BAFFERT BACK FOR MORE CIGAR LUTE

Trainer Bob Baffert has grown accustomed to having Thanksgiving dinner in Southern California before boarding an eastbound plane to spend the weekend in the Big Apple, his sights set on the GI Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile H. The silver-haired conditioner has watched his runners take down top honors three times--in 2000

with current Hill 'n' Dale stallion El Corredor; and in 2002 and 2003 with Congaree. Neither one of those talented horses won an Eclipse Award, but GI Breeders' Cup Sprint hero **Midnight Lute** (Real Quiet) is certain to be honored as the nation's top sprinter early next year and could gain consideration as champion older horse with another victory this afternoon. True, the four-year-old, who shoulders top weight of 123 pounds, has never won beyond seven furlongs, but today's added ground should present no obstacle. "I don't think distance will be an issue for him," Baffert argued. "Thing is, he won the Sprint, but he's not a sprinter. The good ones, they're different." Midnight Lute was certainly in a class of his own on Breeders' Cup day. Some eight lengths behind at the quarter pole on a track which was not playing to off-the-pace horses, the strapping bay closed with enormous strides in one of the most outstanding performances in recent memory. **Daaher** (Awesome Again) is the main threat this afternoon. Given a bit of a break following his Skip Away score, A. P. Arrow was third in the June 9 Birdstone S. at Belmont Park, then shipped to the West Coast, where he finished sixth to Lava Man in the GI Hollywood Gold Cup S. June 30. Third to Lewis Michael in the GII Washington Park H. at Arlington July 28, the well-bred chestnut most recently completed the triple behind Student Council in the GII Hawthorne Gold Cup H. Sept. 29. Allowed to lope along in fourth as stablemates Fairbanks (Giant's Causeway) and Magna Graduate (Honor Grades) attended the pace, A.P. Arrow advanced on the turn and struck the front at the quarter pole. Brass Hat, who exchanged a sound bump with the eventual winner in the drive, poked his head in front at the furlong grounds, but A. P. Arrow re-rallied late for the victory. "The race unfolded just like [trainer] Todd [Pletcher] envisioned it," jockey Ramon Dominguez commented. "I was able to stay within striking distance and he was comfortable. I was able to split horses to get in front and just make sure that he was going to stay there. He wasn't just opening up on the field but they weren't making up any ground on him either." Pletcher indicated that A. P. Arrow would remain in training for 2008 and his early-season target would be the GI Donn H. Feb. 2. Favored Istan (Gone West), impressive winner of the GIII Ack Ack H. Nov. 3, rallied mildly into the stretch, but flattened out late to be fourth in the final start of his career.

Switched permanently to the turf earlier this season, Lang Field zipped through his conditions, going wire-to-wire at Santa Anita Mar. 17 and Apr. 13 and over this turf course May 10. Sixth to After Market in the GI Charles Whittingham Memorial H. at Hollywood June 9,

the gray was a close third to Becrux (lty) in the restricted Wickerr H. at Del Mar July 27. Seventh in the GII Del Mar Mile H. Aug. 19, the gelding came from a bit further off the pace than is his custom to finish a good third in the Oct. 13 War Chant S. in Arcadia. Willow O Wisp (Misnomer) and

Silent Name (Jpn) (Sunday Silence) set out at a good pace, as Lang Field saved ground from a position just short of midfield. Silent Name disposed of Willow O Wisp rounding the far turn, but now had a fresh challenge from Lang Field, who advanced outside a rival on the final turn. He took dead aim on the leader leaving the midstretch marker and was hard-ridden to last. "I had to utilize his speed a little to get position but we were able to sit behind and save the best for last," said winning rider Jon Court. "That turned out to be the best thing in a Grade I." Zann, favored off his runner-up effort in the GII Oak Tree Mile Oct. 7, trailed the field into the stretch and finished with good energy to just miss. "I had a decent trip, not a great trip," commented Zann's rider Garrett Gomez. "I got caught up in a little bit of traffic around the three-eighths pole. I wasn't losing any ground from where I was at, but I just had to wait until I could start making some kind of a run."

