My Indy (Arg) (Indygo Shiner), making his first start since a sixth in last year's G2 UAE Derby on the Dubai World Cup card, returned to Nad Al Sheba to post an

emphatic 5 3/4-length victory in the G3 Sheikh Maktoum Bin Rashid Al Maktoum Challenge-Round I on opening night of the Dubai International Racing Carnival. The five-year-old Godolphin colorbearer, who pressed the pace while caught three-wide around the turn, forged

to the front approaching the 400-meter marker and widened under Frankie Dettori's mild urging. "It has been a great first night back and My Indy has won well," Dettori said. OVERBROOK TO OFFER STORM CAT AS A QUARTER HORSE STALLION

Overbrook Farm's Storm Cat, who was pensioned last year after experiencing fertility problems, has been given a second chance at a stud career--as a Quarter Horse sire. The 26-year-old sire of 164 blacktype winners impregnated just three of the 32 mares he covered during last year's breeding season. But because the American Quarter Horse Association allows artificial insemination and has an open breed registry (meaning a Quarter Horse/Thoroughbred mix can be added to the AQHA registry as an "appendix" Quarter Horse), Overbrook is able to offer the renowned stallion to Quarter Horse mares for a \$20,000 live foal fee. "Storm Cat does bring speed and precocity," noted Ric Waldman, stallion manager for Overbrook. "And I think what's important to Quarter Horse breeders is an outcross to their bloodlines, many of which are much the same, the result of many years of worse inbreeding of perhaps what we've experienced in the Thoroughbred industry. So I think the top Quarter Horse breeders will welcome a stallion of the notoriety of Storm Cat."

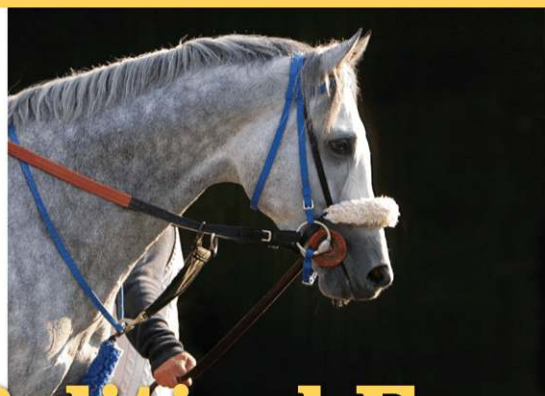

Let go at 8-1 in her unveiling for trainer Doug O'Neill, Pinkarella found herself in fifth in the early going after breaking a tad slow from post four.

Guided to the inside by Joel Rosario, the bay took off within her own restraint to rocket to the lead, and enjoyed a length advantage through an opening quarter of :22 2/5. **Cont. p2**

She began to shake clear on the turn for home through a half mile in :44 4/5, opened daylight while racing on the wrong lead in the lane, and looked like a good thing once leveled off in deep stretch, streaking under the wire a 5 1/4-length victress. The daughter of the winning Storm Cat mare Stormy Monday earned an 82 Beyer Speed Figure for the effort.

“Going into the race, we figured she may have been a work short and also thought that six and a half [furlongs] could be a bit too long first out,” Steve Kenly of STD Racing admitted. “We were pretty pleasantly surprised that she ran that well. We think there’s more to her. She’s really bred to route and she’s a big, long striding filly. She’s got a huge stride to her; she’s a really long bodied filly. She looks like a route filly; we really think her best will be going long.”

Pinkarella’s early speed was a bit of a surprise to Kenly.

“We didn’t think she’d be real speedy,” said Kenly, who campaigns Pinkarella along with longtime friend Bill Decker. “Doug [O’Neill] said she had speed from the pole, but not out of the gate. We figured we’d be in a tracking position--right where she was early. The hole [on the inside] looked like it was pretty wide open and at that point, she kind of took off. [Rosario] wasn’t going to grab a hold of her and steady her, so she kind of started striding out. If you watch that replay, it looks like she did it really easy. It wasn’t like she was a speed horse and broke back. He just chirped at her a little bit, and she just grabbed the bit. When she went past those speed fillies, you look at the hands on the other jockeys and can see that those guys were sending hard. She just kind of breezed up there.”

