MIDNIGHT LUTE UPSET IN CIGAR MILE

Midnight Lute (Real Quiet) was sent off the 1-2 favorite in yesterday's GI Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile H. at Aqueduct, but he couldn't catch Shadwell Stable's **Daaher** (Awesome Again). Hard held by jockey Garrett Gomez down the backstretch, the odds-on chalk went after the front-running three-year-old as they raced out of the turn and looked to have his measure, but Daaher had something left, drawing off to beat Midnight Lute handily. "I was kind of in-between with him because if he makes the lead too easy, his ears go 'Boink!' and he pulls himself up," explained Midnight Lute's rider, Garrett Gomez. "I tried to time it just right. When I got to the leader, I still had a lot of horse. The other horse just kept kicking and my horse flattened out at the eighth pole." **Cont. p2**

Zayat Stables' **Mushka** (Empire Maker), who topped Fasig-Tipton's 2006 Saratoga Sale at \$1.6 million, closed from the back of the pack take yesterday's GII Demoiselle S. at the Big A by an impressive 4 1/2 lengths. Coming off a maiden win at Belmont, she was sent off at 4-1 in her stakes bow. Jockey John Velazquez got the filly in gear on the far turn and she colared 5-2 chalk **Elusive Lady** (Van Nistelrooy) in the stretch and drew clear. "This horse has been all about courage. He's got a bright future." The runner-up also had a rough trip, clipping heels on the first turn before recovering to sit just off the pace. He took over in the stretch and kept on gamely, missing by just a neck. "I thought I was falling off; I don't know how I stayed on," jockey John Velazquez said of the incident. "He ran a great race after falling to his knees. That was a tough way to lose." **Cont. p6**

Daaher Rolls to Third Straight...

May 12. The bay was sent north of the border for his next two starts, finishing fourth in the June 24 Queen's Plate at Woodbine and third in the July 15 Prince of Wales's S. at Fort Erie, but he has been unbeatable since returning to New York.

Sent off the 5-2 favorite

in an optional claimer going nine panels at Saratoga Aug. 26, Daaher galloped to a 13 3/4-length victory, and he proved that effort was no fluke with a decisive score in the Oct. 7 GII Jerome H. The second choice facing GI Forego H. and GI Breeders' Cup Sprint hero **Midnight Lute**, he went right to the front under jockey Mike Luzzi. Pressed through an opening quarter in :23.10, he opened up daylight after a half in :46.32. The odds-on chalk closed the gap while still under wraps on the far turn and loomed a threat as they raced past the quarter pole in 1:09.82. But Daaher was far from done. He kicked away from Midnight Lute in the stretch to win handily. "He's turned out to be a good horse," trainer Kiaran McLaughlin said. "It worked out well that we didn't have anyone pressuring us. The pace wasn't very fast for him. The rider had a double handful--he had so much horse. Once Midnight Lute got to us and we went on, I thought we had him." Looking ahead, McLaughlin added, "Hopefully, we can take him over to Dubai for either the [G2] Godolphin Mile or the [G1 Dubai] World Cup." The Dubai World Cup meet will be held at Nad Al Sheba Mar. 29. As for Midnight Lute's plans, trainer Bob Baffert said, "We'll freshen him up and get him ready for something." Sunday Racing Co. Ltd's **Vermilion (Jpn)** (El Condor Pasa) improved on his fourth-place finish in last year's G1 Japan Cup Dirt, charging down the center of the track at Fuchu Racecourse to post a convincing 1 1/4-length victory. In providing champion jockey Yutaka Take with his fourth win in the event--and trainer Sei Ishizaka with his second straight--Vermilion established a new course record of 2:06.70 for the 2100-meter distance. Ishizaka won the 2006 Japan Cup Dirt with Alondite (Jpn), who beat Take and Seeking the Dia by 1 1/4 lengths.

Nearly Perfect in '07...

Beaten 3 1/4 lengths by Alondite (Jpn) in last year's renewal, Vermilion bounced back with a six-length score in the Nagoya Grand Prix Dec. 20. He made it two in a row with another open-length victory in the Jan. 31 Kawasaki Kinen, which served as a prep for the G1 Dubai World Cup exactly two months later. He could come no closer than 15 lengths when fourth to Invasor (Arg) on racing's biggest stage and was rested thereafter. He made a successful return to action in his latest, a four-length success over **Furioso (Jpn)** (Brian's Time) in the Oct. 31 JBC Classic S. at Ohi.

Heavy Favorite Doesn't Disappoint...

Backed into 13-10 favoritism by the Tokyo faithful, Vermilion broke well and settled in midpack around the far turn and up the backstretch. Given a bit of rein by Take as they raced into the final bend, the dark bay followed the move of American raider **Student Council** (Kingmambo) into the stretch and came out around that rival with about 300 meters to the wire. He struck the lead inside the final furlong and finished well to win going away. "He's not the best [from the gate], but he made a very satisfactory break for him," Take commented. Student Council Weakens to Eighth...

Student Council broke very well and was within easy striking distance for the opening mile of the race. A bit wide into the lane, he looked poised to launch a winning bid in upper stretch, but had little to offer when called upon by jockey Richie Migliore and checked in eighth. "I was able to ride him as planned until the final turn, but he had nothing left in the homestretch," Migliore commented. The other foreign invaders, **Jack Sullivan** (Belong to Me) and **Kandidate (GB)** (Kabool), finished 12th and 15th, respectively.