Edward Evans' homebred Mini Sermon made the most of her first attempt versus older fillies and mares, getting her nose down on the wire just ahead of the pacesetting Lady Marlboro. On the board in each of her first two career starts, Mini Sermon broke through with

a neck victory over Keeneland's Polytrack Apr. 14. Following a pair of wins at Belmont Park--first in a May 10 allowance and then the June 22 Marking Time S.--the gray tacked on a one-length success in the Sweetest Chant S. over Arlington's Polytrack July 28. Sixth in the

GIII Arlington Park Oaks Aug. 18, the Virginia-bred made her most recent appearance in Lexington, finishing an even third in the seven-furlong GII Lexus Raven Run S. Oct. 20. Lady Marlboro assumed command out of the chute, tracked intently by second choice Pool Land (Silver Deputy) with Mini Sermon tucked in at the rail in third. Deftly maneuvered to the three path for the stretch run, she dug in gamely and got the bob. "Coming into this race, she was doing everything right," commented Seth Benzel, assistant to trainer Todd Pletcher. "Eibar [Coa] put a perfect ride on her. He saved ground and let her relax. He was able to move her out, and wear them down after that." Golden Velvet, the slight favorite, came wide into the stretch and finished gamely for third, but the disappointment of the race was Pool Land, who weakened after pressing the pace and finished sixth.

Thorn Song failed to win in seven starts on the main track, but has turned it around with a switch to the turf. Winner of three straight on the grass, including an Aug. 13 allowance at Saratoga, the gray missed by a neck when second at Belmont Sept. 21. He was most recently a game runner-up in the GIII Knickerbocker H. at Aqueduct, but was a generous price in this spot. Favored Cosmonaut, third around the first bend, pulled Edgar Prado to the front after a half in :50 while Thorn Song rated just to his outside. The crowd's choice cut the corner into the stretch, but Kent Desormeaux still had Thorn Song in hand. Cosmonaut boxed on gamely, but Thorn Song, pulling six pounds from the chalk, was able to wear him down for the victory. "When we switched him over to the grass, he just became a different horse," said winning trainer Dale Romans. "I know he is tough and he has a lot of stamina. When he got to him and got a head in front, I didn't think there was any way he (Cosmonaut) could get back in front of him."

Trapped out wide on the far turn, he loomed boldly into the stretch, hit the front approaching the eighth pole and pulled away to win impressively. Indian Sun rallied nicely for the place spot.

MIXED MESSAGES

Keeneland's record 15-day November sale saw a new record for the sale's gross (\$340,877,200), and a new world record for a broodmare (Playful Act, \$10.5 million). With Fasig's Sunday and Adena Springs sales added in, Lexington's 16 days of selling saw 3,589 horses gross \$394,639,200 and average \$109,958. When you add it all up, the number sold was up by 5 percent, the gross was up by 4 percent and the average was actually down a little under 2 percent, compared to the whole November extravaganza last year. Fasig-Tipton had the ClassicStar dispersal last year (\$21.7 million), while Keeneland this year had a significant part of the Swettenham Stud dispersal (\$18 million, and look for some really big numbers at Tattersalls' December sale the next two weeks, including Playful Act's dam, Magnificent Style, from the same dispersal), plus a huge consignment from Hidden Brook, as agent for a big reduction from Adena Springs (\$21.6 million).

The problem, as I've often said about mixed sale catalogues, is that from one year to the next the catalogues may or may not be equivalent, whereas in the yearling sales they are more so. Everything else being equal (which it never is), that should make yearling sale comparisons more reliable.

