LAWYER RON RETIRED

Lawyer Ron (Langfuhr--Donation, by Lord Avie), a MGISW of \$2,790,008, has been retired and will head to Stonewall Farm Stallions, it was announced yesterday. His stud fee has been set at \$30,000. "It is just the right time, and timing is every thing in the Thoroughbred industry," said attorney Ron Bamberger, a long-time friend and advisor of Lawyer Ron's owner/breeder, the late James T. Hines Jr. It was for Bamberger that the colt was named. Lawyer Ron was a top

candidate for the 2006 GI Kentucky Derby after a four-race winning streak capped by the GII Arkansas Derby for trainer Bob Holthus. Tragically, Hines was the victim of an accidental drowning during that run, but Lawyer Ron continued on the Derby trail for Hines's estate. Stonewall purchased an interest in the chestnut before the "Run for the Roses." Twelfth on the first Saturday in May, he went on to take the St. Louis Derby and run second in the GII Super Derby before being transferred to Todd Pletcher. He was unplaced in the 2006 GI Breeders' Cup Classic, but won four of his first six starts this year, setting a Saratoga track record for nine panels in the GI Whitney H. and cruising by 8 1/4 lengths in the GI Woodward S. He was beaten a neck by Curlin the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup, and concluded his racing career with a record of 26-12-4-4. "Lawyer Ron is 100-percent sound and at his peak, he's won the big races, set a new track record and is the top older horse in the country right now," Bamberger added.

MR. GREELEY'S STUD FEE TO \$125,000

Gainesway announced yesterday that the stud fee for **Mr. Greeley** (Gone West--Long Legend, by Reviewer) has been raised to \$125,000 for 2008. "Mr. Greeley is now one of the top 10 sires in the world," said Gainesway President Antony Beck. "His success in Europe, with dual-classic winner and champion Finsceal Beo, has helped move him to the highest level of racing and commercial success." Beck added, "This year, Mr. Greeley had 20 individual yearlings sell for \$300,000 or more, including the \$2.2-million sale-topping colt at Saratoga. His new stud fee is being set by the marketplace, and the mares our fellow breeders have already committed to him are truly outstanding." The 15-year-old is represented by 20 graded or group winners to date. Gainesway Director of Sales Michael Hernon said, "Mr. Greeley possesses Mr. Prospector-line miler speed and he is passing it on to his progeny." **Gainesway Box, p3**

DISTORTED HUMOR RISES TO \$300,000

WinStar Farm has announced that **Distorted Humor** (Forty Niner--Danzig's Beauty, by Danzig), represented by three Grade I winners this year, will stand for \$300,000 in 2008. The 14-year-old stallion's fee was \$225,000 this past season. "Distorted Humor has set the standard for our stallion operation at WinStar," said President Doug Cauthen. "With his first crop to race, he was leading freshman sire; in his second year with runners, he had a Kentucky Derby winner, and it's just gotten better from there. He represents the model of consistency of a great sire." **Cont. p2**

PLAINTIFFS AWARDED SHARE IN CURLIN

The 418 plaintiffs in a civil lawsuit against attorneys Shirley Cunningham Jr. and William Gallion, minority owners of GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero Curlin, have been awarded a 20-percent interest in the colt by a Kentucky court, the *Daily Racing Form* reports. Cunningham and Gallion, who represented the plaintiffs in a lawsuit against the maker of the diet drug phenfen, are charged with misappropriating tens of millions of the \$200-million settlement in that case and remain in jail awaiting a criminal trial. The two bought Curlin for \$57,000 as a yearling and raced him in the name of Midnight Cry Stable, which is owned by their company, Tandy LLC. They sold an 80-percent interest in the colt to Stonestreet Stable, Padua Stables and George Bolton after his maiden win in February. **Cont. p2**

EXCELLENT ART RETIRED TO COOLMORE

Excellent Art (GB) (Pivotal {GB}--Obsessive, by Seeking the Gold), who capped off his career with a second-place finish in the Oct. 27 GI Breeders' Cup Mile at Monmouth Park, has been retired to Coolmore in Ireland. The three-year-old will stand for a fee of £25,000. Bred by Cheveley Park and purchased by Matthew Green for 76,000gns as a

