Game Face moved to challenge on the turn, and took charge in the final furlong before drawing clear to a 2 1/2-length victory. "The pace was definitely a factor today as opposed to last time out," said winning rider John Velazquez. "I wanted to stay close and have a shot, that's all. She kept making up ground, and at the quarter I noticed she got real comfortable. We went to the outside and once I let go and asked her, this time she was ready

to fight all the other horses down the lane." Game Face, third in last year's GI Acorn S., defeated Any Limit to take the Jan. 18 GIII First Lady H. in her four-year-old debut. She couldn't get by her older rival when second in the Feb. 15 GIII Hurricane Bertie H. last time out. Trainer Darrell Vienna said **Feisty Suances** (Suances {GB}), second in the San Felipe, could make his next start in the Apr. 25 Snow Chief S. at Hollywood Park.

Friesan Fire Fine After LA Derby Win

Friesan Fire (A.P. Indy) was reported in fine shape after his win in Saturday's GII Louisiana Derby at Fair Grounds. "Friesan Fire just loved the sloppy going," reported assistant trainer Cindy Jones, who was deputizing for her husband Larry. "Now we don't have to worry about what the weather is like on Derby Day." Trainer Al Stall Jr. reported yesterday that **Terrain** (Sky Mesa), third in the Louisiana Derby, would stay on the Kentucky Derby trail. "That

was a nice comeback race for him," Stall said yesterday. "He'd been off 99 days, including some down time, and I liked what I saw. We'll be going on to Kentucky with him, and shoot for [Apr. 11 GI] Blue Grass or [Apr. 18 GII] Lexington S. with him." Trainer Chris Block said **Giant Oak** (Giant's Causeway) was off the Derby trail after his fourth at Fair Grounds Saturday.

Rachel Alexandra Still on Target for Oaks

Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro) returned to her Oaklawn Park base yesterday, and trainer Hal Wiggins said the filly would make her next start in either the Apr. 5 GII Fantasy or would train up to the May 1 GI Kentucky Oaks. Wiggins was avoiding any talk of a Kentucky Derby start for his star filly, who demolished the field in Saturday's GII Fair Grounds Oaks. "[Derby speculation] makes good talk," Wiggins said Sunday morning, "but it's pretty much all media hype. The Kentucky Oaks has been our goal from the beginning. It would be an honor to win a Kentucky Oaks, and the owners have been leaning that way all along."

Arkansas Derby Next for Win Willy

Win Willy (Yonaguska), upset winner of Saturday's GII Rebel S., will start next in the Apr. 11 GII Arkansas Derby, trainer Mac Robertson confirmed yesterday.

The colt's victory also prompted a \$3-million offer-to-purchase, but the offer was declined, according to the conditioner. "I was sure he would run a big race yesterday," Robertson said. "Inside the stretch, I realized we would be no worse than second. Before the eighth pole, I really felt good. We need to give this colt a lot

of credit. He broke from the outside post, then circled the rivals, and was drawing clear at the end of the race." Beaten favorite **Old Fashioned** (Unbridled's Song) came out of his runner-up effort Saturday in good shape, according to trainer Larry Jones.

I Want Revenge Works

GII Gotham S. winner **I Want Revenge** (Stephen Got Even) worked four furlongs in :48.80 at Hollywood Park Sunday. Jockey Joe Talamo was up for the breeze. "I never had a horse work so easy," Talamo commented. "He went in :48 and I thought it was :52. He just galloped around there." I Want Revenge is expected to make a return trip to New York for the Apr. 4 GI Wood Memorial at Aqueduct.

Zensational (Unbridled's Song), an impressive maiden winner Feb. 21 for Bob Baffert and Zayat Stables, worked four furlongs Sunday at Santa Anita in a bullet :46.20. "I'm thinking of the [Mar. 29] Sunland Derby," Baffert said. "I got him galloping out six furlongs in 1:13 flat." **Bittel Road** (Stormy Atlantic), prepping for next Saturday's GII Lane's End S. at Turfway, went five furlongs at Santa Anita Sunday in 1:00.80.