But it hasn't all been sunshine and roses at the November sales, has it? Beginning last Friday, a total of 715 horses were sold in Keeneland's last two books, Books 7 and 8. Those 715 horses represent almost exactly 20 percent of the 3,589 total sales over the 16 days. Yet these 715 horses grossed only \$8,185,000, averaging \$11,448: that represents 2 percent of the 16-day gross, for just over 10 percent of the 16-day average. I wouldn't have thought many of that bottom 20 percent made anybody any money. That point was rammed home in two continents on Sunday and Monday, when Keeneland was selling Book 8, and Goffs had 544 weanlings catalogued for Book 1 of their November Mixed Sale. Of the 544 catalogued in Goffs Book 1, a total of 438 went through the ring--19 percent outs. Of those 438, only 188 (43 percent) were listed sales, meaning an appalling 57 percent were not. The 188 that did sell grossed \$1,866,000, averaging \$9,926. Though 16 percent more horses were catalogued on those two days than last year, the number sold was down 32 percent, the gross dipped 39 percent, and the average decreased 10 percent. I mention it now because we're liable to be talking about other things as the pedigrees get better and the European sales heat back up. But what a reality check. This message could hardly be clearer: for the bottom 20 percent of horses offered at the leading auctions, there is now little or no interest, and very definitely only about 1 in 100 is making anybody any money.

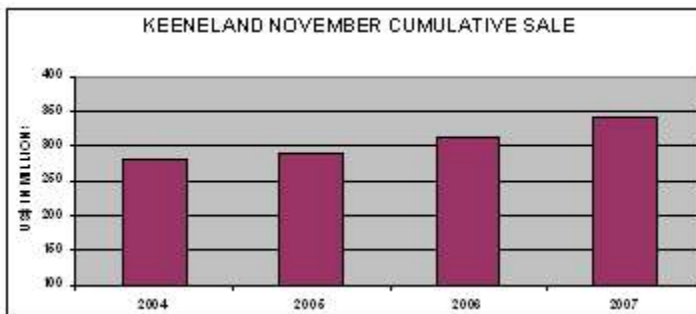
Goffs 2 offered three days of 'better' foals culminating on Thursday, and no doubt meaning that many of the Irish and other sale attendees missed Thanksgiving again. This went better, with 75 percent of the horses reported sold, meaning 480 of the 640 offered grossed \$18,923,400, and averaged \$39,429. This year Book 2 catalogued 735 weanlings--10 percent more than last year's 670--yet sold 4 percent fewer, 480 vs. 500 last year. The gross for the three days was down 7 percent, the average down 3 percent. For the entire five days, the number catalogued was up 12 percent, but the number sold down 14 percent. Consequently the nominal clearance rate (reported as sold) dropped from 79 percent last year to 62 percent this year. The gross was down 11 percent, but, through an interesting statistical anomaly, the average was actually up 4 percent. You're going to ask how that could be, since the average for the first two days was down 10 percent, and the average for the last three days was down 3 percent.

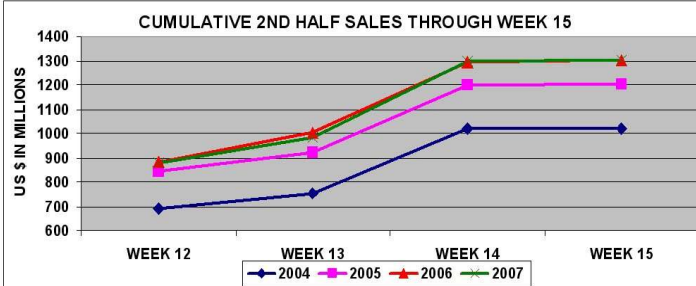

"How incredible is this? After the November sales at Fasig-Tipton and Keeneland, we calculate that 15,400 horses have now sold in the second-half calendar year yearling and mixed sales in North America and Europe. That is exactly 74 more horses than last year, or one-half of one percent. They have sold for a total of \$1,302,785,000 and change, and averaged \$84,596. The gross is up about \$2-million from last year (two-tenths of one percent), and the average is down by \$273 (three-tenths of one percent). Under a 1 percent change in the three key categories? I'd say that means: market is level."

