SLEW'S TIZNOW OUT OF CASHCALL FUTURITY

G1 Lane's End Breeders' Futurity runner-up **Slew's**

Tiznow (Tiznow) has been scratched from today's G1 CashCall Futurity at Hollywood Park due to illness. "I went to check on him at feed time yesterday afternoon, and he was sluggish and dull," trainer Greg Fox said Friday. "He was running a temperature of 101.5. We monitored it, and it was still about the same. That indicated he is fighting some sort of infection. His bloodwork was reasonably good, but he is struggling to get over some sort of mild bug." Fox added, "He is being treated with antibiotics...and if all goes well, he will go home on the 29th. His owner, Joseph LaCombe, was disappointed, but understanding." Originally trained by Patrick Biancone, Slew's Tiznow was fourth behind War Pass in his debut at Saratoga July 28. He came back to break his maiden by 4 1/4 lengths at the Spa Aug. 18 and ran second behind Wicked Style while making his two-turn bow in the Breeders' Futurity. Forced to scratch from the G1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile because of a fever as well, the two-year-old skipped the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. to await this spot, which would have been his first start for Fox. A field of 13 will now go to the post, the largest since Swiss Yodeler prevailed in 1996.

RETIREMENT FOR COURTNEY AND CARRION

Robert Courtney Sr., the owner of Crestfield Farm near Lexington, announced yesterday that one of his primary clients, Jaime Carrion, will be dispersing the remainder of his holdings at the upcoming Keeneland January sale, and that both men will retire. "I've got a lot of years behind me," Courtney said. "We've both got a little age on us, and the game has changed. My health is pretty good, but we both have little problems, and we thought it was time for retirement." Courtney, 86, purchased his first mare in 1941, and 13 years later bought Crestfield, which now covers 300 acres. Sons Robert Jr. and Tom co-manage the operation, and will remain in the business. In partnership with Robert Congleton, Courtney bred millionaire Fit to Fight. Carrion, a native of Puerto Rico, owned a large citrus grower in Florida, and founded Puerto Rico International Airline, a company he sold in 1969. The 79-year-old became involved in racing through Courtney, buying his first broodmares in 1977, and went on to breed champions Meadow Star and Action This Day. While he was most active as a breeder, he also raced stakes winners such as Conte di Savoya, Scratch Pad and Wander Mom. The majority of Carrion's broodmares, which number around 20, were sold privately. There will be nine yearlings, including a half-sister to Action This Day by Ghostzapper, and four broodmare prospects offered at Keeneland January. Courtney will oversee the consignment. "That will be my swan song," he said.

A Prevue of Things to Come?

The first three finishers from the Gill Hollywood Prevue S., the prep for the GI CashCall Futurity, will meet again today. **Massive Drama** (Kafwain), a \$485,000 FTKJUL purchase for Zayat Stables, dashed off a half in :44 1/5 in that seven-furlong test and turned back the challenge of **Into Mischief** (Harlan's Holiday) to take it by 1 3/4 lengths. The colt is now perfect in two starts, and trainer Bob Baffert is pleased with the way he is coming into his first route attempt. "He'll be up close, with his natural speed," Baffert told *Daily Racing Form*. "He hasn't missed a beat. I like the way he's coming along." But Baffert added, "The two turns will be a big test. You don't know how they'll handle that." Massive Drama has been working bullets since the Nov. 22 Prevue, most recently going five-eighths in :58 flat Dec. 16. **Meal Penalty** (Tale of the Cat) has also trained well since running third in the Prevue. The gray colt, one of three Todd Pletcher trainees in the Futurity, closed ground from the rail last time, and adds blinkers today. The \$350,000 BESMAR buy broke his maiden in his career opener at the Meadowlands Sept. 11 and added a Keeneland allowance score Oct. 14. He makes his distance bow off a five-eighths move in :59 3/5 Dec. 16.

Proud as a Peacock...

While owner Cecil Peacock may not be entirely convinced that GIII Generous S. runner-up **Indian Sun** (Indian Charlie) can win today's GI CashCall Futurity, the Calgary native is quite sure of one thing.

"He's very adult for his age, believe me. I think he's more mature than I am," he said with a laugh.

Through his trainer Dan Hendricks, Peacock went to \$140,000 to purchase the son of Unequivocal (Alleged) out of this year's Barretts March sale. What caught his eye?

"He looked so good on the track," Peacock explained. "We appreciated his breeding and his overall appearance and just the way he acted. He was so cool and never was in a sweat."