The competition won’t be easy for Pinkarella off her maiden victory. She hooks a solid field of 10 in the Santa Ynez, which includes Gill Sorrento S. and Moccasin S. heroine **Evita Argentina** (Candy Ride {Arg}).

“When you win like that, especially at this stage in the game when you’re two, just turning three, first [allowance] conditions are really hard to fill in California,” Kenly said of entering his charge in a stakes race off a maiden win. “[The Santa Ynez] was a month out and seven eighths. The entries have come up pretty tough--it’s a hard knocking race. Very hard...If she can compete with these fillies or beat them, then you know you’re sitting on one of the better fillies around, period.”

Pinkarella has been assigned the three hole Saturday. Rosario has retained the mount.

“We were hoping to draw outside, and make it a little easy on her since it’s her first time against winners and going seven eighths,” said Kenly, who’s STD Racing also campaigned three-time GI Hollywood Gold Cup hero Lava Man.

“Unfortunately, we drew inside and all the tough ones are outside,” he said. “We don’t think she’s really a speed horse, but there’s not a whole lot of speed entered. It looks like there’s a lot of horses that like to track [the speed]. But the way the track plays, it’s tough to win on the lead, especially going seven-eighths. These horses have all been flying from 10 or 15 lengths out of it. It’s a big acid test for sure.”

Since her debut, the sophomore has posted only one workout, a four-furlong move over the Hollywood Cushion in :48 4/5 Jan. 9.

“She gallops really strong,” Kenly said. “That work was probably more like a six-furlong workout and a gallop out, than it was a four-furlong workout. She did it nice and easy and really kind of powered through it. She really came home strong and galloped out. It was a good workout for her.”

Bred in Kentucky by B. Wayne Hughes, Pinkarella has been through the sales ring twice, but RNA’d on both occasions. Consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent for Spendthrift Farm, at the 2007 KEESEP Yearling sale, the bidding stopped at \$80,000. She was acquired privately by Kenly’s operation following the sale, then was sent to the following year’s BESMAR auction, where she was bought back for \$60,000. **cont. p3**



The Quiet Storm...

Stormy Monday (Storm Cat), the dam of GII Santa Ynez S. hopeful **Pinkarella**, captured one of five starts in Southern California while racing for breeder B. Wayne Hughes and trainer Ron Ellis before beginning her second career in the breeding shed.

Of her first three foals, only Stormy Tuesday (Malibu Moon) found the winner's circle, scoring three times and posting \$54,248 in earnings. Showing no record for 2005, Stormy Monday returned the following season to produce the aforementioned Pinkarella. Put through the ring in foal to Action This Day at the 2006 Keeneland November Sale, the 12-year-old mare was purchased by Joe Hamilton for a mere \$30,000.

"Right now, she's getting prettier and prettier every day," the 52-year-old Hamilton beamed. "Saturday, she might be the most gorgeous thing to ever walk on a farm. She walked into the ring and I was surprised we got her for that

cheap. There was no big-time page on her yet, but I liked Action This Day, and there's nothing wrong with Malibu Moon; so she had a lot going on for her. And being by Storm Cat, that was a heck of a buy for \$30,000. She's turning out really nice. I guess it was just one of those deals where everyone was out to lunch when she was in the ring. She's also has a super nice Johar yearling and she's back in foal to Johar."

Hamilton operates Two Hearts Farm in Paris, Kentucky, along with partner Tony Braddock of Virginia. The 50-acre farm is currently the home of seven broodmares.

"We basically are just trying to buy and sell," said Hamilton, who bred 1990 GI Breeders' Cup Distaff third-place finisher Valay Maid. "Anything we can't sell, we'll keep and race. We have two in training right now."

The duo's investment in Stormy Monday proved shrewd immediately, selling her Action This Day filly for \$150,000 through Legacy Bloodstock's consignment at last year's FTKJUL Yearling sale. Todd Quast made the purchase on behalf of Goldmark Farm.