Here's the answer: because the number sold of the first two days (which average only 25-30 percent of the last three days) was a significantly lower percentage of the total sold in 2007 than in 2006. Yep, that's the answer. Goffs' post-sale press release put a positive spin on it, which is to be expected, but when the clearance rate is down 22 percent (62 percent is 78 percent of 79 percent--oh, never mind), that's really the story. The headline isn't 'average up 4 percent;' it's 'overproduction bites back.'

You'll see from this week's Sales Ticker that gross second-half (from the beginning of the yearling sales) North American and European sales had topped the \$1.3-billion mark for the second straight year by the end of Keeneland. Goffs is selling three days of mares this year, ending tomorrow, instead of the two days they had last year. Then it's on to Newmarket for the next two weeks, for the Tattersalls December Sale. Ten days of selling there kick off next Monday, followed by five days of foals, a day off on Sunday the 2nd, and four days of mares, ending Thursday the 6th. Arqana then holds their four-day mixed sale from Saturday, December 8 through Tuesday the 11th, and follows up with a one-day yearling sale on the 12th. Then school's out until Keeneland January. Tattersalls December Sale alone grossed over 100-million guineas (well over \$200-million, at today's rates) last year, a 35 percent jump from 2005. The corresponding European sales last year, in total (Ireland, Britain, France) grossed around \$275-million, so when all is said and done, the overall second-half gross should work out between \$1.55 to \$1.6-billion. With the first-half sales added in, we're going to be talking about what can now definitely (and exclusively, since no one else calculates it) be described as "the annual North American and European \$2-billion thoroughbred auction market." You read it here first.

It's been a great year for the whole team." Pletcher heads to California where he'll saddle favored **Sea Chanter** (War Chant) in the GIII Miesque S.

TDN Q & A

Brereton Jones, former governor of Kentucky and chairman of the board of the Kentucky Equine Education Project (KEEP) -



The TDN sat down with Brereton Jones to discuss the goals of KEEP in advance of the organization's Dec. 7 Stallion Season Auction. Created in 2004, KEEP is a state-wide horse industry alliance formed to increase awareness of the benefits of Kentucky's horse economy and to promote jobs and economic opportunities for Kentuckians through the state's horse industry. The Stallion Season Auction will be held at the Hyatt Regency in Lexington between 7 and 11 p.m. and will feature stallion seasons from many of the Bluegrass's top farms.

tween 7 and 11 p.m. and will feature stallion seasons from many of the Bluegrass's top farms.

TDN: What was the impetus behind the formation of KEEP?

BJ: It was necessary to unite the entire horse industry in the state that is the horse capital of the world so that we could all be pulling in the same direction. And that's all breeds of horses, not just Thoroughbreds, but Standardbreds. And we have as many Quarter Horses in Kentucky as we do Thoroughbreds, for example, and the pleasure horses and a large number of walking horses, too. So that we can have a voice in Frankfort when legislation is being considered that will either help or hurt the horse industry.

TDN: What were KEEP's initial goals?

BJ: The main thing was to unite the industry, so that we could speak with one voice. We wanted to get a breeders' awards program passed so that we could compete with other states. We were the only state that had major racing that didn't have a significant breeders' awards program. So we were able to get that through the General Assembly and were able to get the help of a number of legislators in that regard.

TDN: How does KEEP affect legislation?

BJ: The way KEEP is organized, we have a group of supporters in each of the 120 counties that is coordinated with a team leader, so that when we have a piece of legislation, like the breeders' awards program, and if we know that a particular legislator is not knowledgeable about it or is not supportive of it, then we can contact people that are within his or her district to sit down with that person and explain it to them and to try and get their support. It's so much better to have someone that has the opportunity to vote for or against a legislator to talk with them it is to send someone that is perceived to be a rich horse person from the Bluegrass of Kentucky to talk to them. The communication is so much better if it is someone in their own community that's talking to them.

