Three New Winners in Five Days for SMARTY JONES

## TOUSSAUD EUTHANIZED

Broodmare of the Year **Toussaud** (El Gran Senor--Image of Reality, by In Reality), a producer of four Grade I winners, was euthanized Monday due to declining health. She was 20.

The Juddmonte homebred was a Group 3 winner in England in 2002, then was repatriated to the U.S. and took the GI Gamely H. en route to career earnings of \$552,751. She became an immediate success in the breeding shed as well. Her first foal, the millionaire Chester House (Mr. Prospector), annexed the GI Arlington Million S. Honest Lady (Seattle Slew),

Toussaud's second foal, also earned a win at the highest level in the GI Santa Monica H., and went on to produce GI Forego S. winner First Defence (Unbridled's Song). Chiselling (Woodman) became the third Grade I winner out the blue-hen mare when he got up for a nose victory in the 2002 GI Secretariat S. Empire Maker (Unbridled), a leading three-year-old of 2003, posted wins in the GI Wood Memorial S., and the GI Florida Derby and foiled the Triple Crown bid of Funny Cide with his victory in the GI Belmont S. The dark bay also placed second in the GI Kentucky Derby. Along with her quartet of Grade I winners, Toussaud is also the dam of MGSW & GISP Decarchy (Distant View). Toussaud produced the unraced A.P. Indy filly Gateway in 2006, and was not bred back. She was pensioned in 2007. "She was obviously a great broodmare, but was an even more special character with a very unique personality," the farm said in a statement announcing her death. "Though amazingly stubborn at times she was never seen to pin her ears or try to intentionally harm anyone or anything. She had a very kind yet powerfully strong and resilient nature that lives on in the competitive juices of offspring of Chester House, Empire Maker, Decarchy and her daughter Honest Lady."

## BUYERS' MARKET AT MAGIC MILLIONS

Trainer Gai Waterhouse typically defied gloomy economic predictions and gave Magic Millions a welcome shot of adrenalin as, acting on behalf of unnamed clients, Australian racing's ever-effusive first lady outlaid A\$3 million on two colts in less than 20 minutes on day one of the first yearling sale of 2009, the Conrad Jupiter Magic Millions Sale on the Gold Coast. Waterhouse signed at A\$1 million for hip 119, a Redoute's Choice (Aus) colt out of Strawberry

Girl (Strawberry Road {Aus}), offered by Magic Millions part-owner John Singleton's Strawberry Hill Stud. "He's by a champion sire and is out of a champion mare. He looks great value at \$1 million--I think he would have made \$2 million last year. He's a very, very exciting colt," an elated Waterhouse declared. A three quarter brother to proven NZ-based sire Danroad (Aus), the colt attracted an opening bid of \$500,000 and Waterhouse triumphed eight bids later. Another handful of horses down the road, Waterhouse defeated rivals with a A\$2-million bid on hip 127, the much-admired full brother to MG1SW Racing to Win (Aus), the Encosta de Lago (Aus)--Surrealist (Aus) (Kenny's Best Pal {Aus}) colt offered by Coolmore as agent. "He is certainly one of the best horses I have ever bought here at the Magic Millions. His full brother is a champion and he has the pedigree of a stallion," Waterhouse said. "I thought there were three outstanding colts in the sale and I'm glad I've been able to get two of them. I had a number of people approach me at the sale and tell me that they wanted a stallion prospect, and this horse fit the orders. He will be raced by a large group of clients, including some from overseas," Waterhouse added. Coolmore Australia general manager Michael Kirwan confirmed the stud would retain a share in the colt.

Kirwan continued, "Surrealist (Aus) is one of the most valuable mares in Australia, and this colt is a full-brother to a champion miler in Racing to Win (Aus) and half-brother to a group-winning stallion prospect in Purrealist (Aus) (Tale of the Cat), so if he can match his looks with the racing performance of his siblings he will be a very commercial prospect. He is arguably the best yearling we have ever taken to the Magic Millions."