"That was a good looking filly," Legacy Bloodstock's Mark Toothaker recalled. "She was big scopey filly. She had a lot of size to her. She was a really big fancy filly. I think she was the most expensive horse we sold at July."--S. Sherack

My Indy commenced his career in 2007 with two dominant wins at Palermo in his native Argentina, where he competed for his breeder Haras La Quebrada. Following a five-length debut victory, the dark bay closed strongly to take the G2 Clasico Coronel Miguel F. Martinez by four lengths. Subsequently purchased by Godolphin, My Indy chased home Honour Devil (Arg) (Honour and Glory), a 5 1/4-length winner of a 1400m conditions event at Nad Al Sheba Jan. 12, 2008. The top two from that race squared off a second time in the G3 UAE 2000 Guineas Feb. 14 and, once again, Honour Devil proved superior with a victory, while My Indy 3 1/4 lengths back in third. They met a third time in the G2 UAE Derby on Dubai World Cup night March 29, but My Indy never threatened and finished 13 lengths behind the winner Honour Devil, who squeezed in a runner-up effort in the Al Bastakiya S. March 6 following the 2000 Guineas. My Indy went to the shelf following the UAE Derby, but his trainer Saeed bin Suroor was confident about the colt's chances entering the Al Maktoum Challenge. "We were very hopeful coming into the race as he had been working very well indeed," bin Suroor told *Racing Post*. "We knew he had improved a lot from last season and, hopefully, he is a nice horse for the carnival and beyond." The trainer and Dettori also teamed up to capture the third race on the card with Sos Brillante (Chi) (Dance Brightly). (see atw, p.6) The G3 Al Maktoum Challenge will be contested Feb. 5, while the The Dubai World Cup will take place March 28.

The four-year-old developed a slight temperature Wednesday, and following subsequent blood tests yesterday, Frankel informed, "He's not running; his blood's no good." The grey finished third in his U.S. debut in the GI Hollywood Derby. "It will probably be three or four more days before he goes to the track," he said. "He has no temperature [Thursday]."

SMOOTH AIR TO PASS ON CLASSIC Mount Joy Stable's **Smooth Air** (Smooth Jazz), who was under consideration for the OBS Sunshine Millions Classic at Gulfstream Jan. 24, will bypass the even, according to trainer Bennie Stutts Jr. "He's doing just fine," said Stutts Thursday morning. "He just isn't ready to go a mile-and-an-eighth off the layoff against these kind of horses at this point. He'll work again Sunday. There is a one-mile turf race in about two weeks that would fit well." As for where the four-year-old is expected to make his first start, Stutts added, "The first stakes goal could be the one-mile race on the main track [GII Gulfstream Park H. Mar. 14]. That's far enough ahead to plan right now. It's a long season with plenty of opportunities to come." Smooth Air, winner of the GII Hutcheson S. and second to Big Brown in the GI Florida Derby last spring, added the GII Ohio Derby at Thistledown in late May. He missed much of the summer with nagging foot problems, but returned to finish a good third in the GII Pennsylvania Derby at Philadelphia Park Sept. 1, won in the Needles S. on turf at Calder before finishing seventh in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Santa Anita on Oct. 25.

GOMEZ TO RIDE AT SANTA ANITA Agent Ron Anderson said Garrett Gomez would ride at Santa Anita after his mount in the Classic at Gulfstream Park, **Go Between** (Point Given), died of an apparent heart attack following a workout Monday. Among the Sunshine Millions mounts Gomez has at Santa Anita is the multiple graded-stakes winner **Georgie Boy** (Tirbal Rule) in the Sprint. The California-bred gelding owned and bred by George Schwary and trained by Kathy Walsh won the GII San Vicente S. and GII San Felipe S. at Santa Anita as a 3-year-old.

