KEENELAND JANUARY STARTS TODAY

The six-day Keeneland January sale begins this morning in Lexington, Kentucky. Action kicks off at 10:00 a.m. Keeneland has cataloged a total of 2,379 horses

for the January sale, including 986 broodmares, 834 yearlings, 543 horses of racing age and 16 stallions. The sale comes amidst a sharp downturn in the bloodstock market, spurred by factors including the ongoing international economic woes and overproduction within the industry. Two months ago, Keeneland's November sale suffered roughly 40-percent declines in average and median and 45-percent plunge in total receipts.

"There's no mistake. We're going through a huge change in our industry, both globally and locally," commented Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "Having said that, I think there are efforts being made to correct the situation, and opportunities abound for people who are interested in our sport and want to get involved. We'll keep our fingers cross. I think the most important aspect is that we have to get consumer confidence back in the market. We have several dispersals in our catalogue, and that always piques people's interest. We hope that will give the sale an extra boost. And having two mares of the likes of Azeri and Island Fashion doesn't hurt."

Both of those mares sell during today's opener, and should indeed provide a shot in the arm for January. Azeri (Jade Hunter) is one of only six fillies ever to earn Horse of the Year honors, and the only female to earn three Eclipse Awards as champion older mare (2002, 2003 and 2004). Owned by the Allen Paulson Living Trust, Azeri, in foal to Ghostzapper, is consigned by Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency and goes through the ring as hip 301.

A few hours earlier, Island Fashion (Petionville) sells as hip 90 from the draft of Pope McLean's Crestwood Farm, which consigns for Everest Stables. The admirably tough eight-year-old was a three-time Grade I winner on the track and is also in foal to Ghostzapper.

WALK IN THE PARK IN SANTA YSABEL

Trainer Bob Baffert headed into Sunday's GIII Santa Ysabel S. at Santa Anita wielding a strong trio, including the longest priced of the three, **Century Park** (General Meeting). Overlooked at 24-1, the dark bay jumped out to take an early lead, held a comfortable one-length advantage through soft early spilt of :24.47, :48.83 and 1:13.55, and despite drifting out in the lane, had enough in the tank to hold off 3-1 choice **Haka** (Dynaformer) by a length at the wire. **Will O Way** (Broken Vow) was further back in third. "[Sunday] morning when I looked at the *[Racing] Form*, it didn't look like there was much speed in the race," explained winning rider Tyler Baze, who was recording his first victory since he returned to the saddle Jan. 7 after recovering from rib and shoulder injuries sustained in a single-horse spill at Hollywood Park Dec. 5. "Bob [Baffert] and Jimmy [assistant trainer Barnes] both had a lot of confidence in this filly...It's nice to get my first win, it's like getting the monkey off my back and it relieves the pressure." Baffert's other entrants, 4-1 chance **Toro Bonito** (El Corredor) and 12-1 shot **Jemmealey** (Malibu Moon), wound up seventh and ninth, respectively, in the field of nine. **Click for the brisset.com chart or the brisset.com PPs. "This filly has really trained well over this surface," said winning trainer Bob Baffert. "She really likes it. We knew it was a step up for her, but we took a chance. I thought Tyler [Baze] was a good fit for her. He put her on the lead, put them all to sleep, and we got the job done."

**9, Elusive Diva, 8, Elusive Quality--Taj Aire,
by Taj Alriyadh**

Consigned by Denali Stud (Craig and Holly Bandoroff), Agent IV
The fleet Elusive Diva made a name for herself out in California, where her wins included the GIII Railbird S., GIII Las Cinegas H. and GIII Sen. Ken Maddy H. A half-sister to stakes winners R. Baggio (Chimes Band) and Handyman Bill (Skywalker), she was offered up at the 2006 Keeneland November sale. Guy and Diane Snowden were the winning bidders that day at \$1.6 million. Elusive Diva, who foaled a Distorted Humor colt in 2007 and a Bernardini colt last spring, is in foal on a Mar. 27 cover to Giant's Causeway.