Gozzip Girl, who graduated in her turf debut at Aqueduct in her second career start last November, resurfaced with a third-place finish behind Fast Tigress (Hold That Tiger) and Obsequious over the Gulfstream lawn in a Jan. 15 allowance, only to be disqualified and placed fifth. The dark bay filly turned the tables on those rivals to take the Feb. 15 Coconut Grove S. Gozzip Girl dropped back to last in the early going yesterday. Obsequious took charge on the turn and looked home free, but Gozzip Girl made a quick move to reach contention along the rail in upper stretch and closed strongly to just nip Obsequious in the final strides. "She broke terribly," jockey Elvis Trujillo said of the winner. "I didn't force anything and just stayed back waiting for an opportunity. She put it in another gear around the three-eighths, and when I really asked, there was plenty of horse for me." Favored Dream Empress (Bernstein), winner of last year's GI Darley Alcibiades S., stalked the pace, but offered no bid in the stretch while running seventh in her sophomore bow. Dalva and Stefan Friberg's Hot Six, the fourth betting choice in the field of 12, posted an impressive late-rallying victory in the G1 Latinoamericano. The gray gave Brazil its fifth victory at home and ninth overall in the 25th renewal of the multinational race. Under an intelligent ride from Jorge Leme, the gray colt flew past dueling G1 Carlos Pellegrini winner Life of Victory (Arg) (Incurable Optimist); pacesetter Quick Road (Brz) (Jules), a MG1SW in his native country; and Peruvian-raced Zeide Isaac to win convincingly. Zeide Isaac re-rallied late to earn second. The race was marred by a three-horse spill when favorite Flymetothemoon (Brz) (Roi Normand) unseated his rider Jorge Ricardo approaching the final turn, causing Quadriball (Brz) (P.T. Indy) and second choice Negro Da Gaita (Brz) (Know Heights) to stumble. Jorge Ricardo, who has won more Thoroughbred races than any jockey in history, could miss up to 90 days after suffering a fractured skull and vertebra during the spill.

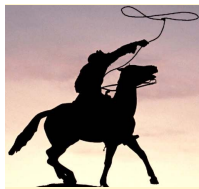

RACING Round-Up

ALBERTUS MAXIMUS IN CUP TUNE-UP GI Donn H. winner **Albertus Maximus** (Albert the Great) tuned up for the Mar. 28 G1 Dubai World Cup with a six-furlong drill in 1:11.80 at Palm Meadows Saturday. “He was just flying out there,” trainer Kiaran McLaughlin said after the move. “He couldn’t be doing any better. We’re so excited.”

McLaughlin, who trained 2007 World Cup winner Invasor (Arg), thinks his charge is primed for a big effort at Nad Al Sheba. “I wouldn’t trade places with anybody,” McLaughlin

said. “I feel like he’s the horse to beat. We might get beaten, but they’ll have to run a tremendous. He’s just doing fabulous.” Albertus Maximus won the Breeders’ Cup Dirt Mile last October for owner/breeder Brandon and Marianne Chase.

He was purchased privately after the Breeders’ Cup and captured the Jan. 31 Donn in his first start for Shadwell Stable. Also working in advance of a trip to Dubai, two-time Eclipse champion **Indian Blessing** (Indian Charlie) sizzled five furlongs in :59 at Santa Anita Saturday. “I’m happy with her,” trainer Bob Baffert said after the work. “She worked very well; so far, so good. She’s ready.” Fellow G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen contender **Black Seventeen** (Is It True) went five furlongs in 1:01.20 at Santa Anita Saturday. “Everything is good,” trainer and co-owner Brian Koriner reported. “He worked pretty aggressively today and looked nice.” All three horses are expected to leave for Dubai Tuesday.

MARCHAND D’OR PLEASURES AT SAINT-CLOUD

Carla Giral’s champion sprinter **Marchand d’Or** (Fr) (Marchand de Sable) satisfied his connections with his pre-racing gallop at Saint-Cloud Saturday. The Freddy Head trained six-year-old, a five-time Group 1 winner, was sent to the Paris track as part of his preparation for the Mar. 28 G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen at Nad Al Sheba. “That was exactly what I wanted,” Head told *Racing Post*. “He needed the gallop and a run in public. I was very satisfied with the way things went, and he will be shipped to Dubai on Monday week [Mar. 23].” Regular rider Davy Bonilla added, “He really needed this work, which will have put him spot on. I was very impressed by the way he went.”