TDN: What is KEEP currently working on?

BJ: We've got two major initiatives going on in this coming legislative session. One is what we call tax equity, so that we can try to get the horse industry treated the same as the cattle industry or the goat industry or the sheep industry. We should not be paying tax on our feed. If you buy a sack of feed in Kentucky right now for your horse, there is a six-percent sales tax on it. If you buy the identical sack of feed for your cow or your goat, there is no sales tax on it. So we want to see tax equity, tax fairness. And by having this kind of organization, it gives us the ability to articulate that and have a much greater chance of success. That legislation will be introduced in the upcoming session that starts in January. **Cont. p15**

We got behind the candidate that was supportive of that and that's Steve Beshear. Mr. Beshear was not only elected, but elected by a very large margin. So that's a big plus.

Then of course, there's the gaming issue. We feel that it is very important that we be able to compete with the gaming that exists in the states that are surrounding us now. By doing that, we will be able to have purses increase dramatically and that will create more end-users for our product. It's not that we have too many Thoroughbred horses out there, it's that we don't have enough people willing to pay the training bills on the horses that are necessary to fill the races that exist. If the purse structure is such that your chance of breaking even or having a loss is dramatically greater than your chance of having a profit, then that is discouraging to the number of new people that you need to attract to participate in the business.

TDN: How has KEEP been received by the Kentucky horsemen?

BJ: The horsemen were extremely supportive. It's wonderful the way that everyone is pulling together now. We all got behind Steve Beshear--I mean 90 percent of the horse people were supportive of Steve Beshear for governor and that's a big plus.

TDN: How will Beshear's election help KEEP?

BJ: What the new governor will be doing is supportive of just the things we're promoting: the tax equity issue and the gaming issue, so that it is done in a constitutional way. No state in America has dealt with the gaming issue in the way that we feel is the most logical, reasonable and advantageous for the whole horse industry and that is through a constitutional amendment as opposed to a statutory amendment. A constitutional amendment allows the people to vote on it, so that every Kentuckian of voting age will have an opportunity to vote on it. If you just do it on statutes, that means through the laws, then only the legislators have the right to vote on it. So what we're asking is for the legislators to put a constitutional amendment on the ballot so that the people of Kentucky can be heard and then we'll deal with this once and for all.

TDN: Why is important for the people to vote on this issue?

BJ: That is the fairness of the issue. We want to hear from all Kentuckians--the people who are going to be affected. Because all of Kentucky's citizenry will be affected. Right now we are sending approximately a half-a-billion dollars a year of Kentucky [gambling] money across the state lines. That means that it doesn't help Kentuckians. We're helping to educate Indiana children and build roads in Ohio and West Virginia and doing those things that we ought to be doing for our own people here.

Wagering without it is a real gamble.

TDN: Is there popular support for the gaming issue?

BJ: Absolutely--if it's properly done. There are two very important things that must happen, I believe for it to pass. One is, the public must feel confident that the there is not going to be a proliferation of gambling locations. Most Kentuckians do not want to see Kentucky turn into another Las Vegas. The overwhelming majority are opposed to that and so it must be stated in the constitution that it would be limited to the race-tracks where gambling already takes place and a very few other select locations, like two or three other locations, and that will be eligible for discussion and debate. But that has to happen or the majority of Kentuckians, I don't believe, will vote for it.

And the second thing that must happen is that all Kentuckians have to know where the money is going to be spent. If a dollar is spent, what happens to that dollar? How much of it goes for teachers' salaries increases, for example? Because we believe it's important to properly pay our teachers if we want to have the best teachers. We believe it's important to provide health care for our citizenry and to help our seniors and to help our veterans and to help the environment and to help the fish and wildlife people. And if you designate a penny and a half a penny and a part of every dollar that is spent and it goes into these areas to help all Kentuckians, then they are going to be inclined to vote for it. If it doesn't help all Kentuckians, if it only helps the horse people, it will fail. But if it helps all of Kentucky, it will pass. But they have to be assured that it will happen, they have to have that guarantee.