**90, Island Fashion, 9, Petionville--Danzigs Fashion,
by A Native Danzig**

Consigned by Pope McLean (Crestwood Farm), agent for Everest Stables (Reduction Phase I)

The centerpiece of the Everest Stables reduction, Island Fashion earned over \$2 million on the track. At three, she won the GI Alabama S. and GI La Brea S., and followed up at four with a tally in the GI Santa Monica H. and a second facing the boys in the GI Santa Anita H. Put through the 2006 Fasig-Tipton November Sale, Island Fashion was bought back by Everest Stables' Jeffrey Nielsen for \$2 million. Island Fashion foaled a Storm Cat filly in 2008--her first foal--and is currently believed to be in foal to Ghostzapper on an Apr. 8 cover.

**93, Jade Queen, 6, Giant's Causeway--Jade Flush,
by Jade Hunter**

Jade Queen hails from a family that produced well for Allen Paulson and his family. Her second dam Royal Strait Flush (Seattle Slew), a sister to Landaluce, is also the second dam of Grade I winner Startac (Theatrical {Ire}) and produced Jade Queen's graded stakes-winning dam Jade Flush. Jade Queen is a half-sister to SW & GSP Megantic (Theatrical {Ire}) and can boast placings in the GI Flower Bowl International S. and GI Garden City Breeders' Cup S. at three.

**208, Shes All Eltish, 4, Eltish--Shesabullwinkle,
by Hesabull**

The Florida-bred Shes All Eltish earned her biggest victory in the Sunshine State last spring, taking the GII Bonnie Miss S. at Gulfstream Park. She also was second in the GII Black-Eyed Susan S. and third in the GII Delaware Oaks. A full-sister to GSP Elizabul, Shes All Eltish was produced by a full to MSW Wire Bound and a half to MGSP Bomfim (Dispersal). Shes All Eltish sells as a racing or broodmare prospect.

Susan's Angel earned just over \$350,000 with a record that included a win in the GIII Turfway Breeders' Cup S. and placings in the GII Falls City H. and GII Churchill Down Distaff H. She produced a filly by Ghostzapper in 2007 and a colt by the Adena Springs sire this spring. She's the lone filly selling on Day 1 in foal to champion Bernardini (A.P. Indy) and one of only two in the sale.

**290, Almonsoon, 6, Giant's Causeway--Garimpeiro,
by Mr. Prospector**

Almonsoon boasts a smart pedigree as a daughter of Garimpeiro, who has produced Grade I stakes winner and GI Breeders' Cup Mile runner-up Geri (Theatrical {Ire}), as well as GII Clark H. winner and MG1SP A.P. Arrow (A.P. Indy). Garimpeiro is also the dam of stakes winner Clure (Theatrical {Ire}) and GSP State Shy (Theatrical {Ire}). Almonsoon, meanwhile, ran second in Gulfstream's GIII Orchid H. as a four-year-old, then returned at five to win Monmouth's Omnibus S.

**301, Azeri, 11, Jade Hunter--Zodiac Miss (Aus),
by Ahonoora (GB)**

Consigned by Hill 'n ' Dale Sales Agency, agent

With a record of 17 wins from 24 starts and record distaff earnings of \$4,079,820, it's safe to call Azeri one of the best racemares of all time. She was named 2002 Horse of the Year, was three times honored as champion older mare and collected no fewer than 10 Grade I victories. Azeri foaled an A.P. Indy colt in 2007, a Giant's Causeway filly in 2008 and is currently in foal to Horse of the Year Ghostzapper on a May 29 service. In September, her first foal, the A.P. Indy colt now named Vallenzeri, failed to meet his reserve at \$7.7 million--the most expensive yearling buyback in history.

Horseracing TV (HRTV) will carry the live coverage of AZERI selling at today's opening session of the Keeneland January Horses of All Ages sale. The 2002 Horse of the Year is expected to sell between 3:00 p.m. and 3:30 p.m. ET.

Honeysuckle Farm a Life's Work for Oliver

Janeen Oliver's Honeysuckle Farm has catalogued seven horses for the January sale, and Oliver, a self-proclaimed "pedigree geek," has a lifetime of experience in the racing and breeding industry invested in her compact consignment.

Oliver, whose late father Joe Haller co-owned Wafare Farm in the 1990s, first got her start in racing when she was just 12 years old.

