become a graded stakes winner when he goes to post in the GII Hutcheson S. for three-year-olds at Gulfstream Park today. In his debut Aug. 30 at Saratoga, the chestnut was part of a three-way duel for the lead and appeared defeated when the stalker Imperial Council (Empire Maker) swooped to the front inside the quarter

pole. Hello Broadway then demonstrated his resolve and came back along the inside for a hard-fought neck victory. **Cont. p2**

GOLDEN GALS

A day after fans at Gulfstream were treated to a brilliant display by Elusive Heat (Elusive Quality) in an allowance event, the two fillies that she finished between in the GIII Old Hat S. Jan. 4 will be on display. In the Old Hat, Elusive Heat finished on near even terms with **Gemswick Park** (Speightstown), who got her nose down on the line, and **Frolic's Dream** (Smoke Glacken), who was another nose back in third. While Elusive Heat's connections opted for an easier spot yesterday, Gemswick Park and Frolic's Dream renew acquaintances. The former, trained by Tom Albertrani, preceded her Old hat victory with a third in the GI Frizette S. in October and a second in the GIII Tempted S. in November. Frolic's Dream was undefeated prior to the Old Hat, having won a pair of stakes at Calder. **Cont. p3**

MIDSHIPMAN TOPS FREE HANDICAP

GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner **Midshipman** (Unbridled's Song) received the high-weight assignment of 126 pounds on the 2008 Experimental Free Handicap, released yesterday by The Jockey Club. The 126 pounds assigned to Midshipman is one pound less than the assignment on last year's heavyweight, War Pass (Cherokee Run), and is the standard impost for top Experimental colts. Midshipman is weighted two pounds higher than **Vineyard Haven** (Lido Palace {Chi}), winner of the GI Champagne S. and GI Hopeful S., and three pounds more than **Square Eddie** (Smart Strike), winner of the GI Lane's End Breeders' Futurity and runner-up in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile.

The filly division is headed by GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies heroine **Stardom Bound** (Tapit) at 124 pounds, one pound above the assignment on last year's high weight, Indian Blessing (Indian Charlie). Stardom Bound is weighted four pounds higher than **Dream Empress** (Bernstein). Dream Empress won the GI Darley Alcibiades S. and was runner-up to Stardom Bound in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies.

The Experimental Free Handicap is a weight-based assessment of the previous year's leading two-year-olds, with the weights compiled for a hypothetical race at 1 1/16 miles on dirt. This year's weighting committee of racing secretaries was composed of Ben Huffman of Churchill Downs, P.J. Campo of the New York Racing Association and Thomas S. Robbins of the Del Mar Thoroughbred Club. **Rankings, p6-7**

Bumped into Grade 1 competition in his second start, Hello Broadway could not keep up in the Champagne S. Oct. 4 and checked in fifth, 9 1/2 lengths behind the winner Vineyard Haven (Lido Palace {Chi}). Returning in the GIII Nashua S. Nov. 2, Hello Broadway raced in close quarters right off the pace and was shuffled back turning for home. After finding room at the three-sixteenths, the colt was reluctant to change leads and drifted in, but was able to make up enough ground to finish second, a diminishing 2 3/4 lengths behind fellow Hutcheson entrant **Break Water Edison** (Lemon Drop Kid). Unraced since, Hello Broadway has been working briskly for his comeback, sporting bullets Jan. 9 and Jan. 27. The seven-furlong Hutcheson is a cut back in distance for the colt, as his last two starts have come at one mile. **Sal Jak** (Graeme Hall) will try to follow the lead of the 2008 Hutcheson winner Smooth Air (Smooth Jazz) and ship north from Calder to post an upset. The stretch-runner enters this spot off three straight wins, including a 1 1/4-length score in the Jack Price Juvenile S. for Florida-breds Nov. 8. He prevailed by 3 1/2 lengths against two foes in a starter allowance Dec. 28 in his latest outing.

An intriguing field lines up for this first leg of the Global Sprint Challenge, including **Weekend Hussler** and **Apache Cat**, who between them have won 12 Group 1 events. Weekend Hussler is unbeaten down the Flemington straight course, and, although he tries 1000 meters for the first time in his career, trainer Ross McDonald exudes confidence. "He's gotten a little bit stronger and he's probably grown a little bit," Caulfield-based trainer told *Australian Associated Press*. "And the work he's been doing...he hasn't been asked [to do much], is frightening really," McDonald added. **Cont. p4**

Excellent Art's first foals impress

POSITIVE reports are already filtering through about the first foals by European champion three-year-old miler Excellent Art.

