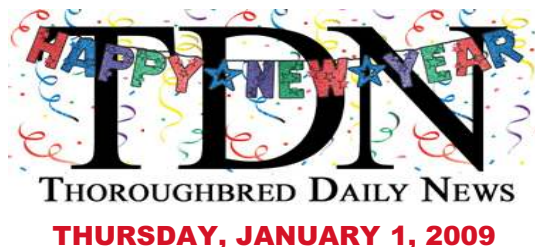

## WINSTAR PURCHASES PERUVIAN COLT

WinStar Farm has purchased the promising Peruvian-raced two-year-old colt **Al Khali** (Medaglia d'Oro--Maya, by Capote) for a 2009 North American campaign. The



Kentucky-bred, a Northern Hemisphere two-year-old who was competing against Southern Hemisphere three-year-

olds, captured two of three starts in Peru by a combined 12 lengths. He was shipped from Lima to Miami Dec. 9, and will be trained in the United States by Todd Pletcher. Bloodstock agent John Fulton brokered the deal for Al Khali, in association with Kentucky-based agent Fernando Macchiavello. "John gave us the head-up about the colt," WinStar's Doug Cauthen said. "He went down there and looked at him, and he liked him, so we bought the colt on his recommendation."

Cauthen added, "He's well-bred, by an up- and-coming young sire, out of a nice female family, and he's a good physical. We've had success with John's recommendations in the past, so we're relying on his bird's-eye view, and we're hopeful for 2009." Al Khali's third dam is GISW Chic Shirine (Mr. Prospector); he is from the family of champion Queena, GISWs Brahms and Serra Lake and graded winners Tara Roma, Cappuchino, Waldoboro, La Reina and Regal Engagement. The bay was acquired for \$15,000 as a KEESEP yearling by Dante Zanelli, agent. Zanelli also signed the ticket for subsequent Peruvian Derby hero Tomcito (Street Cry {Ire}), a \$7,500 KEESEP yearling who was four-for-five in Peru for owner Stud Jet Set and trainer Juan Suarez. Tomcito returned to the U.S. last winter, and Zanelli saddled him to a third-place finish in the GI Florida Derby in his first stateside start.

## READY TO BRING THE "HEAT"

Martin Schwartz's **Elusive Heat** (Elusive Quality), a daughter of champion Xtra Heat (Dixieland Heat), will make her much anticipated return to the races in Sunday's GIII Old Hat S. at Gulfstream Park.

Trained by Kieran McLaughlin, the dark bay showed brilliant early speed in her Oct. 12 Belmont unveiling ([Video](#)), clearing the field after breaking from post nine. With Edgar Prado in the irons, she effortlessly dashed off fractions of :22.19 and :44.95, and went on to win for fun by 5 1/2 lengths, earning **"TDN Rising Star"** status.

"She's just a very talented filly--very fast and she does everything right," McLaughlin said of Elusive Heat, who was acquired by Schwartz for \$750,000 at the FTFFEB two-year-olds in training sale. "She ran extremely well that day, and we hope that she could repeat that performance in the Old Hat. I'm sure it's going to be a little tougher than a maiden race, but she's very talented and we thought we'd step her up to a graded stakes hoping to get a graded placing or a win."

7-time Stakes winner **RAVALO** won the Christmas Stakes on December 27th, posting his second consecutive victory in the race. On the board in 10 Stakes races, **RAVALO's** latest win boosts his career earnings to over a half million dollars.

According to McLaughlin, the plan all along was to await the Old Hat following Elusive Heat's sparkling debut. The 3/4 to SW & GSP Southwestern Heat (Gone West) has posted four workouts at Palm Meadows since late November, including a four-furlong move in :48.25 Dec. 29.

"She worked very well," the conditioner said of Elusive Heat's most recent workout. "Just what we ordered--:48 1/5. She's been working regularly and working well, and we're happy with her training and looking forward to running her."

Elusive Heat will likely be kept to one-turn affairs, and will be pointed toward some of the same stakes races as her multi-millionaire winning mother, who annexed the 2001 GI Prioress S. at Belmont and also placed second in that term's GI Test S. at the Spa.

"I would have to say I'd doubt her stretching out based on her pedigree," McLaughlin commented. "Out of Xtra Heat--who was a pure sprinter--she looks like a sprinter. She's very fast looking. You never know until you try it, but I would think we wouldn't be too quick to try her too far. We wouldn't mind running seven [furlongs], but as far as two turns, we're not going to be in a hurry to do that. We have Grade Is in New York at six and seven furlongs in the Prioress and the Test. So those may be some of our goals down the road."