**Luck of the Irish...**

Adrian Nicoll of BBA Ireland has enjoyed considerable success purchasing at the Gold Coast, and he signed for the day's second-highest priced youngster, hip 171, a Redoute's Choice (Aus) colt out of stakes-placed Twist My Heart (Dayjur), a half-sister to Attire (Aus), the dam of champion two-year-old Fashions Afield (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}). Nicoll said that the colt would be trained by Flemington based David Hayes, and would be owned by a syndicate that included international owners. "He is going to be syndicated and he will go to David, and we have already sold a good few shares in him already," said Nicoll. "I thought he was one of the nicest horses here. He is a magnificent individual." Waterhouse was leading purchaser, securing 12 horses for \$4,845,000, while the Hong Kong Jockey Club was typically active, purchasing eight for A\$940,000.

**Six Out of Ten...**

Activity at the top end of the market and steady participation by international purchasers for 29 horses in total ensured the first session closed on a pleasing note, with an average of A\$150,158, but Magic Millions managing director David Chester is taking a cautious approach. The sale took a while to find its footing, with 17 of the first 50 through the ring bought back. At that point, the average was running at A\$127,916 and 50 lots later the average dropped another 24 percent to A\$119,179 before the impact of Waterhouse and Nicoll's purchases boosted the figures. Last year's first session had only 110 catalogued and 84 sold so comparisons are limited. The average was ultimately down just 3.4 percent on last year's overall average of A\$157,321, but Chester was circumspect, rating the sale "six out of 10." He said the first day was "a tough one for vendors but a goldmine for buyers." He commented, "Those [average] figures are distorted by the \$2-million horse and the other two that made a million dollars," Chester said. "We've probably only got a couple of others that will make the million over the next few days, and the average will go down on Thursday and continue to fall. There was some great buying, and this is the first sale in 12 years where it's in the buyers' favour. From a vendor's point of view I would be disappointed. From a buyer's point of view I would be over the moon." **Cont. p3**

"There were quite a few horses I thought would make more money," Chester continued. "Vendors early on were very realistic. I think the sale started too well--so up the reserves went and they had to re-adjust through the day," he said. Chester expressed significant concern over the clearance rate. "The buyers this year have become much more picky and choosy... [and] there may have been a few horses this year that didn't come up and improve into the sale from the initial inspection," he offered. "But let's not forget that most of these yearlings are only 13, 14 and 15 months old when they get here." Magic Millions' co-owner John Singleton, said he was pleasantly surprised by the strength of the day's trade. "I can't remember being happy about a 20-percent drop in the past, but given some people were expecting prices to be down anywhere between 50 and 70 percent, I think a 20-percent drop is okay," he said.

***New Faces...***

A positive trend to emerge is activity by new faces on the buying bench, with purchases by individuals from Singapore, Hong Kong, Malaysia, Japan, South Africa, New Zealand and the U.S. Shadai Farm's Teruya Yoshida, on his first visit to Magic Millions, gave A\$700,000 for a Redoute's Choice filly from G1 Flight S. winner Unearthly (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}). John Brocklebank's Melbourne-based pinhooking company BC3 Australia signed for two yearlings. The very first horse through the ring, [hip 1](#), a Flying Spur (Aus) colt out of Radio Song (Unbridled's Song) offered by Brian Marheine's Stratheden Stud, was knocked down to BC3 for A\$210,000, and the same outfit signed for the second last horse through the ring [hip 194](#), a colt by Widden's popular first season sire Stratum (Aus) out of Whirligig (Aus) (Brief Truce), for A\$175,000, a great result off a A\$30,250 service fee. Utah native Brocklebank launched BC3 Thoroughbreds stateside in 2003 before extending to Australia last year, purchasing 13 horses at Magic Millions last March and declaring the horses were "first class" and the people "incredible". "We are sellers and we prepare horses a little differently to what is conventional here," Brocklebank said. "We take an open mind and a very scientific approach. Our belief is to expose the horse to a fair amount of racing stress. There is only one way to prepare race density in the bone, that is to expose the horses to that [race conditions]. I would rather have sold to someone a Kentucky Derby winner than to actually own one," he continued. "Because that is what I do and enjoy. Look I still put on a cheerleading outfit when one of our horses run, because they will always be part our family."