STREET CRY FILLY TOPS KEEJAN THURSDAY Thursday's top price at Keeneland January was realized late in the session when [hip 1535](#), a yearling filly by leading sire Street Cry (Ire), was sold for \$125,000. Like many of the higher-priced horses in the last few days, the price tag came as a result of pinhookers clashing. In the end, Front Range Farm landed hip 1535. A representative who signed the ticket asked to not be identified but confirmed the filly will be re-offered at a yearling sale later this year. Produced by the unraced 21-year-old Dot Dot Dash (Nureyev), a full-sister to top California sire Unusual Heat, hip 1535 is a half-sister to stakes winner Dash of Humor (Distorted Humor) and multiple-stakes-placed Two Dot Slew (Evansville Slew). She was consigned by Tom Evans's Trackside Farm. Evans was offering the filly on behalf of her co-breeders Evan and Connie Brann, who bred her on a foal-share agreement with Darley. "She was solid, did a great job showing herself and is a nice, strong filly," said Evans. "And she's by Street Cry. That's a great combination." As for the hammer price, Evans offered, "I think that's fair value for this filly. It's a nice family, she's a half to two stakes horses, and it's the family of Unusual Heat. She's a filly with a lot of potential." Asked if he thought the sale's precipitous drop in average and median was a reflection of a weak catalogue or a slumping market, Evans said, "I think it's a reflection of both. The quality in this session is a little thin, but you have to factor in the market, too. Let's face it. There's not a lot of confidence throughout the industry." For the session, the average was \$14,404 (down 48.8 percent from \$28,141) and the median was \$8,000 (down 60 percent from \$20,000). The cumulative average stands at \$32,892 (down 52.6 percent from \$69,440) and the median is \$15,000 (down 50 percent from \$30,000). The gross of \$28,978,000 is down 53.9 percent from last year's \$62,912,300. The sale continues today at 10:00 a.m. before Saturday's finale. For more information, visit www.keeneland.com.

Broken Vow Colt Brings \$92,000...

The second-highest price on the day, and the highest for a yearling colt, went to [hip 1210](#), a son of Broken Vow who made \$92,000. Eaton Sales' Reilly McDonald signed the ticket as Sugar Valley Farm. The bay colt is a son of the 11-year-old Go Valid Again (Valid Appeal), a graded stakes winner of nearly \$300,000. John Stuart's Bluegrass Thoroughbred Services Inc. consigned.

"That was a really good price, but he was a really nice horse," said Stuart afterwards. "He's a Broken Vow colt. Broken Vow is a real solid sire, but he's been a little slow this past year. This colt probably wasn't as leggy as most Broken Vows. He had a little stronger body, a shorter one, but he had a big engine on him. He was a nice, correct, sound horse."

Like the session-topping Speightstown colt who sold Tuesday for \$270,000, the colt was bred by Brad Kelley. Kelley purchased him in utero when he acquired Go Again Valid for \$80,000 at the 2007 Keeneland November sale. Kelley purchased the mare to be bred to champion English Channel. Like Tuesday's Speightstown colt, this Broken Vow colt is likely to return to the sales ring later in the year.

"There's four or five pinhooking groups where, if you can get two of them going against each other, then it's good," added Stuart. "They have to have a certain number and they've got a lot of money."

Despite the sale's slumping numbers, Stuart said that there were bright spots.

"I had some horses in there that brought plenty of money--like last year's prices," he said. "I think it's basically because there's a lack of quality and people land on them." Is that lack of quality attributable to the fact that folks are reluctant to send good horses through the ring, or is the current January catalogue simply a modest collection? "I think people didn't want to put them in there--I think they withdrew them," said Stuart.

"They may have entered them, but then withdrew them seeing that [the market is down]. But for those few [good ones], it was fine." As for the outs, Stuart opined, "I think it's a bad thing for the sales company, because these people come to town looking for quality. Some from Europe, even, and there's not enough [quality] and they complain. But it this is the January sale, and times are tough and you can't blame people for withdrawing their horses if they think they're not going to get close."

'Shiner' Returns Home for Summer Wind...