Prado has retained the mount for Sunday.--S.S.

## WRITERS UP

A well-known pedigree authority blogged Dec. 23 that the first-crop Walmac stallion Soto was represented by four stakes winners in his first crop, including a Group 1 winner in Japan. He was wrong, but this isn't about him. It's about the flow of erroneous information that can contaminate the research and decision-making process of owners and breeders, unless extreme care is used to filter the true from the false.

The primary bad source, in this case, happens to be equineline.com, a division of The Jockey Club Information Systems, Inc., (TJCIS), a subsidiary of The Jockey Club.

The official word on black type is the book "International Cataloguing Standards and International Statistics 2008," which, ironically, is published by TJCIS in association with the International Federation of Horseracing Authorities. This book clearly states which races worldwide are accorded Group 1, 2, 3, or listed race status, and which other races in the U.S. are eligible for black type, based on purse monies exceeding \$50,000, with some restrictions.

"Cataloging Standards" divides countries into three parts for flat racing. Only "Part 1" countries have recognized grade or group races, and they include the U.S. and Canada; the major European racing countries; Argentina, Brazil, Chile and Peru from South America; Japan, Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, United Arab Emirates, selected races from Hong Kong and one race from Singapore (the most up-to-date stats are available from the website of the International Federation of Horseracing Authorities, [www.ifhaonline.org](http://www.ifhaonline.org)).

Stakes races (including group races) in "Part II" countries are only given listed race status. "Part II" countries include Hong Kong (except for those races that are "Part I"), India, Macau, Panama, Puerto Rico, Scandinavia (except for six races that are "Part I"), Singapore (except for one Group 1 race), Uruguay (former "Part I" country), Venezuela and Zimbabwe.

"Part III" countries get no black type, and they include Mexico, Netherlands, Korea, and everywhere else that racing is conducted.

Because TJCIS publishes this material, Equineline should have this information reflected in its products.

For some of his Soto blog stats, the pedigree authority used equineline.com's product 501s-Soto, a copy of which can be accessed from Soto's page on the Walmac web site (dated Dec. 22 at this writing). Here, it states that Soto is the sire of "four stakes winners" and "1 graded-stakes winner." **cont. p3**



**Writers Up cont.**

In his Soto blog, the authority had Soto as the sire of a Group 1 winner in Japan and a Grade I winner in Mexico as well, so he had one more group or graded winner than EquineLine's 501 report. He probably found the Mexican stakes winner on *The Blood-Horse* online stallion register, which lists the Mexican Grade I winner and a hyperlinked chart of the race--the Clasico Daniel Cardenas Mora.

The online *Blood-Horse* stallion register lists four stakes winners for Soto, but no Japanese Group 1 winner. The *Thoroughbred Times* stallion register has three stakes winners for the stallion, but no Mexican Grade I winner.

Stallion-register pages are advertisements, and are not meant to be definitive reference material, but EquineLine products are usually accepted at face value, which is presumably what the authority used to shape his blog.

Unfortunately, because of this, Soto's stats are inflated in the authority's piece, and anyone researching the stallion through EquineLine or the two stallion registers also will be misled, as the authority was. Instead of four stakes winners, he should have only two at this writing. None of his runners at this point in time are Group 1/ Grade I winners.

Because of a technicality, however, there's room for distortion. Black type is not synonymous with stakes races; therefore, a horse that wins a \$10,000, \$20,000, or \$30,000 stakes race at a small track can be listed as a "stakes winner" for his sire, even though his dam wouldn't get credit for it on her catalog page according to "Cataloging Standards."

Breeders and owners need to demand more uniformity and accuracy from TJCIS, as well as from the advertising supplements of *The Blood-Horse* and *Thoroughbred Times*.

For the record, Walmac, to its credit, had the correct information for Soto on its web page: Two stakes winners, neither of them a Group 1 or Grade I winner.

Here's where everyone else went wrong, according to the "Cataloging Standards:"

- Soto's talented son Suni won the Zen-Nippon Nisai Yushun, a listed race and not a Japanese Group 1.
- Soto's daughter Sonrisa's graded Mexican race does not count as black type, because Mexico is a "Part III" country.
- Soto's daughter Glamorous Gal does get black type, because the \$60,000 stakes race she won qualifies on purse money.
- Soto's son Dance to the Star does not get black type, because the \$25,000 stakes race he won does not qualify on purse money.

