SALES TASK FORCE ISSUES FINDINGS

The Sales Integrity Task Force presented its recommendations on licensing bloodstock agents and consignors and transparency in ownership and medication at public sales. The 36-member task force, formed in cooperation with Consignors and Commercial Breeders Association, Fasig-Tipon, Inc., Horse Owners' Protective Association, Keeneland Association, Kentucky Thoroughbred Association, Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association and Representative Larry Clark, presented its finding at a public forum held yesterday at Keeneland. The task force recommends self-regulation of agents and consignors through the conditions of sale. Under the proposed code, agents are given seven specific situations where they must disclose information to their principals. The code provides a structure for a formal arbitration process. The task force also recommends a voluntary ownership registry to be maintained by the sales companies. If an owner is disclosed, either in the catalogue or in the Ownership Registry, a change in ownership would be required to be disclosed. In regards to transparency in medication in the sales arena, the task force recommends giving buyers the right to ask for a test for the presence of anabolic steroids. "The task force has sent a clear message to the sales companies that self-regulation through their conditions of sale was the best way to address these issues," said Nick Nicholson, president of Keeneland Association. "We welcome this responsibility and believe these recommendations will lead to a more healthy and vibrant marketplace." Walt Robertson, president of Fasig-Tipton Company, Inc., added, "With the broad representation from the Thoroughbred industry and other major breeds in Kentucky, the equine industry has taken a major step forward. GEORGE HANDED CLASSIC OPPORTUNITY

Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's **George Washington (Ire)** (Danehill) will tackle the GI Breeders' Cup Classic for the second year in succession, Aidan O'Brien revealed yesterday. Only sixth on his first try on the dirt at Churchill Downs 12 months ago, the four-year-old will ship to Monmouth for his first start since finishing third in the Sept. 9 G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp. "The plan is to run him in the Breeders' Cup Classic," the Ballydoyle conditioner told *PA Sport*. "It's so far, so good with him."

STREET SENSE WORKS

Kentucky Derby winner **Street Sense** (Street Cry {Ire}) worked five furlongs at Churchill yesterday in preparation for the Oct. 27 GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Monmouth Park. The colt went the distance in 1:00.80 under jockey Calvin Borel. It was the second fastest of 30 at the distance and Churchill Downs clockers caught the Kentucky Derby winner in fractional times of :13, :25.20, :37 and :48.80 and *Horsephotos* she galloped out six furlongs in 1:13.40.

"We got what we needed," trainer Carl Nafzger said of the work. "We just need to keep him going. He's ready. We need to just go up there and get into Monmouth and do our thing." The work also satisfied Borel. "He's fit and he's ready," Borel said. "Since he got back here compared to Saratoga--he was doing good there, but he is doing so good right now it's unbelievable. He's doing good, he's hitting the ground good, and he's happy." The Breeders' Cup Classic is scheduled to be Street Sense's final race, and owner/breeder James Tafel was on hand yesterday at Churchill to watch the colt work. "He's gorgeous--on top of his game," said Tafel. "It's bittersweet, but we're looking forward to a great race because I think this is as tough a Classic as I can remember."

due to the infirmities of old age. The 27-year-old stallion was the first to stand at Three Chimneys. "He was our very first stallion and he stood the 1985 season here all by himself, and during that season he sired an incredible four Grade or Group 1 stakes winner--an almost unheard of accomplishment," said Three Chimneys owner Robert Clay. "He sired six Grade/Group 1 winners in his first two crops."

During two stellar seasons on the racetrack, Slew o' Gold was named champion three-year-old of 1983 and champion older horse of 1984, while capturing back-to-back renewals of the GI Jockey Club Gold H. and GI Woodward S. In 1983, he also won the GI Wood Memorial S. and GI Peter Pan S. and was second in the GI Belmont S. and GI Travers S. The following year, he won the GI Marlboro Cup Invitational H. and GI Whitney H. and was second in the inaugural GI Breeders' Cup Classic. On the board in 18 of 21 starts, Slew o'Gold retired to Three Chimneys with 12 wins and earnings of \$3,533,534. From his first crop, Slew o' Gold sired French and English champion Golden Opinion and Grade I winners Gorgeous, Awe Inspiring and Tactile. From his second crop he sired Grade I winners Thirty Six Red and Dr. Root. He is also the sire of Grade I winners Dramatic Gold and Passinetti. From 17 crops, Slew o' Gold sired 28 stakes, 12 of whom won group or graded stakes. His progeny have earned \$26,989,471. Slew o' Gold was pensioned in August of 2002. "As a young horse, he was tough," admitted Sandy Hatfield, Three Chimneys stallion manager. "He had a lot of Slew about him. But he mellowed with age and we enjoyed each other's company a lot the last few years. We'll all miss him." Slew O' Gold was buried at Three Chimneys.

