## BOB BLACK JACK OUT OF ACTION

Word-record holder **Bob Black Jack** (Stormy Jack), winner of the Dec. 26 GI Malibu S., has been sidelined by an undisclosed ailment.

"He was lame a couple days ago when we pulled him out to jog [at Hollywood Park]," trainer Jim Kasparaoff.

"We're not 100 percent sure what's wrong with him, but he's definitely out of the Sunshine Millions Sprint [Jan. 24] and the Golden

Shaheen [G1, at Nad Al Sheba Mar. 28]. My feeling is he needs three-to-four months. Our plans are on hold, but I don't think you'll be hearing from him until maybe Del Mar." The four-year-old, who set a world mark for six furlongs when covering the distance in 1:06.67 in last year's Sunshine Millions Dash, has compiled a record of 10-4-2-1 and earnings of \$594,925.

## COWBOY UP

He had to survive a stewards' inquiry, but **Cowboy Cal** (Giant's Causeway) was declared a deserving winner of yesterday's GII San Pasqual H. at Santa Anita. The four-year-old went right to the lead and cut out a solid pace. "That last race, he may have been too tight, but today he broke well and got to relax in between horses," said trainer Larry Jones, who took this race with Hard Spun two years ago. "I told [jockey Gabe Saez] that when he was ready to go, to either go in or out, don't go in between horses. He took him out and he finished up the race."

Added Saez, "I put him in the right spot. He settled really good for me. I made my move to the outside, and he did it all." Patena was bidding for his third straight after a maiden win at Woodbine Nov. 9 and a head score in the Display S. Dec. 6. Trainer Josie Carroll was pleased with the performance. "I thought he ran a terrific race," Carroll said. "I certainly expected it to set up with a faster pace." Rider Robby Albarado remarked, "This was a good race for this colt, with those soft fractions and for him to finish up that well. He was finishing up best of all of them. An extra sixteenth may help him." The top two are likely to meet again in the Feb. 7 GIII Risen Star S. **★ "TDN Rising Star" ★** Indygo Mountain (A.P.Indy), the 5-2 second choice, hit the gate and bobbed at the start, then never got into the race, finishing sixth. **STERLING POUND EUTHANIZED** GSW **Sterling Pound** (Seeking the Gold--Spectacular Bev, by Spectacular Bid), the dam of GSW and successful sire Exchange Rate (Danzig), was euthanized at Hagyard Equine Medical Institute due to "progressive infirmities," according to a press release issued Saturday. The 18-year-old broodmare was in foal to Empire Maker at the time of her death. The grey made 17 starts for owner and breeder Heidi Doubleday, winning the GIII Honey Bee H. and running third in the GIII Next Move BC H. for earnings of \$152,018. She was subsequently acquired by Philip Freedman's Cliveden Stud, and produced six winners from seven foals to race. Her first foal was Exchange Rate, who was sold for \$1.4 million as a KEEJUL yearling, and went on to take the GII Tom Fool H. Sterling Pound also produced \$1 million KEESEP yearling Sabre d'Argent (Kris S.), a Group 3 winner in Britain and third in the GIII Fort Marcy H. Her 2005 foal is the winning filly Cable (Dynaformer); she also has an unraced two-year-old filly by Giant's Causeway and a yearling filly by Bernardini. Sterling Pound will be buried at Middlebrook Farm.

