He picked up right where he left off in his sophomore debut, stalking **Silver City** (Unbridled's Song) in the GIII Southwest S. Feb. 16, before powering clear to a

The Stonestreet colorbearer will exit from the seven stall. **Hamazing Destiny** (Salt Lake), transferred to D. John Velazquez, who piloted Edward P Evans's **Quality Road** (Elusive Quality) to an emphatic score in the GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S. Feb. 28, will stay at Gulfstream to ride the sophomore in the Mar. 28 GI Florida Derby. Velazquez will bypass a mount on champion Indian Blessing (Indian Charlie) in the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen, run on the same day. "It was a very tough decision," Velazquez said. "But Quality Road is really the one horse I've got that's heading toward the Derby right now. Indian Blessing is a really good horse, but it's about the Derby right now and Quality Road is

a three-year-old that has that kind of promise." Quality Road is expected to face the unbeaten **"TDN Rising Star"** **Dunkirk** (Unbridled's Song) in the Florida Derby. The \$3.7-million KEESep graduate has been ridden by Edgar Prado and Garrett Gomez in his two previous starts. "I've gotten no edge on [Dunkirk] so far," Velazquez continued. "He hasn't done anything wrong and he's going to be tough."

## FAST TIMES AT FIRST OBS BREEZE SHOW

The Ocala Breeders' Sales Company held the first of two breeze shows yesterday morning in advance of next week's March Selected Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training. The glib Safetrack surface at the OBS complex yielded fast times during the show, which saw eight horses share the bullet for an eighth after breezing in :9 4/5. Another four horses shared the bullet for the quarter-mile works after going in :20 2/5, while a colt by Milwaukee Brew stood alone among the three-eighths breezers after going in :33 2/5. The fast times, also seen at the OBS February sale, came as no surprise to consignors, who noted the track did seem to slow down a bit as the show progressed under the Florida sun.

"I don't think there's a whole lot new to talk about when it comes to the synthetics--it's just a fast track," said Niall Brennan. "It was fast early, but I don't think there was any doubt that the track slowed down a little bit. In these longer breeze shows in the warmer weather, and with the few extra breaks in this sale versus the first sale, you're going to see that. It was clearly a tick or two slower later on. But it was a consistent track in terms of safety. It was a safe track all day. I thought all of our horses breezed good and came back good. We're really happy with them."

Brennan continued, "Again, comparing the horses that went early and those who went later, I know the ones that went later are every bit as good as the ones that went early, but they were a little slower on times. But that's one of the reasons on how I can form my opinion of how the track was slower in the second half of the day."

Brennan said that, regardless of the final times, horses were going well over the track all day long.

"I think the horses move just as well over it--it's just slower," he said. "If you sit there all day and mark your card, you'd just need to mark where the breaks were as a reminder that the times would slow down afterwards --say the :9 4/5 is a :10 or :10 1/5. Which really, is probably more normal for the horses than :9 4/5."

OBS Director of Sales Tom Ventura said he was happy with Thursday's results.

"It was a good day," he said. "The weather was accommodating, the track was good and the horses got to show their stuff. The wind, if any, was mild, and it was probably 60 degrees when we started and maybe 80, 85 when we finished. It was maybe a little warmer than normal, but last time [at February], it was a little colder than normal. The times were fast, but it's a quick surface. The distribution is still there--the horses are still spreading themselves out the same." The second and final breeze show begins this morning at 9:00 a.m. The two-day sale will be held next Tuesday and Wednesday in Ocala. The full preview can be viewed [here](#).

Judi Hicklin may not be a household name, but the Iowa native sports an impressive batting average in graded stakes.

"I have eight horses in my stable and two of them are graded winners," said Hicklin, still basking in the glow of Let It Rock's victory in the GIII Razorback H. "Can you even believe it?"

Hicklin recorded her first graded victory last summer when Wayzata Bay (Roar) captured the GII Prairie Meadows Cornhusker Breeders' Cup H.

Hicklin's involvement in Thoroughbred racing seems almost to be an accident of geography.

"I used to show hunter and jumpers," she explained. "I'm from Des Moines, Iowa, and in 1989 they opened a racetrack called Prairie Meadows in Des Moines. In '89, I bought a Thoroughbred racehorse. I'd never had one before, but I bought one because they opened Prairie Meadows and I

thought it would be kind of fun to have a racehorse."

A year later, Hicklin went from owner to trainer.

"I thought, 'I know how to take care of a horse, I could probably do this,'" Hicklin recalled. "I had had hunter jumpers and show horses. I knew how to take care of a horse, so I got my trainer's license in 1990 and I've been training ever since."

Hicklin said she plans to add a young horse to her stable each year.

"I always like to try to find a young horse and play around with that one," she explained. "I like to pick out one horse every year at the two-year-olds in training sales or as a yearling. Sometimes you get lucky. Usually I'll end up buying it and then try to find a partner--you know how that goes."

Hicklin owns Let It Rock in partnership with long-time client Tom Gregerson.

"I've been training with him for a while," Hicklin said of Gregerson. "We've had various horses that we've tried before that didn't work as well as this one."

