GLADWELL GETS HIS MON

The most entertaining bidding duel during Wednesday's third session of the Keeneland January sale came before noon, and left onlookers in the pavilion wondering, just who was that masked man? The fellow under the hat, scarf and quilted coveralls was Florida pinhooker Jimmy Gladwell--one of the few appropriately

dressed people on the grounds on a frigid day in Lexington. Standing in a doorway, Gladwell outlasted a group that included fellow pinhookers Brian and Bill Graves, sitting underneath the press box, for a good-looking yearling son of the late Maria's Mon--La Cucina (Ire) for \$390,000. The colt is, among others, a half to GSW Sir Cherokee (Cherokee Run). It was

the top price for a horse Wednesday and is easily the most expensive short yearling to sell thus far at January. The next highest was the Speightstown--Treysta colt who sold for \$270,000 Tuesday.

"We thought he was a real good yearling, and that's about all there was to it," Gladwell said after signing the ticket as Ferguson Valley Ranch. "He had a lot of stretch and scope, and he was real correct. His mother's thrown some real high-quality runners, and we

think he's a horse that the buyers at the top of the market will be looking at later this year. He'll go

back to a yearling sale. The top end of the market is what will probably hold up, and hopefully, if he pans out, that's where he'll be at." **Cont. p2**

ECLIPSE AWARD OF MERIT TO CHANDLER

Mill Ridge Farm owner Alice Chandler will receive an Eclipse Award of Merit for her lifetime achievements in racing, it was announced yesterday. "I am just thrilled to be honored with the Eclipse Award," said Chandler. "I have had a wonderful life with Thoroughbreds." The daughter of Hal Price Headley--co-founder of Keeneland Association--Chandler established Mill Ridge with just four mares following the death of her father in 1962. One of those mares, Attica, produced the Sir Gaylord colt Sir Ivor in 1965. Sir Ivor was acquired by Arthur "Bull" Hancock on behalf of Raymond Guest for \$42,000 as a yearling at Keeneland July in 1966; the bay went on to claim the Epsom Derby in 1968 and was Horse of the Year in England. "Sir Ivor's influence provided a major turning point in opening up the American market to the European market," said Keeneland's President and CEO Nick Nicholson. "It convinced foreign buyers that North American pedigrees could be adapted to European training methods and win Classic races." Since Sir Ivor, Mill Ridge has bred, raced or sold the likes of 2001 Horse of the Year Point Given, 2005 GI Kentucky Derby hero Giacomo and Breeders' Cup winners Artie Schiller, Sweet Catomine, Round Pond, Spain and Johar. Chandler has been involved with many equine organizations, serving as chairman of the University of Kentucky Equine Research Foundation, president of the Kentucky Thoroughbred Association, and a director of the Breeders' Cup, Keeneland Association, Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association; and a member of the Equine Drug Council and the Gluck Research Center. "I believed it was important for me to take an active leadership role for these important programs and organizations," she continued. "All of this has made for a terrific life." The Eclipse Awards will be held Jan. 26, 2009 at the Fontainebleau Miami Beach in Miami Beach, Florida.

Gladwell added of the Ferguson Valley moniker, "It's a hunting camp we have in Illinois. It's one of our farms."

Asked if the colt would return in the consignment of his son Jim "Jimbo" Gladwell's Top Line Sales, the upstart operation that the younger Gladwell launched along with his girlfriend Torie Burns last summer, Jimmy Gladwell said, "I don't know. I bet he'll push us hard to, but I don't know yet. But he'll go to our farm in Florida, Kindergarten Farm."

Gladwell said that, while the \$390,000 price tag wasn't cheap, it wasn't a surprise. "I thought the price was plenty strong for the horse, but that's the market that's holding up and that we hope will hold up," he said. "All the sharp guys were on him. It wasn't a surprise that he was one of the highest-priced yearlings here. We liked the horse an awful lot. We've been out on a limb before, and we're out there again. We'll take a shot."

High Water Mark...

Catalogued as hip 863, yesterday's session-topping colt is a half-brother to GII Arkansas Derby hero Sir Cherokee (Cherokee Run) and MGSP Lady Linda (Torrential). The colt also received a timely update when, after the catalogue was published, his half-sister Miss Isella (Silver Charm) captured the GII Falls City H. at Churchill Downs. Meg Levy's Bluewater Sales consigned the chestnut for his breeders, Domino Stud of Lexington LLC.

