10 ENTERED IN LOUISIANA DERBY

A field of 10 sophomores was entered for Saturday's GII Louisiana Derby at Fair Grounds. Vinery Stable and Fox Hill Farms' **Friesan Fire** (A.P. Indy) was installed the

5-2 morning-line favorite after drawing post nine yesterday. Part of the powerful Larry Jones stable, the bay is two-for-two at Fair Grounds this winter. He opened his sophomore campaign with a 1 1/2-length victory in the Jan. 10 GIII Lecomte S. before adding a two-length triumph over

Saturday's 1 1/16-miles distance in the Feb. 7 GIII Risen Star S. Friesan Fire turned in a bullet five furlongs in :58.20 in New Orleans yesterday and Jones thinks the best is yet to come for his precocious charge. "The horse is just getting very, very good right now," Jones said. "He did [the work] without being asked." Friesan Fire could become the first horse in 16 years to sweep Fair Grounds's series of Triple Crown prep races.

Patena (Seeking the Gold), second in the Lecomte in his only three-year-old start to date, is the 7-2 second choice on the morning line and will break from post three. Since that effort, the colt has been purchased by IEAH and has been transferred to the barn of Rick Dutrow, Jr. Patena turned in a bullet five-furlong drill at Gulfstream yesterday in :59.40. "He obviously has a lot of talent," Dutrow said. "We're very pleased with what he showed us in his work today. We're very happy with him right now." *Full Field p5*

MARKET WATCH

The 20th Barretts March Sale will be staged today amidst a global economic downturn, but the mood on the sales grounds isn't one of general despair. "I think it's going fairly well, all things considered," said Bill Baker, Barretts' vice president and controller. "Obviously, the economy's been tough on everybody, but I think there's plenty of money here." He added, "We're

happy with the horses, we're happy with the preview. The economy, we're not happy with, but we have no control over that. I think we've got a significant amount of Japanese participation here. The Yoshida family is here, Mr. Hirai is coming, and Mr. Muriyama flew in [Sunday]

night." A trimmer catalogue than in recent years has been universally well-received. "We intentionally left the catalogue smaller," Baker explained. "The demand for two-year-olds and horses as a total is going to be much softer this year." Indeed, both of the first two in-training sales were down approximately 30 percent in both average and median, but some consignors are cautiously optimistic. "[The traffic] has been a lot better than I thought it'd be," said Shane Chipman of BC3 Thoroughbreds. "[Sunday] was really busy. We've been busy all week, and that surprised me." The relaxed California attitude was referenced several times yesterday morning, a sentiment echoed by Chipman. "The difference between here and Florida is you'll get a lot of the buyers come in Monday and Tuesday--they don't come in [on the weekend] like they do in Florida," he explained. "I'm pleased with the horses we have this year and with how things are going. It seems positive--we've had a lot of lookers, a lot more people than we thought we would." As far as visitors to the Eddie Woods barn, the Irishman offered, "[It's] probably very typical of what you get in this place. In the past, this has scared us to death, but we've done OK, because they've shown up at the last minute. We'll probably get as much traffic [Tuesday] morning as we did in the four or five days between the breeze show and the sale."

'Acoma Flaunts her Class in Azeri'

On a Tight Schedule...

With Fasig-Tipton having its sale last Tuesday and OBS March all set for next week, buyers and consignors alike have been racking up the frequent flyer miles, and it's been especially tough for those based in Florida. "I didn't think there was that much of a difference this year when we first looked at the schedule," said Ciaran Dunne of Wavertree Stables. "We've been doing this, coming back to California for several years now, but when we started making the arrangements, the logistics were a nightmare, and it's difficult on buyers." He suggested, "I think one of the things the sales companies need to do--Fasig-Tipton, OBS and Barretts is to sit down together and is to hash out some details, because if OBS and Fasig squeeze Barretts to the point where someone's got to make the decision between coming here or going there or vice versa and we lose one buyer...our buying base is not deep enough that we can afford to make it difficult for buyers. I mean, everything has to revolve around them. To ask them to attend the Fasig-Tipton sale Tuesday, get on a plane on Wednesday and be in their seats on Thursday to see a breeze show, then follow it up with the sale on Tuesday, get back on a plane Wednesday and be in their seats at OBS Thursday. Yes, we do it because it's our job, but it's not necessarily their job to do it. We've got to come up with a format that makes it easier on the buyers and agents, as well. This year was a little tough, and some adjustments need to be made. I think the NATC may need to be proactive in putting these guys together. Obviously, each sales company wants what's best for them, but sometimes you have to look at the big picture. We've got Bill Baker here at Barretts, we've got Tom Ventura at OBS and Boyd Browning, Jr. at Fasig-Tipton--three very, very smart guys who I think are capable of thinking outside the box." Dunne offered, "I think it's just a matter of putting the three of them at the table and saying, 'Hey, what's best for the two-year-old business in general?' and they'll hash it out."