**DAUGHTER OF IMMIGRANT WORKERS  
TO HEAD LABOR DEPARTMENT**

President-elect Barack Obama recently nominated a woman whose parents were immigrant workers to head the Department of Labor. U.S. Rep. Hilda Solis (D-CA) is the daughter of a Mexican-born father who was a Teamsters union steward. Solis' mother is from Nicaragua. During her four terms in Congress, Solis has championed both labor and immigration causes.

Immigration reform is expected to be considered once again in the 111th Congress and will include efforts to balance border security and enforcement against the issue of legalization. The Obama-Biden "Blueprint for Change" indicates that, as President, Obama will bring this issue up in the first year of his administration.

While Obama has stated he favors comprehensive immigration reform and does not put specific focus on H-1B visas, he also has said that he would support a temporary increase in H-1Bs (used largely by employers seeking highly educated and technically skilled workers) as a "stopgap" measure until comprehensive reform can be enacted. It remains unclear whether initial reforms will extend to H-2B visa workers, who are used by employers in the racing industry, fishing, landscaping, etc.

**YOUBET TO TAKE BETS ON GULFSTREAM**

Youbet.com has entered an agreement to offer wagering on Gulfstream Park races when the track re-opens Jan. 3, according to *Blood-Horse* yesterday. Sam Gordon, president of the Florida Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, also confirmed that Youbet.com has reached an agreement for Calder's upcoming 2009 meet. According to Gordon, the agreement between Youbet.com and the Florida tracks offers the same division of revenue as those attained by other advance deposit wagering (ADW) platforms TwinSpires.com and XpressBet.com. Those companies agreed to pay nine percent on their handle for the Gulfstream signal and seven percent for Calder's. TrackNet Media, a joint venture owned by Magna Entertainment Corp. and Churchill Downs Inc., is involved in ongoing negotiations with TVG for the signals of the two South Florida ovals. Both platforms, Youbet.com and TVG, did not carry Gulfstream races in 2008. From the beginning of the Calder meet which commenced Apr. 21 through Dec. 22, Calder was not carried on most large ADWs, however, TwinSpires.com and XpressBet.com are currently offering wagering on the Miami oval for the rest of its meet, which concludes Jan. 2.

**NYSRWB Mandates New Ticket Cashing Policy:**

Effective Jan. 1, 2009, the New York State Racing and Wagering Board (NYSRWB) has implemented a new rule concerning any winning pari-mutuel ticket purchased at a New York pari-mutuel facility that is not cashed within 10 days and has a cash value of \$300 or more. Under the new NYSRWB mandate, such a ticket can only be cashed at specific designated pari-mutuel windows after the name, home address, date of birth and social security number of the relevant patron have been provided. No other racing jurisdiction in the country makes this requirement of its customers. The New York Racing Association strongly opposed this new rule when it was circulated for industry comments, and continues to oppose the rule as fundamentally bad public policy, because it will not remedy any material harm that can be articulated and it will therefore needlessly damage the business of the state's pari-mutuel facilities. "The New York Racing Association is the industry leader in integrity, based on its anti-money laundering policies, its race day security barns, and its refusal to do business with unregulated off-shore rebate shops," said NYRA President and CEO Charles Hayward. "However, this rule is not about integrity; it is further inconveniencing the customer who is fortunate enough to have placed a winning wager. No other state in the country punishes its customers for holding on to a winning ticket for more than 10 days. Given the current state of the industry and the economy in general, this new ruling could not have come at a worse time."

Delosvientos galloped his rivals into the ground in three successive starts earlier this year, capped by a two-length tally in the 12-furlong GII Brooklyn H. at Belmont June 6. Shipped to California for the GI Pacific Classic Aug. 24 at Del Mar, the dark bay never saw the lead and folded to finish ninth in that Polytrack contest. He returned east to annex Monmouth's Point Given S. at a mile and a half Sept. 21, and was odds-on here despite the layoff. Breaking alertly in the swirling snow, the five-year-old assumed his customary spot on the front end with splits of :49.33, 1:13.83 and 1:40.26. Lord Kipling took a run at him turning for home, but Delosvientos responded to jockey Eddie Castro and, despite being reluctant to switch leads, crossed the wire well clear of his rivals. "This was a wonderful way to finish up the year," said owner/trainer Giuseppe Iadiseria. "Having so much time off was not ideal, but I was not concerned. The only trouble with him is finding longer races on the dirt. He'll have about 60 days off and during that time we'll figure out what will be next for him." [Video, sponsored by Taylor Made.](#)

The bay romped by 15 1/2 lengths at the \$30,000 level at this track Nov. 3 and added another front-running tally in a local optional claimer Nov. 25. After stalking the pace from the inside, the sophomore came up the fence to take the lead and kicked clear in the final furlong for her third straight success.