TDN: How is KEEP positioned to get Kentuckians that message?

BJ: We're going to have a really very large fundraiser for that express purpose on Dec. 7. To show you the strong support of the Thoroughbred industry, Ashford Stud, for example, has committed to give one breeding to each of their stallions [for auction]. Lane's End Farm has agreed to do the same thing. Hill 'n' Dale Farms has agreed to do the same thing. Darley America has agreed to do the same thing. Shadwell, WinStar, Airdrie, Vinery, Pin Oak, it goes on and on. So everyone is stepping up to the plate and we will have the largest season auction ever held any place.

TDN: And what the money from the fund-raising be used for?

BJ: Not just for the gaming campaign, but for the operation of KEEP and for the tax equity issue. We have to be doing television advertising, just like a political campaign, to explain to people what it is we're doing, what's going to be on the ballot and why they should vote for it.

TDN: Beyond the gaming and tax equity issues, what are the long-term goals for KEEP?

BJ: *(Laughing)* Other than that, Mrs. Lincoln how did you enjoy the theatre? Those two are monumental. But then, in all truthfulness, there is always something going on in the legislature that will help or hurt any given group of people. So KEEP is to be a watchdog for the horse industry and to make sure that the horse industry is fairly treated. We're not asking for anything more than fairness, but to be fairly treated so that we can compete on a level playing field.

TDN: What does KEEP need from the horsemen?

BJ: We're looking for the horsemen to come to that fundraiser on Dec. 7 at the Hyatt Regency in Lexington at 7 p.m. It's going to be a great party. We've got a fabulous band and singers. Plus there is going to be this fabulous stallion auction, both a live auction and a silent auction on all these seasons. So if you want to breed to a horse whose book is already closed, the seasons aren't available, there will be one season to that horse that will be available at this fundraiser that you can bid on. And all the money will go to KEEP for the purposes that we've just discussed.

TDN: How much money is KEEP looking to raise with this fundraiser?

BJ: We're hopeful that we will raise enough money to fund our expenses for the television and radio advertising to get the legislation passed for both the gaming and tax equity. We obviously want to raise as much as possible. We're continuing to get more and more stallions committed [to the auction]. Each day we're getting more farms committed and more stallions committed. It's a work in progress. The total expenditure will be greater than the amount that we will raise with this one fundraiser, I'm sure, but we would certainly assume that we would raise well in excess of \$1 million.

TDN: What specifically will the money be used for?

BJ: It will be both on advertising and a campaign to get the legislation passed. For example, on election day, just like an election for individuals running for public office, you have to have a ground game. You have to get people to the polls after we get it on the ballot. The first phase is to get it on the ballot in the proper form and the second phase is to get the vote out on election day, which will be in November of '08.

TDN: How many live seasons will be offered?

BJ: The live seasons will be limited to 30 to 35 and those would be the most expensive of the seasons. For example, if you look at the general sire list you see Smart Strike, Distorted Humor, A.P. Indy, Langfuhr, Giant's Causeway. The top five horses. All five of those are in our live auction. And there are other farms that are in the process of coming into the program. These are the creme de la creme of the industry. And it's extremely important that we have the lesser-priced stallions also and those will be done at the silent auction. We want all of them. We want the high-priced seasons and we want the \$1,000 seasons, because everyone is really united in this effort, which is what makes it so exciting. To be successful in an election you need to have the people united, and the horse industry is really united--it's not just the Thoroughbred people, it's the Quarter Horse people and all the other breeds. We're asking anyone that has a male horse that has at least one testicle, that they donate a breeding to that horse.

