FRIESAN FIRE: ANOTHER FOX HILL STAR

Trainer Larry Jones and owner Rick Porter's Fox Hill Farm have finished runner-up in each of the last two runnings of the GI Kentucky Derby, with Hard Spun (Danzig) in 2007 and the late Eight Belles (Unbridled's Song). The team is poised to go one better in 2008. GIII Lecomte S. hero **Friesan Fire** (A.P. Indy), a colt owned in partnership with Vinery Stables, sat a perfect trip just in behind the pace yesterday, overtook a game **Flying Pegasus** (Fusaichi Pegasus) leaving the eighth pole and strode

home a comfortable winner of the GIII Risen Star S. at the Fair Grounds. Friesan Fire became the first horse since Fly Cry in 1994 to win both of the local preps ahead of the Mar. 14 GII Louisiana Derby. And, if you believe the winning conditioner, the best is yet to come. "He's getting better each time he runs," Jones said. "We had some questions with him that had to be answered and he did that today. Hopefully, it will be smooth sailing from now on. We still haven't gotten to the bottom of this horse, but we're going to shoot for the Louisiana Derby next month now." **Cont. p2**

STARDOM BOUNDS HOME IN LAS VIRGENES

The champ is back. It may not have come with the same overwhelming dominance, but, making her first start for IEAH Stables and partners and trainer Bobby Frankel, **Stardom Bound** (Tapit) was uncustomarily buried down on the inside for the first six furlongs of the GI Las Virgenes S., then accelerated when regular rider Mike Smith pointed her at daylight five off the rail. She was roused to the front outside of **Saucey Evening** (In Excess {Ire}) in upper stretch and held on late as Haka (Dynaformer) closed from behind. The victory has IEAH principle Mike Iavarone thinking big. "I don't see why she wouldn't go on [and face the boys in the GI Santa Anita Derby Apr. 4]. I don't know what else she has to prove against the girls. I'll talk it over with Bobby, but I think that's what we want. I think that's what racing wants." **Cont. p2**

Catching Fire...

Third in the seven-furlong GII Futurity S. at Belmont Sept. 13 and fourth in the GIII Nashua S. over a one-turn mile at Aqueduct Nov. 2, Friesan Fire was the 2-5 chalk in a two-turn allowance Dec. 18, but succumbed to a late run from **Uno Mas** (Macho Uno) and settled for second. Undeterred by the defeat, trainer Larry Jones pointed the bay colt to the Jan. 10 GIII Lecomte S. over the unique one-mile configuration at the Fair Grounds, and he responded to the task, edging away to score by 1 1/2 lengths from the well-regarded Patena (Seeking the Gold) and **Au Moon** (Malibu Moon). Forwardly placed in the Risen Star within easy striking distance as stablemate **It Happened Again** (Proud Citizen) showed the way, Friesan Fire was blocked briefly behind a wall of horses, while Flying Pegasus, wide throughout, raced to the front as they turned for home. But Friesan Fire had all the answers, overtaking the GII Futurity S. runner-up before edging clear. Race favorite **Giant Oak** (Giant's Causeway) had nothing go his way. Slow into stride, the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. second-place finisher pulled jockey Edgar Prado into the teeth of the pace down the backstretch. Blocked for a run as they cornered, it was far too late when he got out, and he did exceedingly well to be fifth, beaten under six lengths. Runner-up in her first two career outings, including the GII Sorrento S. at Del Mar Aug. 6, Stardom Bound quite literally burst onto the scene in the Sept. 1 GI Del Mar Debutante, bolting home from second-last to score by a decisive 4 1/4 lengths. Stretched to two turns for the first time in the GI Oak Leaf S. Sept. 27, she employed a similarly devastating turn of speed to swoop past all rivals en route to a 3 1/2-length victory. She made 8-5 favoritism look like a gift in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies in her freshman finale, charging five wide on the turn before outstaying Dream Empress (Bernstein) for a 1 1/2-length score and cementing her status as champion of her generation. Stardom Bound dropped back to near the tail of the Las Virgenes field early on, but grabbed the bit and pulled Mike Smith up the rail on the backstretch. Unable to utilize her patented move this time around, she found a split five paths off the rail in upper stretch and accelerated powerfully to win comfortably in the end. "I was actually glad to be bottled up really, because I didn't want to ask her to run too early," Smith commented. "I figured if I stayed stuck, something would probably open up by the eighth pole. SMILES AND SMILES FOR 'NILE

Spun six or seven wide into the Santa Anita stretch, there seemed very little chance that Zayat Stables' homebred **Pioneerof the Nile** (Empire Maker) could find his way to the wire first in yesterday's GII Robert B.

Lewis S. But, with a final sixteenth of a mile in a devastating :5 2/5, the striking dark bay was along to hand a game **Papa Clem** (Smart Strike) a half-length defeat. **I Want Revenge** (Stephen Got Even), the 2-1 second choice behind **Pioneerof the Nile**, was another length back in third. With a pair of

stakes scores on synthetic and having no previous dirt experience, what's next for the winner? "I think I'm going to leave him here [for the Santa Anita Derby Apr. 4], because he likes it here and he trains well here. If he likes the dirt, he'll like the dirt. I can't force him to like the dirt, but I think he's going to like it, the way he moves over it, and the way he ran at Hollywood. That's more of a dirt course, anyway.

Tale of Two Races...

A solid fifth behind **Midshipman** (Unbridled's Song) in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Oct. 25, **Pioneerof the Nile** was piloted for the first time by Garrett Gomez in the Dec. 20 GI CashCall Futurity and the colt got the job done--almost in spite of himself--scoring by a desperate nose from **I Want Revenge**. The latter was out for just that Saturday afternoon and sat the much better trip, stalking from third, while **Pioneerof the Nile** raced in sixth to the far turn. The favorite began an advance at the three-eighths, but was pocketed briefly. Once extricated, he swung wide and looked to have left himself too much to do, but leveled out and flew home. "Coming to the eighth pole I was thinking I might be a bad third and all of a sudden he kicked it in," Gomez explained. "He's a big, long-striding horse and it's nice to see that he faced some adversity today and he overcame it."

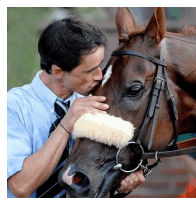

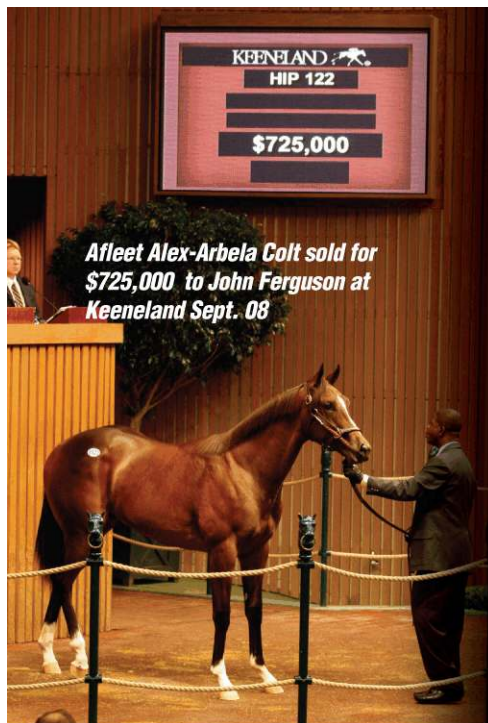

A Grade III winner on turf early last year, Cowboy Cal made a successful transition to Polytrack in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S., leading nearly every yard before getting caught by stablemate Monba (Maria's Mon). Rested off a ninth in the GI Kentucky Derby May 3, he returned to Keeneland Oct. 12 and was put

up to the win in the grassy Bryan Station S. Second, beaten 3/4 of a length to Court Vision (Gulch) in the GI Hollywood Derby across town Nov. 30, he tried this synthetic surface for the first time in the Jan. 10 GII San Pasqual H. and was able to gut out a nose victory. Settled just

off the pace of the free-wheeling Wishful Tomcat (Tactical Cat) through a half in :48.10 and three-quarters in 1:12.10, Cowboy Cal took aim on that foe inside the final furlong and held off the fast-finishing Blue Exit for the victory. The first eight home were covered by about two lengths. "He relaxed a little better for me than he did the other day [in the San Pasqual], but he still pulls really hard," said winning jockey John Velazquez. "We had a good trip and down the lane when he passed [Wishful Tomcat], he had to dig in again because those other horses were coming on the outside." THIS WEEK IN HISTORY...

February 8, 1941...Whirlaway began his three-year-old season with a win in a six-furlong allowance race at Hialeah.

February 9, 1940...After a year's absence from competition, Seabiscuit, champion handicap horse of 1937 and 1938, returned to racing at Santa Anita, where he finished third in a handicap race. Seabiscuit ran three more races in 1940, concluding his career with a win in the Santa Anita H.

February 9, 1974...Jockey Chris McCarron rode his first winner, a five-year-old gelding named Ezev, at Bowie Racecourse. By year's end, McCarron had established a then-record number of winners for a single season: 546. Fifteen years later, on Nov. 30, 1989, jockey Kent Desormeaux eclipsed that mark.

February 11, 1933...The Jockey Club released data showing that as of 1932, the U.S. had surpassed Great Britain and Ireland in foal production for the first time to become the world's leading producer of Thoroughbreds.

February 11, 1995...1994 Horse of the Year Holy Bull injured his left front leg during the running of the Donn Handicap at Gulfstream Park and subsequently was retired to stud at Jonabell Farm.

February 12, 1981...Julie Krone rode her first career winner, a \$3,500 claimer named Lord Farkle, who was owned and trained by Les St. Leon, in the sixth race at Tampa Bay Downs.

February 14, 1966...Buckpasser suffered the only defeat of his three-year-old season, finishing second in a non-betting race, the Black Caesar Purse, at Hialeah. He went on to win 13 straight races in 1966, 12 of them stakes, but missed the Triple Crown due to injury.

What is your biggest accomplishment since you've been involved in the business? My wife and I have bred numerous stake horses, but the real accomplishment has been in helping some horses overcome injury-related problems that allow them to live out a useful life.

How many horses do you own? Forty, give or take a few.

Of all the horses you've been around, who has been your favorite? Thoroughbred wise, Platinum Tiara, one of my son's horses that ran second in the Breeders' Cup, and has continued to produce fine foals and race horses. My wife had a Chincoteague pony who Marguerite Henry wrote a book about, "Mistys Twilight." Twilight lived to be 32, just recently passing this summer, but the last six years of her life she was a special horse to the many visitors who came to see her. Twilight herself was special because she had foundered, but she continued to play with the visiting children.

Who was your biggest idol growing up? Walter Payton of the Chicago Bears.

If you could have dinner with one historical figure, it would be... Dwight D. Eisenhower. He was both a dedicated man to his country, and in later life, a man who showed he could lead his country.

Favorite vacation spot? The USA. There are so many great places to visit and see. How could anybody fail to see the beauty?

Favorite food or meal? Italian.

What's the funniest movie you've ever seen? Pink Panther.

Favorite sport besides racing? Football and baseball.

Favorite sports figure and why? Seattle Slew. When racing needed a push from behind, the winner of the Triple Crown gave us a push and also helped to unite the horse industry. We need another one soon.

Texas Toyco LLC's **Loch Dubh** (Friends Lake), winner of the Jan. 3 Turfway Prevue S. last time out, will make his next appearance in the Feb. 16 GIII Southwest S. at Oaklawn Park. Off the board in his first three outings, the \$42,000 KEESOP yearling was claimed for \$15,000 after a 7 1/4-length maiden win at Churchill Nov. 14. He followed up with a five-length allowance tally at Mountaineer Dec. 15 and made it three in a row at Turfway. "He could not be doing any better--I'm very happy with the way he has trained up to the Southwest," trainer Jeff Talley said. "He really loves the track, and I'm very happy with everything he has done." The bay worked five furlongs in a bullet 1:01 at Oaklawn Feb. 1. He stretches out to a flat mile. "We are going to try him around two turns and see how that goes, but I don't think he should have any problems," Talley remarked. "It is that time of year where, if you have a three-year-old with some ability, you want to give him a shot at the Kentucky Derby, and that's what we are doing with Loch Dubh. I'm excited about the Southwest."

Dirt vs. Synthetic at Florida Premier 2-Y-O Sales: No Difference in Racing Performance--by Bob Fierro

Since many of North America's top tracks have installed synthetic tracks, questions have arisen as to whether horses that breeze at 2-year-old sales conducted on synthetic surfaces have an advantage over those that breeze at sales held on dirt tracks—and vice-versa.

DataTrack International, which provides a service (*BreezeFigs*) at these sales that quantifies speed, stride length and motion analysis studied the results of the first two sales of 2008 to seek general answers (the service is also offered as a tool by *Daily Racing Form* for online handicappers). The two sales are the premier events in Florida--the Ocala Breeders' Select sale, which is conducted on a synthetic track in Ocala in mid February; and the Fasig-Tipton Select sale which is conducted on a dirt track at Calder Racecourse in Miami at the end of February.

The study followed the 2008 (2-year-old) racing careers of horses that breezed at least once at each of the sales, regardless of whether the horse was sold. Two categories were established for each sale: All starters that did not earn black type in 2008, and all starters that earned black type. The reason was to see if quality affected success rates.

The study finds virtually no difference in the winning rates on any surface for horses that breezed at either Ocala or Calder, i.e., horses that breezed on either kind of track won races or earned black type at the same basic frequencies on all racetrack surfaces. The results are consistent despite the fact that the Ocala sale has fewer horses, and therefore fewer starters, than the Fasig-Tipton sale.

Of the horses that did not earn black type, 17 of 66 (30 percent) of the Ocala graduates started at least once on a synthetic track and 35 percent of them won. Of the 14 of 83 Fasig-Tipton graduates that made at least one start on a synthetic surface, five of them won (36 percent).

The study conducted on horses that earned black type was on a start-by-start basis--10 from Ocala made 53 total starts and 13 from Fasig-Tipton made 38 total starts. Ironically, all 10 Ocala graduates won, but three of the 13 from Fasig-Tipton earned black type as maidens and did not win in 2008. The study showed that 42 percent of the Ocala starters and 36 percent of the Fasig-Tipton graduates won on synthetic while 15 percent of the Ocala starters and 33 percent of the Fasig-Tipton starters won on the dirt. Results of stakes race success were inconclusive, but several horses from both sales earned black type on both surfaces.
