Sheikh Mohammed's operation had acquired a half share in the chestnut during the summer, but has now snapped up the other 50 percent in the the G1 National S. and G1 Darley Dewhurst S. winner. "I can confirm we have purchased the other 50 percent of New

Approach and Darley now own the horse outright," John Ferguson told *Racing Post*. "He will run in the colours of Her Royal Highness Princess Haya next year." Bolger, who also sold Teofilo (Ire) to Darley this year, added, "I'm delighted to have recently concluded the deal with Darley, and am very happy to be training him for the coming 12 months. The 2000 Guineas is his early season target, and these days he's doing light exercise and is out in the paddock with his pony and generally enjoying life. We're all looking forward to next year." New Approach, a son of the Ahonoora (GB) mare Park Express (GB), was recently honored with a Cartier Award as Europe's top two-year-old colt. He was acquired by the Bolgers for €430,000 as a yearling at Goffs.

## NO HONG KONG FOR PRESSING

Gary Tanaka's **Pressing (Ire)** (Soviet Star), winner of the G1 Premio Roma Nov. 4, will not make the trip to Sha Tin for the G1 Hong Kong Cup Dec. 9. The four-year-old came down with a cough and "a dirty scope," according to the disappointed Tanaka. He will remain in training with Michael Jarvis in Newmarket. Meanwhile, champions **Dylan Thomas (Ire)** (Danehill) and **Miss Andretti (Aus)** (Ihtiram {Ire}) both arrived safely Monday night in Hong Kong for their respective engagements, the G1 Vase and G1 Sprint. "We take great pride in presenting this magnificent racing occasion as Hong Kong takes on the world," said Bill Nader, the Hong Kong Jockey Club's Executive Director of Racing. "Dylan Thomas and Miss Andretti are universally recognized as superstars, and will play a meaningful role in reinforcing the day as the Turf World Championships." Winner of the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe and G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. this season, Dylan Thomas was forced to skip last Sunday's G1 Japan Cup due to Japanese quarantine restrictions. "The trip from the quarantine stable in Japan to Sha Tin took about 11 hours," said Pat Keating, trainer Aidan O'Brien's traveling head lad. "He's a seasoned traveler, and he looks to have settled in very quickly." Miss Andretti was honored Monday as Australia's Horse of the Year after becoming the first runner to sweep the G1 Manikato S., G1 Australia S., G1 Lightning S. and the G1 Newmarket H. in the same season. "It was a smooth trip and she has traveled well," said Scott Magee, trainer Lee Freedman's traveling foreman. "She'll just have a light walk this morning to loosen up. She's in good form." Heroine of the G2 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot, the six-year-old is coming off an impressive victory in the G1 The Age Classic Nov. 10 at Flemington.

**CLODOVIL COLT TOPPS TATTS FOAL OPENER**

Yesterday's pipeopener to the Tattersalls December Foal sale--the weakest of the five days on paper--was topped by a Clodovil colt out of Inching (GB) (Inchinor {GB}). Selling as hip 541, he was bought by pinhooker Jimmy Murphy of Redpender Stud for 60,000gns. Inching had been acquired by agent Gill Richardson for Tania Trant for 30,000gns while carrying the colt at Tattersalls in February. "The sire has done well and he's a quality horse with a very fast book," Murphy said.

"The mother is by Inchinor, who has been good to me." One bought to race was a 58,000gns colt from the first crop of Avonbridge (GB) (Averti {Ire}) out of Go Between (GB) (Daggers Drawn), a half-sister to G2 Flying Childers S. heroine Wunders Dream (Ire) (Averti {Ire}). Agent Richard Frisby signed for hip 436, a flashy chestnut who was consigned from breeder John Deer's Oakgrove Stud in Wales.

"He's been bought for a client to race, although it's too early to say where he'll be trained," said Frisby. "I've bought a couple of Avonbridges and they seem nice horses--his sire Averti made a solid start to his stud career before his untimely death, and there's every chance his son will be equally effective." It was a selective market with a clearance rate of 54 percent, compared to 74 percent on the same day in 2006. **THIN ICE**

Nobody knows more about the breeding and sales side of the business than the auction companies, sales consignors, and bloodstock agents (true), so when Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony noted the sceptre of overproduction hanging over the European yearling markets last month--comments echoed by Goffs/DBS CEO Henry Beeby after last week's Goffs November Mixed sale--it's worth paying attention to. Though the inevitably upbeat post-sale propaganda refers to the 'second-highest' this and 'near-record' that, the cracks in the ice were evident at Goffs last week, and again at Tattersalls' opening yearling session of their 10-session December sale (which actually does take place mostly in December this year) Monday.

