## 13 ENTERED FOR RISEN STAR

A field of 13 sophomores was entered yesterday for Saturday's GIII Risen Star S. at Fair Grounds, with graded stakes-placed **Giant Oak** (Giant's Causeway) the 3-1 morning-line favorite. The chestnut colt was beaten just a neck when second behind Beethoven (Sky Mesa) in the Nov. 29 GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. Capt.

Candy Man (Candy Ride {Arg}), winner of last week's GII Hutcheson S., was third that day. Giant Oak turned in a bullet five-furlong work at Fair Grounds Sunday in 1:00.40. He will break from post seven. **Friesan Fire** (A.P. Indy), coming off a win in the Lecomte S. at Fair Grounds Jan. 10, is second choice at 7-2 and will break from post six. Friesan Fire worked five furlongs at Fair

Grounds yesterday in 1:04.20. **Flying Pegasus** (Fusaichi Pegasus), making his first start since running second in the GII Futurity S. at Belmont last September, is third choice on the morning line at 6-1. The Ralph Nicks trainee drew the 12 post yesterday. The Risen Star S. is the ninth of 11 races at Fair Grounds Saturday, with an expected post time of 5:29 p.m. ET.

## KENTUCKY FARMS COPE WITH ICE STORM DAMAGES, COULD RECEIVE FEDERAL AID

As Governor Steve Beshear asked President Obama to declare Kentucky a major disaster area Monday, Thoroughbred farms in the commonwealth continue to cope with the lingering effects of last week's ice storm that is blamed for 42 deaths in the United States and left 1.3 million in the nation without electricity.

At one point, more than 700,000 Kentucky residents were without power and Beshear has ordered 4,600 soldiers--including the entire state national guard--to distribute food and water, remove fallen trees and provide security. Thoroughbred breeders have also been dealt a blow by the storm, according to David Switzer, executive director for the Kentucky Thoroughbred Association/Kentucky Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders.

"The common denomination of information we're receiving from farms are downed trees--and it's going to be very costly with debris removal--fences down, frozen water lines, and a lack of electricity at most of our farms," Switzer said Monday. "Consequently, we're foaling mares in the dark. The cost of hay has gone up because for two or three days, we weren't able to turn any horses out."

The worst may have passed by Monday as every stud farm contacted by the *Thoroughbred Daily News* had electricity in their main offices, with the exception of Airdrie Stud, which had resorted to generator power. Several farms, however, reported that some of their barns remained without electricity.

President Obama declared Kentucky a disaster area on Thursday, but Beshear now seeks immediate financial relief from damage with a "major disaster" declaration. The Democratic governor estimates damages exceed \$45 million, which is the threshold for receiving such a declaration.

"There will be some funds coming into the state, but we're not quite sure how much agriculture may or may not get," Switzer said. "We are talking with the Farm Service Agency about the possibility of farm disaster relief."

The Food, Conservation, and Energy Act of 2008--also known as the Farm Bill--included a provision that made horse breeders eligible for emergency federal loans following a disaster. Previously, horse breeders were not eligible for these loans, even though they were available to other livestock farmers. **Cont. p2**

"We'll be talking to Secretary [Tom] Vilsack of the U.S. Department of Agriculture and see what, if anything, might be available," Switzer said.

Switzer, however, believes farmers would benefit more from a cost-sharing program, where those affected would pay for 50 percent of the damages and the federal government would pay the rest.

"[The low-interest loans] are very difficult to qualify for," Switzer said. "We tried using those back in 2001 when we had the mare reproductive loss syndrome, and we only qualified three people for that. So that's not the direction we're trying to go."

Switzer said he couldn't estimate the chances horse breeders will qualify for a cost-share program and added that it could be "months" before breeders receive any money. He also advised farmers to document any damage their property incurred before they undertake any extensive clean-up project.

"One of the things we're urging folks to do--in the event we do find some funds--is to document the destruction," Switzer said. "Take pictures of the fallen trees, take pictures of the fences that are down, etc. And keep their receipts. There are some USDA programs that require repairs not be done until the funds are allocated, but we can't wait on that."

Representatives of several farms in the Lexington area told similar tales of destruction.