"I was just horse crazy," she admitted. "Some friends had broodmares, and I would sneak over the hill and throw a piece of twine over a broodmare and kick her around the field. Their trainer came out one day and saw me on some mare that used to run off with everybody on the racetrack and he said, 'Hell kid, if you want to ride that bad, I'll put you to work.' So I started working at Ak-Sar-Ben walking hots off a pony for J.D. Taylor."

From that early experience, Oliver moved west to Arizona and graduated to training racehorses. She initially started as assistant to Paul Oliver.

"I ended up marrying Paul eventually," Oliver said. "And then I trained on my own. I was first, second or third leading trainer out there several times."

The couple also bred and raced their own stock. Janeen won 300 races, while her late husband trained roughly 3,000 winners.

Her father's purchase of Wafare Farm led Oliver in a new direction.

"Back in the 1980s, when all the purses and the economy went to hell, kind of like it's doing right now, I was in New Mexico," Oliver recalled. "My dad bought Wafare Farm, and I came back to manage it for him. He was partners with Nathan [Fox]. He sold out in 1999, then he helped me buy [Honeysuckle Farm]."

Oliver is now in the business of breeding and selling racehorses, and she's very clear on her goal. **cont. p5**

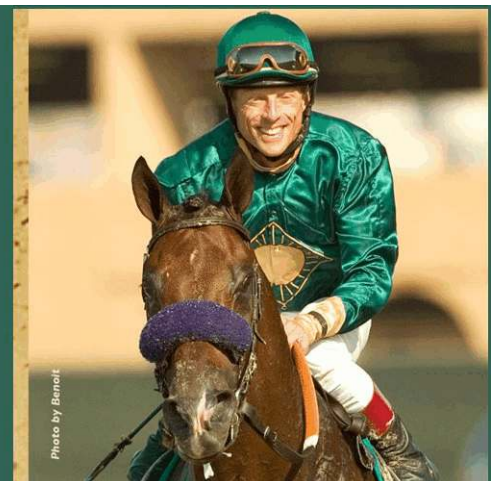

"I try to breed the best racehorse...with what I can afford to buy," she stated. "My finances are quite limited, so I can't play at the top end, but I've had some pretty good luck, even with \$1,000 horses."

That "luck" includes the purchase of the mare Essie's Maid (Linkage), the dam of 2006 G1 Italian Oaks winner and Italian champion Dionisia (Tejano Run).

"I bought the mare for \$1,000, and then Dionisia popped up," Oliver said. "Then I had a Barkerville colt [out of Essie's Maid] that I bred that

went to Italy and won four out of five as a two-year-old and was stakes placed. Then the mare's daughter produced My Baby Baby (Bernstein), who is a stakes winner now that Ken McPeek has."

Oliver sold Diocleziano, Essie's Maid's Barkerville colt, for \$38,000 as a FTKOCT yearling in 2006, but she is content to bring her horses home to race if she is unsatisfied with the bidding.

"I breed them to sell," she said. "Most of them go in the sale. But if I don't get what I think they're worth, then I go ahead and race them. That happened with this yearling filly by Leroidesanimoux (Brz) [out of Essie's Maid]. That family really exploded, so I just pulled her out of the sale and put her in training."

Oliver contends she is looking to downsize.

"My broodmare band runs about 12 or 15; I've lost count," she explained. "I'm going to probably reduce. I'm getting a little older and I do most of it myself, all the foaling, and I'm probably going to try to slow down."

But just as she talks about decreasing her stock, she also admits the market may be playing against her.

"Then again, I've got a bunch in the sale and I'm sitting here going through the list now thinking the sales are rough, and I'm going to have to scratch this one, scratch this one," she said. "So I don't know how many I'm going to sell, or even take in there."

Then again, the uncertainty in the market could make buying more mares an attractive proposition.

"In November, I went to the sale to sell two," Oliver admitted. "I bought them both back and then I bought two more. I'm not going to buy anything [in January]. I know they're going to be so cheap, I'll be tempted. So I don't even know if I'm going to show up for my own consignment because: A) I'll buy them back, and B) I'll be buying something else."