Been There, Dunne That...

Ciaran Dunne's Wavertree Stables sold seven youngsters at last year's March sale, including Suni (Soto), a \$120,000 purchase by Narvick International who became the best dirt-based juvenile in Japan. Dunne has brought a solid cast once more this year. "We got in here last Monday to give them time to acclimatise," said Dunne. "We train on a mile racetrack at home, so it gives them time to adjust to the five-eighths track here." He added, "We felt pretty good coming out here, and we were satisfied with our breezes. Like everyone who sells two-year-olds, you always want them to go a tick faster than they did. We brought a two-turn group of horses here, and they performed that way." Among the group is hip [26](#), a Giant's Causeway--Miss Soft Sell filly. The grey is the fourth of her siblings to visit the Hinds Pavilion. Don'tsellmeshort (Benchmark) was a \$75,000 BESMAY purchase in 2003, while Wavertree sold Swissle Stick (Swiss Yodeler) for \$600,000 at this sale the following year. Brother Derek (Benchmark) went for \$275,000 at the venue in 2005. "Her family is California royalty," said Dunne. "She worked well [[:10 2/5](#)]. At the end of the day, she's more a three-year-old type than a two-year-old type." Dunne confirmed that the decision to bring the \$280,000 KEESEP yearling to Pomona was a no brainer. "She's made for this program," he said. "She's one of the rare California-breds that has that kind of pedigree, so I think she has wide-spread appeal and, hopefully, they'll pick up on her." As far as looking like her brothers, Dunne said, "BC3 [Thoroughbreds] sold Brother Derek--I remember him as being a bigger, rangier horse. Swissle Stick was very much in the mold of a Quarter Horse, and she falls somewhere in between. She's got a big hip and shoulder on her, and I think she's got a lot of maturing to do. She's still a bit roly poly in her withers and, in my mind, will be a much better three-year-old than two-year-old." Another youngster proving popular from Wavertree's barn is hip [76](#), a racy bay son of Indian Charlie. A \$175,000 KEESEP purchase, the athletic colt is out of SW Young Star (Capote). He went in [:10 1/5](#) during the preview.

What They're Saying At The Sales...

Consignor Eddie Woods, suggesting that the under-tack preview be closer to the sale itself:

"Incidentally, the five days between the breeze show and the sale is ridiculous. I think in a small select catalogue like this...one day in between is enough, with modern technology and everything like that. Yes, we can watch the videos on-line just about as good as you can anywhere else. Here, we bide the time for the weather, because this track is totally unusable with any amount of rain, so I suppose you have to forgive them a little bit. With the technology now...for anyone to wait for a DVD to come across the country kind of doesn't make any sense anymore. You sometimes lose the spirit of the sale from a selling point of view--you never really know where you're at. It's really hard to handicap the deal because it's so drawn out between--you forget what people looked at the horse four days ago and then show up here to bid on him, so to speak, even though you've got the name written down, but they buy the horses when they need to."

Consignor Ciaran Dunne, on the one-breeze format:

"The whole two-year-old market is going through an adjustment. We're trying to learn how to cope with the one breeze show format. The sales companies are trying to give themselves enough time to send DVDs out. Obviously, here at Barretts we've got to be very conscious of the weather. I think breezing on Thursday and selling on Tuesday, there's almost too much time to the point where you have guys saying, 'Oh, I'll come tomorrow, I'll come tomorrow,' as opposed to just getting up and coming out here. We've been steady rather than swamped, but the right people are here and they seem to be getting on the right horses."

Barretts Vice President Bill Baker, on the sales schedule:

"We've had this date in March for a while. OBS moved back a week to be right behind us, and then Fasig moved a week, so we're kind of sandwiched. After this year, we're going to have to re-look the dates in its entirety because we're not happy being happy in between these two sales."

Consignor Andy Havens:

"Barretts has also done a very good job in limiting the numbers to a smallish, select group and holding their standards firm so that the appropriate ratios of supply and demand can be in place. They've done a good job in organizing the catalogue and in selecting them--there are a bunch of really nice horses here."