"The colt was everything that both pinhookers and the end users wanted," said Levy. "He was very athletic, had great conformation and was by an established sire. He had all the attributes of his sire--great hip, great hind leg. Everybody seems to be gravitating toward the established sires. It's a place of safety. This colt was an athlete. Plus it is an awesome family with a great update, with the Grade II winner at Churchill. People told me there's been a little less quality in the sale in terms of yearlings, so all the people who still have money landed on him."

La Cucina a Special Mare for Restructuring Domino...

Domino Stud of Lexington, the operation launched by Kenneth T. Jones, Jr., is currently restructuring. A veteran of World War II and a noted businessman and philanthropist, Jones passed away in October at the age of 91. His family has decided to sell off Domino's breeding stock, but fully intends to maintain a racing stable.

"We've been in racing since 1962," explained Jones's daughter Donna Jones, who was on hand yesterday at the Keeneland sales pavilion. "This is something that we love that we did with my father. So we have no intention of leaving Kentucky or the racing business. We just really didn't enjoy breeding. We'd rather race, and that's what we'll do now."

Parting with some of the breeding stock isn't an unemotional process, though. On Monday, Domino sold one of its best producers, La Cucina (Ire) (Last Tycoon {Ire}). The 16-year-old mare was knocked down to Anthony Penfold, agent for Litex Stud England, for \$150,000.

Domino purchased the unraced La Cucina for \$97,000 back at the 1997 Keeneland November sale with Lady Linda in utero. Thanks to the exploits of Lady Linda, who placed in a trio of Grade III events, and then Sir Cherokee, La Cucina became a wellspring of successful sale horses for Domino. In 2004, Jerry and Ann Moss bought an El Prado (Ire) yearling filly out of La Cucina for \$250,000. A year later, Ahmed Zayat bought the colt Malt Magic (Cherokee Run) for \$320,000. And at the most recent renewal of the September sale, Mike Ryan purchased a Speightstown daughter for \$230,000.

Yesterday, La Cucina was represented by her highest-priced sales horse ever when her son by Maria's Mon was sold for \$390,000, much to the delight of Donna.

"I'll be honest with you, I'm the type of person where I go into everything cautiously optimistic, so I wasn't putting a lot of pressure on any of the horses we sold," said Donna. "So this is huge; I'm very excited. Especially because I'm the only one from my family that's here, so it's nice to be able to have some good news for them."

The Jones family spends much of the time in Guam, where Kenneth Jones parlayed an importing business into a wide-ranging business empire. Donna made the trip to Lexington to oversee the dispersal of the breeding stock.

"Guam is where we have the bulk of our business, but I have actually lived here at various times," she said. "We're a very small operation. The most important thing with me coming here was just to clean house and start fresh. I went to high school here, and I love Kentucky, so if I needed to spend more time here, I wouldn't be disappointed at all."

Though the Domino racing operation is comprised of only two unraced juveniles and one runner at the track, the runner at the track has come on like a good thing of late. The newly turned four-year-old Miss Isella (Silver Charm) capped her sophomore season with a 15-1 upset in the GII Falls City H. at Churchill. Miss Isella, another of La Cucina's offspring, is trained by Ian Wilkes.

As for what's next for Domino, Donna didn't rule out a trip to Keeneland September to add some prospects to the fold, but said, "We're keeping our options open. It's so early in the game." -L Marquardt

Pomeroy Colt Makes \$115,000...

The only other yearling to clear the six-figure mark yesterday was [hip 1051](#), a colt from the first crop of dual Grade I winner Pomeroy (Boundary). Foxtale Farm paid \$115,000 for the handsome grey, who was consigned by Legacy Bloodstock, agent. Silverleaf Farms bred the colt in Florida. Foaled last Feb. 20, hip 1051 was produced by the stakes-winning 16-year-old Two Punch Lil (Two Punch). Two Punch Lil is also the dam of Yuwa Hurricane (Mt. Livermore), a stakes-placed winner of over \$435,000 in Japan. Pomeroy will stand the 2009 breeding season at Vinery in Florida for a fee of \$8,000. His victories included the 2004 GI King's Bishop S., the 2005 GII A.G. Vanderbilt H. and the 2006 GI Forego H.

Down Again, January Moves Forward...

The action was cold inside and out during Day 3 at January. The six-day event, which runs through Saturday, continued to suffer declines in the 50-percent range for average and median.

For the session, a total of 230 horses sold for \$4,443,800, equating to an average of \$19,321 (down 42.1 percent from \$33,358). The median was \$10,000 (down 50 percent from \$20,000).