Last Wednesday, Car Colston Hall Stud welcomed a bay filly out of Riotous Applause, a Royal Applause half-sister to Group 1 Racing Post Trophy winner and Derby favourite Crowded House.

"She's an absolute corker; a very, very good first foal, correct, with quality in abundance; we couldn't be happier with

her," said stud manager Clive Newland.

Other early arrivals by Excellent Art also include a bay filly out of Rock Candy, a Rock Of Gibraltar daughter of Irish 1,000 Guineas runner-up Strawberry Roan, and a bay filly out of Swordlestown Stud's Sahara Sky, who is a three-parts sister to July Cup winner Owington.

The latter is boarding with Peter Collier of Cramps Castle Stud, who described her as: "a very correct, quality

filly, all bay with a lovely head."

Excellent Art was among the leaders of his generation at both two and three years, capturing the Group 2 Mill Reef Stakes as a juvenile and the Group 1 St James's Palace Stakes from Duke Of Marmalade at three. The son of Pivotal was also placed four times at Group 1 level, notably when a head second to Ramonti in the Sussex Stakes.

Since winning his five Group 1s in succession last year, he is winless in three tries, including a third as the favorite in the G1 Hong Kong Sprint Dec. 14. **Wilander** carries the maroon and white of Sheikh Mohammed and is the X-factor in the race. Three-for-five lifetime, the beaten favorite in last year's G1 Blue Diamond S. was last seen taking out the G2 Schillaci S. at Caulfield in October and gets a break in the weights for his return.

Break Water Edison (120) (3-1) - ran big in his second start, tailed off, then threw a big one to win the Nashua. He spots weight to some good ones here, so even if he runs his best it might not be good enough--and he's not likely to run his best, both because he probably hasn't been cranked up for a sprint, and because the big jump may have taken something out of him for a while. Next time.

Bee Cee Cee (120) (15-1) - jumped when first time both Lasix and blinkers in August, tailed off, then got back to his best right off the bench. He would need a big forward move to get involved here, and a bounce is much more likely.

Capt. Candyman Can (120) (3-1) - ran pretty well in his first two, and better with Lasix in his next two. His last was a strong figure, earned in part by being very wide (5w, upper left) on the first turn. This is the kind of pattern that produces a strong three-year-old campaign, and we like him going forward. But like Break Water Edison, even his previous top may not be good enough, and he may not be fully cranked up for this.

Jerry Brown formed Thoro-Graph in 1982 to service the needs of horsemen and professional handicappers. Since then, Thoro-Graph has been responsible for the purchase of a total of 77 horses who have gone on to win stakes for their clients. Additionally, three NTRA national handicapping championship winners used Thoro-Graph data. Thoro-Graph performance figures take into account weight, ground loss, effect of wind on the time of the race, and track speed. The lower the figure, the better the performance. Hello Broadway (114) (5-2) - is similar to some other young Tagg runners of recent years, in that he came out running and didn't develop through the campaign. This colt wasn't badly beaten in the Nashua, but that's deceiving--he got a rail trip (1w), while Break Water Edison was 4w and earned a much better figure. However, Hello Broadway is very likely to beat his nemesis today--he gets eight pounds this time, worth 1 1/2 points on the Thoro-Graph scale. He's also very likely to run at least as well as his previous best, or better--he's shown he runs well when fresh, he's older and presumably stronger now, and he's working fast.

Salo Jak (120) (8-1) - got down to a decent figure in his third start before bouncing some last time, and could get back to his best now. But he would have to improve to beat these monsters, and there's no real reason to expect that.

Rocketing Returns (116) (5-1) - exploded in his second start to win a good maiden race with a very fast figure, then came back after a break with a similar effort at Calder. At the weights, this colt's best is actually the fastest in this race, and with five weeks rest, sprinting, he is also more likely to fire than the ones almost as fast.

Z Day (114) (6-1) - made a huge forward move last time (when heavily bet...hmm...), and a repeat of that effort would get him a piece of this. But a) that jump is almost certain to cause a bounce, and b) there is a major issue of acclimation, since he worked just two weeks ago at Aqueduct.

Bottom Line - Rocketing Returns is a clear play here at close to the morning line, with Hello Broadway the one to fear.