John Brocklebank signed the \$250,000 ticket for the May 11-born colt at KEESEP.

"We've been excited about her all year," admitted Ciaran Dunne. "She does things so effortlessly--in her breeze here, it looked like she was stroking at about 90 percent. There's almost no doubt in my mind that she's a stakes horse." Bred on the same cross as GSW Denis of Cork, the Kentucky-bred is out of a half-sister to SW Forest Danz (Forestry).

A \$55,000 purchase at KEESEP by John Brocklebank, this chestnut stopped the clock in :9 4/5 when breezing Thursday, but don't let the time mislead you. "She's not a Quarter Horse-looking thing," said BC3's Shane Chipman. "She's got a lot of scope to her, a huge shoulder on her, and she's got a lot of class. She's been a neat horse to be around all along. She's an outstanding individual." The Jan. 23-born filly is a granddaughter of SW & MGSP Digitalize, who herself is a half to the top-class turfer Awad (Caveat).

Picked up for \$37,000 by Sommer Smith at KEESEP, this flashy chestnut went :10 2/5 Thursday. "[He] is an absolutely beautiful mover," said NexStar's Dave Showalter. "He just covers the ground like a good horse." The consignor added, "We're actually catalogued in Keeneland, but, with the economics that we're under nationally, I thought it was in our best interest to stay at home." From the second crop of last year's leading freshman and juvenile sire, this grey colt has attracted a lot of attention following a :10 1/5 breeze. "He's one of the best, if not the best horses we're taking to a sale all year," Eddie Woods confirmed. "He's just an uncomplicated, fabulous-training horse. Tapit is the flavor of the month anywhere you go, and especially out here. The dam's half-sister [Tasha's Miracle] was a big filly out here last year. He's a very California-pedigreed horse, but at the same time, I could have taken him anywhere." His dam, the winning Harve de Grace, is a half to MGSW & GISP Tasha's Miracle (Harlan's Holiday), GSP Deb's Charm (Silver Charm) and SP Early Vintage (Jump Start). The Mar. 1-born colt has been through the ring twice already, selling for \$70,000 as a weanling at KEENOV before going for \$220,000 to the account of Coleton Stables at KEESEP last year. It looks like he has a ton of improvement left in him--he'll be a special horse." "He broke sharply today and negotiated the turns well, making everything very easy," said winning jockey Julio Cesar Mendez. Conditioned by champion trainer Carlos Daniel Etchechoury, who saddled Life of Victory (Arg) (Incurable Optimist) to win the last renewal of the prestigious G1 Carlos Pellegrini, Don Ladino entered the race off a seven-day

The bay filly came into the race off a runner-up effort in the G2 Clasico Casares Feb. 14, and is expected to point to the Copa Bullrich Final in April. Peristaltica is out of the unraced Kentucky-bred Pediform, who was purchased for \$17,000 at KEENOV in 2003 and exported to Argentina in 2004 in foal to Arch. She produced a Grand Reward yearling filly in 2007 and weanling colt by the same sire in 2008.

Everybody knows that two-time champion sire A.P. Indy has an affinity for Mr. Prospector blood. Indeed this cross has proved so successful that, according to the *Blood-Horse's* Nicks for 2009, daughters of Mr. Prospector were responsible for 109 of A.P. Indy's first 917 foals of racing age--nearly 12 percent--and for 18 of his stakes winners.

This cross's considerable success has led to A.P. Indy siring another 156 foals from mares by sons of Mr. Prospector and this sizeable sample has also established an excellent strike rate, with 12-percent stakes winners.

But which branch of the Mr. Prospector male line will prove capable of extending this success story to the next generation? There was a pretty good clue provided by A.P. Indy's record with daughters of Fappiano. From only 13 foals out of mares by Fappiano, A.P. Indy sired A.P. Adventure, winner of the GI Las Virgenes S., Admiral's Cruise, a Group 3 winner in England, and Aratama Indy, a winner at Group 3 level in Japan. That's 23 percent graded/group winners and Fappiano mares also produced graded winners to two other sons of Seattle Slew in Capote and Slew City Slew.

Is it any wonder, then, that A.P. Indy and his sons are achieving some eye-catching results with mares by Fappiano's sons?

