

RECORD TURNOVER AT TATTERSALLS

An electric day's trade at the Tattersalls December sale in Newmarket yesterday produced an aggregate of over 36-million guineas, the highest single-day turnover ever seen at a European bloodstock auction. No less than three lots made 3-million guineas or more, and two of the trio came from the Sangster family's Swettenham Stud.

The 10-strong dispersal brought in a total of 8,555,000gns, including session topper **Ocean Silk** (Dynaformer). The seven-year-old, a listed winner and runner-up in the

2003 G1 Yorkshire Oaks, sold in foal to Pivotal (GB) for 3.2-million guineas. She was the subject of a duel between John Ferguson and Coolmore's Paul Shanahan, with the Sheikh Mohammed team prevailing once again. Ferguson went to a world-record \$10.5 million for the Swettenham Stud mare Playful Act (Ire) at Keeneland November. Ocean Silk, a \$190,000 KESEP yearling purchase by BBA Ireland supremo Adrian Nicoll, is from the family of two-time European champion filly Divine Proportions and G1SW Whipper. The day's co-second top selling lot also came from the Swettenham consignment.

MGISW **Angara (GB)** (Alzao) was purchased by London Thoroughbred Services, agent for Waddesdon Stud, for 3-million guineas. After the Swettenham draft went through the ring, Ben Sangster reflected, "It is a sad day, but we have to be delighted with the prices. There are a lot of memories--Ocean Silk was bought as a yearling by Adrian Nicoll and trained by John Gosden, and we bought Angara privately and had a lot of sport with the pair of them." Sangster added, "We'll let the dust settle and see what the future holds, but I will have several horses running in my colours and I have a younger brother with two farms in Australia."

Angara (GB) (Alzao) after she was sold for 3-million guineas at Tattersalls yesterday. James Wigan of London Thoroughbred Services signed the ticket. Anthony Stroud went to 2.7-million guineas for the mare, in foal to Montjeu (Ire), and

Charlie Gordon-Watson was the underbidder courtesy of a single 2.9-million guineas bid. "Her page speaks for itself," said Wigan. "I tried to buy her privately before Ben Sangster bought her, and she won her Grade I, so I have always followed her." Wigan bought last year's 4.6-million guineas record-breaker Magical Romance (GB) for Waddesdon Stud.

Darley Still Shopping...

Mandellicht (Ire) (Be My Guest), carrying a full sibling to champion Manduro (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}), is yet another high-priced acquisition set to join the Darley broodmare band. Dick O'Gorman did the bidding on behalf of Sheikh Mohammed's team this time, securing the 13-year-old for 3-million guineas. John Warren, standing with Newsells Park Stud Manager Julian Dollar, was underbidder at 2.9-million guineas; Coolmore rep Paul Shanahan had stopped at 2.7-million guineas. "She's for Darley and will head to Dalham Hall Stud," said O'Gorman. "She was never going to be cheap and has bred an outstanding horse--she's done it already." Ferguson and O'Gorman spent a combined total of 8,995,000gns on six lots, with Ferguson striking early to buy the Irish Group 3 winner **Galatee (Fr)** (Galileo {Ire}) for 1.4-million guineas from Ennistown Stud.

Gordon-Watson In Action...

Charlie Gordon-Watson was working on behalf of two new English clients yesterday. The London-based agent outbid Barronstown Stud's Diane Nagle to get G1 Prix Vermeille winner **Sweet Stream (Ity)** (Shantou), in foal to Monsun (Ger), for 1.1-million guineas. "She's going to Watership Down Stud and has been bought for a new English owner," said Gordon-Watson. "To me, she was the best-looking I've seen in many years." He also picked up **Leto** (Diesis {GB}), a half-sister to 2007 G1 Oaks winner Light Shift (Kingmambo), yesterday, going to 900,000gns on behalf of an undisclosed new owner. The client also acquired **Silverskaya** (Silver Hawk) for 750,000gns. Leto was purchased by Gordon-Watson, on behalf of Breeding Capital Plc, for 250,000gns at last year's December Sale.

Twice a winner at three, Mandelhush was sent through the ring at the 2006 Deauville December Sale as a broodmare prospect and was purchased by Suzanne Roberts for €55,000. But that was before Manduro (Ger), who is out of a half-sister to this mare, reached the pinnacle of his career. A Group 2 winner when Mandelhush last went through the ring, Manduro was a perfect five-for-five this year, with victories in the G1 Prince of Wales's S., G1 Prix d'Ispahan and G1 Prix Jacques Le Marois. Mandelhush is in foal to Breeders' Cup champ Shirocco (Ger), who is by Manduro's sire, Monsun (Ger). Roberts is an agent who buys for syndicates such as De Saro Ltd.