Ten years ago, a handsome chestnut son of A.P. Indy--Navarra was led out of the ring at Keeneland July, unsold at a final bid of \$975,000. The colt's breeders, Summer Wind Farm's Frank and Jane Lyon, opted to

take a chance and put the colt into training, reasoning his pedigree and good looks merited the risk.

Named Indygo Shiner, the colt made an inauspicious debut in August of 2000 at Saratoga, running

greenly and finishing over 10 lengths off the winner. But Indygo Shiner quickly found his stride. He broke his maiden in his second start, then shipped to Woodbine and finished second behind Macho Uno in the GI Grey Breeders' Cup S. Switched to the turf in his three-year-old year, Indygo Shiner won the GIII Jefferson Cup at Churchill and was runner-up in the GII Arlington Classic and GII Del Mar Derby.

Injury disrupted his four-year-old season, but when he was finally retired in 2003, Indygo Shiner boasted a solid record. He was first or second in seven of 12 starts and bankrolled \$444,066. Because he did much of his work on the spinach, however, reaction was tepid when the Lyons began shopping Indygo Shiner as a stallion, though his pedigree clearly warranted a shot in the stallion barn. Indygo Shiner was produced by Navarra, a full-sister to the recently deceased Toussad, who had produced, or would go on to produce, the likes of Grade I winners Chester House, Empire Maker, Honest Lady and Chiselling.

Ultimately, the Lyons sold Indygo Shiner to Argentine interests, and in the summer of 2003 he covered his first book of mares in the Southern Hemisphere. The Lyons didn't break all ties with Indygo Shiner, however. They retained a 25-percent interest, just in case he hit it big in South America. And lo and behold...cont. p7

From just two crops, Indygo Shiner's first runners have dominated some of Argentina's biggest races. His son, Tecla Shiner (Arg), won the G1 Nacional-Argentine Derby, while daughter Miss Match (Aus) took the G1 Seleccion-Argentine Oaks, making Indygo Shiner the only horse in modern Argentine history to sire both an Argentine Derby and Oaks winner in the same year. Mu Amiguito (Arg), his third Classic winner, captured the G1 Polla de Potrillos (Argentina 2000 Guineas), and Garatero (Arg) gave him his fourth Group 1 winner in the Provincia de Buenos Aires. In all, Indygo Shiner has sired seven group winners from his first two crops.

Just yesterday, Indygo Shiner's son My Indy (Arg), already a Group 2 winner in Argentina, got his sire some international clout with a rousing 5 3/4-length tally in the G3 Sheikh Maktoum Bin Rashid Al Maktoum Challenge-Round I on opening night of the Dubai International Racing Carnival. The colt, a five-year-old in the Northern Hemisphere, races for Sheikh Mohammed's Godolphin operation.

Indygo Shiner's success prompted the Lyons to return him to the States for the 2009 Northern Hemisphere breeding season. The 11-year-old stallion will stand at John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Farm in Lexington for a fee of \$7,500.

Summer Wind is determined to support Indygo Shiner in his inaugural run in Kentucky, according to farm manager Mark Moloney. The Lyons purchased a pair of mares at the January Sale who will be among the 10 Summer Wind mares in his 2009 book. On Monday, Summer Wind went to \$450,000 for MGISP Jade Queen (Giant's Causeway--Jade Flush, by Jade Hunter) ([hip 93](#)); and to \$290,000 for GSW Susan's Angel (Cape Town--Copeway, by Copelan) ([hip 235](#)).

"They're both very nice mares and we'll see what we get," said Moloney before adding. "We had been looking for mares from the Halo line, because he's done very well with them in South America. The colt that won today is out of a Southern Halo mare. We tried to look for some mares that were graded winners from the line, but couldn't find anything."

Moloney hopes breeders take notice of Summer Wind's support of Indygo Shiner.

"If you're going to support him, the first year's the year to do it," he said. "If he produces a group winner in his first crop in North America, he can be decent value for everybody. I know John [Sikura] is going to breed some nice mares to him. He's been very popular; he's been very well-received."

While Indygo Shiner is just kicking off his career in the U.S., the Irish-bred Moloney is more established in this country. The affable horseman moved to the States in 1989 after growing up working the farms in his home country.

