up early in the morning to be here the following day. I am fit and will keep fit." Due to an agreement on the amount of witnesses in the trial, it is hoped that the potential four-month long trial will be shortened. Yesterday's proceedings involved a study of one of the accused jockey's ride on Legal Set (Ire) in a claimer at Lingfield in December 2002. Darren Williams, who along with his five co-defendants denies involvement in a conspiracy to defraud, had been interviewed by the security department of the Jockey Club following the third-placing of the horse after he had drifted from 9-4 to 5-1 on the betting exchange Betfair. The court heard that Williams claimed at the time to have given the horse a "good ride" and that connections were satisfied that he had ridden the race to instructions. Miles Rodgers, who had laid the horse in question to profit by over £20,000, denied at the time that he held a Betfair account. The hearing was adjourned until Monday.