Cowboy Cal was one of the few horses that Robert and Janice McNair held on to when they dispersed their Stonerside holdings, and he could be a good one to have in the barn this year. The winner of the Laurel Futurity and the GIII Tropical Park Derby on the grass, the dark bay earned a trip to the GI Kentucky Derby with a second in the Apr. 12 GI Blue Grass S. He faded to ninth on the first Saturday in May, and was given a break. The colt returned in the Oct. 12 GIII Bryan Station S. on the turf at Keeneland and hit the line a head back in second, but was awarded the win when Seaspeak was DQ'd. Cowboy Cal was runner-up again in the Nov. 30 GI Hollywood Derby, and was second choice with the return to synthetic here. He cut out a half in :46.20 and six panels in 1:10.25, then dug in when challenged and prevailed while drifting out down the lane. The stewards looked at the tape and allowed the result to stand. He hadn't visited the winner's circle since taking this race last year, but French Beret was favored to get the job done once again. The crowd called it right, but only just. French Beret had a relatively productive 2008 campaign, running third in the GII Nijinsky S. and the GIII Connaught Cup, and fourth in the GII King Edward H. and the Labeeb S. He capped off the year with a second behind Wise River in an optional claimer over course and distance Dec. 19, and was given the nod by the Fair Grounds faithful here. Settled in third through six panels in 1:13.06, the bay gelding drove to a narrow lead from between horses inside the eighth pole. Wise River battled on gamely at the rail, and Golden Yank made a run from the outside, but it was French Beret's nose that hit the line in front. "You never quite know when he's going to show up, but when he does, he gets the job done," trainer Mark Frostad said. Added jockey James Graham, "He was really into the bridle in the post parade, so I felt I had a lot of horse. He loves this place for some reason." **Toro Bonito**, one of three from the Bob Baffert barn, comes off a third in the Dec. 13 GI Hollywood Starlet S. The Earnhardt homebred broke slowly in that effort, as she did when second in the Nov. 1 Sharp Cat S. at Hollywood and third in the Oct. 19 Anoakia S. at Oak Tree. Stablemate **Jemmealey**, a \$350,000 FTKJUL buy for Zayat Stables, makes her West Coast bow. Bill Mott saddled the chestnut to a decisive maiden score at the Meadowlands Nov. 3 in her latest appearance. **Haka**, third behind **Acting Lady** in a maiden test on the turf at Hollywood Nov. 23, came back in an off-the-grass affair Dec. 18 and went gate to wire to win by 5 1/2.



**MAGIC MILLIONS SELECT CONCLUDES**

After the hammer fell on the last of 503 horses to sell during the four select sessions of the Conrad Jupiters Magic Millions Yearling Sale, industry participants reached a consensus that the market is still moving at a pleasing pace, despite a slowdown compared to the swift gallop of 2008. Vendors were justifiably concerned that Australian bloodstock markets could mirror overseas trends, but while the average at Magic Millions fell from A\$157,321 last year to A\$131,632, the 2008 season closed on an unprecedented high, and the dizzying market escalation experienced last year perhaps made the downward tilt of 2009 more pronounced. Magic Millions Managing Director David Chester was especially pleased that the clearance rate edged just over 80 percent, although, as he had predicted, there were no fireworks during the final Saturday evening session. Chester added, "The average is only down 16 percent. Before the sale, the most positive prediction was a 20-percent drop, and the worst was 40 to 50 percent, mirroring the share market."

There was also trade outside the sales ring, and Magic Millions principal and Baramul owner Gerry Harvey was among vendors who sold passed-in horses immediately after they left the ring.

“Quite a few vendors were quickly able to sell horses passed in, with our beloved leader among them,” Chester said. “[Harvey] commented that he couldn’t understand why they weren’t just bought in the ring when he was able to sell them within minutes anyway, at their reserve price.”

Chester added that the 10-race Magic Millions carnival day was a huge success, with race goers flocking across the road to cram into the pavilion and watch the sale. “The race day today was phenomenal,” Chester commented. “There were 160 horses, maximum fields in every race, and they are all graduates of Magic Millions sales. It makes you feel very proud to be part of Magic Millions, and every owner and every trainer, they are all clients of ours. This is all about having fun. It is not for the purist--it is a meeting restricted to horses sold at our sales--but it is great for the breeding industry and great for owners.” Chester continued, “I’d love to see the breeders give us a go with some better horses. I think that we have proved that we can sell them, and I wish they would give us a bit more of a go. We’ve thought about doing a more select sale [to attract high-quality yearlings], but we don’t want Magic Millions to get too elitist and have people say they can’t afford to go because they don’t have \$200,000 or \$300,000 to spend.”


