FROLICING HOME IN FORWARD GAL

Dare to Dream Farm's **Frolic Dream** (Smoke Glacken) established herself as the fastest juvenile filly in South Florida last season, with three wins from as many starts, including black-type scores in October's Cassidy S.--by 12 3/4 lengths--and the John Franks Juvenile Fillies S. the following month. The grey, who failed to meet her reserve in two trips through the sales ring, lost little in defeat when third to **Gemswick Park** (Speightstown) in a blanket finish in the GIII Old Hat S. Jan. 4, and regained the winning thread yesterday in the GII Forward Gal S. at Gulfstream Park. Sweet From the Start...

Capt. Candyman Can was let go at 19-1 in a field of six in his 5 1/2-furlong debut at Saratoga Aug. 13, and was forced to steady and alter course at the quarter pole, but overcame that trouble to air by 7 1/4 lengths, becoming a ☆ "TDN Rising Star" ☆. The bay was favored at 5-2 for the GIII Arlington-Washington Futurity at the suburban Chicago oval Sept. 13, but was taken up late in a roughly run race and finished sixth, beaten just two lengths. Kept around one turn for his next, the gelding raced close to the pace in the Nov. 1 GIII Iroquois S. at Churchill Downs, took command into the lane and came home three lengths best in that one-mile test. He stretched out to a distance of ground for his two-year-old finale in the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. Nov. 29, but overraced on the front end and settled for third, beaten a half-length.

A Perfect Ride...

Capt. Candyman Can broke alertly in the Hutch and contested the early pace inside Hello Broadway and Rocketing Returns (Gone West). But, in stark opposition to the Kentucky Jockey Club, the colt came back willingly to jockey Julien Leparoux, who eased him out to the three path for a clear run at the leaders on the turn. The Frenchman took a confident look behind him at the quarter pole, took over soon after and outlasted Hello Broadway to the line. "We've been teaching him to [relax] in the mornings, but until they do it in the afternoon you don't know whether they get it," commented winning trainer Ian Wilkes. "Julien was able to get him back out of [the speed duel down the backstretch] and he came on from there." Wilkes said the winner is likely to reappear in the GII Fountain of Youth S. over Gulfstream's one-turn mile Feb. 28. The sky appeared the limit for **Arson Squad** following his victory over Spring at Last and Brother Derek in the 2007 GII Strub S. at Santa Anita, but he made his next seven starts over California's synthetic surfaces and could never manage anything better than a fourth-place

effort. Sent to the barn of Rick Dutrow Jr. following a seventh in the GII Pat O'Brien H. at Del Mar Aug. 24, the dark bay made a successful return to a conventional main track with a 2 1/2-length victory in the GII Meadowlands Cup H. Oct. 3. Given the green light for the GI Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile H. at Aqueduct Nov. 29, Arson

Squad lingered well behind a strong pace and was moving into contention when he was forced out by the ill-fated Wanderin Boy. He still managed to make up nine lengths in the final quarter mile, but fell a length short in fourth. **Albertus Maximus** makes his first start for the Kieran McLaughlin barn, having been privately purchased by Shadwell Stable following his win in the Oct. 25 Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile. Prior to championship day, the five-year-old won the Windy Sands H. at Del Mar Sept. 1 and was third in the GI Goodwood S. Sept. 27. Multiple Eclipse finalist **Einstein** looks to improve on his sixth in this event last season. A dual Grade I winner on the turf in 2008, the attractive dark bay closed the season with a handy success over Commentator (Distorted Humor) in the GII Clark H. over the Churchill main track Nov. 28.

