## MY MY: INDY TAKES ROUND TWO

Godolphin's **My Indy (Arg)** (Indygo Shiner) continued in his progressive form Thursday night at Nad Al Sheba, giving his owners a fourth victory in the G3 Maktoum Challenge Round 2. Winner of his two starts in Argentina, including a Group 2 affair in October 2007, the striking dark bay made three starts at last year's Carnival, finishing behind the talented Honour Devil (Arg)

(Honour and Glory) when runner-up in a Jan. 24 allowance, third in the G3 UAE 2000 Guineas Feb. 14 and sixth in the Mar. 29 G2 UAE Derby. He made a sparkling return from a 10-month absence in his latest, driving clear to a 5 3/4-

length victory in Round 1 of the G3 Maktoum Challenge over 1600 meters Jan. 15. My Indy broke alertly and raced three paths off the rail as **Asiatic Boy (Arg)** (Not For Sale), who was closest to Curlin in last year's G1 Dubai World Cup, raced freely up front in tandem with **Military Power (GB)** (Dubai Destination). Asiatic Boy took the lead into the lane, but, having been softened up by the duel yielded, grudgingly, as Happy Boy (Brz) (Ski Champ) made strides at the rail to cut down My Indy's winning margin to three-parts of a length. "That was a very pleasing effort and this horse has really improved over the winter," commented winning trainer Saeed bin Suroor. ## SQUARE EDDIE TO MISS SOUTHWEST

**Square Eddie** (Smart Strike) will miss an intended engagement in the GIII Southwest S. Feb. 16 because of sore shins, according to published reports Thursday. The chestnut, who missed a scheduled trip to Arkansas yesterday after he was diagnosed Wednesday, is expected to miss two weeks of training. In his most recent start, the J. Paul Reddam-owned colt finished second behind The Pamplemousse (Kafwain) in the GIII San Rafael S. at Santa Anita Jan. 17. Winner of the GI Breeders' Futurity S. at Keeneland last fall, the Canadian-bred colt rounded out the season with a runner-up finish behind subsequent juvenile champ Midshipman (Unbridled's Song) in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Santa Anita Oct. 25.

In spite of a pedigree that absolutely screams grass, Deem made her three starts in front of the home crowd in Saudi Arabia, winning her nine-furlong debut by three lengths Oct. 17 before adding open-length scores in allowance company Nov. 14 and Dec. 26. Trying the turf for the first time, the homebred filly was content to settle off the pace, from which vantage point Belmont S. and Breeders' Cup Classic winning jockey Fernando Jara could monitor the every move of favored Front House. The latter inherited the lead when stablemate Inca Noble (Arg) (Ride the Rails) faded tamely up front, but could not quicken with the eventual winner and settled for a second-place effort. Front House was having her first start since winning the G2 Gold Circle Oaks in South Africa last July 26. **SEEKING REVENGE IN THE LEWIS**

David Lanzman, best known as the owner of champion sprinter Squirtle Squirt, came to the Barretts May sale last year prepared to sell his homebred colt **I Want Revenge** (Stephen Got Even). The colt breezed an eighth in :10 2/5 at the preview, a good if unspectacular work for a horse bred for distance, and so Lanzman set the reserve just under \$100,000--a realistic number, he thought. When **I Want Revenge** stepped into the ring and bidding quickly shot up to \$95,000, Lanzman figured he was just seconds away from congratulating the colt's new owner.

"I saw the guy who was bidding across from me, and I was just waiting for him to raise his hand one more time, and I was done," said Lanzman. "And he just didn't. So I bought the horse back for \$95,000."

Sometimes the breaks go your way, and for Lanzman, that's been the case. **I Want Revenge**, now in trainer Jeff Mullins's barn, is already a winner of over \$190,000 and came just a nose short of beating **Pioneerof the Nile** (Empire Maker) in the GI CashCall Futurity Dec. 20. This Saturday, he'll get another shot at **Pioneerof the Nile** in the \$200,000, GI Robert B. Lewis S. at Santa Anita.

"He's progressed quite a bit since the CashCall," Lanzman said Tuesday. "I don't usually go to workouts, but I went down to see him the other day [Jan. 26] when he worked seven-eighths. He worked in 1:23 and change [a best-of-four 1:23 3/5]. I looked at Jeff afterwards and said, 'What do you think?' He said, 'I've got goosebumps.'" **cont. p4**

Lanzman, a native of Pennsylvania who sang in a number of rock bands in the 1970s and early '80s, first got into racing as a teenager, when he would sneak into Hollywood Park. Later, he would own a piece of a few claimers, but it wasn't until a few years after

launching a successful real estate mortgage company, Nationwide Mortgage Consultants, that he decided to get more serious about the sport. Lanzman targeted two-year-olds in training, and in 1999, he purchased his first horse. A year later, in his second visit to the sales at Barretts March, he saw a

handsome son of Marquetry in the walking ring and was impressed. Lanzman had an advisor look at the horse. He was impressed, too. Lanzman thought the horse, then named Marque the Code, could bring as much as \$150,000, and was surprised when he signed the winning ticket for just \$25,000. There was a reason, it turned out.