**Sebring Kin Leads Way...**

The two top-priced yearlings from Saturday night’s session will both go to Leilani Lodge, where evergreen trainer Bart Cummings will put the polish on them. The Cups King himself signed for the top seller. Consigned by Corumbene Stud as hip 680, the Charge Forward (Aus) half-brother to Golden Slipper winner Sebring (Aus) (More Than Ready {Aus}) brought A\$420,000. Agent Duncan Ramage, whose purchases are prepared by Cummings as well, gave A\$350,000 for hip 620, a son of Encosta de Lago (Aus) out of the GSW and G1SP Nevis (NZ) (Danehill). The first foal from his dam, the colt has New Zealand champion and MG1SW Tartan Tights (NZ) as his second dam, and is from the immediate family of MG1SW and sire Arena (Aus) (Danehill). “In our humble opinion, he was the best-rated colt on pedigree, and his conformation matched that. We are very pleased to have acquired him,” Ramage said.

Anthony Cummings was third-leading buyer by outlay, with 19 purchased for A\$2,670,000. His shopping list included a Fastnet Rock (Aus) filly offered as hip 656 by Bill Benson’s Emerald Thoroughbreds. Consigned by Baramul Stud, the filly, out of Plastic Lady (NZ) (Centaine {NZ}), is from the immediate family of GI Matriarch S., GI Gamely H. and GI Beverly Hills H. winner Happyanunoit (NZ) (Yachtie {Aus}).

**State Boost...**

Magic Millions is possibly the only sales company in the world to receive direct state government funding. While that might seem unusual when there is debate in Queensland over the affordability of a new children’s hospital, the official logic is that Magic Millions is the state’s biggest event. And witnessing the overflowing restaurants and convivial race carnival atmosphere on the Gold Coast, one would be hard-pressed to believe the nation is on the edge of recession. While David Chester would not comment on the amount that the sale company receives, he said, “The state government has been very supportive, but we are the number one carnival in Queensland. Walk down Tedder Avenue, and every restaurant is full of horse people. The government realizes that the people that come to the sale are rich and famous and they all spend a lot of money while they are here. We market the Gold Coast as much as we market the horses. You can go to boring cities like Melbourne and Sydney, or you can come here and it’s a holiday.” Magic Millions and Aushorse annually pay airfares, accommodations and other costs for a bevy of international clients, and Chester reported that the total spend among Aushorse-subsidized guests, predominantly from Asia and South Africa, was A\$20 million.

Harvey's wife Katie Page-Harvey is determined to elevate the carnival to the status of the Melbourne spring carnival, with an emphasis on fashion and fun. She commented, "When people come from overseas for the sales, they are not just going to Magic Millions; they are experiencing the Gold Coast. The restaurants, the theme parks, the retailers and the hotels here all benefit. We are the highest tourism dollar earner for Queensland."

Another aspect of Magic Millions that might seem unusual for a sales company is the fact that it has attracted sponsorship from prestige car brands, airlines, clothing retailers and jewelers. "The Magic Millions has become a priority destination for premium brands, and it's certainly a priority destination for us," said Christine Bracher, spokeswoman for Magic Millions sponsor Paspaley Pearls.

## A SINGULAR STAR

It was a damp, overcast, cold October day when the Breeders' Cup was held for the first time at Richard Duchossois's Arlington Park in 2002. Still, some 46,000 race fans packed into the Chicago-area oval to see racing's biggest stars. As always on Breeders' Cup day, the main event figured to be the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, where the three-year-old War Emblem would try to exorcize the demons of a failed Triple Crown bid against fellow three-year-olds Medaglia d'Oro, Harlan's Holiday and Came Home.

In the hours leading up to the Classic, the shivering crowd was treated to some fine championship performances. Storm Flag Flying re-rallied to win the Juvenile Fillies. Vindication led every step in the Juvenile. Orientate won the Sprint for Lukas and the Lewises. Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) nearly overcame a disastrous run when second to Domedriver (Ire) in the Mile. And High Chapparral (Ire) won the first of his two Turf titles.