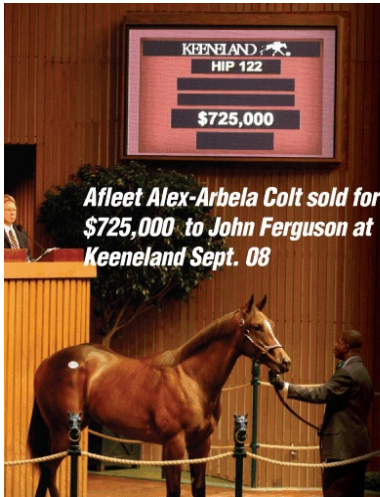

The absence of dual champion Indian Blessing leaves **Ventura** a heavy favorite. The Juddmonte homebred, off since an impressive victory in the Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint at this track and distance Oct. 24, has hit the board in all seven of her U.S. starts. Ventura won the GI Just a Game S. at Belmont in June, then was nosed out of a win when second in the July 5 GII CashCall Mile before another runner-up effort in the Sept. 7 GI Woodbine Mile. All those efforts were over the turf, but she had no trouble adding to her synthetic track success in the Breeders' Cup. "She's a super mare and I'm excited to see her back and ready to go," said jockey Garrett Gomez, who has ridden Ventura in all of her seven North American outings. "I don't work her, but I know she's been training well." **Wake Up Maggie**, a stakes winner over the Del Mar all-weather track last summer, is coming off a third-place finish in the 1 1/16-miles GII Bayakoa H. and jockey Tyler Baze thinks the cut back in distance will help the six-year-old mare find the winner's circle Saturday. "Seven furlongs is going to be a perfect distance for her," Baze said. "Nothing bothers her. She can come from five or six lengths out of it. **She's Cheeky** looks like the only speed since Indian Blessing's not going to run, so we might be sitting in the garden spot. I know she can finish. She's been working absolutely wonderful." She's Cheeky will be looking for her fourth straight win while making her stakes debut in the Santa Monica. The four-year-old filly broke her maiden over this track Oct. 1, then added an optional claiming victory Oct. 24 and a Dec. 29 allowance.

THE QUAD

Last week I challenged Kentucky Thoroughbred interests not to pursue alternative gaming (VTLs). I promised to show how a positive change to the racing environment through the introduction of a new bet would serve to get racing's fan base pumped up on a regular basis.

My concept is far from original, yet proven in popularity. With a twist here and there, it can, I believe, jump-start our sagging game.

Currently, the only proven magnet to get fans involved is a Pick 6 carryover. The chance to use one's skill to bet a small amount and cash in big-time brings out people and money to an otherwise stale enterprise. Racing's dilemma is that carryovers are unpredictable and difficult to imitate. Some tracks offer an occasional guaranteed pool, but the artificial carryovers do not work nearly as well as the real deal.

So what can racing do on a regular basis to create pools large enough to excite patron participation?

I introduce you to The Quad. No, not that four-sided plot of land on campus where you set a date to meet your girl, but a new wager that borrows heavily from the Tierce, a bet that fueled the racing industry in France for decades.

The Quad is a superfecta in which a player must select the first four horses across the line in the correct order.

That's it? That is what Irwin thinks will save the game?

Yes, that be it, baby!

And, with the enhancement of bells and whistles, I believe The Quad can generate enough enthusiasm to re-energize our base and, just as importantly, introduce many times more people to the sport than currently play our game.

The Quad, as I envision it, would be a bet that has a minimal betting unit. The Quad would be a game that is played once a week on a weekday. A good time might be Thursday in the last race of the day.

Bets on The Quad, most importantly, would be handled through the state lottery. Entries would drawn five or six days in advance, as part of the build-up would consist of a weekly publication promoting the race. Print and on-line magazines would include features on the horses and the human participants in that week's race. *Daily Racing Form* could do an insert well in advance of the race with features, analysis and past performances.

The Quad could be vigorously promoted on television, with one show early in the week to get people geared up for the race, and another program that would include the running of the race itself. Additionally, The Quad could be shown during the dinner-time news on local stations.

What promises to make the race a spectacle for the neophyte and a lure for the hard-core player lies in the details: a very large field of runners with a weight spread of 40 pounds competing for substantial prize money and generating a ton of cash for players to win because of the inclusion of betting dollars that normally would not be available. And all to be had for a minimal betting amount. Small bet, chance for big payout. Greed!

Initially, in order for the race to gain as much exposure as possible, The Quad should be limited to a few venues that have a large population and racetracks big enough to accommodate as many runners as possible. Belmont could run more than 20 horses, as could Churchill Downs and Arlington Park. The more horses, the more betting combinations, and the bigger the pool because of the greater possibilities.

A race in which the weight spread is 40 pounds can bring a graded stakes winner and a \$25,000 claimer together at the finish line.

Depending on how well the horse industry does with its political connections, betting on the race could cross state lines. Every state that conducts racing would not have to be involved in producing The Quad in its own locale, but certainly each state could benefit from its share of the handle.

I don't think it is necessary to explain why horseplayers would embrace this bet, but Kentucky Derby Day has a huge handle, in part because people that do not attend the races on a regular basis pump a lot of cash into the pools and skilled handicappers love to bet into them.