"He had a chip in his knee the size of your thumb," he related in 2001. "Apparently, I was the only one at the sale that didn't know that."

It was another break, literally, that went Lanzman's way. Lanzman renamed the colt Squirtle Squirt, after his son Blair's favorite Pokemon character, and two months after the sale he began a four-race winning skein that was capped with a victory in the GIII Hollywood Juvenile Championship S.

Squirtle Squirt emerged as the top sprinter in the land the next year as a three-year-old of 2001, taking the GI King's Bishop S. over the ill-fated Illusioned and City Zip, and defeating Xtra Heat in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint. Squirtle Squirt was honored as champion sprinter that year.

Lanzman said his run with Squirtle Squirt produced countless great memories and stories, not a few involving the Squirtle Squirt's trainer, Hall of Famer Bobby Frankel, who conditioned Squirtle Squirt in the second half of his career.

"Being with Frankel was a story in itself," Lanzman laughed. "At the Breeders' Cup, Bobby ran seven, including Flute, You and Aptitude, and we were the only one that won. Needless to say, he stayed in the hotel that night. He's a character. I've got nothing bad to say about him at all. You know what you're going to get when you go into that relationship."

Lanzman related another story. "We usually travel with a big group--we like to have fun when we run--but when we ran in the Vosburgh in New York [with Squirtle Squirt in 2001], it was at the last minute. We only entered because we knew it was going to come up a five-horse field. So my wife and I traveled alone to that race. Squirtle Squirt was like 1-2 that day. We walked into the paddock, and Bobby's standing there, and my wife goes and hugs him and says, 'Hey Bobby, if we win, do you want to go out for dinner after the races?' And he just looked at her and said, 'No.' He didn't think about it or anything..."

Squirtle Squirt lost the Vosburgh battle to Left Bank, but wound up winning the war when he captured the Breeders' Cup Sprint in his next outing. Squirtle Squirt raced twice more at four before being sold to Japanese interests to stand stud.

"The whole thing was a dream," Lanzman added. "To decide I was going to buy two-year-olds in training, and then to get that horse the next year? It was surreal--this can't really be happening."

Since his run with Squirtle Squirt, Lanzman, a resident of Beverly Hills, has maintained a racing stable in Southern California. He has employed a few different trainers over the years, but for the last three has kept the majority of his runners with Mullins. Lanzman says he's been impressed with Mullins's hands-on approach.

"I joke around that if the stewards came down with a new rule that there could be no more grooms, no more valets, no more nothing--the trainer has to do everything--he'd be the only one on the backstretch who wouldn't be looking for a job," said Lanzman.

Together, Lanzman and Mullins have enjoyed some success. Probably their best horse has been Seven Nation Army (General Meeting), who beat Da Stoops (Distorted Humor) in a \$100,000 Cal-bred stakes in 2006.

One of Lanzman's runners who Mullins didn't train was I Want Revenge's dam Meguial (Arg), a mare by Roy who was Group 1-placed in Argentina before being purchased privately by Lanzman and shipped to the U.S. for the 2003 season.

"She was actually still eligible for a first-level allowance, and in her first start here she was bet down from 6-1 to 2-1, I think," said Lanzman. "Everybody that saw her work knew about her, and she won as easy as you could win. We put her in a restricted stakes next time and again she got bet way down, but she came out of the race with an ankle. We ran her four or five more times, but she was never able to fulfil her potential because of the ankle. My trainer told me that I was going to have to drop her in for a tag or retire her, and I said 'I'm not running her for a tag.' I wasn't in breeding at all and tried to sell her, but nobody offered me more than \$75,000 for her. She was beautiful, so I thought that I'd try my hand in the breeding business."

Meguial got off to a slow start as a broodmare. Her first foal, a colt by Doneraile Court named The Royals Court, broke his maiden for a \$12,5000 tag at Golden Gate and is currently plying his trade in the lower claiming ranks at Portland Meadows. Meguial did better next out, however, producing I Want Revenge to the cover of Stephen Got Even.

Asked how he decided on the mating, Lanzman explained, "I spent about 40 hours on the eNicks site, and, for the money, Stephen Got Even was just off the charts. He just ranked higher than everybody, and he was standing for nothing. I think he was \$10,000 at the time."

Meguial is also the dam of a colt by Thunder Gulch--I Want Noise--who's now two, and last spring had a filly by Tale of the Cat. Lanzman, who boards his mares at John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Farm in Kentucky, owns both. Unfortunately for him, however, has since parted ways with Meguial.

"Last year, somebody called me from out of nowhere and offered me \$50,000 for the mare," he said. "So I called my people at Hill 'n' Dale and called my people here in California, and they said, 'We have no idea why they want her.' So I sold her. I just figured, with the economy the way it is, all right, sure, why not?"

At the time, I Want Revenge hadn't even been broken. When he was sent to Dave Showalter and Sommer Smith's NexStar Ranch in California to receive his early training, however, the early reports were overwhelmingly positive. That gave Lanzman the confidence to hold onto I Want Revenge following the Barretts sale, and the colt made his debut at Hollywood in July. He ran third that day sprinting five panels, and came back to finish third again in two more sprint races.

"From the time he worked a half mile, we knew that he wanted to go two turns," said Lanzman. "But he battled shins all summer. We kept wanting to run him long, but the shins would knock us back and we'd have to sprint him again."

I Want Revenge finally got his chance to run long in a Hollywood maiden Oct. 29 and lived up to expectations, cruising gate-to-wire and winning by a length.

"When we stretched him out, he was 1-2, so it's not like we were geniuses," said Lanzman. "Everybody could see on paper that that's what he wanted to do. If he maiden win was a workout, they would have deemed it 'breezing.' It was a pure gallop for a mile and a sixteenth."

I Want Revenge was given a 6-1 chance in the CashCall and nearly pulled off the slight upset. Lanzman said he wasn't surprised with I Want Revenge's effort.

"But it was nice, because it re-affirmed our confidence in the horse," he said.

As an aside, Lanzman added that the colt's strong resemblance to his dam helped him pick up I Want Revenge in the race.

"It's like we cloned the mare," he said. "He looks exactly like her, even the markings on his face. When he ran in the CashCall, we were up in the Director's Room at Hollywood. And when we went down to the paddock I forgot my glasses, so I lost my horse in the race. The first time I was able to pick him out was when he came between horses and I saw that face."-L Marquardt

Reigning champion juvenile filly **Stardom Bound** (Tapit) will visit champion sophomore colt **Big Brown** (Boundary) following her retirement from racing, according to a Three Chimneys release yesterday. The winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies is one of 19 IEAH-owned mares slated to visit the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. hero. Also scheduled to visit Big Brown are IEAH and partners-owned GISWs Irish Smoke

(Smoke Glacken) and Wonder Lady Anne L (Real Quiet); and GSWs Ms Brookski (Montbrook) and Shaggy Mane (Bertrando). "Big Brown's book of mares this year has a lot of quality," said Case Clay, president of Three Chimneys Farm. "We're very pleased with the mare support by breeders as well as the shareholders. He was very well received at our open house this November and the quality started coming in after breeders saw him up close." Other mares committed to Big Brown for the 2009 breeding season are D'Enough, dam of D'Wildcat (GI); La Gueriere, Grade I winner and dam of Lasting Approval (GII); Mistical Bel, dam of Mistical Plan (GII); Ivanavinalot (GII); Hopes and Fears, a full sister to multiple Grade I winners Peaks and Valleys and Three Chimneys-owned mare Santaria, dam of Grade II winner Air Commander and multiple Grade II winner and multiple track record setter Medallist.

**Old Fashioned Earns Bullet in Southwest Tune-Up...**

**Old Fashioned** (Unbridled's Song), the dominant winner of the GII Remsen S. Nov. 29, earned a bullet for his :48 2/5 four-furlong move over the Oaklawn oval Thursday. The undefeated gray will be the likely favorite in the \$100,000 GIII Southwest S. at Oaklawn Feb. 16. "He liked the track, and we didn't want another Hard Spun (Danzig) scenario where he didn't like the track," explained trainer Larry Jones. "I'm happy with the work; it was like an open gallop for him. And he did everything easy. This work puts him ahead of the game." The one-mile Southwest will be a cutback in distance for Old Fashioned as the Remsen was contested at 1 1/8 miles.

**ORR STAKES PUSHED BACK TO SUNDAY** Officials at the Melbourne Racing Club have decided to cancel all racing in the state on Saturday, as temperatures during an ongoing heatwave are forecast to exceed 40 degrees Celsius (104 Fahrenheit) in many regions. The G1 C.F. Orr S., originally scheduled for Saturday, has been rerouted for the Sunday program at Caulfield. "Moving the meeting to Sunday is in the best interests of all participants," MRC Chief Executive Warran Brown told *Australian Associated Press*. "There were a few options available to us that we were considering in the last day or so since we learnt of the forecast, but the common-sense approach was to avoid the oppressive conditions that are expected on Saturday in the interests of all concerned." Race times at Caulfield on Sunday have been altered to accommodate other meetings in Victoria. Post time for the Orr, the day's seventh race, is set for 4:18 p.m.