But when the day was over, after the tote flashed Volponi's huge \$89 parimutuel upset, there was one performance that truly stood out--and it didn't come in the Classic. It instead came in the GI Distaff, by way of the Californian invader **Azeri** (Jade Hunter).

After debuting in November of her three-year-old season, Azeri dominated the older fillies division that year, winning seven of her eight starts leading up to the Distaff, including four Grade I events.

Wearing the red, white and blue colors her breeder Allen Paulson, who had passed away when she was a two-year-old, Azeri entered the gate the 8-5 choice in the Distaff. On a drying-out track, she was hustled out to lead under regular jockey Mike Smith. She rolled into the first turn with Imperial Gesture in close pursuit.

Azeri clicked through a sharp half in :46.20 as accomplished horses like Take Charge Lady, Farda Amiga and Summer Colony loomed. On the far turn, announcer Tom Durkin howled, "She's run three-quarters in 1:09 3/5

--sensational fractions here for Azeri!" But if anyone thought Azeri was in danger, those ideas were fleeting, as she leveled out in the stretch and steadily drew away. The crowd roared its approval as she streaked under the wire five lengths clear, and the managing partners of the Allen Paulson Living Trust, including Paulson's son Michael, joyously made their way down to the winner's circle to welcome their champion filly.

"Her performance that day was just exceptional," Michael Paulson said last week. "I remember going down to the track right after the race. The track that day was just like peanut butter. I literally lost one of my shoes walking in it. So considering the track condition, the time she ran and the ease with which she won, it was just a spectacular day." **Cont. p2**

Indeed, in a career of remarkable performances, it was Azeri at her very best. The late-starting filly by a modest sire was now, without question, the Queen of Racing. With no clear standout in the three-year-old male or handicap divisions, she was subsequently named Horse of the Year, becoming the first female to be so honored since Lady's Secret in 1986. Azeri also earned the Eclipse Award in the distaff division, the first of three times she would take the hardware in that category.

In all, Azeri--who was nicknamed Honeybear by her first trainer Laura de Seroux because of her kindly demeanor around the barn--raced 24 times. Azeri won 17 of those starts and was second another four times, with 14 graded stakes wins and 11 Grade I wins. When she was finally retired from the track after running a respectable fifth behind Ghostzapper in the 2004 Breeders' Cup Classic, her earnings of \$4,079,820 set a new standard for females in North America.

Azeri carries this record and reputation when she enters the ring during tomorrow's opening session at Keeneland January. She sells late in the session as hip [301](#), and is in foal to another Horse of the Year, Ghostzapper, on a May 29 cover.

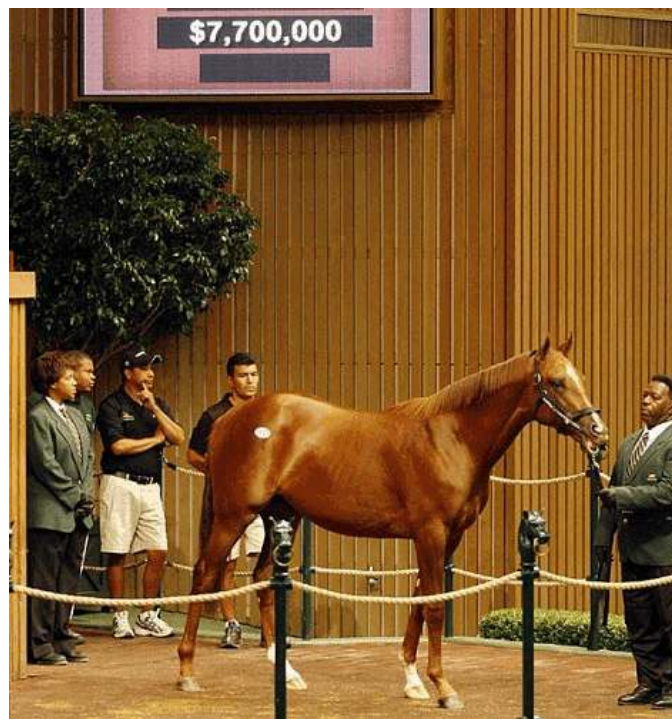
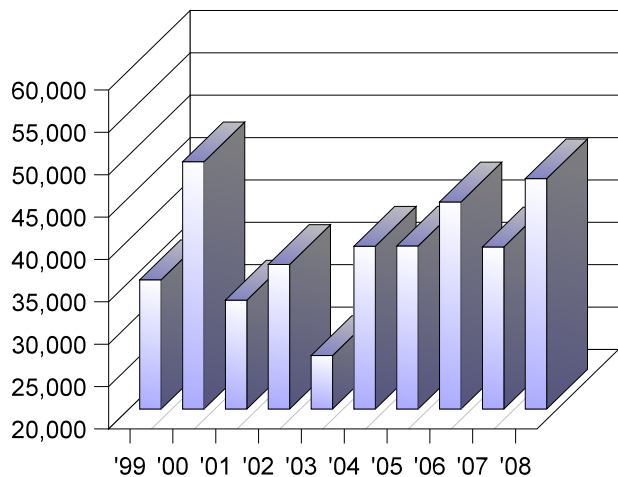
While this will be the first time Azeri will go through an auction ring, it isn't the first time she's been catalogued for sale. In the spring of 2003, a dispersal of the Paulson Living Trust horses--Azeri included--was scheduled at Barretts March. But the horses were withdrawn a month before the sale.