DONSEP yearling, Excellent Art followed a debut maiden win at two with a nine-length romp in the National S. at Sandown. Third in the G2 Railway S. and G1 Prix Morny, he completed his juvenile campaign with a victory in the G2 Mill Reef S. Mrs. John Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith bought into the colt after that performance, and he was transferred from trainer Neville Callaghan to Aidan O'Brien. The bay was a troubled fourth in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains in his first start under new management, but followed up with a win in the G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot. Excellent Art had only Ramonti (GB) in front of him in the G1 Sussex S. in August and in his penultimate outing, the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. in September. He retires with a record of 10-4-3-2 and earnings of £630,196.

Doug Cauthen continued, “[Distorted Humor] ended 2006 as the leading sire of stakes winners in North America with 20. In 2007, he is the leading sire of Grade I winners and co-leading sire of stakes winners with 18. With five individual \$1-million plus yearlings at Keeneland September, coupled with his year-in, year-out success with top class runners, we feel he has found himself in a class alongside A.P. Indy and Storm Cat. Therefore, we have set his fee at \$300,000.” Darley purchased a number of shares in the chestnut stallion in September, and have also acquired the future services of his son Any Given Saturday, winner of this year's GI Haskell Invitational. Distorted Humor is also represented by 2007 Grade I stakes winners Bit of Whimsy and Hystericalady. **WinStar Box, p3**

In a ruling late Thursday, Boone County Circuit Court Judge William Wehr gave the plaintiffs against Cunningham and Gallion control of Tandy LLC. Angela Ford, attorney for the plaintiffs, told DRF that her clients, as well as Stonestreet principal Jess Jackson, Padua owner Satish Sanan and Bolton, may be planning to sell Curlin. “Everyone has agreed to sell, but there's no agreement yet on whether that will be done by a private sale or at public auction,” Ford said.

Coolmore has purchased a majority interest in Thursday's G1 Criterium International victor **Thewayyouare** (Kingmambo). "He will remain in training with Andre Fabre next season and continue to race in the colours of Sean Mulryan, with whom we are delighted to be in partnership," Christy Grassick said. "He will ultimately retire to Coolmore and is an extremely exciting stallion prospect, being by Kingmambo from the immediate family of El Gran

Senor, and with superstars Peeping Fawn and Rags to Riches both coming up in his pedigree this year." Thewayyouare, a son of the Sadler's Wells mare Maryinsky (Ire) bred by Barnett Enterprises, has won four of five career starts, including the G3 Prix Thomas Bryon Oct. 13.

BECRUX JAPAN BOUND Team Valor International's **Becrux (Ity)** (Glen Jordan {GB}), winner of the 2006 GI Woodbine Mile, will make his next start the G1 Mile Championship at Kyoto Nov. 18. "Becrux will be the first runner to carry our silks in a race in Japan," Team Valor International President Barry Irwin said. "We have won Grade I races in many countries and we would love to make an impression in Japan. We have the deepest respect for the Japanese horses, but we feel our horse is back to his best and we have confidence he will represent us well." Becrux was last seen finishing third in the GIII Morvich H. at Oak Tree Oct. 27.

Purchased by Glencrest Farm for \$70,000 from the 2002 Wimborne Farm dispersal, the six-year-old mare went on to win 13 races, including the GI E.P. Taylor S. and GI Flower Bowl Invitational S. The gray was third in the 2006 GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf, and capped off a stellar career with a second-place finish in the 2007 edition of the event. Trained by Todd Pletcher for all 32 starts, she earned \$2,784,159.

Tiza started his France campaign with a victory in the G3 Prix de Ris-Orangis at Deauville July 11. He dropped down the scale to finish 10th in the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest back at the Normandy track Aug. 5 before hitting the board in the G3 Prix de Meautry in his penultimate start Aug. 26. Making late headway to finish sixth in the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye at Longchamp Oct. 7, he found this task easier and disposed of his 15 rivals with ease. Finding cover at the back of the pack from the outset, Tiza made headway on the outside to challenge at the distance, and he was ridden clear in the latter stages for a commanding success. "He ran an excellent race in the Abbaye when he was caught for early speed, and six furlongs is obviously his best trip," commented trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre. "He's a much-travelled South African horse who joined the stable in the spring and is only just starting to acclimatize to his new surroundings and the French training methods. He has now won two Group 3 races [in France] and I'm convinced he will win a major race one day. In the meantime, we would like to go to Hong Kong and I hope he'll be invited as I'm sure he'll have a very good chance in the [G1] Sprint [at Sha Tin Dec. 9]." **Click for the [Racing Post chart](#).**