Of her unexpected buying spree at Keeneland November, Oliver said, "I picked up two great little mares in November. I picked up the dam of a stakes winner and she's out of a Grade I-winning champion; then I picked up another mare that's in foal, and her foals average about \$160,000. There are great bargains out there."

Last November, Oliver paid \$5,500 for Cape North (Capote). Out of 1987 champion older mare North Sider, the 16-year-old mare, in foal to Forestry, is the dam of stakes winner Spirited Away (Awesome Again). She also purchased Susie Ticket (Housebuster), in foal to Good Reward, for \$2,200. **Cont. p6**

An avid student of pedigrees, Oliver plans all her own matings.

"I try to have a mare that traces to a great broodmare, or a Classic winner," she explained. "I really follow the female families. I'm the one who came up with the Mare Maps, which are like the sire-line charts, but trace the mares. I'm researching those all the time. It's all fine and good to say this mare was a great mare back in the 1600s, but what have you done for me lately?"

One mare that Oliver has decided not to sell at the January sale is **Riley Rose** (Chief Seattle) ([hip 581](#)).

"This week, I've been compiling all the Classic winners--I've got them in what family and branches they are from, and am trying to figure out what mare from 1950 onward has the most. As I got to doing that, I found out that Riley Rose, one of the mares I had in the sale, has 16 Classic winners in her family within four dams. So she's got to come out. I knew she was a good mare, and I was thinking of selling her to scare up a little money, but I don't want to give her away."



The Honeysuckle consignment does include **Island Melody** (Islefaxyou) ([hip 459](#)), a stakes-winning nine-year-old mare in foal to Gulch. Oliver purchased the mare, in foal to Mizzen Mast, for \$25,000 at this sale a year ago. Her Mizzen Mast filly will follow her into the ring.

Oliver said she wasn't surprised in the downturn in the market, and has budgeted accordingly.

"I've been predicting this for three or four years," she said. "So I've been conservative on what I'll spend on a mare and what I'll pay for stud fees. Actually, the last few years, even though I've gotten better mares, I've cut back on the stud fees I've been spending. It had to come. If you follow, back in the '80s, when the stud fees got astronomical, it just snowballs down and I kept saying, 'It's crazy; it's crazy.' These horses coming off the track at a \$150,000 stud fee, it caught up to us, and the bad thing is the economy went to hell at the same time. I don't want to be gloom and doom, I'm hoping it picks up by September and November. If it doesn't, I'll be another one doing the major dispersal."

Plans for Jones Runners...

Fresh off a sparkling weekend at the Fair Grounds, trainer Larry Jones outlined plans for a few of his up-and-coming stable stars. Leading the way is Saturday's GIII Lecomte S. winner **Friesan Fire** (A.P. Indy), who is expected to make his next start in the GIII Risen Star S. Feb. 7. "When we watched the replay, we realized that he absolutely dragged [jockey] Gabe [Saez] to the lead," explained Jones. "The horse did all that basically on his own. We wanted the the jock to get him in behind horses for the experience, but putting blinkers on him made him a lot more competitive. Like a lot of A.P. Indys, he has that 'want to' quality about his running." Also a winner for Jones Saturday was **Just Jenda** (Menifee), victorious in the Tiffany Lass S. for three-year-old fillies. "It was very special to have her win like that," said Cindy Jones, who owns the chestnut. "Those were some quality fillies in that race against her, but she didn't even want to pull up after the race. She wanted to go on, and that's a good sign. Also, it was a good sign that when she got back to the barn she wanted to jump right into her feed tub. She's named in honor of our granddaughter Jenda, who had just graduated from high school when we got the filly." According to Mrs. Jones, the filly is boarded in the same stall that Proud Spell (Proud Citizen) was stabled in last year. That filly, who won the GII Fair Grounds Oaks, went on to take the GI Kentucky Oaks and GI Alabama S. and is Eclipse finalist for champion three-year-old filly. As for Just Jenda, Cindy added, "The day she got off the van from South Carolina, one of the assistants said one of the horses off the van was particularly good looking, and it was her. She's a gorgeous animal, and she's talented as well." Highly regarded **Old Fashioned** (Unbridled's Song), who is a finalist for the Eclipse Award for champion juvenile colt, will make his next start in the GIII Southwest S. at Oaklawn Feb. 16.