A.P. Indy's first 16 foals out of granddaughters of Fappiano include the likes of Bernardini and A.P. Warrior (both out of Quiet American mares) and Teammate (out of a Rubiano mare). While it is wrong to assume that this type of success will naturally be handed down from father to son, the early signs are that granddaughters of Fappiano are working equally well with A.P. Indy's stallion sons.

There is no better example than Tapit, last year's champion sire of two-year-olds who is by Pulpit out of an Unbridled mare. Then there's the Grade I two-year-old winner Great Hunter (by Aptitude out of a daughter of Roy), the GII Fountain of Youth winner Cool Coal Man (by Mineshaft out of a Rubiano mare) and the dual Grade III winner Ecclesiastic (by Pulpit out of a Rubiano mare).

Now the name of Saturday's GIII Gotham S. winner I Want Revenge can be added to the list, as he is by Stephen Got Even out of an Argentinian-bred daughter of Roy.

I Want Revenge's juvenile form on California's all-weather tracks was good enough to earn him 118 on the Experimental Free H., eight pounds behind the sidelined Midshipman, but his 8 1/2-length Gotham victory raises the possibility that he is going to be even better on traditional dirt—a possibility which will do his Triple Crown aspirations no harm.

As might be expected of a son of A.P. Indy and a Cox's Ridge mare, Stephen Got Even was a dirt performer, notably defeating Golden Missile and Behrens to take the GI Donn H. over a mile and an eighth. Stephen Got Even had been one of the favorites for the previous year's Kentucky Derby but, according to his owner Stephen Hilbert, he got "trampled in a stampede."

As Stephen Got Even had a May 4 birthday, there was reason to expect him to make a formidable four-year-old, a theory supported by the 120 Beyer Speed Figure he achieved in the Donn H. on his first start of 2000.

"There are a lot of races to be won this year and we might have the horse to win them," said Hilbert. Luck wasn't on their side, though. The son of A.P. Indy had to be scratched from the Widener H. in March after bruising a foot and he was retired after suffering another injury, this time to an ankle, while training for the Woodward S. in September.

He promptly joined his sire at Lane's End, part of his appeal being that his pedigree is free of Northern Dancer and Mr. Prospector. Although his fee is down to \$7,500 from its original \$20,000, Stephen Got Even has a respectable record with his first five crops, which have yielded seven graded winners in the U.S. Star of the team was undoubtedly Stevie Wonderboy, the champion juvenile of 2005. This colt's victories in the GII Del Mar Futurity and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile mean that Stephen Got Even's 2007 crop, numbering more than 100 foals, is potentially one of his strongest.

I Want Revenge's broodmare sire is Fappiano's much travelled son Roy, who also sired the dams of Great Hunter and Host.

At 16.3 hands, Roy was a typically big son of Fappiano, but his size didn't stop his connections making a fairly early start with him as a two-year-old in 1985. Roy started favorite for the GII Sanford S. on the strength of a 17-length maiden win and went down by only a neck to Sovereign Don. Unfortunately, he bucked his shins and later failed to fulfil his promise, though he won twice at up to a mile at Aqueduct at three.

Roy enjoyed most of his success as a stallion in South America, firstly in Chile and later in Argentina, but his Chilean Group 2 winner India Divina won the GI Santa Maria H. in the U.S.

I Want Revenge's dam Meguial was one of Roy's good winners in Argentina, where she was second in the Argentine equivalents to the 1,000 Guineas and Oaks. As the Oaks was contested over a mile and a quarter, I Want Revenge should have no problems when he ventures beyond 1 1/16 miles and this powerful galloper is clearly one to keep an eye on.

POLITICS AND THOROUGHBRED RACING

Don't you just hate politics?

Seems like politics creeps into everything today. Banks, real estate, autos, you name it and politics is now involved.

The Kentucky horse industry has thrust itself into politics in pursuit of slots at the tracks.

For those of you outside Kentucky, adding slots at the tracks might seem a no-brainer for the center of the Thoroughbred industry.

But politics in Kentucky, like everywhere, is complicated. My ad agency used to do political campaigns in Kentucky, including an amendment to the state constitution. During such campaigns, you gain insight into what Kentuckians value and hold dear.

I'm concerned about a message today that says, "If you like the Thoroughbred industry, you will let us bring slot machines into your state and possibly your community." That's a big jump for Kentuckians to make, especially those with strong beliefs against gambling, but who give racing a pass as part of their culture and heritage.

It's like having a nephew you like come see you for approval to develop the family farm. After you have told him no, he doesn't accept it and just keeps coming back. The relationship becomes strained and before long you care for him a little less.