### Lord of the Game Making Comeback:

Multiple graded stakes winner **Lord of the Game** (Saint Ballado) will make his first start since 2005 in today's ninth race at Fair Grounds, a one-mile optional claimer. The seven-year-old gelding sustained a torn tendon in his left foreleg after his last start, a sixth-place finish in the Gill Fayette S. at Keeneland in October 2005; he was trained by Tom Tomillo at the time. "We did stem cell on the tendon, and so far, so good," trainer Keith Bourgeois told *Daily Racing Form*. "He checks out good when he comes off the track after working out." The half-brother to GISW Bluegrass Cat (Storm Cat) has been breezing steadily since returning to the

worktab in October at the Evangeline training center. "He's been working really well, and he needs to run," Bourgeois added. "I'd like to find out if he can be even three-quarters of the horse he once was. Horses are like people, they slow down as they age. But he hasn't run that much, and he hasn't been run into the ground." Dropped in for a \$10,000 tag by breeder WinStar Farm in his career debut on New Year's Eve 2004, Lord of the Game aired by 22 3/4 lengths and was claimed by William Slevin. He wound up winning seven of his first eight starts, including the Gill Hanshin H. and Gill Cornhusker Breeders' Cup H. in 2005. Also second in the Gill Hawthorne Gold Cup that season, the dark bay's record currently stands at 13-8-2-1 with earnings of \$539,920.

### Oaklawn, HBPA, TrackNet Settle ADW Agreement:

Oaklawn Jockey Club, the Arkansas division of the Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association and TrackNet Media have finalized an agreement on advance deposit wagering. The result of the agreement will have Oaklawn races available on the ADW outlets owned by TrackNet Media--TwinSpires.com and XpressBet.com--as well as to Youbet.com for the 2009 live Thoroughbred season at Oaklawn, which includes 54 racing days from Jan. 16-Apr. 11. "This agreement was worked out through the outstanding efforts of Dr. Earl Bellamy, president of the HBPA in Arkansas," noted Oaklawn Gaming and Wagering Director Bobby Geiger. "Our discussions were always businesslike and never contentious, which makes it a pleasure to work on an agreement like this with Dr. Bellamy." Scott Daruty, president and CEO of TrackNet, added, "TrackNet's goal has always been to broadly distribute the content of its member racetracks. Unfortunately, in the recent past, various industry issues have prevented that from happening. However, we are now at a point where those issues appear to be resolved. This agreement relating to the distribution of the Oaklawn signal for account wagering is another example of how the industry is well-served by broad distribution."

### Euroears Sidlined Again:

**Euroears** (Langfuhr), the winner of his first six lifetime starts, has been sidelined after aggravating the surgery site on his right hind leg; the chestnut sustained a fracture to his right hind leg earlier this season. ### Louisville Courier-Journal Web Site Wins Eclipse Award:

The National Thoroughbred Racing Association, *Daily Racing Form* and the National Turf Writers Association announced yesterday that the Website [courier-journal.com](http://www.courier-journal.com) of the *Louisville Courier-Journal* has been honored with the 2008 Media Eclipse Award in the Audio and Multi-Media Internet category. The site won for its three-part series on injuries to race horses, which appeared on its site from Aug. 16-18, 2008. Following the fatal injury to Eight Belles in the Kentucky Derby, the *Courier-Journal* initiated an investigative examination of horse racing safety, incorporating multiple platforms of audio, video, print, interactive graphics and still photography on [courier-journal.com](http://www.courier-journal.com). Titled "Tragedy on the Track," the series explored genetic research and breeding, track surfaces and performance-enhancing medication. The print pieces were supported by videos, which included a comparison of Thoroughbreds making foot impact on a dirt track and synthetic surfaces; and a demonstration by blacksmith Steve Norman focusing on the differences between flat horse shoes and controversial toe grabs. "After the deaths of Barbaro and then Eight Belles, and the industry and public reaction to them, it was obvious that we needed to take another look at the issue of breakdowns," said *Courier-Journal* Sports Editor Harry Bryan. "It was a real team effort, but it was especially important that our editor, Bennie Ivory, recognized not only the significance of the issue, but also the possibilities that the internet provided in conveying the story. He provided us with the time and the resources to get the job done right. The tools of the Internet enabled us to tell the story far more effectively than in previous efforts." The principal writers were Jennie Rees, Andrew Wolfson and Greg Hall, with Scott Utterback, videographer and Steve Reed, graphic artist. Other editors involved in the project were John Mura, the multi-media manager of the site, along with Kim Kolarik, new media editor, Managing Editor Ben Post and First Amendment Manager Jean Porter. ### Billy Reed Wins Eclipse for News/Commentary Writing:

Billy Reed, long time sports writer and columnist, has won the 2008 Media Eclipse Award for Writing in the News/Commentary category for his column "A Rose for Eight Belles," which appeared in the May 16 issue of *Thoroughbred Times*. This is the third Media Eclipse Award for the 65-year-old, a native of Louisville, Kentucky. He previously won the 1979 Media Eclipse Award for Newspaper writing for an article in the *Louisville Courier-Journal* on jockey Ron Turcotte, and again for newspaper writing in 1988 for an article on trainer D. Wayne Lukas, which appeared in the *Lexington Herald-Leader*. Reed was a sports editor and columnist for the *Courier-Journal* and columnist for the *Herald-Leader*, as well as a senior writer for *Sports Illustrated*. "I am stunned to win this award again," said Reed. "I just love racing. I have covered every major sporting event, but the Derby is still my favorite one. I went to the backstretch morning after this year's race to express my sympathies to the connections of Eight Belles and brought my five-year-old granddaughter, Caroline, with me. I was trying to gain some perspective to it all, and decided to write the column."

Reed draws on his experiences and emotions of previous Derbies while relating the events surrounding the 2008 running. The following day, with Caroline, who had drawn a picture of Eight Belles on Derby morning, Reed visited Eight Belles's trainer Larry Jones, as a part of a search for answers to the mystery of the love for the race horse. In his award-winning piece, Reed writes: "When an accident happens, racetrackers do not point fingers. They do not blame the trainer or the track condition. They only drop their heads or brush back a tear or give somebody a hug. Then they go back to work. The horses must be fed and groomed and exercised. Life must go on. The grandfather told the little girl he had no explanation, except that maybe God just decided he needed a fast horse, and so it was time for him to call Eight Belles home. She listened, brow furrowed. She thought. Then she said she wanted to take her drawing and a rose to the track to give to the people who took care of Eight Belles."

Finalists for the 2008 Eclipse Awards will be announced Thursday, Jan. 8, 2009. The National Thoroughbred Racing Association (NTRA), National Turf Writers Association (NTWA) and *Daily Racing Form* (DRF) vote on the Eclipse Awards. **RTCA CONCLUDES SUCCESSFUL SOUTH AMERICA MISSION**

Looking to promote awareness of the Race Track Chaplaincy of America and its mission to establish racetrack ministry work throughout the worldwide horse racing community, leaders of the group recently concluded a successful trip to South America that included stops in Santiago, Lima and Buenos Aires. RTCA members met with racetrack industry leaders in Peru and with councils at Hipodromo Chile and at Hipodromo La Plata in Argentina. Beginning their journey Dec. 1, the team was led by Assistant Executive Director Edward Smith and Chaplain Luis Peralta. While in Peru, they visited with leaders from several segments of the racing industry, from track management to the Jockey Club and the Jockey School, and with trainers, members of the local community and church leaders and turf writers. "The primary purpose in Peru was to introduce the concept of the Race Track Ministry, which focuses on a holistic approach of serving the racetrack workers who serve the horse racing industry," said Smith. "It was a successful introductory visit, and it is the goal and hope of the RTCA to help establish a chaplaincy in Peru in 2009." Peralta, a native of Guatemala, will relocate to Cordoba, Argentina, and will serve as the RTCA South American liaison to Smith. "We have been leading training for the councils, and it was incredible to hear testimony of how the chaplaincy has impacted and changed the lives of so many workers," said Smith. In its 37th year of work, the RTCA currently sanctions and oversees 77 chaplains who serve at 117 tracks and training/breeding centers throughout North America and around the world.