Pleasant Hill, first or second in her first six career starts, looks to get back on track after running sixth in the Sept. 29 GIII Kentucky Cup Distaff S. on the Turfway Park all-weather. Diagnosed with a hairline knee fracture last fall, the four-year-old filly came back after nearly nine months on the sidelines to take a Churchill Downs allowance test June 10. She stumbled at the start when making her route debut June 30, but still got up to be second, then wired the field in the Aug. 18 GIII Gardenia H. going a mile at Ellis Park. She tired after pressing the pace last time out. "She was up on the front end and a little too aggressive that day," trainer Greg Foley said. "She just didn't finish that day, but she has come back good and had a couple of good works." As for today's tactics, Foley said, "I'd like to see her in a good stalking position, laying about third or fourth and maybe four or five lengths off the pace, and then mow them down." **Trendy Lady**, runner-up behind **Lady Belsara** in the GIII Chicago H. at Arlington in June, faded to fifth in an optional claimer at Saratoga Aug. 1, but came back to take an optional claimer at Keeneland last time out Oct. 7. Lady Belsara had some time off after her Arlington score, returning to be fifth after showing good speed in the Oct. 6 GIII Thoroughbred Club of America S. at Keeneland. She should improve in her second start off the layoff.

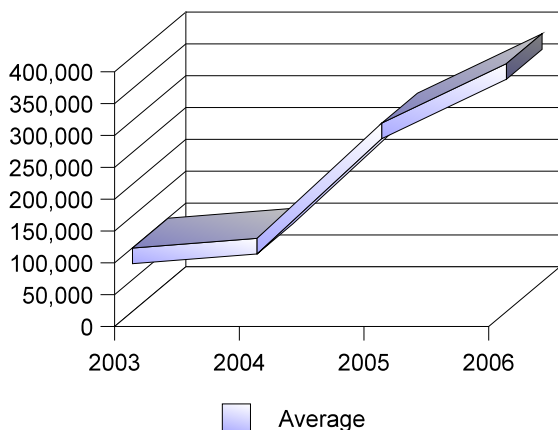

The 2003 renewal almost seems like a different sale, in fact. Consider this: four years ago, 59 head sold for \$5,160,000--an average of \$87,458 and a median of \$45,000. Things got rolling in 2004 when the average eclipsed the six-figure mark (\$102,914). A new watershed was reached that year when I'll Get Along, dam of Smarty Jones, realized \$5 million, but it was in 2005 that the numbers skyrocketed across the board. The Grade I winner Riskaverse brought \$5 million, helping the average soar to \$287,338 while the median jumped to \$86,000. As good as 2005 was, 2006 was even better. Last year, a total of 14 horses made \$1 million or more, including sales-topper Sharp Lisa, who was knocked down for \$3.4 million, as well as the \$3.3-million broodmare prospect Summerly. **Cont. p2**

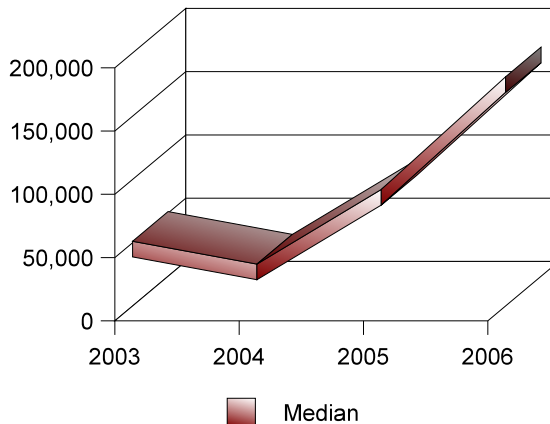

The momentum, it seems, has carried over to this year, and sellers have been complimentary of Fasig officials. "Fasig-Tipton has done such a good job throughout the year, and you know you're going to have the spotlight shine on a top mare," said West Point Thoroughbreds' Terry Finley, who offers Dream Rush and Irish Smoke through the Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency. "The credit goes to them for developing a niche in the November Broodmare sale." Mark Taylor, of perennial leading consigner Taylor Made Sales Agency, agrees. "A few years ago, they sold the dam of Smarty Jones, and I think that particular year she was the highest-priced mare sold," Taylor commented. "I think that showed that