The mare's foal of 2003, Boris de Deauville (Ire) (Soviet Star), captured the G3 Prix de Guiche in 2006 and the G2 Prix d'Harcourt in 2007 and bankrolled €213,800. Pegasus bought back her 2006 foal, a colt by Gold Away (Ire), for €70,000 at the 2007 Deauville August yearling sale, but let Logjam go for a tidy profit here.

She was bred to Cape Cross and was carrying her first foal here; adding to her catalogue page was her half-brother Norman Invader (War Chant), a two-year-old of 2007 who became a group winner with his score in the G3 Go and Go Round Tower S. at The Curragh. Madura was an even more fortunate acquisition. Gordon-Watson picked up the half-sister to European superstar Manduro (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}) for just 170,000gns at this sale last year. In foal to Manduro's sire, she was one of the toppers at Tattersalls December this year.

The first, GSW Mixed Blessing, was snapped up for 160,000gns at this sale last year, bred to Oasis Dream and produced a solid return yesterday. The second was even more successful. Princess Danah was bought for just 80,000gns at the TATAUT sale last year and, now in foal to Mr. Greeley, proved nearly four times as valuable here. The mare is a half to the dam of Shakis (Ire), who won the GII Bernard Baruch H. and was third in the GI Manhattan H. and GI Shadwell Turf Mile S. this year. Both are carrying their first foals.

FROM THE DESK OF...

HEATED EXCHANGES

You know the \$40 million Sheikh Mohammed didn't spend on yearlings in Book 1 of Keeneland September this year? He's put it back in the marketplace now, and then some. Having spent upwards of \$200 million buying every top stallion prospect he could find on both sides of the Atlantic, he is now buying a few mares to go to them. John Ferguson signed for eight broodmares or broodmare prospects in Kentucky for a total of \$33.5 million, and he's followed up in the first two days of Tattersalls December Sale of Mares, etc, with nine more purchases (I'm including Dick O'Gorman signing for Manduro's dam, Mandellicht) totaling over \$40 million.

That makes it 17 fillies or mares for a total of around \$74 million, which is an average of somewhere in the neighborhood of \$4,353,000 per item. Tattersalls finished off their first two days grossing over 60-million guineas (about \$130 million), including a blockbuster session yesterday that shattered last year's single-day European mixed sale gross. Ferguson bought nine horses, including Mandellicht, which constituted 30 percent of the first two days' gross. Sheikh Mohammed may have singlehandedly caused the Keeneland September Book 1 gross to fall by 20 percent, but his 17 purchases, all by themselves, have comprised over 10 percent of the combined \$700-million mixed sale market in Kentucky, Ireland and Britain.

We used to go to the November sales and ask ourselves, as mare after mare went through for impossible prices, "don't they remember what happened in September?" This week we were asking ourselves, "don't they remember what happened last week?"

To which the answer must be--it would appear not. It wasn't just at last week's Tattersalls December Yearling and Foal sales, either; for most of the last three weeks, lower-end commercial horses have been experiencing a brutal clearance rate, often 60 percent or lower of the horses offered. Even during the record-shattering last two days, the clearance rate was 69 percent (compared to 81 percent last year), so there are plenty not getting sold even here, in the strongest of markets, where the two-day gross was up 23 percent from last year's European record and the average up a staggering 39 percent.

We talk about "the market" because these horse sales all have the auction format in common, but everybody knows there are actually several main tiers to the market, and recent results make it abundantly clear that what we might call the "lower-commercial" tier of the marketplace is being hit hard by the effects of overproduction.

Two-hundred-and-fifty more horses were catalogued for the foal sale than a year ago, yet the number sold and the gross were very close to the corresponding numbers from last year. This strongly suggests there is a finite number of horses the market can absorb.

It may be finite, but it's still no small number: through the end of last week's Foal sale, there had been 17,427 horses sold at the second-half North American and European sales we are covering, exactly 18 more horses (one-tenth of one percent) than last year. The last two days, which totaled over \$130 million when converted to U.S. dollars, take the second-half totals to more than 18,000 horses sold for more than \$1.5 billion, with another two days at Tattersalls today and tomorrow and four days of selling at the Arqana December sale at Deauville to come.