A LAUNCHING PAD FOR STARS

Ten years ago, the OBS March Selected Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training was a blue-collar sort of event, a place where trainers could come to find reliable runners who would pay the bills, but probably wouldn't be writing the headlines later in the year. Those days are done, as OBS March has developed into a much more high-profile event. It doesn't rival Fasig-Tipton's Calder sale in terms of pedigree or prices, nor has it supplanted OBS' own boutique February sale, but without doubt March has become a steady source of top-flight runners. That is evidenced by the honor roll on this year's OBS March catalog cover, which includes not one but three 2008 Breeders' Cup champions.

Covergirl **Stardom Bound** (Tapit) sold at this sale a year ago. A \$50,000 yearling purchase by Shadybrook Farm's Michael Yates, the gray miss was hammered down to Christopher Paasch, on behalf of Charles Cono, for \$375,000 at March. By season's end, Stardom Bound was the near unanimous choice as champion juvenile filly, with the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies among her Grade I wins. Since selling to IEAH and partners for \$5.7 million at Fasig's November sale, Stardom Bound has added wins in the GI Las Virgenes S. and GI Santa Anita Oaks, and has now earned more than \$1.7 million.

Also gracing the March cover is last year's GI Breeders' Filly & Mare Turf heroine **Forever Together** (Belong to Me). Another gray filly, Forever Together was purchased for \$27,000 as a yearling by Pamela Edel before re-selling, through Racehorse Consignment, at the 2006 March sale for \$240,000. EQB's Patrice Miller signed the ticket on behalf of George Strawbridge. Forever Together collected a trio of Grade I victories in 2008 and was honored with an Eclipse Award as champion grass mare.

Eddie Woods consigned a strapping son of Real Quiet, a \$70,000 yearling later named **Midnight Lute** (Real Quiet) at the 2005 March sale. Though Bidding stalled out at \$290,000, short of the reserve, Midnight Lute was later sold privately to Mike Pegram and partners. In 2007, Midnight Lute rewarded his connections with the first of two GI Breeders' Cup Sprint victories. Midnight Lute

was also named champion sprinter in 2007.

In addition to Stardom Bound, last year's sale yielded the talented graded stakes winners **Break Water Edison** (Lemon Drop Kid) and **The Pamplousse** (Kawfain).

The former was a \$150,000 yearling purchase by Off the Hook, which resold the bay to trainer John Kimmel and owner Eli Gindi for \$525,000. Break Water Edison justified that purchase price with a tally in the GIII Nashua S. last fall. While that colt's Triple Crown dreams were shelved recently, The Pamplousse has emerged as a top challenger on the West Coast. The big gray colt, an \$80,000 yearling buy, was sold by Stephens Thoroughbreds, agent for Vision Sales, for \$150,000 to Alex Solis Bloodstock. Since then, The Pamplousse has won three of five, including his last three tries. He won by two lengths in the GIII San Rafael S. Jan. 17, then romped by six lengths in the GIII Sham S. Feb. 28.

Bowling, Now Solo, Goes All In With New Venture...

Last fall, Florida horseman Tony Bowling announced that he was launching a new sales consignment, All In Sales. Bowling had been mulling over the move for much of the year, but as it happened, the announce-

ment coincided with the biggest economic crisis since the Great Depression.

"I was spooked," Bowling chuckled when asked what he was feeling as he watched the economy spiral down. "I was thinking, 'Oh, what a year to have done this. What year did I pick?'"

While last fall was probably not the ideal time to launch a new business,

Bowling has been a horseman for nearly all of his 44 years and has sold two-year-olds for roughly half of them. So while All In Sales is a new name, Bowling's is a face that buyers have come to know and trust.

Bowling previously operated the sales consignment Bowling & Dodd, along with longtime friend Bobby Dodd. But last year, he decided it was time for a change.

"Bobby and I were partners for something like 22 years--a long time--doing Bowling and Dodd, but it's hard to make a living in this business, and it's getting harder and harder," Bowling explained of the decision. "When two guys are working together, you're divvying everything up. So I just decided I wanted to go my own direction and train a few more [two-year-old] horses, while Bobby's doing more weanling-to-yearling pinhooking."