Thus far in 2009, a total of 642 horses have sold for \$25,535,400, equating to an average of \$39,775 (down 52.8 percent). The sale median stands at \$20,000 (down 50 percent).

The session-to-session comparisons were stark. In all, 11 broodmare or racing prospects made six figures during the corresponding third session at January in 2008. Yesterday, only one mare, the \$100,000 Smokem Then Frolic (Smoke Glacken), hit the mark. Meanwhile, four yearlings made six figures in 2008, compared to two this term. This year's session-topping \$390,000 Maria's Mon colt, however, easily bested the top-priced yearling in last year's session, a Cherokee Run--Gal of Mine who went for \$110,000. Brian Graves, part of the group that was underbidder on yesterday's \$390,000 Maria's Mon colt:

"He was awesome. I haven't gotten to buy a horse yet, just because there doesn't seem to be any change in the market for a horse that ticks all the boxes--if he is a good physical and has any kind of desirable pedigree. I've gone after two so far. I wanted the Speightstown (Tuesday's \$270,000 colt), but didn't even get to raise my hand. I think a lot of the guys shopping for yearlings, the professionals, did well last year and either got their money back or even made a little bit of money. So even though the economy's changing, they still need product and they still have the same ammunition."

PLETCHER GEARING UP OLDER HORSES

Trainer Todd Pletcher tuned up newly turned four-year-olds **Atoned** (Repent) and **Harlem Rocker** (Macho Uno) by working them in company Sunday at Palm Meadows; they covered six furlongs in 1:14 4/5. "They both worked very well," Pletcher remarked. "They were head-and-head. It was the solid work we were looking for and they both appear to be in good form." Atoned will be the first to make an afternoon appearance in 2009 when he lines up in the \$1-million OBS Sunshine Millions Classic at Gulfstream Jan. 24. The Florida-bred had acquired a bit of a bridesmaid's reputation earlier in his career, but may have turned the corner by winning the GIII Pegasus S. Oct. 24 at the Meadowlands. "Atoned showed last year that on his best day he can compete at the highest levels," said Pletcher. "We were glad with the Pegasus win. It was the elusive graded stakes. He had been knocking on the door and finally got it." Hero of the GIII Withers S. and Prince of Wales S., Harlem Rocker crossed the line first by a lip in the GI Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile in November, but was disqualified to second behind Tale of Ekati (Tale of the Cat). "The sting is still there," Pletcher admitted. "Anytime you get DQ'd

I race on something that I consider a borderline call, the sting is going to linger a while, but we were certainly proud of the way he ran." The Adena homebred is slated to make his seasonal bow in the GI Donn H. Jan. 31.

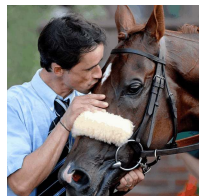

aboard for the move. The six-year-old is on course for Sunday's GIII First Lady S. at the Hallandale oval; she won the race in 2007, when she also captured the GIII Hurricane Bertie H. "If she doesn't run well, she will be bred," said trainer Allen Jerkens. The Joe Shields homebred paired up front-running scores in New York last summer--the GII First Flight H. at Belmont and GII Honorable Miss

H. at Saratoga--but concluded 2008 with a pair of sixth-place efforts in the GIII Thoroughbred Club of America S. to the ill-fated Indyanne at Keeneland in October and the one-mile GII Top Flight H. at Aqueduct Nov. 28 in her most recent start. "I don't think she got used to the distance," said Velasquez of the Top Flight. "It was a little long. Then, she didn't like Polytrack all that much, and you have to also consider she was going up against some tough competition. She felt really confident and strong going a half-mile today, so I expect some good things to happen."

BALLYDOYLE TARGET GUINEAS WITH DUO Aidan O'Brien yesterday named **Mastercraftsman (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and **Rip Van Winkle (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) as the two stable contenders for the G1 2000 Guineas. Following the announcement on Tuesday that Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's G1 Phoenix S. and G1 National S. winner Mastercraftsman was on top of the two-year-old division in the 2008 World Rankings, the Ballydoyle conditioner revealed that he would be joined by the same ownership's G3 Tyros S. winner and G1 Dewhurst S. seventh Rip Van Winkle in the May 2 Newmarket Classic. "A mile should suit him well and while it isn't certain yet, the likelihood is that he will go to the Guineas without a prep run," O'Brien told *Racing Post*, referring to Mastercraftsman. "A lot of things went against Rip Van Winkle in the Dewhurst. He didn't have an ideal preparation for the race and he ran very green. In the circumstances, we were very encouraged by his run and the plan is to go for the Guineas with him. He has plenty of speed but, being by Galileo, you'd have to think he will get further than a mile."