As far as a regular lottery player or an uninitiated racetrack bettor is concerned, it seems that people interested in gambling would be more prone to having a flutter if a) it was a socially acceptable activity (let's face it, buying a lottery ticket on a daily basis is an embarrassing activity to most adults) and b) bettors could rationalize their gamble based on it being a test of skill on an actual sporting event. Buying a ticket at the corner convenience store is not exactly like betting on the Super Bowl.

The addition of toreador-like jockeys, horses with clever names and a package of entertainment should make The Quad a tad more interesting than watching some washed-up announcer-type dressed in a rented tux anxiously waiting for a ping-pong ball with a number to be plucked from some carnival contraption by a Vanna White wannabe.

The Quad could offer a large purse to horse owners to encourage participation of their horses. In addition to the obvious prize money available for the race, there are myriad ways in which our sport could benefit from The Quad, including a bonanza for state-bred programs, which in turn would make it easier for the racing industry to sell it to state legislators.

State-bred horses especially could benefit greatly from The Quad, as they will be needed to fill the races. Imagine two races a month for New York-breds at Belmont Park with purses that rival their championship-day pots. Imagine 20 state-breds lining up to run for that big payday in a race that receives a ton of publicity and is shown on television. Do you think the New York breeders would have something to promote to encourage new breeders to join their ranks? Do you think that breeders would get a better reception at public auction for New York-bred yearlings? Do you think that state legislators will pay more attention to benefits for state-breds that are generated by gambling? You betcha!

The Quad would generate job opportunities for turf writers, television analysts, jockeys (we'll need 20 or more per race!), publicists and several others. It could be a back-to-work program for a lot of racing's recently disenfranchised. Obama might even throw some stimulus money at the The Quad!

But seriously, ladies and gentlemen. . .

As with any new idea, there will be things to be worked out and detractors to pooh-pooh the concept. Twenty horses in a race--are you freaking crazy--think of the danger! And where are you going to find a rider that can do 100 pounds, on Mars? What will PETA say! No state legislature is going to touch this thing! The lottery does not like racing.

Yadda, yadda, yadda. It is 2009, the game is dying before our very eyes, and racetracks, state governments and short-sighted horsemen are trying to make us get in bed with a cold-steel body that has AIDS! Let's take advantage of the current climate and tap into the spirit for change. Racing can develop bets to win back our players. Sure, there will be hurdles, but certainly none greater than pro-casino types are facing on this very day in getting VTLs into Kentucky racetracks.

I am not ego driven to a point where I think The Quad is the only innovation that can get people involved. I know that if the right people put their heads together, other concepts can be developed to take advantage of what racing has to offer its patrons. But it is time to toss out the old model and think outside of the bun.

You remember how exciting it was to know you would be meeting your girl at The Quad? Well, let's try to engender this game of ours with a little of that anticipation and passion.

### Jones Holding Strong Hand in New Orleans...

Trainer Larry Jones has sent out the Kentucky Derby runner-up the last two years and looks primed to take another crack at this year's Triple Crown. The barn is set to be represented by a pair of runners in next Saturday's GIII Risen Star S.

at the Fair Grounds, **Friesan Fire** (A.P. Indy), victorious in his most recent appearance of the GIII Lecomte S. in the Big Easy; and **It Happened Again** (Proud Citizen), last-out winner of the Triple Sec S. up at Delta Downs. "Friesan Fire and It Happened

Again are both on schedule," Jones said Friday morning. "Both are doing well and both should get their final works Monday morning, assuming the track conditions fit. Both horses have talent, but both are still learning the game. It's up to them which one wants to become a major player and step up to the plate. I'm looking for an improvement in their numbers in this race coming up." **Old Fashioned** (Unbridled's Song), the GII Remsen S. hero and current barn star, has seen plans change recently. The gray, owned by Fox Hill Farms, was penciled in for the GIII Southwest S. Feb. 16, but, "we're up in the air on what's next for him unless we can resolve some things with Oaklawn," Jones said.

### Calhoun, Scharbauer Duo Looms Large...

At the other end of the Fair Grounds backside, trainer Bret Calhoun spoke confidently of **Indygo Mountain** (A.P. Indy) and **Silver City** (Unbridled's Song), a pair of sophomore colts campaigned by Clarence Scharbauer. "Indygo Mountain worked great [Thursday]," Calhoun said of his Risen Star-bound colt who breezed five-eighths in 1:00. "We got just what we were looking for. We're going to throw that last race [sixth in the Lecomte] out. Nothing went right for us with this horse for about a month, but we're back on track with him now." Indygo Mountain was set to contest a Dec. 11 allowance prep for the Lecomte, but it was rained out and rescheduled a week later. But the colt was a gate scratch Dec. 18 and he was likely short on fitness for the Lecomte. Silver City shipped to Oaklawn for his most recent appearance where he was an impressive and popular winner of the Dixieland S. Jan. 16. "His work [Thursday, four furlongs in :47.80] was awesome. What was impressive was the way he galloped out. He'll go back to Oaklawn for the [Feb. 16 GIII] Southwest."

