SOLID START FOR TATTS PART TWO

Part Two of Tattersalls' October Yearling Sale began in Newmarket yesterday with a lively trade producing figures well up on the equivalent day in 2006. A total of 31 lots made six figures, compared to 20 last year.

Leading the way was lot 783, a filly by Oasis Dream who looks set to join Co. Tipperary trainer David Wachman's stable after bringing 300,000gns yesterday. Wachman--standing with his father-in-law, John Magnier--outbid Hamdan Al Maktoum's racing

manager Angus Gold for the bay. The daughter of Jackie's Opera (Fr) (Indian Ridge {Ire}) was a successful pinhook for vendor Ger Hourigan's Whitehall Stud; she was bought for 72,000gns as a weanling at Tattersalls' December Sale last year. The yearling's second dam is G1 Prix de Diane Hermes heroine Escaline (Fr). Sheikh Hamdan was in attendance, and his manager made nine successful bids. His purchases were headed by hip 846, a 210,000gns son of Cape Cross (Ire). Out of Madame Dubois (GB) (Legend of France), the bay is a half to Indian Haven (GB) (Indian Ridge {Ire}), winner of the 2003 G1 Irish 2000 Guineas; and Count Dubois (GB) (Zafonic), hero of the G1 Gran Criterium in 2000. He was bred by Cliveden Stud and consigned by Watership Down Stud. Rahy was responsible for another 210,000gns youngster, hip 923, a colt out of No More Ironing (Slew O'Gold) knocked down to Bedfordshire agent David Metcalfe. The half to G1 Kentucky Oaks third Sneaky Quiet (Seeking the Gold) will race for Dubai-based Britons Steven and Gillian Lamprell, owners of G1 Prix de l'Opera heroine Satwa Queen (Fr). "The Lamprells wanted to have one or two horses in England, and this colt is going to Ed Dunlop along with a Johannesburg we got last week," said Metcalfe. The colt, also a half to MSW Ironman Dehere (Dehere), was purchased as a weanling for \$120,000 at Keeneland in November. SMART STRIKE JOINS ELITE SIRES

Sitting atop the leading sires' list with progeny earnings of over \$9 million, and with horses such as G1 Preakness S. winner Curlin to his credit, Lane's End's **Smart Strike** (Mr. Prospector) has enjoyed a breakout

year in 2007. That was reflected Monday when Lane's End released its stud fees for 2008, with Smart Strike's fee doubled to \$150,000 for the upcoming breeding season.

Such a jump could be justified, if one chose to, by a single afternoon. On Sunday, Sept. 30, Smart Strike scored the rarest of feats for a sire--a trio of

Grade I winners, all on the same day, all at the same track: Curlin defeated Lawyer Ron in Belmont's 1 1/4-mile Jockey Club Gold Cup, Fabulous Strike romped in the six-furlong Vosburgh S. and English Channel took his second straight Joe Hirsch Turf Classic Invitational at 1 1/2 miles. "I don't think it's ever happened before,"

said Lane's End's Will Farish. "The interesting thing that I think is so appealing to breeders is that he did it with a sprinter, a top turf horse and obviously a top dirt horse, at varying distances and on different surfaces. He's really a pretty remarkable stallion and, needless to say, we're encouraged and excited about him." The Grade I treble punctuated Smart Strike's dramatic rise in the stallion ranks. From 2000 to 2003, the Grade I-winning son of Mr. Prospector, out of Broodmare of the Year Classy 'N

Smart and a half to the brilliant Dance Smartly, stood for \$30,000. He dipped to \$20,000 in 2003, but steadily rose from \$25,000 in 2004 and \$35,000 in 2005 to \$50,000 in 2006. "You never can tell what causes a horse to move forward the way he has, but he's been very solid up to now and he had a very good year last year and a very good year this year," said Farish. **Smart Strike cont. p2**

John Ferguson, shopping for Sheikh Mohammed, spent 200,000gns for hip 859, a Cape Cross (Ire) colt out of G3 Prix Vanteaux winner Mare Nostrum (GB) (Caerleon). The bay, consigned by Timmy Hyde's Camas Park Stud, descends from the Fanfreluche dynasty. Trainer Mark Johnston, another of the day's bigger spenders, was stretched to 210,000gns to outbid Cheveley Park Stud's Chris Richardson to net hip 921. The Selkirk colt was consigned by John and Lady Carolyn Warren's Berkshire-based Highclere Stud. The flashy chestnut is a son of the Night Shift mare Night Frolic (GB), a half-sister to GSW Miss Caerleona (Fr), who is the dam of graded winners Karen's Capar and Miss Coronado. 