"My father used to love to go to the races, and I grew up working with horses at the farm across the road," said Moloney. "When I was 17, I went to work for Sheikh Mohammed at Woodpark, then Kildangan. Finally, I decided to come to America, just to see what it was like. I think it's good for young people to travel."

Moloney got a job at Wimbledon Farm and later moved on to Hartwell Farm.

"Then seven years ago, someone called me one day and said Frank [Lyon] was looking for someone to manage his farm, so I went and talked with him," Moloney said.

It's an enviable gig, as Summer Wind's broodmare band currently boasts plenty of star power. Among its mares are India, Leave Me Along and Pampered Princess, as well as champion Fleet Indian. Moloney reports that multiple Grade I winner, whom the Lyons purchased privately after she RNA'd for \$3.9 million at the 2007 Keeneland November sale, is doing fine after suffering a devastating career-ending injury in the 2006 GI Breeders' Cup Distaff, an injury which necessitated her ankle to be fused.

"She's turned out in a paddock with three other mares and they just stick together all year," he said. "She's a very classy mare and never has any problems. She has a Storm cat yearling colt on the ground who's very nice, and she's in foal to A.P. Indy. She's due in just about a month now and will go back to Distorted Humor."

With Monday's additions, Summer Wind's broodmare band now stands at around 35.

"It's a great place, to be working with that kind of quality," said Moloney. "Short of working for Sheikh Mohammed, it's hard to find broodmares like that."

Working at Summer Wind has other benefits, too, Moloney will tell you. He fell in love with the farm's broodmare manager--the Lyons' daughter Karen Bailey Karen Bailey--and last summer the pair married.

What They're Saying At The Sales...

Cris Caldwell, Keeneland Auctioneer:

What's your take on the market so far at January?

"Everybody's finding a nice place to float right now. The catalogue, compared to last year, is significantly weaker. Once you take that into account, when you look at horse-for-horse, they're selling very much on par with last year. Most of us, across the board, have that sense of things, as do the buyers. They're finding it very tough to buy a mare that they want to bring home and that they're happy with. They're finding a lot of competition. A lot of people are on the desirable horses. It seems like the buyers have re-invented themselves in a very fast way. Horse for horse, I feel it's very similar to years in the past."

If you had to put a number on how much things are down, horse for horse, what would you guess--five percent? 10 percent? 20 percent?

"It would be in that range. Certainly less than 20 percent. Everybody I've spoken with feels that, as well, and they're having a hard time placing the horses in the barn that they want. Yes, the lighter horses are suffering, as, sadly, they should in these tough economic times. But a viable horse is a viable horse, this year and last. I'd have to say this January sale is functioning as the old January sale used to function. We don't have the big dispersals, we don't have the eye-catching mares across the board as we have had in recent years. So it's back to being a good, solid winter sale, where some people are deciding to turn some loose and not pay the feed bill on a given mare or short yearling, and move forward within their own programs."