After sitting out OBS February, All In Sales broke its maiden at Fasig-Tipton's Calder sale. Leading the way in Miami was a Seeking the Gold filly out of Valid Warning who brought \$425,000 to the bid of Martin Schwartz. That was more than double her yearling price tag of \$210,000. All In Sales also sold an Elusive Quality--Coherent colt for \$300,000; a D'wildcat--Casino Bound colt for \$200,000; a Maria's Mon--She's Smokin colt for \$190,000; and a Stormin Fever--Casanova Junction colt for \$160,000, among a few others.

Given the current state of the market, Bowling said he was pleased with the results at Calder.

"I didn't go into it expecting everything to be as it was--that would be a pipe dream," he said. "But I think people were there to buy horses, and that was nice to see. On several horses, there was more than one person. There were a few of those horses that I thought would top out at \$125,000, and one of those went to \$160,000 and one went to \$200,000."

While All In Sales is his own operation, Bowling has continued to partner on several horses, primarily with fellow consignor David McKathan. They jointly owned around 20 horses that sold last year, all but a few under McKathan's M & H Training & Sales consignment, and have gone together on a similar number for the 2009 sale season.

"Dave and I have been friends for a long time, and we've been doing business for probably six or seven years," said Bowling. "In the past, we've partnered on mostly cheaper horses, to be honest with you, but lately we've been going after the better horses."

Those horses are selling both through All In Sales and through M & H Training.

In partnership with McKathan and on his own, Bowling was busy at last year's yearling sales. He purchased just about 45 horses, some 25 percent more than usual.

"We were getting more bang for the buck," Bowling said. "We didn't know what kind of year this would be, but we decided to spread ourselves from inexpensive horses to high-dollar horses. We were trying to cover all aspects of the market this year, since we didn't know what to expect."

Bowling is the son of another respected Florida horseman in Straightaway Farm's Carl Bowling. Bowling said the early lessons he received from his father helped him achieve success later.

"Probably the most important lesson I learned, especially in the early years, was that you really had to work hard, because you were pretty much going to get out of it what you put into it," said Bowling. "I really believe the harder you go out there and work at it, the more that it's going to happen for you. And that's probably the most important thing I learned from him, to go out there and do for myself."

"As far as specifics for horses, he always had an eye for a racehorse, and he taught me what that was. That seems to be pretty universal now. It seems everyone has an eye for a racehorse. Fifteen years ago, it was funny how people totally went for a different kind of horse. Racehorses come in all sorts of shapes and sizes, of course, but I guess they were more pedigree-oriented. You used to go out and be able to pick up those good individuals, and we did well with that. That kind of put me on the map."

Some of Bowling's best horses over the years include the top sprinter Saratoga County, who won the G1 Golden Shaheen and earned \$1.6 million, as well as that colt's sire, Valid Expectation. Bowling and Dodd sold Saratoga County for \$100,000 as a two-year-old; and sold Valid Expectations for \$225,000. Bowling and Dodd also sold Music Merci, a \$51,000 juvenile back in 1988. That Stop the Music colt won the GI Del Mar Futurity and seven other stakes, making over \$1.5 million.

More recently, Bowling grad Sweet August Moon (Malibu Moon), a \$400,000 purchase by Brian Koriner at this sales two years ago, finished third in last year's GIII La Habra S. and just earned her first black-type victory, beating a good field that included Foxy Danseur Coco Belle in the Mar. 7 Honest Lady S. at Santa Anita.

Bowling is optimistic he has a few more stars in his line-up at OBS March. He points to [hip 245](#), a filly by Harlan's Holiday, as one of his better offerings.

"She's a real stretchy, streamlined filly, maybe more so than the horse I typically chose," he said. "She's more two-turn-ish. But she's very quick and goes real easy across the ground. She's just one of those fillies that has it all. She's very correct. When you look in the book, she's very light-pedigreed, but we gave \$75,000 for her [at the Texas August sale], so that tells you we liked her. She's a Louisiana-bred."

Bowling also likes the chances of [hip 181](#), a filly from the first crop of Grade I winner Proud Accolade (Yes It's True).

"She's a half-sister to Black Seventeen, who won the GI Vosburgh S. last year," said Bowling.

Hip 181 is bred along the same lines as Black Seventeen, as she is a great-granddaughter of Is It True, sire of Black Seventeen.

"I also have a few D'wildcats that I've been really happy with," said Bowling. "I had one down in Miami I did well with. Dave and I had three together. We sold one down south for \$200,000, and he's got a colt in this sale [[hip 277](#)] that I think an awful lot of, and I've got a colt in this sale [[hip 184](#)] I think an awful lot of."