Fasig-Tipton could sell a mare in this market. And I think that they've really targeted that market segment and they devote a lot of their time and energy to recruiting those mares that are top racemares coming right off the track. It's a viable option. Keeneland is the international marketplace and I think Fasig has tried to carve out niches that they can really focus on. They're not going to try and do everything--they don't have the resources. But they focus on top mares for a one-night sale in November and they focus on top-end yearlings at Saratoga and they're very big in the two-year-old market down at Calder. They pick those markets to put a lot of their efforts into, and I think it's paid off for them."

Catalogue updates don't get much better than a Breeders' Cup win. As it was, the six-year-old **Maryfield** (Elusive Quality) had assured herself plenty of attention after taking the GI Ballerina S. at Saratoga this year. But with her victory in last week's inaugural \$1-million Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint, she may well have sealed an Eclipse Award in the new female sprinter division, giving buyers even further incentive to bid early and often.

Maryfield is a daughter of the stakes-placed Sly Maid (Desert Wine) and is a half-sister to graded stakes-placed Quiet (Roar), who herself has produced MSP Quietly Mine (Belong to Me). Though she possesses a sprinter's turn of foot, Maryfield has plenty of stamina in her pedigree, too. Her third dam, the Sea Hawk II mare Miss Pele, is a full-sister to GI San Juan Capistrano Invitational victress *La Zanzara, who defeated males in the race. Miss Pele produced GI San Luis Obispo H. winner Sir Pele and San Juan Capistrano third Swoon.

More to the Point...

Despite a somewhat disappointing Breeders' Cup, West Point Thoroughbreds has enjoyed a banner 2007 with a quartet of Grade I winners to its credit, three of which are fillies: the two-year-old GI Spinaway S. heroine **Irish Smoke** (Smoke Glacken), GI Test S. and GI Prioress S. winner **Dream Rush** (Wild Rush) and GI Gazelle S. winner **Lear's Princess** (Lear Fan). All three, entered in the Fasig November sale prior to the Breeders' Cup, were highly regarded going into racing's biggest days, but track conditions and other factors may have played against the three, and each failed to hit the board.

Earlier this week, West Point President Terry Finley called an audible and withdrew Lear's Princess from tomorrow's sale, but in Dream Rush and Irish Smoke, West Point offers a pair of very exciting prospects that are sure to be

popular with buyers.

"I saw them about two hours ago, and they're both showing well and getting a lot of attention," Finley said yesterday afternoon.

Not surprisingly, Finley said that parting with Dream Rush and Irish Smoke is anything but easy.

"It's kind of bittersweet that they're both going to be sold Sunday," he admitted. "It's tough. You've got partners that have grown attached to them. They're both upper-end fillies. Dream Rush didn't get lucky in the Breeders' Cup. Otherwise, she would have been the champion [female sprinter]. They both won Grade Is for us at Saratoga, and we know how important and special winning any race at Saratoga is, much less a Grade I. It really drives it home how special they are, as individual racehorses and to the partners."

The inclusion of partnership-owned fillies like Dream Rush and Irish Smoke at Fasig is likely a sign of things to come. As partnerships proliferate and more and more of their runners win important races, more and more accomplished fillies figure to find their way into the sales ring, as few partnerships have ventured into breeding. Selling broodmare and/or racing prospects, like Dream Rush and Irish Smoke, also offers investors an immediate and sizeable return.

The decision boils down to simple economics. Dream Rush was purchased by West Point for \$285,000 as a juvenile in training. She's thus far earned \$627,864, but her value as a racing/broodmare prospect could be many times that number. Irish Smoke was bought for \$285,000, as well, and earned \$187,200 winning two of four starts as a two-year-old. She, too, could bring the West Point partners a tidy profit, especially considering she was purchased just nine months ago.