Our industry needs to be careful about its relationship with the people of Kentucky. This isn't a bridge to be burned. Cool, experienced heads need to prevail.

The Political Gift of Legal Wagering

I am not against casinos. I'm just for Thoroughbred racing, which enjoys the political gift of legal wagering. If you think this gift is set in stone, you need to learn more about the give and take of politics.

How many of us were down in Texas during the 1980's to get racing restored after 50 years of exile? Racing was thrown out with the bathwater of other gambling in 1937. Now, Texas racing is trying to repeat history and climb back into the same tub.

Kentucky racing survived the last national backlash by having the tracks separate from other gambling facilities.

Public sentiment toward gambling is cyclical. It always has been, it always will be. Today, sentiment is red hot and there is no ceiling in sight, kind of like the housing market in 2006. There is no holding in-place; it is either on its way up or on its way down.

When we talk about the need to package a better racing product ([TDN Oct. 10, 2008](#)), or a structure within the sport to ensure integrity, we're talking about changes to the sport that will give the public reasons to continue the precious gift of legal wagering. When we give the public cheating, drugs and package our product in a way no one wants to see, we are putting the political gift in play.

Regardless of whether slots are approved at the tracks in Kentucky, the fact is the state has a very small population to wager on slots or racing. If Kentucky's future in the industry is based on the money wagered in the Commonwealth, then it will lose to states with more people. Pennsylvania has five times more people and Texas has 10 times more people than Kentucky.

While slots will not make Kentucky racing revenue equal to larger states, let's consider what Kentucky and other year-round racing states have that can make them equal.

Small State - Big Exports

Kentuckians buy a lot less bourbon than the \$700 million we export each year. The same goes for Kentucky's two Thoroughbred products: breeding and racing.

The bourbon industry has a normal business model. The distiller who produces the product gets the lion's share of the money. Straight up.

The breeding side of our industry has a normal business model. If you produce a yearling, you get the lion's share of the money. Straight up.

The racing side of the industry, though, has two very different business models:

- 1) The On-track model is normal business. The track and purse account get the lion's share of the money bet on-track. Straight up.
- 2) The Off-track model is anything but normal. The host track and purse account do not get the lion's share of the bets on their product. They only get three percent and out-of-state bet takers keep 18 percent. Not Straight Up--Upside Down. **Cont. p10**

As an analogy: If a bottle of bourbon after taxes retails for \$21, and the bourbon maker only gets \$3 because the retailers keep \$18, then bourbon will no longer be made.

Two-hundred forty-five million dollars was bet in Kentucky on races imported from other states, but a whopping \$1.2 billion is wagered out-of-state on Kentucky races.

Kentucky is exporting five times more racing product than it imports, but Kentucky racing gets less total money from those exports. How could that be possible? How could the Kentucky industry be allowing this travesty to continue?

The Upside Down Off-Track Model

Last July 18 in the *TDN*, I wrote [Racing's Upside Down Distribution Model](#), which pointed out the host tracks are only getting three percent of the off-track bets, while off-track bet takers are getting up to 18 percent. It's an upside-down model that is killing the sport and the headlines tell us it is happening at an ever-quickening pace.

If you click on the above link to the article, you will find out about the problem and the solution--both are found in the Interstate Horseracing Act (IHA). Here's what correcting the IHA would mean for Kentucky racing:

Kentucky Racing Revenue Will Double to \$160 Million

In 2007, Kentucky's total racing revenue to tracks and purse accounts from imported and exported wagering was about \$80 million.

By correcting the IHA, Kentucky racing would double from \$80 million currently to over \$160 million in the first year. That comes from a basic 50-50 split of take-out between racetracks and charging non-racing entities a higher percentage. (I can send you an email with the calculations.)

The Task Force on Kentucky Racing failed to mention this new revenue is possible, but it did note many areas to improve racing integrity and safety and those will need to be funded even if slots are not approved. All these needed items can be funded quickly by the new revenue, which is currently bleeding out because of the upside-down model.

I understand the desire for added revenue; that's because under the current model, the host track and purse account get almost nothing (three percent) for the racing product they export. Our major tracks are failing. ***If Not Now, When?***

I wrote variations of the article for other trade publications. Hundreds of people in breeding and racing have contacted me and said they were "shocked" to find out the business model is upside down.

One of the media carried the headline "Priority 1 - Racing's Business Model" and then conducted a poll of its readers, which showed 93 percent of those responding felt the current business model should now be changed.