There is one worrying aspect of Sheikh Mohammed's nearly \$300-million spending spree on breeding stock this year, though, and that is the creation of a huge gap in what used to be the top tier of the market. Up until this year, the top one or two percent of the market saw a linear progression to the very top, but this year, Darley's stallion and now broodmare acquisitions (the stallions privately and the broodmares at auction) have resulted in the top one-tenth of one percent of sales now belonging almost exclusively to Darley and Coolmore--when Coolmore decides to take Darley on.

No fewer than five mares during Tattersalls' first two days sold for 3-million guineas (about \$6,450,000) or more; four went to Darley, the other to London Thoroughbred Services' James Wigan, who last year signed for the then-record filly or mare, Magical Romance. It is unbelievably strong at the very top, but the very top is now such a rarefied atmosphere that very serious players after very serious stallion and broodmare prospects are being frustrated at almost every turn.

Naturally, impressive home runs are being scored at this new top level, as two of the fillies or mares who sold for 3-million guineas or more illustrate. Agent Jamie McCalmont, who had previously bought Breeders' Cup winners Wilko and Red Rocks for his principal client, J. Paul Reddam, bought Sander Camillo for \$500,000 at the Fasig Calder Two-Year-Old sale for Sir Robert Ogden last year. Trained by Jeremy Nosedá, she went on to win the G2 Cherry Hinton S. last year, and was rated the second-best two-year-old filly in Europe, behind only Finsceal Beo. She sold Monday to John Ferguson for 3.2-million guineas (about \$6,880,000). The same price was realized by Ocean Silk, the star of the Sangster/Swettenham Stud consignment yesterday (after Magnificent Style had to be scratched). A \$190,000 yearling purchase by the Sangster family in 2001, she won the Lupe S. and ran second in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks; her dam then became a full sister to dual Classic winner Divine Proportions. Fortunately, the big scores weren't limited to the few mares who brought more than \$6 million. A British venture called Breeding Capital PLC, run by financier William Sporborg with expert aid from Simon Marsh, Charlie Gordon-Watson and Michael Youngs, bought seven fillies or mares last year. Three of them (Erytheis, Madura and Leto) came up last night, all three with significant updates. The three had been bought for a total of 605,000gns last year at this sale; all three got in foal, on stud fees totaling around another 225,000gns. They sold for a combined 2,070,000gns yesterday.

The boys are doing another Breeding Capital project in January and, after this performance, it's a fairly safe prediction that the project will be selling out in a hurry. Nothing But Net, and from the three-point line, too. Well done.

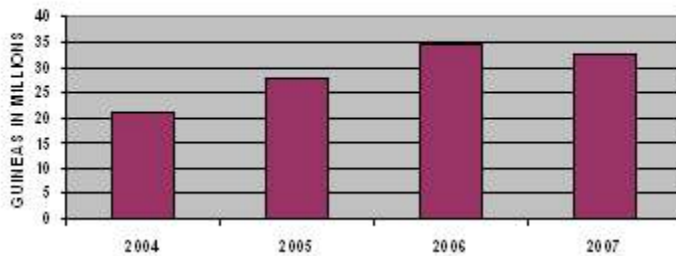

"You wouldn't know it from the blockbuster mare session yesterday, but last week's Yearlings and Foals parts of Tattersalls December Sale exposed serious weakness in the bottom ranges of commercial pedigrees. By the end of the week, though, the gross and average were each off a manageable 5%. Overall, the market has been strikingly similar to last year: with more than 17,000 horses grossing over \$1.4-billion. In the second-half sales, the number sold is up by 18 (one-tenth of 1%), the gross is down \$6-million, and the average by \$500 – one-half of 1% each."