Finley said he expected to see more owners, especially partnerships, offer horses-in-training at sales.

“More and more people are doing one or the other-- either they run or they breed,” he said. “For us, it was never a matter of if we would sell these fillies, but a matter of when. That's really just what it boils down to.”

Finley added that timing also plays a role in the decision-making process, and said yesterday that most of the partners agreed that now is the right time to sell the pair.

“It's a fluid situation, but we had the majority of the people agree to send them through the ring,” he said. “We just threw it up there and everyone pretty much agreed. We feel the market is very strong right now. We were hoping to come into this sale with a Breeders' Cup win, especially for Dream Rush, and to have all the stars aligned. As it is, almost all the stars aligned.”

Another Partnership Horse Goes Through the Ring...

In addition to the fillies brought to the auction by West Point, another successful partnership, Cot Campbell's Dogwood Stables, is offering up this year's GI Acorn S. winner **Cotton Blossom** (Broken Vow) (who upset Dream Rush in that one-mile event, it should be noted). One of the more consistent fillies in her division over the last two years, Cotton Blossom won the GIII Schuylerville S. at two and was placed in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and GI Spinaway S., then returned this year to take the Acorn and Florida Oaks and place in the GII Fantasy S. and GII Delaware Oaks. Cotton Blossom exited an unplaced finish in the GI Test S. at Saratoga with a career-ending injury and will be sent through the ring as a broodmare prospect only. Three Chimneys consigns the half-sister to GSW Vicarage (Vicar).

Notable Outs...

While the Fasig sale is still chock full of promising racing and broodmare prospects, there are some notable outs. As mentioned, **Lear's Princess** (Lear Fan) has been pulled from the sale by West Point Thoroughbreds. Puglisi Stables and Steve Klesaris's **Miraculous Miss** (Mr. Greeley), who belied long odds to be runner-up in the inaugural running of the \$1-million Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint, is also out. Gone, too, are **Winter's Gone** (Dynaformer) (hip 123), dam of Grade I winner Sharp Lisa and graded winner Sharp Susan; **Dancing Edie** (Moscow Ballet) (hip 156), a Grade I winner in California who runs in today's Cal Cup Distaff H.; and this year's GI Del Mar Debutante S. victress **Set Play** (Van Nistelrooy) (hip 179).

Up An Octave...

History was made two years ago when a filly owned by Jack and Laurie Wolf's Starlight Stable and partners, the hard-knocking dual champion Ashado, brought \$9 million across town at the Keeneland November sale.

While her hopes of an Eclipse Award were essentially dashed when Rags to Riches beat Curlin in the GI Belmont S., another Starlight runner, **Octave** (Unbridled's Song), has put together what would be a championship season in many other years, and buyers will have a chance to vote with their wallets tomorrow when the gray filly, a late addition to the sale, steps into the ring as hip [112A](#). "Don [Lucarelli, co-owner] and I feel this is excellent timing to realize the full asset value of Octave," Wolf explained about the decision to supplement Octave to the sale. "She has been nothing short of sensational for two full seasons. We are a racing partnership and sold Ashado in similar circumstances, so offering Octave is very much in line with our business model." Starlight Stable and Lucarelli purchased Octave for \$350,000 as yearling and were rewarded in her juvenile year when she annexed the GI Adirondack Breeders' Cup S. at Saratoga. Runner-up in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, Octave really came into her own this term. After running a fantastic race to be second to stablemate Rags to Riches in the GI Kentucky Oaks, she captured the first two legs of NYRA's Triple Tiara, the GI Mother Goose S. and GI Coaching Club American Oaks. Last week, she put in a sustained rally to be third, beaten a half-length by Ginger Punch, in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff. Never out of the money in 13 starts, Octave has bankrolled \$1,660,934 to date. Taylor Made, who consigned Ashado, also consigns Octave, and the farm's Mark Taylor believes Octave's consistency at the sport's highest level makes her a hot commodity. "She basically broke her maiden at Churchill in May of her two-year-old year and immediately went into stakes competition," he said. "She ran in a listed stakes in her second start and she's run in 11 consecutive Grade Is or Grade IIs since then, and she's never been off the board. Her Breeders' Cup run was unbelievable. By the time she hit the wire, I think she was carrying 150 pounds--she took every bit of mud that was on that track and had to pack it down the lane. If they would have had a car wash at the sixteenth pole, she probably would have won. Unfortunately, she didn't quite get there, but she had just an unbelievable run and she's still sound and she's basically there for the taking. Somebody can take her and, I think, have a real good shot at an Eclipse Award next year, or they can take her [as a broodmare] and the sky's the limit. Unbridled's Song is just exploding as a broodmare sire."