SILVER BUCK EUTHANIZED Silver Buck (Buckpasser--Silver True, by Hail to Reason), sire of Kentucky Derby winner Silver Charm, was euthanized Oct. 4 after suffering complications of old age. The 29-year-old stallion had resided at Bridledwood Farm in Ocala, Florida since 1999 and was pensioned in 2001. On the racetrack, Silver Buck captured the 1982 GI Suburban H. and GI Whitney H. He was second in that season's GI Metropolitan H. At stud, Silver Buck sired 40 stakes winners and the earners of nearly \$40 million. Silver Charm, his most-accomplished runner, won the 1997 GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. and was second in that year's GI Belmont S. before being named champion three-year-old. Silver Charm also won the 1998 G1 Dubai World Cup. Silver Buck is also the sire of Grade I winners Silver Maiden and Forever Silver, as well as graded winners Silver Survivor, Silver of Silver, The Silver Move, Classic Endeavor and Bay Street Star. "Silver Buck was a grand patriarch among Florida stallions and has left a strong imprint on Florida breeding through the Buckpasser line through his daughters," said Bridlewood's George Isaacs. "There were a lot of tears and long faces around Bridledwood the day of his passing." Silver Buck was buried at Bridlewood Farm.

STORM CAT TO STAND FOR \$300,000

Storm Cat (Storm Bird--Terlingua, by Secretariat), who has stood at a fee of \$500,000 since 2002, will stand the 2008 season for \$300,000. The 24-year-old stallion stands at Overbrook Farm. Yearlings by the vaunted stallion sold for an average of \$544,038 this year, falling from \$1,255,400 a year ago. To date, Storm Cat has sired 96 graded stakes winners, eight champions

and 158 stakes winners, according to equineline.com. Among his stakes winner this year is Grade I winner After Market, GII Canadian S. winner Essential Edge, Pilgrim S. winner The Leopard and Pebbles S. winner Cat Charmer. Storm Cat will be represented in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile by After Market, while The Leopard will represent the stallion in the inaugural Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf.

AFTER MARKET TO STAND FOR \$30,000;

A.P. INDY STAYS AT \$300K Lane's End yesterday announced stud fees for its stallion roster, which will include multiple Grade I winner **After Market** (Storm Cat--Tranquility Lake, by Rahy), who retires to the Versailles nursery after the end of this racing season.

The four-year-old After Market will stand his first year at stud for a fee of \$30,000. A homebred of Pam and Marty Wygod, After Market is a winner of four of eight starts this term, including victories in the GI Eddie Read H. and GI Charles Whittingham Memorial H. He was also the winner of the GII

National Museum of Racing Hall of Fame S. last term. He is slated to make his final career start in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile at Monmouth Park Oct. 27. His celebrated soon-to-be-barnmate A.P. Indy, meanwhile, will remain at a fee of \$300,000. The son of Seattle Slew is enjoying an outstanding 2007 on the track and in the ring. In addition to being the sire of Grade I winners Rags to Riches and Majestic Warrior this term, his yearlings have averaged \$853,541, which puts him atop the TDN's Insta-tistics rankings. After a stellar fall, Lane's End's **Smart Strike** (Mr. Prospector--Classy 'n Smart, by Smarten) will stand for \$150,000, up from \$75,000 in 2007.