Local star Relento dictated the pace through comfortable fractions and pulled clear in the stretch to score a crowning victory in the 111th running of the G1 Jose Pedro Ramirez at Maroñas National Racetrack. The four-year-old, who was sent off as the crowd's favorite, strode into racing history securing his ninth consecutive stakes victory in Uruguay's marquee event. Brazilian compatriote Bucaneer ran on well to earn second over Potri Locatario. Good Report, winner of the 2007 Ramirez at Maroñas and Latinoamericano at La Plata, gave way on the far turn after being in contention early and finished distant last. Relento, winner in his most recent start of the G2 Gran Premio Comparacion Dec. 7, won for the 10th time in 19 career starts. A trip to Dubai is under consideration for both Relento and compatriote Adiacent (Midnight Tiger), who posted a frontrunning upset in the G2 Gran Premio Maroñas, reserved for Uruguay's fastest sprinters earlier in the card.

### GOLDEN FAMILY FOR SIKURA BROTHERS

When the three-year-old colt **Patena** (Seeking the Gold) steps into the starting gate in Saturday's GIII Lecomte S. at Fair Grounds, he'll represent the third generation of a family that has been very good to brothers John and Glenn Sikura. He'll also represent the power of a want ad.

The story of Patena, winner of the \$150,000 Display S. at Woodbine

Dec. 6 and the 4-1 second choice in Lecomte, dates back to roughly 1989. Around that time, John and Glenn's father John Sikura Jr. purchased a majority of the Thoroughbred holdings of Nelson Bunker Hunt, who was fighting through bankruptcy. Included among the race horses, mares and foals were several stallion shares. Sikura and his sons figured they didn't have the mare inventory to support all the stallion shares, and so they did the next logical thing.

"We put an advertisement in the *Daily Racing Form* looking to do some foal shares with somebody," explained Glenn, who now owns and operates Hill 'n' Dale Farms Canada while his brother runs the Kentucky division. "And we were contacted at some point by Holtsinger, who had the mare Passing Mood." Passing Mood, a burgeoning star in the breeding shed, would eventually become the dam of two Classic winners, as well as the third dam of Patena.

Holtsinger Inc., the operation founded by George M. Holtsinger and run by his daughter Joan Turner, purchased Passing Mood from Kinghaven Farms for \$300,000 at the Keeneland November Sale in 1987. At the time, the nine-year-old stakes-winning daughter of Buckpasser was in foal to Raise a Native and had already produced the GSP Launch Key (Roberto).

In the summer of 1989, Passing Mood's son by Caro (Ire), With Approval, swept Canada's Triple Crown for Kinghaven, and a year later was runner-up to In the Wings (GB) in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf. Passing Mood was named Canada's Broodmare of the Year in 1989.

The Sikuras and Holtsinger came to an agreement. Hill 'n' Dale paid the stud fee on, and became the co-breeder of, the Saratoga Six filly Passing Mood was carrying, Bar U Mood. A foal of 1990, Bar U Mood was sold as a yearling and went on to be a multiple stakes winner for Frank Stronach.

Passing Mood didn't catch after foaling Bar U Mood, but Hill 'n' Dale provided a Deputy Minister season for Passing Mood's next mating in 1991. That mating resulted in the filly Daijin--Patena's second dam--who was sent through the 1992 Keeneland November sale as a weanling. John and Glenn liked the filly, and bought out their partners for \$160,000 and put her in training in Canada. Daijin developed into one of the best three-year-old fillies in the country in 1995, winning the Star Shoot S. and Selene S. (then a Canadian Grade I) before shipping down to finish third behind Chaposa Springs in the GI Test S. at Saratoga.

Daijin made one more start after the Test, then was retired to the Hill 'n' Dale broodmare band in Kentucky. Her value as a broodmare soon soared when her full-brother, Touch Gold, won the GI Belmont S. and GI Haskell Invitational.

Daijin was sent to Mr. Prospector in her first three years at stud and produced three modest winners. She would later go on to produce the unraced Gone West filly Speed Succeeds, who was knocked down to Live Oak Plantation for \$1.45 million as a yearling, as well as the A.P. Indy filly Serenading, a homebred who won last year's Listed Belle Mahone S. at Woodbine. But Daijin's most accomplished runner is Handpainted, a foal of 2000. Like her mother, Handpainted was sent through the ring, and like her mother, was bought back by John and Glenn. John signed the ticket for \$300,000 at the 2001 Keeneland September sale.

Trained by Josie Carroll in Canada, Handpainted got off to an auspicious start at two, reeling off three straight wins, including the Ontario Debutante S. Handpainted lost her unbeaten record when she finished second in the GII Mazarine BC S., but the defeat came with a valid excuse.