TDN: What part do the racetracks play in KEEP?

BJ: They are very supportive of KEEP. For example, I know Churchill will be giving us one of their Blue Ribbon boxes for Derby and Oaks Day to auction off. The tracks, depending on their size, make an annual contribution of \$50-100,000. They've been very supportive. This is the first time that the tracks and the breeders and the general horse population has been united.

TDN: Are there other fundraisers planned?

BJ: We'll see how much we raise. We'll see what the expenses are. There's no way to gauge that at the moment. It just depends on how things fall into place.

TDN: Is this an annual fundraiser?

BJ: This is not an annual fundraiser. This is a one-time event. You can't just keep going back to the stallion managers asking for more and more free seasons. You wear out your welcome pretty quick that way.

Through Wednesday, the following farms have agreed to donate stallion season's to KEEP's upcoming auction: Airdrie, Adena Springs, Ashcraft Farms, Ashford, Brookdale, Crestwood, Darby Dan, Darley, Dromoland, Hill 'n' Dale, Hurricane Hall, Juddmonte, Kentuckiana Stallion Management, Lane's End, Overbrook, Pin Oak Stud, Shadwell, Stonerside, Stonewall, Sugarfoot, WinStar, Taylor Made, Three Chimneys, Twin Creek, Vinery, Wintergreen Stallion Station, Woods Edge and Walmac.

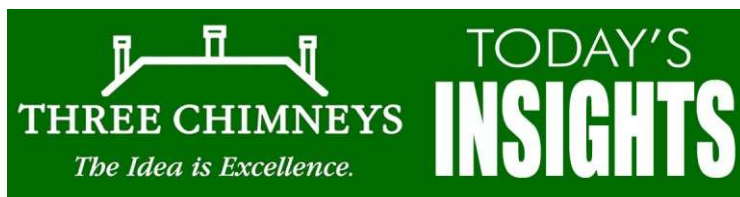

DUAL DUTY STALLIONS RETURN DELAYED

A number of dual-hemisphere stallions currently residing in Australia, who normally return to their Northern Hemisphere bases in December, will be leaving later than originally scheduled, according to Coolmore Australia General Manager Michael Kirwan. Kirwan confirmed that the departure date for Coolmore sires to return to Ireland and Kentucky would likely be postponed to late January. "We have only just started work on it and, obviously, we have to abide by protocols," he explained. "At the moment, they are all going back and we are not too concerned; it is not as though they are contracted to be back by a certain date--we own them. The signs are positive at present, but they may not go until January." Arrowfield's John Messara said Shadai Farm was keen to have Australian-based sire **Snitzel (Aus)** (Redoute's Choice {Aus}), who covered 85 mares in Japan earlier this year, return to the island of Hokkaido, but travel plans are blocked by that country's current import policy. "They would like him back, but there is no protocol for him to go to Japan at present," Messara said. Japan is among several countries to have suspended exports from Australia until further notice.

Creating a Game Plan..

International Racehorse Transport Managing Director Quentin Wallace confirmed it was likely that many of the shuttle stallions would leave Australia at the start of 2008. "It is a work in progress," Wallace said. "Each country has its own set of requirements and set of hurdles to overcome, but I am exceedingly hopeful that the stallions will return as usual to Europe and the U.S.A., where EI is not an exotic disease." According to Wallace, U.S.-based shuttle stallions will return in early January, while their European counterparts are slated to depart in mid-January. "We are monitoring the situation in Japan," he added. "There are discussions going on at present between the Australian Quarantine and Inspection Service and Japan to facilitate the return of stallions to Japan." Rock of Gibraltar (Ire), Snitzel (Aus), Stravinsky, Grandera (Ire) and Black Hawk (GB) all shuttled from Japan to Australia this season. A total of 48 stallions flew to Australia, but in the wake of the EI crisis, 24 sires went straight from quarantine back to the Northern Hemisphere.