MOYNAHAN SUPPLEMENTED TO DEWHURST

Trainer Paul Cole will be double-handed in Saturday's G1 Darley Dewhurst S. after supplementing the York maiden scorer **Moynahan** (Johannesburg) at yesterday's five-day stage. After paying the £15,000 fee, the Whatcombe-based conditioner will commit the winner of the Aug. 22 Convivial Maiden S. to a steep jump in class alongside Stephanie Smith's G2 Coventry S. third and recent Goffs Million winner **Luck Money (Ire)** (Indian Ridge {Ire}). "They will have a pipe-opener on Tuesday and, if all is satisfactory, both of them will take their chance," he commented. "It is a bit of a step up in class for Moynahan, but he quickened up well at York and has been working well at home. Both he and Luck Money are in good form. Luck Money has come out very well from his race in Ireland. I am hoping for good ground."

DUO ADDED TO CHAMPION

Godolphin's **Creachadoir (Ire)** (King's Best) and Javier Martinez Salmean's **Doctor Dino (Fr)** (Muhtathir {GB}) were yesterday supplemented to Saturday's G1 Emirates Airline Champion S. at Newmarket. Creachadoir, who was runner-up in both the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains and G1 Irish 2000 Guineas for Jim Bolger, was impressive on his first start for his new connections when winning the G3 Joel S. at the track last time Oct. 6, while Doctor Dino will be returning to European soil after winning the GI Man o'War S. at Belmont Sept. 8. The latter's trainer Richard Gibson is hoping the decision is justified. "The horse is really well and we think conditions will suit him," he told *PA Sport*. "Obviously, we are keeping an eye on the weather, but early indications are that it's unlikely to be soft. He is an experienced, mature horse and he can handle travelling." The additions, at £24,000 apiece, mean that a maximum field of 14 will face the starter in the 10-furlong contest.

Some partnerships simply sound right together, such as Lennon and McCartney, Dolce and Gabbana, and especially Moet et Chandon. And in Kingmambo and Sadler's Wells, the Thoroughbred world has two famous stallions whose names seem destined to be forever linked together.

I mentioned their joint exploits in this column as recently as July, but Saturday's European meetings added two more stakes winners--both juveniles--to this cross's burgeoning total. In France the G3 Prix Thomas Bryon was won very comfortably by Thewayyouare, who has now won the last three of his four starts. Almost simultaneously, the G3 Autumn S. at Ascot was being won in good style by Ibn Khaldun, a colt from the first crop by Kingmambo's imposing son Dubai Destination. The parallels continue, as both colts are out of Sadler's Wells mares which showed high-class form at two years. Indeed, their dams competed against each on several occasions, once filling first and second positions in Ascot's Fillies' Mile, in which Ibn Khaldun's dam Gossamer was chased home by Thewayyouare's dam Maryinsky.

The appeal of crossing Kingmambo and his sons with Sadler's Wells mares is that the cross produces inbreeding to Northern Dancer and Special, whose names will forever be associated with that extraordinary triumvirate of Nureyev, Sadler's Wells and Fairy King.

However, when trying to evaluate the effectiveness of a certain nick, you have to ask whether there is another possible reason for the animals in question being as talented as they are. For example, Thewayyouare is the second foal of Maryinsky and he still has some way to go before he can be considered the equal of his predecessor, the quadruple G1 winner Peeping Fawn, by Danehill, whose 3x3 inbreeding to Northern Dancer isn't combined with inbreeding to Special.

Thewayyouare's parentage gives him every right to be a top-notch performer, without any help from a "nick." His sire Kingmambo is responsible for no fewer than seven Classic winners in Britain or France and has also sired winners of a Belmont S. and a Japanese Derby. And his broodmare sire Sadler's Wells appears currently to be heading for his third consecutive broodmare sires' championship in Britain and Ireland, where he had previously been champion sire 14 times in 15 years. As if this weren't enough, Maryinsky is a half-sister to Better Than Honour, the dam of Rags to Riches and Jazil. As Thewayyouare's second dam won the Kentucky Oaks and his third dam Best In Show was Broodmare of the Year, it simply isn't possible to attribute his talent simply to his inbreeding (4x3 to Northern Dancer, 4x4 to Special, 4x5 to Native Dancer and 5x5 to Nasrullah). But the overall picture suggests that the inbreeding can certainly help.

Indeed, this cross has proved so compelling that there are now 73 foals of racing age by Kingmambo out of Sadler's Wells mares, with Thewayyouare being one of more than a dozen two-year-olds. These two-year-olds also include Henrythenavigator, winner of the G2 Coventry S. and second in the G1 Phoenix S., and Campanologist, a dual winner who has tried Group 2 company. Alexandros, another of Kingmambo's current group-winning juveniles, is out of a mare by a disappointing son of Sadler's Wells.