After her retirement, Azeri was retained by the Allen Paulson Living Trust as a broodmare. She didn't catch in her first trip to the breeding shed in the spring of 2005 when sent to Storm Cat, but a visit to A.P. Indy a year later was successful. Azeri produced her first foal, a colt now named Vallenzeri, in 2007, and last spring had a filly by Giant's Causeway.

At the most recent Keeneland September sale, Vallenzeri was offered by Hill 'n' Dale Sales, but made history when led out of the ring unsold at \$7.7 million. It was the highest buyback for a yearling on record.

Last December, it was announced that Azeri herself would sell at January, along with several other horses owned by the Allen Paulson Living Trust.

“It was the right time to do it,” Michael Paulson said of the decision to offer Azeri. “My father, before he passed away, always offered some of his select mares at the January sale and always did very well.”

Asked if the Paulson draft at January--which is being handled by Hill ‘n’ Dale Sales and includes the top producer Garimpeiro and MGISP Jade Queen--represents a complete dispersal, Michael Paulson said, “Pretty close. We

still have some stallion shares and some horses that aren’t sellable. But I’d say this is a 90-percent dispersal.”

It would border on trite to say Azeri means a lot to the Paulson family. Spend any time talking with Michael Paulson, and it becomes clear that when he sees Azeri streaking across the paddocks at her home at Hill ‘n’ Dale, he sees the legacy of his father.

“I know I’ve been quoted before, and I truly believe that she was a parting gift from my father before he passed away,” he said. “To be close to an exceptional mare like her has been a privilege, and I think she was a fitting finale for my dad’s breeding operation: to be a Horse of the Year, and a female one at that.”

Michael and his wife Lenora dote on the mare when they visit Hill ‘n’ Dale, and spent a frigid week in Lexington awaiting Vallenzeri’s foaling. Though the reserve made headlines, it wasn’t overly surprising when Michael decided to buy back Vallenzeri at September. So it’s a fair question to ask, what are the chances he’ll buy back Azeri, too?

