Among the bidders on the colt were Gay O'Callaghan; Paul McCartan of Croom House Stud; Charlie

Vigors and Timmy Hyde; Teddy Grimthorpe, racing manager to Oasis Dream's owner/breeder Khalid Abdullah; and finally BBA Ireland's Adrian Nicoll. "He's an outstanding individual by a proven sire out of a mare that won the King's Stand S.," said Ferguson. "It's developing into a really classy speed family." Cont. p2

McCreery's Stowell Hill Stud enjoyed a vintage day, also selling a 200,000gns colt by Dansili (GB) out of Bandanna (GB). Purchased on behalf of breeder Rosanne Dobson, lot 1010 is a half-brother to Gary Moore's winning juvenile Art Sale (GB) (Compton Place). Pinhooker Willie Browne fought off Paul McCartan, manager of Denis Brosnan's Croom House Stud, for the colt. "That's the most I've ever given for a foal, but he was a beautiful horse," explained Browne. "He'll come back here, and I think with the way the economy is going, you are going to be safer with the dearer horses because the big money is never really dangerous; the middle-to-bottom end is going to be much riskier." Lot 1065, a 125,000gns full-brother to promising juvenile Oarsman (GB)--by Selkirk out of Felucca (GB)--will be reoffered from Brendan Holland's Co. Cork-based Grove Stud next year. "He's got a good pedigree and is a horse with a lot of quality, and the full-brother looks very promising," said Holland. "He's the fourth I've got here and, if I can get another couple that will do for me. I also got six in America and one at Goffs last week." Heading the fillies was Lot 1067--a daughter of first crop sire Oratorio (Ire) (Danehill) out of Swards Folly (GB)--was a half-sister to G3 Cornwallis S. winner Hunter Street (GB) (Compton Place {GB}). Bred by Crandon Park Stud, the filly sold for 130,000 gns to a client of Emerald Bloodstock's Brendan Gallagher. Queensland owner Dick Karreman's enjoyed his third Group 1 of the season when Keepa Cruisin won yesterday's Levin Classic. Karreman, who acquired two Group 1 trophies courtesy of the winner's half-sister Seachange (NZ) earlier this year, scored yet another. According to Karreman, there are some similarities between Keepa Cruisin, by Cambridge Stud's sophomore sire Keeper (Danehill), and Seachange. "She showed a bit early, but I never felt she had the brilliance of Seachange," he said. "But she had her other qualities of toughness and constitution." In her latest start, Keepa Cruisin was put up to second behind In-souciant (NZ) in the G1 2000 Guineas at Riccarton Nov. 10. Trainer Stephen McKee said she needed the race. "That was her first run at a mile, and being a hard run, it probably brought her on for this," he said. McKee said Keepa Cruisin would probably be restricted to races no further than 1600 meters, unless racing against her own sex.

VISIT 'B' SAMPLE POSITIVE Juddmonte Farms' Visit (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}), who was revealed to have tested positive for the banned substance acetylpromazine (ACP) last month, looks certain to be disqualified from her runner-up finish in the Aug. 23 G2 Lowther S. at York after a second sample of her original test was also found to contain the banned substance. "Unfortunately, we have been told that Visit's 'B' sample has now tested positive as well as the 'A' sample," racing manager Teddy Grimthorpe told *Daily Mail*. "I would imagine she will now be stripped of second place as well as her prizemoney. We have been in daily contact with the BHA about their investigation. Either someone has inadvertently given it to her or it is malicious--we still don't know." Before her positive test, Visit landed the G3 Princess Margaret S. at Ascot July 29 and has since run eighth in the G1 Cheveley Park S. at Newmarket Oct. 5.

CURTAIN CALL MOVES Curtain Call (Fr) (Sadler's Wells), second to New Approach in the G2 Futurity S., and four-length winner of the G2 Juddmonte Beresford S. at two this year, is being syndicated and has moved to two-time G1 Epsom Derby-winning trainer Luca Cumani for his three-year-old campaign. Bought as a yearling by BBA Ireland's Patrick Cooper for a small group including Tattersalls Marketing Director Jimmy George and *TDN* columnist Bill Oppenheim, Curtain Call is by 14-time British and Irish champion sire Sadler's Wells, and is the first foal of Apsara (Fr) (Darshaan {GB}). She is a half-sister to Hernando (Fr), winner of the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (French Derby) and sire of two G1 Prix du Jockey-Club winners; and to Johann Quatz, also by Sadler's Wells, who was second to Baratheia (Ire) in the G1 Breeders' Cup Mile. "We're very excited about Curtain Call's prospects for next year," said Cooper. "He finished three lengths behind New Approach in the G2 Futurity at seven furlongs in only his third start, making up 15 lengths on the winner. He then went on to dominate the opposition, winning off by four lengths in the G2 Beresford, a race whose previous winners include Sadler's Wells himself, El Prado, and subsequent G1 12-furlong winners Alamshar and Azamour." Cooper added, "He's the best two-year-old to come out of a very good family, probably ever, and we think he's nailed on to get a mile and a half next year. We respect all of them, but we fear none." Curtain Call, who races in the colors of Cooper's wife, Juliet, is to be syndicated into 50 shares, at a cost of £75,000 per share, with syndicate members sharing in racing earnings as well as an eventual stud career. "Horse racing is meant to be fun," says Cooper, "But believe me, it's a lot more fun when you have a really good horse, and we're lucky enough to have one. In a game, and at a level dominated by the really big stables, it's great to be in a position to give them a run for their money. I'd also like to pay tribute to Jesse Harrington, who did a fantastic job developing the horse. Jesse's a big part of the reason we're in the position we are, and we're just hoping we can build on the foundation she laid, and produce a genuine G1 Epsom Derby contender on the big day."