Last August, Adena Springs announced it had cancelled its annual March Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training and would instead focus on selling its

homebreds as yearlings. But in November, Frank Stronach and company had a change of heart, and tonight will hold the one-session event, albeit on a smaller scale than in years past. Just 70 horses have been catalogued for the evening sale, which kicks off

at 4:30 p.m. The sale will be preceded by a country BBQ that starts at 3:00 p.m.

"I think it's a very good bunch of horses," offered Adena Springs South Farm Manager Mark Roberts. "I think it's much stronger than in years past. And the horses on the track match up with the pedigrees."

Roberts said the reduced number of horses can be attributed to two factors. Adena did sell a number of yearlings last term, "and we have sold off a number of mares, just to get our numbers under control," explained Roberts. Roberts also reported that Adena was not arranging an Adena Ventures Syndicate--offered to investors for the past three years and consisting of a half-dozen or so of Adena's best-bred horses--in 2009.

As far as bringing the sale back, Roberts explained in November, "When we announced our intention to discontinue the sale, a number of our customers expressed genuine disappointment with our decision. All things considered, including the number of two-year-olds that we will have in training in 2009, we thought it made not only good business sense, but also provided us with a chance to respond to the needs of our valued clientele."

Last year, 136 Adena juveniles were catalogued in March. After all was said and done, 97 sold for a total of \$5,283,500, good for an average of \$54,469. To the dollar, that was almost the same average of the 2007 Adena sale, which realized a figure of \$54,356.

The Adena Springs March sale is coming off a strong 2008 season. Its graduates included Canadian Horse of the Year and GI Breeders' Cup Sprint Fatal Bullet (Red Bullet), who cost Bear Stables just \$27,000 at the sale in 2007. That was the exact price at which Ginger Punch (Awesome Again) was bought back for at the 2005 sale. Named champion older mare in 2007 after winning the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff, Ginger Punch added three more Grade 1s in 2008 to push her career earnings past the \$3-million mark. Like Fatal Bullet, Ginger Brew (Milwaukee Brew) earned a Sovereign Award in Canada last year. She was named champion three-year-old filly after winning three stakes, including the Woodbine Oaks. Ginger Brew was a \$65,000 buy-back at Adena March in 2007. Buffalo Man (El Prado {Ire}) won three stakes in 2008, including the GIII Red Bank S. and GIII Appleton H. Trainer Cam Gambolati, always busy at this sale and the buyer of last year's topper A.P. Cardinal (A.P. Indy) for \$380,000, purchased Buffalo Man for \$190,000 in 2006. Others who came out of last year's event were High Mist (Olmodovar), a \$22,000 March grad who has won three of four, including the Fanfreluche S. at Woodbine.

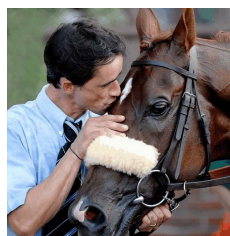

SOUMILLON BAGS OVERDOSE RIDE Leading jockey Christophe Soumillon has bagged the prized ride aboard unbeaten sprinting sensation **Overdose (GB)** (Starborough {GB}), according to *Racing Post*. Soumillon will take over from Andreas Suborics, who has ridden the Hungarian-based star in each of his four latest wins, including an impressive 10-length score in the Nov. 16 G3 Premio Carlo & Francesco Aloisi at Rome last time. Connections have turned down substantial offers for the 11-time winner, and will instead embark on a global campaign with the 2,000gns bargain buy. "It would be very unwise to sell the horse now that he is starting to make sports history," owner Zoltan Mikoczy told the trade daily. "Remaining undefeated throughout the season is a wild dream, but we will work hard to make it true." The four-year-old has an ambitious itinerary mapped out, which will begin at Kincsem Park in Budapest next month before he attempts a crack at the May 23 G2 Temple S. at Haydock. He is also slated to contest the G1 King's Stand S. and G1 Golden Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot and the G1 July Cup at Newmarket. A defence of the G2 Goldene Peitsche at Baden-Baden is also planned, as is a return to Longchamp for the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye, a race in which he finished first past the post in last term's false-start fiasco. The G1 Hong Kong Sprint at Sha Tin will close his season.