"Initially, we were hit real hard and lost electricity all over the farm," said Frank Taylor of Taylor Made Farm in Nicholasville. "We've got it all back now, but we lost a lot of trees. You couldn't pass from one barn to another. The first thing we did was get all the horses in the barn, and there were about 48 hours when we didn't turn out. We got all the roads clear of trees, ice and debris. We had eight chainsaws and four or five dump wagons going at a time to clear the road. That took us a couple of days. We had several foals during that time and we had to foal [using] flashlights. We had generators going some places. But with the horses, we didn't have any injuries because [of the storm]."

Damon Thayer--who handles advertising and media relations for Millennium Farms in Lexington, Ramsey Farm in Nicholasville and Richland Hills Farm in Midway--said all three of his clients' properties require a "major clean-up effort."

"The cover over [the Millennium Farms] Equi-ciser collapsed and half the farm is still without power," Thayer said. "The power didn't go out until this weekend. We're functioning--we've got power in the office and we're taking calls for stallion bookings. One of my other clients, Ramsey Farm, lost power all of last week, and just had power restored in the last day or two. Another one of my clients, Richland Hills, lost power in about half the barns, but the main office was able to maintain electricity."

Airdrie Stud in Midway has lagged other farms when it comes to power restoration. "The power has been down since Tuesday, and we still don't have it back on in four or five barns," said Tim Thornton, general manager of Airdrie. "We don't understand why it can't come on. It's on all around us, but it's not on here. It makes it a real problem as far as frozen water and getting water to horses. I've got a lot of busted pipes."

Thornton hopes Thoroughbred farms will qualify for disaster relief funds. "Everybody could use some help, especially the small breeders," he said. "There are a lot of extra costs with the clean-up."

Ric Waldman, manager of stallion operations for Overbrook Farm in Lexington, concurred.

"We're an agricultural industry," Waldman said. "And if there is federal aid for disasters to the agriculture community, we should be eligible for it."

Even in the depressed days of 1994, when only one yearling made more than a million dollars, there was still huge interest when an 18-year-old broodmare came under the hammer at Keeneland. The mare in question was that extraordinary producer Fall Aspen, and it took a bid of \$2.4 million from John Magnier to secure her.

The Grade I-winning daughter of Pretense had already staked her claim to being the most accomplished broodmare of recent decades, with her record standing at seven group or graded winners from her first 10 foals of racing age.

Fall Aspen's sale came just a couple of days after her son Timber Country had added the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile to his earlier success in the GI Champagne S. Fall Aspen therefore became a shoo-in for the title of 1994 Broodmare of the Year, but she wasn't finished yet.

Fall Aspen was unlucky not to notch up her eighth graded winner with her 1993 foal Prince of Thieves, who died soon after his very close second in the GII Lexington S. and his good third in the Kentucky Derby. Bianconi, Fall Aspen's first foal for her new owners, succeeded where Prince of Thieves had failed, becoming her eighth individual group winner when he took the G2 Diadem S. in 1998.

Since then, Fall Aspen's daughters and granddaughters have produced a string of important winners. Her Grade II winner Colorado Dancer arguably takes pride of place, as the dam of the exceptional Dubai Millennium, but Colorado Dancer faced stiff competition from the likes of Dance of Leaves and Elle Seule.

Elle Seule, a Grade II winner by Exclusive Native, proved a worthy daughter of Fall Aspen. Not only did she become the dam of three group winners, including two Group 1 winners, but she also produced the dam of another Group 1 winner. Both of her Group 1 winners, the Irish 1000 Guineas winner Mehthaaf and the July Cup winner Elnadim, were by sons of Northern Dancer and, as a son of Danzig, Elnadim was a three-parts brother to Fall Aspen's fast sons Hamas and Bianconi.

This relationship to Hamas was to prove something of a thorn in Elnadim's side. Winner of the G1 July Cup in 1993, five years before Elnadim landed the same prestigious race, Hamas retired to the Derrinstown Stud of his owner, Sheikh Hamdan. Unfortunately he struggled to make an impact, his only group winner being Mitcham, winner of the G2 King's Stand S. in 1999.

Although Elnadim was a better racehorse than his close relative, both at three and four, would breeders in Britain or Ireland be prepared to give him a fair chance after Hamas's disappointing results? His connections decided to send him to the States towards the end of 1998, initially to receive treatment for micro-fractures in his hind pasterns. The possibility of racing him in the States wasn't ruled out and he duly returned to action for three races in 2000, but without recapturing his best form.