Brought along slowly by Hendricks, Indian Sun did not make his debut until about two months ago, charging

from last to finish second by 3/4 of a length in a Santa Anita maiden down the hill. The bay got the job done in his next start Nov. 4 ([video](#)), setting the stage for the Generous ([video](#)), in which he was defeated 2 1/4 lengths by The

Leopard. Peacock said that it was not necessarily plan 'A' for Indian Sun to make his first three starts on the grass. He tries the Cushion Track for the first time this afternoon.

"It just happened that those were the races that came about when he was ready to go," the 80-year-old Peacock commented. "So we put him on the turf and he seemed to enjoy it. The turf-to-synthetic angle is not too extreme and we have high hopes that he can handle it. He's been doing well in his works on it."

Peacock has the distinction of being a prior winner of the Futurity, courtesy of Brother Derek in 2005.

"We can't help but to compare him with Brother Derek, both for eye appeal and for racing capacity," he offered. "I think he's a little more cool than Brother Derek. One time, I asked Dan--we were training at Santa Anita and had to run him over to Hollywood Park for the race--and I asked Dan, did that not upset him to be trucked over for the race? Dan said, 'Nothing upsets Indian Sun, except if you forget to feed him.'"

Peacock said that Brother Derek, unraced since finishing third in the GII Strub S. in February, is back in light training with Hendricks and could make a return to the races in early 2008. As for Indian Sun, Peacock is enjoying the ride so far.

"He's been a pleasure already," he said. "It's so much fun to have a horse that gets out there and shows quite a capacity to run. He's nice to get along with and he puts on a pretty good show."

SANTA ANITA ON TRACK FOR OPENING Santa Anita President Ron Charles said yesterday that Santa Anita will be ready for business on opening day, Wednesday, Dec. 26. "We're positively going to race," Charles said. "We're going to open the 26th and we're expecting to have a good surface." The Santa Anita Cushion Track, installed last summer, has been closed since Dec. 3 to improve the drainage system. The problems have not been completely resolved, but track management is confident all will be in order the day after Christmas. "The quality of drainage isn't as good as we'd like, so we're continuing to experiment at the seven-eighths chute, but, currently, the weather forecast looks extremely good for the next seven or eight days," Charles said. "Opening day, it should be terrific." The track is scheduled to be open for training today.

DATES FOR KY FUTURE WAGER POOLS SET The first pools for the 2008 Kentucky Derby and Kentucky Oaks Future Wagers will open Thursday, Feb. 7, at noon Eastern time. The Derby pool will close at 6 p.m. ET on Sunday, Feb. 10, and the Oaks pool will close at 6:30 p.m. ET. The second pool is scheduled for Mar. 6-9, and the third and final pool for Apr. 3-6. The opening and closing times will be the same for all three pools. The GI Kentucky Oaks will be run May 2 next year, with the GI Kentucky Derby set for May 3. The Derby Future Wager was established in 1999, with an aggregate of \$676,233 bet; last year, the pools totaled \$1,365,424. The handle for the Oaks Future Wager, started in 2003, has grown from \$117,368 to \$193,086. Funny Cide set the record for a Derby Future Wager payoff when those who had him in Pool 1 collected \$188. He paid \$27.60 on Derby day in 2003. Ashado paid a record \$48.40 in Pool 1 of the 2004 Oaks Future Wager, and just \$6.60 on Oaks day.