Just look at the numbers. As the accompanying Weekly Sales Ticker table shows, the number sold for the entire eight days at Goffs was down by 5 percent from 1,154 last year to 1,099 this year. The gross was off by €3.3 million (9 percent), and the average was down 4 percent. But what is really telling is that last year the 1,154 listed sales constituted 78 percent of the 1,475 horses sent through the ring. This year, there were 1,765 horses offered--20 percent more than in 2006--yet the 1,099 listed sales represented just 62 percent of those sent through the ring. The clearance rate declined by 20 percent, and even with 20 percent more horses offered, the gross was down almost 10 percent. Clearly, a lot of horses were offered that people just didn't want, and, from the reports, a big reason for that was the absence of a lot of the Irish domestic property development and construction industry money, which has especially fueled the Goffs sales the last couple of years. Not entirely surprising considering plenty of evidence that house prices are down by as much as 20 percent in the U.S., Britain and Ireland.

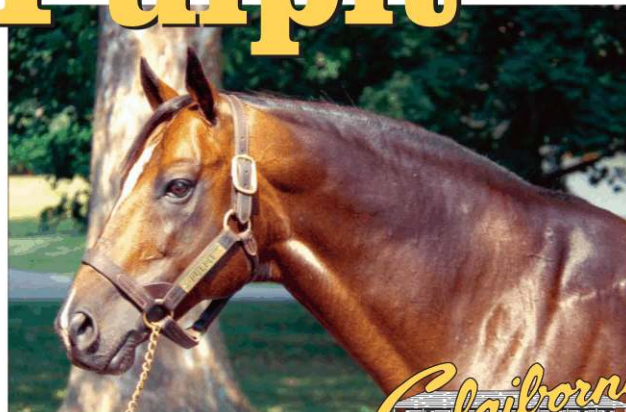
The dose was repeated at Tattersalls Monday for the end-of-season yearlings. This year, 5 percent fewer were offered than in 2006 (217 this year, 229 in 2006). Yet again, there was a big drop in the clearance rate from 80 percent last year--when 183 yearlings grossed 5,533,500gns--to 66 percent Monday when just 143 yearlings sold, grossing 4,086,300 down 26 percent from 2006. This illustrates what happens when there are contractions in the horse market. It's not that the top horses are getting cheaper (yet)--no, not at all. What happens first is that the bar (the standard of individual for which the buyers are prepared to pay top dollar) gets higher as there are more to choose from--especially because so many are by top sires now. Plus, as we're seeing there is no demand for the bottom 20 percent.

As we saw last week, that was even the case at Keeneland--though the far broader marketplace in North America (which produces twice as many foals as Britain, Ireland, and France combined, so there had better be a lot more buyers) either delays or mitigates such dramatic evidence of a downturn as we are now seeing in Europe.

**Giant Bargains...**

Next year's stud fees were mostly set after the yearling sales and to their credit, stallion managers have seen this coming. The only real jumps in stud fees have come in the developing young horses. Even this year's respective leading freshman sires, Acclamation and Posse, have only seen stud fee advances to €30,000 and \$30,000, respectively. Stallion masters are reducing books and stud fees--both welcome developments, though once again breeders should be reminded that the stud farms are not doing this because they're inherently nice, but because of market pressures. Nonetheless, it's welcome.

Surely there can be no better illustration of the prevailing market feeling than to see that Giant's Causeway's stud fee has been slashed to \$125,000 for 2008, having peaked at \$300,000 in 2006, and already reduced to \$225,000 (though listed as private--a fee which would be outlawed if I were Emperor) for 2007.



Giant's Causeway was bred to 192 mares at \$300,000 in 2006 and 176 this year at \$225,000. He is the number five sire in North America this year, having been number three last year. Yet, in spite of his success, the combination of overexposure, coupled with the 'knock' that he doesn't have enough Group/Grade 1 winners (I dismiss that argument, but perhaps the market does not), saw 93 yearlings by Giant's Causeway average \$293,696 this year, with a median of \$200,000 (per Instatistics), off a \$200,000 stud fee in 2005. When the yearlings average 1.47X the stud fee, and the median is 1.00X, it's clear the buyers didn't agree with the breeders about his value. So a lot of breeders got stung. Now his stud fee is less than half of what it was two years ago, and you have to assume that the 300 or so foals which he'll have in his 2007 and 2008 crops are going to give Giant's Causeway a big chance to extend his stay among the top five on the North American General Sire List. I hope to be able to point out a lot of bargains in the stud fee sector over the next few weeks, but I can guarantee you I won't be finding any bigger bargains than Giant's Causeway at \$125,000 for 2008.