The Ferguson Factor...

When this year's Keeneland September sale slumped by some 20 percent in Book 1, the drop was rightly credited to the scaled-back purchasing of John Ferguson, who represents Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum. Sheikh Mohammed's dollar--or lack thereof--rarely affects the later books at Keeneland, and so it was that this year's sale enjoyed admirable growth in Books 2 through 7.

While Sheikh Mohammed's reduced spending seriously affected the yearling sales, both in Europe and in America, he hasn't flexed his considerable buying muscle at the bloodstock sales in Lexington in the last few years--with the notable exception of the record \$9-million purchase of Ashado. Last year, according to Keeneland's website, Ferguson didn't sign one ticket at the November sale; similarly, his name did not appear on any of Fasig-Tipton's sales slips last year.

As a consequence, the current editions of the Fasig-Tipton and Keeneland November sales figure to offer a perhaps more accurate picture of the market, a market not so affected by the buying decisions of one man or buying team.

The good news for Fasig-Tipton and Keeneland, of course, is that if Sheikh Mohammed decides to pursue some of the enticing lots on offer over the next several days, both sales could build significantly on last year's numbers.



On Golden Pond...

She was one of the very best in her 2 1/2 years of racing for Rick Porter's Fox Hill Farm and, with a sterling pedigree to boost her stock, **Round Pond** (Awesome Again) figures to be one of the stars that will shine brightest in Fasig-Tipton's sales ring. The five-year-old mare, acquired by Porter for \$105,000 as a yearling, won the GI Acorn S. at three, then romped by 5 1/2 lengths in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Distaff. Sportingly, she was returned to training this spring and made two starts, including a third in the GI Apple Blossom S. at Oaklawn, but was retired after sustaining an injury. Porter said Round Pond comes into the sale in fine fettle.

"Everybody's who's looked at her says she looks fantastic," he said, adding with a laugh, "She looks like a million dollars--pardon that pun." He added, "She needs the right breeder. She's got a terrific package. She's a gorgeous-looking mare and she was the real deal on the racetrack."

Round Pond was produced by Gift of Dance (Tremolino), a daughter of the G1SP Coral Dance (Fr), and thus a half to Group 1/Grade I winners Black Minnaloushe (Storm Cat), Pennekamp (Bering {GB}), and Nasr El Arab (Al Nasr {Fr}).

"Everyone knows about Round Pond--she won the Breeders' Cup last year," said consignor Mark Taylor. "But she's got a phenomenal female family behind her and she's one that the sky is the limit on how you want to breed her. She's out of a Tremolino mare who is out of one of the best families in Europe. So, she's a mare that excelled on dirt, was a Breeders' Cup winner on dirt, but she's got a family that could like any surface. I think the major players are going to think she's a must-have item."

The sale of Round Pond could cap an outstanding year for Porter's Fox Hill. The stable campaigned GI Kentucky Derby and GI Breeders' Cup Classic runner-up and GI King's Bishop hero Hard Spun, who has been retired to Darley to stand the 2008 season.

BUYING AT THE TOP OF THE MARKET AT 2006 FASIG-TIPTON NOVEMBER

SUN KING TO DARBY DAN Tracy Farmer's **Sun King** (Charismatic--Clever But Costly, by Clever Trick) will enter stud in 2008 at Darby Dan Farm for a fee of \$10,000. The five-year-old is scheduled to make two

more starts for trainer Nick Zito before retiring--today's GIII Ack Ack H. at Churchill Downs and the GI Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile H. at Aqueduct Nov. 24. Bred by Cambridge Farm and James Conway, Sun King was purchased for \$400,000 to top all yearlings at the 2003 Keeneland January sale.