Smart Accomplishments...

To date, the 15-year-old Smart Strike has racked up seven champions, 51 stakes winners and 26 graded winners, including no fewer than five Grade I winners--Curlin, English Channel, Fabulous Strike, Soaring Free and Shadow Cast--as well as 2003 Japan Cup Dirt winner Fleetstreet Dancer. "Of course, with those accomplishments, the demand is really what dictates the stud fees, and we felt that it was more than appropriate to move forward with him," said Will Farish. "The demand really has been overwhelming." Farish credits the operation that bred and campaigned Smart Strike, Sam-Son Farms, for much of the stallion's success. "They have supported him tremendously from the very beginning," he explained.

During a telephone interview yesterday, Farish also commented on the decision to leave the number two stallion in the nation, Rags to Riches' sire **A.P. Indy** (Seattle Slew), at \$300,000. "We felt very comfortable at that figure," he said. "When you get much above that, it just becomes very tough for breeders."

And of the addition of **After Market**--who becomes the first son of Storm Cat to stand at Lane's End--Farish said, "I'm very excited to have him--a great pedigree, a Storm Cat who could go the distance, and a very sound horse with great conformation. And he's out of such a tremendous mare [Tranquility Lake]."

U-TURN FOR 'TIME'

Khalid Abdullah's **Passage of Time (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) will run in the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf after connections decided against a tilt at Saturday's G1 Emirates Airline Champion S. at Newmarket. Despite indications that last year's G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud heroine would bypass the Oct. 27 contest at Monmouth, Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe told *Daily Mail* that the Juddmonte homebred was back in the picture for a trans-Atlantic flight. "We wanted to see what the Breeders' Cup was looking like and she was entered in it," Grimthorpe explained. "It is a bit of a turnaround, but the Champion S. looks very competitive. We'll use an American jockey, as Richard Hughes can't do [118 pounds]."

GI Alabama S. heroine **Lady Joanne** (Orientate) tuned up for the Oct. 27 GI Breeders' Cup Distaff with a half-mile in :48.60 Tuesday morning at Churchill Downs. The three-year-old filly clicked off fractions of :12.60 and :24.40 and galloped out five panels in 1:01.20, pulling up the three-quarters in 1:14. "She went real good this morning," said jockey Calvin Borel, who was in the irons for the move. Added trainer Carl Nafzger, "If they aren't doing good, they shouldn't be [going to the Breeders' Cup]." The filly will have her final Breeders' Cup breeze at Churchill and ship to Monmouth next week. Nafzger added that Lady Joanne will be back for a four-year-old campaign, and possibly beyond. "She'll run again [after the Breeders' Cup]," he remarked. "[Owner Bentley Smith] wants to run her. She will run as long as she is sound. If she gets a little sore, she will go off [to the breeding shed], but until then, she'll be a racehorse."



"SCINTILLATING" WORK FOR NEW APPROACH

G1 National S. winner **New Approach (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), getting ready for Saturday's G1 Darley Dewhurst S. at Newmarket, stretched his legs on the Coolcullen gallops yesterday morning. "It was a scintillating piece of work," trainer Jim Bolger told *Racing Post*. "It all went very well and he is in very good form for Saturday." Last year, Bolger guided European champion Teofilo (Ire), another son of Galileo (Ire), through an undefeated juvenile campaign that culminated with a victory in the Dewhurst. Unbeaten New Approach, coming off a 1 3/4-length score over Rio de la Plata at The Curragh Sept. 16, will bid to emulate that accomplishment. The Paul Cole-trained duo of **Moynihan** (Johannesburg) and **Lucky Money (Ire)** (Indian Ridge {Ire}) also worked out yesterday, getting their final preparations in at Cole's Whatcombe establishment. "They both worked very well and are in tip-top form," Cole told *Racing Post*. "If there is a bit of cut in the ground it shouldn't bother either of them." Jockey Jamie Spencer will partner Moynihan, while regular rider Richard Quinn will stay aboard Lucky Money. **Dewhurst S. cont. p6**

Hatta Fort's Participation Depends on the Going...