Market conditions, it seems to me, are suppressing the 2008 fees on a number of promising freshman sires besides leaders Acclamation and Posse, as mentioned above. Numbers 2-5 on the North American Freshman Sire list are all horses that look to me a fair gamble, all at \$20,000-\$25,500: Proud Citizen, Van Nistleroo, Harlan's Holiday (all at \$25,000) and Macho Uno (\$20,000). Not to mention Kafwain, number 11 on the Freshman Sire list and likely to be swamped at \$10,000 following Massive Drama's win in the GII Hollywood Prevue S.--his fourth stakes winner. But, just as Giant's Causeway gets the six-figure stud fee value star for 2008, a horse that just leaps off the page in the middle five-figure stud fee range is Broken Vow at \$30,000 for 2008 at Pin Oak. He's the number one third-crop sire (oldest now four-year-olds), and ranks 16th on the General Sire List. He's also had 22 two-year-old winners this year, and his seven two-year-old winners in the last month include five maiden winners going longer than one mile. He was only a Grade II winner himself, but like Pulpit (and Distorted Humor, Elusive Quality, Mr. Greeley and Posse) he's proving that not winning a Grade I is not a barrier to sire success. That's one of the reasons why I reject the notion that Giant's Causeway's not a good enough sire because he doesn't have enough Grade/Group 1 winners. The idea that all future good sires must win a Grade/Group 1--that's a myth.

But plenty of future good sires do win at the top level, and one of those who's sending out the right signals--as Andrew Caulfield detailed yesterday--is another son of Unbridled, current number 10 freshman sire, Empire Maker. He was arguably unlucky not to have a Grade II double Saturday, as jockey Rafael Bejarano managed to find plenty of trouble on the even-money GII Golden Rod S. favorite, Turn Away, who could only finish third. **Oppenheim cont.**

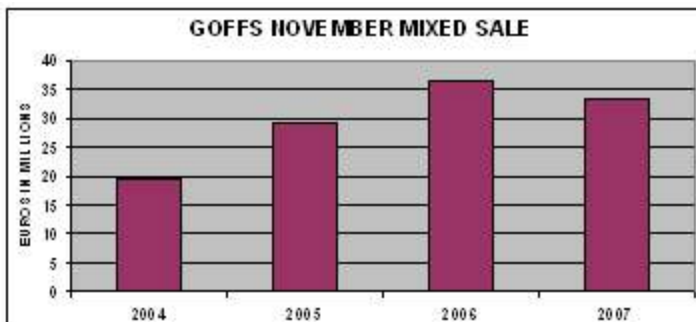

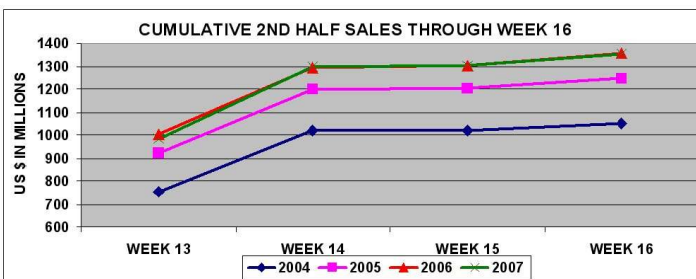

"In spite of cataloguing 21% more horses than last year, Goffs eight-day November Sale had 5% fewer sold, and the gross dropped 9%, reflecting only 62% listed sales, versus 78% last year. The top horses may still be making top prices, but the first major European mixed sale, at least, suggested it's harder to get to the top, and it's plenty weak enough as you start to go down the ladder. On their first two days, only 43% of the foals offered in Goffs November Book 1 were listed as sold."