Storm Cat had stood the 2009 season for \$300,000 and had previously carried a fee of \$500,000, but will have one of the highest fees of all Quarter Horse sires. For comparison, the highest Quarter Horse stallion fee listed on Stallionsearch.com is \$40,000 for Corona Cartel, while fellow Thoroughbred Eishin Masamune (Jpn) is offered for \$15,000. The notable Quarter Horse stallion First Down Dash stands for a private fee. "It's a far cry from what we're used to getting for Storm Cat, but [Quarter Horse racing] is its own economy," Waldman said. "We're not doing this for the money, but rather because it's an intriguing prospect." Dr. Dickson Varner, a professor and the Pin Oak Stud Chair of Stallion Reproductive Studies at Texas A&M, approached Overbrook with the idea of offering Storm Cat as a Quarter Horse stallion using new procedure developed at the school. With this method, high-quality sperm are extracted from the semen and are then used to inseminate the mare using a low-dose technique. Less than 1 mL of the semen is used in each dose. Varner and Dr. Joe Yocum, Overbrook's farm manager and resident veterinarian, and Dr. Stuart Brown Jr. of Hagyard Equine Medical Institute worked together to extract semen from Storm Cat, according to an article posted on *Stallionsearch.com*. "The procedure has been applied successfully to many American Quarter Horse stallions, but this represents the first attempt at using the procedure in a Thoroughbred stallion," Varner told the website. Additionally, Storm Cat's semen has been frozen at Texas A&M and can later be used to fertilize eggs using a technique called intracytoplasmic sperm injection. Under ICSI, an egg is extracted from the mare and fertilized in a laboratory. After seven days, the egg is then non-surgically transferred into the mare's uterus. On Thursday, Overbrook sent out a press release "mainly to the Quarter Horse world," according to Waldman. The farm has already received responses. "We've had calls this afternoon already," Waldman said. "You may not see the large numbers you think you might see with artificial insemination, but maybe there will be 15-20 mares that will get covered by him. Or I hope that many." Storm Cat's son Hennessy, the sire 61 Thoroughbred blacktype winners, has experienced success in limited opportunities as a Quarter Horse stud. Hennessy, who died from a heart attack in 2007, sired two stakes winners from five Quarter Horse foals, including Check Him Out, who has also found fortune as a stallion. "When you limit it to the odd or two, or in this case five with Hennessy, your sample is too small to make a judgment," Waldman said. "But obviously with two successes out of five, that's indicative that it did work. And I imagine the idea of having a Storm Cat out of a top Quarter Horse mare as a potential stud horse would be very appealing to Quarter Horse breeders."

"He is a unique, polished and passionate talent with an absolutely infectious personality. His race calls and pre- and post-race commentary are supremely accurate, descriptive and colorful, and his knowledge of the sport of horse racing and its historical perspective is vast. It all makes for a wonderful and unique entertainment mix and we're thrilled to showcase his talents to an American and worldwide audience in 2009." Johnson, 42, replaces Luke Kruytbosch, who passed away unexpectedly last summer at the age of 47. He becomes the sixth announcer in the history of Churchill Downs. "Never in a million years did I ever think I would be in this position," said Johnson, who called his first race at Tweseldown, England in 1986. "It is a dream come true. BAN LIFTED AT FAIR GROUNDS Officials of the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry and the Louisiana State Racing Commission yesterday lifted a quarantine on a Fair Grounds barn that had been in place since last month. All 66 horses in Barn 4A and 4B in Fair Grounds' stable area tested negative for equine herpes virus earlier this week. Barn 4A and 4B, which house horses trained by Dallas Stewart and Neil Howard, was placed under quarantine Dec. 26 after test results confirmed that a horse in that barn was infected with EHV-1. "We are most grateful not only to the LSRC and the Department of Agriculture for their guidance and assistance, but to our horsemen for their diligence in dealing with the quarantine," said Fair Grounds vice president and general manager of racing Eric Halstrom. The quarantine of that barn was ordered after a Thoroughbred trained by Stewart displayed symptoms of equine herpes on Dec. 23, and the diagnosis was confirmed a day later. The lifting of the quarantine means that Stewart's and Howard's horses who tested negative this week may resume training with the rest of the horse population, and those horses may again be entered to race. When entries were taken Thursday for Sunday's 10-race program, Stewart entered two horses and Howard one. The five horses that had positive tests for equine herpes Dec. 29 remain off grounds and will be tested again Monday. If the horses test negative next week, they will be allowed to rejoin Fair Grounds' horse population. According to Halstrom, measures implemented for horses shipping in to Fair Grounds will remain in place through the remainder of the racing season. The measures, as recommended by the LDAF, include a normal temperature reading upon arrival and records of a certified veterinary inspection within the last 48 hours and a herpes vaccination from not less than 14 and not more than 90 days ago. The adjusted training hours in place since Dec. 27 to accommodate the quarantined horses will remain in place through Sunday, with training from 5:30-9:30 a.m. and a renovation break from 7:30-8 a.m. Beginning Monday, the training schedule will return to the normal 6-10 a.m.