Benny The Bull was purchased privately by IEAH Stable and partners after rallying to win the June 30 Iowa Sprint H. at Prairie Meadows in his stakes debut. He made his first start under new management in the GII Alfred G. Vanderbilt H. at Saratoga July 28 and, after getting bumped around at the break, he ended up fourth. The dark bay colt finished well to be second behind Midnight Lute in the Sept. 1 GI Forego H., then ran into that rival again in the Oct. 27 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint. Benny The Bull hit the gate at the start that day, however, and never threatened, finishing nine lengths back in fourth.

Getting Out of the Shadow of the Champ...

Dodging the Midnight Lute bullet this time as the likely Eclipse winner opted to go for the GI Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile H., Benny The Bull was the 13-10 chalk in the DeFrancis Dash. The Florida-bred was in hand as Talent Search led them along through a quarter in :22.64 and a half in :45.72. He made his bid while

four wide at the top of the stretch, caught the pacesetter inside the eighth pole and drew clear. "Sometimes I have to ride him very hard, but today I didn't," jockey Edgar Prado said. "He did it all on his own. I encouraged my horse, but I didn't really beat him up. I saved something for the end." Gregg James, who owned the colt before selling a majority interest to IEAH, Pegasus Holding Group Stables and A. I. Cohen, explained the origin of Benny The Bull's name. "My daughter Erika named him after a cartoon character on Dora the Explorer," James said. Trainer Mark Shuman was pleased with the effort of the runner-up, who was coming off a third in the Breeders' Cup Sprint. "He came out of the Breeders' Cup Sprint great, so I thought he would run well today," Shuman said. "He broke real sharp out of the gate today and tried his best. He's such a good horse. Off at 8-1 to go one better in his first try around two turns, the dark bay was in hand as he settled in fourth through six furlongs in 1:11.56. He went after the leaders at the top of the stretch, took over inside the

eighth pole and had enough in reserve to hold off Blackberry Road to the wire. "These races have produced a lot of good horses and he looks like he will go a distance of ground," said trainer Nick Zito. "I was really impressed when [Blackberry Road] came up the inside and my horse looked like he could have hung for a little while, but he saw him and he took off again. He reminds me a lot of The Cliff's Edge [winner of the 2003 Kentucky Jockey Club S.]." Daytona raced exclusively on all-weather tracks in his three starts in Britain, but he has found a home on the grass in the U.S. The chestnut gelding was a rallying fourth going six furlongs in an entry-level allowance at Hollywood in May and a troubled fifth when stretched out to 1 1/16 miles July 1. Third after setting the pace in an optional claimer at Del Mar Aug. 9, he closed to fill out the trifecta once again in the El Cajon S. on the all-weather three weeks later, then switched back to the grass and posted an impressive 4 1/4-length score over **Ten a Penny** in the Oct. 13 GII Oak Tree Derby. He stretches out off that nine-furlong affair. "I don't think a mile and a quarter will be a problem," trainer Dan Hendricks said. "Daytona is doing super and is ready to go." Hendricks had planned on running Brother Derek in the 2006 Hollywood Derby, but the Cal-bred colicked on the morning of the race and was scratched. His dam, Tribulation (Danzig), captured the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup and is herself a full sister to the dam of Japanese champion Grass Wonder (Silver Hawk) and MGISW Wonder Again (Silver Hawk).

WONDROUS TRADE TELLS A STORY Strong trade during yesterday's penultimate session of Goffs' November sale bucked the trend of the previous six days as returns advanced over last year's figures. Swettenham Stud's winning mare **Wondrous Story**, offered as hip 1599, led the way and earned the top price when she was knocked down to Adrian Nicoll of BBA Ireland for €165,000. The daughter of Royal Academy is a half-sister to G3 Cherry Hinton S. winner **Musicale** and hails from the family of dual champion **Committed**. The latter is also the granddam of likely American turf champion **English Channel**. "She's a lovely mare and it's family I know well," revealed Nicoll. "I bought her **Danehill Dancer** yearling here [€130,000 Goffs Challenge] and she has gone into training with Brian Meehan who seems to like her. She's from a good pedigree that has plenty going for it and it's not often that you can buy mares like this. She has been bought for an English client." Second place on the podium went to Darley's **So Sweet (Ire)**, who went the way of Albert and Lousie Conneally's Moorpark Stud for €125,000. Offered as hip 1755, the two-time winner is a full sister to dual stakes score **Crosspeace (Ire)**. "We're trying to build up a strong broodmare band and this filly fit the bill," explained stud manager Sinead McGlynn. "She's a good-looking, good-walking sort from a good pedigree." BBA Ireland was the successful bidder for the day's third-highest priced lot when snapping up Mountarmstrong Stud's hip 1762, **Alexander Icequeen (Ire)**, for €115,000. The five-year-old was placed in two Listed events as a juvenile and hit the board in the G3 Ballyogan S. and G3 Brownstown S. during her sophomore campaign. She was covered by both **Danehill Dancer (Ire)** and **Redback (GB)** this year. An improved clearance rate--by the week's standards--of 75 percent helped the aggregate up almost 16 percent on last year while the session average jumped almost one fifth to €22,719. Overall returns still finished in arrears, but pleasing trade saw the average end up just under three percent behind last year's two-day equivalent.