But, while 93 percent of you might feel the current model needs to be changed, none of you are stepping forward to change it.

I fear many of you think there is still plenty of time, that the sport and commercial breeding are just going to slowly decline over the years, but not collapse unexpectedly like the American automakers.

The feedback from organization heads is this: "Sure, it needs to be done, but I am not going to be the one who cracks open the IHA."

I understand them. They don't want to stick their necks out and take the risk that someone in Congress might insert an item into the IHA that hurts the industry. They have everything to lose and nothing to gain individually. Their boards need to get involved.

Here are three thoughts on making the decision:

- 1) The business model for 90 percent of all racing revenue from wagering is upside down because of the wording in the IHA. That percentage will grow this year.
- 2) The only way to correct the problem is to amend the IHA. So yes, there are risks, but without amending the IHA the sport dies.
- 3) Take the risk of amending the IHA versus the certain, cowardly death from waiting.

The Emergency

Those betting into the tote today at both host and receiving tracks are paying full "retail." Their wagers are the high-profit funding for the tracks and purses today.

How long will it take the folks paying retail to realize the guy on the phone next to them is getting a rebate and they too can switch to phone bets, which means they stop funding the game? How soon will it happen? How many people have a cell phone today?

But just as fast as racing can collapse, correcting the IHA to favor the host tracks can turn the sport around quickly.

Oh, Look at the Kitty

A few years ago, the comic Robin Williams did a funny impersonation of President Bush's attention span. He had the President answering a serious question in a press conference, when suddenly Bush glanced down and said, "Oh, look at the kitty."

If owners, breeders and journalists are distracted by the "kitty" of non-IHA issues like rebates and takeout rates, the baton drops and the business model race is

over. The IHA is business-distribution legislation; so lets win this specific race first, and then tackle other issues.

If those of you with a big investment in racing and breeding think someone else is going to do this for you and you don't have to take an active role, you might reconsider that thought. This isn't an industry where people stick their necks out and lead.

I'm going to guess that millions of dollars have been raised and spent on the political process of bringing slots to Kentucky racetracks, and it appears the legislature will not vote them in this year.

Correcting the IHA is not an alternative to slots, but a real way to save racing in Kentucky and every racing state. The IHA was created in 1978 for one purpose, to expand the distribution of the host track's wagering across state lines. Politics got involved and the wording of the IHA was screwed up and has never been corrected. As simulcasting grew and morphed into phone and Internet betting, the wording of the IHA went from just being unfair to the host tracks, to being certain death for live racing.

Correcting the IHA will not only restore the original intent of the IHA, but then host tracks could distribute their races directly to the betting customers in every racing jurisdiction. This will allow us to achieve a virtual "on-track" business model, with no limits on how much can be wagered through expanded distribution. Making 12-15 percent versus three percent changes everything.

The new IHA will be the business foundation for a new Golden Age of Thoroughbred Racing.

I have recently been asked to look over some innovative ideas for Thoroughbred racing. These are private capital efforts. I have told them that nothing can succeed until the business model is corrected by the IHA. Think about it. But, once we do correct the IHA, the sky is the limit for the sport. New, creative racing ventures are on the horizon and will come forward.

My Role and Your Role

I see my role like the first leg of a relay race. I have identified the problem and provided the solution, which is correcting the IHA.

Here's how you can take the baton and do your part in the race to save the sport.

We need Policy Statements from the boards of TOBA, The Breeders' Cup, NTRA, The American Horse Council, TOC and as many state breeding organizations as you can deliver in support of correcting the IHA. This will make it easier politically.

Pick up the phone, email or write to the presidents and board members of the organizations. Tell them you support correcting the Interstate Horseracing Act (IHA).

This isn't like I'm asking you to visit someone in the

hospital. Your readership of *TDN* means you have a vested interest in restoring the sport. The business model is the first step and popular support (political pressure) is needed now. If they don't hear from you, they can assume the status quo is your preference.

Former editor of *The Blood-Horse* Kent Hollingsworth said, "When Thoroughbred people aren't wringing their hands, they're sitting on them." We can do better.

This isn't a decision for next year; it is a decision for today.

If you agree the off-track business model is upside down, because it favors the bet-takers over the host tracks, and if you agree that we must restore a real-world business model, then it should follow the IHA must be corrected or live racing will fail quickly.

Technology gives us the ability to deliver a message quickly and with little effort to a select target audience.