Thewayyouare is Kingmambo's sixth group winner out of a Sadler's Wells mare, others being the Group 1 winner El Condor Pasa (whose dam failed to earn a single penny during a nine-race career) and the Classic-winning fillies Virginia Waters and Divine Proportions.

Ibn Khaldun isn't the only recent Group 3 winner from this cross for Godolphin. Creachadoir, a close second in this year's French and Irish 2000 Guineas before his purchase, is by Kingmambo's Classic-winning son King's Best out of a Sadler's Wells mare. He's one of four stakes winners bred this way, another being the 2006 Irish Derby third Best Alibi.

Ibn Khaldun follows Meeriss as the second stakes winner to emerge from Dubai Destination's first runners, which also include Dubai Time, runner-up in the G3 Prix des Chenes.

As you might guess from his price tag of \$1.5 million as a yearling, Dubai Destination is a very well-connected horse and he justified his purchase during a career restricted by injury to eight starts in three seasons. The sky looked to be the limit when he defeated Rock of Gibraltar in the G2 Champagne S. and he also looked extremely good when he defeated Hawk Wing in the G1 Queen Anne S. at four.

These efforts made him one of the highest-priced new stallions in Britain in 2004 and he was entrusted with some good mares, none better than Ibn Khaldun's dam Gossamer.

This mare--a reminder of the glory days of the late Gerald Leigh's Eydon Hall Stud--was one of four group winners out of the G1 Prix de la Foret winner Brocade. Gossamer's win in the Irish 1000 Guineas completed a tremendous double for Brocade, as Gossamer's brother Barathea had won the Irish 2000 Guineas (and the Breeders' Cup Mile). An indication of this family's reputation was provided when one of Brocade's daughters, Brocatelle, sold for 1.7 million guineas in 2000 and another, Zibilene, made 1.5 million guineas a year later.

Ibn Khaldun has now won his last three starts, on each occasion producing fine acceleration after being held up, and it would be no surprise were this royally bred colt to win at an even higher level.

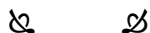

VITAL EQUINE TO BEARSTONE

Vital Equine (Ire) (Danetime {Ire}--Bayalika {Ire}, by Selkirk) has been retired to Bearstone Stud following an injury sustained in last Saturday's G1 Prix de la Foret. Last year's G2 Champagne S. winner, who went on to finish runner-up in this year's G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket, will stand at Terry Holdcroft's Shropshire-based operation Stud in 2008 alongside Firebreak (GB), Indes-atchel (Ire) and Reel Buddy. Trained by Eoghan O'Neill, Vital Equine's career-best success came at the expense of the subsequent G1 Epsom Derby runner-up Eagle Mountain (GB) and Cockney Rebel (Ire) in the Champagne at York last September, after which he was also third in the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere at Longchamp the following month. He suffered a reversal of the Champagne form when 1 1/2-lengths second to Cockney Rebel in the 2000 Guineas, but was off the board in the Irish equivalent and Prix de la Foret after a lengthy break. "We are thrilled to be bringing such a high-class son of a hugely successful and much missed stallion to Bearstone Stud," Holdcroft said. "He is a very impressive horse, fast and precocious enough to be a Group 2 winner at two and classy enough to go so close to winning the 2000 Guineas at three. We believe that he offers the commercial British breeder a tremendous opportunity to tap into the most successful sire line in Europe at present." A fee has not been announced.

SCOTNEY DENIES COMMENT

Yesterday's proceedings during the race-fixing trial at the Old Bailey brought about further revelations, as British racing's Head of Security Paul Scotney denied making a statement that he would "get" Kieren Fallon. Under cross-examination by Christopher Sallon QC, who is defending Shaun Lynch, Scotney was asked to comment on a complaint made about him by trainer Alan Jarvis after a social function in November 2006. "At that meeting in 2006, which Mr. Jarvis attended, you said quite audibly that you will 'get' Kieren Fallon if this is the last thing you do," said Mr. Sallon. To which Scotney replied, "I would not have said that." Fallon and his five co-defendants deny the charges of conspiracy to defraud between December 2002 and September 2004.