IT'S ALL IN THE FAMILY FOR SIS

When **Tough Tiz's Sis** (Tiznow) goes postward in Saturday's GII Bayakoa H. at Hollywood Park, there will be one very keen observer in St. Francisville, Illinois.

"I love her," admitted Gary Tussey, who bred the GI Lady's Secret Breeders' Cup S. winner. "I've had five heart attacks and it takes two nitro pills to watch her run. But I just can't wait to see her race."

Tussey has been in the crude oil-producing business for 50 years and he owns Tussey Oil and Tussey Trucking.

He currently has seven broodmares and 15 horses in training and admitted, "I try to breed to sell--it doesn't always work that way, but I do breed to sell."

Tussey's involvement in racing started some 40 years ago.

"We went down to the harness track and started betting on them just a little bit," Tussey explained. "Then I ran into another guy who was a trainer. And then I thought I'd buy a Thoroughbred. I started with cheap claiming horses."

As the years went by, Tussey's involvement in the sport evolved.

"I got into the breeding game [about 20 years ago]," the 67-year-old recalled. "I started going to Keeneland buying yearlings there. I bought a few yearlings, but I didn't have much success.

So I just decided to try and pick out some good broodmares. I ended up buying some mares in foal at Keeneland, but mostly what I've done is try to claim some horses that I thought would be good broodmares."

One of the racehorses that Tussey claimed as a future broodmare was Tough Tiz's Sis's dam Leaseholder (Taylor's Falls). In fact, Tussey liked Leaseholder so much, he claimed her twice.

"They snuck up on us and claimed her, and I was going to get her back regardless of what it took," Tussey said. "I liked her very much. A friend, Dave Vance, who is training for me, and his son, had Leaseholder for this lady down in Texas. She just had a ton of heart. I saw her one time, she was just about three-legged, she was really hurting so bad. And they brought her back to the races and she just had so much class, so much nerve. She's so big-hearted. And she is an awesome broodmare."

Tough Tiz's Sis began her racing career for Tussey, but she was sold after breaking her maiden by 6 1/4 lengths last December at Hawthorne.

"The thing about it is, I've raced a lot of horses and it's just hard to make money in the racing business," Tussey said, explaining his decision to sell the filly. "They called up my trainer and my trainer asked me if I wanted to call them back. I said, 'Sure, I'll call the people.' I called them back. They made me an offer, and I said, 'No, there's no way.' But they paid a respectable price for her and I knew they could do nothing but help me. They were going to get things done that I couldn't get done, and that's proved out to be so. [Trainer] Bob Baffert and the guys who bought her have done an excellent job with her."

After she was purchased by Karl Watson and Paul Weitman's Watson and Weitman Performances LLC, Tough Tiz's Sis went on to win this year's WinStar Oaks, GII Hollywood Breeders' Cup Oaks and GI Lady's Secret Breeders' Cup S. She also finished third in the GI Gazelle S. **Cont. p7**

But Tussey still has strong ties to Tough Tiz's Sis's family.

"I've got a full brother to Tough Tiz's Sis [allowance winner Tough Tiz], before long I'll have a full sibling, I've got a half-sister [weanling by Even the Score] and a half-sister that's a broodmare [Leaseholders Dream]," Tussey explained. "So I've got quite a bit of stock in her. Every time she does something, it goes cha-ching for me, too."

Leaseholder, in foal to Tough Tiz's Sis's sire Tiznow, is attracting quite a bit of attention in the wake of her three-year-old daughter's exploits this year.

"They've been trying to buy me out, mare, foal and all, but I won't sell," Tussey said.

But he's making no guarantees for next year's foal.

"We'll see if it is a good, correct foal, whether it's a colt or a filly," Tussey said. "I'd be more likely to keep a filly."

Tussey has already decided to breed Leaseholders Dream to Tiznow in 2008, but Leaseholder's plans are more uncertain.

"I wish you'd help me," Tussey joked when asked for breeding plans for Leaseholder. "I just got through talking to Darley. I'm thinking about breeding her to Hard Spun, but I don't know yet."

Tough Tiz's Sis's success has Tussey dreaming big for the future.

"My goal is to sell a horse for a million dollars," he said. "That would be a big goal, but it might not be too big because they've already offered a lot of money for my mare."