The next step for Elnadim was to stand at Shadwell's Kentucky branch, where he met a distinctly lukewarm reception at a fee of \$15,000.

With only 19 foals in that crop, Elnadim was immediately switched to Derrinstown. Although the move revived breeders' interest in him, it eventually began to fade, to the extent that he has only 30 foals in his 2006 crop and a mere five in his 2007 crop.

Despite all his vicissitudes, Elnadim has shown himself to be worthy of much stronger support than he has generally received--especially at the €6,000 fee he is advertised at for 2009. There are only 229 foals in his first five Northern Hemisphere crops, but he increased his number of graded/group winners to six when his ex-Irish daughter Pasar Silbano proved too fast for her opponents (most of whom received six pounds) in the GIII La Habra S. at Santa Anita Sunday.

Pasar Silbano is typical of Elnadim's good runners in that she showed a lot of ability as a two-year-old, winning four of her six starts in Ireland. Although she is one of only 30 foals in Elnadim's 2006 crop, it has also produced Elnawin, conqueror of Square Eddie in the G3 Sirenia S., and three other black-type performers. Previous crops produced the very useful sprinter Wi Dud (a Group 2 winner at two and also runner-up in the G1 Middle Park S.), Elletelle (G3 Queen Mary S.), Caldra (G3 Autumn S. at two) and the good sprinters Al Qasi and Almuss.

Elnadim certainly has the potential to be one of the best stallions from the Fall Aspen family. There has been the occasional disappointment apart from Hamas, such as Medaaly and Bianconi, but Fort Wood regularly ranks among the leading sires in South Africa.

Circumstances have made it hard to assess several of the family's other stallions. Charnwood Forest died at the age of 10, but not before he'd sired the high-class international miler Firebreak, and Dubai Millennium left three group-winning sons in Dubawi, Echo of Light and Belenus, despite dying during his first season. Timber Country also had his moments, with Group 1 winners in Japan, Australia and the U.S. (that high-class filly Balletto, who was sired during Timber Country's time in the UAE).

With only five juveniles in his current crop of two-year-olds, Elnadim won't find it easy to add significantly to his record in 2009, but I expect Pasar Silbano to continue being a good ambassador for this extremely well-related stallion.

He was third in the 2006 GI Eddie Read H. and GI Shoemaker Breeders' Cup Mile, as well as in the 2007 GI Frank E Kilroe Mile H. On the board in 12 of 23 starts, the seven-year-old retired with six wins and earnings of \$663,428. "Silent Name is by Sunday Silence and out of a Danehill mare, he has a powerhouse pedigree and is the only multiple Group 1 miler by Sunday Silence at stud in North America," Stronach added. "He won graded stakes on turf and Polytrack, and that kind of ability will serve us very well in the Canadian market."

### ELUSIVE CITY COLT TOPS KARAKA FINALE

The two-day Festival Sale wrapped up in Karaka yesterday, concluding New Zealand Bloodstock's National Yearling Sales Series. It was the young Elusive Quality sire Elusive City who provided the top price for the second day in a row when a son, catalogued as [Lot 1636](#), was knocked down to David Cole for NZ\$77,500. The colt was offered by Haunui Farm and was produced by the unraced Dream Well (Fr) mare Contemplate (NZ).

The Festival Sale followed the trend set by the Premier and Select Sales throughout last week, with good competition on the better offerings, and the sale maintained reasonably well given the current international economic woes.

Total gross for the Festival Sale was NZ\$4,498,700, down 11 percent on last year's turnover of NZ\$5,073,850. With 375 of the 526 horses sold, the clearance rate was a very solid 81 percent. Cumulative average was NZ\$11,997, down 29 percent on a record NZ\$16,857 in 2008, with a healthy median of NZ\$10,000 (down 17 percent from \$12,000 in 2008).

New Zealand Bloodstock Managing Director Petrea Vela was pleased with the outcome of the Festival Sale, with final results in line with expectations heading into the week.

"The Festival Sale has fared very well over the past two days, rounding off sales week on a positive note," she said. "There was still good momentum in the ring all day yesterday and today, and many vendors will be relieved that the market held up as well as it did. From the outset, we thought that results in the range of our 2007 figures would be an acceptable result, and we have managed to do that at this session. The 81-percent clearance rate is one of the most pleasing results, and it's a credit to our Festival sale vendors who recognised the importance of meeting the market in order to get the most from the sale."