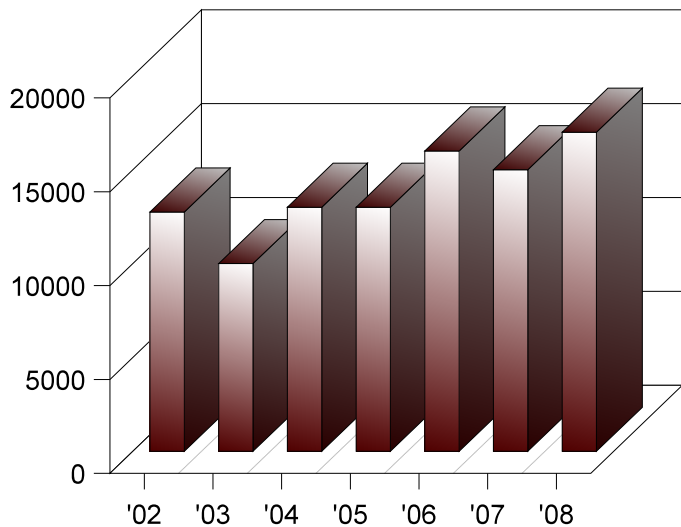
“My sincere hopes is to get her sold, but obviously she has a value to us,” he said. “I can’t disclose it, but she will have a reserve on her. But it’ll be a very fair reserve based on the current market. There’s always the chance of a buy back, but I think she’ll sell very well. As everybody knows, she’s a very unique individual. She’s the only three-time Eclipse champion older mare, and is in a very exclusive club, being a female Horse of the Year. She’s very unique, and I would think some of the top breeders in the world would consider themselves very fortunate to have her in their broodmare barn.” -L Marquardt

Island Fashion won the 2003 GI Alabama S. and GI La Brea S., as well as the 2004 GI Santa Monica H. She was second against the boys in the 2004 GI Santa Anita H. The grey was narrowly beaten when second over the Del Mar turf in the 2005 GI John C. Mabee H., and ran third in that race in 2006. On the board in 15 of 30 starts, Island Fashion retired from racing after the 2006 season with six wins and earnings of \$2,037,970.

The Everest homebred was offered at the 2006 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November sale, but was led out unsold at \$2 million. She was bred to Storm Cat in 2007 and McLean has high hopes for the newly turned yearling.

“Island Fashion has an extremely nice Storm Cat filly that we’ll be selling in September,” he confirmed.

McLean admitted the uncertainty in the market may work against Island Fashion Monday.

“It’s hard to say with the market the way it is, but it is what it is,” he said. “Island Fashion is a stand-out, so we’re hoping she can stand on what she accomplished on the racetrack. Plus, she’s a big good-looking mare. We’ll just have to see how it goes.”

Island Fashion is not the only highlight in the reduction.

“We have quite a few nice mares on offer, and some really good racing and broodmare prospects,” McLean said.

Among the broodmares is **Two to Waltz** (Seattle Slew --Lady for Two, by Storm Bird) ([hip 257](#)). McLean said the 14-year-old “is sure to be appealing.”

Two to Waltz, dam of Two Step Salsa (Petionville), is carrying a full sibling to that multiple graded stakes winner. As a sophomore of 2008, Two Step Salsa won the GIII Laz Barrera Memorial and GIII Swaps S. and was third in the GI Breeders’ Cup Mile. A two-year-old full brother to Two Step Salsa sells as [hip 386](#).

Three full sisters to Island Fashion are also scheduled to sell Monday. The eight-year-old **Flash of Fashion** sells as [hip 29](#), while the unraced five-year-old **Big Shoes**, in foal to Indian Charlie, sells as [hip 311](#), and a newly turned two-year-old filly will sell as [hip 357](#). The five-year-old **Only First Class** (Petionville--Ticket to Houston, by Houston), a full sister to MGSP Runway Model, sells as a broodmare prospect ([hip 164](#)).

McLean admitted he has been impressed with the success of Everest. Everest Stables was the leading owner at the 2008 Spring/Summer meet at Hollywood.

“Jeff has been in the business 15 years,” McLean said. “I have to say, I’m proud of what he’s accomplished. In the past year, for two or three months, he was in the top 10 leading owners and doing it mostly with homebreds--most of them by Petionville, Hold for Gold and Storm Boot. They were horses that he bred and raised himself, and 90 percent of them were by Petionville. I think the fact that he was in the top 10 with all the competition that’s out there is pretty incredible.”

Although McLean acknowledged that the market is tough at the moment, he thinks the Everest horses will be well-received.

“He’s taking them out to sell, and I think people who are on their toes will get good value for their money,” he said. “These are quality individuals, and I think people will realize there is quality there.” -*J Martini*