THE PERFECT STORM

That's how veteran bloodstock agent Eugenio Colombo described it Monday: "The Perfect Storm." Demand plummets at the same time the world financial markets are in their worst crisis in years. Credit is hard-to-impossible to come by, and nobody's much in the mood to ask for credit if they don't really need it anyway. Those with cash, on the whole, aren't much in the mood to spend it, either; well, not unless a really nice yearling or a worthwhile mare comes along.

Yes, that's right, it's not all doom and gloom. There was demand for a respectable number of horses in Keeneland January's Book 1, and, let's be realistic, the Book 1 catalogue included far fewer desirable pages this year. Tuesday's gross was barely a third of the corresponding session's last year, yet the market was not down by two-thirds. I thought there were a few cases that suggested prices on the desirable individuals--the ones "they" want--were down by a third, and probably the catalogue was down by a third.

But what about the prices on the ones nobody really wants? Nearly a third (31 percent) of the horses catalogued for Book 1 were withdrawn, three times the percentage of withdrawals in better times. And for the yearlings that didn't make the cut--of which there were many, since the pinhookers are only interested in star quality--it was brutal. As one sales veteran put it, "you used to at least get back a third of the stud fee if it was one nobody wanted. Now you're lucky if you get back the [six-percent] sales tax."

The raw numbers make for grim reading. Monday's session alone last year grossed \$21,325,900, more than the whole of Book 1 (\$21,091,600) this year, and last year's Tuesday session was stronger than Monday's, grossing \$27 million. The \$58,500 median for Book 1 last year was higher than the average (\$51,193) this year; ordinarily, the average would be about 30 percent higher. Both the gross and the average fell by more than 50 percent. Even so, for those horses that do make the cut, it looked like you could still sell them for roughly two-thirds of what they would have brought last year. It's not great, but there is a glimmer of hope in that there are plenty of people on the grounds, and quite a few people still ready to do business, too.

The New Apex Top 50...

On a brighter note, the new figures are now in from TJCIS (The Jockey Club Information Systems), and A.P. Indy remains at the top of the charts as the Northern Hemisphere's leading sire, ranked by APEX A Runner Index covering the seven-year span 2002-2008 (*see Table 1, p11*). His 4.97 A Runner Index is one of only three at 4.00 or over achieved by sires with 200+ runners (year-starters) in the seven-year period; the other two are Danzig (4.63), and the Northern Hemisphere's leading younger sire Galileo, who as an A Runner Index of exactly 4.00.

A short review of the parameters: APEX stands for Annual Progeny Earnings indeX, which is a method of measuring how frequently a sire gets runners that achieve certain earnings thresholds. The amount varies from country to country, but the principle is the same: the top two percent of runners in each country each year are counted as 'A' runners; the next two percent are 'B' runners; the next four percent are 'C' runners; and those three categories all combine for 'ABC' runners, the top eight percent of earners. **Cont. p10**

In North America in 2008, a horse had to earn a little over \$111,300 to qualify as an A Runner; \$79,300 to qualify as a B Runner; and around \$53,000 to qualify as a C Runner. If a sire has two percent A Runners from total runners in a given year, that sire would have an A Runner Index of 1.00; if he had five percent A Runners from runners, his index would be 2.50, and so on. The 'earnings thresholds' are calculated for each jurisdiction covered (North America, Britain/Ireland, France, Germany and Japan), and the results are added together. It makes it possible to compare sires from different racing and breeding centers, as well as at different ages, and in different places (North America, Europe, Japan).

From 1998 until a couple of years ago, the world's top three sires by APEX A Runner Index were **A.P. Indy**, **Danzig** and **Storm Cat**, in some order, while Nureyev and his three-quarter brother **Sadler's Wells** were nearly always fourth and fifth (in either order). Then Nureyev died, and when he ran out of three-year-olds (a sire has to have 10 or more three-year-olds from the last year covered to be rated), he was immediately replaced in the top five by Danehill. But his last crop of three-year-olds was in 2007; in this year's figures Danehill is replaced by Galileo, who actually ranks third, while Storm Cat has dropped to fifth. But four of the perennial top five are still in the top five, though three are no longer covering: Danzig (died in 2006), and Sadler's Wells and Storm Cat, retired on successive days early last year. A.P. Indy, now 20, and Galileo are the only active sires left in the top five.