He made a favorable impression at age two, finishing third in the GI Champagne S. and in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, and carried his good form into his sophomore season, winning the GII Pennsylvania Derby, the GIII Leonard Richards S. and the GIII Tampa Bay Derby. An explosive winner of the GII Commonwealth Breeders' Cup S. at Keeneland last year, the dark bay rallied to miss by a head to Silver Train in the GI Metropolitan Mile H. and by a nose to subsequent Horse of the Year Invasor (Arg) in the GI Whitney H. He was also third in the GI Woodward S., a race in which he finished runner-up to Lawyer Ron this past September. "Darby Dan is honored that Tracy Farmer selected Darby Dan to stand Sun King," said co-managing partner John Phillips. "In an effort to secure the best book for Sun King, Mr. Farmer has decided to offer a free season to Sun King to approved graded-stakes winning or producing mares." To date, Sun King has a record of 27-6-6-5 and earnings of \$2,197,018.

PURIM TO RICHLAND HILLS GISW Purim (Dynaformer--Kirsteena, by Lord At War {Arg}) has been retired and will take up stud duties at Richland Hills Farm in Midway, Kentucky for 2008. The five-year-old won four of his eight starts at three, including the GIII Arlington Classic on the grass. He came back last year to win the GIII Razorback BC H. on the dirt, but saved his best for his final season. The handsome dark bay opened the year with a victory in the Colonel E.R. Bradley S. at Fair Grounds, and was third, beaten less than a length by Kip Deville, in the GII Maker's Mark Mile S. at Keeneland two starts later. He rebounded from a pair of off-the-board efforts to take the John Henry S. at Arlington in September and made it two in a row in the Oct. 6 GI Shadwell Turf Mile S. at Keeneland. "Purim is a special horse, and we want to give him every advantage," Richland Hills owner Nathan Fox said. Bred and raced by E. J. Sukley and trained by Thomas F. Proctor, Purim retires with a record of 22-9-3-1 and a bankroll of \$923,003. He will stand for a fee of \$10,000. "He was adept on both dirt and turf and is an outcross to the majority of the population," Fox continued. "We believe he can attract mares from stallions who stand for considerably higher fees."



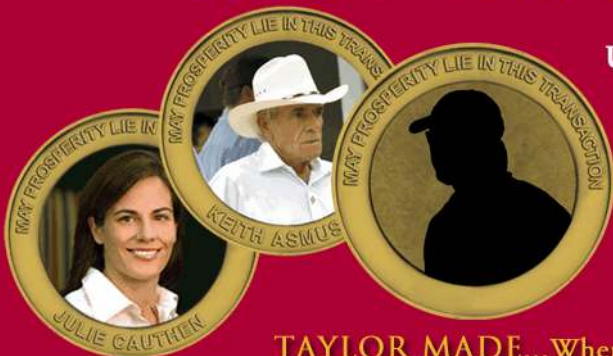

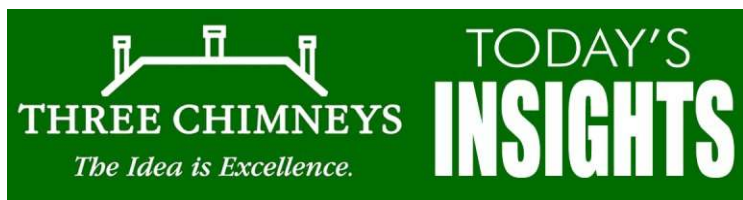

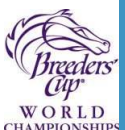

MONEY LINKS UNVEILED IN TRIAL

Yesterday's proceedings at the Old Bailey focused on the discovery of potential links between the syndicate manager at the centre of the alleged race-fixing plot Miles Rodgers and jockey Fergal Lynch. During the arrest of Rodgers in Sheffield in September 2004, City of London Police investigators are understood to have discovered Lynch's bank details in a briefcase belonging to the former. Statements made by the police at the time also outlined how shredded paper was re-constituted, and was found to have the initials "KF" and "£2,500" on it. Fallon, Lynch and fellow jockey Darren Williams, along with Rodgers, Lynch's brother Shaun Lynch and Philip Sherkle plead not guilty to conspiracy to defraud between December 2002 and August 2004. Rodgers also denies concealing the proceeds of crime.