"She was the likely champion in Canada, but she hurt herself in [the Mazarine]," explained Glenn. "When they opened the gates, she pushed off and got her foot caught under a support bar in the starting gate and tore it up pretty severely. But she still ran on well to be second that day. I think she lost by one vote as champion two-year-old filly."

Handpainted returned at three to be second in the race her mother had won eight years earlier, the GI Selene S., and added stakes wins at Fair Grounds and Delta Downs.

Retired alongside her dam at Hill 'n' Dale, Handpainted was bred to Seeking the Gold in the spring of 2005 and produced her first foal, Patena, a year later. Following the theme of the family, Patena was offered at auction, but was bought back by John and Glenn for \$250,000 at the 2007 Keeneland September event.

"He's a beautifully bodied horse, but at that time he was at a bit of an awkward stage," said Glenn. "So we took him back and decided to race him."

Shortly after the sale Dominic Dilalla, a client of Hill 'n' Dale Bloodstock Director Donato Lanni, purchased an interest in Patena.

Patena debuted with Josie Carroll in August at Woodbine, running second in a six-furlong dash on the turf. Stretched out to two turns on the main track next out, he tired to be fourth Sept. 6 before breaking through with a 5-length romp in a seven-furlong maiden Nov. 9. Given a 9-2 shot in an 11-horse strong Display S., Patena settled off the leaders, forged to the lead in the stretch and showed good resolve to hold on for the win ([video](#)).

Patena now steps up against markedly better competition, and does so on a new surface. Glenn is confident he'll handle the switch from Woodbine's Polytrack to conventional dirt.

"There's no pressure to run him, and he wouldn't run unless the trainer felt everything is okay," he said. "He worked well down there."

Patena has two recorded works at Fair Grounds. He went four panels in :49 3/5 (31/104) Dec. 21 and breezed six furlongs in 1:15 3/5 (4/8) Dec. 28.

Looking back at the original partnership between Hill 'n' Dale and Holtsinger that 19 years later has led to Patena, Glenn reflects, "For whatever reason, everything went so well with our partnership. We bred four stakes winners together, including Touch Gold, and we probably only bred six or seven foals together."

On Saturday, the Sikura brothers will see if Patena has the stuff to follow in the hoofsteps of Touch Gold down the Classics trail. -L Marquardt

**EDITOR'S NOTE:** Owner/breeder Jim Sapara wrote the following open letter to Kentucky Governor Steve Beshear and the citizens of the state, and has provided a copy to the TDN for inclusion in today's paper.

Dear Governor Beshear:

On December 15th, the Governor's Task Force on the Future of Horse Racing published their findings. In the report's Executive Summary, the following statistics are reported: between 80,000-100,000 Kentucky jobs are created by the horse industry, it has an annual economic impact of \$4-billion, over \$127-million in horses are exported from Kentucky annually--not to mention the huge tourism generated by people visiting Kentucky, and the goodwill the state accrues. This is big business. I am Canadian, and I can tell you any state or province on the continent would be proud to have these kinds of figures.

Yet, while you are now in at least your seventh year of indecision, your neighbors--one of them your next-door neighbor, Indiana--have seized the initiative and are using VLTs and what the report calls "alternative gaming revenue" to boost purses to the point where next year both Hoosier Park and Indiana Downs will be offering daily purses one-third higher than Ellis Park, whose owner, Ron Geary, has referred to that as a "death knell" for Ellis Park--and he's not kidding. Horses, trainers, veterinarians, gamblers--they all follow purses; the bigger the purses, the better the horses. Nobody disputes that. The task force's subcommittee on Industry Financial Matters found that: "purses have grown nationwide at tracks that have alternate gaming revenue. Currently, 15 of the nation's top 20 tracks in total purses are now or will soon have purses subsidized with alternate gaming revenue." The subcommittee went on to say: "Racetracks with alternative gaming are projected to see a combined increase in annual purses of 45.5 percent by 2013. This compares to an anticipated decline of 11.9 percent at tracks without such gaming revenues." Even Churchill Downs was forced to cut purses in its 2008 Fall meet.

Kentuckians, wake up and smell the coffee. There is competition out there--Indiana, Pennsylvania, now even Maryland. The competition is moving forward, and you are standing still. Take action before it is too late.

This is my 26th year in this Industry and I have been to Kentucky once or twice every year, though have missed two occasions because of health reasons.