'Pioneer' Sizzles at Santa Anita...

Pioneer of the Nile (Empire Maker), winner of the GI CashCall Futurity at Hollywood Dec. 20, worked five furlongs in a bullet :57.60 at Santa Anita Sunday in advance of a start in the Feb. 7 GII Robert B. Lewis S. Ridden by Joe Steiner, the Zayat-owned colt worked in company with stablemate **Riley Tucker** (Harlan Holiday), who was caught in the same time. "He's doing well," said trainer Bob Baffert. According to private clocker Toby Turrell, "To say Pioneer of the Nile is stepping forward would be an understatement. The work was incredible. Steiner never moved on him."

"We told Edgar there's less room to maneuver," said Ward, who is hoping to have the colt join his more accomplished stablemate on the Triple Crown Trail.

"We just lost too much training time with him after he had those foot problems that caused his late scratch last time," explained Parrot.

Risen Star Next For Patena....

Canadian-based trainer Josie Carroll, who saddled Good and Lucky to win Saturday's Louisiana H., was equally pleased with **Patena's** (Seeking the Gold) second-place finish in Saturday's GIII Lecomte S. "He's done everything we've asked him to do so far," said Carroll of Patena, who was making his first start over a dirt course. "He also got a lot out of that race [Saturday]. We galloped him out past the wire and he galloped out strong, and continues to show us that he's a horse who can get a distance of ground." Looking ahead, Carroll added, "Hopefully, that race will set him up perfectly for the Risen Star S. [Feb. 7]." Also possible for the Risen Star is Lecomte third **Au Moon** (Malibu Moon). "The [Lecomte] didn't set up well for him at all," said Au Moon's trainer David Carroll, who saddled Denis of Cork to finish third in last year's Kentucky Derby. "He needs more of a distance of ground, but hopefully, he got something out of the race," he added. "I was pleased with [Au Moon's] effort, and he came back fine." The GII Louisiana Derby Mar. 14 is also a possible target for Au Moon.

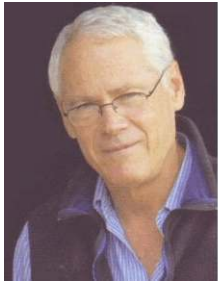

CHECK-OFF ... AND WRITE A CHECK

The new year begins with fresh hope and an opportunity for breeders to set an important example for the industry.

As announced recently, The Jockey Club has established a "check-off" program for breeders to make *voluntary* contributions toward the care of unwanted or retired Thoroughbreds. Responding to requests from Thoroughbred Charities of America (TCA) and the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation (TRF), The Jockey Club will begin collecting monies from breeders at time of foal registration, and will distribute the funds through the TCA and TRF. Despite limited funding, both well-established programs have already made an important impact related to rescue, retraining, adoption or placement, and retirement. For its part, The Jockey Club has agreed to contribute up to \$200,000 in matching funds.

This program should clearly be *mandatory* rather than voluntary, and these monies will only be a tiny amount compared to the vast funds likely to be required because of the closing of slaughter houses at a time when our economy is in recession and our own industry is in crisis. But this is an important first step toward developing a comprehensive plan to address a serious and growing problem. Furthermore, more hope may be on the way, as TCA is currently designing an industry-wide plan for participation by all major stake holders.

Clearly, breeders who bring these wonderful creatures into the world only have a portion of the responsibility for their well being over their life-cycle. *Every group who makes money on the backs of Thoroughbreds shares an innate obligation. Stallion owners, sales companies, agents who buy and sell, racetracks, simulcast facilities, owners, trainers, jockeys, veterinarians, farriers, transporters, feed companies, and other suppliers and service providers (but not fans and bettors) all share an ethical responsibility to contribute a fair pro-rata amount.*

We need to provide adequate funding to address what will be a growing problem. And we need to do it now. Whether we view horses as livestock and as legitimate candidates for the "food chain," or as pets who should never go to slaughter, we can be united and agree on the importance of humane treatment and proper care for these special animals. Thoroughbred racehorses enrich our lives with aesthetic beauty, companionship, entertainment, joy, and at times monetary gain.