APEX calculations are earnings-based, which partially explains why the California sire **Unusual Heat** has worked his way up to sixth on this list. The combination of Cal-bred restrictions and supplements, plus the fact that Cal-breds are paying their way in smaller fields in open company in California, has undoubtedly helped Unusual Heat rise from complete obscurity to a top 10 ranking on this list, but you don't get there without a lot of native talent, too. Had he emerged when he was younger, he'd have been whisked off to Kentucky for sure. Big pots and restricted races in Canada have enabled their top two sires, veteran **Bold Executive** and younger star **Trajectory** (another good son of Gone West) to claim ninth and 10th spots among the top 10.

Leading German sire **Monsun**, though he didn't have a stellar year in 2008, ranks seventh, and Curlin's sire **Smart Strike** is a solid eighth, with a 3.50 A Runner Index--exactly seven percent of runners. We run the top 50 by A Runner Index here; much more to follow on these numbers in upcoming weeks.

This week, we are also running a list of the leading freshman sires in Europe in 2008, as compiled by Hyperion Promotions (see p12). This we run as a reference, since these statistics are often accountably hard to come by in North American publications. We need to know what's working over there, too.

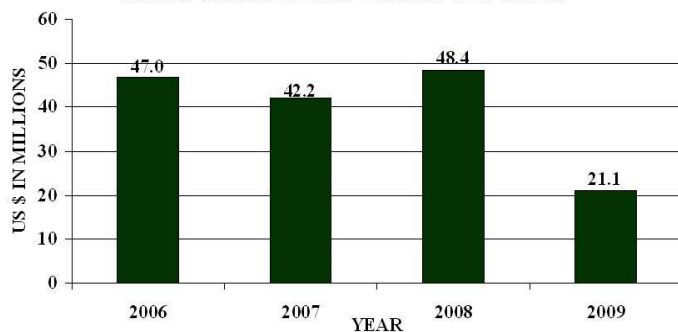

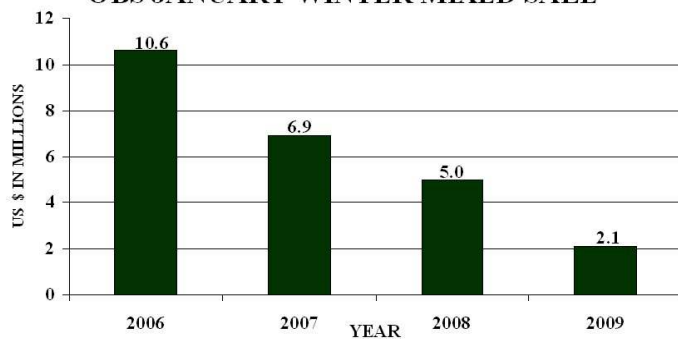

MEMBERSHIP IN WAYS & MEANS COMMITTEE COULD IMPACT THOROUGHBRED INDUSTRY

The [House Ways & Means Committee](#) recently announced its membership for the 111th Congress. The powerful Committee has jurisdiction over federal revenue-generating measures, which include taxation, trade and entitlement programs like Social Security.

Key returning Committee members include Chairman [Charles Rangel](#) (D-NY) and Ranking GOP Member [Dave Camp](#) (R-MI).

Notable new members include Reps. [Charles Boustany, Jr.](#) (R-LA), [Geoff Davis](#) (R-KY), [Linda Sanchez](#) (D-CA) and [John Yarmuth](#) (D-KY).

Rep. Boustany has two Thoroughbred racetracks in his district and introduced in the House the "Pari-Mutuel Conformity and Equality Act of 2008," which would eliminate the 25 percent federal withholding on pari-mutuel winnings of \$5,000 or more. Rep. Davis' district includes Turfway Park; Rep. Yarmuth's district is home to Churchill Downs. Rep. Sanchez's district surrounds Los Angeles, home to Santa Anita Park and Hollywood Park. California's horse industry is the country's largest as measured by economic impact and employment.