Like Andrew, I also noticed the GII Kentucky Jockey Club winner, Anak Nakal, is inbred 3X3 to Unbridled's sire, Fappiano, being by Cryptoclearance's son, Victory Gallop, out of a Quiet American mare. 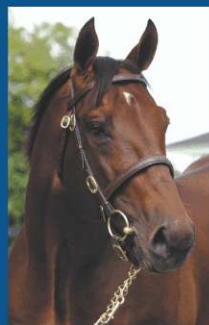

**SOUTH AMERICAN SENSATION: BAYAKOA**

In hindsight, it might be easy to look at Bayakoa, the brilliant two-time champion who became just the second horse to win

Obscure breeding aside, Bayakoa had a very good, but not spectacular, race record in her native country. Coming off an impressive seventh-length maiden victory as a three-year-old in April of 1987, Bayakoa was trounced in her first start at the Group 1 level. She captured an allowance race--her first start on the grass--in her next outing, but then was badly beaten once again when stepped up in the Argentine 1000 Guineas in July. She began to come around in late summer and fall of that season, though, running second in a pair of Group 1's, including one test against males, before ending her campaign with a rousing 12-length win in the mud in the G1 Gran Premio Palermo, again facing the boys.

back-to-back Breeders' Cup races, as a can't-miss prospect after being purchased by American connections and moved to the States in 1988. But in reality, the daughter of Consultant's Bid was anything but.

Not too shabby, by any means, but let's face it, many horses have come to the U.S. from South America with more impressive resumes and done little.

Moreover, the parrot-mouthed Bayakoa was a nervous--some described her as self-destructive, even--sort of filly, the kind that make trainers earn every cent of their money.

Still, Ron McAnally liked Bayakoa immediately when he saw her in Argentina. The respected horsemen, who had skillfully handled the irascible John Henry during much of that horse's Hall of Fame career, was in South America representing American owners Janis and Frank Whitham.

McAnally, after making the deal to buy Bayakoa, took his time with the filly. He tried to settle her in the mornings, so that she'd focus her energies on her races.

Bayakoa's first start in the U.S. came in a one-mile grass allowance at Hollywood Park. Sent off at 3-1 odds, she won in wire-to-wire fashion under a hand ride. It was an auspicious debut, but McAnally didn't push Bayakoa straight into graded company. Instead, he opted to send her to Minnesota to contest the \$150,000 Lady Canterbury H. at Canterbury Park. The crowd's 2-1 choice was on the lead through the opening six furlongs, but tired down the lane and trudged home sixth, beaten 6 1/2 lengths by a horse named Balbonella (Fr), who later would become the dam of Anabaa and Classic heroine Always Loyal.

McAnally returned Bayakoa to California, freshened her, then entered her in a minor stakes at Del Mar in August. Again, Bayakoa was a pace factor, but again she tired, this time finishing fifth.

About a month later, Bayakoa was entered in another small stakes at Del Mar. But this one was on the dirt. In her first main-track start in the U.S., Bayakoa gave a preview of what was to come, sprinting clear to win the one-mile race by 10 lengths as an 8-1 longshot under young jockey Aaron Gryder.

But even the best of horseman can sometimes fail to take the hint, and McAnally returned Bayakoa to the turf for her next two. Neither race produced a victory, and Bayakoa would never start on the grass again.

12-length margin. It would be the beginning of a 21-race stretch that saw Bayakoa finish worse than second just twice. After that allowance win, she ran a good second in the GII Santa Maria H., then won her first Grade I in the U.S. as a 7-2 shot in the Santa Margarita Invitational H. in February of 1989. Through a dazzling season, Bayakoa added six more wins in her next

seven starts, including five in Grade I company.

Coming into the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff off a 11 1/2-length dismantling in the GI Spinster S. ([video](#)), Bayakoa was a heavily favored 3-5 favorite at Gulfstream Park. In an atypical off-the-pace performance, she forged to the lead on the far turn and charged hom 1 1/2 lengths clear of Gorgeous ([video](#)), ensuring an Eclipse Award as champion older female.

Returned to training at five, Bayakoa romped in her seasonal debut in the Santa Maria--now a Grade I ([video](#))--and took her second renewal of the Santa Margarita. The typically conservative McAnally thought Bayakoa deserved a shot against males, but Bayakoa's GI Santa Anita H. effort proved dismal. She never made the lead and trailed home a distanced 10th.

Gorgeous got the better of Bayakoa--who was a prohibitive 1-10 choice--in the 1990 edition of the Apple Blossom ([video](#)), but Bayakoa got back to winning ways in the GII Hawthorne H. ([video](#)) and GI Milady H. Again put against males in the GII San Diego H., Bayakoa ran a much-improved second, but the 1-2 pick still found Quiet American 2 1/4 lengths too strong, though she was spotting that foe seven pounds.