Picking out Let It Rock was a team effort, according to the trainer. "For that particular sale [2007 OBSAPR], I was in Iowa," Hicklin said. "My friend Chad Stewart has a farm in Ocala and his wife is a vet. He looks at them and she vets them and, if everything looks good, then they buy them for me. I looked at the page, I liked the horse's page. Then I looked at his workout and I liked the way he looked. Chad liked the way he looked in person and Laurie vetted him. My partner Tom used to be a Quarter Horse judge and he is big on conformation. So it is a whole team operation for us to even find a horse that passes everybody. It's a good partnership for all of us and we got lucky."

Asked about the advantages of buying at two-year-olds in training sale, Hicklin is succinct.

"You're a whole lot closer to the races," she said.

Hicklin admits she was pretty emotional after Let It Rock's victory at Oaklawn Park.

"I have to tell you, I was crying," she said. "I was crying and screaming. After he crossed the wire and Tom and I were going to get our picture taken, Chad called me and I couldn't even talk because I was crying so much. It's really a big deal for us. I know a lot of people win stakes all the time, but people like me just don't win them."

An encore for Let It Rock will have to wait after the four-year-old exited the Razorback with an injury.

"He came out of the race with a crack in his shin," his trainer said. "So we're going to have to give him some time off now. But it's not career-ending. He's just going to need a little time."

For the moment, Hicklin is enjoying the success of her small stable.

"At one time I had 42 in training," she said. "Eight is a lot easier. And when two of them are graded stakes winners, then eight is all you need."

Age is but a number. Just ask Rob Whiteley, who, along with Brandywine Farm's Jim and Pam Robinson, purchased Pay Bird (Storm Bird), then already 17 years old, for \$15,000 out of the 2004 Keeneland November sale.

"I have made something of a career out of looking for value in middle-aged mares that some people, for some reason, think are past their prime," Whiteley explained. "There is absolutely no reason that older mares cannot have their best horses at an advanced age."

Some of Whiteley's most prominent purchases include then 13-year-old Blush With Pride (Blushing Groom {Fr}) for \$200,000 with the express intent of sending her to Deputy Minister. That mating would result in Better Than Honour, dam of two Classic winners. He also bought 15-year-old Rokeby Rose (Tom Rolfe), the dam of subsequent champion Silverbulletday, for \$32,000.

"I hope Pay Bird can join that select club," Whiteley commented.

At the time of her purchase, Pay Bird was already the dam of Black Coffey (Spend a Buck), a multiple champion and Horse of the Year while racing in Peru. So, what drew Whiteley and the Robinsons to her at Keeneland?

"I was particularly taken by her size and conformation," Whiteley continued. "For a Storm Bird, she was a big mare. She produced a major horse in Black Coffey, so I knew she was capable of producing a top-level horse."

After foaling the In Excess (Ire) filly she was carrying in utero--which was subsequently sold at KESEP for \$30,000 the following year--Team Whiteley/Robinson decided to send the mare to Street Cry.

"I start my matings with the physical match, and Street Cry and Pay Bird were a very good type-to-type match," Whiteley stated. "I figured if I could get anything that was close to either one of them physically, it would be a good outcome."

Apparently, the buying public concurred, as the colt realized a final bid of \$250,000 from Sheikh Mohammed's representative John Ferguson at Keeneland September 2007.

Whiteley admitted that while he knew the horse's quality going into his second career start yesterday, he didn't know quite what to expect, especially as the race unfolded.

"We all thought the stretch out would help, but there he was tucked in at the rail and making these mini-moves. I was just hoping he wasn't going to be discouraged," he recollected. "But then the way he accelerated when he was clear, with the jockey looking back...then he was eased down at the wire. It was an impressive race."

Whiteley freely credits the Robinsons with contributing to the overall success of the collective.

"Jim and Pam do such a beautiful job of foaling a raising all our offspring," he offered. "It's a real division of labor. I plan the matings and together we pluck out the mares."

Pay Bird is to be represented by a two-year-old full sister to Valid Sum next month at the Keeneland April Sale. She is pregnant to Elusive Quality and due "any day now," says Whiteley, and is scheduled to visit Leroidesanimaux (Brz) this spring. — Alan Carasso

### ADELAIDE YEARLING SALE ENDS WITH IMPROVEMENTS IN AGGREGATE, CLEARANCE

The Magic Millions Adelaide Yearling sale concluded Thursday with 71 lots selling for an aggregate of A\$390,000, enough to buck trends and eclipse last year's cumulative gross. Combined with the figures from the first two sessions, A\$5,291,250 was spent over the course of the auction, compared to \$5,258,000 in 2008. The clearance rate improved from 72 percent to 76 percent from year to year. "This is a remarkable achievement," said Magic Millions Managing Director David Chester. "The sale aggregate figure along with the clearance rate percentages are the most important when assessing a sale." The third session clearance rate also improved, rising to 79 percent from last year's mark of 76 percent. The session average and gross, however, fell compared to last term. This year's session averaged A\$5,494, while 83 yearlings averaged A\$8,500 in 2008.