Saturday's Bayakoa could help Tussey move a step closer to that goal.

JERSEY RACING SET TO TAKE A HIT During a meeting in the state capitol of Trenton Wednesday afternoon, the New Jersey Racing Commission set the 2008 racing calendar, awarding a total of 147 dates to the state's three Thoroughbred facilities. Monmouth Park and the Meadowlands will race a combined 141 days in 2008, as required by off-track betting and account-wagering legislation. The two ovals combined for a total of 120 dates this past year. Making matters worse for the industry is the fact that a four-year, \$86-million purse supplement which allowed Monmouth Park to offer daily average purses of \$330,000 last summer, has now expired and Dennis Dowd, senior vice president for Monmouth and the Meadowlands, estimates that number could be as low as \$180,000. Barring any change, there will be an additional 21 days of racing at the state's two main tracks next season, to Dowd's great dismay. "It makes for a terribly long racing season if we're forced to run that," Dowd told *Daily Racing Form*. "It's going to be a struggle." Monmouth Park is scheduled to race a total of 99 days in 2008 from May 9 to Sept. 28. The newest wrinkle is Friday racing during the month of May. Previously, the track conducted live racing only on the weekends. The Meadowlands will run a Monday-to-Saturday schedule from Oct. 1 to Nov. 15, a total of 42 dates. The track will host live racing on Tuesdays in September, a dark day at Monmouth. Atlantic City Race Course will play host to six live racing programs Apr. 23 to 25 and Apr. 30 to May 2. The awarding of dates to the McKee City venue means simulcasting will be allowed to continue into the New Year. The NJRC also stipulated that the track run a minimum of 20 dates in 2009.

NYRA REORGANIZATION PLAN APPROVED

An amended reorganization plan submitted by officials of the New York Racing Association was approved by a U.S. bankruptcy court in Manhattan Wednesday. The plan is based on a deal with New York Governor Elliot Spitzer, which requires approval from both houses of the state legislature. Spitzer's plan would provide NYRA with a 30-year extension on its franchise to run the three tracks in exchange for NYRA giving up their titles to Aqueduct, Belmont Park and Saratoga. The state would also provide NYRA with \$75 million to resolve some of its existing debt and to make available some operating cash as it emerges from bankruptcy protection. Those who oppose Spitzer's plan want to create a state commission which would award licenses to run the tracks. The commission would also choose operators for a casino at Aqueduct and possibly at Belmont. During Wednesday's hearing, an attorney from the Internal Revenue Service said that it has agreed that NYRA owes "less than \$25 million" to the IRS, Brian Rosen, an attorney for NYRA told *Daily Racing Form*. The IRS had previously suggested NYRA owed in excess of \$1.6 billion.

TAGG VISITS TRF'S WATEREE Trainer Barclay Tagg made a surprise visit to the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation's Second Chances program at the Wateree River Correctional Facility in Rembert, South Carolina this afternoon, and spent an hour touring the facility and visiting with the inmates who care for the program's 34 equine retirees. The trainer of 2003 Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner Funny Cide, Tagg toured the facility, admired the condition of the horses, listened to a description of the course material from corrections officer Tim Amerson, and watched Dr. Reid McClellan, the program's chief instructor, give a round-pen lesson. "This program is much more in-depth than I imagined before I got here," Tagg told the inmates, "and you guys will be well-prepared for jobs in the horse business when you complete the course and leave here. There is no reason for anyone who is willing to work and likes horses to ever be without a job." Kip Elser, president of the South Carolina chapter of the TRF, said that the men were stunned that a person of Tagg's stature in the Thoroughbred industry would pay them a visit. "Several men asked questions and it really gave them a pickup that somebody from the outside would really tell them that they can get a job, that there is something ahead," said Elser. Wateree is one of seven correctional facilities which have partnered with the TRF to bring groundbreaking vocational programs to the inmates while offering top-quality care for ex-race-horses with no other retirement options. CHRB Moves to Prohibit Anabolic Steroids:

The California Horse Racing Board approved an amendment yesterday that would forbid the use of anabolic steroids in horses for a specified period of time prior to a race. The amendment would propose withdrawal times of 30 to 60 days for stanazolol, nandrolone, boldenone and testosterone, the only four steroids approved for use. Though the use of anabolic steroids in California is currently unrestricted, the goal is to be anabolic steroid free by the time of the 2008 Breeders' Cup World Championships, to be held at Santa Anita Park in Arcadia. Dr. Rick Arthur, equine medical director for the CHRB told Daily Racing Form. Penalties for positive test results include a 30-day suspension for the trainer and a redistribution of any purse money.

McKay, a soccer players' agent, acts on behalf of a number of high-profile clients and owns a string of 30 racehorses which are based at his Martin Grange Stables complex in Yorkshire. City of London police, the organisation also involved in the ongoing Kieren Fallon trial, confirmed the former bookmaker was one of five people arrested on suspicion of conspiracy to defraud and false accounting, but had been released on police bail pending further enquiries.