G2 Superlative S. winner **Hatta Fort (GB)** (Cape Cross {Ire}), fourth in the Oct. 7 G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere, is on target for the Dewhurst, but will only run if the going is to trainer Mick Channon's liking. "He's come out of his run at Longchamp great, but he didn't like the going there," Channon told *Racing Post*. "It was a good effort in the circumstances, but if the ground's soft he won't run on Saturday." There was rain in the forecast for Newmarket last night, but Clerk of the Course, quoted in *Racing Post*, said, "Tonight is quite key to what ground we will have, but high pressure is forecast to build from Wednesday through to Saturday with plenty of sunny spells on Saturday. I think we will be good to soft on Friday on the track used for the Cambridgeshire, but on fresh ground on Saturday we should be close to good."

SEN. BRUNO: STATE CORP SHOULD DECIDE FRANCHISE FUTURE

State Senate Majority Leader Joseph Bruno has come up with a proposal that would create an 11-member state corporation to award the franchise for the three tracks currently run by the New York Racing Association. The corporation, to be called the Racing, Gaming, and Equine Sports Development Corp., would also act as an oversight committee for the new franchise holder. Under Bruno's recommendation, the five members of the current NYRA Oversight Board would be included on the new board. The corporation would take bids from those interested in attaining the franchise to run the tracks and/or the Aqueduct casino, and then would have a say in how the new franchise holder conducted its business. Bruno's proposal would also bring New York's off-track betting operations under the umbrella of the new corporation. There were opponents to the proposal. NYRA President Charles Hayward issued a statement reiterating his company's backing for Spitzer's plan, while State Assembly Speaker Sheldon Silver stated that the Senate Majority "offered a plan for Thoroughbred racing that provided no details and no clear vision." Any final decision as to who will be awarded the franchise must be approved by the governor and the State Assembly and Senate.

Six Groups Eye for Aqueduct Casino...

Six companies have notified New York State that they would be interested in operating the proposed Aqueduct casino. Under a recommendation made by Gov. Eliot Spitzer, NYRA would be awarded a 30-year extension for the franchise to run Aqueduct, Belmont Park and Saratoga, while a second entity would be chosen to run the casino. The six groups interested in the casino are: partners Delaware North (which owns Finger Lakes and dropped out of Empire Racing last week) and Saratoga Gaming and Raceway; and Greenwood Racing (owner of Philadelphia Park); and casino operators Foxwoods Development Co; Mohegan Sun and partner Capital Play; Seneca Gaming Corp; and the Shinnecock Indian nation and Gateway Casino Resorts. Missing from the list is Empire Racing and Excelsior Racing, two of the four original bidders for the franchise. Spitzer said he would consult with NYRA when deciding on a casino operator. There are two proposals on the table regarding the casino's business model. One would have the casino built and owned by New York State, with the operator paid either a set fee or a share in the revenue. The second would require the operator to receive a split of the revenue after financing the building of the facility.

El Nino to Martin Stables South:

El Nino (Storm Cat--Bay Harbor, by Forty Niner) will join the stallion roster at Eddie Martin's Martin Stables South for the 2008 breeding season. Bred and owned by Overbrook Farm, the four-year-old was third in last year's GII Amsterdam S. for trainer D. Wayne Lukas. On the board in eight of 15 starts, El Nino won three times and earned \$153,849. He is out of Bay Harbor, a half sister to champion juvenile Boston Harbor (Capote). "I am happy to stand this exciting young Storm Cat prospect with Hidden Lake Farm and McMahon Thoroughbreds," Martin said. "Sons of Storm Cat from fast two-year-old families appeal to the Florida marketplace and El Nino should be an attractive first-year sire for area breeders." El Nino will stand for \$5,000 live foal, stands and nurses.
