

SARATOGA SINNER OFF DERBY TRAIL

Lally Stable's **Saratoga Sinner** (Harlan's Holiday), who earned a 96 Beyer while annexing last Saturday's GIII Holy Bull S., has developed a chip in his left knee and will be sidelined, according to *Daily Racing Form*. "He'll leave for Kentucky this weekend and have surgery," trainer Eddie Kenneally told *DRF*. "If all goes well he should be back for a late summer and fall campaign. It's terrible timing more than anything and hopefully, he'll come back 100 percent. He's worth waiting for." Saratoga Sinner, a \$130,000 KEESEP yearling purchase, closed out his two-year-old campaign with a good third behind Danger to Society (Harlan's Holiday) in a Churchill Downs maiden Nov. 19. The bay earned his diploma at Gulfstream Jan. 7 prior to his score in the Holy Bull.

BREEDERS' CUP TO MAINTAIN \$25.5 MILLION IN CHAMPIONSHIPS PURSES

Following a special meeting Wednesday, the Breeders' Cup Board of Members and Trustees confirmed that the total purses for the 2009 Breeders' Cup World Championships will remain at \$25.5 million. It was also announced that the two-day, 14-race World Championships format would continue. "Today's meetings were very productive and signaled a strong spirit of cooperation within the full Board of Members and Trustees," said Breeders' Cup Chairman William S. Farish, Jr. "Importantly, the actions we took today were unanimously approved by all Trustees in attendance. We understand this is a challenging time for the industry, which makes it especially critical that we work together in a unified fashion. We also want to send a strong signal that the Board has heard our nominators loudly and clearly; and we will continue to support the Stakes Program in the foreseeable future. Our multiple constituents look to the Breeders' Cup to be a strong leader, and we plan to do everything it takes to meet that obligation." The Board also announced that there would be a long-term commitment to funding the Breeders' Cup Stakes program at the current levels beyond 2009.

Asiatic Boy swept through Nad al Sheba's sequence for sophomores in 2007, capped by a 9 1/2-length triumph in the G2 UAE Derby. He returned in 2008 to land the G3 Al Shindagha Sprint in January and, two starts later, was runner-up to Curlin in the G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 29. The bay has not faced the starter since, but trainer Mike de Kock isn't too concerned. "Asiatic Boy has been pleasing us in his work and is ready for a run," he said. "His campaign is geared around the World Cup again, and he will improve for this outing, but he should go well." Also in the field is Godolphin's **My Indy**, who pulled away impressively last out in the G3 Maktoum Challenge-Round 1 Jan. 15. "We were very pleased with My Indy three weeks ago, and he won as we hoped he would," said trainer Saeed bin Suroor. "He had been working like an improved horse before that race and has continued to in good form. We have to be hopeful."

MEC FUNDS MARYLAND SLOTS LICENSE FEE

Magna Entertainment Corp. announced yesterday that it has arranged to have the \$28.5 million license fee necessary to obtain a video lottery terminal license in Maryland placed in escrow in a Maryland bank. MEC's Laurel Racing Association, which Monday submitted a bid for a Maryland slots license, had initially withheld the fee over concerns that the money might not be refunded in the event that MEC does not receive the license, or receives the license, but is unable to complete the VLT facility project. Laurel is located in Anne Arundel County, the only county that drew two competing bids for slots. Also submitting a proposal for the area was PPE Casino Resorts Maryland LLC, an offshoot of the real estate developer and entertainment operator Cordish Companies.

In a press release, MEC stated yesterday, "Laurel Racing has asked the Maryland VLT Facility Location Commission to undertake that it will utilize its discretionary authority to refund the Initial License Fee in the event Laurel Racing is granted a VLT License, but is unable to obtain all proper zoning and permits necessary for the operation of a video lottery terminal facility at Laurel Racing's Anne Arundel location. Provided the Commission agrees to refund the Initial License Fee, such fee [and all interest earned] will be paid to the Commission."

There had been concerns that the failure to pay the licensing fee would jeopardize Magna's bid. Maryland lawmakers have expressed serious disappointment with the results of the bidding process. It had been anticipated that at least a dozen entities might submit bids, and that there would be requests for all 15,000 slot machines authorized by the referendum. In fact, according to figures released Tuesday by the Video Lottery Facility Location Commission, there were only six bids for the five potential slots locations. The initial proposals would put a maximum of 7,300 VLTs in operation, with final totals reaching no more than 14,000. It is projected that VLT facilities will open for business in 2011.

NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL



THREE-YEAR DEPRECIATION NOW AVAILABLE FOR ALL RACEHORSES

The New Year has brought with it a new, faster depreciation schedule for young racehorses. Now all yearlings and two-year-olds placed in service in 2009 can be depreciated using a 3-year schedule (which is spread over 4 tax years). Before 2009, racehorses 24 months old or younger from the foaling date when placed in service had to be depreciated over 7 years. The change means that now all racehorses are depreciated using the 3-year schedule regardless of how old they are when placed in service.

Under the new schedule, 62.5% of the cost of a yearling can be written off in the first two years, which is more than twice as much as the write off for the first two years before 2009. The new provision is effective through 2013, unless extended by Congress. For more details, [click here.](#)

Broodmares are not affected by the change. Younger broodmares (those 12 years from their foaling date and younger) continue to be depreciated using a 7-year schedule, while older broodmares (over 12 years from their foaling date) continue to be depreciated using the 3-year schedule.