And they allow us to project our own hopes and dreams upon them in ways that lift our spirits while giving us something exciting to look forward to. The least we can do is to do the right thing by them. We must check ourselves, check-off, and write a check.

As for speaking about doing the right thing, I find it curious that The Jockey Club is only matching "up to \$200,000." As their website proclaims, "The Jockey Club is dedicated to the improvement of Thoroughbred breeding and racing." If they truly mean what they say, I'm thinking that they should add a zero to their contribution, whether it is matched or not. Given their mission statement and expressed commitment to the industry and to the horse, it seems reasonable to think that they could and should contribute an annual amount equivalent to the compensation package of its top four employees (approximately \$2,000,000).

In this context, I was floored to learn recently that the American Quarter Horse Association (AQHA) registers about three times as many horses each year as The Jockey Club and charges \$25 to register a foal up to seven months of age. Even with economies of scale, the difference between the AQHA's \$25 fee and the \$200 that The Jockey Club charges breeders is staggering.

I would like to see a detailed break-down of exactly how our \$200 fee is spent by The Jockey Club. How do their costs add up to the \$200 per foal? Are we in part paying for G & A costs that sustain the *for-profit* businesses and partnerships created and run by The Jockey Club (e.g., The Jockey Club Information Systems, Equineline, Equibase, TrackMaster, InCompass, etc.)? Are we contributing to the overhead of a posh 52nd Street, New York address? Where exactly does our money go compared to the AQHA process?

Furthermore, I'm also thinking that we and our industry's horses might be best served if The Jockey Club "spun off" or transferred its *non-profit* registry office to a horsemen's organization that could run the registry in a more cost-effective way, similar to the AQHA model. By lowering overhead and reducing the basic cost of our foal registration fee to \$50, or \$75, or even \$100, we could maintain the total registration fee at \$200 and assign the difference to the task at hand; namely, the proper and responsible care of unwanted or retired racehorses.

Meanwhile, breeders, please do what we can to set the right example. Check-off and write a check.

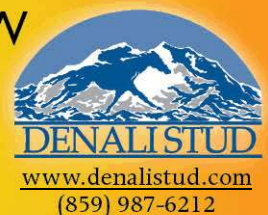

MAGIC MILLIONS SEES STRONG FIFTH SESSION


The fifth session of the 2009 Conrad Jupiters Magic Millions Yearling Sale was able to buck world trends, concluding with a 17.9-percent increase in average price. The clearance rate of 81.7 percent was also up compared to last year's mark of 77.7 percent. "While we're ecstatic the figures rose and a sale has seen its average price increase, I'm still adamant this auction is very much in the buyers' favor," said Magic Millions Managing Director David Chester. "There was a top-quality line of buyers at the sale today, and we were particularly pleased with the number of horses again sold to overseas clients from Singapore, Hong Kong, South Africa, Ireland and Malaysia." The top lot on the day was hip 859, a Oratorio (Ire) filly who sold for A\$165,000. Hip 859--out of the unraced Fasliyev mare Miss Sharapova (Aus), a half-sister New Zealand's 1997 champion two-year-old Thriller (NZ) (Volksraad {GB})--went to Ireland-based bloodstock agent Hubbie Deburgh. Anthony Cummings continued his buying spree as he purchased three yearlings for a combined total of A\$240,000. Included in the group was hip 877, a half-sister to MGSP Flash Bash (Aus) (Vettori {Ire}) and SW Mega Me (Aus) (Danewin {Aus}), who was knocked by his son Anthony Jr. for A\$150,000. "She's a lovely-bodied filly with a winning pedigree," said the younger Cummings. "Anthony [Sr.] has shown a great interest in training the filly, but I will keep my options open," he added with a chuckle. The elder Cummings also confirmed that he has privately acquired hip 83, a Redoute's Choice (Aus) colt who failed to meet his reserve during session one Wednesday, for A\$500,000. Hip 83 is out of the SP Quest for Fame (GB) mare Sister Declan (Aus). The sixth session will commence Thursday at 11:00 a.m. local time.