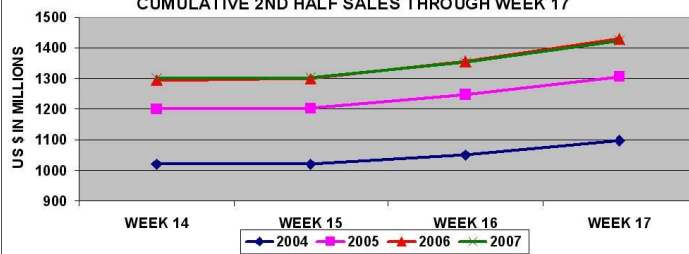

LIFE AFTER THE BREEDERS' CUP

Since its inception in 1981, seven champions have lined up for the GI Hollywood Turf Cup. The legendary John Henry, a two-time Horse of the Year recipient, brought home 1983's edition at the age of eight. Miss Alleged, heroine of the 1991 GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Churchill Downs, closed out her championship season with a head victory over 1990 winner and champion turf horse Itsallgreetkome. She is the only filly or mare to win the Turf Cup. Vanlandingham, champion older horse in 1985, finished third behind Zoffany in that term's Turf Cup. The great Theatrical (Ire) completed the trifecta in 1986, one year before being crowned champion turf horse. Champion turf mare Estrapade finished off the board in 1986. Tasso, winner of the 1985 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile as well as the Eclipse as top two-year-old colt that season, was retired following a ninth-place finish in the 1987 Turf Cup.

Alphabatim became the first two-time winner, rattling off victories in 1984 and 1986. Lazy Lode (Arg) produced back-to-back wins in 1998 and 1999 before finishing third in 2000.

Paulson homebred Fraise crossed the wire first in 1992 and 1993, but was DQ'd from the top spot and placed second due to interference in '92. He left little doubt about the outcome the following year, running off to a six-length tally, which remains the largest winning margin in Turf Cup history.

Jockey Chris McCarron leads all riders with eight victories. Among active journeymen, Alex Solis has won four editions, while Corey Nakatani has booted home two victors. Four conditioners have saddled three winners--Bobby Frankel, John Gosden, Richard Mandella and Charlie Whittingham.

Boboman's final time of 2:24 3/5 in 2006 eclipsed Itsallgreetkome's winning time of 2:24 4/5 in 1990 for the stakes record. Bien Bien, hero of the 1992 edition, became the first Turf Cup winner to sire a winner when his son Bienamado scored by three lengths in 2000.

Grass racing, including the Turf Cup, was called off at the 2005 Hollywood Park autumn meeting after management was dissatisfied with a newly installed turf course. Run at 1 3/8 miles between 1982-84, the Turf Cup was split into two divisions in 1982. It is currently run at 1 1/2 miles.

OBS STEROID BAN TO INCLUDE TWO-YEAR-OLD SALES Beginning with the 2008 February Sale of Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training, the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company will implement a policy banning the use of anabolic steroids within 45 days of an OBS sale, it was announced yesterday. Buyers can request that their purchases be tested for steroids, and a positive test will allow the buyer to void the sale. "The use of anabolic steroids throughout all sports is certainly a hot topic and deserving of close scrutiny," said OBS General Manager Tom Ventura. "With the advancement in testing technology, OBS considers the timing appropriate to incorporate restrictions regarding the use of anabolic steroids." OBS announced additional changes to its medication and prohibited practices policy, including a ban on bronchodilators, Lasix, procaine penicillin and all Class 1 and Class 2 substances, as defined by the Association of Racing Commissioners International.

BARRETT'S ANNOUNCES STEROID POLICY Barretts Equine Limited announced yesterday that, beginning in January of next year, it will prohibit the sale of weanlings and yearlings treated with anabolic steroids. Steroids must be withdrawn a minimum of 45 days prior to a Barretts sale. "Along with our parent company, the Los Angeles County Fair Association, we support the Thoroughbred industry's movement toward the regulation of these medications," said Jerry McMahon, president and general manager of Barretts. "We believe these actions are critical steps the industry must take in order to strengthen buyer confidence, as well as the overall integrity of our sport. We look forward to working with Dr. Rick Arthur, who has shown tremendous leadership nationally and in our state as the [California Horse Racing Board] equine medical director, and Dr. Scott Stanley, director of the Ken Maddy Laboratory at the University of California at Davis, as we move to implement these rules at future Barretts two-year-old sales as well." The 2008 Barretts January Mixed Sale, set for Jan. 22-23, will be conducted under the previous conditions of sale listed in the catalogue, which do not specifically address the use of anabolic steroids. Barretts will submit samples from the January sale to the Ken Maddy Laboratory for testing.

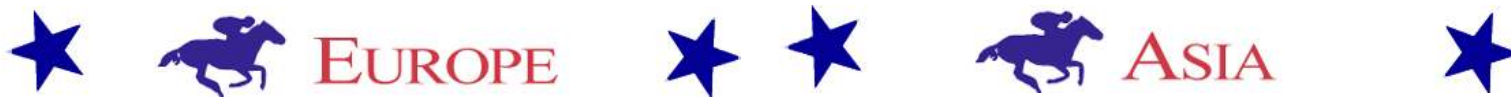
Melnyk Purchases Kentucky Property:
