'OTHERS' FAVORED IN 1ST KY DERBY POOL

Already in its 11th year, the Churchill Downs Kentucky Derby Future Wager began its 2009 run with the mutuel field listed as the 5-2 morning-line favorite in the first of three betting pools. Pool 1 opens tomorrow at noon and runs through 6 p.m. Feb. 15. Churchill Downs handicapper Mike Battaglia installed the 'all others' betting interest ahead of GII Remsen S. winner **Old Fashioned** (Unbridled's Song) and GII Hutcheson S. hero **Capt. Candyman Can** (Candy Ride {Arg}), who are co-favored individual interests at 10-1.

A slew of contenders are listed at 12-1: 2008 juvenile champs **Midshipman** (Unbridled's Song) and **Stardom Bound** (Tapit); GII Lecomte S. and GII Risen Star S. winner **Friesan Fire** (A.P. Indy); GI CashCall Futurity S. and GII Robert B. Lewis S. hero **Pioneerof the Nile** (Empire Maker); GI Champagne S. winner **Vineyard Haven** (Lido Palace {Chi}); and **This Ones for Phil** (Untutttable), victorious in the Sunshine Millions Dash. This Ones For Phil is the lone member of Pool 1 who is not yet nominated to the Kentucky Derby and the Triple Crown. Betting interests in the Kentucky Derby Future Wager pools are selected by a panel that includes Mike Watchmaker, *Daily Racing Form* national handicapper; Brad Free, West Coast correspondent for the *Daily Racing Form*; and John Asher, vice president of racing communications at Churchill Downs. A total of \$1,056,520 was wagered on the three Kentucky Derby Future Wager pools in 2008 as total betting on the wager topped the \$1-million mark for the ninth consecutive time in its 10-year history. KDFW Pool 2 is scheduled for Mar. 12-15 and the third and final pool will be conducted Apr. 2-5. Real-time odds of the KDFW are available on www.kentuckyderby.com.

ONE "HULL" OF A PROSPECT

While the winners of the Gill Risen Star S. and the Gill Silverbulletday S. grabbed all the headlines on the stakes-loaded card at the Fair Grounds Saturday, there was another three-year-old who stamped himself as one to watch after earning his diploma in the nightcap.

Heiligbrodt Racing Stable's **Hull** (Holy Bull--Band Queen, by Chimes Band) hinted ability in the a.m., firing a best-of-29 five-furlong bullet in :59 Jan. 7 and a fastest-of-39 four-furlong move in :47 1/5 Jan. 21. Backed at odds of 5-2, the dark bay broke sharply and vied for the early lead through an opening quarter of :22.20. With Gabriel Saez in the irons, Hull began to shake free on the turn for home, and zigged and zagged his way through the stretch to post an emphatic 4 1/4-length tally.

"We thought he was a good horse, but that was a solid field, and we didn't expect him to run as fast as he did," trainer Dale Romans commented. "I never had a horse run a 99 Beyer [Speed Figure] first time out. I was very impressed with him. He was a little bit green [in the stretch] maybe. We never really had gotten after him, and never had to because he always worked plenty fast enough in the mornings. He probably didn't know what was going on when he was getting hit on. It will do him good for later."

Romans plans on being conservative with the son of the stakes-placed mare Band Queen for the time being.

"We haven't thought that far in advance, but I think we will eventually stretch him out," Romans continued. "We'll at least give him a shot at it, but as for his next race, we're really not sure yet. We may change our minds, but right now we're probably going to point toward an allowance race [at Fair Grounds]."

Hull went through the sales ring twice--as a \$30,000 KEESEP yearling and an \$82,000 FTMMAY juvenile. He caught the eye of EQB's Patti Miller, who purchased the colt on behalf of Heiligbrodt Stable at the Timonium sale.

"I liked him physically, and Dale Romans was there too at Timonium, and he loved the colt as well," Miller offered. "He was an exquisite mover and he trained very well. He wasn't a super big horse at that point. We thought he'd be able to handle longer distances down the line based on his cardiac profile and his way of moving. He did everything right and seems to just have progressed slowly. Dale takes his time and does everything carefully. Hull looks like he's a little late coming around I guess, but it seems like he was worth waiting for." --S.S.

MINOR FILES LAWSUIT OVER HIALEAH DEED

According to published reports, Internet mogul Halsey Minor filed a lawsuit in the Circuit Court of Miami-Dade County in Florida Monday seeking a declaratory judgment on the city of Hialeah's 2004 decision to transfer the deed of the track to its current owner, John Brunetti. Also filed by the non-profit Save Hialeah Racing Inc., the lawsuit, which states that the city violated the terms of an agreement with Brunetti and the city's charter when it transferred the deed to Brunetti, is asking the court to rule on the legality of the sale in an effort to get the track back under city ownership. Using to support its claim, the lawsuit contends that Brunetti failed to comply with the terms of the agreement because the track did not hold live racing during the duration of the agreement. Also, it claims that Brunetti did not maintain the track property in the same condition as on the day the lease agreement was signed and that the city charter prohibits the transfer of city assets without a referendum.

Saturday, may make his next start in the GI Frank E. Kilroe Mile at Santa Anita Mar. 7, trainer Christophe Clement told *Daily Racing Form*. "It's a bit of a puzzle," Clement told *DRF*. "The Kilroe Mile is a chance. We could give him a break for Keeneland [in April]." At two, the bay won the Woodford Reserve Bourbon S. before adding victories in the GII Virginia Derby, GIII Hill Prince S. and GIII Sir Beaufort S. at three.

23 SIREs: THE PRICE IS RIGHT

Value, value, value: that has to be the watchword of the year. It's not much help now to say it should always be the watchword anyway. When the pendulum swings toward proven sires, there will be good value to be had gambling on unproven sires--emphasis on gambling, though. But the best value, relatively speaking of course, must still be proven sires if you can get them at the right price. This week: 23 proven sires (with APEX ratings, so had at least three-year-olds of 2008). There were three requirements to make this list, which is 23 sires but actually has 30 names on it (I'll explain). First requirement is that the sire has to stand for no more than \$20,000 (or Sterling/Euro equivalent), preferably less--16 of the 23 in fact stand for \$12,500 or less. I'm not even saying those are great bargains; it's still a lot of money if all you're doing is breeding a \$20,000 yearling. But, in the universe of actual proven useful sires, these are the sires with the best numbers at the lowest prices.

The second requirement was that the sire absolutely had to have an ABC Index of 1.30 or higher--preferably 1.50, which at least is 12 percent of runners. I would still leave them on in that borderline 1.30--1.50 zone, as I didn't consider it a disqualifying weakness; 18 of the 23 did have indexes of 1.50 and higher. What did knock them off the main list and into the 'Honorable Mention' category, though, was a new, key statistic which we have just finished updating this week: Sires' career percentage of 'unique' A Runners/ Named Foals of Racing Age (through 2008). This is about the equivalent of measuring a sire's career percentage of listed and group/graded stakes winners. A sire's career percentage of unique A Runners (in other words, counted once regardless of how many different seasons they earned 'A Runner' money) from foals, really does show you how much more compressed the numbers for the top sires are these days than they used to be. The days of double-digit sires look long gone, that's for sure: Danzig 15.3 percent A Runners from foals; A.P. Indy--13.7 percent; Storm Cat--12.2 percent. Today's leaders are roughly a third below that: Smart Strike (8.7 percent) and Distorted Humor (8.4 percent).

Those are six-figure stud fee sires, of course. To make this main list of 23, sires only had to score four percent or higher 'unique' A Runners from foals; the five horses on the Honorable Mention list all have good APEX ratings, but, when measured against their entire foal crops, they are under four percent. It probably means they can get the 'big horse,' all right, but have been less consistent at siring A Runners.

An extreme case is Muhtathir, who had Grade I winners Doctor Dino, Satwa Queen, and Maturalakana in his first two crops, and only this year will have his first crop out of 'better' mares. As you can see also, two sires with very comparable numbers to the sires on this list were bought for Asian interests: Precise End, who had great figures (especially for two- and three-year-olds) from his New York crops, and was bought to replace his sire, End Sweep, when the latter died in Japan; and Menifee, hands down the sire with the best APEX numbers, anyway, to be bought for Korea. They would make this list a top 25 if they still stood in North America.

THE 12 PERCENT TARGET

Eight percent ABC Runners--earners of \$53,500 or more in North America in 2008, for example--equals an ABC Index of 1.00, so 12 percent ABC Runners equals an index of 1.50. That's the key figure to look for in this list--an ABC Index of 1.50 or higher. The five sires among the 23 which didn't achieve that rating compensate in some other way--Catienus, for example, has just a 1.30 ABC Index (10.4 percent of runners), but compensates for it by recording 6.3 percent unique A Runners from foals. For a \$10,000 stallion, those are good numbers.

Alphabet Soup, who defeated Louis Quatorze and Cigar in the 1996 GI Breeders' Cup Classic, is by Cozzene, and is a complete outcross for Native Dancer and Northern Dancer. Though his overall figures look quite consistent (1.59 ABC Index, 4.9 percent Unique A's/Foals), in fact he has a strange profile. He had 24 'unique' A Runners in his first three crops (1999-2001), but has had exactly zero A Runners in three of his five crops since. He had one A Runner in his fourth crop (2002), and four in his 2004 crop, four-year-olds last year. So, having averaged eight A Runners per crop in his first three crops, he's averaged one in his five crops since! Having covered 112 mares in Kentucky in 2007, Adena Springs moved him to Florida in 2008, when he covered 75 mares. I guess it's a big gamble whether he's still the same horse he was 10 years ago, but there's no scientific reason I know of why he shouldn't be.

Belong to Me, now 20 years old, came to Kentucky after his first New York-bred crop did very well in 1997, meaning he's sired four crops in New York, and his 2006 crop was his eighth in Kentucky. His 2002-2008 APEX ratings show he's sustained his consistency (1.74 ABC Index; see Age Ratings on the website--in his case, very level), and his 6.1-percent career 'unique' A Runners from foals looks very good for a \$10,000 stallion. He's sired 51 unique A Runners, averaging more than four per crop. If Lane's End hasn't yet sold out his barnmate, City Zip, at \$12,500, it's not because he doesn't get a mention in this column every single week. Here he is again--8.1 percent unique A Runners (though three of his four crops to race were foaled in New York, where the purses are boosted). As you know, he had five two-year-old stakes winners in his first Kentucky crop last year. His age figures do show a definite regression so far; they've been much better at two and three; and, of course, he's the newest member of the 18-and-under Top 30.

Catienus reached number 19 on the 2007 General Sire List, the year his first crop were five-year-olds. That's an impressive achievement--that crop includes multiple Grade I winner Precious Kitten and two other Grade I horses, Dawn of War and Talent Search. Though he didn't hit those heights in 2008, and though he is lower than you'd prefer for ABC Index, that 6.3 percent unique A Runners reads well. D'Wildcat, a good sprinter himself from Forest Wildcat's first crop, had the winner of the Landaluce S. at Hollywood and a couple of really salty stakes horses in Canada in his first crop, and has off-the-charts numbers for a \$6,500 Florida sire.

Desert Code's win in the ungraded but valuable Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint was the big-time win E Dubai had been needing. With his first foals four-year-olds last year, he's always had very good numbers, and his age ratings are consistently high, too. Freud, a full brother to Giant's Causeway, managed a Royal Ascot placing when third in the old G2 Cork and Orrery S. on the race-track, and has no doubt benefited from operating in the rich New York program. He had an off-the-charts 4.24 five-year-old ABC Index with his first crop last year.

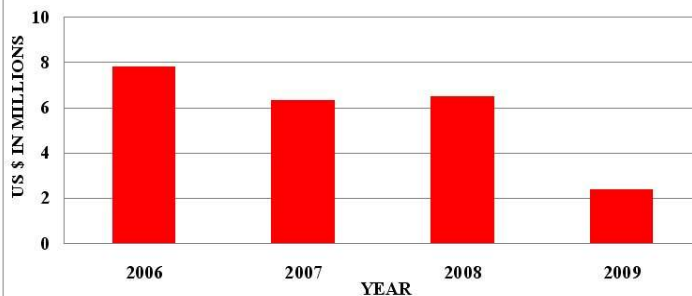
Weekly Sales Ticker

"From the Silver Lining Dept.: while nobody needs to pretend Fasig February's 63 percent drop in gross is good news, it is striking that, typical of what is happening right now, the number catalogued was down 40 percent. Fasig was down from two days to one; Goffs this week has shrunk from four days to two. Breeders are obviously deciding there is no market for a lot of these horses, so the expense of going to auction isn't justified. The silver lining is that, of those catalogued, Fasig sold 67.2 percent. The first Two-Year-Old sale, in Ocala next week, will tell us a lot."

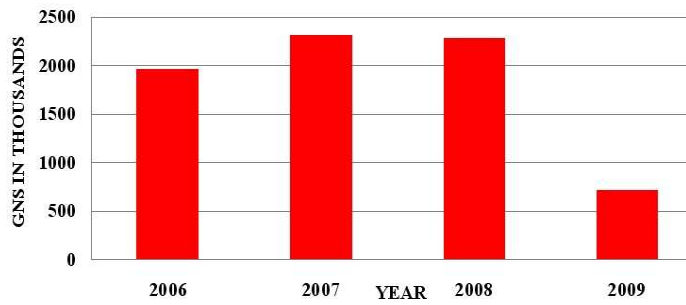

Halling and Hernando are two British sires with somewhat similar profiles. Each has had a little over 600 year-starters since 2002; Halling had 25 A Runners in that period (2.02 A Runner Index), Hernando 27 (2.14 A Index). Both are below 1.00 for two-year-olds, both much stronger as three-year-olds and up. Halling has sired 5.4 percent unique A Runners from foals; Hernando 5.5 percent. They aren't precocious, that has to be conceded, but they are both good sires.

Holy Bull looks very consistent now for \$10,000, at 1.68 A Runner Index, 1.66 ABC; he is a touch above average for two-year-olds, then they improve. Jump Start did just that in the first half of 2008, when he had his first four-year-olds. Though he didn't fare as well in the second half of the year, his overall profile looks well above average, including a good 1.85 rating for his first four-year-olds last year. Langfuhr is one of the \$20,000 stallions on this list, but as usual that doesn't look expensive for what he's achieved. Considering he always gave Pulpit a run for his money as crop leader for North American sires with first foals 1999, he still looks really worth the money: 2.32 A Index, 1.84 ABC Index, 5.8 percent unique A Runners from foals; they start out well above average (1.47 for two-year-olds) and improve with age.

Once he'd finished 22nd on the 2005 Freshman Sire list, Monarchos faced an uphill struggle commercially. Even though he has had only one graded stakes winner, he did nonetheless have six three-year-old A Runners last year. He could be poised to look pretty good value in his second year at a \$6,000 fee. Mutakddim (by Seeking the Gold), a member of the 1998 sire class which also includes Smart Strike and Unbridled's Song, has always had consistently good numbers. He still does: 1.72 for A Runners, 1.69 ABC's, and 4.8 percent unique A Runners from foals. He did very well in Argentina, too. Officer was a good two-year-old himself and got off to a fast start at stud, which he's pretty much continued. His numbers read well for a horse whose fee was halved this year. They have been best at two so far, but a solid 1.78 ABC Index (over 14 percent of runners) suggests they're training on.

Pleasant Tap is now 22, and the fee for Pleasant Colony's only successful son so far (Pleasantly Perfect, also at Lane's End, has three-year-olds this year) has dropped to \$12,500. From the same 1994 sire class as A.P. Indy and El Prado, Pleasant Tap isn't as hot as he was a couple of years ago, but his 6.0 career 'unique A Runners' from foals percentage is pretty respectable. If Monarchos's 22nd ranking on the 2003 Freshman Sire list wasn't discouraging enough, what about Point Given? He ranked 33rd, with two winners. But his figures have improved significantly; though his 1.42 ABC rating is still a little below what you'd like to see, he has proven he can sire the big horse, with a 2.37 A Index.

He's also got a very high 3.24 All-Weather (synthetic) cumulative average-earnings index. Interestingly, on that 2005 Freshman Sire list, the top five were: (1) Tiznow; (2) El Corredor; (3) City Zip; (4) Songandaprayer; and (5) Broken Vow. Besides City Zip, (33) Point Given, and (22) Monarchos, other F2003 sires (first five-year-olds 2008) which make this good-value, \$20,000-and-under list are former freshman sires number (14) Put It Back; (17) Freud; and (21) Trajectory; so six in all, nearly a quarter of the 23 sires covered here.

The 2004 sire class is headed by Street Cry and Johannesburg in America, and by Rock of Gibraltar and Invincible Spirit in Europe, but the supporting cast includes three further sires in Kentucky, and one in Europe, which make this list. The Americans are E Dubai, Officer, and Pure Prize, sire of Pure Clan, Cowgirls Don't Cry, and Coronet of a Baron. Pure Prize actually slightly outpoints the other two, with a 3.26 A Runner Index, and a 1.90 ABC Index (E Dubai is 1.84, Officer 1.78). The year they have their first five-year-olds can be a tricky one, not least because their fourth crop of two-year-olds is often the smallest and/or worst-bred; but if these three can sustain their good starts, they could be a very solid bunch of sires, especially as all three have good two-year-old figures.

That profile would not fit the European F2004 representative from this stud fee range, Sakhee. Though he has a 3.10 A Runner Index, and a 1.84 ABC rating, his age ratings tell the story: an extra-low 0.40 for two-year-olds, but 2.41 for three-year-olds, and 2.53 for four-year-olds.

The two other F2003 sires I haven't mentioned are Florida stallion Put It Back and Trajectory, a son of Gone West who is probably the best young sire in Ontario. Put It Back gets nearly as many mentions in this column as City Zip. He's actually on the low end of the scale with 4.1 percent unique A Runners from foals, but with the likes of In Summation and Smokey Stover in his first crop, and Hey Byrn and Sunshine Millions Filly and Mare Sprint winner High Resolve in his third, he can be forgiven if he hasn't struck with the frequency of some of the others who probably had a much better opportunity. Except in Brazil, that is, where he has four Group 1 winners in two crops there. Trajectory has certainly acted on the Woodbine all-weather surface: he has a 2.38 AW average-earnings index (including five AW stakes winners) and a very high 43 percent AW winners to starters. He had a total of seven stakes winners last year.

Smoke Glacken was just about everybody's number 31 on our list of top 30 sires aged 18-and-under. With well over 1,000 year-starters since 2002, he has compiled a 1.88 A Runner Index and a 1.82 ABC Index--that's 155 ABC Runners. He has a very good 2.49 two-year-old index, and his 35 unique A Runners represents 6.3 percent of his foals. He's an absolute solid citizen. That should leave us with two California sires to mention, but even though his numbers put him right in with these and we know he stands for less than \$20,000, the farm has chosen to list In Excess's fee as 'private' the last few years; so he gets only this half a call, and no listing. Though Unusual Heat is 'private' this year, he was listed at \$20,000 for last year, which does qualify him for inclusion. His connections have exploited the California program, perhaps somewhat by accident initially, to the point where Unusual Heat is one of the top sires in the country, based on the number of runners he sires which make money. He was actually the number six sire in the Northern Hemisphere at the end of 2008, with a 3.86 A Runner Index (7.72 percent of runners). His 2.52 ABC Index is over 20 percent of his runners and his 31 unique A Runners comprise 8.5 percent of his foals. That's a whole lot of sire for \$20,000, at least if you're breeding to race in California.

The colt, consigned by Kanangra, agent, was purchased by F Mitchell. He is a full brother to the talented Leiserl (Aus). During three sessions, Inglis sold 392 horses for a total of A\$10,410,500. The average was A\$26,557 and the median A\$20,000. Of the 607 lots catalogued, 66 were withdrawn and 149 were passed in. The clearance rate was 73 percent. The average fell 17 percent from a year ago. "Given what we have seen unfold in the Northern Hemisphere and the first of the Australasian sales this year, keeping the falls to those levels was a reasonable result," Inglis Managing Director Mark Webster said. "After a number of years where vendors enjoyed outstanding results, this year is shaping up very much in favor of the buyers and, given the success of Classic graduates on the racetrack, I suspect there has been some exceptional value secured here at Newmarket over the past three days." Inglis is still offering passed-in lots from the auction on its web site, www.inglis.com.au.