Victory in the GII Chula Vista H. at Del Mar ([video](#)) and a repeat win in the Spinster ([video](#)) set the stage for one of the most anticipated match-ups of that year's Breeders' Cup at Belmont Park--a showdown with the three-year-old East Coast standout Go for Wand, who was sent off the 3-5 pick over Bayakoa on the strength of five straight

Grade I victories. The race was turning into the event everyone had hoped for when the two hooked up from the start and roared off the turn for home with little separating them. But in the stretch, tragedy struck when Go for Wand broke down in front of a stunned crowd.

Bayakoa galloped home to her second Breeders' Cup win in the Distaff, but the winner's circle celebration was a muted affair.

"It should be a victory, but it isn't," McAnally said. "They give their lives for our enjoyment."

Bayakoa, who also earned her second consecutive Eclipse Award, raced three more times at seven, but failed to win. She was retired with 21 wins in 39 starts and \$2,817,524 in earnings.

As a broodmare she produced just four foals before dying of laminitis in 1997 at the age of 13. While only two of those foals started and only one found the winner's circle, some of Bayakoa's resolve and talent were passed on to her grandchildren. Her granddaughter Affluent, a Whitham homebred who was trained by McAnally, was a four-time Grade I winner of \$1.4 million, while another, Izarra, has shown plenty of promise as a two-year-old filly this year in California. Named after Bayakoa's second dam--the Argentine-bred Izarra--the daughter of Distorted Humor was third in the GI Del Mar Debutante and just missed by a nose in the GI Oak Leaf Breeders' Cup S. before failing to handle the off-going her granddam loved in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies.

Fittingly, McAnally trains Izarra, too.

Bayakoa was elected to racing's Hall of Fame a year after her death and was named the 95<sup>th</sup> greatest horse of the century by *The Blood-Horse*. In 1993, the Silver Belles H. was renamed the Bayakoa.

**HALL OF FAME JOCKEY BILL HARTACK**

**DEAD** Hall of Fame jockey Bill Hartack was found dead in a cabin in southern Texas due to an apparent heart attack Monday, according to *Daily Racing Form*. He

was 74. Hartack, along with the legendary Eddie Arcaro, are the only two jockeys to ride five GI Kentucky Derby winners. He was aboard Iron Liege in 1957, Venetian Way in 1960, Decidedly in 1962, Northern Dancer in 1964 and Majestic Prince in 1969. He also rode three GI Preakness S. winners--Fabius in 1956, Northern Dancer in 1964, and Majestic Prince in 1969--and one GI Belmont S. winner, Celtic Ash in 1960. Hartack began his

career in racing as an exercise rider with trainer Junie Corbin at Charles Town at the age of 17. He became a contract rider at Waterford Park for Corbin in 1952. Only seven years later, he was inducted into the Hall of Fame. The native of Ebensburg, Pennsylvania, rode 4,272 winners in the United States and led the nation in races won four times. He also rode in Hong Kong from 1978 to 1980. Hartack remained active in the Thoroughbred industry, serving as a steward at the recently concluded Louisiana Downs meeting. Funeral arrangements are pending.



**RED RANSOM COLT TOPS MM OPENER** Selling late in the opening session, a two-year-old colt by Red Ransom sold for A\$275,000 to top yesterday's Magic Millions Horses in Training Sale on the Gold Coast in Queensland. Hip 235, consigned by Oakwood Farm, was purchased by Singapore trainer Patrick Shaw through South African agent Andy Williams. He is the first foal from the winning Langfuhr mare Luna Scene (NZ). "He's a lovely colt," Shaw said after signing the ticket. "He's a wonderful type and he looked good in his gallop on Sunday ([video](#)). And, at the price, he looks good value because of the current circumstances." The topper was preceded in the ring by hip 232, a A\$250,000 son of Giant's Causeway. Magic Millions, acting on behalf of an unidentified client, purchased the chestnut from the Washpool Lodge draft. He is a son of Group 1 winner Love De Tor (NZ) (Spectacular Love). "He was purchased by an international agent as a potential stallion prospect later on," Magic Millions Managing Director David Chester explained. "The colt impressed him with his gallop ([video](#)), and he's developed into a striking individual during his preparation at Washpool Lodge." Chester was pleased with the sale's figures, especially in light of the equine influenza crisis. "Under the circumstances, it turned out a positive day's selling," he commented. "When we first catalogued for the sale we were thinking the sale would be the biggest and best breeze-up style sale ever seen in the Southern Hemisphere. Obviously, the equine influenza outbreak led to the catalogue being reduced dramatically because of unfortunate travel restrictions around Australia."