Gatsas Thoroughbreds began operation in 1997 and the family's success soon attracted people who wanted to share in the excitement of racehorse ownership. In 2001, Gatsas Thoroughbreds expanded into the partnership group Sovereign Stable, with 15 horses and some 150 partners nationwide.

The Gatsas family campaigned millionaire and graded stakes winner Gander (Cormorant), as well as graded stakes winner Shadow Caster (Future Storm).

"We owned some horses as a family and had a lot of success early on," Sovereign Stable President Matt Gatsas recalled. "When we started

to do well, there were some friends that wanted to get in and we grew it and now we're national. We're basically looking for partners throughout the country who want to run at the top level."

Sovereign Stable allows investors to pick and choose which horses they want to be involved with.

"We go out and buy the horses, put out a brochure and people call us on horses that they want," Gatsas explained. "There are people who buy every one of them."

The partnership attracts people with various levels of experience within the racing industry.

"A lot of people are newcomers and there are some experienced people--there is a wide range," Gatsas said. "A lot of people are in the same boat that we are, looking to be in the partnership world. If they are experienced, they are usually experienced in the partnership world. We do get some people, just a few, who were in the business on their own."

Sovereign Stable acquires the majority of its runners at public auction and most come from two-year-old sales.

"We were in the yearling business a little bit, but we've almost exclusively gone to the two-year-old sales now," Gatsas said.

Asked about the advantages of buying at two-year-old auctions, Gatsas said, "When you get new people into the game and their friends ask, 'When is he going to run?', likely the last thing they want to say is, 'Well, in a year and a half or so.' So that's one reason. The other reason is our success in the last three or four years buying at the two-year-old sales. Not that our yearling success wasn't good, but our two-year-old success has been just over the top. And you get a chance to see them move. So we're just trying to limit the mistakes we make."

Sovereign Stable enjoyed another stakes win Wednesday at Aqueduct when **Awesome I Am** (Awesome Again) took the Get Lucky S. at Aqueduct. It was the second straight stakes victory for the four-year-old filly, who also won the Jan. 2 Restored Hope S. and was third in last year's GI Gazelle S.

Sovereign Stable purchased Awesome I Am as a two-year-old for \$100,000 at the 2007 OBS March sale.

Gatsas said he was attracted to the filly from the beginning. "The way she moved, was obviously one thing that we liked about her," he said. "And she came from a great farm in Ocala Stud--we always like buying off those guys if we can. Then, on top of her movement and her time, she just had something about her. She wanted to be a good horse. There is always that comment that no one can explain, but every good horse when you go see them, you just say, 'She just had something about her.' You can't explain it. I guess that's why we buy them all. But she just always had something that drew attention to herself, for us at least."

Sovereign Stable has maintained a steady level of horses over the years, but Gatsas admitted he wouldn't mind seeing the stable expand.

"We've been staying in the 10-15 range, mostly because that's what our partners have been able to handle," he said. "But we're always looking for new partners and always looking to expand. We'd like to have a stable of 200 one day."

**WEATHER, CATALOGUE PLAGUE FEBRUARY**

**SALE** Trade was sharply down on last year at Tattersalls' first sale of 2009, the one-day February Sale in a snowbound Newmarket. The 707,100gns turnover dropped by 69 percent, the average fell by 57 percent to 6,928gns and the median dropped by 33 percent to 3,500gns. Three-year-old Sky Gate (Arch), who was bred in the U.S., will return across the Atlantic after topping the day with a 47,000gns price tag. A maiden winner in Britain for trainer Brian Meehan, he was bought by agent Hugo Merry to join Marty Wolfson's stable in Florida. "He should be fine for that sort of money to run in America. Arch can do it on every surface and this colt still looks quite babyish, the sort of horse who should keep improving," said Merry. The top-priced broodmare was eight-year-old Omission (GB) (Green Desert), who is due to foal to Authorized (Ire) next month. Darley's Benoit Jeffroy, acting for Qatari breeder Hamed Alattiyah, paid 39,000gns for the Green Desert mare. At the close of play, Tattersalls chairman Edmond Mahony reflected: "Regardless of the difficult economic climate, we were always going to struggle to match last year's record figures for this sale," he commented. "We had a significantly smaller catalogue and one which, although commercial enough, lacked real quality and certainly had no individual that was going to challenge the 2008 record top price of 450,000gns. In addition, we have had difficult weather conditions to contend with, as illustrated by a number of the stallions being unable to make the National Stud Stallion Parade, but despite the various obstacles there has been a cosmopolitan crowd here today. We have sold horses to places as diverse as Kazakhstan, Libya, Lebanon and Saudi Arabia as well as the more traditional overseas markets, and online bidders have been active throughout the sale.