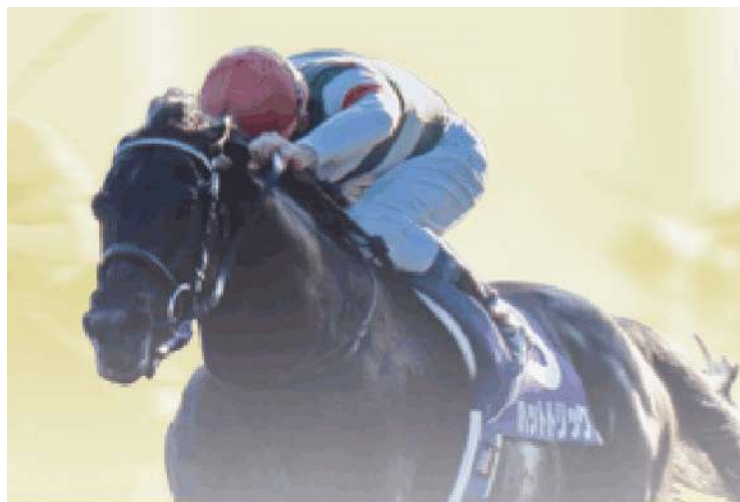

WTO SETTLES ONLINE GAMBLING DISPUTE

The World Trade Organization yesterday ruled that Antigua and Barbuda will receive \$21 million in annual trade concessions in its dispute with the U.S. over online gambling. In the dispute, originally filed in 2003, the two Caribbean nations claimed that the U.S. was in violation of trade agreements because it bans all Internet gaming from foreign suppliers, while allowing online wagering on horse racing from domestic companies, and was seeking \$3.4 billion in damages. The U.S. had countered with an offer of \$500,000, and the case went before a WTO arbitration panel in July. After the ruling, U.S. Trade Representative Spokesman Sean Spicer stated, "Because the United States is already taking steps to bring itself into compliance by clarifying its WTO commitments with respect to Internet gambling, the Arbitrator's award issued today is not paramount. The United States has already initiated the formal process under the WTO for clarifying its schedule of commitments and is engaged in compensation negotiations with Antigua and six other WTO Members that have claimed to be affected. We would expect that Antigua would not suspend its WTO commitments to the United States while that process is underway." Spicer added, "Once the process of clarifying the U.S. schedule of commitments is complete, any issues in our bilateral dispute with Antigua will be moot, and there will no longer be any basis for suspending WTO commitments in accordance with the Arbitrator's award."

WTO Gives Antigua Rights to U.S. Intellectual Property...

In addition to the trade concessions, the WTO ruled that Antigua is also entitled to suspend WTO benefits with respect to intellectual property rights. That gives the country the right to suspend copyright protections on American movies, music and software, allowing its manufacturers to export copies of those products to the U.S. and other markets to make up for the loss in business. A release from the Office of the U.S. Trade Representative stated, "The United States is pleased that the figure arrived at by the Arbitrator is over 100 times lower than Antigua's claim. The United States is concerned, however, that the Arbitrator agreed with Antigua's request to suspend WTO concessions, not just with respect to services, but also with respect to intellectual property rights (IPR). Any authorization pursuant to the award would be strictly limited to Antigua...Moreover, even with respect to Antigua, it would establish a harmful precedent for a WTO Member to affirmatively authorize what would otherwise be considered acts of piracy, counterfeiting, or other forms of IPR infringement. Furthermore, to do so would undermine Antigua's claimed intentions of becoming a leader in legitimate electronic commerce, and would severely discourage foreign investment in the Antiguan economy."

Snow Ridge to Regal Heir:

Snow Ridge (Tabasco Cat--Snow Forest, by Woodman) is being relocated from his previous home at Padua Stables in Florida to Regal Heir Farm in Grantville, Pennsylvania, for the 2008 breeding season. The winners of the 2002 GI San Carlos H. will stand for a fee of \$5,000 as the property of Joe Davis. The sire of 52 winner from 69 to race, Snow Ridge has progeny earnings of \$1,875,972 through this past Wednesday. "I think he's going to have better and better babies," said Davis, who bought Snow Ridge after the 2007 breeding season with the intention of standing him in Louisiana. "I'm going out and buying as many of the babies as I can at auction to promote him but also to help improve his mares. The mares that he got the last few years were better than he got his first two years. I think when his third crop hits the track next year, it will be his best crop so far." Bred in Kentucky by Mt. Brilliant Farm, Snow Ridge, a 10-time winner of \$711,989, is a half-brother to \$2.5 million KEESEP yearling Pavarotti (A.P. Indy), who enters stud this year in Florida.



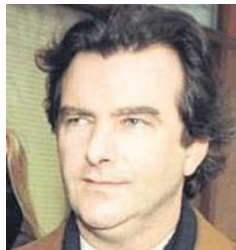

TARGET, HERO--TAKE TWO When last they clashed, **Takeover Target (Aus)** (Celtic Swing {GB}) came with a barnstorming run to defeat **Dance Hero (Aus)** (Danzero {Aus}) by a long head in a six-furlong test at Randwick Dec. 1. The two multiple Group 1 winners rematch in this afternoon's Listed Razor Sharp Quality S. at the Sydney oval, and although there is a slight shift in the weights in the favor of Dance Hero, Takeover Target figures that much tighter in his second appearance off a 23-week absence. The eight-year-old turned in his final piece of serious work Tuesday, covering the final 600 meters of a five-furlong move in :34.8. "He stretched out well and everything looks good for Saturday," jockey Jay Ford told *Australia Associated Press*. "I let him do a bit of work up the straight and [trainer] Joe [Janiak] was very happy with the work and the horse has pulled up a treat."