### McPeek Looking to Hot Springs for More Than Willing...

**More Than Willing** (More Than Ready), who posted a 3/4-length allowance victory at Gulfstream Park in his two-turn debut Jan. 25, looks poised to make the jump into stakes competition for the GIII Rebel S. at Oaklawn Park Mar. 14. "He trained like a good horse, and he should have broken his maiden in his first two starts, but I kept him sprinting and he does his best running going long," McPeek explained. "As long as we can make travel arrangements by plane, then we will be coming to Oaklawn. I will keep him at Gulfstream and train him there." Kent Desormeaux, who broke the colt's maiden last Sunday, is scheduled to ride in the Rebel.

**NYRA Opposes Proposed Elimination of the 'Belmont Special' Train Service:**

The New York Racing Association issued a brief statement to the Metropolitan Transit Authority on Friday expressing its opposition to the proposed discontinuation of the Long Island Rail Road's "Belmont Special" train service, with an exception for Belmont Stakes Day. The LIRR, facing a \$54-million budget deficit, has proposed a series of fare increases and service cuts, including the elimination of the special line that takes race fans to Belmont Park, located in Elmont, Long Island. NYRA, mandated in its 25-year franchise renewal to increase attendance, is concerned the loss of service will hurt on-track business. "While NYRA recognizes that the MTA needs to balance its budget, no other proposed service cut so directly affects one business, one employer, one industry as does the proposal to eliminate LIRR service to Belmont Park (except for Belmont Stakes Day)," the company said in a release. Joe Calderoni, a spokesman for the LIRR, said the elimination of the Belmont Special is one of several proposed cost-saving measures, including reducing service on other lines and closing ticket offices. The Ravitch Commission, created by Governor David Paterson, is currently working on a rescue plan that could prevent the service cuts and save the Belmont Special, which averages 100 riders per day, according to Calderoni. John Lee, director of communications for NYRA, noted that Belmont Special ridership is higher on weekends and that improved marketing and a proposed casino at Belmont could improve the number of riders. "As we have emerged from bankruptcy and have received our franchise renewal, we have worked on plans to improve attendance," Lee said. "[The loss in rail service] is really going to be a detriment to those plans." NYRA has urged "patrons, industry stakeholders and concerned citizens" to express their opposition to the MTA plan by writing to Douglas Sussman, director of community affairs for the MTA. # BREEDERS' EDITION AMERICA

**TALE OF THE CAT TOPS SELECT FINALE** A colt by Tale of the Cat topped yesterday's final session of the New Zealand Bloodstock's Select Yearling Sale in Karaka. The yearling ([hip 1155](#)), out of Eyes Light Up (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}), was consigned by Hallmark Stud and was purchased for NZ\$205,000 by Perth trainer Lindsey Smith. "I've had a great time over here, the sale was good for buyers and the good horses still sold for good money," Smith said. "I'm a fan of fast horses and I'm happy with the three I've purchased. The Tale of the Cat's an early running type and we'll give him a chance to settle in back home and break him in, then map out a plan for him." During three Select sessions, 456 yearlings sold for NZ\$17,039,000. The Select average of NZ\$37,366 fell 37.4 percent from the 2008 figure of NZ\$59,709. The median was NZ\$30,000, down 37.5 percent from NZ\$48,000 in 2008. The 2009 clearance rate was 73 percent. New Zealand Bloodstock Managing Director Petrea Vela admitted sales figures were effected by global uncertainties. "Although there's been good activity in the ring over the past three days, and the general consensus has been that it's hard to buy a nice horse, this sale has suffered from a lack of buyer confidence to buy on spec in this climate," Vela said. "This session has traditionally been underpinned by pinhookers selecting horses for our Ready to Run Sale in November and, while the top horses have sold just as well, without the pinhookers here in force, we've seen a softening of that middle market. After experiencing exponential growth here over the past couple of years, the tide has turned in buyers' favour and there's a lot of good buying to be had." The New Zealand Bloodstock's National Yearling Sales Series concludes with the two-day Festival Sale on Sunday and Monday. Both sessions begin at 11 a.m.