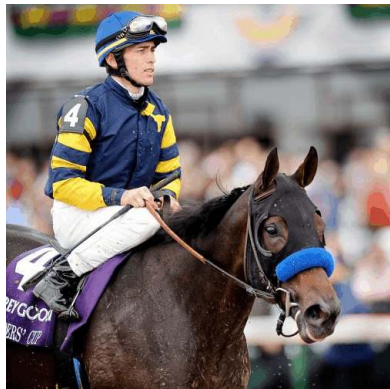

INDIAN BLESSING SCRATCHED FROM SANTA MONICA

Newly crowned sprint champion **Indian Blessing** (Indian Charlie) will not compete in Saturday's GI Santa Monica H. at Santa Anita, leaving the mare that beat her in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare

Sprint, the five-year-old **Ventura** (Chester House), as the heavy favorite for the seven-furlong race. Bob Baffert, who trains Indian Blessing for Hal and Patti Earnhardt, confirmed Thursday morning she will skip the race. "We're not going to run," the trainer said. "I want to freshen her up. We're pointing for Dubai [GI \$2 million Golden Shaheen Mar. 28]." Rival trainers weren't exactly mourning the decision.



'Blessing' will bypass Santa Monica

"I'm glad Indian Blessing's not running," said Ventura's trainer Bobby Frankel. "I'm not looking for tough competition." Asked if Ventura, who is unraced since the Breeders' Cup, was "cranked" for her return, Frankel said, "She's cranked enough to win." Two-time Eclipse Award-winning jockey Garrett Gomez has the mount. He has ridden Ventura in each of her seven U.S. starts, four of them victories. Frankel has also entered **Jibboom** (Mizzen Mast) in the Santa Monica. Trainer Peter Eurton, who will send out **She's Cheeky** (Black Minnaloushe), also welcomed the word that Indian Blessing would pass the Santa Monica. "Is that a for sure? You're not just pulling my leg or trying to make my day," Eurton said when told. "I'm very happy to hear that, because with Indian Blessing and Ventura in there, everyone else was running for third, at best."

DREAM EMPRESS TO ENGLISH OAKS? Trainer Ken McPeck told the *Daily Racing Form* that the three-year-old filly **Dream Empress** (Bernstein), winner of the GI Alcibiades S. over Keeneland's Polytrack, will bypass the GI Kentucky Oaks and instead point toward the G1 Epsom Oaks. "She's a big, leggy kind of filly," said the conditioner. "She won on Polytrack and on turf. I don't think dirt is her game. After we leave [Florida], I'll be able to train her on my farm in Kentucky over the hills and rolling gallops to get her used to that. And the purse of the English Oaks is huge, like three times the Kentucky Oaks." A winner on the turf at Saratoga, Dream Empress came off her Alcibiades victory to be second to Stardom Bound (Tapit) in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, but could do no better than a well-beaten fourth on dirt as the favorite in the GII Golden Rod S. at Churchill Nov. 29.

BARBARO MEMORIAL UNVEILING

SCHEDULED FOR APR. 26 A larger-than-life bronze statue of **Barbaro** (Dynaformer) will be unveiled at Churchill Downs Apr. 26, the racetrack announced Thursday, the second-year anniversary of the colt's death. The statue will be the focal point of the memorial and burial site for the 2007 GI Kentucky Derby winner who broke down while competing in the GI Preakness S. "[My wife] Gretchen and I are very much looking forward to the public ceremony this April," said Roy Jackson, who bred, raised and raced Barbaro with his wife. "We're absolutely thrilled that Barbaro will be honored at Churchill Downs with a magnificent statue at the site of his greatest race." The unveiling ceremony will take place outside the track's Gate 1 near the Kentucky Derby Museum before the races commence that day. The colt's ashes will be interred beneath the statue, which is nearing its final stages with equine sculptor Alexa King. Track officials said additional details about the ceremony will be forthcoming as they become available.

TRACK SIGNALS PULLED FROM VEGAS Sports books in Las Vegas are without the signal from five tracks after TrackNet, the media partnership between Magna Entertainment and Churchill Downs, failed to reach an agreement with casinos on the value of the signal. The affected tracks include the Magna-owned tracks of Santa Anita, Gulfstream, Golden Gate Fields, and Laurel, as well as Oaklawn, which uses TrackNet to negotiate its simulcast signals. According to a report in *Daily Racing Form*, officials representing the casinos were still negotiating with TrackNet in the hopes a deal can be hammered out. An agreement between the groups expire Jan. 1.

"It's possible she might run again as she certainly has the ability to win. She's a very good-looking filly with a decent pedigree and there's plenty happening on the page."