MAGIC MILLIONS BOOK TWO KICKS OFF Off the back of a more than satisfactory session five of the Conrad Jupiters Magic Millions Yearling Sale, where prominent New South Wales purchasers featured prominently alongside buyers from Singapore and South Africa, the two-day Book 2 of the sale is expected to continue the theme of "a buyer's market". The sale kicks off today with 243 catalogued, and a further 197 set to go under the hammer Friday. With a couple of notable exceptions, Queensland purchasers have been low-key throughout the Magic Millions sale series to date, but many are assembled for Book 2, where purchasers from Southeast Asia are also expected to play a part. Vendor Paul Higgins of Baerami Stud, which has a draft of 13, noted, "There has not been a lot of Queensland money spent and that augurs well. I think that the money will still be there and we'll see the same trend we saw in the major sale." He added, "Initially, expectations were not that high, but now that the select sale has held up well, I think there will be greater demand than what we expected. The clearance rate might be the issue, but I imagine that nice horses will sell for good value. We've noticed that trainers from the Sunshine Coast and Brisbane have stayed away so far, so we are hoping they will make an appearance." Magic Millions managing director David Chester was similarly optimistic, saying, "I think the sale will be okay, especially with buyers looking at putting horses back through the horses-in-training sales here and in New Zealand--there are some really nice horses, but they don't have the pedigree, and there's been a lot of interest from trainers. I think we might see some new faces."

FOREIGN TRIPS LOOM FOR WHOBEGOTYOU

Star sophomore **Whobegotyou (Aus)** (Street Cry {Ire}) is set to begin in his autumn campaign in the G3 C. S. Hayes S. Mar. 7 at Flemington ahead of a long-term plan to venture abroad in 2010. The G1 Caulfield Guineas winner has not been seen since finishing second to upset winner Rebel Raider (Aus) (Reset {Aus}) in the G1 Victoria Derby Nov. 1, and Kavanagh has pencilled in races including the G2 Autumn S. Feb. 21 at Caulfield ahead of the G1 Australian Guineas Mar. 7 at Flemington. "He's only three and you have got to look after them," Kavanagh commented. He had only a month off after a winter campaign last year and another month after the Derby, but if he has a light autumn he can have a good spell and fill out before having a crack at the spring." Kavanagh, who won the G1 Cox Plate last year with Maldivian (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}), said he was considering approaches from three or four international race clubs to go overseas, with possibilities including Dubai, Royal Ascot and Hong Kong.



SAMANTHA MISS BIGGER AND BETTER

Outstanding filly **Samantha Miss (Aus)** (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) has the Apr. 18 G1 AJC Australian Oaks as her primary target, with trainer Kris Lees reporting the bay has returned from a spell sporting a more powerful frame. The A\$1.5-million Inglis Easter graduate captured the G1 AJC Sires' Produce S. at two, and last spring won the four-leg Princess Series culminating in the G1 Flight S. over a mile at Randwick Oct. 4. Third by beaten a length in the G1 Cox Plate Oct. 25, she bounced back 12 days later to add the G1 Crown Oaks. "She's been back in the stables for a couple of weeks now and she is looking great," Lees reported, adding that he has pencilled in the G2 Light Fingers S. Feb. 14 over 1200 meters at Randwick as a first-up assignment for the sophomore. "Then she'll go to the [Mar. 7 G2] Surround S. before having a crack at the [G1] Coolmore Classic [Mar. 21] against the older mares. After the Coolmore I'll assess where we go with her, but I'd say it will be the [G1 Apr. 4] Arrowfield Stud S. on the way to the AJC Australian Oaks. Being an Oaks winner already, we know she won't have any problems with the trip."

GOOD BA BA WORLD'S TOP MILER

Good Ba Ba (Lear Fan), the highly impressive repeat winner of the G1 Cathay Pacific Hong Kong Mile Dec. 14, was the world's leading older turf miler when the 2008 World Thoroughbred Rankings were released Tuesday. Trained by Andreas Schutz, the six-year-old gelded son of Elle Meme (Zilzal) was given an international rating of 124, the highest ever awarded to a horse based in Hong Kong. The previous best was the 123 assigned to Silent Witness (Aus), the world's top sprinter from 2003 to 2005. "To be training a horse who has been recognised as superior to Silent Witness and Sacred Kingdom is something I could never have imagined when I came to Hong Kong and first took over the horse," Schutz told South China *Morning Post*. Despite missing the chance to defend his title in the G1 Hong Kong Spring, **Sacred Kingdom (Aus)** (Encosta de Lago {Aus}) was rated the world's joint top sprinter, sharing top billing on 123 with two-time GI Breeders' Cup Sprint hero **Midnight Lute** (Real Quiet).
